The Game

Oklahoma, winner of three straight, hosts Texas A&M Saturday on the annual Dad's Day weekend on the OU campus. It is the second straight road game for the Aggies, who were at Texas Tech last week. The Sooners were idle. TAMU is looking to snap a two-game losing streak after a 42-14 home loss to Iowa State and a 56-17 setback at Texas Tech.

■ This marks the first time since 1994 that Oklahoma has had two bye weeks during the regular season. OU was scheduled for one off Saturday, but then go another when ABC selected the Sooners' game vs. Oklahoma State and requested it be moved to Thanksgiving weekend.

Series Notes: Oklahoma has won two straight and five of the last six ... the only interruption of that streak came at College Station in 2002 when the unranked Aggies toppled No. 1 OU, 30-26 ... OU has won three straight over Texas A&M in Norman dating back to 1997 game.

The Coaches

Oklahoma: Bob Stoops (Iowa '83), now in his seventh season with the Sooners, is 72-15 overall. He is 3-3 in bowls, 3-2 in January bowls, 2-2 in BCS games, 48-9 vs. the Big 12, 25-6 vs. the Big 12 South, 23-3 vs. the Big 12 North, 3-1 in the Big 12 title game, 25-6 vs. non-conference opponents, 39-2 at home, 21-7 on the road, 12-6 on neutral fields, 21-6 vs. ranked opponents and 5-1 vs. Texas A&M.

Texas A&M: Dennis Franchione (Pittsburg State '73) is 16-17 in his third season at Texas A&M, 171-90-2 in 23 years overall. He is 1-2 against Oklahoma.

Weekly Media Luncheon

Each Tuesday during the season OU hosts a media luncheon inside the Kerr McGee Stadium Club (east side) at Gaylord Family. The luncheon begins at 11:15 a.m., with comments from the head coach of OU's opponent that week (by speaker phone if the coach is available). Lunch is served at 11:30 a.m., and OU head coach Bob Stoops steps to the podium at 12 p.m. A limited number of Sooner players are on hand for interviews.

Credentials

Requests for credentials are taken online. To receive the link to the web site, e-mail Kenny Mossman at kmossman@ou.edu. Requests must be submitted by a sports director/editor at least eight days prior to the contest. Media attending games will have passes scanned and must show government issued photo identification upon entering the stadium. If the name on the credential and the photo ID do not match, the credential will be voided.

Practice

Practices are open to photographers for the first 15 minutes Monday-Wednesday. Photographers are required to inform the media relations office when they plan to attend and must stay in out-of-bounds areas at all times. No other portion of the practices are open to public or media.

Interviews

All interview requests should be submitted to the OU Athletic Media Relations Office ...

- **Head Coach** Bob Stoops will do general interviews following practice on Monday. All other requests must be submitted to Kenny Mossman.
- Assistant Coaches: The coaches are available after the Monday-Wednesday practices (coordinators who appear at the Tuesday luncheon are not available that day).
- Players: All interviews with players will take place at the media luncheon or after practice on Monday and Tuesday. Media should request players at least 24 hours in advance. Those who attend the media luncheon are not available after Tuesday's practice.
- Post-Game: The OU locker room is closed at all times. Head coach Bob Stoops and several Sooners players will be brought to designated areas. At home, the interview area is the Switzer Center's Red Room, located under the south end zone grandstand.

This Week's Opponent

- Since opening with 3-1 mark, Texas A&M has dropped three of five, including two straight.
- The Aggies rank No. 11 nationally in rushing offense (223.89), No. 18 in total offense (446.67). TAMU is No. 37 nationally in rushing defense (127.33), but No. 116 in passing defense (321.22).
- P Justin Brantly is No. 16 in average (43.44) and QB Reggie McNeal is No. 21 nationally in total offense (274.56).
- Jaxson Appel and Marquis Carpenter both have three interceptions.

The Last Meeting

Oklahoma won 42-35 over Texas A&M last season in College Station ...

