# **PLAYER TO WATCH**

QB Sam Bradford, the nation's leader in passing efficiency last season as a redshirt freshman, is off to another great start completing nearly 80% of his passes. The Oklahoma City native threw a total of 10 touchdown passes over the last two games. At Washington, he had more TD throws (5) than incompletions (3). Seventeen games into his career, Bradford has 48 scoring strikes and just 10 interceptions.

### **THE GAME**

After the first of two bye weeks, Oklahoma returns to action when it hosts TCU. The visiting Horned Frogs posted a 48-7 win over SMU last week. This marks the final non-conference game of the season for both teams.

# THE SERIES

Oklahoma leads it, 6-4, although TCU has won four of five in Norman. Five of these teams' 10 meetings took place prior to 1950.

### THE COACHES

**Oklahoma:** Bob Stoops (lowa '83) is 100-22 in his 10th season with the Sooners. He is 65-13 vs. the Big 12, 35-9 vs. the Big 12 South, 28-4 vs. the Big 12 North, 5-1 in the Big 12 title game, 35-9 vs. non-conference opponents, 56-2 at home, 28-11 on the road, 16-9 on neutral fields, 28-11 vs. ranked opponents, 4-5 in bowls, 3-5 in January Bowls and 2-4 in BCS games. He is 0-1 vs. TCU. **TCU:** Gary Patterson (Kansas State '83) is 66-25 in his eighth season as TCU's head coach.

# **THE PROGRAM**

Oklahoma's all-time record stands at 782-295-53. The Sooners own seven national championships (1950, 1955, 1956, 1974, 1975, 1985, 2000). OU has 41 bowl appearances (No. 7 nationally) with 24 victories (No. 4 nationally). Oklahoma has won 41 conference titles. Since WWII, Oklahoma is the most success college football program with 547 victories. Some 144 All-Americans and four Heisman Trophy winners have come from the Oklahoma program. With 30, 10-win seasons, OU leads the nation.

### **WEEKLY MEDIA LUNCHEON**

Each Tuesday during the season OU hosts a media luncheon inside the Kerr McGee Stadium Club (east side) at Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. The luncheon begins at 11:15 a.m., with comments from the head coach of OU's opponent that week (by speaker phone if the coach is available). Lunch is served at 11:30 a.m., and OU head coach Bob Stoops steps to the podium at 12:05 p.m. A limited number of Sooner players are on hand for interviews.

#### **CREDENTIALS**

Requests for credentials are accepted online. To receive the link to the web site, e-mail Kenny Mossman at kmossman@ou.edu. Requests must be submitted by a sports director/editor at least eight days prior to the contest. Media attending games will have passes scanned and must show government issued photo identification upon entering the stadium. If the name on the credential and the photo ID do not match, the credential will be voided.

#### **PRACTICE**

- Post-Game: The OU locker room is closed at all times. Head coach Bob Stoops and several Sooner players will be brought to designated areas. After home games, the interview area is the Switzer Center's Red Room, located under the south end zone grandstand.

#### THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT

- TCU was picked for a third-place finish (out of nine) in the preseason Mountain West Conference poll behind BYU and Utah, respectively.
- TCU is one of only two programs (the other is Oklahoma State) to win a game against a Bob Stoops-coached Oklahoma team in Norman. The unranked Horned Frogs upset the No. 5 Sooners,17-10, on Sept. 3, 2005 (season opener for both teams). OU has not lost a home since that encounter. That 2005 Sooner team went on to an 8-4 finish. The 2005 TCU club finished 11-1. Oklahoma had a 19-game home field winning streak at the time of that game. The current mark of 20 is the best under Bob Stoops.
- This is a two-game contract. Oklahoma will return the game in 2012 at Amon G. Carter Stadium in Fort Worth.

# TIES WITH THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT

■ TCU running backs coach Justin Fuente was an Oklahoma quarterback in 1997-97 before transferring to Murray State to complete his career. Fuente played for OU against TCU in the 1996 game, which TCU won, 20-7.

# **OKLAHOMA'S MOST RECENT GAME**

In its first road game of the season, Oklahoma torched Washington, 55-14 ...

