SCENE SETTER

Oklahoma plays the middle of three straight home games when it hosts the Texas A&M Aggies. It marks the second time in as many seasons that first-year A&M coach Dennis Franchione has been in Norman. Last season, he led Alabama's Crimson Tide onto Owen Field. The Sooners prevailed in that one, 37-27. This week, OU guns for it's 10th victory. There have been 26 previous seasons in which the Sooners won 10 or more games, including the last three in a row. Bob Stoops, now in his fifth season at the OU helm, already has three double-digit victory seasons. Among Oklahoma coaches, only Barry Switzer managed four such seasons in his first five years. This will be the 1,070th all-time game for Oklahoma, which is 734-282-53.

THE POLLS

Oklahoma is the unanimous No. 1 in the AP and ESPN/USA Today Coaches Polls and has been in every poll this season. Texas A&M is unranked.

SERIES HISTORY

Oklahoma leads the series, 11-10, and has won three of the last four. The Sooners own an 8-2 advantage in Norman. OU had reeled off three straight wins against the Aggies until last year's 30-26 setback at College Station, Texas. That outcome marked the only time in 51 tries that an unranked opponent defeated Oklahoma when the Sooners were ranked No. 1.

THE COACHES

Oklahoma: Bob Stoops (Iowa '83), now in his fifth season with the Sooners, is 52-9 overall. He is 3-1 in bowls, 3-0 in January bowls, 2-0 in BCS games, 31-7 vs. the Big 12, 17-5 vs. the Big 12 South, 14-2 vs. the Big 12 North, 2-0 in the Big 12 Championship game, 21-2 vs. non-conference foes, 28-1 at home, 15-6 on the road, 9-2 on neutral fields, 18-2 against ranked foes and 3-1 vs. Texas A&M.

Texas A&M: Dennis Franchione (Pittsburg State '73) is in his first season as the head coach at Texas A&M. He owns an overall coach mark of 115-73-2 in 21 years on the college level. Franchione (pronounced FRAN-choe-nee) is 0-1 against OU (2002 season as Alabama's head coach).

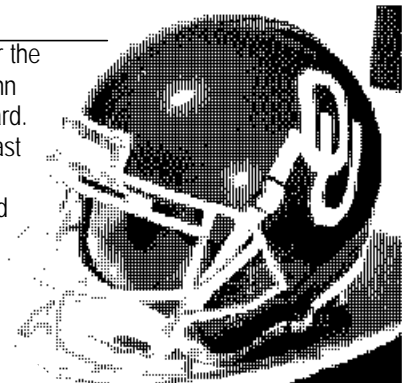

CODY IS BIG 12 DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

OU junior DE Dan Cody is the SBC Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week for his play in last week's win over Oklahoma State. He had four tackles, all for losses, three sacks and one fumble forced in Oklahoma's 52-9 triumph.

RECAPPING LAST WEEK'S HONORS

Tommie Harris and Teddy Lehman were named semifinalists for the Lombardi Award. Also, the FWAA named Mark Clayton and Lynn McGruder as two of 17 nominees for the Most Courageous Award. They pulled victims from a serious automobile accident on I-35 last summer. Renaldo Works was named one of just eight I-A scholar-athletes named by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame.



OU Tops Big 12 Grad Rates

University of Oklahoma has announced that its students athletes achieved a record graduation rate of 74%, leading the Big 12 Conference. The graduation rate was announced as part of a national release by the NCAA. This report, which measures the class that entered in 1996, recognizes OU as one of 15 institutions that will receive a \$20,000 achievement award sponsored by *USA Today*. The OU rate, which showed a 40% hike, experienced the greatest increase in I-A. OU also announced a record rate in football of 65%, which ranks No. 2 in the Big 12 behind Baylor's 75%. Eleven of 17 football players graduated. Four of the six who did not transferred in good academic standing.

Ten and Oh

This team is trying to become the 11th in Oklahoma history to win its first 10 games and the second to do so under Bob Stoops (the other was in 2000).