- Oklahoma trailed by 14 points three times before rallying on the strength of five Jason White touchdown passes. The game-winner came on a 39-yard strike to Mark Bradley.
- The Aggies scored two touchdowns on faked kicks -- a 71-yard pass on a punt and a four-yard pass on a field goal.
- Texas A&M out-gained Oklahoma, 489-433, but turned the ball over three times. Two of those opened the door for Sooner touchdowns.
- OU nearly posted a shutout, but the Huskers got a 39-yard field goal on the games final play.
- Oklahoma posted five sacks in the game.
- The Aggies used two quarterbacks. Reggie McNeal completed 11-of-24 passes for 213 yards with two touchdowns and one interception. Ty Branyon came off the bench to complete 7-of-12 passes for 72 yards with no interceptions or touchdowns. Branyon finished the game.

Ties With This Week's Opponent


- Oklahoma special teams coordinator and tight ends coach Kevin Sumlin was on the Texas A&M staff from 2001-02. He had the title of assistant head coach, offensive coordinator and receivers coach during his tenure.
- OU assistant strength coach Larry Jackson was assistant strength coach at A&M from 1998-2004. He graduated from A&M in 1994.
- Aggie assistant head coach and receivers coach Kenith Pope coached OU's defensive ends from 1995-97. He also played for the Sooners and earned his degree from OU in 1976.
- Texas A&M cornerbacks coach Chris Thurmond was on the OU staff from 1996-97 as defensive backs coach. He is a native of Sand Springs, Okla., and a 1975 Tulsa graduate.
- TAMU director of football operations Charley North is a native of Waggoner, Okla. He graduated from Panhandles State in 1966 and later received a graduate degree from Oklahoma State. He was on the OU staff as offensive line coach from 1979-94. Prior to that, he had a lengthy career coach high school football in Oklahoma (McAlester, Tecumseh and Waggoner).
- Texas A&M director of on-campus recruiting Johnny Barr was on the OU staff as inside linebackers coach from 1989-94. He was freshman receivers coach in 1970, the same year he received his B.A., from OU.

Oklahoma's Most Recent Game

Oklahoma got its first win at Nebraska since 1987 when the Sooners prevailed 31-24 in Lincoln on Oct. 29 ...

- OU rolled to a 24-3 lead, then staved off a Nebraska rally. The Sooners never trailed and were never tied in the game.
- Oklahoma's defense equalled a record for the Bob Stoops era when it registered nine sacks, the most ever permitted by a Husker team. LB Rufus Alexander got to NU quarterback Zac Taylor three times. He made 13 tackles in the game.
- A Nebraska team that entered the game with 38 sacks got to OU's Rhett Bomar just once.
- Adrian Peterson, who had missed all or more than half of the previous four games with a sprained ankle, returned. He carried 24 times for 146 yards and two touchdowns.
- Leading receiver Travis Wilson was back for the first time in three games. He made three grabs for 42 yards, including a crucial 21-yard catch on third-and-10 during the last scoring drive.
- OU got its third interception return for a touchdown this season when Chijioke Onyenegecha ran 63 yards with a pick with 1:00 remaining in the first half.
- True freshman Malcolm Kelly topped the Sooners with eight receptions for 86 yards.
- DT Dusty Dvoracek had his first career interception along with eight tackles, four for loss.



■ The 12 straight does not include a loss to Kansas State in the 2003 Big 12 title game. Sandwiched around that setback, the Sooners won the Big 12 crown with a pair of victories against North Division champion Colorado in 2002 and 2004.

Injury Bug Bites

Oklahoma players have combined to miss 31 full games this season due to injury. There are another four who missed partial games (more than half of the game). Through seven games last season, OU players had combined to miss just 11 games due to injury.

Sooner Youth Movement

Last February's recruiting class was lauded as one of the nation's best, and that talent has found its way to the field. With 12 true freshman seeing game action so far this season, only Arkansas (16) and Duke (14) can boast more. And neither the Razorbacks or Blue Devils have won a conference game this season. The Sooners will finish no worse than .500 in the Big 12.

Fourth Down Fun

OU has converted 8-of-12 fourth-down tries this season. Three came on faked kicks (punt vs. Texas, FG vs. Kansas, FG vs. Nebraska). Sooner opponents are 2-of-10 on fourth down. Under Stoops, OU is 67-of-115 (58%) on fourth down; the opponents are 49-of-134 (37%).

Sooners Taking a Different Position

Paul Thompson's move from QB (he's still the No. 2) to WR and Allen Patrick's change from DB to RB continues a venture that has been successful under Bob Stoops -- players changing positions. Here is a look at some of the more successful moves over the last seven seasons ...