- OU scored on five of its seven first-half possessions and built a 34-0 lead by intermission. The lead to 41-0 before UW cracked the scoring column.
- Bradford completed 18-of-21 passes for 304 yards with five touchdowns and no interceptions. He also rushed for a one-yard TD, the first of his career.
- Chris Brown (13-107) and DeMarco Murray (16-100) became the first OU duo to exceed 100 yards on the road since Quentin Griffin (126) and Reggie Skinner (116) at Iowa State in 1999.
- The game marked the most points scored by 0U on the road since scoring 62 in its 62-21 win over Tulsa in 2007. The game also marked the largest margin of victory on the road since 0U's 53-7 win over Iowa State in 2003.
- Oklahoma eclipsed 500 total yards for the second straight game with 591 yards (592 yards vs. Cincinnati).
- With two TD receptions Jermaine Gresham moved is tied for the most ever by a Sooner tight end -- 16.
- Oklahoma held a home team to a first-half shutout (34-0) for the first time since defeating Baylor 35-0 in 2004.
- CB Brian Jackson led the defense with two fumble recoveries, one fumble forced and five tackles.
- Oklahoma scored 50 points for the eighth time since Sam Bradford was named starting quarterback, a span of 17 games. Saturday's game also marked the 24th time in Bob Stoops tenure at OU to eclipse 50 points.

### **WASHINGTON VICTORY WAS NO. 100 FOR STOOPS**

The 55-14 victory at Washington represented an historic milestone of 100 victories for Oklahoma's Bob Stoops ...

- Stoops became the eighth-fastest coach to 100 victories in NCAA history by doing so in 122 games, the same number it took for former OU head coach Barry Switzer to hit the mark. Another OU great, Bud Wilkinson, picked up his 100th victory in game 111. He is No. 3 on the list.
- Oklahoma is the only school in NCAA history to produce four, 100-win coaches. The others are Bennie Owen (122-54-165 from 1905-26), Wilkinson (145-29-4 from 1947-63) and Switzer (157-29-4 from 1973-88).
- Stoops is only the second coach in NCAA history, and the first in the modern era, to win 100 games in his first 10 seasons. His victory total, regardless of what it is at season's end, will rank No. 2 in NCAA history for 10 seasons. Penn's George Woodruff holds the mark at 124 wins. His 10th season was 1901. Switzer is third on that list at 98.
- Stoops is one of three coaches in with an average of 10 victories per season with at least 10 seasons of coaching. The others were Tom Osborne (255 in 25 seasons at Nebraska) and George Woodruff (142 in 12 seasons, mostly at Penn).
- Stoops' teams are 100-22 with one national title and five league crowns in 10 seasons (9+). In the 10 years before he arrived in Norman, the 0U football fortunes had taken a rare dip. The program was 61-50-3 during that period with no championships.

# STOOPS'TREE REACHES FIVE

Bob Stoops celebrated his 48th birthday Sept. 9, but despite his relative youth, he currently has the most extensive coaching tree in all of college football (current FBS coaches hired from current school). Five current FBS head coaches were hired from his Oklahoma staff ...

#### THE SOONERS BRIEFLY

- OU was No. 4 in both of preseason polls. It marked the 10th straight season that was ranked in the first AP poll.
- Oklahoma was tabbed for a first-place finish in the Big 12's South Division in a preseason polling of league media. Defensive end Auston English was named the league's preseason defensive player of the year.
- There are 27 players on this team with previous starting experience. There were 34 in 2007, 10 in 2006.
- Last season, OU was 11-3 overall, 6-2 in the Big 12. The Sooners won their fifth Big 12 crown, second straight and 41st league title overall before advancing to the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.
- Three players from the '07 team left early for the NFL: WR Malcolm Kelly, LB Curtis Lofton and DB Reggie Smith.

#### **DECADE OF DOMINANCE**

Oklahoma's best decade in terms of total victories came in the 1970's when the Sooners were 102-13-3 (.877). In the 2000's, OU is 93-17-0 (845).

# **POST BYE WEEK SUCCESS**

During Bob Stoops' tenure, Oklahoma is 10-1 in regular season games that follow bye weeks.

#### **HOME FIELD HONCHOS**

Bob Stoops' teams are 56-2 at Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium and have won their last 20 in a row there, and 40 of their last 41. The current streak is the longest under Stoops, who twice coached the Sooners to 19 straight wins at home. The current streak is tied for third-longest in school history. The top mark was 25, a string that ended in 1953. A streak of 21 ended in 1975 and another of 20 ended in 1957.

