SCENE SETTER

For the second year in a row and the third time in the last four years, Oklahoma is in the Dr Pepper Big 12 Championship Game. This year's bout features a repeat of the 2000 game in both opponent (Kansas State) and location (Arrowhead Stadium in Kansas City). Oklahoma enters as the nation's only undefeated team. The Sooners will arrive in Kansas City Friday afternoon and will participate in a 2 p.m., media conference in the Pavillion Area on the press box side of the stadium.

THE POLLS

Oklahoma is the unanimous No. 1 in the AP and ESPN/USA Today Coaches Polls and has been in every poll this season. Kansas State is No. 14 by the AP and No. 15 by the coaches.

SERIES HISTORY

Oklahoma leads the series, 66-16-4, and have won the last three in a row. OU also has won the only previous meeting between the two in Kansas City, the 2000 Big 12 title game. These two met every year from 1919-1997, but then took a two-year break as part of the Big 12's scheduling rotation. They resumed play in 2000 with a 41-31 Sooner win in Manhattan, then a 27-24 OU triumph in the above-mentioned Big 12 title game at Kansas City. In 2001, in the first game for either team after the 9/11 tragedy, Oklahoma won a 38-37 thriller in Norman. The two teams did not meet during the regular season in 2002 or 2003.

THE COACHES

Oklahoma: Bob Stoops (Iowa '83), now in his fifth season with the Sooners, is 55-9 overall. He is 3-1 in bowls, 3-0 in January bowls, 2-0 in BCS games, 34-7 vs. the Big 12, 20-5 vs. the Big 12 South, 14-2 vs. the Big 12 North, 2-0 in the Big 12 Championship game, 21-2 vs. nonconference foes, 30-1 at home, 16-6 on the road, 9-2 on neutral fields, 18-2 against ranked foes and 3-0 vs. Kansas State.

Kansas State: Bill Snyder (William Jewell '62) is 126-54-1 in his 15th season with the Wildcats.

OU Tops Big 12 Grad Rates

University of Oklahoma has announced that its students athletes achieved a record graduation rate of 74%, leading the Big 12 Conference. The graduation rate was announced as part of a national release by the NCAA. This report, which measures the class that entered in 1996, recognizes OU as one of 15 institutions that will receive a \$20,000 achievement award sponsored by *USA Today*. The OU rate, which showed a 40% hike, experienced the greatest increase in I-A. OU also announced a record rate in football of 65%, which ranks No. 2 in the Big 12 behind Baylor's 75%. Eleven of 17 football players graduated. Four of the six who did not transferred in good academic standing.

THE DR PEPPER BIG 12 CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

This is the eighth Big 12 title contest. It's back in Kansas City for a second time. Oklahoma defeated Kansas State, 27-24, in the 2000 game played at Arrowhead Stadium ...

• Oklahoma joins Nebraska and Texas as the only three-time participants in the Big 12 Championship Game.

• OU is the fourth team to reach this game in back-to-back seasons. Nebraska (1996-97) games, Texas A&M (1997-98) and Colorado (2001-02) are the others.

• Oklahoma is the second team to go three times in a four-year span. Nebraska was in the 1996, 1997 and 1999 games.

• Last year, Oklahoma became the first team to win the title game in a city (Houston) that would be considered part of the same division (Big 12 South). Big 12 South teams have won all three of the previous games played in North cities/states (two in St. Louis and one in Kansas City).

- The South holds a 4-3 lead in the history of this tilt and won this year's season series, 11-7.
- This will be just the third Big 12 title game played outdoors and the second in Kansas City. Last years' game was in Hosuton's Reliant Stadium, which has a retractable roof, but it was open for OU's 29-7 victory over Colorado.

• This marks the first time in three trips to the title game that OU is not playing a team that it also played during the regular season.

• The only players returning who had statistics in the 2000 title game are DB Michael Thompson (four tackles, four PBU), DT Kory Klein (three tackles), DB Derrick Strait (two tackles) and Brandon Everage (one tackle).

THE SOONERS IN KC

Despite the 1905 contest against the Kansas City Medics (OU won in Norman 33-0), this is just Oklahoma's second game in Kansas City. The other was the off-mentioned 2000 Dr Pepper Big 12 Championship Game.

• There are two KC natives on OU's roster. LB Wayne Chambers is from Grandview, Mo., (Grandview HS) and DB Brandon Shelby is from Kansas City, Mo., (Rockhurst HS).

