#### Road Finale

Oklahoma, fresh off a Big 12 South victory over Texas A&M, plays its final regular season road game of the 2001 campaign when the Sooners travel to Texas Tech. The Red Raiders have won their last three games, including two on the road.

This was to have been Tech's final game of the season, but after the events of Sept. 11, the Red Raiders' schedule was adjusted to add a home game against Stephen F. Austin on Nov. 24.

### Coaches Capsule

- ▶ Oklahoma's Bob Stoops (lowa '83), winner of seven national coach of the year citations last season, is in his third year at the Sooner helm. He owns a record of 29-6, which includes a 1-1 ledger against Texas Tech. Stoops' OU teams are 17-0 at home, 8-4 on the road and 4-2 on neutral fields. *A more in-depth look at Stoops can be found inside*.
- ► Texas Tech's Mike Leach (BYU '83) is 13-9 in his second season with the Red Raiders. He was Oklahoma's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 1999. Leach is 0-1 against the Sooners as TTU's head coach.

### The Polls

Oklahoma is ranked No. 3 in the Associated Press (media) poll and No. 4 in the ESPN/USA Today (coaches) poll. The Sooners were No. 3 in both polls through the Kansas game (Oct. 13), then moved up to No. 2 for two weeks in both before moving to the current spots.

### Four for 100

Oklahomaentered this season with just two receivers who had 100 career receptions -114 by wide receiver Eddie Hinton (1966-68) and 104 by tight end Stephen Alexander(1994-97). Now, four current Sooners have hit 100 receptions or will soon.

The Downtown Athletic Club of Orlando is scheduled to announce the three finalists for the Butkus Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top linebacker, Thursday, Nov. 15, at 11 a.m., CST. Oklahoma's Rocky Calmus was a finalist for the award last season and is on the semi-finalist list this season.

#### Next Week

Oklahoma concludes regular season play next Saturday when the Sooners host Oklahoma State in the annual renewal of the Bank of Oklahoma Bedlam series, presented by the Oklahoma Ford Dealers. Kickoff is set for 2:30 p.m. The Sooner seniors will be recognized in pre-game ceremonies.

#### The Series

Oklahoma leads the series, 6-2, including a 2-1 advantage in Lubbock. One of the previous games was played on a neutral field when the Sooners notched a 41-10 victory over Tech in the 1993 John Hancock Bowl at El Paso, Texas.

#### **OU's Most Recent Game**

A review of the most recent outing, a 31-10 win over Texas A&M ...

- Oklahoma piled up 352 total yards as compared to just 132 for the Aggies. The Sooner special teams snuffed out an A&M punt and scored on a fake field goal to make it a complete performance by OU.
- OU's Heisman candidates, Roy Williams and Rocky Calmus, had 11 and 10 tackles, respectively, as the Sooners limited A&M to just five first downs for the game.
- A&M's lone touchdown came on an interception return.
- Nate Hybl completed 25-of-38 passes for 195 yards with two touchdowns and one interception. The junior also rushed for a six-pointer.
- OU punter Jeff Ferguson averaged 43.4 yards on seven punts with two downed inside the five, including one of 63 yards.
- PK Tim Duncan rushed for a 10-yard touchdown and also made his only field goal attempt (35 yards) and all four of his field goal tries.

### **Another Great Sooner Season**

This is the 32nd time Oklahoma has won at least nine games. In 25 seasons, the Sooners have turned that nine into 10 or more victories. It is worth noting that Oklahoma has not posted back-to-back double-digit victory seasons since 1986 and 1987.

### An Offense With Its Own Identity

OU's dominant defense is a unit that can hog headlines, but the Sooner offense has produced at least 329 total yards in five straight games, including three outings that exceeded 400 yards.

### Seeing Red

Of it's 55 trips into the red zone, Oklahoma has scored on 44. The Sooner opponents have *been* in the red zone 17 times, or roughly 40% of the times OU has *scored* from there.

### **Double Digit Punts**

When Texas A&M punted 10 times in last Saturday's game, it marked the fourth time in 10 games this season that the Sooner opponent had to punt the ball away at least 10 times.

### The Boys of November

Under Bob Stoops, Oklahoma is 9-1 in the month of November and has won its last five games played in the 11th month.

### Playing by the Rules

In two of its first three games, OU exceeded 100 yards in penalties, but since posting 120 against North Texas in game No. 3, the Sooners have cut back dramatically. The high since then was 75 against Baylor and in the other six games of that stretch, OU has not had more than 56.

