PLAYER TO WATC

DT Gerald McCoy continues to perform as one of the top defensive linemen in the Big 12. The sophomore had two sacks in last Saturday's game against Texas and now has 3.5 for the season along with 6.5 tackles for loss. Last week, McCoy was named to the American Football Coaches Association Good Works Team for his extensive work on campus and in the community.

THE GAME

Oklahoma looks to rebound from a hard-fought loss to Texas when it confronts the Big 12 North Division for the first time this season. Kansas, which owns two North victories, visits Norman for the first time since 2004. This is homecoming weekend on the OU campus.

THE SERIES

This will be the 100th meeting between Oklahoma and Kansas. The Sooners lead the all-time series 66-27-6 including a 34-12-2 advantage in Norman.

THE COACHES

Oklahoma: Bob Stoops (lowa '83) is 102-23 in his 10th season with the Sooners. He is 66-14 vs. the Big 12, 36-10 vs. the Big 12 South, 28-4 vs. the Big 12 North, 5-1 in the Big 12 title game, 36-9 vs. non-conference opponents, 57-2 at home, 29-11 on the road, 16-10 on neutral fields, 29-12 vs. ranked opponents, 4-5 in bowls, 3-4 in January Bowls and 2-4 in BCS games. He is 4-0 against Kansas. Kansas: Mark Mangino (Youngstown St. '87) is 42-37 in his seventh season at KU. He is 0-2 vs. OU.

THE PROGRAM

Oklahoma's all-time record stands at 784-296-53. The Sooners own seven national championships (1950, 1955, 1956, 1974, 1975, 1985, 2000). OU has 41 bowl appearances (No. 7 nationally) with 24 victories (No. 4 nationally). Oklahoma has won 41 conference titles. Since WWII, OU is the most successful program with 549 victories. The school has produced 144 All-Americans and four Heisman Trophy winners. With 30, 10-win seasons, OU leads the nation. Oklahoma's best decade for of total victories was the 1970's when the Sooners were 102-13-3 (.877). In the 2000's, OU is 95-18-0 (.841).

WEEKLY MEDIA LUNCHEON

Each Tuesday during the season OU hosts a media luncheon inside the Kerr McGee Stadium Club (east side) at Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. The luncheon begins at 11:15 a.m., with comments from the head coach of OU's opponent that week (by speaker phone if the coach is available). Lunch is served at 11:30 a.m., and OU head coach Bob Stoops steps to the podium at 12:05 p.m. A limited number of Sooner players are on hand for interviews.

CREDENTIALS

Requests for credentials are accepted online. To receive the link to the web site, e-mail Kenny Mossman at kmossman@ou.edu. Requests must be submitted by a sports director/editor at least eight days prior to the contest. Media attending games will have passes scanned and must show government issued photo identification upon entering the stadium. If the name on the credential and the photo ID do not match, the credential will be voided.

PRACTICE

MORE ON THE KANSAS SERIES

- Before falling victim to the Big 12 divisional scheduling, this was one of the longest uninterrupted series in college football. The two teams played 96 games over 94 consecutive years from 1903-97. That still ties for fifthmost by games in NCAA history.
- Since Mark Mangino became Kansas' coach, OU has played its former assistant coach twice, posting a 41-10 win in Norman in 2004 and a 19-3 win at Kansas City's Arrowhead Stadium (regular season game) in 2005.
- Kansas is responsible for the longest rush ever surrendered by Oklahoma. Eric Vann went 99 yards against the Sooners in 1997.
- The OU record for touchdown receptions in one game was established by Trent Smith at Kansas in 2001 when the former tight end caught four. That mark was equaled last season by Jermaine Gresham vs. Texas A&M.

TIES WITH THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT

■ Like Oklahoma's Bob Stoops, Kansas head coach Mark Mangino is a native of Youngstown, Ohio. Mangino was on Stoops' OU staff from 1999-2001 and was the offensive coordinator for those final two years. His quarterback for the 2000 national championship season was current Oklahoma QB coach Josh Heupel. The KU coach also was on the Kansas State staff with Bob Stoops from 1991-95, and current OU defensive coordinator Brent Venables from 1992-98.

