## THE GAME

Oklahoma (1-0) looks to extend a 14-game home winning streak Saturday when its hosts Houston (0-1) in the second of three non-conference games to start the season. The Sooners opened with a 40-24 victory over Bowling Green last week, while the Cougars dropped a 10-7 decision to cross-town rival Rice.

## THE POLLS

OU is No. 2 in the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today Coaches polls. Houston is unranked.

## THE SERIES

Oklahoma and Houston meet for just the second time. The two collided in the 1981 Sun Bowl at El Paso with the Sooners prevailing, 40-14. OU is 12-4 against teams currently holding membership in Conference USA (2-1 vs. Army, 1-0 Houston, 2-0 vs. Louisville, 1-0 vs. South Florida, 6-3 vs. TCU).

## THE COACHES

Oklahoma: Bob Stoops (lowa '78), now in his sixth season with the Sooners, is 56-11 overall. He is 3-2 in bowls, 3-1 in January bowls, 2-1 in BCS games, $34-7$ vs. the Big 12, 20-5 vs. the Big 12 South, $15-3$ vs. the Big 12 North, 2-1 in the Big 12 title game, 22-3 vs. non-confererence foes, 31-1 at home, 16-6 on the road, 9-4 on neutral fields and 18-4 vs. ranked opponents. Houston: Art Briley (Texas Tech '79) is 7-7 in his second season at Houston.

## OKLAHOMA... ONE OF COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S ELITE PROGRAMS

Oklahoma's football program owns a remarkable list of accomplishments ...

- Seven national championships (1950, 1955, 1974, 1975, 1985, 2000), 38 conference titles and 37 bowl appearances, 23 of which resulted in a Sooner victory.
- Oklahoma ranks No. 8 in all-time victories (737-284-53), No. 1 in victories since WWII (493) and No. 1 in victories since 2000 (48).
- Oklahoma's all-time winning percentage of .711 ranks No. 4 nationally. The Sooners' .888 percentage since 2000 ranks No. 2 during that period.
- Oklahoma ranks No. 7 in bowl appearances with 37 and No. 3 in bowl victories with 23.
- The Sooners have produced 138 All-Americans (average of more than one per season over a 110-year history) and 51 national award winners, including four Heisman Trophy recipients. No school has produced more Butkus Award (four), Thorpe Award (three) or Nagurski Award (two) winners. Only Notre Dame (7) and Ohio State (6) have produced more Heisman winners (OU is tied with USC at four).

## WEEKLY MEDIA LUNCHEON

Each Tuesday during the season, OU hosts a media luncheon inside the East Side Stadium Club at Gaylord Family - Memorial Stadium. The luncheon begins at 11:15 a.m., with comments from the head coach of OU's opponent that week. Lunch will be served at 11:30 a.m., and Coach Stoops will address the attending media following lunch. A limited number of OU players will be on hand for interviews. Media may downlink the conference for airing at a later time. Live airings are prohibited. The coordinates are SBS 6/K 5. D.L. Freq. 11823.0 H.

## CREDENTIALS

Requests for credentials should be faxed to the media relations office at least eight days prior to the game. The requests, which may only be submitted by a sports editor/director, should appear on letterhead and include the names of those individuals seeking passes. Media attending games must show a photo ID upon entering the stadium. If the name on the credential and the photo ID do not match, the credential will be voided.

## PRACTICE

Practices will be open to photographers for the first 15 minutes Monday-Wednesday. Photographers are required to inform the media relations office when they plan to attend. No other portion of the practices are open. Those in attendance are required to stay at the end of the practice field at all times unless accompanied by a member of the media relations office.