LAST YEAR'S BIG 12 TITLE GAME

Oklahoma notched a convincing 29-7 victory over Colorado at Houston's Reliant Stadium ... • OU's defense stifled the Buffaloes, giving up just seven first downs and 193 total yards. CU's lone score came on an 80-yard punt return by Jeremy Bloom.

• Nate Hybl completed 14-of-25 passes for 114 yards and two touchdowns and Quentin Griffin rushed 29 times for 188 yards.

• Oklahoma will start 10 position players who also started last year's title game -- five on offense, five on defense. Some 36 players on this year's team also played in last year's game.

KANSAS STATE TIES

• OU head coach Bob Stoops was defensive backs coach at Kansas State in 1989 and 1990, before being elevated to co-defensive coordinator, a position he held from 1991-95.

• OU associate head coach and co-defensive coordinator Mike Stoops was defensive ends coach at KSU from 1992-955, then was co-defensive coordinator and defensive ends coach in 1996 before becoming co-defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach i 1997. He added the title assistant head coach in 1998.

• OU co-defensive coordinator Brent Venables was a graduate assistant at Kansas State from 1993-95, then linebackers coach from 1996-98, then defensive run game coordinator in 1998. He also played at Kansas State (HM All-Big Eight in 1992) and is a 1992 graduate of KSU.

• OU receivers coach Darrell Wyatt is a 1989 Kansas State graduate. He lettered two seasons in football and also was one of the Big Eight's top sprinters.

• OU football administrative coordinator Matt McMillen is a '95 KSU grad and was on the athletics administrative staff there from 1987-97, eventually serving as associate athletics director for external affairs.

• OU GA Mike Ekeler lettered four years in football at K-State and graduated in 1995.

• OU associate athletics director Kirby Hocutt is a 1995 Kansas State graduate and he was a four-year football letterman there.

SOONERS NO. 1

• Oklahoma is No. 1 for the 15th consecutive week, which ties for the longest streak to begin a season. Florida State, which went wire-to-wire in 1999, and Nebraska had a run of 15 straight No. 1 rankings in 1983 until losing the Orange Bowl to Miami. Army and Notre Dame went wire-to-wire in 1945 and 1943 respectively, when the polls began in October.

• The Associated Press college football poll debuted in 1936. Since that time, no team has spent more time in the No. 1 position than Notre Dame with 95 weeks. Oklahoma is second on the list and closing. Including this week's poll, OU has been the No. 1 team in 94 weeks. Ohio State is next at 74, followed by Miami at 69 and Florida State at 61.

• This is the 22nd week that Oklahoma has held AP's No. 1 spot since Bob Stoops arrived.

• Oklahoma has been ranked among the AP's top 10 in every week but one since Oct. 6, 2000. That one exception saw the Sooners dip to No. 11 prior to defeating Arkansas in the

Cotton Bowl at the end of the 2001 season. That win vaulted them back into the top 10. • Oklahoma was the preseason No. 1. It marked the ninth time overall and the first time since 1987 that the Sooners entered a year atop the AP rankings. In four of those seasons, OU went on to win the national championship.

• Oklahoma has the third-longest active streak in terms of consecutive weeks in the AP rankings. Michigan tops the list at 91, followed by Miami at 69 and OU at 67.

• During the current streak, there have been 840 game minutes. OU has trailed just 5:58 -- 3:44 vs. UCLA (10-7) and 2:14 vs. Texas Tech (3-0).

SOONERS PERFECT IN THE REGULAR SEASON

Oklahoma completed the regular season unbeaten and untied for the 10th time since 1938. The nine previous perfect regular seasons came in 2000, 1987, 1974, 1956, 1955, 1954, 1950, 1949 and 1938. Only one of those, the 2000 team, had a 12-game regular season.

WE WILL PROTECT OUR HOUSE

Oklahoma finished 7-0 at home, a best in school history. The 2003 team became the 29th Sooner club since 1938 to go unbeaten and untied at home, but was the first to do so with a seven-game home slate. OU won its home games this season by an average score of 50-11. The closest home game was a 34-13 win over then-No. 24 Missouri.

THE MILLION FAN MARCH

To date, Oklahoma has playe din front of 898,838 fans this season. Never before has a Sooner team reached one million in overall attendance in one season. To reach that milestone, this OU club would need to average 50,581 over its next two games.

• All 12 of Oklahoma's regular season games were sellouts. That was a first in OU history.