#### MARQUEE MATCHUPS AWAIT OKLAHOMA ON FUTURE SCHEDULES

Non-conference games on future schedules include at Miami (Fla.) in 2009, at Florida State (2011), Notre Dame (2012), at Notre Dame (2013), Tennessee (2014), at Tennessee (2015), Ohio State (2016), at Ohio State (2017) and LSU in 2018 and 2019. Under Stoops, OU already played Louisville, Notre Dame, North Carolina, Alabama (twice), UCLA (twice), Oregon (twice), Washington (twice), South Florida and Miami (Fla.) in regular season contests.

#### **NEW VIDEO BOARD IN DEBUT SEASON**

- The board measures 113.5 feet wide by 32.5 feet tall (3,689 square feet). The previous video board space on the south end board was 36 X 21 (756 square feet). It is thought that the new board is the fourth-largest in the nation.
- The 16mm High Definition board was purchased at a cost \$4.5 million.
- The project included a new sound system, the extension of the ribbon boards on the upper decks and a new Sooner Vision high definition control room, which carried a price tag of \$2 million.

### STOOPS ERA YIELDING RECORD-SETTING ATTENDANCE NUMBERS

Oklahoma has drawn 4,668,225 fans for Bob Stops' 58 home games (started in 1999)

- All 58 have been sold out and the Sooners have prevailed 56 times.
- Last year's average home attendance of 84,858 was the largest in school history. The top eight seasons for OU home attendance have come on Stoops' watch.
- The crowd of 85,357 for the '07 Miami game was the largest to see a sporting event in the state of Oklahoma.
- OU has exceeded its listed capacity of 82,112 in 32 consecutive games.
- Oklahoma has played before sellout crowds in 102 of Stoops' 122 games. A total of 9,020,749, or an average of 73,940, has seen those games.

#### **ABOUT THE OFFENSE**

- Under Stoops, Oklahoma has produced its career leader in passing and receiving, while turning out the No. 3- and No. 4-ranked rusher in school history and the school record holder for single-season rushing, passing and receiving yards. Of the 81 basic offensive records at OU, 50 have been set on Stoops' watch.
- OU scored at least one TD in every game dating to Nov. 7, 1998.
- 0U rushed for 200 yards 37 times under Stoops, 31 in the last five years.
- Also under Stoops, OU has 127 touchdowns of 25-plus yards and 254 scoring drives that took less than two minutes.

# **SINCE SAM**

OU has played 17 games since Sam Bradford was named the starting QB. He missed nearly all of the Texas Tech game last season due to injury (out

during second series). Here is a look at OU's offensive production in those other 16 games, in which the team has a record of 14-2, a Big 12 title and BCS Bowl appearance ...

- The Sooners averaged 38.8 points per game and eclipsed 50 points eight times times.
- He averaged 3.0 touchdown passes/game, while completing 301-of-422 passes (.713) with 48 TDs and 10 INT.
- Oklahoma averaged 404.3 yards total yards per game.
- He threw for 300+ yards four times in an offense that also averaged 199.3 rushing yards per game.
- Threw multiple TDs in 14 games with five each against Miami (Fla.), Texas A&M, Cincinnati and Washington.

# **IGLESIAS PILES UP YARDS**

WR Juaquin Iglesias is one of the top all-around performers ever to wear a Sooner uniform ...

- His career total of 3,235 all purpose yards is 20th on the career list at 0klahoma.
- Iglesias has the nation's fifth-longest streak for receptions in consecutive games with 35. He trails Rice's Jarrett Dillard (40), UNLV's Casey Flair (39), Ball State's Dante Ball (37).

# **TOUCHDOWNS GERMANE TO JERMAINE**

Junior tight end Jermaine Gresham needs just one touchdown reception to move into a tie for No. 2 on the all-time Sooner list and set a new mark for OU tight ends. He has 16 to date, including four this season.

■ Gresham is strking from longer distance in 2008. Last season, he averaged 13.8 yards per touchdown catch, but that figure has ballooned to 29.5 this season.

# THREE-HEADED RUNNING GAME

Aside from Allen Patrick's 1,009 rushing yards last season. Reserves Chris Brown (611 yards) and DeMarco Murray (764 yards) combined for 1,375. Murray scored 13 TDs, Brown nine. In '08, Murray, the starter, has 46 carries for 312 yards and three touchdowns. Brown and Mossis Madu have s combined 75 attempts for 359 yards and six TDs.

■ In the opener, Brown became the 66th player in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in a career. Murray became the 67th during the game at Washington.

