

The Match-Up

- Oklahoma is coming off an open week following a 24-19 loss vs. Kansas State (9/22). Texas Tech opened Big 12 play with a 24-13 win at lowa State (9/29).
- OU is 10-3 in Big 12 road openers under Bob Stoops and will face Texas Tech for the first time in such a contest.
- Oklahoma is 9-3 in games played on Oct. 6, most recently registering a 28-21 win vs. Texas (10/6/07).
- This is the earliest matchup in the season between the Sooners and Red Raiders since Oklahoma's 28-13 win vs. Texas Tech in Norman (10/2/04).
- Dating back to the 2004 campaign, the Sooners are 18-0 in games immediately following a regular season loss. OU hasn't lost consecutive games in the same season since the final two contests of the 2003 campaign.
- The Sooners have never suffered back-to-back Big 12 Conference losses in the Stoops era.
- When OU is ranked in the Top 25, the Sooners have compiled a 8-2 mark against Texas Tech.
- Oklahoma is 14-5 in the regular season under Stoops following a bye week.
- OU ranks second in the nation in pass defense (123.7 ypg), while Texas Tech leads the country (82.0 ypg).

The Series

- The Sooners lead the all-time series 13-6 and are 4-4 in games played in Lubbock.
- Oklahoma is 8-5 against Texas Tech under Stoops, including 6-1 at home and 2-4 on the road.
- Texas Tech snapped OU's 39-game home winning streak with a 41-38 victory (10/22/11), marking just one of four home losses at Owen Field during the Stoops era. The two teams combined for 1,108 yards of total offense (OU-572, TT-536) in that contest.
- Oklahoma has lost its last three games in Lubbock and has not defeated the Red Raiders on the road since a 56-25 victory (11/22/03).
- Under Stoops, OU has outscored Texas Tech by an average margin of 36.3 to 23.7 ppg.
- Oklahoma has recorded five TD passes in each of its last two games against Texas Tech.
- OU has racked up more than 500 yards of total offense in three of its past four matchups vs. Texas Tech. Texas Tech currently leads the nation in total defense, allowing only 167.5 ypg through its first four contests.
- OU has forced two or more turnovers against Texas Tech in nine of the 13 Big 12 meetings between the clubs.

What to Watch

- OU is No. 17 in the AP Poll and is No. 14 in the *USA Today* Coaches' Poll. Texas Tech received votes in the AP Poll and is No. 24 in the Coaches' Poll.
- QB Landry Jones owns a 31-9 (.775) record as a starter. He is one win away from tying QB Steve Davis (32 wins from 1973-75) for the top spot in OU history.
- The Sooners are 24-2 (.923) in games when Jones throws two or more TDs, including a 7-1 mark on the road.
- OU has registered a 100-yard receiver in each of its first three contests. Junior WR Kenny Stills posted 121 yards at UTEP (9/1) and 120 yards vs. Florida A&M (9/8). Freshman WR Sterling Shepard registered 108 yards in his initial career start vs. Kansas State (9/22).

THE TEAMS AT A GLANCE



OKLAHOMASooners

Oklahoma is 2-1 to start the season following a 24-19 loss at home to Kansas State (9/22). The Sooners have not lost

back-to-back regular season Big 12 contests in the Stoops era.

Offence

A balanced offensive attack has been the name of the game for the Sooners so far in 2012 as they rank 30th nationally in rushing yards and 32nd in passing yards. Junior running back Damien Williams leads the team and ranks third in the Big 12 with 97.7 rushing yards per game. Senior quarterback Landry Jones has completed nearly 64 percent of his passes with five touchdowns and two interceptions. Junior wide receiver Kenny Stills has been his top target, recording 22 catches for 301 yards and two touchdowns through three games.

Defense

Oklahoma boasts the No. 15 defense in the nation through three games, giving up 284.0 yards of offense per contest. In addition, the 14.7 points per game allowed is tied for 21st in the country. OU's passing defense ranks third in the country, yielding just 123.7 yards per game. UTEP (9/1) threw for only 48 yards in the opener, while Florida A&M (9/8) had a season-best 174 yards and Kansas State (9/22) had only 149 yards.

Special Teams

Sophomore Michael Hunnicutt has made three of four field goals in 2012 and 13 of 14 extra points. Senior punter Tress Way leads the Big 12 with an average of 42.9 yards per kick. Justin Brown is fifth in the nation with 22.0 yards per punt return.