## INTERMEWS

- Head Coach Bob Stoops will do general interviews following practice on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday. All other requests for interviews must be submitted to the media relations office at least 24 hours prior to the scheduled interview.
- Assistant Coaches: Arrangements should be made through the media relations office. Most interviews will be conducted after practice Monday-Wednesday.
- Players: All interviews with players will take place at the media luncheon or after practice on Monday and Tuesday. Media should request players at least 24 hours in advance. Players and coaches who attend the Tuesday luncheon will not be available following practice that day.
- Post-game: The OU locker room is closed at all times. Head coach Bob Stoops and several Sooner players will be brought to designated interivew areas. At home, that is the Red Room, located under the south end zone grandstand in the Barry Switzer Center.

## ABOUT THE OPPONENT

- Houston lost to Rice, 10-7, on Sunday despite having more first downs and total yards than the Owls. The Cougars gave u- nine sacks, including seven that were absorbed by Kevin Kolb. He was 15 -of- 33 for 204 yards with one touchdown and one interceptions. Also, UH had two missed FGs (both from 42 yards) and a punting average of 32.3 yards.
- The loss was in contrast to last year's Rice game when UH prevailed 48-14.
- The loss to Rice may have marked a step forward for the Cougar defense, which held the opponent to less than 14 points for the first time in Art Briley's brief tenure. Last season, UH gave up 30 or more points in eight games.
- Houston was 7-6 last season, which was Briley's first with the Cougars. UH lost to Hawaii in the Sheraton Hawaii Bowl, 54-48, in triple overtime.
- The Cougars return 18 starters: eight on offense, nine on defense and one on special teams.
- Houston lost its opener to Rice, 10-7, last Sunday.
- Briley was Texas Tech's running backs coach from 2000-02, but this will be his first game against a Big 12 opponent since he moved to Houston.


## NO PASSING FANCY

Houston fired 33 passes in its opener, and averaged 28 passing attempts per game last season. Throwing can be a tough proposition against OU ...

- Since 2000, Oklahoma is 41-2 in games in which the opponent attempted at least 25 aerials.
- Going back to include 1999, which then encompasses the entire length of Bob Stoops' tenure, Oklahoma is $47-5$ when the foe puts the ball up at least 25 times.


## TIES WITH THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT

- Sooners who call Houston home ... FS Brodney Pool (Westbury HS), DE Jonathan Jackson (North Shore HS), DE Calvin Thibodeaux (Westbury HS), TE Bubba Moses (North Shore HS) and DE John Williams (Lamar HS).
- New Oklahoma assistant men's basketball coach Ray McCallum was Houston's head coach for four seasons ending with the 2004 campaign.


## TEXAS TOAST

Oklahoma has won eight in a row and 18 of its last 19 contests against schools from the state of Texas. The Sooners have not lost to a Texas-based opponent in Norman since Nov. 15, 1997, when Texas A\&M claimed a 51-7 win. Since then, OU has reeled off 13 straight against teams that ventured north of the Red River.

## OU's MOST RECENT GAME

Oklahoma opened with a 40-24 win over Bowling Green in Norman last Saturday. The Sooners were out to a 37-10 advantage with 2:23 left in the third quarter. Here is more on the game ... - OU held an offense that averaged 496.9 yards per game last season to just 269. Two BGSU TDs came after turnovers -- a fumble deep in OU's end and an interception returned for a TD. - OU backs Kejuan Jones (148) and Adrian Peterson (100) both crossed the century mark. - Heisman Trophy winner Jason White hit on 21-of-31 passes for 238 yards and three touchdowns with one interception. He also rushed twice for eight yards.

- Nine Sooners caught a pass, including seven by Mark Clayton. Two of those went for TDs.
- PR Antonio Perkins, who needs just one more punt return for TD to tie the NCAA record, did not take one to the house, but he did got 44 yards with one of his return.
- Lance Mitchell, who missed the last 11 games last season with a knee injury, topped Oklahoma's tacklers with nine.
- A record crowd of 84,319 saw the game in the newly-expanded Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. The previous high was 84,027 vs. Oklahoma State last season.

## CRACKING THE SCORING COLUMN FIRST

Oklahoma has scored first in 53 of Bob Stoops' 67 games at Oklahoma. The Sooners are 47-6 in those games. The Sooners were the first to score in the opener of this season, too.