OKLAHOMA'S MOST RECENT GAME

OU dropped a 45-35 decision to Texas at Dallas last Saturday ...

- The combined point total of 80 points was the highest in the 103-year history of the series.
- OU's Sam Bradford threw for 387 yards and five touchdowns, the most ever by a Sooner against Texas. Bradford completed 28-of-39 passes with two interceptions, including one on the game's final play.
- Oklahoma WLB Travis Lewis tied the Sooner record for tackles by a freshman with 19. Brian Bosworth set the original mark against Nebraska in 1984. Nineteen tackles ties for No. 8 for a single game at OU by any player.
- Oklahoma did not trail until the 1:03 mark of the third quarter.
- WR Manuel Johnson caught three touchdown passes for the second time in the last three games.
- Texas' 45 points and 438 total yards were the most allowed by OU this season.
- Oklahoma picked up just 48 yards on 26 rushing attempts, while Texas mustered 161 on 35 tries. Longhorn back Chris Oqbonndaya had the best day against the Sooner defense this season with 127 rushing yards.

VICTORY AT WASHINGTON WAS NO. 100 FOR STOOPS

Oklahoma's 55-14 victory at Washington on Sept. 13, represented an historic milestone of 100 victories for Sooner head coach Bob Stoops ...

- Stoops became the eighth-fastest coach to 100 victories in NCAA history by doing so in 122 games, the same number it took for former OU head coach Barry Switzer to hit the mark. Another OU great, Bud Wilkinson, picked up his 100th victory in game 111. He is No. 3 on the list.
- Oklahoma is the only school in NCAA history to produce four, 100-win coaches. The others are Bennie Owen (122-54-165 from 1905-26), Wilkinson (145-29-4 from 1947-63) and Switzer (157-29-4 from 1973-88).
- Stoops is only the second coach in NCAA history, and the first in the modern era, to win 100 games in his first 10 seasons. His victory total, regardless of what it is at season's end, will rank No. 2 in NCAA history for 10 seasons. Penn's George Woodruff holds the mark at 124 wins. His 10th season was 1901. Switzer is third on that list at 98.
- Stoops is one of three coaches with an average of 10 victories per season with at least 10 seasons of coaching. The others were Tom Osborne (255 in 25 seasons at Nebraska) and George Woodruff (142 in 12 seasons, mostly at Penn).
- Stoops' teams are 102-22 with one national title and five league crowns in 10 seasons (9+). In the 10 years before he arrived in Norman, the OU football fortunes had taken a rare dip. The program was 61-50-3 with no championships and only three bowl trips.

THE SOONERS BRIEFLY

- 0U was No. 4 in both of preseason polls. It marked the 10th straight season that was ranked in the first AP poll.
- Oklahoma was tabbed for a first-place finish in the Big 12's South Division in a preseason polling of league media. Defensive end Auston English was named the league's preseason defensive player of the year.
- There are 27 players on this team with previous starting experience. There were 34 in 2007, 10 in 2006.
- Last season, OU was 11-3 overall, 6-2 in the Big 12. The Sooners won their fifth Big 12 crown (second straight) and 41st league title overall before advancing to the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.
- Three players from the '07 team left early for the NFL: WR Malcolm Kelly (Redskins), LB Curtis Lofton (Falcons) and DB Reggie Smith (49ers).

OU AND THE BIG 12

- OU's all-time Big 12 regular season record is 69-29, 74-30 if counting title games. Stoops is 61-13 in the regular season, 66-14 counting all. Before he arrived, OU's Big 12 mark was 8-16.
- Oklahoma has won five Big 12 titles. That's more than double any other league member.

HOME FIELD HONCHOS

Bob Stoops' teams are 57-2 at Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium and have won their last 21 in a row there (longest current home field winning streak in the nation), and 41 of their last 42. The current streak is the longest under Stoops, who has twice coached the Sooners to 19 straight wins at home, and is tied for second-longest in school history. The top mark at Oklahoma was 25, a string that ended in 1953. A streak of 21 ended in 1975 and another of 20 ended in 1957.

