GAME 3: OKLAHOMA SOONERS VS. FRESNO STATE BULLDOGS September 13. 2003 • 2:40 p.m.

Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium • Norman, Okla.

SCENE SETTER

Oklahoma (2-0) and Fresno State (1-1), a pair of teams coming off thrilling victories last week, collide in Norman, Okla. It's the first time these two have gotten together on the gridiron. OU prevailed at Alabama last Saturday, 20-13, while the Bulldogs took a 16-14 home triumph against Oregon State.

THE POLLS

OU is No. 1 in both the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today polls. Fresno State is unranked.

THE SERIES

It's the first meeting for these two programs. Fresno State plays in the Western Athletic Conference and Oklahoma holds an all-time mark of 35-11-2 against teams currently holding membership in that league. OU played two WAC teams last season in Tulsa (W, 37-0) and Texas-El Paso (W, 68-0). Fresno State is 1-8 vs. OU's conference, the Big 12, but that win came in its most recent contest against a Big 12 foe, a 24-22 victory at Colorado in 2001.

THE COACHES

Oklahoma: Bob Stoops (Iowa '78), now in his fifth season with the Sooners, is 45-9 overall. He is 3-1 in bowls, 3-0 in January bowls, 2-0 in BCS games, 26-7 vs. the Big 12, 15-5 vs. the Big 12 South, 11-2 vs. the Big 12 North, 2-0 in the Big 12 Championship game, 19-2 vs. nonconference foes, 24-1 at home, 13-6 on the road, 8-2 on neutral fields and 0-0 vs. Fresno State.

Fresno State: Pat Hill (UC-Riverside '73) is 47-31 in his seventh season at Fresno State. He is 0-0 against Oklahoma.

SPECIAL EVENTS

Sooner Fan Fest opens at 11:30 a.m., in the area between the stadium and McCasland Field House. Oklahoma's 2002 NCAA national champion men's gymnastics teams will sign autographs from noon-1 p.m.

Pre-Game ceremonies will include a recognition of OU's National Merit Scholars. **Halftime** ceremonies will include recognition of OU's 2003 NCAA national champion men's gymnastics team.

OU Tops Big 12 Grad Rates

University of Oklahoma has announced that its students athletes achieved a record graduation rate of 74%, leading the Big 12 Conference. The graduation rate was announced as part of a national release by the NCAA. This report, which measures the class that entered in 1996, recognizes OU as one of 15 institutions that will receive a \$20,000 achievement award sponsored by *USA Today*. The OU rate, which showed a 40% hike, experienced the greatest increase in I-A. OU also announced a record rate in football of 65%, which ranks No. 2 in the Big 12 behind Baylor's 75%. Eleven of 17 football players graduated. Four of the six who did not transferred in good academic standing.

ABOUT THE OPPONENT

- Fresno State opened the season Aug. 30 with a 24-6 loss at Tennessee, before posting a 16-14 triumph over Oregon State on Friday, Sept. 5. Brett Visintainer's 47-yard field goal with 31 seconds remaining lifted the Bulldogs to the come-from-behind victory.
- RB Rodney Davis, the nation's No. 3 rusher last season, ran for 1,586 yards in 2002 to set a single season record for his school. So far this season, he has 32 attempts for 50 net yards.
- Fresno State has a pair of dangerous receivers in Marque Davis and Bernard Berrian. Both have eight receptions this season. Davis' grabs went for 137 yards, while Berrian's covered 108 and included one touchdown.
- QB Jeff Grady has completed 35-of-73 passes (.479) for 394 yards and one touchdown. He has been sacked four times.
- Fresno State has seven interceptions thus far, including two each by DBs Richard Marshall Dee Meza. Marshall's returns have gone for 83 yards and one touchdown.
- The top tackler thus far is LB Bryce McGill with 15 stops.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN'

This is the first of two straight Oklahoma games against teams from California. UCLA visits Norman for a Sept. 20 contest. Here is more on OU and the Golden State ...