THE WHITE STUFF

• The nation's leader in pass efficiency (177.87) also tops the I-A quarterbacks in touchdown percentage with one scoring strike every 10.99 passes. No other QB has more than 9.24.

· Has at least one completion of 45 yards in all but one game this season. Has 17 completions of 40 or more yards this season. That's the most ever by an OU guarterback. Josh Heupel (1999) and Steve Davis (1973) both had 11.

• White is No. 4 on OU's career passing list with 4,308 career yards. He has played in 20 games. • He ranks No. 3 in passing yards in an OU season with 3,446, 160 behind No. 2 Josh Heupel (2000). His completion percentage of .654 is on course to break a school record that he already shares with Josh Heupel. With 30 touchdown passes, he now owns that OU record.

• In his 16 career starts (OU is 15-1) combined, White is 295-of-455 (.648) for 4,020 yards and 42 TDs with nine INT. He did not play past the mid-point of the second guarter in two starts.

• The 66-yard TD from White to Brandon Jones (vs. Oklahoma State) was a personal long for both. That pair also connected on a 64-yarder against North Texas.

Oklahoma has seven games this season with at least 50 points. That's a school record. • With 580 points, this is the highest scoring team in school history, eclipsing the previous best of 541 by the 2002 team. The record for average points in a season is 46.6 by the '56 national champions. This year's team is averaging 48.3.

• The 77 points against Texas A&M tied for the second-highest total in the modern OU era.

• This team has 43 touchdown passes, a school record that betters the 34 in 1999.

SACK RECORD SACKED

With 45 sacks, this team has set a school record, eclipsing the previous best of 41 in 1997.
It's interesting that the '03 club took just 10 games to take down a record that was set in 12.
The defensive line (two ends and two tackles) already owns 33 sacks this season. Last year, those same positions accounted for just 19 through the entire 14-game schedule.

A LOOK BACK AT THE NON-CON

Oklahoma's non-conference opponents have a combined record of 25-22 -- North Texas is 8-3 and just won its 18th straight Sun Belt Conference game, Alabama is 4-8 (does not include season finale at Hawaii), Fresno State is 7-5 and UCLA is 7-5. All are I-A and three of the four are bowl eligible.

• 10 -- Number of 200-yard rushing games by the Sooners in the next three seasons (2001-03) under Stoops. Three have come this season.

- \bullet OU has eclipsed 100 rushing yards in eight of its 12 games this season.
- OU averages one interception every 64.8 passing attempts, the foes one every 18.9.
- OU has completed 50 percent of its passes in every game but one this season.

- Over the last five seasons, the Sooners have scored 70 TDs that covered 25+ yards.
- The quick-striking offense has 177 scoring drives of two minutes or less under Bob Stoops.

• OU scored on its first offensive possession in 10 of 12 games -- four FG and six TD. The Sooners failed to do OSU and TTU, but did score on their second possession.

ABOUT THE SOONER DEFENSE

• Only two opponents reached their season passing yardage average vs. Oklahoma.

• Only one Big 12 foe reached its passing yardage average for the season, and that was Missouri, which lost to the Sooners by 24 points.

• The opponents' leading receiver failed to reach his yards per game average in eight.

• The opponents' leading receivers have combined to average 4.7 receptions for 42.7 yards and COMBINED to score one touchdown. None has reached 100 yards.

• OU has faced two Biletnikoff semifinalists ... Texas' Roy Williams and Oklahoma State's Rashaun Woods. Williams had seven catches for 89 yards, although four of those receptions and 37 of the yards came after halftime when OU had built a substantial lead. Woods had four catches for 25 yards. Neither caught a touchdown pass against OU.

• The defense has three touchdowns this year. A 34-yard INT by Eric Bassey against UCLA, a 21-yard INT return by Jonathan Jackson against Texas and a 17-yard fumble return by Derrick Strait vs. Texas A&M.

• OU ranks No. 1 in the Big 12 in fourth down 'D' -- opponents are just 8-of-22 for 36.4%.

• Oklahoma has forced at least one turnover in 58 of the last 64 games (Stoops' tenure) and has at least one interception in 45 of the last 52 contests. Perhaps even more impressive is the fact that OU has had multiple interceptions in 14 of the last 24 games.

- Sooner opponents have completed 50% of their passes just 26 times in the last 64 games.
- OU foes have scored 14 or more points just 24 times in the last 64 games.

