RB Allen Patrick has been impressive since taking over as Oklahoma's top running back. Through two games in that role, the junior from Conway, S.C., has 70 carries for 267 yards

and one touchdown. Last week at Missouri, Patrick logged 35 rushing attempts for a careerhigh 157 yards as the Sooners downed the Tigers, 26-10.

#### **THE GAME**

Bob Stoops coaches his 100th Oklahoma game when the Sooners go to Texas A&M this weekend. The Sooners carry a three-game winning streak into a game with an Aggie club that has won four straight.

#### **THE SERIES**

Oklahoma leads it, 14-10, and has won the last three meetings and six of the last seven between the two. Texas A&M holds a 5-2 advantage over the Sooners in games played at College Station.

#### THE COACHES

Oklahoma: Bob Stoops (Iowa '83) is 81-18 in his eighth season with the Sooners. He is 4-3 in bowls, 3-2 in January Bowls, 2-2 in BCS games, 52-11 vs. the Big 12, 28-8 vs. the Big 12 South, 24-3 vs. the Big 12 North, 3-1 in the Big 12 title game, 29-7 vs. non-conference opponents, 46-2 at home, 22-9 on the road, 13-7 on neutral fields and 23-9 vs. ranked opponents. He is 6-1 vs. Texas A&M. Texas A&M: Dennis Franchione (Pittsburg State '73) is 24-20 in his fourth season at A&M, 179-93-2 in his 24th season overall.

#### THE PROGRAM

■ Oklahoma's all-time record is 763-291-53. ■ The Sooners own seven national championships (1950, 1955, 1956, 1974, 1975, 1985, 2000). ■ OU has 39 bowl appearances (No. 7 nationally) with 24 victories (No. 3 nationally). ■ Oklahoma has won 39 conference titles. ■ Since WWII, Oklahoma is the most successful college football program with 516 victories. ■ Some 141 All-Americans and four Heisman Trophy winners have come from the Oklahoma program.

#### **WEEKLY MEDIA LUNCHEON**

Each Tuesday during the season OU hosts a media luncheon inside the Kerr McGee Stadium Club (east side) at Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. The luncheon begins at 11:15 a.m., with comments from the head coach of OU's opponent that week (by speaker phone if the coach is available). Lunch is served at 11:30 a.m., and OU head coach Bob Stoops steps to the podium at 12 p.m. A limited number of Sooner players are on hand for interviews.

#### **CREDENTIALS**

Requests for credentials are taken online. To receive the link to the web site, e-mail Kenny Mossman at kmossman@ou.edu. Requests must be submitted by a sports director/editor at least eight days prior to the contest. Media attending games will have passes scanned and must show government issued photo identification upon entering the stadium. If the name on the credential and the photo ID do not match, the credential will be voided.

#### **PRACTICE**

All practice sessions are closed to media and public unless otherwise posted. - Assistant Coaches: The coaches are available after the Monday-Wednesday practices (coordinators who appear at the Tuesday luncheon are not available that day).
- Players: All interviews with players will take place at the media luncheon or after practice on Monday (offense) and Tuesday (defense). Media should request players at least 24 hours in advance. Those who attend the media luncheon are not available after Tuesday's practice.
- Post-Game: The OU locker room is closed at all times. Head coach Bob Stoops and several Sooners players will be brought to designated areas. After home games, the interview area is the Switzer Center's Red Room, located under the south end zone grandstand.

#### **OU HONORS GAUTT**



This season, Oklahoma honors the late Prentice Gautt. It was 50 years ago this season (1956) that Gautt became the first black football player at OU. Gautt, an Academic All-American during his playing days, went on to a successful career as a college administrator. He wore No. 38 on his jersey at Oklahoma. That number was not issued for this season. The Sooners are wearing a No. 38 decal (pictured below) on their helmets.



#### THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT

- Since dropping a 31-27 decision to then-No. 24 Texas Tech, Texas A&M has won four straight games. Included in that streak is three road triumphs.
- The Aggies feature a balanced offensive attack with 213.7 rushing yards per game and 209.1 through the air. Similarly, Oklahoma is within 11 yards per game of perfect balance.
- A&M opponents average just 117.7 yards per game, but have thrown for 197.3 while connecting on 53.6% of their passes.
- Oklahoma and Texas A&M have only one common opponent -- Missouri. The Aggies turned back the Tigers on Oct. 14 at College Station, 25-19. OU won at Columbia last Saturday, 26-10.

#### TIES WITH THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT

- Oklahoma co-offensive coordinator and receivers coach Kevin Sumlin was on the A&M staff from 2001-02.
- Aggie assistant head coach Kenith Pope played at OU and was on the Sooner staff from 1995-97. He graduated from Oklahoma in 1976.
- Texas A&M defensive coordinator Gary Darnell is a native of Moore, Okla.
- TAMU director of football operations Charley North coached the offensive line at OU from 1979-94. He is a Wagoner, Okla., native and coached 19 years of high school football in the Sooner state before embarking on a college coaching career.

#### **OKLAHOMA'S MOST RECENT GAME**

Oklahoma notched its 23rd win in 32 tries over a ranked opponent during the Bob Stoops era when it knocked off Missouri at Columbia last Saturday, 26-10 ...

- MU entered the game as the 16th-best scoring team in the nation, but was held to a season-low total and some 23 points under its average.
- The OU defense picked off Missouri QB Chase Daniel three times. Daniel had thrown just five interceptions in the previous seven games.
- RB Allen Patrick eclipsed 100 yards in his second straight game as the OU starter. He carried 35 times for 157 yards. The Sooners rolled up a season-high 231 rushing yards.
- WR Quentin Chaney made his first career reception, a 15-yard TD grab. It marked the second straight trip to Columbia in which a Sooner player made his first career touchdown reception. TE Chris Chester did the same thing in the 2002 game.

### **TURNOVER TALK**

Oklahoma (17) and its opponents (19) have nearly the same number of turnovers, but what happens after those turnovers is markedly different. The Sooners have scored 68 points after their takeaways as opposed to the opponents' 20.

#### **TRENDS**

- In three games since committing 11 penalties and five turnovers against Texas, the Sooners have committed a total of 13 penalties and three turnovers.
- Oklahoma QB Paul Thompson has not thrown an interception in any of the last three games.
- The Sooners have had a 100-yard rusher in every game this season. As a team, OU has exceeded 100 rushing yards in 14 consecutive games.
- Over the last two games, Oklahoma has had a commanding advantage in time of possession. Against Colorado, OU had the ball 13:28 more than the Buffs and at Missouri the advantage stood at 12:46. That's a total of 26:14, or nearly one half, during that stretch.

#### STREAKING AGAINST THE NORTH

With its win over Missouri, Oklahoma notched its fifth straight regular season sweep of the three games against the Big 12 North Division. The regular season streak against the North stands at 15 games while the overall streak, including the Big 12 title game, stands at 10.

- Under Bob Stoops, OU is 25-3 against the North.
- Stoops' home mark against the North moved to 13-0 with the win over Missouri. Oklahoma scored more than 30 points in 11 of those and won 12 by double digits.

#### ROSTER WRITINGS

- This Sooner team has just 11 seniors, the lowest number of Bob Stoops' tenure. The previous low was 12 by the 2001 squad. Only eight of the 11 are on scholarships.
- There are 24 players on this team with previous experience as a starter for OU. That's up from seven over the same time last season.
- Last season, OU ranked No. 7 nationally by playing 12 true freshmen. Through seven games this season, eight true freshmen have made it to the field. Those eight at C Chase Beeler, OL Cory Brandon, RB Chris Brown, WR Brandon Caleb, DB Quinton Carter, TE Jermaine Gresham, WR Adron Tennell and OT Trent Williams. The only two with starts are Beeler (vs. Middle Tennessee) and Williams (took over beginning with the Missouri game).
- Eleven of the 22 players that started against Missouri have at least two years of eligibility remaining. That also is true of 31 of the 44 players that saw action.