- There are six current Sooners from California -- TE Chris Chester (Tustin), QB Tommy Grady (Huntington Beach), SLB Pasha Jackson (Hayward), DB Aaron Miller (Fresno), MLB Lance Mitchell (Los Banos) and S Donte Nicholson (Walnut). Jackson, Mitchell and Nicholson are listed as starters on the current depth chart.
- Oklahoma's Tommy Grady and Fresno State's Jeff Grady, both quarterbacks, are brothers. Tommy is a true freshman and Jeff is a senior.
- Fresno State's roster, almost exclusively of Californians, includes no Oklahomans.
- OU's Aaron Miller, Fresno State DB Clifton Miller and Fresno State WR Deandre Gilbert all attended Edison HS in Fresno. OU's Chris Chester and Fresno State LB Ricky Miller both attended Tustin HS in Tustin, Calif.

OKLAHOMA LAST WEEK

- Oklahoma led from wire-to-wire in defeating Alabama, 20-13, at Tuscaloosa, Ala. It was the second win in as many years for the Sooners over the Crimson Tide.
- It was just the 12th time Alabama had lost its Tuscaloosa opener ... against 93 wins and a tie.
- Jason White completed 21-of-35 passes for 259 yards with two touchdowns, one of 47 yards to Brandon Jones and one of 46 yards to Mark Clayton.
- OU did not surrender a sack and was penalized just three times.
- OU's defense got six sacks and two interceptions (Antonio Perkins and Donte Nicholson).
- The big play of the game was a faked punt that went for 22 yards. P Blake Ferguson passed to DB Michael Thompson. On the next play, White fired his TD strike to Jones.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

In Bob Stoops' five seasons, Oklahoma is 16-1 in regular season non-conference games. Throw in the four bowl tilts and the Sooners are 19-2 vs. non-Big 12 teams.

- OU has won 15 straight non-conference games, including the Rose Bowl victory over Washington State in January. That streak includes six games that were not played in Norman.
- OU's last loss to a non-league opponent came on Dec. 31, 1999, when Mississippi downed the Sooners, 27-25, in the Independence Bowl. The last regular season setback at the hands of a non-conference foe came on Oct. 2, 1999, when Notre Dame clipped OU, 34-30.

OU'S NON-LEAGUE FOES IMPRESSIVE

SOONERS NO. 1

Oklahoma is ranked No. 1 in both polls and was the preseason No. 1, too. It is the ninth time overall and the first time since 1987 that the Sooners have entered a year atop the AP rankings. In four of those seasons, OU went on to win the national championship.

- The Sooners are 60-6-0 when carrying the No. 1 ranking.
- Oklahoma has the third-longest active streak in terms of consecutive weeks in the AP rankings. Michigan tops the list at 80, followed by Miami at 58 and OU at 56.
- Oklahoma media relations personnel were able to uncover 18 different preseason rankings for college football. Oklahoma is No. 1 in 10 of those with a composite ranking of No. 1. None of those rankings lists OU any lower than No. 4.

SEE YOU IN SEPTEMBER

Bob Stoops' Oklahoma teams are now 14-0 in the month of September. No other Sooner coach can match that feat. OU legend Barry Switzer went 21 games without a loss in September, but tied his second game played in that month (9/20/73 vs. USC). Here is a rundown of Stoops' September outings ...

ZERO-BASED FOOTBALL

Oklahoma did not allow a sack in the game at Alabama, nor did the Sooners commit a turnover. Here is more on those two feats ...

- It was the sixth game of the Bob Stoops era that yielded no turnovers for OU. The others were in 2001 against Texas and in 2002 against UTEP, Alabama, Baylor, Oklahoma State.
- OU has had fewer turnovers than its opponent in 11 of 16 games over the last two seasons.
- The Alabama game was the ninth in which a Stoops team did not surrender a sack. The others were the 1999 games against Indiana State, Texas A&M, Missouri and Iowa State; the 2000 game against Texas Tech; the 2001 game at Air Force and the 2002 outings against Texas Tech and Colorado.

THE WHITE STUFF

The injury story is well known, but here's a refresher ... QB Jason White tore his left ACL in the 2001 game at Nebraska. He then tore his right ACL in last season's game against Alabama. In neither case was he injured by contact.