MARQUEE MATCH-UPS AWAIT OKLAHOMA ON FUTURE SCHEDULES

Non-conference games on future schedules include at Miami (Fla.) in 2009, at Florida State (2011), Notre Dame (2012), at Notre Dame (2013), Tennessee (2014), at Tennessee (2015), Ohio State (2016), at Ohio State (2017) and LSU in 2018 and 2019. Under Stoops, OU already played Louisville, Notre Dame, North Carolina, Alabama (twice), UCLA (twice), Oregon (twice), Washington (twice), South Florida and Miami (Fla.) in regular season contests.

NEW VIDEO BOARD IN DEBUT SEASON AT NORMAN

The board measures 113.5 feet wide by 32.5 feet tall (3,689 square feet). The previous video board space on the south end board was 36 X 21 (756 square feet). It is thought that the new board is the fourth-largest in the nation.

- The 16mm High Definition board was purchased at a cost \$4.5 million.
- The project included a new sound system, the extension of the ribbon boards on the upper decks and a new Sooner Vision high definition control room, which carried a price tag of \$2 million.

STOOPS ERA YIELDING RECORD-SETTING ATTENDANCE NUMBERS

Oklahoma has drawn 4,753,383 fans for Bob Stops' 59 home games (started in 1999) \dots

- All 59 have been sold out and the Sooners have prevailed 57 times.
- Last year's average home attendance of 84,858 was the largest in school history. The top eight seasons for OU home attendance have come on Stoops' watch.
- The crowd of 85,357 for the '07 Miami game was the largest to see a sporting event in the state of Oklahoma.
- OU has exceeded its listed capacity of 82,112 in 33 consecutive games.
- Oklahoma has played before sellout crowds in 104 of Stoops' 125 games. A total of 9,235,234, or an average of 73,881, has seen those games.

- Under Stoops, OU produced its career leader in passing and receiving, while turning out the No. 3 and No. 4 career rushers and the school record holder for single-season rushing, passing and receiving yards.
- Of 81 basic offensive records at Oklahoma, 50 have been set under Stoops.
- Oklahoma scored at least one touchdown in every game dating to Nov. 7, 1998.
- Oklahoma rushed for 200 yards 37 times under Stoops, 31 in the last five years.
- Also under Stoops, OU has 130 TDs of 25+ yards and 258 scoring drives that took less than two minutes.
- OU is the highest scoring program in college football history. In 1,133 games, the Sooners scored 30,060 points, or 26.5 per game. Michigan has 29,437 points in 1,199 games and Nebraska 29,279 in 1,195.

BRADFORD NCAA'S BEST OUT OF THE GATE

Sam Bradford set an NCAA mark for most touchdown passes thrown during the freshman and sophomore seasons with 59. Florida's Rex Grossman previously held the mark with 55.

- This season, Bradford averages one touchdown pass every eight attempts, while tossing just one interception every 37 attempts. With just 31 attempts per game, that's less than on per outing.
- Bradford has seven completions that exceeded 50 yards. All seven went for touchdowns.
- The OU QB threw two picks each against Cincinnati and Texas. He also threw five TDs in each of those games.

SINCE SAM

OU has played 20 games since Sam Bradford was named the starting QB. He missed nearly all of the '07 Texas Tech game due to injury (out during second series). Here is a look at OU's production in the other 19 games, in which the team has a record of 16-3, a Big 12 title and BCS Bowl appearance ...

- The Sooners averaged 39.0 points per game and eclipsed 50 points eight times.
- He averaged 3.3 touchdown passes/game, while completing 371-of-526 passes (.705) with 59 TDs and 13 INT.
- Oklahoma averaged 417.7 yards total yards per game.
- He threw for 300+ yards seven times and 400+ once in an offense that also averaged 182.61 rushing yards.
- Threw multiple TDs in 17 games with five each vs. Miami (Fla.), Texas A&M, Cincinnati, Washington and Texas.