Rivalry Routs

Oklahoma won its two named rivalry games this year -- Red River Shootout vs. Texas and Bedlam vs. Oklahoma State -- by a combined 85 points (65-13 over Texas and 52-9 over OSU). That was the widest combined margin of victory for OU over those two opponents since the 1956 club rolled up combined victories of 98 points (45-0 over Texas and 53-0 over OSU). What makes that even more impressive is that this is only the seventh season in which both Texas and Oklahoma State were ranked in the same year at the time of the games.

OKLAHOMA'S LAST GAME

Oklahoma throttled No. 14 Oklahoma State, 52-9, last Saturday in Norman ...

- Bob Stoops moved his career coaching mark to 52-9 with a 52-9 victory.
- Every facet of the OU team was clicking, but a special tip of the cap goes to the defense which gave up only 10 first downs, 62 passing yards and 99 rushing yards. Not even the OSU points can be tagged to the Sooner defense since the lone touchdown came on an interception return and the field goal also came after an interception deep in OU territory.
- DE Dan Cody had three sacks, the highest total ever by a Sooner in the Bedlam game.
- OSU's record-setting receiver Rashaun Woods had just four catches for 25 yards.
- The crowd of 84,027 was a record for Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, which means it also was the largest crowd ever for a gathering in the state of Oklahoma.
- OU averted a third straight loss to its in-state rival. Four times OSU has won two in a row over Oklahoma. The Sooners have then won that next game by an average of 41.2 points.
- RB Renaldo Works had 19 rushes for 103 yards to mark the third time in the last four games that he eclipsed the century mark. • Mark Clayton's six receptions went for six first downs, 96 yards and one touchdown.
- Jason White was 11-of-27 for 194 yards. He fired a pair of touchdown passes while running for a third score. He was picked off twice.

SOONERS NO. 1

- The Sooners are 67-6-0 when carrying the No. 1 ranking.
- The Associated Press college football poll debuted in 1936. Since that time, no team has spent more time in the No. 1 position than Notre Dame with 95 weeks. Oklahoma is second on the list and closing. Including this week's poll, OU has been the No. 1 team in 90 weeks. Ohio State is next at 74, followed by Miami at 69 and Florida State at 61.
- This is the 18th week that Oklahoma has held AP's No. 1 spot since Bob Stoops arrived.
- Oklahoma has been ranked among the AP's top 10 in every week but one since Oct. 6, 2000. That one exception saw the Sooners dip to No. 11 prior to defeating Arkansas in the Cotton Bowl at the end of the 2001 season. That win vaulted them back into the top 10.
- Oklahoma was the preseason No. 1. It marked the ninth time overall and the first time since 1987 that the Sooners entered a year atop the AP rankings. In four of those seasons, OU went on to win the national championship.
- Oklahoma has the third-longest active streak in terms of consecutive weeks in the AP rankings. Michigan tops the list at 87, followed by Miami at 65 and OU at 63.

THE WHITE STUFF

QB Jason White tore his left ACL in the 2001 game at Nebraska. He then tore his right ACL in last season's game against Alabama. In neither case was he injured by contact.

- He has drilled 179-of-276 passes (.649) for 2,482 yards with 27 touchdowns and six interceptions. He threw two of his picks against UCLA and was hit on the release both times.

- Has at last one completion of 45 yards or more in each game this season. Has 13 completions of 40 or more yards this season. That's the most ever by an OU quarterback. Josh Heupel (1999) and Steve Davis (1973) both had 11.

- White is now No. 5 on OU's career passing list with 3,334 career yards. He needs 401 to move ahead of Bobby Warmack for No. 4. White has played in 17 games.

- In his 13 career starts (OU is 12-1) combined, White is 236-of-367 (.643) for 3,056 yards and 29 TDs with nine INT. He did not play past the mid-point of the second quarter in two starts.

- The 66-yard TD from White to Brandon Jones (vs. Oklahoma State) was a personal long for both. That pair also connected on a 64-yarder against North Texas.

- Due to a scoring margin, Jason White has finished only three games this season. He threw just four second-half passes vs. Texas. The games White did not close ...

