SCENE SETTER

Oklahoma plays it first road game of the season when it travels to Alabama. This marks the Sooners' first trip to a Southeastern Conference venue since Sept. 18, 1982, when they prevailed at Kentucky, 29-8. The trip to Tuscaloosa will be the first by an OU football team to the state of Alabama. The Crimson Tide open with five straight home games this season. The first was last week against South Florida in Birmingham. This contest represents the first of four straight in Tuscaloosa.

THE POLLS

OU is No. 1 in both the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today polls. Alabama is unranked, but received votes in the AP Poll. Never before has the Crimson Tide hosted the No. 1-ranked team.

THE SERIES

The series is knotted at 1-1-1. Last year's game, a 37-27 win for OU in Norman, Okla., was the first meeting between the two during the regular season. Alabama prevailed in the 1963 Orange Bowl, 17-0, then the two teams played to a 24-all stalemate in the 1970 Astro-Bluebonnet Bowl.

LAST YEAR'S GAME

Oklahoma roared to a 23-3 halftime bulge, then was stunned by an Alabama comeback that resulted in the Crimson Tide taking a 27-23 lead. OU regrouped when Renaldo Works took a pair of shovel passes for a total of 62 yards to set up an 8-yard touchdown burst by Kejuan Jones. That play came with just 2:11 remaining to retrieve the lead for the Sooners. On the ensuing possession, Alabama was on the move when QB Tyler Watts fumbled. OU safety Eric Bassey scooped up the ball and ran 45 yards for the TD that iced the game.

THE COACHES

Oklahoma: Bob Stoops (lowa '78), now in his fifth season with the Sooners, is 44-9 overall. He is 3-1 in bowls, 3-0 in January bowls, 2-0 in BCS games, 26-7 vs. the Big 12, 15-5 vs. the Big 12 South, 11-2 vs. the Big 12 North, 2-0 in the Big 12 Championship game, 18-2 vs. nonconference foes, 24-1 at home, 12-6 on the road, 8-2 on neutral fields and 1-0 vs. Alabama. **Alabama:** Mike Shula (Alabama '87) is 1-0 in his first year at his alma mater.

ON THE AIR

ESPN is televising nationally. The broadcasters are Ron Franklin (play-by-play), Mike Gottfried (color) and Adrian Karsten (sideline). The Sooner Network has the radio call with Bob Barry, Sr., (play-by-play), Merv Johnson (color) and Mark Rodgers (sideline). In addition, the ESPN Gameday television and radio crews will be on hand. Chris Fowler, Lee Corso and Kirk Herbstreit will be on the TV side, while Mel Kiper Jr., and Dave Revsine will be on the radio side.

ABOUT THE OPPONENT

- Alabama opened with a 40-17 win over South Florida, a team Oklahoma defeated in Norman last season, 31-14. OU, on the other hand, opened this season with a 37-3 win over North Texas, a team the Crimson Tide downed last year, 33-7.
- Alabama under first-year head coach Mike Shula, returns 43 lettermen and 13 starters (six offense, six defense and one specialist) from last year's 10-3 team that tied for first in the SEC West and earned a No. 11 ranking in the final AP poll.
- Alabama and South Florida were knotted at 17 at halftime of last week's game, but the Crimson Tide scored 16 unanswered points in the third quarter. The big blow was a 73-yard punt return for a touchdown by Shaud Williams. It was on of three touchdowns the former Texas Tech back scored.
- At age 38, Shula is the second-youngest head coach in I-A behind Rutgers' Greg Schianno. OU's Bob Stoops was 39 when he entered his first season with the Sooners in 1999.
- There are two former I-A head coaches on the Alabama staff. Dave Rader was the head man at Tulsa from 1988-99 and Sparky Woods was in charge at South Carolina from 1989-93.
- There is one Oklahoman on the Alabama roster -- WLB Mark Anderson (Tulsa)