• Under Stoops, the Sooners have six shutouts. Opponents failed to score more than seven points in 20 of the 64 games.

• Oklahoma has 20 interceptions for a fourth straight season. Never before had OU strung together even three seasons with 20 straight picks.

• Over its last three bowl games, all in January and two as part of the BCS, OU has given up a grand total of 19 points. Only two touchdowns have been scored against the OU defense.

ABOUT THE SPECIAL TEAMS

A look at special teams notes from Bob Stoops' era as OU's head coach ...

• There have been 20 special teams TDs, including 13 in the last 34 regular season games. Those 13 came via five different kinds of plays -- eight punt returns, two faked field goals, a blocked punt, a kickoff return and a faked punt. The special teams also own one safety.

- OU has returned five kickoffs and 11 punts for touchdowns.
- The Sooners have blocked 16 kicks.

• OU has recovered its only onside kick attempt this season (at Colorado).

DRIVE FOR SHOW

Various points on offensive drives by Oklahoma and its opponents ...

• OU opponents have gone three-and-out (or less) 80 times in 164 possessions (that does not include drives that ended due to clock expiration at the end of a half). The Sooners have gone three-and-out 34 times in 163 possessions.

• Oklahoma has mounted 21 possessions that included at least 10 plays. The longest was a 16-play effort against Iowa State. OU opponents have had 16 drives of 10 or more plays. The most plays were posted by Baylor, which ran 18 on its way to a field goal.

• OU's longest offensive possession in terms of time last nine minutes and 16 seconds against Oklahoma State. The above-mentioned Baylor drive was the longest by time for a foe this season at 8:28.

• The Sooners have had 20 drives that consumed at least four minutes, the opponents 14.

• Thirty-two of Oklahoma's scoring drives have taken less than two minutes. The opponents have eight.

• Oklahoma has had 19 drives that covered at least 80 yards and three that covered at least 90. The longest was a 99-yarder against Oklahoma State. The opponents have three 80-yard drives.

• OU has had six one-play scoring drives. The opponents have none.

TURNOVERS TURNED OFF

- OU had fewer turnovers than its opponent in 19 of 26 games over the last two seasons.
- OU ranks No. 3 nationally in turnover margin at +1.5.
- OU has 31 takeaways to just 12 turnovers lost.

AP ALL-AMERICAN

OU's version of AP, Antonio Perkins, is certainly bucking for that honor in the role of return specialist. He has the seven career punt returns for touchdown including four (NCAA record) this season ...

• The NCAA career record of eight career punt returns for touchdowns is held by Wes Welker, who currently plays for Texas Tech.

• Perkins, with 1,278 yards in career punt returns is the all-time OU leader in that category and became such as a junior in just his 25th game as the Sooners' punt returner.

THAT'S A COMBINED 602 POUNDS ON THE PROWL

Two of OU's bigger linemen covered some serious ground in making plays this season ... • Jammal Brown (6-6, 313), OU's right tackle, ran down and tackled UCLA LB Spencer

Havner at the end of a 72-yard interception return.

• DT Tommie Harris (6-3, 289) covered 21 yards to tackle Iowa State WR Jack Whitver from behind and force a fumble that OU recovered. When QB Austin Flynn released the pass, Harris was four yards deep in the backfield at the ISU 22. The tackle occurred at the ISU 43.

SOONER STUFF

Bob Stoops' teams have held a double-digit lead in 56 of 64 games ... OU has not suffered back-to-back losses under Stoops ... Stoops is 50-3 when leading at the half, 3-3 when trailing at the half and 2-3 when tied at the half ... OU is 41-23 all-time in Big 12 play (formed for the 1996 season), 33-7 since Bob Stoops arrived in 1999 ... this season, OU scored more than 50 points in four straight games, a first in school history ... the offensive line contains no seniors, but has a combined 143 starts ... Oklahoma has outscored its opponents in the second period this season by a whopping count of 212-29.

When Bob Stoops arrived at Oklahoma prior to the 1999 season, it had been five

seasons since the storied Sooner program had finished above .500, four since it last played in a bowl game.

In Stoops' first four seasons, OU captured a national championship, 43 victories and four bowl appearances. The lightning-quick return to national prominence was so complete as to almost obliterate perhaps the most impressive achievement of all ... the turnaround itself.

Few could have envisioned OU's dip in the middle '90's. Fewer

could have predicted the extent to which the Schooner would be righted under Stoops.