#### **TAKING A DIFFERENT POSITION**

During Bob Stoops' tenure 14 players have moved from one position to earn a starting job at another ...

- Perhaps most notable of those who changed was OT Jammal Brown who moved from the defensive line. He went on to win the 2004 Outland Trophy and was a first-round draft pick of the New Orleans Saints.
- Like Brown, eight of those who have moved went from one side of the ball to the other. This team includes 10 players who have switched positions since arriving at Oklahoma.

#### **OKLAHOMA TACKLES FULL SLATE OF I-A FOES ... AGAIN**

For the seventh straight season Oklahoma is playing an all I-A schedule. The Sooners have played exclusive I-A since Bob Stoops' opener in 1999 (a 49-0 win over I-AA Indiana State). This season, OU is the only program in the Big 12 with a full I-A slate.

#### **HOME FIELD HONCHOS**

With the win over Colorado, Oklahoma moved to 46-2 at Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium under Bob Stoops.


■ The Sooners have won their last 10 at home and 29 of the last 30. The two longest home field winning streaks under Stoops were 19 and 17 games.

#### STOOPS ERA ATTENDANCE CLIMBS ABOVE FOUR MILLION

With 422,053 in attendance for home games thus far in 2006, Oklahoma has drawn 4,072,319 for Bob Stoops' 48 home games (started in 1999). The Sooners crossed the four-million mark in this year's contest against Colorado.

- All 48 have been sold out and the most crimson-clad throng has seen the Sooners prevail 46 times.
- OU has exceeded its listed capacity of 82,112 in 22 consecutive games.
- Since Stoops became the head coach, expansion projects at Gaylord Family Oklahoma Memorial Stadium have increased the capacity by 9,347 seats.

#### **ABOUT THE OFFENSE**

- Under Stoops, OU produced its career leader in passing and receiving, while producing the fourth and fifth-ranked rusher in school history and the record-holder for single season rushing.
- Oklahoma has scored at least one touchdown in every game dating back to Nov. 7, 1998.
- On Stoops' watch, OU has 30, 200-yard rushing games with 24 over the last five years.
- Also under their current head coach, the Sooners have 98 touchdowns of 25-plus yards and 215 scoring drives that lasted less than two minutes.

#### **RUNNING GAME OPTIONS**

With RB Adrian Peterson with a broken collarbone, OU looks elsewhere in the running game ...

- Junior Allen Patrick made his first career start against Colorado. He established career highs with 35 attempts for 110 yards against a Buffalo defense ranked No. 9 nationally against the rush. It was the first 100-yard effort of the season against CU. Patrick then came back with another 35 rushes for 157 yards in the 26-10 win at Missouri.
- Junior Jacob Gutierrez has two career starts, both last season. He started vs. Baylor last season and got 30 carries for 173 yards and two TD. He underwent knee surgery after an ACL injury sustained in the 2005 Holiday Bowl and missed spring ball. He saw his most extensive action of the season against Colorado when he logged five carries for 19 yards.
- True frosh Chris Brown saw his first action vs. Colorado -- 4 att., for 12 yards and one TD.

#### **SANS AD**

Because of injury, Adrian Peterson (No. 2 in the nation in rushing and all purpose yards and No. 4 in scoring at the time of his injury) was out for all of last year's Baylor game and more than half of games against Kansas State, Texas and Kansas. OU rushed for 232 vs. K-State (Peterson had 51 before spraining an ankle), 77 vs. Texas (Peterson had 10), 95 vs. Kansas (Peterson had -4) and 205 vs. Baylor (Peterson DNP). Peterson missed no games in 2004.

■ When playing without Peterson, OU is 5-1 and out-rushed each opponent. The Sooners had a 100-yard rusher in three of those six games.

#### PT CRUISIN'

Paul Thompson, who moved to WR last season, did not return to the QB role until Aug. 3 ...