- So far this season, he has drilled 44-of-70 passes (.629) for 507 yards with five touchdowns and one interception, a desperation heave on a fairly meaningless fourth down against North Texas.
- White is now No. 15 on OU's career passing list with 1,369 yards, just 10 behind No. 14 Jack Jacobs. White has played in 13 games during his career.
- White has thrown 11 touchdown passes over his last seven games played, only six of which were starting assignments. In his five career starts combined, White is 101-of-161 (.627) for 1,081 yards and seven touchdowns with four interceptions. He did not play past the mid-point of the second guarter in two of those starts. OU is 5-1 in White's starts.

CATCHING ON

Oklahoma entered this season minus the top four pass catchers in school history (by receptions). RB Quentin Griffin, WR Curtis Fagan, WR Antwone Savage and TE Trent Smith all finished their eligibility last season. Couple that with the fact that Will Peoples, the top returning receiver with 39 catches a year ago, missed the first two games with a mild knee/ankle ailment, and the early-season efforts by the receiving corps has been particularly impressive ...

- The group of players that has accounted for Oklahoma's receptions this season posted 39 grabs for 766 yards and 12 touchdowns last season. In '03, they already have 50 receptions for 567 yards and six touchdowns.
- Through his first two seasons of eligibility, Brandon Jones had nine receptions for 133 yards and three touchdowns. Through two games this season, he has 17 catches for 207 yards and two touchdowns.
- With five receptions for 68 yards, Mark Clayton is now at 1,003 receiving yards for his career. He is the 18th OU player to eclipse 1,000 yards.
- Jejuan Rankins' three-yard touchdown reception from Jason White in the first quarter of the opener against North Texas was the first reception and touchdown of his career. The last player to score a touchdown on his first career pass reception was Arthur Guess in 1987 against Tulsa on a 21-yard play. Rankins later caught another TD in the game.
- The 64-yard touchdown from Jason White to Brandon Jones against North Texas was a personal best for both players. Jones also recorded career highs in total receptions (10) and yards (121). The 100-yard game was a first for Jones, the 54th in Oklahoma history and the 15th in the Stoops era. Jones' 10 catches also represented the most by a Sooner in a season opener. Jones' 121 yards in receptions ranks No. 3 all-time for a season opener.
- Mark Bradley had his first career reception at Alabama. He actually caught two passes in the game -- one for 35 yards and another for 44.

TRFY GOOD FOR THRFF

K Trey DiCarlo is off to a fast start this season. He has made 5-of-6 field goals and all six of his point after touchdown kicks ...

- Equaled his career-long field goal with a 46-yarder in the opener against North Texas.
- His miss at Alabama ended a string of six consecutive field goal makes dating back to the Rose Bowl. He has made 12 of his last 14 field goal attempts and now ranks No. 8 on the school's career list with 21.
- He has eight multiple field goal games including both contests this season.
- Through two games, he has six touchbacks on his kickoffs. Last year, he had just nine all season.

FOR STARTERS

CB Derrick Strait, already the career leader for games started and consecutive starts by a defensive back, makes his 43nd start this week. He currently ranks No. 10 in career games started (tracked only since 1980).

- The defensive unit's nine return starters have a combined 264 starting assignments at OU.
- The offensive line contains no seniors, but has a combined 87 starts.

STILL YOUNG

Twenty-two of the players listed on Oklahoma's depth chart are freshmen or sophomores. The first depth chart of last season had 26 players that fit that bill.

• On opening night, the Sooner offense started two seniors, four juniors, four sophomores and a freshman. The defense started with five seniors, five juniors and one sophomore. OU's starting punter was a junior and the kicker a sophomore.

ABOUT THE SOONER DEFENSE

- Oklahoma has forced at least one turnover in 48 of the 54 games over the last five years and has at least one interception in 36 of the last 42 contests.
- Sooner opponents have completed 50% of their passes just 20 times in the 54 games coached by Stoops.
- OU foes have scored 14 or more points just 20 times in the last 54 games.
- Under Stoops, the Sooners have five shutouts. Opponents failed to score more than seven points in 19 of the 54 games.
- Last season, Oklahoma led the nation with 24 interceptions. It was the third straight season the team posted 20, a first at OU.
- Over its last three bowl games, all in January and two as part of the BCS, OU has given up a grand total of 19 points. Only two touchdowns have been scored against the Sooner defense.