SENIOR RECEIVERS PUTTING UP BIG NUMBERS

Manuel Johnson has seven touchdown receptions over the last three games and at least one TD grab in all three. The only other time in school history that a player had that many over a three-game stretch was last season when Malcolm Kelly had seven against North Texas, Miami and Utah State.

- Juaquin Iglesias has a career total of 3,629 all purpose yards, which ranks No. 11 on the career list at Oklahoma.
- Iglesias has the nation's third-longest streak for receptions in consecutive games with 38. He trails Rice's Jarrett Dillard (42) and UNLV's Casey Flair (41).
- String of six straight games with TD catch snapped vs. Texas. Fell two games shy of Mark Clayton's OU record.

TOUCHDOWNS GERMANE TO JERMAINE

Jermaine Gresham has more TD catches than any tight end in OU history. He has 17, including five in '08.

■ Gresham is striking from longer distance in 2008. Last season, he averaged 13.8 yards per touchdown catch, but that figure has ballooned to 34.0 this season.

THE LINE ON THE LINE

This offensive line two-deep averages 6-5 (77.1 inches) and 302.8 pounds. During the Stoops era this is the third-heaviest and third-tallest line. This line (two-deep) has combined for 165 starts, 236 games played.

ONE-LINERS

- OU is No. 1 in the nation in Red Zone Scoring (28-28) with 27 TD.
- Oklahoma has scored a touchdown on its first drive in each game.
- Oklahoma's 24 touchdown passes have gone to six different receivers.
- 0U has completed passes to 16 receivers, which ranks No. 3 nationally.
- With four rushing attempts this season, Matt Clapp has equalled the most by a Sooner fullback since 2003 when Dan Townsend also had four.
- DeMarco Murray, the starter at running back, has 92 carries for 437 yards and five touchdowns, while Back-ups Chris Brown and Mossis Madu have a combined 128 tries for 549 yards and nine TDs.

- OU forced at least one turnover in 109 of Bob Stoops' 125 games and has at least one interception in 80 of the last 109; multiple picks in 34 of the last 80 outings.
- Oklahoma has nine shutouts under its current head coach. Opponents scored less than seven points 30 times and less than 14 in 57 games.

SACK EXCHANGE RATE GOOD

Over the last two seasons, Oklahoma's defense has 48 (2.4/game) sacks while allowing only 21 (1.1/game). This season, that ratio is 21:5.

WEAK FREAK

Travis Lewis is having a banner redshirt freshman season at weak side linebacker. The redshirt freshman leads the team with 60 tackles, 19 of which came against Texas when he tied the freshman single game set by Brian Bosworth in the 1984 Nebraska game.

- Bosworth also has the freshman season tackle record at 133 followed by Darrell Reed with 90 and Kevin Murphy with 87. Reed and Murphy were defensive ends.
- Among linebackers, Lewis already has the No. 2 season ever by an OU freshman linebacker. Bosworth had his 133 followed by Lewis then Rocky Calmus with 55, Chris Justice with 47 and then Dante Jones and Lewis with 41. Both Bosworth (twice) and Calmus won the Butkus Award as the nation's top linebacker.

SOONERS LOSE REYNOLDS TO INJURY

Starting middle linebacker Ryan Reynolds will miss the remainder of the season after incurring a right knee injury against Texas. The junior concludes the campaign with 46 total tackles, five for loss with two pass deflections and one fumble forced. Reynolds was the only player on OU's team that came into the season with a previous Sooner starting assignment at linebacker.

THIRD DOWN THUNDER

■ OU ranks No. 17 nationally for third-down defense. Opponents have converted just 27-of-90 for 30.0%.

TAKEAWAYS A GROUP PROJECT

In 2008, several Oklahoma players have gotten in on taking the ball away from the opponents ...

- Five different players have forced a fumble.
- Three players have fumble recoveries, although FS Lendy Holmes and CB Brian Jackson each have two.
- The four interceptions thus far by the Sooners have been made by four different players.

HE'S NEW, SORTA

First-year Sooner Mike Balogun was born Sept. 28, 1983, and is 24 years old. Former OU players C.J. Ah You (2006) and Billy Sims (1979) were 24 during their senior seasons.

