PLAYER TO WATCH



THE GAME

Oklahoma, which played just one game from Sept. 15 until this weekend's match-up, now hosts three of its last four. The stretch begins Saturday when Texas A&M visits. The Sooners were idle last week, while the Aggies dropped a 19-11 home decision to Kansas.

THE SERIES

Oklahoma leads it 15-10, including 10-2 advantage in Norman. The Sooners have won the last four meetings and the last four between the two schools on Owen Field.

THE COACHES

Oklahoma: Bob Stoops (lowa '83) is 93-20 in his ninth season with the Sooners. He is 4-4 in bowls, 3-3 in January Bowls, 2-3 in BCS games, 59-12 vs. the Big 12, 32-8 vs. the Big 12 South, 27-4 vs. the Big 12 North, 4-1 in the Big 12 title game, 33-8 vs. non-conference opponents, 51-2 at home, 27-10 on the road, 14-8 on neutral fields and 27-10 vs. ranked foes. He is 7-1 vs. A&M. Texas A&M: Dennis Franchione (Pittsburg St., '73) 31-26 in his fifth year with the Aggies, 186-99-2 in 25 years overall.

THE PROGRAM

■ Oklahoma's all-time record stands at 775-293-53. ■ The Sooners own seven national championships (1950, 1955, 1956, 1974, 1975, 1985, 2000). ■ OU has 40 bowl appearances (No. 7 nationally) with 24 victories (No. 3 nationally). ■ Oklahoma has won 40 conference titles. ■ Since WWII, Oklahoma is the most successful college football program with 531 victories. ■ Some 142 All-Americans and four Heisman Trophy winners have come from the Oklahoma program.

WEEKLY MEDIA LUNCHEON

Each Tuesday during the season OU hosts a media luncheon inside the Kerr McGee Stadium Club (east side) at Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. The luncheon begins at 11:15 a.m., with comments from the head coach of OU's opponent that week (by speaker phone if the coach is available). Lunch is served at 11:30 a.m., and OU head coach Bob Stoops steps to the podium at 12:05 p.m. A limited number of Sooner players are on hand for interviews.

CREDENTIALS

Requests for credentials are accepted online. To receive the link to the web site, e-mail Kenny Mossman at kmossman@ou.edu. Requests must be submitted by a sports director/editor at least eight days prior to the contest. Media attending games will have passes scanned and must show government issued photo identification upon entering the stadium. If the name on the credential and the photo ID do not match, the credential will be voided.

The University of Oklahoma Athletics Media Relations office has opened a media-only website to assist in covering Sooner sports. PRACTICE

All practice sessions are closed to media and public unless otherwise posted. On days when post-practice interviews are conducted, media should gather outside the practice site 10-15 minutes before the workout is complete. Requests for interviews will be recorded at that time and members of the athletics media relations staff will escort media into the practice facility at the appropriate time.

- Head Coach Bob Stoops will do general interviews following practice on Monday. All other requests must be submitted to Kenny Mossman.
- Assistant Coaches: The coaches are available after the Monday-Wednesday practices (coordinators who appear at the Tuesday luncheon are not available that day).
- Players: All interviews with players will take place at the media luncheon or after practice on Monday and Tuesday. Media should request players at least 24 hours in advance. Those who attend the media luncheon are not available after Tuesday's practice.
- Post-Game: The OU locker room is closed at all times. Head coach Bob Stoops and several Sooner players will be brought to designated areas. After home games, the interview area is the Switzer Center's Red Room, located under the south end zone grandstand.

LAST YEAR'S GAME

Oklahoma gambled and won at College Station, 17-16 ...

■ With 1:29 remaining and OU clinging to a one-point lead at its own 29-yard line, OU converted a fourth-and-one on a QB sneak from Paul Thompson.

■ Oklahoma picked up 224 yards on the ground, including 173 by Allen Patrick. The Sooners completed just 3-of-12 passes.

■ The Aggies were forced to settle for field goals on two of their three trips into the red zone. Michael Goodson led A&M with 127 rushing yards on just 10 attempts.

■ OU jumped to a 14-3 lead, and led 14-10 at the half. Neither team could generate much offense in the second half with A&M booting two field goals and Oklahoma one.

OKLAHOMA'S MOST RECENT GAME

Oklahoma's offense was sluggish, but gathered itself in the second half and the Sooners rode a strong defensive performance to a 17-7 win at lowa State on Oct. 20 ...