Texas Tech Red Raiders

Texas Tech is off to a 4-0 start for the second year in a row after a 24-13 win at lowa State (9/29). The Red Raiders

have scored at least 44 points in three of four games this year and have allowed no more than 14 points in a game.

Offense

The Texas Tech offense is led by senior quarterback Seth Doege. He ranks third in the Big 12 in passing yards per game (297.2) and total offense (295.0) and is sixth in efficiency (169.0). He distributes the ball evenly as six different receivers have at least 10 receptions and over 100 yards receiving on the year.

Defense

After finishing with the No. 114 total defense last year, the Red Raiders have stepped up their efforts in 2012 and currently boast the nation's top-ranked defensive unit. Texas Tech leads the country in pass defense (82.0 yards per game), is fifth in scoring defense (10.8 points) and 12th in rush defense (85.5 yards). Senior safety Cody Davis leads the team with 23 tackles and is tied for the team lead with two interceptions.

Special Teams

Sophomore kicker Ryan Bustin has made six of eight field goals this year, including a 50-yarder. He has also made all 22 extra points, making him the third-leading scorer among kickers in the Big 12. Junior Ryan Erxleben has only had to punt seven times this year, averaging 43.0 yards per kick. Senior Austin Zouzalik is gaining 10.4 yards per punt return, while junior SaDale Foster has a 29.2 average on kickoff returns.

THE HEAD COACHES



Bob Stoops Oklahoma

Last season, Oklahoma registered its 10th 10-win season under Stoops. In 2010 Oklahoma won its seventh Big 12 title, all of which have come under the current head coach. Stoops didn't arrive

at OU until the Big 12 was three years old, but already he has coached the program to more than twice as many championships as any other school in the league.

Stoops won a national crown in 2000, just his second season in Norman, and has led the Sooners to a school-record 13 consecutive bowl games, including eight of the BCS variety.

Along the way, he has picked up 17 coach of the year citations, including eight on the national level (only five coaches nationally have won more conference coach of the year awards), and watched five assistant coaches move into Football Bowl Subdivision head coaching positions.

Stoops can claim 141 victories (he reached 100 victories faster than any coach in college football history) and has a 44-18 mark against opponents ranked among the Associated Press top 25.

Two Heisman winners and five Heisman finalists have been characteristic of the talent Stoops and his staff have attracted. The offenses have been among the best in college football history (the 2008 team was the first to score 60 or more points in five straight games en route to scoring an NCAA record 716 points).

The defense has been stingy and is the only program to produce two players who won the Thorpe and Nagurski Awards in the same season.

Stoops has been characterized as a grounded family man, big-game coach, relentless recruiter, strong leader and a person with uncommon perspective.

The son of a coach, Stoops was a four-year starter at lowa. He began his coaching career in 1983 as a volunteer in the Hawkeye program under Hayden Fry, working through the ranks until he became co-defensive coordinator at Kansas State (1991-95). There he played a key role in one of the most impressive turnarounds in college football history while serving on Bill Snyder's staff.

Eventually, he left for Florida and a three-year stint as Steve Spurrier's defensive coordinator. It was with the Gators, and a national championship team in 1996, that the spotlight found Stoops and made him one of the hottest names in the profession.

Tommy Tuberville Texas Tech

Tommy Tuberville is in his third season as head coach at Texas Tech, boasting a 17-12 record at the school and a 127-72 mark in his 17-year career.

In just two seasons, Tuberville has assembled the top two recruiting classes in school history that placed the Red Raiders in the national top 25 in both 2011 and 2012.

In year one, Tuberville led the Red Raiders to an 8-5 record and became the first coach in school history to win a bowl game in his first season. The Red Raiders secured their 11th consecutive bowl bid by ending the regular-season with back-to-back wins.

Tuberville's strong bowl history proved beneficial for the Red Raiders as he led them to a 45-38 win over Northwestern, which gave Tech its third consecutive win over a Big Ten foe. His successful debut led to a one-year contract extention that will keep him on the Tech sideline through the 2015 season.

The excitement for Tuberville's first season was historic as a new single-season school record for season tickets was established with sales peaking at 46,565. Along the way, Tech also set a new standard for home attendance as an average of 57,107 fans attended the six home games at Jones A&T Stadium.