ABOUT THE SOONER OFFENSE

- OU ranked among the top 30 in the nation in scoring in each of Bob Stoops' four years.
- Last season, the Sooners rushed for 190.6 yards per game, an increase of 71.2 yards over the previous season.
- Under Bob Stoops, OU's offense has produced the career passing leader, the top four career receivers and the No. 4 career rusher in school history.
- Over the last five seasons, the Sooners have scored 54 TDs that covered 25 or more yards.
- The guick-striking offense has 150 scoring drives of two minutes or less under Bob Stoops.

MANY HAPPY RETURNS

A look at the OU special teams under Bob Stoops ...

- Kickoff Returns -- There have been 23 returns of 25 yards or more with four touchdowns.
- Punt Returns -- There have been 25 returns of 15 or more yards with seven touchdowns.
- Interceptions -- There have been 37 returns of 10 or more yards with nine touchdowns.
- Fumbles -- Two returns of 15 or more yards with two touchdowns.

SPECIAL? THEY'RE MORE THAN SPECIAL

A look at special teams notes from Bob Stoops' era as OU's head coach ...

- There have been 15 special teams touchdowns, including eight in the last 26 regular season games. Those eight came via four different plays -- two punt returns, two faked field goals, a blocked punt, a kickoff return and a faked punt. The special teams also own one safety.

When Bob Stoops arrived at Oklahoma prior to the 1999 season, it had been five

seasons since the storied Sooner program had finished above .500, four since it last played in a bowl game.

In Stoops' first four seasons, OU captured a national championship, 43 victories and four bowl appearances. The lightning-quick return to national prominence was so complete as to almost obliterate perhaps the most impressive achievement of all ... the turnaround itself.

Few could have envisioned OU's dip in

the middle '90's. Fewer could have predicted the extent to which the Schooner would be righted under Stoops.

The head coach stubbornly points to the program as a whole when defining the resurgence. Humility aside, it is Stoops who deserve a lion's share of the credit ...

- He is the first OU coach to take his first four teams to bowl games.
- One of 18 head coaches hired on the D-I level in 1999, he has been the most successful of the class with a 45-9 mark.
- More than 70 school records have been set during the his tenure.
- In 25 home games, his teams have out-scored their opponents 822-211.
- Every home game of his OU tenure has been a sellout.
- During his tenure, OU has 20 national television appearances, nine vists from ESPN's GameDay and five cover photos on Sports Illustrated.
- The team set a record football graduation rate of 65%, which ranked No. 2 in the Big 12 Conference in the most recently released figures.

If not for its meteoric pace, Stoops' career would read like a textbook rise in the coaching profession.

A four-year starter as a player at lowa,

he began his coaching career in a volunteer capacity at his alma mater in 1983.



Then came a threeyear stint as Florida's defensive coordinator from 1996-98. It was during that time that the national spotlight focused on his accomplishments. The move

to a head coaching role was a hiring for the ages in Norman.

Stoops has restored the Sooner pride, while carving out a niche' for a new era.

Jason White, in his debut after a second reconstructive knee surgery, fired three touchdown passes and Oklahoma's defense was dominant in a 37-3 win over two-time defending Sun Belt Conference champion North Texas.

The first of three Trey DiCarlo field goals gave the Sooners a lead on their initial possession. Scoring strikes from White to Jejuan Rankins (three yards) and Brandon Jones (64 yards) quickly made the lead comfortable.

North Texas had no success against the OU defense. The Sooners recovered a fumble, intercepted a pass and logged three sacks. Derrick Strait had seven tackles, a forced fumble and a pass deflection to spearhead the effort.

OU's defense logged six sacks and two interceptions to compliment the bigplay offense and strong kicking of Ferguson and Trey DiCarlo.