- His completion rate is 60.9% with 13 TD and five INT. His average/completion is 13.2 yards.
- Over the last 45 years, most of which were run-dominated, there have been only four in which a Sooner QB completed 60% of his passes -- two by Jason White and two by Josh Heupel.
- He has at least one TD pass in seven of the eight games and multiple scoring throws in five.
- Since Peterson's injury, Thompson has rushed 11 times for 54 yards and one touchdown. Prior to the injury, he had 26 rushes for 14 yards.
- He has not thrown a pick in five of the last six games, including the last three in a row.

#### **SUPER SOPHS CATCHING ON**

- Malcolm Kelly became the fastest OU receiver to 1,000 yards when he did so during the Missouri game, the 19th of his career. The mark was previously held by Antwone Savage, who eclipsed 1,000 yards in his 21st game. He has TD receptions in all but three games. Kelly had his best game for receptions this season against Colorado with seven, one off his career best.
- Juaquin Iglesias has 25 catches with four or more grabs in four of the last six games.
- Manuel Johnson got his first career start in the game against Colorado and responded with two catches for 11 yards and one touchdown.

#### TRENCH TALK

Oklahoma lost four seniors (two were drafted) who gobbled up 41 starts last season in the offensive line, but there are returnees who either started or saw extensive action ...

- The offensive line is young by any standard with three sophomore starters and one true freshman, but that is magnified by the fact that none of the four redshirted. Of the nine players who have seen action on the line this year, all but one have at least two years of eligibility remaining.
- Two true frosh have started -- C Chase Beeler (Middle Tennessee) and RT Trent Williams (Missouri).



#### **ABOUT THE DEFENSE**

- Oklahoma has forced at least one turnover in 88 of Bob Stoops' 99 games and has at least one interception in 65 of the last 86. OU has multiple picks in 24 of its last 55 outings.
- Opponents completed 50 percent of their passes in less than half of the Stoops-coached games -- 46 times in 98 games.
- Oklahoma has nine shutouts under its current head coach. Opponents failed to score more than seven points 27 times and scored less than 14 points 51 times against OU.
- With 11 starters in 12 games last season there were 132 combined starting assignments. Ninety-six of those return among the personnel on hand for the 2006 season.

#### **RAISING THE RUF**

Linebacker Rufus Alexander, Oklahoma's leading tackler for a second straight season, is etching his name on a prestigious list ... the career tackles chart for OU linebackers. With 244, Alexander is No. 18 on a list that includes four Butkus Award winners. OU has produced more Butkus winners than any other program. Alexander needs two more tackles to move ahead of Mark Driscoll for the No. 17 position.

■ Alexander is trying to become the first player to lead the Sooners in tackles in consecutive seasons since Rocky Calmus did it three in three straight from 1999-2001.

#### **HANDS-ON DEFENSE**

Oklahoma defenders have touched the ball a total of 49 times in the form of 31 pass deflections, 10 interceptions and eight fumble recoveries. Of those 49, 16 (33%) have occurred over the last two games. In those two games, OU has 10 PBU, four interceptions and two fumble recoveries.

#### END ALL, BE ALL

A look at one of OU's deepest positions, defensive end ...

- C.J. Ah You was the consensus Big 12 Defensive Newcomer of the Year in 2005. He also captured Defensive MVP honors at the Pacific Life Holiday Bowl.
- Calvin Thibodeaux started every game last season and led the team with 10 sacks.
- Larry Birdine missed the first 11 games in '05 with a biceps injury, but is still on the Hendricks Watch List. In 2004, he did not start a game while working behind Dan Cody and Jonathan Jackson, yet finished No. 3 in the Big 12 with seven sacks.
- John Williams redshirted in 2004. He had four tackles, a sack and a fumble recovery before suffering a season-ending knee injury in the 2005 opener vs. TCU.
- Alonzo Dotson is the nephew of former Baylor and Green Bay Packers great Santana Dotson.