Sooners Eclipse Three Million in Attendance Under Stoops

Oklahoma has sold out all 41 home games of Bob Stoops' tenure and during the Tulsa game the total attendance for that period exceeded three million. The total stands at 3,227,865. OU has exceeded its listed capacity of 82,112 in 16 straight games.

Oklahoma Picks Up Win. No. 750

The win over Tulsa was the 750th all-time for Oklahoma. The Sooners' all-time record now stands 754-288-53. OU is one of just eight schools with 750 victories. With 1,095 games played, the Sooners are just five away from 1,100. Nineteen other schools have played 1,100 games.

OU Brand Among the Nation's Most Popular

Early Games Illustrate Changing of the Guard

A game-by-game look at the youth and change on this year's team ...

The TCU Game

- Seven defensive players made their first career start.
- Thirteen freshmen (eight true, five redshirt) played.
- The starting offensive players in last season's finale had a combined 301 starts. The offensive starters in the '05 opener had a combined 130. The offensive line that started in the Orange Bowl last season at 188 career starts compared to just 68 for the group that started this year's opener.

The Tulsa Game

- Eighteen first-year players saw action. Of those, 16 were freshmen, including 10 true.
- Four of the five starting offensive linemen were in their first game at that particular position. Only Chris Bush, who had two previous starts at right guard (one in '03 and another in '04) was in a spot he had previously held. The offensive line that started against TU had a combined 41 career starts, down some 27 from the opener.
- Three freshman linemen played, including RT Branndon Braxton in his first career start.
- CB D.J. Wolfe led OU with 12 tackles. At the same time last year he was a reserve RB.
- OU's leading rusher and receiver was a sophomore (Adrian Peterson), the QB was a redshirt freshman (Rhett Bomar), the P was a sophomore (Cody Freeby), the K was a sophomore (Garrett Hartley), the leading tackle was a sophomore (D.J. Wolfe) and three of the four sacks were made by players who either weren't here last season or were playing offense in 2004.

The UCLA Game

- Three true freshmen started in the game in RT Branndon Braxton, WR Malcolm Kelly and SS Reggie Smith. To put that in perspective, only four true freshmen even *played* for OU all of 2004.
- Of the 15 players who had statistics on offense or in returns, 10 have at least two years of eligibility remaining, as did the leading tacklers Demarrio Pleasant and Darien Williams (both had 10), both of whom are sophomores.

The Kansas State Game

- Four true freshmen started, including both safeties -- Reggie Smith (FS) and Nic Harris (SS). Harris responded with seven tackles and one sack in his first career start. Smith had an interception and a 14-yard return.
- In the third quarter, the Sooners faced a third-and-seven at their own 19. The offense came out in a three-receiver set and all three were true freshmen -- Malcolm Kelly, Manuel Johnson and Juaquin Iglesias. Rhett Bomar, a redshirt freshman himself, hit Iglesias for 18 yards.

The Texas Game

- For the second straight game five freshmen were in the starting line-up, including three true frosh. RG J.D. Quinn, a redshirt freshman, made his first career start after Chris Bush moved over to the center spot to spell ailing Chris Chester, a senior.
- Quinn was one of three offensive players making a first career start, sort of. Paul Thompson, a junior, started this year's opener at quarterback, but made his first-ever start at WR against Texas. Sophomore RB Jacob Gutierrez lined up in the slot on the first play to earn his first start.

The Kansas Game

■ OU's lone offensive touchdown was scored by true freshman Malcolm Kelly on a 25-yard pass from RS freshman Rhett Bomar. The Sooners' other TD was scored by sophomore CB D.J. Wolfe, who played RB last season. WR Juaquin Iglesias became the eighth freshman to start a game this season, the fifth true freshman to do so.

The Baylor Game

- Six players missed the game (five due to injury and one due to suspension). Of that six, five were seniors. The game-winner in the second overtime was a 21-yard pass from redshirt freshman Rhett Bomar to true freshman Juaquin Inglesias.
- With its top three running backs sidelined, fourth-string back Jacob Gutierrez, a sophomore, rushed for 173 yards. His back-up was converted DB Allen Patrick, who gained 49 on 15 tries.
- The Sooners matched a season high by playing 10 true freshmen.

The Nebraska Game

■ True freshman Malcolm Kelly led Oklahoma with eight receptions. OU had nine sacks, one by a senior. The Sooners matched a season high by playing 18 first-year players and used more true freshmen, 11, than in any other game to date.