OKLAHOMA-ALABAMA TIES

- Alabama offensive coordinator Dave Rader is a Tulsa native, who was a standout player at TU and the Golden Hurricane head coach from 1988-99.
- UA defensive line coach Buddy Wyatt was Oklahoma State's defensive line coach in 1996.
- Assistant head coach and defensive coordinator Joe Kines was Florida State's linebackers coach when OU and FSU met in the 2000 national championship game.
- Secondary coach Chris Ball and offensive line coach Bob Connelly were on the Washington State staff that opposed OU in last season's Rose Bowl.
- OU defensive line coach Jackie Shipp held the same position at Alabama in 1998. Sooner running backs coach Cale Gundy was on the Alabama-Birmingham staff from 1995-98.

OKLAHOMA LAST WEEK

- Oklahoma opened with a 37-3 victory over two-time defending Sun Belt Conference champion and reigning New Orleans Bowl winner, North Texas.
- The game drew a crowd of 83,073 in the expanded Gaylord Family Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. It is believed to be the largest gathering ever assembled for an event in the state of Oklahoma, which has a population of 3.5 million people.
- The Sooner Legacy uniforms worn by OU were representative of those worn by Sooner teams from 1946-1965. The last time OU wore similar uniforms was Dec. 4, 1965.
- These players made first career starts: RB Renaldo Works, OT Chris Messner, WR Jejuan Rankins TE James Moses, SS Donte Nicholson and FS Brodney Pool.
- OU is now 83-20-6 in season openers, including a 50-8-5 record in Norman. OU head coach Bob Stoops is 5-0 in home openers.
- Oklahoma had a 30-0 lead before UNT moved down field for a field goal. The penetration came against a defense comprised largely of non-starters.
- For the third consecutive time OU scored 37 points against North Texas: 37-9 in 1998; 37-10 in 2001 and 37-3 this season.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

In Bob Stoops' three seasons, Oklahoma is 15-1 in regular season non-conference games. Throw in the four bowl tilts and the Sooners are 18-2 vs. non-Big 12 teams.

- OU has won 14 straight non-conference games, including the Rose Bowl victory over Washington State in January. That streak includes five games that were not played in Norman.
- OU's last loss to a non-league opponent came on Dec. 31, 1999, when Mississippi downed the Sooners, 27-25, in the Independence Bowl. The last regular season setback at the hands of a non-conference foe came on Oct. 2, 1999, when Notre Dame clipped OU, 34-30.
- Oklahoma is 18-8-3 vs. teams currently holding membership in the Southeastern Conference.
- Two of OU's four bowl opponents under Bob Stoops have been from the SEC. The Sooners dropped the 1999 Independence Bowl to Mississippi (27-25), then whipped Arkansas in the 2002 Cotton Bowl (2001 season), 10-3.

OU'S NON-LEAGUE FOES IMPRESSIVE

SOONERS NO. 1

Oklahoma is ranked No. 1 in both polls and was the preseason No. 1, too. It is the ninth time overall and the first time since 1987 that the Sooners have entered a year atop the AP rankings. In four of those seasons, OU went on to win the national championship.

- The Sooners are 59-6-0 when carrying the No. 1 ranking.
- Oklahoma has the third-longest active streak in terms of consecutive weeks in the AP rankings. Michigan tops the list at 79, followed by Miami at 57 and OU at 54.
- Oklahoma media relations personnel was able to uncover 18 different preseason rankings for college football. Oklahoma is No. 1 in 10 of those with a composite ranking of No. 1. None of those rankings lists OU any lower than No. 4.

THE WHITE STUFF

No. 20

In his first game back from a second rehab for a torn ACL, Sooner QB Jason White was impressive against North Texas. He completed 23-of-35 passes for 248 yards with three touchdowns and one interception. He left the game with more than 11 minutes remaining. White tore is left ACL in the 2001 game at Nebraska. He then tore his right ACL in last season's game against Alabama. In neither case was he injured by contact.