#### **RIP AND RUN**

Oklahoma has 10 interceptions with a return average of 7.3 yards and one touchdown. Last year, Oklahoma returned its 13 interceptions for 220 yards, an average of 16.9 yards, and three TD. The return average was third-highest in the Stoops era. The 2003 team set the standard with a 21.5-yard average on 24 picks.

#### **ABOUT THE SPECIAL TEAMS**

Oklahoma's special teams under Bob Stoops ...

- There have been 23 special teams TD, including 16 in the last 50 regular season games. Those 16 came via five different kinds of plays -- 10 punt returns, two faked FG, two blocked punts, a kickoff return and a faked punt. The special teams also own one safety in that span.
- In total, OU has returned five kickoffs and 13 punts for TD on Stoops' watch (since 1999).
- The Sooners have blocked 20 kicks, including two punts this season by Jason Carter. His block at Missouri resulted in a safety.
- Last season OU ran a trick play, blocked a kick or tackled a punter in five of the 12 games.

#### **MANY HAPPY RETURNS**

Information on returns during the Stoops era ...

- Kickoff Returns -- 43 returns of 25 yards or more with five touchdowns.
- Punt Returns -- 43 returns of 15 or more yards with 14 touchdowns.
- Interceptions Returns -- 55 returns of 10 or more yards with 15 touchdowns.
- Fumble Returns -- Three returns of 15 or more yards with three touchdowns.

#### **THE 2006 RETURN GAME**

Oklahoma is averaging 23.0 yards on kickoff returns and 10.2 on punt returns. Last season, the Sooners averaged 18.2 yards on kickoff returns and 7.4 on punt returns.

- Reggie Smith has 22 punt returns for a 10.2-yard average. In the Washington game, he picked up an 82-yard punt and returned it 62 yards. He has two of 25 yards or longer. At Oregon, he had a 55-yard kickoff return. He had a 61-yard return for a touchdown against Middle Tennessee.
- Juaquin Iglesias has been an effective kickoff returner with six for a 25.2-yard average. Four of his returns exceeded 30 yards.
- The coverage teams allow just 5.4 yards on punt returns, 17.9 on kickoff returns.

## THE LONG AND SHORT OF THE PUNTING GAME

Michael Cohen is handling the long punts for OU and Mike Knall the short ...

- Cohen has 26 of OU's 34 on the season. He is averaging 39.9 yards with six downed inside the 20 (one at the 1).
- Knall has seven punts downed inside the 20 for the season. Used only in short field situations, he has only one touchback in eight kicks.

#### **MCEACHERN GETS A GRIP**

Back-up QB Hays McEachern, whose father played at Texas and whose mother was a cheer-leader for the Longhorns, is the holder. He is the first QB to hold since Patrick Fletcher in 2000.

#### **CRIMSON SNAPPER**

OU lost Jacob Rice to graduation. He was the long snapper for all 52 games of his career. Derek Shaw has taken over the duties. The true freshman is perfect in 67 snaps this season.

#### **SOONERS HAVE HART-LEY**

K Garrett Hartley is in his third season in the starter's role. He won the job in the regular season finale of his true freshman season (2004) ...

- Hartley is 14-of-15 on field goals and 29-of-29 on PATs this season. His lone miss was a blocked kick. He has kicked off 52 times with 24 touchbacks.
- His field goals made percentage of .933 leads the nation among kickers with more than 10 attempts.
- The junior ranks No. 4 nationally with 1.75 field goals made per game and No. 14 in scoring with 8.88 points per game.
- He made a career-high four field goals at Oregon.
- Hartley has three career makes of 50 yards or longer. His long for this season is 46, which he has done twice.

History is one tough customer at Oklahoma. The tradition, so rich and so long-standing, is as daunting as it is impressive. To be among the best at Oklahoma is to be among the best in college football.

Such dramatics are lost on Bob Stoops. The Sooner head coach befriended the would-be albatross of OU's successful past from his first

day on campus and remains steadfastly focused on tomorrow and the championship it holds.