# THE LINE ON THE LINE

With an average height of just over 6-5 (77.1 inches) and 302.8 pounds on the two-deep this is one of the biggest offensive lines in OU history. During the Stoops era this is the third-heaviest line. Last year's was the heaviest line at 316.6. By height, this is the third-tallest line under Stoops. The 2002 and 2003 lines both measured 77.2 inches.

- This veteran line (two-deep) has combined for 148 starts and 206 games played.
- Oklahoma ranks No. 8 in sacks allowed at 0.3/game.

# **ONE-LINERS**

- The Sooners are No. 1 in the nation in Red Zone Scoring (18-18) with 17 touchdowns and one field goal.
- OU ranks No. 1 nationally with 54.67 points per game, but the highest Sooner in individual scoring ranks No. 54.
- Oklahoma's 13 touchdown passes have gone to six different receivers.
- OU has completed passes to 16 different receiverrs, which is second nationally to Troy's 17.

# **NEARING 30,000 POINTS**

By points, Oklahoma is the highest scoring program in the history of college football.

In 1,130 games, the Sooners have scored **29,941** points, an average of **26.5** per game.

Chasing the Sooners are Michigan with 29,380 points in 1,197 games and Nebraska with 29,201 in 1,193.

OU's opponents have scored 13,961 tallies,12.4 per game.

- 0U forced at least one turnover in 108 of Bob Stoops' 122 games and has at least one interception in 79 of the last 106; multiple picks in 33 of the last 77 outings.
- Oklahoma has nine shutouts under its current head coach. Opponents scored less than seven points 30 times and less than 14 in 57 games.

#### SACK EXCHANGE RATE GOOD

Over the last two seasons, Oklahoma's defense has 39 (2.4) sacks while allowing only 15 (0.9). This season, that ratio is 12:1.

# **ENGLISH LESSON**

DE Auston English is 10th in the nation with 1.25 sacks per game picking up right where he left off in 2007 ...

- With 9.5 sacks, English tied with Torrance Marshall (1999) for the 14th-best single season total in school history. It was the second-best total in the Stoops era behind the 10 by Calvin Thibodeaux (2005) and Dan Cody (2004, 2003).
- English broke a non-weight-bearing bone in his right leg in the Texas A&M game. A rod was inserted and he missed the next three contests. He returned for the Big 12 Championship game and the Fiesta Bowl with the rod still in place.

#### **WEAK FREAK**

A lot of attention was focused on the weakside linebacker spot during the preseason, but Travis Lewis has answered some of those questions in the early going. The redshirt freshman leads the team with 25 tackles, 12 of which came against Cincinnati. He had 2.5 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks in that game. The 12 tackles vs. UC rank No. 7 for a freshman at OU. The record of 19 was set by Brian Bosworth against Nebraska in 1984.

#### HE'S NEW, SORTA

First-year Sooner Mike Balogun was born Sept. 28, 1983, and is 24 years old. Former OU players C.J. Ah You (2006) and Billy Sims (1979) were 24 during their senior seasons. Players of that age were typical after WWII. Since that time, the oldest Sooner football player was DL Dick Passo, who was 26 when he played in 1968.

# **PUSH'EM BACK**

Oklahoma has 30 tackles for 121 yards in losses compared to just 14 for 34 by the Sooner opponents.

#### **MORE THAN RUN STOPPERS**

Defensive ends and blitzers tend to be associated with the sack, but the Sooner interior has played a role in that statistic too. OU's four-man defensive tackle has a combined total of 13.0 career sacks.

# **RIP AND RUN**

Bob Stoops' teams have been notorious for their interception return yardage. The 2007 team was among OU's best in that department ....

- Oklahoma had 19 interceptions for 346 interception return yards and three touchdowns. That yardage total ranked No. 3 since Stoops became the head coach. The 2002 team put up a ridiculous 516 return yards on 24 interceptions. The 2000 National Champions notched 369 return yards, also on 24 picks.
- The 2007 OU defenders touched the ball 70 times (5.4 times per game) with 42 PBUs, 19 interceptions and nine fumble recoveries. To put that in perspective, opposing teams have just 46 touches in 27 break-ups, 11 fumble recoveries and eight interceptions.
- OU averaged 18.0 yards on INT/FUM returns with five TDs to tie the school record set in 1956, 2000 and 2001.

- DeMarco Murray ran 81 yards for a touchdown against Tulsa on the second kickoff return of his college career. His first came earlier in that same game. He then went for 91 yards and a touchdown against Baylor.