THE "MARK" OF A GREAT RECEIVER

Mark Clayton is one of the top receivers in the nation and certainly one of the hottest ...

- Has a touchdown reception in five straight games. Seven of his nine TD grabs this season have come over the last five games.
- Has four 100-yard games this season and has had 93 or more receiving yards in seven consecutive outings. Caught two passes for 14 yards in the opener, but his worst game since then was three grabs for 54 yards.
- Has six pass receptions of 40 or more yards this season. Only Tinker Owens exceeded that number with seven in 1973.

THAT'S THE YAC, JACK

One of White's greatest attributes is his ability to hit receivers in stride. And the OU receivers are dangerous in that setting. Here's a look at the yards after catch (YAC) for the Sooners ...

CATCHING ON

Oklahoma entered this season minus the top four pass catchers in school history (by receptions). RB Quentin Griffin, WR Curtis Fagan, WR Antwone Savage and TE Trent Smith all finished their eligibility last season. Here's some quick information on this year's corps ...

- **Mark Clayton**, a junior, is fashioning some impressive career numbers. In 34 games, he has 123 receptions for 2990 yards and 17 touchdowns. He has seven career 100-yard receiving games, a school record. Clayton's 59-yard reception at Colorado was the longest of his career and his fourth of 50 or more yards. Clayton is leading the club in receptions (50), receiving yards (881), yards per catch (17.6) and touchdowns (9). Clayton ranks No. 13 nationally in receiving yards per game at 97.9.
- Through his first two seasons of eligibility, **Brandon Jones** had 10 receptions for 178 yards and three touchdowns. Through eight games this season, he has 36 catches for 538 yards and six touchdowns.
- **Jejuan Rankins** ranks third on the team with five touchdown receptions, including one in three of the last five games. His three-yard touchdown reception from Jason White in the first quarter of the opener against North Texas was the first reception and touchdown of his career. The last player to score a touchdown on his first career pass reception was Arthur Guess in 1987 against Tulsa on a 21-yard play. Rankins later caught another TD in the game.
- **Mark Bradley** had his first career reception at Alabama. He actually caught two passes in the game -- one for 35 yards and another for 44. Caught one TD pass and threw one to Mark Clayton vs. Oklahoma State.
- **Will Peoples** missed the first two games due to injury, but has rebounded with 13 catches for 171 yards and two TDs.

AREA OF GREATEST IMPROVEMENT?

It could be in the OU pass rush. Last year's team had 37 sacks through 14 games (2.6/game). The 2003 Sooners have 35 sacks in nine games (3.9/game). Last year's team had 113 QB hurries (not an official NCAA stat) or 7.9 per game. This year's team already has 100, which is 12.6 per game.

- The defensive line (two ends and two tackles) already owns 29 sacks this season. Last year, those same positions accounted for just 19 through the entire 14-game schedule.
- This team has a shot at the school record for sacks in a season. The 1997 club owns that distinction with 41. The '97 team played 12 games (3.4 sacks per game).

- On the flip side, Oklahoma has gone back to pass 305 times this season, but has suffered just 12 sacks. The Sooner defense has 37 sacks in 303 drop backs by the opponents.
- Ten times under Bob Stoops OU's offense has not allowed a sack.

TREY GOOD FOR THREE

K Trey DiCarlo is enjoying a strong season ...

- He has made 17-of-18 field goals. Seven (7-of-7) of his field goal makes came from 40 yards or longer. He had just three makes from at least 40 yards all of last season.
- Of the I-A kickers who have at least 15 attempts, only one has a higher field goal percentage than DiCarlo's .941. Ole Miss's Jonathan Woods has made 22-of-23 for .957.
- Equaled his career-long field goal with a 46-yarder in the opener against North Texas.
- Has made 12 straight field goals, the longest string of his career. He has made 24 of his last 26 field goal attempts and now ranks No. 5 on the school's career list with 33.
- He has 12 multiple field goal games including six this season.
- He has 27 touchbacks on kickoffs after posting just nine all of last season.