In 10 seasons at Auburn (1999-2008), Tuberville led the Tigers to 85 overall wins, which ranks fourth in school history. The Tigers also won 49 Southeastern Conference games, a number that is the fourth-best mark in the SEC. Tuberville led Auburn to seven-straight bowl appearances, including New Year's Day bowl games in four of those years.

In 2004, Tuberville led Auburn to its best season ever as the Tigers won a school-record 13 games and captured the SEC Championship and the NOKIA Sugar Bowl title. Auburn won its first conference title since 1989. Auburn defeated five top 15 teams, becoming just the 10th NCAA Division I-A team to finish 13-0 or better. For his efforts, Tuberville was named the AFCA, Associated Press, Paul "Bear" Bryant, FCA, SEC and Walter Camp Coach of the Year.

While at Ole Miss from 1995-98, Tuberville posted a 25-20 record. Inheriting a Rebel program plagued by NCAA sanctions and probation, he guided Ole Miss to a winning record in his first season in 1995, despite having just 61 players on scholarship. He did not have a full compliment of scholarship players to work with in any of his four years at Ole Miss.

NORMAN, Okla. - Seth Doege threw for 441 yards and connected with Alex Torres on three of his four touchdown passes, and Texas Tech snapped the Sooners' 39-game home winning streak with a 41-38 victory.

Doege worked against an Oklahoma defense missing three starters, helping the Red Raiders become the first opponent since TCU in the 2005 season opener to win in Norman. Oklahoma State pulled off the only other win against Stoops in Norman, in the 2001 regular-season finale. The Sooners gave up 572 yards of total offense

Doege threw touchdown passes of 44, 30 and 11 yards to Torres to build up a 31-7 lead just over 2 minutes into the second half and the Red Raiders hung on from there.

Landry Jones ended up with 412 yards passing and five touchdowns with one interception, but it wasn't enough to rally Oklahoma back from a sluggish start and save its unbeaten season.

Red Zone Production

Oklahoma is tied for 11th in the nation with a Red Zone scoring percentage of 93 percent. The Sooners were 10-for-10 inside the opponent's 20-yard line entering the Kansas State game (9/22), and finished that contest 3-for-4 in the Red 7one.

On defense, Oklahoma gave up its first points inside the red zone against Kansas State (9/22). The Wildcats were 3-for-3, pushing OU's mark to 75 percent (3-for-4). However, the four Red Zone trips allowed ranks second in the country for fewest trips allowed.

Tough Schedule in 2012

- Three games into the 2012 season and Oklahoma holds the fifth-toughest schedule in college football according to the cumulative opposition rankings on NCAA.org.
- The Sooners' past opponents are 3-3 on the year and their future foes are 22-7, bringing the combined record of OU opponents to 25-10 and a winning percentage of .714.

- When Kenny Stills recorded 120 receiving yards and Damien Williams rushed for 156 yards vs. Florida A&M (9/8), it marked the the 28th time during the Bob Stoops era that OU had a 100-yard rusher and a 100-yard receiver in the same game.
- It was the second time this season that Stills and Williams each went over 100 yards as the pair also did it in the season opener against UTEP (9/1) when Stills had 121 receiving yards and Williams had 103 rushing yards.
- The Sooners are a perfect 28-0 under Bob Stoops when having a 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver in the same game.

OKLAHOMA COACHING STAFF

- During Bob Stoops' tenure at OU, six of his assistant coaches have gone on to become head coaches at other FBS programs.
- Four former Stoops' assistants are now head coaches: Mike Leach (Washington State), Bo Pelini (Nebraska), Kevin Sumlin (Texas A&M) and Kevin Wilson (Indiana).
- This season, Mike Stoops returns to Oklahoma as the defensive coordinator, while Tim Kish joins the program as assistant defensive coordinator.
- Three current assistants played for Oklahoma, including Jackie Shipp (1980-83),
 Cale Gundy (1990-93) and Josh Heupel (1999-00).
- OU's coaches have a cumulative 63 years on the sidelines in Norman and 192 years experience total.

- Oklahoma has outscored its opponents a combined 640-192 in 14 home openers under Stoops.
- OU's 349 rushing yards against FAMU were the thirdhighest total in the Stoops Era and marked the 12th game of 300 rushing yards or more under Stoops.
- The 662 yards of total offense gained by OU is the 18th-most in college football this season.
- Oklahoma's eight rushing touchdowns were the most in the Stoops Era.
- Oklahoma had over 300 yards both receiving and rushing for the third time in school history against Florida A&M (9/8). OU also did it against Texas A&M (11/8/08) and lowa State (10/16/10).