The head coach stubbornly points to the program as a whole when defining the resurgence. Humility aside, it is Stoops who deserves a lion's share of the credit ...

• He is the first OU coach to take his first four teams to bowl games.

• One of 18 head coaches hired on the D-I level in 1999, he has been the most successful of the class with a 55-9 mark.

• More than 80 school records have been set during the his tenure.

• In 31 home games, his teams have out-scored their opponents 1,227-288.

• Every home game of his OU tenure has been a sellout.

• During his tenure, OU has 21 national television appearances, 10 vists from ESPN's GameDay and six cover photos on Sports Illustrated.

• The team set a record football graduation rate of 65%, which ranked No. 2 in the Big 12 Conference in the most recently released figures.

If not for its meteoric pace, Stoops' career would read like a textbook rise in the coaching profession.

A four-year starter as a player at lowa, he began his coaching career in a volunteer



capacity at his alma mater in 1983. He worked through the ranks until he became co-defensive coordinator at Kansas State from 1991-95. With the Wildcats, he played a key role in the impressive turnaround. During his final four seasons there, K-State was 35-12 with three bowl appearances.

Then came a threeyear stint as Florida's defensive coordinator from 1996-98. It was during that time that the national spotlight

focused on his accomplishments. The move to a head coaching role was a hiring for the ages in Norman.

WR Will Peoples

Missed first two games (inj.), then had three grabs for 29 yards vs. Fresno State ... five grabs for 80 yards and a 45-yard TD at Iowa State ... 20-yard TD grab vs. Texas ... two grabs for 40 yards and TD vs. Baylor ... doubtful for Tech (inj).

CB Antonio Perkins

One of the top returners in college football also draws the start at CB this season ... interceptions at Alabama, Colorado.

FS Brodney Pool

Started opener and had career-best 11 tackles ... two picks at ISU and Tech ... leads team with six INT ... blocked a PAT at CU ... tied for fourth on the team with 56 tackles.

WR Jejuan Rankins

Two TD receptions vs. North Texas in first career start ... scored on 15-yard receptions against Iowa State and Texas, then got a 30-yard TD catch vs. Missouri and a seven-yarder against A&M.

FB J.D. Runnels Starter at H-back ... excellent blocker ... 17-yard reception at Alabama ... caught TD passes vs. Fresno State and Texas.

DB Brandon Shelby

Used in extra DB sets ... HM All-Big 12 last season with no starts ... one INT, four sacks and two blocks in 2002 ... blocked a punt against Baylor.

OT Wes Sims

Has 31 career starts, including 25 at left tackle ... came off the bench against North Texas, but has started since then.

CB Derrick Strait

Thorpe and Nagurski finalist ... career leader for games started and consecutive starts by a DB ... consecutive streak ended at 43 when he was sidelined for the UCLA game ... entered season with one FR but has four this season ... career-high 11 tackles with two FR, 1 INT and 3 PBU vs. Texas ... INTs vs. Texas and Alabama ... returned a fumble 17 yards for TD against Texas A&M ... 97-yard interception return at Tech.

QB Paul Thompson

Hit 5-of-6 for 38 yards and one TD in opener ... 50-yard rush vs. Fresno State, the longest by a Sooner QB since 1998 ... against A&M, he completed 2-of-3 passes for 34 yards and rushed six times for 79 yards and two TD.

Physical receiver ... TD catches against North Texas, Iowa State and Texas Tech ... 12-yard TD grab vs. A&M.

RB Renaldo Works

Exceeded 80 rushing yards in five games, including 130 at Colorado, 112 vs. Texas and 103 vs. Oklahoma State ... missed A&M and Baylor games with bruised back.

Assistant Coaches

Players

Post-game

Members of the Oklahoma Media Relations staff will escort media representatives to the appropriate locker room areas with five minutes remaining in the game. The home Oklahoma locker room, which is located behind the south end zone, is closed to the media at all times.

Head coach Bob Stoops and several Sooner players will be brought to the OU Red Room for interviews. The Red Room, which is located down the hall from the locker room, will be set up for writers to sit in front and camera operators may set up and shoot from the back.

At the beginning of the fourth quarter, interview requests will be collected. The top three OU players requested will be brought into the Red Room as soon as Coach Stoops is finished with his comments. Any other requested players will be brought into the room as soon as the first three players are finished.

The opposing head coach will meet with the media inside the opponent interview room. A representative from the OU Media Relations Office will be on hand to assist the media in finding this area.