## SOONERS GET CARRIED AWAY

A closer look at Oklahoma's 258-yard rushing performance in the season-opener ...

- For the 59th time, two Oklahoma players exceeded 100 rushing yards in the same game. It was the third time it happened in Bob Stoops' six seasons. Donta Hickson (131) and Jones (120) did it against Texas A\&M last season. In 1999, Quentin Griffin (126) and Reggie Skinner (116) both cracked 100 yards against lowa State.
- OU had more rushing yards than passing (238) for the 13th time in Bob Stoops' 67 games. - Adrian Peterson became just the second OU freshman to rush for 100 yards in his debut, and the first running back. True freshman QB Kerry Jackson went for 109 yards on 10 carries against Utah State in 1972. Peterson is the fourth frosh running back to play under Stoops. - The 258 team rushing yards ranked second for OU in an opener. The Sooners had 378 at Tulsa in 2002. This marked the 16th time that Oklahoma had rushed for 200 or more yards under Stoops.


## POLL TOLL

Oklahoma is ranked No. 2 in both polls ...

- Oklahoma is 52-12 when carrying the No. 2 ranking, including a 20-3 mark at home. The Sooners are $35-4$ vs. unranked opponents when listed at No. 2. Ranked OU teams are 307-27-3 against unranked teams all-time.
- Oklahoma has the third-longest active streak in terms of consecutive weeks in the Associated Press' rankings. Michigan tops that list at 95 followed by Miami at 73 and Oklahoma at 71. - The AP poll debuted in 1936. OU and Notre Dame are tied for the most weeks spent at No. 1 with 95 each. Ohio State is next at 74 followed by Miami at 69 and Florida State at 61.
- Oklahoma has been ranked among the AP's top 10 in every week but one since Oct. 6, 2000. That one exception saw the Sooners dip to No. 11 prior to defeating Arkansas in the Cotton Bowl at the end of the 2001 season. That win vaulted them back into the top 10.


## HOME FIELD HONCHOS

Oklahoma is 31-1 at Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium under Bob Stoops. The Sooners have won their last 14 home games, including five over ranked opponents. The longest home winning streak under Stoops was 17. During the current streak, OU has ... - averaged 47.4 points per game to just 12.4 for the opponents.

- won every game by double digits.
- eclipsed 50 points six times, 60 points three times and 70 points once.
- notched two shutouts and another three games in which the opponent did not score a TD.


## GREAT SLATE

Oklahoma's 11-game schedule includes nine opponents who were in bowls last season. The foes were $87-57$ (.604) in '03. The non-conference foes were $26-14$ (.650). That rates as the nation's 12 th-toughest non-league slate. Four OU opponents won 10 or more games last year.

## NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS TOPS AMONG BIG 12

Since Bob Stoops arrived in 1999, no Big 12 team has had a better winning percentage in nonconference games than Oklahoma. The Sooners are 19-1 during that time. Both Nebraska and Kansas State have the same record during that time. OU and NU both played one I-AA foe in that period. K-State played four. Here is more on the Sooners' non-league success ... - OU has won its last 16 regular season games vs. non-league foes.

- Bob Stoops is $21-3$ vs. non-league foes, $18-1$ in regular season non-league games and 15-0 in non-conference home games.


## HOME IS WHERE THE GAMES ARE

Oklahoma is playing its first four games at home for just the third time in its history. The other two seasons in which that happened were the 2000 National Championship year and 1995, Howard Schnellenberger's lone campaign with the Sooners. As a matter of fact, those are the only other instances in which OU played four straight home games during the same season.

## SEE YOU IN SEPTEMBER

Oklahoma is 17-0 during the month of September under Bob Stoops. Over the last 25 seasons, the Sooners have had a losing record just twice in September -- 1996 and 1982.

## J ASON'S RETURN

Oklahoma's Heisman-winning quarterback Jason White, listed as a senior last year, received a ruling from the NCAA that allows him another year on the college level. White is the second Heisman winner since OU's Billy Sims in 1978 to return for an additional season. BYU's Ty Detmer, who won the award in 1990 as a junior, was the other.