Non-Conference Success

 With wins over UTEP (9/1) and Florida A&M (9/8), Oklahoma has now won 12 straight non-conference games dating back to the 2009 season and is 50-12 all-time under Bob Stoops against teams outside of the Big 12.

2012 Team Captains

This season's team captains are OL Gabe Ikard (Jr.), QB Landry Jones (Sr.), DE David King (Sr.), FB Trey Millard (Jr.) and P Tress Way (Sr.).

Conference Domination

- The Sooners were picked to finish first in the Big 12 preseason media poll.
- Oklahoma has won seven Big 12 Conference titles (2000, 02, 04, 06, 07, 08, 10), twice as many as the next closest program in the league.
- Since 2000, Oklahoma is 79-18 (.814) in Big 12 play, the best mark in the conference. Texas is next with a 74-23 (.763) record.
- Among BCS-automatic qualifier conference teams, Oklahoma has the best conference winning percentage, with the next-best records at USC of the Pac-12, which has a 65-20 (.765) conference record since 2000 and Virginia Tech of the ACC (70-22, .761).

Preseason Rankings

- Oklahoma entered the first week of the season ranked No. 4 (USA Today and AP).
- Since 2000, OU has been ranked in the preseason polls all 13 seasons.
- The following is where OU has been ranked in the preseason and how the team finished in each of the past five seasons:

 Of the Sooners' 12 opponents this season, seven were ranked in the AP preseason poll. West Virginia (No. 11) is the highest-ranked foe, followed by Texas (15), Oklahoma State (19), TCU (20) and Kansas State (22). Notre Dame and Baylor each received votes.

About the Offense

- Under Bob Stoops, OU has produced career leaders in passing, receiving, total offense and all-purpose yards, four top-10 career rushers and season record holders in rushing, passing, total offense and receiving yards.
- Stoops-led Sooner teams have set 66 offensive school records.
- OU has scored in 178 straight games since 11/7/98.
- Since Stoops' arrival, OU has scored 6,460 points an average of 36.7 per game.
- Oklahoma is the highest scoring college program in history. In 1,184 games, the Sooners have scored 32,044 points. Michigan is next at 30,851 points in 1,248 games.

Oklahoma O

- OU has scored in 10-straight quarters, including every quarter of each of its last two games.
- Oklahoma has racked up 300 yards or more of total offense in 38 straight regular season contests dating back to early 2009.

Starting Off on the Right Foot

OU's opening drive against Kansas State (9/22) of 14
plays and 80 yards over 5:30 was the longest scoring
drive of the season in terms of plays and time of
possession. It was also the first score on an opening
drive by the Sooners this season.

Wide Open

- Junior wide receiver Kenny Stills has had an impressive start to the 2012 campaign. He leads the team with 301 receiving yards and two touchdowns on 22 catches. He posted over 120 receiving yards in each of his first two games of the year.
- His 100.3 receiving yards per game rank fifth in the Big 12 and 16th in the NCAA, while his 7.3 receptions per game is 15th in the country and fourth in the conference.
- Going over the 100-yard mark in his first two games of the year, Stills now has five career 100-yard receiving games, moving Stills ahead of Eddie Hinton for fifth all-time at OU.
- Stills' 68-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter against UTEP (9/1) was the longest of his career, surpassing the 58-yarder he had vs. Texas Tech (11/13/2010), and it was the longest pass play for OU since since Jones hit Cameron Kenney for an 86-yard touchdown at Oklahoma State (11/27/10).
- Among active players in the NCAA, Stills ranks No. 9
 in receiving yards per game (69.1), No. 16 in
 receptions (144), tied for No. 17 in TD receptions (15)
 and No. 19 in receiving yards (1,936).

Shepard Shines in First Start

- Sterling Shepard started for the first time in his Sooner career and set career highs with seven receptions for 108 yards, leading all receivers.
- Shepard became the seventh freshman in OU history to go over 100 yards receiving. OU freshmen have accomplished the feat eight times overall. Ryan Broyles was the previous freshman to do so, gaining 141 yards at Cincinnati (9/6/08).
- Shepard's 108 receiving yards ties him with Mark Clayton (vs. Baylor, 10/20/01) and Tinker Owens (vs. Nebraska, 11/23/72) for fourth-most receiving yards by a freshman.