It falls then to the observers and experts of the game to define Stoops' impact. Rarely have the pundits had it so easy.

Under Stoops, Oklahoma has won 81 games (81-18), spent 69 consecutive weeks in the national rankings, played in seven bowl games, four of the BCS variety, and captured three Big 12 crowns. His 2000 team won the national champion-

ship. On a playing field leveled by scholarship limits and parity, this era stares down the Oklahoma standard and does not blink.

The achievement dulls the memory of what Stoops inherited. When he arrived in Norman, the proud Sooner program was five years removed from a winning record, four from bowl play. Those atypical days of angst are so forgotten now that they might as well be mentioned with the land rush and dust bowl.

Stoops has been characterized as a grounded family man, brilliant big-game coach, relentless recruiter, disciplined leader and a person with uncommon perspective. His success emanates from a disciplined style true to his roots in the Steel Valley of Ohio, but he is far from inflexible. The principles to which he holds are the tried and true axioms of the sport ... mixed with cutting edge strategy and an appreciation for the calculated risk.

During his time, OU has produced recordsetting passers and receivers, three 1,000-yard rushers, suffocating defense and special teams

units that rank among the most dynamic in the land. Every facet has been impacted.

His players have snagged 16 national awards, including the 2003 Heisman Trophy won by Jason White. There have been 54 academic honorees, 47 All-Big 12 players, 21 All-Americans and 29 NFL draft choices.

Stoops has won a total of 10 national coach

of the year awards and has been Big 12 Coach of the year in three of his six campaigns in Norman.

This is one of the finest coaches in the history of one of college football's most storied traditions.

The son of a coach, Stoops was a four-year starter at Iowa. He began his coaching career in 1983 as a volunteer in the Hawkeye program under Hayden Fry. He worked through the ranks until he became co-defensive coordinator at

Kansas State (1991-

95) during Bill Snyders rein.

With the Wildcats, he played a key role in an impressive turnaround. During his final four seasons there, K-State was 35-12 with three bowl appearances. Eventually, he left for Florida and a three-year stint as Steve Spurrier's defensive coordinator. In 1996, he was part of a national championship team. It was with the Gators that the spotlight found Stoops and made him one of the hottest names in the profession.

Stoops, who was born Sept. 9, 1960, in Youngstown, Ohio, graduated from Iowa in 1983 with a degree in marketing. He and his wife, Carol, have three children: daughter, Mackenzie, and twin sons, Drake and Isaac.

NORMAN, Okla. -- Adrian Peterson rushed for one touchdown and caught another as Oklahoma withstood a stubborn UAB team, 24-17. A crowd of 84,555, the largest ever to see an OU opener, witnessed the game.

Like the 2005 opener, when the Sooners lost to TCU, 17-10, Oklahoma committed four turnovers. Peterson had one of those, a fumble, but atoned with a four-yard touchdown run and a 69-yard TD reception.

Paul Thompson got the start at guarterback and was impressive. He completed eight of his first 10 and finished 14-of-24 for 227 yards. He was picked off twice, but also had a pair of scoring tosses.

OU trailed only once, 17-14, but scored on its first play after falling behind on the swing pass from Thompson to Peterson.

The two teams combined for just 110 plays, a record for fewest plays in a game over the last 50 seasons.

Several disputed calls down the stretch, including replays, marred a thrilling, offensive slugfest. In particular, the touching of the ball and awarding of possession on an Oregon onside kick with 1:06 remaining drew outcry from Oklahoma and many national media.

The Ducks rallied from a 13-point deficit over the final 3:12, then blocked OU's potential game-winning field goal on the final play.

Adrian Peterson starred for the Sooners. He rushed 34 times for 211 yards and one touchdown in the game. He was particularly impressive in the fourth quarter when he gained 145 yards.

Oklahoma trailed early, then built a 33-20 lead in the fourth quarter. A defense that had played well through the second and third periods, faltered in the fourth and wound up surrendering 501 yards on the day.