About the Sooner Offense

- Under Bob Stoops, OU has produced its career leader in passing and receiving, while also turning out the fourth-leading rusher in school history and the school record holder for single season rushing yards.
- Oklahoma has scored at least one touchdown in 88 consecutive games dating back to Nov. 7, 1998.
- Under Stoops, OU has rushed for 200 yards 25 times, including 20 over the last four seasons.
- Also under Stoops, OU has 90 TDs of 25+ yards and 204 scoring drives that lasted less than two minutes.

Peterson Goes Over 2,000 Yards

Soph RB Adrian Peterson crossed over the 2,000 yard mark for his career vs. Tulsa, when be bolted for 220 against the Golden Hurricane. Peterson now has 2,469 yards for his career ...

■ Peterson has been slowed by bad ankle in the last four games (did not play vs. Baylor). Three weeks ago against Kansas State he had 51 yards through one quarter and a half when he left the game with an ankle injury. He had a 22-yard TD run before retiring. Two weeks he had just three carries for 10 yards against Texas, the last week he had five totes for -4 yards while playing in the first half only against Kansas.

■ The Tulsa game was the fourth 200-yard game (his fourth-highest total) and his fourth three-touchdown game. His 32 carries tied for his third-highest total, but with two receptions, the 34 touches ranked second. He had 36 touches (all rushes) against Kansas State last season.

- Last season, Peterson carried 339 times for 1,925 yards. His attempts ranked No. 1 in the nation, while his net yards was No. 3.
- During the off-season he had surgery on his left shoulder, which precluded his participation in spring practice.
- Peterson set a single season rushing record at OU in 2004, surpassing the previous best of 1,896 yards by Billy Sims in 1978.
- Peterson eclipsed Ron Dayne's (1,863) NCAA single season

mark for a freshman. Peterson set other NCAA freshman standards for consecutive 100-yard games (nine) and 100-yard games (11). He tied (Emmitt Smith, Florida, 1987 and Marshall Faulk, San Diego State, 1991) the record for reaching 1,000 yards the fastest by a frosh by doing so in the seventh game.

- Peterson averaged 164.0 yards vs. the four ranked foes in 2004.
- He gained 100 yards in 11 of 13 games as a frosh and has done so in 12 of 19 games during his career.
- He had the highest finish in the Heisman voting ever by a freshman (second) and was the first freshman to be named a finalist for the Doak Walker Award. He also was a finalist for the Maxwell.

Two X 2,000

With Kejuan Jones (2,227) and Adrian Peterson (2,469) both over 2,000 career rushing yards, it marks the first time since 1987 that OU has two backs over that figure on the same roster. Lydell Carr finished with 2,910 and Jamelle Holieway with 2,713 that year. It also happened in 1986 when Carr and Spencer Tillman both eclipsed 2,000.

■ It's also interesting to note that both Jones and Peterson figure to continue their respective ascensions up the career rushing touchdown list at OU. Jones is tied at No. 6 with Steve Davis with 35. Peterson has 23. He needs just seven to crack the top 15.

Rushing Game Revival

In the last three games, OU's ground game has found its groove again ...

- Against Kansas, the Sooners wound up with 96 rushing yards for the game, but that was due mostly to sacks. Donta Hickson (18-59) and Kejuan Jones (16-51) both eclipsed 50 yards while splitting the reps. A case could be made that one back might have made it over the century mark.
- The following week against Baylor, OU got 205 yards on the ground against Baylor for its third 200-yard performance of the season.
- Jacob Gutierrez went for 173 on yards on 30 carries against Baylor. Prior to that game, the soph's career numbers (all this season) were 14 rushes for 73 yards.
- Adrian Peterson carried 24 times for 146 yards at Nebraska.

Bomar Sooner

A look at RS QB Rhett Bomar, who came off the bench in the opener, but has since been the starter ...

- All four of his touchdown passes have come in the last five games.
- Since completing just 7-of-18 passes over his first two games, he has hit on 50% or better in five of the last six.
- Has positive rushing yards in five of eight games and three rushing touchdowns.
- He had a string of 73 throws without an interception snapped against Texas when one of his tosses bounced off a Sooner receiver into the hands of a Longhorn defender.
- In a two-game stretch vs. UCLA and Kansas St., he was 32-of-51 for 380 yards with one TD and no INT.
- He has nine rushes of more than 10 yards with a long of 42 vs. K-State. He had a 28 yarder vs. TCU.