# **KNALL EMERGES AT PUNTER**

Mike Knall won the starting job in the 10th game (vs. Baylor) of the 2007 season and held it for the remainder of the season. Prior to that time he had been used mostly in short-yardage situations as the pooch punter ...

- Finished the season with 24 punts for an average of 43.7. He unleashed a 66-yarder, the longest of the season for OU, against Missouri in the Big 12 Championship game.
- In his five starting assignments, he averaged 42.2 yards per punt and was under 40 yards in just one game (39.5 vs. Baylor).
- His best game was the Missouri tilt with four punts for a 49.5-yard average.

### **FRESHMAN KICKER**

Redshirt freshman Jimmy Stevens is the team's placekicker. He is the first freshman to tackle that chore since Garrett Hartley did so in the Baylor game of 2004 (Nov. 20).

# **HOLD IT**

WR Carter Whitson, a walk-on, takes over as the team's holder. The sophomore played most of his high school career at Shawnee, Okla., before spending his senior season at Broken Arrow HS. He was a quarterback during his prep days. Whitson was the holder at Shawnee during his sophomore season.

■ With redshirt freshman Jimmy Stevens at kicker,
Whitson at holder and Ben Hampton as the long
snapper, all three ball-handlers on placements are new this season.
Hampton held at Northeastern Oklahoma A&M junior college for
two seasons before transferring to Oklahoma. Derek Shaw, the

The tradition, so rich and so long-standing, is as daunting as it is impressive. To be among the best at Oklahoma is to be among the best in college football.

Such dramatics are lost on Bob Stoops. The Sooner head coach befriended the would-be albatross of OU's successful past from his first day on campus and

remains steadfastly focused on tomorrow and the championship it holds.

It falls then to the observers and experts of the game to define Stoops' impact. Rarely have the pundits had it so easy.

Under Stoops,
Oklahoma has won 100
games (100-22), nine
bowl games, six of the
BCS variety, had one
string of 88 consecutive appearances in the
AP poll and captured
five Big 12 crowns (the
next highest total in
the league is two). His
2000 team won the

national championship. On a playing field leveled by scholarship limits and parity, this era stares down the Oklahoma standard and does not blink.

The achievement dulls the memory of what Stoops inherited. When he arrived in Norman, the proud Sooner program was five years removed from a winning record, four from bowl play. Those atypical days of angst are so forgotten now that they might as well be mentioned with the land rush and dust bowl.

Stoop, born Sept. 9, 1960, has been characterized as a grounded family man, brilliant big-game coach, relentless recruiter, disciplined leader and a person with uncommon perspective.

His success emanates from a disciplined style true to his roots in the Steel Valley of Ohio, but he is far from inflexible. The principles to which he holds are the tried and true axioms of the sport ... mixed with cutting edge strategy and an appreciation for the calculated risk.

During his time, OU has produced record—setting passers and receivers, five 1,000-yard rushers, suffocating defense and special teams units that rank among the most dynamic in the land. Every facet has been impacted.

His players have snagged 16 national awards, including the 2003 Heisman Trophy won by Jason White. There have been more than 60 academic honorees, 62 All-Big 12 players, 24 All-Americans and

36 NFL draft choices.

Stoops has won a total of 10 national coach of the year awards and has been Big 12 Coach of the year three times.

This is one of the finest coaches in the history of one of college football's most storied traditions.

The son of a coach, Stoops was a four-year starter at lowa. He began his coaching career in 1983 as a volunteer in the Hawkeye program under Hayden Fry. He worked through the ranks until he became co-defensive

coordinator at Kansas State (1991-95) during Bill Snyder's rein.

With the Wildcats, he played a key role in an impressive turnaround. During his final four seasons there, K-State was 35-12 with three bowl appearances. Eventually, he left for Florida and a three-year stint as Steve Spurrier's defensive coordinator. In 1996, he was part of a national championship team. It was with the Gators that the spotlight found Stoops and made him one of the hottest names in the profession.

Stoops, who is widely known for countless hours of charitable work, most of which is directed towards children, graduated from lowa in 1983 with a degree in marketing. He and his wife, Carol, have three children: daughter, Mackenzie, and twin sons, Drake and Isaac.

At the end of the day, Oklahoma had 591 total yads with 274 on the ground and 317 through the air. UW finished wtih 336 yards, but registered 95 of those in the fourth quarter.