- Oklahoma went scoreless through a half for the first time this year (trailed 7-0) at halftime.
- The Sooner defense was stingy. Iowa State's lone score came on a 35-yard drive after an OU fumble. It was one of three Oklahoma turnovers. The Cyclones were 4-of-15 on third down and scored on only one of four trips into the Red Zone.
- Sam Bradford completed 16-of-28 passes for 183 yards. His only interception bounced off the chest of an OU receiver. The Sooners rushed for 133 yards with Demarco Murray getting a team high 59 on nine carries.
- Chris Brown scored both OU touchdowns on runs of eight and four yards.
- D.J. Wolfe and Curtis Lofton both had 11 tackles. Wolfe made an important interception in the end zone with 6:54 remaining to protect a 14-7 lead. Lofton tipped that pass.
- Garrett Hartley's 43-yard field goal into the wind with 1:34 remaining sealed the outcome.

SOONERS DIGGING THE LONG BALL

OU has 70 plays, offense and defense, of 20 yards or longer (not including special teams) ...

- Plays of 20-29 Yards -- 31 plays and seven touchdowns.
- Plays of 30-39 Yards -- 19 plays and five touchdowns
- Plays of 40+ Yards -- 21 plays and 11 touchdowns.

Notes: Four Sooners have a rush of 41 yards or longer ... OU has a 53-yard FG from Garrett Hartley ... OU's opponents have 16 plays (14 passes) of 20+ yards ... OU's longest play was a 92-yard touchdown run by DeMarco Murray vs. Utah State ... he also had an 81-yard kickoff return at Tulsa ... Juaqin Iglesias has the most plays of 20 or more yards with 21 with 11 of those on kickoff returns ... from scrimmage, Malcolm Kelly leads with 11, seven of which were TD.

MISCELLANY

- Oklahoma has scored in 26 of 30 quarters this season. .
- Oklahoma has had a 100-yard receiver in five games this season.
- DeMarco Murray and Allen Patrick both have 100-yard rushing games this season. It marks the fifth consecutive season that more than one tailback achieved the feat in the same year. Those two average 6.3 and 5.9 yards per carry, respectively.
- OU has four, one-play scoring drives. Three of those plays were rushes and the shortest, a rush, was 17 yards.
- OU has two, 90-yard scoring drives: 96 against Utah State and 94 against Texas.
- OU opponents are 37-fo-125 on third down for 29.6%. OU is 54-of-105 for 51.4%.
- Oklahoma opponents are 3-of-25 on third down in the fourth quarter.
- OU ran between 67 and 73 plays in its six wins, 46 in its loss. The Sooners ran 73 plays in four games this season, 72 in another.
- Rushing -- OU 321 attempts for 1,540 yards (4.8/carry); opponents 275 for 551 (2.0/carry).
- Oklahoma has 15 turnovers as opposed to 19 by the opponents. OU scored 86 points (8 TD, 2 FG) off the turnovers, the opponents have 51 (6 TD, 3 FG).

THE SOONERS BRIEFLY

- Oklahoma was tabbed for a second-place finish in the Big 12's South Division in a preseason polling of league media. Defensive back Reggie Smith was named the league's preseason defensive player of the year.
- There are 34 players on this team with previous experience as a starter for OU. That's up from 10 over the number that returned last season.

HOME FIELD HONCHOS

- Oklahoma is 51-2 at home under Bob Stoops and has won its last 15 in a row there and 35 of its last 36. During Stoops's tenure, which included home winning streaks of 19 and 17 games, OU has registered six shutouts on Owen Field.
- The Sooners are 27-1 against the Big 12 at home under Stoops and have won their last 18 conference games on Owen Field.

GREAT SLATE

- Oklahoma has played exclusive Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly I-A) opposition since Bob Stoops' opener in 1999 (a 49-0 win over I-AA Indiana State) or for 113 consecutive games.
- Under Stoops, Oklahoma has played regular season games against Notre Dame, UCLA (twice), Alabama (twice), Oregon (twice), Miami, Louisville, North Carolina, Air Force and Washington. Future slates feature Miami, Washington, Tennessee, Notre Dame, LSU and Florida State.