Rushing QB Returns at Oklahoma

Only twice during the last two seasons (2003, 2004) did a starting Sooner quarterback have rushes of 10 or more yards. Jason White picked up 10 yards against Texas in 2003 and then had a 12-yard jaunt against USC last season. White finished in positive rushing numbers just five times over those two seasons (once in '03 and four times in '04). Bomar has had a positive rushing number in five of eight games to date. That's impressive considering he has thrown 175 passes and been sacked 18 times. In White's defense, before being slowed by two knee surgeries, he was a dangerous runner. He rushed 12 times for 117 yards at Kansas in the 2001 game. Two weeks later he suffered the first of two knee injuries during a game at Nebraska.

- That 2001 Kansas game stood as the most recent time that a Sooner quarterback had led the team in rushing for a game until Bomar's 67 yards topped OU in this year's Kansas State tilt.
- Bomar rushed for touchdowns in back-to-back games (UCLA and Kansas State), a first at OU since Nate Hybl did it against Air Force and North Texas in 2001. He since got another against Baylor.

Four Touchdown Passes, but ...

While it's true that Oklahoma has just four touchdown passes this season, the air game has played a significant role in other OU trips to the end zone ...

The UCLA Game

■ Bomar completed passes of 10 and 18 yards to the Bruin 16 before running to the end zone from there.

The Kansas State Game

- Bomar hit Finley on a 17-yard throw to the KSU three. Kejuan Jones score on the next play.
- Bomar hit Travis Wilson on a 24-yard play to the Wildcat four. Jones scored two plays later.

Young But Catching On

The receiving corps is another place where Oklahoma's youthfulness manifests itself. Seven of the 15 players with a catch this season have at least two years of eligibility remaining after this season.

- The four touchdown throws have gone to a sophomore (two) and a true freshman (two).
- Seven of those with a catch either weren't on the active roster in '04 or were playing a different position.

Geez, Mr. Wilson

Travis Wilson now has 102 catches for his career and is five receptions away from OU's career top 10 and 65 yards away from OU's career top 10 ...

- In the opener, Wilson led OU with five receptions for 52 yards. Seventeen of those yards after the catch.
- He had seven catches for 103 yards at UCLA. He also rushed twice for 61 yards, including a 56-yard TD.
- Against Kansas State, he caught five passes for 68 yards and returned one kickoff for 34.
- Wilson logged 30 receptions for 345 yards and five touchdowns over his first two seasons before erupting in his junior campaign with 50 catches for 660 yards and the 11 scores.

Versatility in the Trenches

The Oklahoma offensive linemen have played a number of positions during the respective careers ...

- LG Davin Joseph has 28 starts at right guard, four at left tackle and one at left guard.
- RG Chris Bush has five starts at left guard, five at right guard and three at center. Bush has three starts at right guard and three at center *this season*.
- C Chris Chester has one start at RG, three at C. He's the only offensive lineman on the team with a touchdown. That came on a fake field goal at Missouri in 2002 when he played TE and caught a pass.
- OT Chris Messner started the 2003 Alabama game at left tackle, then got the nod at right tackle in this year's season opener and has since returned to the line-up in that same slot.

About the Sooner Defense

- OU has forced at least one turnover in 77 of Bob Stoops' 87 games and has at least one interception in 56 of the last 743 games. OU has multiple picks in 19 of its last 46 outings.
- Opponents completed 50% or more of their passes in less than half of their games against Stoopscoached teams -- 41 times in 87 games.
- Foes scored less than 14 points in 48 of the games.
- OU has eight shutouts under its current coach. During that same period, the opponents failed to score more than seven points 26 times.

This Corps Living Up to Standard at Linebacker U.

With four Butkus winners (Brian Bosworth - 1984-85, Rocky Calmus (2001) and Teddy Lehman (2003), no school has won the honor more than OU. This year, Clint Ingram (SLB), Zach Latimer (MLB) and Rufus Alexander (WLB) are living up to the tradition. Ingram and Alexander were on the Watch List for this year's Butkus award ...