AP ALL-AMERICAN

OU's version of AP, Antonio Perkins, is certainly bucking for that honor in the role of return specialist. He has the seventh of his career punt returns for touchdown including four this season ...

- The NCAA single season mark for punt return touchdowns is held by 11 players, including Perkins. The NCAA career record of eight is held by Wes Welker, who currently plays for Texas Tech.
- Perkins, with 1,174 yards in career punt returns, trails OU career punt return yardage leader Jarrail Jackson (1996-99) by 73 yards. Jackson tallied 1,238.

WORKS FOR US

Renaldo Works entered this season with one 100-yard game, a 109-yard effort against Arkansas State in 2000. He has now exceeded that career best twice in the last three games. He had 112 yards (15 carries) against Texas, then came back with 130 yards (20 carries) at Colorado. He also had 103 vs. Oklahoma State.

SOUTH OF THE BORDER SUCCESS

Oklahoma has won 15 of its last 16 contests against schools from the state of Texas. This year's Sooner roster includes 46 natives of the Lone Star state.

FLYING THE SOONER SKIES

- Oklahoma "worst" passing day (vs. OSU) resulted in 225 yards. Last year's Sooner team exceeded 225 yards just four times ...
- OU averages one interception every 42 passing attempts, the foes one every 20 attempts.
- OU has completed 50 percent of its passes in every game but one this season.
- It's far too early to begin discussing records, but it's worth a mention that this team's completion percentage of .660 would obliterate the current school mark of .642 set in 2000. Four of the five top season completion percentage marks at OU have been set since Bob Stoops arrived. The record for interception avoidance was set in 1992 when 2.5% of the aeriels were picked. This team is at 2.2%.

A REALLY STRONG SAFETY

SS Donte Nicholson, a junior in his first season at OU, is emerging as one of the top DBs in the Big 12. Thirty-one (11 vs. Texas, 10 vs. Missouri) of his 58 tackles (ranks No. 2 on the team to Teddy Lehman) have come over the last four games. Holds his lofty team ranking despite posting zero tackles in the opener. He has one sack in five of the last six games. His second interception came last week vs. Oklahoma State.

THAT'S A COMBINED 602 POUNDS ON THE PROWL

- Two of OU's bigger linemen covered some serious ground in making plays this season ...
- Jammal Brown (6-6, 313), OU's right tackle, ran down and tackled UCLA LB Spencer Havner at the end of a 72-yard interception return.
- DT Tommie Harris (6-3, 289) covered 21 yards to tackle Iowa State WR Jack Whitver from behind and force a fumble that OU recovered. When ISU QB Austin Flynn released the pass, Harris was four yards deep in the backfield at the ISU 22. The tackle occurred at the ISU 43.

TURNOVERS TURNED OFF

- OU had fewer turnovers than its opponent in 16 of 23 games over the last two seasons.
- OU ranks No. 6 nationally in turnover margin at +1.3.
- OU has 24 takeaways to just 11 turnovers lost.

ABOUT THE SOONER DEFENSE

- The defense has two touchdowns this year -- both on interception returns. A 34-yarder by Eric Bassey against UCLA and a 21-yarder by Jonathan Jackson against Texas.
- From 1999-02, no college team had more interceptions than Oklahoma's 88. The Sooners also gave up just 88 touchdowns in that time, second only to Southern Miss' 78.
- Oklahoma has forced at least one turnover in 55 of the last 61 games (Stoops' tenure) and has at least one interception in 43 of the last 49 contests. Perhaps even more impressive is the fact that OU has had multiple interceptions in 13 of the last 21 games.
- Sooner opponents have completed 50% of their passes just 24 times in the last 61 games.
- OU foes have scored 14 or more points just 23 times in the last 61 games.
- Under Stoops, the Sooners have five shutouts. Opponents failed to score more than seven points in 20 of the 60 games.
- Last season, OU led the nation with 24 interceptions. It was the third straight season the team posted 20, a first at OU.
- Over its last three bowl games, all in January and two as part of the BCS, OU has given up a grand total of 19 points. Only two touchdowns have been scored against the OU defense.