CLOSE SHAVES

Oklahoma's loss at Colorado marked the fourth time in the last five Sooner setbacks that the game was decided on the game's final play: 2007 Colorado (CU field goal), 2007 Fiesta Bowl (Boise State TD), 2006 Oregon (blocked Oklahoma field goal attempt) and 2005 Texas Tech (TTU touchdown). Those four losses were by a total of seven points (27-24 at Colorado, 43-42 to Boise State, 34-33 at Oregon and 23-21 at Texas Tech), and all were away from Norman.

STOOPS ERA YIELDING RECORD-SETTING ATTENDANCE NUMBERS

Oklahoma has drawn 4,244,302 for Bob Stoops' 53 home games (started in 1999) ...

- All 53 have been sold out and the Sooners prevailed 51 times. The current string of sellouts is second-longest in school history trailing a string of 69 straight from 1971 to 1984.
- Last year's average home attendance of 84,561 was the largest in school history. The top seven seasons for OU home attendance have come on Stoops' watch.
- The crowd of 85,357 for this year's Miami game is the largest in school history. The 84,472 for this year's North Texas game was the largest ever for an OU opener
- OU has exceeded its listed capacity of 82,112 in 27 consecutive games.
- When the game against Missouri sold out, it marked the 94th (home, away and neutral) to do so in Bob Stoops' 113 games as the OU head coach.
- During those nine years, 8,156,471 fans have been in attendance for Sooner games.
- Some 83.1% of Stoops' games sold out as compared with 83.7 (136-of-190) for Barry Switzer and 37.1% (66-of-178) for Bud Wilkinson.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE

- Under Stoops, Oklahoma has produced its career leader in passing and receiving, while turning out the No. 3- and No. 4-ranked rusher in school history and the school record holder for single-season rushing, passing and receiving yards.
- OU has scored at least one touchdown in every game dating back to Nov. 7, 1998.
- Under Stoops, OU has rushed for 200 yards 35 times, including 29 over the last five seasons.
- In the Stoops era, OU has 119 TD of 25+ yards and 242 scoring drives of less than 2:00.
- OU's 2006 team missed perfect offensive balance by just 202 yards (2,682 passing, 2,480 rushing). The 2005 team missed it by just one yard and the 2003 squad was off by only 160.

BRADFORD HAS SPECIAL TIES TO OU AND THE STATE

Sam Bradford earned the starting quarterback job in August ...

- Bradford is a certified Cherokee Indian. His great, great grandmother (father's side) was named Susie Walkingstick.
- Bradford's father, Kent, was an offensive lineman at OU. He lettered in 1977 and 1978.
- He completed his last 18 passes vs. North Texas and his first four vs. Miami. That string of 22 broke Jason White's OU record of 18 and challenged the NCAA mark of 24 set by Tennessee's Tee Martin. Bradford then hit his last 10 vs. Miami and first 11 vs. Utah State for a string of 21.
- Multiple TD passes in six games, school record (tied) five TD passes vs. North Texas, hit at least 65% in six games, no INT in four games, at least one 30-yard pass in every game.

NATIONAL NUMBERS

■ No. 2 in passing efficiency at 171.1. ■ No. 2 in scoring with 44.5 per game. ■ No. 9 in sacks allowed at 1.0 per game. ■ No. 19 in total offense with 449.1 yards per game. ■ No. 25 in rushing offense with 193.5 yards per game. ■ Sam Bradford is No. 2 in passing eff. (170.9).

LINE OF DEMARCATION

Adrian Peterson was a true frosh in '04 (age 19; DeMarco Murray a redshirt in '07 (age 19) ...

- Peterson rushed for 15 touchdowns in 2004, one every 22.6 attempts. Murray has nine, one every 7.9 attempts. All of Peterson's TDs came via the rush. Murray has a 10th on a KO return.
- Peterson's long frosh rush was 80 yards vs. Oklahoma St. Murray went 92 yards vs Utah St.
- Peterson had five receptions as a freshman; Murray has 10.

JUA-KEEN IGLESIAS

- The junior entered the season with 60 career receptions for 804 yards and four touchdowns. In 2007, he has 42 grabs for 635 yards and four scores. His longest reception coming into this season was 37 yards. He already has five for longer distances in '07.
- Career bests in catches (8 vs. Tulsa, Utah St.), yards (142 vs. Tulsa) and TD (2 vs. Tulsa).
- He's averaging 28.4 yards per kickoff return (No. 22 nationally) with a long of 44.
- Iglesias' 1,107 all-purpose yards are 325 more than the next highest figure on the team.