Williams Continues to Wow

- A transfer from Arizona Western, junior running back Damien Williams made his presence felt in his brief time at Oklahoma.
- With an average of 97.7 rushing yards per game,
 Williams is third in the Big 12 and ranks 34th in the nation.
- After finishing with 10 carries for 103 yards and a touchdown last week at UTEP (9/1) in his OU debut, Williams gained 156 rushing yards and four touchdowns against Florida A&M (9/8).
- Williams' 156 total yards rushing were the most in home debut in Oklahoma history, surpassing Dominique Whaley's 131 yards vs. Tulsa (9/3/11).
- He is the first Sooner to score at least one touchdown in each of the first two games of his career since Ryan Broyles did so against Chattanooga (9/6/08) and Cincinnati (9/13/08).
- Williams is the first Sooner to register 100-yard rushing games in each of the first two games of his OU career since Adrian Peterson rushed for 100 yards against Bowling Green (9/4/04) and 117 against Houston (9/11/04).
- Williams had the first back-to-back 100-yard rushing games for OU since DeMarco Murray did so against Texas (115 yards, 10/2/10) and Iowa State (112 yards, 10/16/10).
- His 89-yard TD run was the longest since DeMarco Murray's 92-yarder against Utah State in (9/14/07) and ties for the seventh-longest run play in school history. It's also the fourth-longest run so far this season in college football.

About the Defense

- Oklahoma has ranked in the top 16 in the nation in total defense eight of the last 11 years.
- OU has forced at least one turnover in 152 of 176 games over the last 14 seasons - 86% of games played in that span.
- The Sooner defense has at least one interception in 73% of its games (129 of 176) over the last 14 years.
- Oklahoma has 13 shutouts under Bob Stoops.
- Under Stoops, the Oklahoma defense has surrendered an average of just 18.3 points per game.

- The defense has allowed less than 100 rushing yards per game in five of the last 11 seasons.
- In 2012, Oklahoma has permitted only 17 secondhalf points through its first two games.
- In 12 quarters of play, OU has posted shutouts in seven of them. Kansas State had scored in all 12 quarters entering Saturday's game (9/22), but were shutout in both the first and third quarters by OU.

Back to the Future

- OU associate head coach and defensive coordinator Mike Stoops is back on the Sooner coaching staff after previously guiding the OU defense from 1999-03.
- In his first stint in Norman, four of Stoops' five defenses finished No. 7 or better nationally in scoring defense and in the top 10 for total defense.
- From 2000-03, Stoops' defenses also finished in the top 25 in pass defense and rush defense every season and in pass efficiency defense and turnovers forced twice.
- In addition, Stoops is the only coach to have an athlete win both the Nagurski and Thorpe awards in the same season, doing so twice with Roy Williams in 2001 and Derrick Strait in 2003.

Third-Down Defense

- Under Bob Stoops' tenure, no program has been better at stopping foes on third down than OU, limiting teams to an FBS-best 30.5 percent success rate since the start of the 1999 season.
- The Sooners have kept that trend going in the 2012 season, holding their first two opponents to just three conversions in 16 attempts each (18.8%).
- The Oklahoma defense posted the No. 5 third down defense in the nation in 2011, allowing just 60 conversions in 196 attempts (30.6%).
- In home games, no team was better in the category than OU's 20.2% mark.
- The Sooners have consistently been at the top of the rankings in third-down defense, ranking No. 11 two seasons ago and No. 3 in 2009.

No Passing Zone

- Oklahoma ranks second in the nation in passing defense, yielding just 123.7 yards per game.
- The OU defense held UTEP to just 48 yards passing in the season opener (9/1), the fewest passing yards allowed by the Sooners since Oklahoma State had 47 (11/28/2009).
- The 48 passing yards allowed were the secondfewest in the FBS' opening week and the best for a team facing a fellow FBS opponent.
- Under Bob Stoops, the Sooners are 26-1 when limiting teams to 100 yards passing or less and 10-1 when teams pass for 50 yards or less.