### The Nation's Best Defense?

- Opponents completed 50% of their passes in just 11 of 35 games vs. Stoops' OU teams.
- North Carolina (1.8), Texas 1.4 and Texas (1.1) all averaged less than 2.0 yards per rush.
- The OU defense has at least one interception in 22 of the last 24 games dating back to 1999.
- During those 24 games, OU has recorded 38 interceptions and 194 pass deflections.
- OU hasn't allowed 300 yards rushing since Nebraska did so in 1997 (48 straight games).
- OU hasn't allowed 200 or more yards rushing in 30 straight games.
- OU has forced at least one turnover in 32 of the last 35 games.
- In the 34 games under this staff, OU opponents have scored 14+ points just 11 times.
- OU has gotten a hand on 87 (72 PBU, 15 INTs) of the opposition's 134 incompletions.
- OU has returned five takeaways for touchdowns. Of the other 18 takeaways, OU's offense took over, on average, at the opponents' 31.5 yardline.
- Twelve different players have accounted for OU's 26 takeaways this season.
- Oklahoma's defense has scored in seven of the last 13 regular season games.
- OU has averaged 16.9 yards on returns of 11 INTs (one TD) and six fumbles (four TDs).

### Third Down Thoughts

For the year, Sooner foes are just 37-of-162 on third down for a paltry 22.8%. After intermission, Oklahoma opponents have converted just 15-of-79 for 18.9%.

### Top-Ranked Rushing Foes

Both Kansas State and Nebraska entered their respective game with Oklahoma ranked as the nation's top rushing team. Neither came close to their average against the Sooners ...

- Kansas State came in at 308.5, had 189 vs. OU (61% of the average).
- Nebraska came in at 338.8, had 164 vs. OU (48% of the average).

- Fourteen Sooners, one more than last season have at least one pass reception.
- Sixteen Sooners have scored TDs this season as compared with 15 all last season.

### Offensive Efficiency

- OU foes have 47 more rushing attempts than the Sooners, but 316 fewer rushing yards.
- OU opponents have 111 fewer passing attempts than the Sooners, but four more INTs.
- OU opponents have had nine more third-downs than the Sooners, but converted 20 less.
- In the last three years, OU completed 851-of-1,363 passes for a completion rate of 62.4%.
- OU ran more plays than the foe once in the first four games, but has now done so in five
  of the last six.

### Sooner Summation

- During Bob Stoops' tenure, Oklahoma has set 33 school records.
- OU is 27-20 in Big 12 games with wins in 14 of its last 15. Bob Stoops is 19-4 vs. the Big 12.
- OU lost four fumbles over the first three games, four since then. Similarly, six of the 11 INTs came over the first four games.
- Never before have two QBs cracked the school's top 10 list for completion percentage, but that could change. Jason White completed 73-of-113 for a rate of 64.6%. That's 0.1% behind Josh Heupel's record of 64.7% set last season. Nate Hybl is at 62.5% (140-of-227), No. 3 on the list.
- OU averaged at least 40 punting yards in each game except Texas (39.9) and Nebraska (38.6) when the team executed late pooches (by Tim Duncan). Opponents averaged 40 yards just five times.
- Run backs of interceptions and fumbles amount to 278 yards for OU, just 109 for the opponents.
- Under Bob Stoops, Oklahoma has held a double digit lead in all but five of its 35 games (exceptions: CU, TT and Ole Miss, in 1999, Texas A&M in 2000 and NU in 2001).
- OU's FB and MBB teams worked with Norman firefighters Sept. 28 at a car wash to raise \$20,000 for firefighters in NYC. During the K-State game, fans donated \$70,000 for the United Way.
- Oklahoma has a blocked a PAT vs. Kansas State (Rocky Calmus) and a FG vs. Texas (Andre Woolfolk), and now has eight blocked kicks during Bob Stoops' three-year tenure.
- OU has 23 scoring drives of less than two minutes in 2001, 84 over the last three years.
- OU has at least one TD from a unit other than the offense in 14 of Bob Stoops' 35 games.
- LB Rocky Calmus, P Jeff Ferguson, LS Ben Panter, WR Josh Norman and OT Frank Romero are team leaders in games played at 46. Panter's 46 straight starts lead the squad. Of the regular position players, the longest starting strings belong to Romero, SS Roy Williams and DE Cory Heinecke at 27.
- As part of the OU's \$100 million Great Expectations: The Campaign for Sooner Sports, Memorial
  Stadium will be upgraded. The \$65 million project will renovate facility structures and amenities, replace
  current seating, and add new seating including 2,200 club seats and 27 sky suites to bring capacity to
  more than 80,000. Work will start just after this season and be complete in time for the 2003 season.

klahoma head coach Bob Stoops has coached in 13 bowl games, including two as a head coach.