TIGHT END TANDEM

Last season, Joe Jon Finley and Jermaine Gresham combined to average 1.9 receptions/game and scored four touchdowns. In '07, they're averaging 4.1 receptions and have seven TD.

O-LINE OF HISTORICAL PROPORTIONS

With an average height of 6-5 (76.6 inches) and 322.4 pounds this is one of the biggest offensive lines in OU history. In the Stoops era this is the heaviest line and the third-tallest. The 2002 and 2003 lines measured 77.2 inches.

KEEPING THE OB CLEAN

OU allows 1.0 sacks per game. The school record for fewest sacks allowed in a season was set last season at 1.1 (sacks record tracked only on teams with at least 100 passing attempts).



ABOUT THE SOONER DEFENSE

- OU has forced at least one turnover in 102 of Bob Stoops' 113 games and has at least one interception in 76 of the last 99. There have multiple picks in 30 of their last 69 outings.
- Oklahoma has nine shutouts under its current head coach. Opponents failed to score more than seven points 29 times and scored less than 14 in 55 games.

ENGLISH LESSON

Sophomore DE Auston English redshirted after his true freshman season, but is back from that year away from competition in a big way. He leads the Sooners in sacks with 8.5 and in tackles for loss with 12.

■ With 8.5 sacks, English is tied with Torrance Marshall (1999) for the 14th-best single season total in school history. The OU record of 14 is held by Martin Chase (1997) and Cedric Jones (1994). The best total in the Stoops era was 10 | OU Most Tackles in a Season by Calvin Thibodeaux (2005) and Dan Cody (2004, 2003).

PAPER OR PLASTIC?

Oklahoma is averaging 3.4 sacks per game. That average over a 12-game schedule would amount to 41 sacks. The school record of 48 was set in 1986. The sack high for this season is six vs. North Texas and Tulsa.

LB Curtis Lofton ranks No. 5 nationally with 11.6 tackles per game. His 93 stops include six double-digit games and a career-high 18 vs. Missouri. He also has a pair of TD with a 45-yard interception return (Utah) State and a 12-yard fumble return (Missouri).

WHAT HAVE YOU DONE FOR ME LATELY?

- With 239 INT return yards, OU has exceeded its total for each of the last three years.
- With 26.5 sacks through eight games, OU is 1.5 ahead of its 14-game total in 2006.

TOUCHY, FEELY DEFENSE

OU defenders have touched the ball 45 times (5.6 times per game) with 26 PBUs, 14 interceptions and five fumble recoveries. To put that in perspective, opposing teams have just 29 touches in 13 break-ups, 10 fumble recoveries and six interceptions. OU is averaging 16.4 yards on INT/fumble returns with four touchdowns, which is one shy of the school record set in 1956 and 2001.

STOOPS ERA STAPLE: RUN DEFENSE

This season, six opponents rushed for 66 or fewer yards. Eighteen times, Bob Stoops-coached Oklahoma teams have held opponents under 40 rushing yards in a game. Four times the total has resulted in negative yards.

- There have been 25 special teams TDs, including 18 in the last 61 regular season games. Those 18 came via five different kinds of plays -- 10 punt returns, two faked FG, two blocked punts, three kickoff returns and a faked punt. Special teams also own one safety in that span.
- In total, OU has returned six kickoffs and 14 punts for TDs on Stoops' watch (since 1999).
- The Sooners have blocked 20 kicks.

MORE ON THE RETURNS

Oklahoma's kickoff returns have been particularly solid this season ...

- Three different players have a return of more than 35 yards.
- All four players that have returned kicks this season are averaging at least 24 yards.
- DeMarco Murray ran 81 yards for a touchdown against Tulsa on the second kickoff return of his college career. His first came earlier in the same game.

TWO-HEADED PUNTER

Oklahoma used two punters last season and both return ...

- Michael Cohen handles the long punts and is averaging 42.2 yards per boot. Five of his boots covered 50 or more yards with a long of 59 yards at Colorado. He had three 50-yard punts against Texas and now has a 50-yarder in three of the last four games.
- Mike Knall kicks when it is a short field. He's averaging 36.2 yards with two of four downed inside the 20 yardline.