## THE STOOPS ERA IN BRIEF

A look at Oklahoma in Bob Stoops' first five seasons, 1999-2003 ...

- OU won the 2000 national champi-
onship, three Big 12 South crowns and two Big 12 titles.
- Oklahoma has spent 22 weeks at No. 1.
- Two of the longest winning streaks in OU history - a 20-game streak from 2000-01 and a 14-game streak from 2002-03.
- OU has set or tied 62 school records.

No college program has scored more points than Oklahoma's 28,021. In addition, OU's total margin of victory, 15,094 , ranks No. 2 behind Michigan. Oklahoma is 102nd (out of 117) in points surrendered at 12,927. Not bad for a team that ranks No. 26 in games played at 1,075.

## STADIUMSTUFF

Phase II was completed in the off-season. The $\$ 7$ million project has centered in three areas -fan amenities on the upper levels of the west side, remodeling of the Santee Lounge and bricking the north, south and center portions of the west side. Also, the facing of the press box was re-designed with new images and a listing of the football program's accomplishments.

- The capacity of the stadium is up from 81,207 last season to 82,112 this season.
- The stadium can seat $2.3 \%$ of the state's population. Of the 27 states with at least three million residents, none can house a greater percentage of the state's population in a college football venue.
- The playing surface was replaced over the off-season ... grass type: Tiff-Sport (Bermuda sod grown in San Antonio, Texas), square footage: 79,000, quantity of sand: 2,500 tons.

## STOOPS COACHING TREE

Three of Bob Stoops' assistant coaches have left OU to become head coaches ...
Mike Leach (Texas Tech)
Mark Mangino (Kansas)
Mike Stoops (Arizona)

History is one tough customer at Oklahoma. The tradition, so rich and so long-standing, is as daunting as it is impressive. To be among the best at Oklahoma is to be among the best in college football.

Such dramatics are lost on Bob Stoops. The Sooner head coach befriended the would-be albatross of OU's successful past from his first day on campus and remains steadfastly focused on tomorrow and the championship it holds.

It falls then to longtime observers and experts of the game to define Stoops' impact. Rarely have the pundits had it so easy.

Under Stoops, Oklahoma has won 56 games, spent 56 consecutive weeks in the national rankings, played in five bowl games, three of the BCS variety, and captured two Big 12 crowns. On a playing field leveled by scholarship limits and parity, this era stares down the Oklahoma standard and does not blink.

The achievement is so brilliant that it dulls the memory of what Stoops inherited. When he arrived in Norman, the proud Sooner program was five years removed from a winning record; four from bowl play. Those atypical days of angst are so forgotten now that they might as well be categorized with the land rush and dust bowl.

Stoops has been characterized as a grounded family man, brilliant big-game coach, relentless recruiter, disciplined leader and a person with uncommon perspective. His success emanates from a disciplined style true to his roots in the Steel Valley of Ohio, but he is far from inflexible. The principles to which he holds are the tried and true axioms of the sport ... mixed with cutting edge strategy and an appreciation for the calculated risk.

During his time, OU has produced record-setting passers and receivers, a 1,000-yard rusher, suffocating defense and special teams units that rank among the
most dynamic in the land. The Sooners have been nothing if not versatile.

The son of a coach, Stoops was a fouryear starter at lowa. He began his coaching career in 1983 as a volunteer in the Hawkeye program under Hayden Fry. He worked through the ranks until he became co-defensive coordinator at Kansas State (199195).

With the Wildcats, he played a key role in their impressive turnaround. During his final four seasons there, K State was $35-12$ with three bowl appearances.

Eventually, he left for Florida and a threeyear stint as Steve Spurrier's defensive coordinator. In 1996, he was part of a national championship team. It was with the Gators that the spotight found Stoops and made him one of the hottest names in the profession. His hiring at Oklahoma was one for the ages.