Players of that age were typical after WWII. Since that time, the oldest Sooner football player was DL Dick Passo, who was 26 when he played in 1968.

PUSH'EM BACK

Oklahoma has 51 tackles for 209 yards in losses compared to just 29 for 103 by the Sooner opponents.

MORE THAN RUN STOPPERS

Defensive ends and blitzers tend to be associated with the sack, but the Sooner interior has played a role in that statistic too. OU's four-man defensive tackle rotation has a combined total of 18.0 career sacks, and a DT has been credited with a full or have sack in four games.

- In total, OU has returned eight kickoffs and 14 punts for touchdowns on Stoops' watch (since 1999).
- The Sooners have blocked 21 kicks.

- The Sooners had 19 kickoff returns that covered at least 30 yards.
- Four different players had a return of more than 35 yards.
- All five players who returned kicks last season averaged at least 24 yards.
- DeMarco Murray ran 81 yards for a touchdown against Tulsa on the second kickoff return of his college career. His first came earlier in that same game. He then went for 91 yards and a touchdown against Baylor.

KNALL EMERGES AT PUNTER

Mike Knall won the starting job in the 10th game (vs. Baylor) of the 2007 season and held it for the remainder of the season. Prior to that time he had been used mostly in short-yardage situations as the pooch punter ...

■ True to his pooch-punting past, Knall has put eight of his 26 kicks this season inside the 20. For his career, 17 of 61 boots have been downed inside the 20.

FRESHMAN KICKER

Redshirt freshman Jimmy Stevens is the team's placekicker. He is the first freshman to tackle that chore since Garrett Hartley did so in the Baylor game of 2004 (Nov. 20). Steven has been called upon for only one field goal this season, a 36-yarder that he converted against Cincinnati.

■ Stevens has been victimized by a Sooner offense that is 28-of-28 in the Red Zone. He is just 1-of-1 on field goal attempts this season. The record for fewest FGs in a season at OU is zero on multiple occasions, most recently in 1962. There have been 10 seasons with single digit attempts, most recently eight in 1988.

HOLD IT

WR Carter Whitson, a walk-on, takes over as the team's holder. The sophomore played most of his high school career at Shawnee, Okla., before spending his senior season at Broken Arrow HS. He was a quarterback during his prep days. Whitson was the holder at Shawnee during his sophomore season.

■ With redshirt freshman Jimmy Stevens at kicker, Whitson at holder and James Winchester as the long snapper, all three ball-handlers on placements are new this season.

■ Freshman long snapper James Winchester is the son of former Sooner Mike Winchester, who lettered as a punter from 1984-86. Carolyn Winchester, a senior member of the OU women's basketball team, is James' sister.

The tradition, so rich and so long-standing, is as daunting as it is impressive. To be among the best at Oklahoma is to be among the best in college football.

Such dramatics are lost on Bob Stoops. The Sooner head coach befriended the would-be albatross of OU's successful past from his first day on campus and

remains steadfastly focused on tomorrow and the championship it holds.

It falls then to the observers and experts of the game to define Stoops' impact. Rarely have the pundits had it so easy.

Under Stoops,
Oklahoma has won 102
games (102-23), nine
bowl games, six of the
BCS variety, had one
string of 88 consecutive appearances in the
AP poll and captured
five Big 12 crowns (the
next highest total in
the league is two). His
2000 team won the

national championship. On a playing field leveled by scholarship limits and parity, this era stares down the Oklahoma standard and does not blink.

The achievement dulls the memory of what Stoops inherited. When he arrived in Norman, the proud Sooner program was five years removed from a winning record, four from bowl play. Those atypical days of angst are so forgotten now that they might as well be mentioned with the land rush and dust bowl.

Stoop, born Sept. 9, 1960, has been characterized as a grounded family man, brilliant big-game coach, relentless recruiter, disciplined leader and a person with uncommon perspective.

His success emanates from a disciplined style true to his roots in the Steel Valley of Ohio, but he is far from inflexible. The principles to which he holds are the tried and true axioms of the sport ... mixed with cutting edge strategy and an appreciation for the calculated risk.