HARTLEY SHOWING OFF BIG LEG

Garrett Hartley, who made a 53-yard field goal vs. Utah State, is averaging 66.6 yards per kick-off (ball lands at the three yard line) with 16 touchbacks in 62 attempts. To put that in perspective, opposing kickers average 61.0 yards per kickoff with two touchbacks in 29 tries.

- Opposing teams are averaging just 21.3 yards per return after Hartley's kickoffs. OU is averaging 27.7 yards per kickoff return.
- Hartley tied a school record when he made 11 point after touchdown kicks in the opener.
- He has made 16 of his last 18 field goal attempts, including a 43-yarder at Iowa State.

SOONERS HAVE HART-LEY

K Garrett Hartley was one of three finalists for the Lou Groza Award and is on the watch list for that award again this year ...

- Hartley ranks No. 5 in career kick scoring at OU (260), No. 6 in career field goals (40) and No. 7 in career PAT (140).
- Hartley made 19-of-20 FG and 49-of-50 on PAT in 2006. His lone field goal miss was a block at Oregon (made a career-high four FG in that game). He kicked off 78 times with 31 touchbacks.
- His FG made percentage of .950 was tops in the nation among kickers with at least 10 makes. He made his last 11 attempts of the season.
- Hartley ranked No. 20 nationally in field goals made per game with 1.36 and was No. 21 in scoring with 7.57 points per game.
- Hartley has four career makes of 50 yards or longer, including a 53-yarder against Utah State this season. He made a long of 46 yards twice last season.

History is one tough customer at Oklahoma. The tradition, so rich and so long-standing, is as daunting as it is impressive. To be among the best at Oklahoma is to be among the best in college football.

Such dramatics are lost on Bob Stoops. The Sooner head coach befriended the would-be albatross of OU's successful past from his first

day on campus and remains steadfastly focused on tomorrow and the championship it holds.

It falls then to the observers and experts of the game to define Stoops' impact. Rarely have the pundits had it so easy.

Under Stoops,
Oklahoma has won
93 games (93-20),
been ranked for
126 weeks in
the AP Poll (69
consecutive at one
point) and 123 in
the USA Today
Coaches Poll,
played in seven
bowl games, four of
the BCS variety, and

captured three Big 12 crowns. His 2000 team won the national championship. On a playing field leveled by scholarship limits and parity, this era stares down the Oklahoma standard and does not blink.

The achievement dulls the memory of what Stoops inherited. When he arrived in Norman, the proud Sooner program was five years removed from a winning record, four from bowl play. Those atypical days of angst are so forgotten now that they might as well be mentioned with the land rush and dust bowl.

Stoops has been characterized as a grounded family man, brilliant big-game coach, relentless recruiter, disciplined leader and a person with uncommon perspective. His success emanates from a disciplined style true to his roots in the Steel Valley of Ohio, but he is far from inflexible. The principles to which he holds are the tried and true axioms of the sport ... mixed with cutting edge strategy and an appreciation for the calculated risk.

During his time, OU has produced recordsetting passers and receivers, three 1,000-yard rushers, suffocating defense and special teams units that rank among the most dynamic in the land. Every facet has been impacted.

His players have snagged 16 national awards, including the 2003 Heisman Trophy won by Jason White. There have been 58 aca-

demic honorees, 53 All-Big 12 players, 22 All-Americans and 32 NFL draft choices.

Stoops has won a total of 10 national coach of the year awards and has been consensus Big 12 Coach of the year in three times.

The son of a coach, Stoops was a four-year starter at lowa. He began his coaching career in 1983 as a volunteer in the Hawkeye program under Hayden Fry. He worked through the ranks until he became co-defensive coordinator at

Kansas State (1991-95) during Bill Snyders rein.

With the Wildcats, he played a key role in an impressive turnaround. During his final four seasons there, K-State was 35-12 with three bowl appearances. Eventually, he left for Florida and a three-year stint as Steve Spurrier's defensive coordinator. In 1996, he was part of a national championship team. It was with the Gators that the spotlight found Stoops and made him one of the hottest names in the profession.

Stoops, who was born Sept. 9, 1960, in Youngstown, Ohio, graduated from lowa in 1983 with a degree in marketing. He and his wife, Carol, have three children: daughter, Mackenzie, and twin sons, Drake and Isaac.