For many, those accomplishments would read rather nicely for a career. For Stoops, it represents a good start.

At the tender coaching age of 40, OU's

head coach led his team to the 2000 national championship and emerged as the consensus national coach of the year.

Stoops shrugs at the overwhelming nature of his early success while keeping himself and his team focused on the future. Still, what is done is done, and the early returns are more than impressive ...

• He is just the second coach to lead his first two OU teams to bowls (Chuck Fairbanks was the other).



• In 17 home games, his Oklahoma teams have out-scored their opponents 667-165.

• His teams are 9-1 against top 10 teams and won those games by an average of 16.0

• Every home game of his OU tenure has been a sellout. The average attendance at Memoria Stadium during Stoops' tenure is 75,055. The facility has a listed capacity of 72,765.

If not for the meteoric pace, Stoops' resume would read like a textbook rise to a head coaching position.

A four-year starter as a player at lowa, he began his coaching career in a volunteer capacity at his alma mater in 1983. He worked his way through the ranks (see the chart at left) until he became defensive coordinator at Kansas State from 1991-95. There he played a key role in one of the most impressive turnarounds in college football history. During his final four seasons there, K-State posted a 35-12 record and played in three bowl games.

Then came a three-year stint as Florida's

defensive coordinator from 1996-98. It was during that time that the national spotlight focused sharply on his accomplishments and the door opened for a head coaching post.


At Oklahoma he has restored the tradition of Sooner football, while also carving out a niche' for this era and these teams.

> OU employs a balanced and unpredictable offense (Sooner receivers rushed for 261 yards last season) and the kind of impenetrable defense (No. 5 in total defense and scoring defense in 2000) one might expect from a coach who spent much of his career on that side of the ball.

> Not surprisingly, Sooner fans love their head coach and are tangible in their affection -- every home game of Stoops' tenure has been a

sellout.

To paraphrase Stoops' post-Orange Bowl comment, Oklahoma is indeed "back" and it's a return that not so coincidentally mirrors the tenure of the Sooner coach.

Rocky Calmus leads the Sooners with 93 tackles.

- · Six double digit tackle games, including 12 against Texas A&M.
- Only the fifth Sooner to reach 400 career tackles and he has 16 double-digit tackle games for his
  career, including three this season.
- His 53 career tackles for loss rate as a school record, breaking the mark of 44 set by Brian Bosworth.
- Calmus has 32 "touches" during his career -- 23 deflections, six fumble recoveries and three
  interceptions. Of the four takeaways he has returned (had no return on one of the interceptions), he has
  averaged 28.7 yards with three touchdowns.

C Vince Carter, a true freshman, made his first start vs. K-State and has started every game since then.

WR Mark Clayton made first career start vs. K-State and is enjoying a remarkable freshman campaign ...

- Has 35 receptions this season to set a freshman record at OU. Antwone Savage had 31 in 1999.
- Only wide receiver on the team with a catch in every game this season.
- Tied Quentin Griffin's Oklahoma freshman record with eight receptions against Baylor. His 108 receiving yards in that game rank No. 2 by a Sooner freshman.

**OG Howard Duncan** has won a national championship in every year of his collegiate competition -- two that he won at Butler County Community College and one that he won at Oklahoma.

· Moved from right tackle to left guard prior to the Kansas game.

**K Tim Duncan** set a school record for points by a kicker with 16 vs. Tulsa ...

- · Has made seven consecutive field goals.
- · Has 278 career points and is only the 15th Sooner to reach 200.
- This season, he has drilled 41-of-43 PATs (miss came from 35 yards following OU penalties, another was blocked).
- He has made 100 of his last 102 PATs and now ranks No. 4 in school history with 39 field goals.
- Scored the second TD of his career with a 10-yard rush on a fake FG against Texas A&M.

FS Brandon Everage had a career-high 12 tackles at Air Force.

- Has 49 tackles this season as compared to 50 during the entire 2000 campaign.
- Eleven tackles and two fumbles forced at Kansas.
- · Got his first career sack against Kansas State.
- Has his first interception of the season against Nebraska, and added five tackles.

**WR/PR Curtis Fagan** had no collegiate punt returns prior to the North Texas game, Now, in four games in that role, Fagan has 40 returns for an average of 7.4 yards.