Ingram, who missed the UCLA game with an injury, has three interceptions this season. Against TCU he returned a pick 23 yards and against Tulsa he went 48 yards for a touchdown.

- In his career, he has three INT, two fumbles caused, two fumbles recovered (vs. Texas last season, he caused and recovered a fumble on the same play) and five PBU in 18 starts.
- His two sacks came vs. Kansas State and Texas.

Latimer made his first career start against TCU. The junior responded with 15 tackles, including 11 that were solo. Latimer entered the game with 12 career tackles.

■ He got 12 stops against Texas and is the team's second-leading tackler with 58.

Alexander is the team's top tackler with 71.

- He had seven TFL in his career heading into the Tulsa game then logged four vs. TU. He got three more against Kansas
- He has 147 career tackles and eclipsed the century mark with six at UCLA.
- He has four pass break-ups, one interception, two fumbles forced and one fumble recovery.

Dvoracek On Pace to Eclipse His Previous Best

DT Dusty Dvoracek is back after being dismissed from the 2004 squad and is now a team captain. He is a former All-Big 12 performer and CoSIDA Academic All-District selection. In 2003, he was credited with 40 tackles, including seven sacks and 16 TFL. All three of those numbers were tops on an OU interior line that included Tommie Harris, the Lombardi Award winner and a first-round draft choice of the Chicago Bears.

Good Company

Dusty Dvoracek now has 41 career tackles for loss, good for No. 8 on OU's all-time list ahead of the likes of Tony Casillas, Lee Roy Selmon and Darrell Reed.

■ Dvoracek is on pace to eclipse his 2003 numbers.

With 33 tackles through five games, he's on pace for 45 With 15 TFL, he's on pace for 21.

- Ranks No. 9 nationally and No. 1 among defensive tackles with 15 tackles for loss.
- He had four tackles at UCLA, three for loss. He logged a 10-yard sack despite the fact that the Bruin lineman was flagged for holding him on the play. He came back with three more TFL and another sack against Kansas.
- Four tackles for loss, one sack and his first career interception (on any level) at Nebraska.
- A candidate for Academic All-America honors.

Freshman Rarity Happened Just Once Before

OU started two true freshmen at the safety spots in two games this season -- SS Reggie Smith and FS Nic Harris. The only other time two true freshmen started in the OU secondary was the 1981 Sun Bowl vs. Houston. S Keith Stanberry got his only start of the year and CB Elbert Watts got his seventh.

Which End is Up?

OU is minus half of its anticipated two-deep at DE. Larry Birdine was lost during the August drills with a torn left biceps. John Williams suffered a torn left ACL against TCU. Both will miss the

Special Teams Stuff

- There have been 22 special teams TDs, including 15 in the last 44 regular season games. Those 15 came via five different kinds of plays -- nine punt returns, two faked field goals, a blocked punt, a kickoff return and a faked punt. The special teams also own one safety.
- OU has returned five kickoffs and 13 punts for touchdowns.
- The Sooners have blocked 18 kicks.
- In this year's opener, OU did not block a kick or return one for a TD, but did get a big play when Jason Carter tackled the TCU punter. The Sooners converted the play into a field goal.
- Against Kansas State, Jacob Gutierrez tipped a punt that traveled just eight yards.
- Against Texas, OU faked a punt with J.D. Runnels rushing to gain a first down.
- Against Kansas, the Sooners faked an extra point with H Cody Freeby completing a pitch pass to Russell Dennison for a first down.
- Against Nebraska, OU faked a field goal with H Cody Freeby pitching to K Garrett Hartley for a six-yard gain and a first down. OU scored on the next play on a 17-yard rush.

Many Happy Returns

OU special teams under Bob Stoops ...

- Kickoff Returns -- There have been 36 returns of 25 yards or more with five TDs.
- Punt Returns -- There have been 39 returns of 15 or more yards with 13 TDs.
- Interceptions -- There have been 52 returns of 10 or more yards with 14 TDs.
- Fumbles -- Three returns of 15 or more yards with three touchdowns.

Sooners Get a Freeby

Sophomore Cody Freeby, is in his first season at Oklahoma's punter.