- White is now No. 17 on OU's career passing list with 1,219 yards, just three behind No. 16 Steve Collins. White has played in 12 games during his career.
- White threw one more pass (35) against North Texas than he attempted in his two games played combined last season (34).
- White has thrown nine touchdown passes over his last six games played, only five of which were starting assignments. In his five career starts combined, White is 80-of-126 (.635) for 822 yards and five touchdowns with four interceptions. He did not play past the mid-point of the second quarter in two of those starts. OU is 4-1 in White's starts.

CATCHING ON

Oklahoma entered this season minus the top four pass catchers in school history (by receptions). RB Quentin Griffin, WR Curtis Fagan, WR Antwone Savage and TE Trent Smith all finished their eligibility last season. Couple that with the fact that Will Peoples, the top returning receiver with 39 catches a year ago, missed opener with a mild knee ailment, and the first-game effort by the receiving corps was particularly impressive ...

- Jejuan Rankins' three-yard touchdown reception from Jason White in the first quarter was the first reception and touchdown of his career. The last player to score a touchdown on his first career pass reception was Arthur Guess in 1987 against Tulsa on a 21-yd. pass. Rankins became the 37th Sooner to catch two or more touchdown passes in a single game and the ninth during Stoops' era. He also is just the third Sooner to do so in a season opener.
- The 64-yard touchdown from Jason White to Brandon Jones, who also is an outfielder on OU's baseball team, was a personal best for both players. Jones, who entered the game with nine career receptions for 133 yards, also recorded career highs in total receptions (10) and yards (121). The 100-yard game was a first for Jones, the 54th in Oklahoma history and the 15th in the Stoops era. Jones' 10 catches also represented the most by a Sooner in a season opener. Jones' 121 yards in receptions ranks third all-time for a season opener.
- Travis Wilson's 13-yard touchdown reception was the second touchdown of his career. Wilson pulled down an 11-yard TD against UTEP last season. Wilson nearly equaled his career output at receiver in the game. Coming in, he had five career receptions for 50 yards. He finished the opener with four receptions for 58 yards.
- Tight end James "Bubba" Moses entered this season with two career receptions, but made three for 30 yards in his first career start.

STRAIT TALK

Derrick Strait was named SBC Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts against North Texas. He had seven tackles, one fumble forced (a turnover that was later converted into a touchdown by the OU offense) and one pass broken up. The pass deflection was the 44th of his career, tying a school mark set by current Dallas Cowboy Roy Williams.

TREY GOOD FOR THREE

K Trey DiCarlo got off to a good start with his work against North Texas -- he made all three of his field goal (37, 40, 46), the last of which tied a career long. He has now made his last four field goals in a row. The best streak of his career is six straight, which ran from the Texas A&M game through his first made field goal in the Rose Bowl. Dating back to the 2002 Texas A&M game, DiCarlo has made 10 of 11 field goal attempts. Perhaps even more impressive in the North Texas game was the fact that three of his kickoffs resulted in touchbacks. Last year, he had just nine all season.

FOR STARTERS

CB Derrick Strait, already the career leader for games started and consecutive starts by a defensive back, makes his 42nd start this week. He currently ranks No. 12 in career games started (tracked only since 1980).

- The defensive unit's nine return starters have a combined 253 starting assignments at OU.
- The offensive line contains no seniors, but has a combined 76 starts.

STILL YOUNG

Twenty-two of the players listed on Oklahoma's depth chart are freshmen or sophomores. The first depth chart of last season had 26 players that fit that bill.

• On opening night, the Sooner offense started two seniors, four juniors, four sophomores and a freshman. The defense started with five seniors, five juniors and one sophomore. OU's starting punter was a junior and the kicker a sophomore.