During his time, OU has produced record—setting passers and receivers, five 1,000-yard rushers, suffocating defense and special teams units that rank among the most dynamic in the land. Every facet has been impacted.

His players have snagged 16 national awards, including the 2003 Heisman Trophy won by Jason White. There have been more than 60 academic honorees, 62 All-Big 12 players, 24 All-Americans and

36 NFL draft choices.

Stoops has won a total of 10 national coach of the year awards and has been Big 12 Coach of the year three times.

This is one of the finest coaches in the history of one of college football's most storied traditions.

The son of a coach, Stoops was a four-year starter at lowa. He began his coaching career in 1983 as a volunteer in the Hawkeye program under Hayden Fry. He worked through the ranks until he became co-defensive

coordinator at Kansas State (1991-95) during Bill Snyder's rein.

With the Wildcats, he played a key role in an impressive turnaround. During his final four seasons there, K-State was 35-12 with three bowl appearances. Eventually, he left for Florida and a three-year stint as Steve Spurrier's defensive coordinator. In 1996, he was part of a national championship team. It was with the Gators that the spotlight found Stoops and made him one of the hottest names in the profession.

Stoops, who is widely known for countless hours of charitable work, most of which is directed towards children, graduated from lowa in 1983 with a degree in marketing. He and his wife, Carol, have three children: daughter, Mackenzie, and twin sons, Drake and Isaac.

The Sooners established a physical running game early to set up the pinpoint passing of quarterback Sam Bradford. Both Chris Brown (107) and DeMarco Murray (100) hit the 100-yard mark on the ground, while Bradford completed 18-of-21 passes for 304 yards with five touchdowns and no interceptions.

The Oklahoma defense was equally dominant, shutting out the Huskies until the 5:37 mark of the third period. Prior to that play, OU had amassed a 41-0 lead.

CB Brian Jackson led the defensive unit with two fumble recoveries, one fumble forced and five tackles.

At the end of the day, Oklahoma had 591 total yards with 274 on the ground and 317 through the air. UW finished wtih 336 yards, 95 in the fourth quarter.

The contest was the first ever played by OU in the state of Washington.

NORMAN, Okla. -- Sam Bradford threw for a career-high 411 yards and Manuel Johnson set an Oklahoma record with 206 receiving yards as the No. 2-ranked Sooners sprinted past TCU, 35-10.

The Horned Frogs loaded up against the run, and limited OU to just 25 yards on 36 attempts, but opened themselves up to a flurry of big passing plays.

After finding Juaquin Iglesias for a 24-yard touchdown on OU's first possession, Bradford threw three straight TDs to Johnson on plays covering 76, 55 and 63 yards. Johnson became just the second player in school history to record three scoring plays of 55+ yards in one game (tying Antonio Perkins).

Oklahoma shredded the nation's No. 1-ranked defense for 436 total yards and Bradford threw at least four touchdown passes in a third consecutive game.

Meanwhile, the Sooner defense stymied a TCU team that was averaging 43.0 points per game by forcing four turnovers, two fumbles and two interceptions. The Horned Frogs did not get a touchdown until the fourth guarter.

The victory extended Oklahoma's home winning streak to 21 games, a figure that tied the second longest home streak in school history.

DALLAS -- Texas rallied from an 11-point, first-half deficit to defeat Oklahoma in the 103rd Red River Rivalry, 45-35.

OU had sprinted to a 21-10 lead when Texas' Jordan Shipley returned a kickoff 96 yards for a touchdown. Later, the Sooners lost MLB Ryan Reynolds, the Big 12's fourth-leading tackler, to a knee injury, and the Longhorns completed their rally.

The 80 combined points represented the highest scoring total in the history of the series.

OU quarterback Sam Bradford threw for 387 yards and five touchdowns, the best totals by any player in series history, but it wasn't enough as the Sooners gave up 161 yards on the ground and 277 through the air.

The crowd of 92,182 in the remodeled and expanded Cotton Bowl was the largest ever to see an Oklahoma game.