- He needs four touchdown receptions to reach 14 for his career and a Sooner record.
- Needs just three receptions to reach 100.

### P Jeff Ferguson is a do-it-all punter ...

- Averaging 43.9 yards with 18 kicks downed inside the 20 and 10 inside the 10.
- Could become only the second Sooner to average at least 40 yards in each of his four years (Michael Keeling accomplished the feat 1979-82).
- With a 42.9-yard career average, the senior is attempting to break a 60-year-old Oklahoma mark, Jack Jacobs' career punting standard of 42.3 yards, which was set from 1939-41.
- Of his 218 career punts, 66 (nearly one-third) have pinned the opponent inside the 20.
- His 71-yarder at Air Force was the second-longest of his career. He has 45 of 50 yards or longer in his career, including 16 this season.
- Opponents average 9.3 yards per return, but that number is misleading. Minus an 89 yarder by North Carolina's Michael Waddell, the foes average just 5.3. Just 30 of his 59 punts have been returned.

**OT Jerod Fields** is a true freshman tackle who got his first collegiate start at Nebraska and has started every game since that time.

**RB Quentin Griffin** holds the school record for receptions in consecutive games with 27. The streak is ongoing and covers every game of his career.

- Rushed 11 times for 90 yards against Tulsa, while also catching eight passes for 72 yards. Rushed for three touchdowns and scored a fourth on a reception. It was the sixth multi-TD game of his career.
- Has 30 career touchdowns (27 rushing, 3 receiving).
- Since rushing for just six yards at Kansas, he has gained at least 50 yards in four straight games and averaged 4.7 yards per carry.

**DT Bary Holleyman** has at least one tackle for loss in six of the eight games this season.

· Six of his last seven tackles were unassisted.

QB Nate Hybl started the first six games, then returned as the starter in game nine against Tulsa.

- Since returning to the starting role vs. Tulsa, he has completed 63-of-86 passes (73.3%) for 542 yards with four touchdowns and one interception.

- Became the holder for placements when Jason White was injured (during the Nebraska game).

**LB Brandon Moore** had a career-high seven tackles at Air Force, then set a career-best for TFL with five against North Texas.

WR Josh Norman had a career-long 57-yard reception (TD) vs. North Texas.

- Needs just 31 receiving yards to reach 1,000 for his career.
- Had five catches and 42 receiving yards against Baylor. That was his second-best outing of the year behind his 6-catch, 120-yard effort against North Texas.

**QB Jason White** will miss the remainder of the season with a knee injury, suffered in the second quarter of the Nebraska game.

- In his first collegiate start against Baylor, he set a school record for total plays with 64. He also completed 32-of-44 passes for 343 yards, the 10th-best yardage total in school history, with one touchdown toss and no interceptions.
- Against Texas, he entered the game in the second quarter when Nate Hybl left with an injury. He hit 16-of-23 passes in that game for 108 yards and rushed 12 times for a team-high 38 yards.
- At Kansas, he again entered the game in the second quarter and hit 18-of-29 passes for 151 yards with four TDs and two INTs. Also rushed 12 times for 117 yards (9.8/carry), the first 100-yard rushing performance by a Sooner QB since Eric Moore's 141 yards vs. Baylor in 1997.

**DE Jimmy Wilkerson** leads the team with 17 tackles for loss, the sixth-highest figure ever for a Sooner defensive lineman ...

- Forced the fumble that Roy Williams returned 18 yards for a touchdown against Kansas State. Also
  had four tackles for loss in that game.
- · Career-best 11 tackles against North Texas.
- He has at least one tackle for loss in seven of the 10 games this season.
- Tied for the team lead with 11 quarterback hurries.

S Roy Williams is having a monster season ...

- Made his fifth interception of the season and the ninth of his career against Tulsa.
- Needs just one pass broken up to set season and career records at Oklahoma.
- Has his second double-digit tackle game of the season with 11 against Texas A&M.
- Nine tackles, five passes broken up and one interception against Baylor.
- Seven tackles and a seven-yard fumble return at Kansas.
- Nine tackles, including one for loss, and a pass breakup in the Nebraska game.

**CB/WR Andre Woolfolk** started at WR and CB in the first two games, a role he also filled last season. He is the first Sooner to play both ways since Bud Hebert (A-bare) worked at both S and SE in 1979.

- Expected to miss three to four weeks with a sprained knee suffered vs. Tulsa. Did not play vs. A&M.
- Played exclusively on defense in the Kansas State, Texas and Kansas games, but then re-emerged on
  offense against Baylor when he made two receptions for 48 yards.