ABOUT THE SOONER OFFENSE

- OU ranked among the top 30 in the nation in scoring in each of Bob Stoops' four years.
- Under Bob Stoops, OU's offense has produced the career passing leader, the top four career receivers and the No. 4 career rusher in school history.
- Over the last five seasons, the Sooners have scored 63 TDs that covered 25+ yards.
- The quick-striking offense has 165 scoring drives of two minutes or less under Bob Stoops.
- OU scored on its first offensive possession the first eight games -- four FG and four TD. The Sooners failed to do so in game nine (OSU), but made a FG on the second possession.

ABOUT THE SPECIAL TEAMS

A look at special teams notes from Bob Stoops' era as OU's head coach ...

- There have been 20 special teams touchdowns, including 13 in the last 32 regular season games. Those 13 came via five different plays -- five punt returns, two faked field goals, a blocked punt, a kickoff return and a faked punt. The special teams also own one safety.
- OU has returned five kickoffs and 11 punts for touchdowns.
- The Sooners have blocked 15 kicks.
- The current special teams rank No. 6 in the nation in punt returns (15.69).
- OU has recovered its only onside kick attempt this season (at Colorado).

SOONER STUFF

Bob Stoops' teams have held a double-digit lead in 53 of 61 games ... OU has not suffered back-to-back losses under Stoops ... Stoops is 47-3 when leading at the half, 3-3 when trailing at the half and 2-3 when tied at the half ... OU is 38-23 all-time in Big 12 play (formed for the 1996 season), 30-7 since Bob Stoops arrived in 1999 ... Bob Stoops got the 50th win of his coaching career, all at Oklahoma, when the Sooners defeated Missouri earlier this season (Stoops reached the 50-win plateau in his 59th game. Barry Switzer got his 50th OU win in 56 games, while Bud Wilkinson did it in 58. The only other Sooner coach to reach that milestone in the post WWII era was Chuck Fairbanks, who got win No. 50 in his 66th game.) ... this season, OU scored more than 50 points in four straight games, a first in school history ... the offensive line contains no seniors, but has a combined 128 starts ... Oklahoma has outscored its opponents in the second period this season by a whopping count of 146-19.

When Bob Stoops arrived at Oklahoma prior to the 1999 season, it had been five seasons since the storied Sooner program had finished above .500, four since it last played in a bowl game.

In Stoops' first four seasons, OU captured a national championship, 43 victories and four bowl appearances. The lightning-quick return to national prominence was so complete as to almost obliterate perhaps the most impressive achievement of all ... the turnaround itself.

Few could have envisioned OU's dip in the middle '90's. Fewer could have predicted the extent to which the Schooner would be righted under Stoops.

The head coach stubbornly points to the program as a whole when defining the resurgence. Humility aside, it is Stoops who deserves a lion's share of the credit ...

- He is the first OU coach to take his first four teams to bowl games.
- One of 18 head coaches hired on the D-I level in 1999, he has been the most successful of the class with a 52-9 mark.
- More than 70 school records have been set during the his tenure.
- In 29 home games, his teams have out-scored their opponents 1,109-285.
- Every home game of his OU tenure has been a sellout.
- During his tenure, OU has 21 national television appearances, 10 visits from ESPN's GameDay and six cover photos on Sports Illustrated.

The team set a record football graduation rate of 65%, which ranked No. 2 in the Big 12 Conference in the most recently released figures.

If not for its meteoric pace, Stoops' career would read like a textbook rise in the coaching profession.

A four-year starter as a player at Iowa, he began his coaching career in a volunteer capacity at his alma mater in 1983. He worked through the ranks until he became co-defensive coordinator at Kansas State from 1991-95. With the Wildcats, he played a key role in the impressive turnaround. During his final four seasons there, K-State was 35-12 with three bowl appearances.



Then came a three-year stint as Florida's defensive coordinator from 1996-98. It was during that time that the national spotlight

focused on his accomplishments. The move to a head coaching role was a hiring for the ages in Norman.