ABOUT THE SOONER DEFENSE

- Last season, Oklahoma led the nation with 24 interceptions. It was the third straight season the team posted 20, a first at OU.
- Over it's last three bowl games, all in January and two as part of the BCS, OU has given up a grand total of 19 points. Only two touchdowns have been scored against the Sooner defense.
- Oklahoma has forced at least one turnover in 47 of the 53 games over the last five years and has at least one interception in 35 of the last 41 contests.
- Sooner opponents have completed 50% of their passes just 19 times in the 53 games coached by Stoops. North Texas was 7-of-25.
- OU foes have scored 14 or more points just 20 times in the last 53 games.
- Under Stoops, the Sooners have five shutouts. Opponents failed to score more than seven points in 19 of the 53 games.

ABOUT THE SOONER OFFENSE

- OU ranked among the top 30 in the nation in scoring in each of Bob Stoops' four years.
- Last season, the Sooners rushed for 190.6 yards per game, an increase of 71.2 yards over the previous season.
- Under Bob Stoops, OU's offense has produced the career passing leader, the top four career receivers and the No. 4 career rusher in school history.
- Over the last five seasons, the Sooners have scored 52 TDs that covered 25 or more yards.
- The quick-striking offense has 149 scoring drives of two minutes or less under Bob Stoops.

MANY HAPPY RETURNS

A look at the OU special teams under Bob Stoops ...

- Kickoff Returns -- There have been 23 of 25 yards or more with four touchdowns.
- Punt Returns -- There have been 25 returns of 15 or more yards with seven touchdowns.
- Interceptions -- There have been 37 returns of 10 or more yards with nine touchdowns.
- Fumbles -- Two returns of 15 or more yards with two touchdowns.

SPECIAL? THEY'RE MORE THAN SPECIAL

A look at special teams notes from Bob Stoops' era as OU's head coach ...

- There have been 15 special teams touchdowns, including eight in the last 25 regular season games. Those eight came via four different plays -- two punt returns, two faked field goals, a blocked punt, a kickoff return and a faked punt. The special teams also own one safety.
- OU has returned four kickoffs and seven punts for touchdowns.
- The Sooners have blocked 14 kicks.

THE UNDER-APPRECIATED STAT

When Bob Stoops arrived at Oklahoma prior to the 1999 season, it had been five

seasons since the storied Sooner program had finished above .500, four since it last played in a bowl game.

In Stoops' first three seasons, OU captured a national championship, 31 victories and three bowl appearances. The lightningquick return to national prominence was so complete as to almost obliterate per-haps the most impressive achievement of all ... the turnaround itself.

Few could have envisioned OU's dip in

the middle '90's. Fewer could have predicted the extent to which the Schooner would be righted under Stoops.

The head coach stubbornly points to the program as a whole when defining the resurgence. Humility aside, it is Stoops who deserve a lion's share of the credit ...

- · He is the first OU coach to take his first three teams to bowl games.
- One of 18 head coaches hired on the D-I level in 1999, he has been the most successful of the class with a 41-9 mark.
- His 31-7 three-year start is the fifthbest three-year mark in NCAA history.
- · More than 70 school records have been set during the his tenure.
- In 24 home games, his teams have out-scored their opponents 785-208.
- · Every home game of his OU tenure has been a sellout. The average attendance at Memorial Stadium during that time is 75,075. The facility has a listed capacity of 72,765.
- During his tenure, OU has 18 national television appearances, nine vists from ESPN's GameDay and five cover photos on Sports Illustrated.

If not for its meteoric pace, Stoops' career would read like a textbook rise in the coaching profession.

A four-year starter as a player at lowa, he began his coaching career in a volun-



Then came a threeyear stint as Florida's defensive coordinator from 1996-98. It was during that time that the national spotlight

focused on his accomplishments. The move to a head coaching role was a hiring for the ages in Norman.

Stoops has restored the Sooner pride, while carving out a niche' for a new era.

Jason White, in his debut after a second reconstructive knee surgery, fired three touchdown passes and Oklahoma's defense was dominant in a 37-3 win over two-time defending Sun Belt Conference champion North Texas.