- The left-footer also is the holder for Garrett Hartley's placements.
- In his first game, Freeby averaged 38.3 yards on eight punts with three downed inside the 20 and no touchbacks. Only one of his punts was returned and that one went for 10 yards.
- Against Tulsa, when he averaged 50.0 yards on five kicks, his 70-yarder was the first by a Sooner to cover that distance since Jeff Ferguson got off 71-yarder at Air Force in 2001.
- At UCLA, he averaged 45.6 yards on five punts and allowed the then-nation's leading returner, Maurice Drew, just one attempt for five yards.
- Against Kansas State, only two of his six boots were returned for a total of two yards.
- In the Texas game, he scooped up a bad snap and unleashed a 55-yard punt. It was one of two 50-yarders he had in the game.
- Against Baylor, he averaged 41.7 yardson six punts with one downed at the three and another at the one.

Sooners Have Hart-ley

Garrett Hartley, Oklahoma's kicker, has been especially impressive with his kickoffs ...

- Hartley has 26 full kickoffs (does not include squibs) and his average is 64.3 yards with 22 touchbacks. That means the ball lands or is caught at the one yardline. He had five touchbacks against KSU, three more against Texas (on four kicks).
- His 52-yard field goal against Texas was the longest ever by a Sooner against the Longhorns and was a career-best for Hartley. He made 50-yarders against Nebraska and TCU.
- He made all three field goal attempts against Baylor include a 39-yarder at the end of the first OT to force the decisive second extra period when OU got the win.
- ranks No. 16 nationally with 1.63 field goals per game.

Rice Trumps all the Streaks

Jacob Rice, the long-snapper and a former standout TE and DE at Norman High, trumps all the starts and games played streaks. The senior has been a starter in all 48 career games.

Dennison a Special Teams Stud

History is one tough customer at Oklahoma. The tradition, so rich and so long-standing, is as daunting as it is impressive. To be among the best at Oklahoma is to be among the best in college football.

Such dramatics are lost on Bob Stoops. The Sooner head coach befriended the would-be albatross of OU's successful past from his first

day on campus and remains steadfastly focused on tomorrow and the championship it holds.

It falls then to the observers and experts of the game to define Stoops' impact. Rarely have the pundits had it so easy.

Under Stoops, Oklahoma has won 72 games (72-15), spent 69 consecutive weeks in the national rankings, played in six bowl games, four of the BCS variety, and captured three Big 12 crowns. His 2000 team won the national champion-

ship. On a playing field leveled by scholarship limits and parity, this era stares down the Oklahoma standard and does not blink.

The achievement dulls the memory of what Stoops inherited. When he arrived in Norman, the proud Sooner program was five years removed from a winning record, four from bowl play. Those atypical days of angst are so forgotten now that they might as well be mentioned with the land rush and dust bowl.

Stoops has been characterized as a grounded family man, brilliant big-game coach, relentless recruiter, disciplined leader and a person with uncommon perspective. His success emanates from a disciplined style true to his roots in the Steel Valley of Ohio, but he is far from inflexible. The principles to which he holds are the tried and true axioms of the sport ... mixed with cutting edge strategy and an appreciation for the calculated risk.

During his time, OU has produced record—setting passers and receivers, two 1,000-yard rushers, suffocating defense and special teams

units that rank among the most dynamic in the land. Every facet has been impacted.

His players have snagged 16 national awards, including the 2003 Heisman Trophy won by Jason White. There have been 49 academic honorees, 43 All-Big 12 players, 21 All-Americans and 13 NFL draft choices.

Stoops has won a total of 10 national coach

of the year awards and has been Big 12 Coach of the year in three of his six campaigns in Norman.

This is one of the finest coaches in the history of one of college football's most storied traditions.

The son of a coach, Stoops was a four-year starter at lowa. He began his coaching career in 1983 as a volunteer in the Hawkeye program under Hayden Fry. He worked through the ranks until he became co-defensive coordinator at Kansas State



(1991-95).

With the Wildcats, he played a key role in their impressive turnaround. During his final four seasons there, K-State was 35-12 with three bowl appearances. Eventually, he left for Florida and a three-year stint as Steve Spurrier's defensive coordinator. In 1996, he was part of a national championship team. It was with the Gators that the spotlight found Stoops and made him one of the hottest names in the profession.

Stoops, who was born Sept. 9, 1960, in Youngstown, Ohio, graduated from lowa in 1983 with a degree in marketing. He and his wife, Carol, have three children: daughter, Mackenzie, and twin sons, Drake and Isaac.

Stoops vs. Ranked Foes