Support in the Secondary

- Tony Jefferson totaled 14 tackles against Kansas State (9/22), the most tackles by a Sooner since defensive back Quinton Carter had 17 tackles vs. Texas Tech (11/13/10).
- Jefferson (14) and Javon Harris (career-high 12) became the first OU defensive backs to both have double-digit tackle totals in the same game since Jemell Fleming and Jonathan Nelson accomplished the feat against Texas A&M (11/6/10).
- Jefferson is tied for sixth in the Big 12 with an average of 8.3 tackles per game, while Harris is not far behind in 10th place with 8.0 stops per game.

Colvin Against the Pass

 Defensive back Aaron Colvin has a team-high five pass breakups, good enough to put him second in the Big 12 and 19th in the NCAA.

Defensive Shutout

- In the opener at UTEP (9/1), the OU defense held the Miners' offense scoreless, marking the first time OU kept an opposing offense off the board since a 52-0 win vs. Iowa State (10/16/10).
- During Mike Stoops' first tour of duty as OU's defensive coordinator from 1999-03, the Sooners pitched six shutouts.

Defensive TDs at 42 in Stoops Era

- With a school-record three defensive touchdowns against Texas in 2011, Oklahoma now has 42 in Bob Stoops' 13 seasons.
- Thirteen of those touchdowns came via a fumble return.
- The defense has scored at least one touchdown in all of Stoops' first13 seasons, including four in 2011.
- The four defensive scores last season were one shy of the most in Stoops' tenure. OU had five touchdowns on defense in 2007, 2001 and 2000.

About the Special Teams

Oklahoma's special teams under Bob Stoops ...

- There have been 29 special teams touchdowns.
- Those 29 have come via five different kinds of plays -- punt returns, fake field goals, blocked punts, kickoff returns and a fake punt. Special teams also owns four safeties in that span.
- Oklahoma has returned six kickoffs and 14 punts for touchdowns.
- Oklahoma has blocked 28 kicks.

Many Happy Returns

Information on returns during the Stoops era ...

- Kickoff Returns --109 returns of 25 yards or more with eight touchdowns.
- Punt Returns -- 69 returns of 15 or more yards with 16 touchdowns.
- Interception Returns -- 90 returns of 10 or more yards with 24 touchdowns.
- Fumble Returns -- 8 returns of 15 or more yards with 12 touchdowns.

Excelling on Returns

- With an average of 28.2 yards per return,
 Oklahoma ranks second in the Big 12 and is tied for 10th in the NCAA in kickoff returns.
- Brennan Clay is averaging 34.5 yards on his two kickoff returns, while Roy Finch has returned three kicks an average of 29.0 yards.
- OU is third in the Big 12 in punt return average.
 The 22.0 yards per return, all by Justin Brown, sits sixth in the NCAA.

Way Good at Punter

- Tress Way is third among active punters in the NCAA's FBS with 209 career punts and 9,163 total punt yards.
- Way also ranks No. 6 among active punters in the NCAA with a 43.8 yards per punt average.
- His career average currently ranks No. 1 in OU history with a season left to play, just ahead of Jeff Ferguson (1998-01) at 42.5 ypp.
- This season, Way ranks 34th in the NCAA with an average of 42.9 yards per punt.
- With three against UTEP (9/1), Way has 61 punts of 50+ yards in his career to set the OU program record. Ferguson previously held the record with 52.
- Way's 58.8 avg. vs. Oklahoma State (11/28/09) is the highest in a game in program history.
- In 2011, Way has played a central role in field position with 34 of 63 punts downed inside the 20. Only six of Way's punts resulted in a touchback.

Hunnicutt Through the Uprights

Returning kicker Michael Hunnicutt is in his second season as the Sooners' field goal kicker.

- This season he has made 3-of-4 field goal tries with a long of 38 against UTEP (9/1). After missing a 44-yarder to start the year, he has made his last three successfully.
- Against Kansas State (9/22), Hunnicutt kicked two field goals, the fifth multi-field goal game in his career. He is now 24-of-28 in his career.
- As a freshman, Hunnicutt made 21 field goals, tying the OU single-season record set by Tim Duncan in 2001.
- The total also tied him for the 13th-most conversions in the nation in 2011.
- His 118 total points (21 FG, 55 PATs) ranked No.
 10 on the OU season scoring list.
- Hunnicutt broke the OU freshman field goal record (16, Trey DiCarlo, 2002) and tied the OU freshman scoring record (Jimmy Stevens, 2008).
- Hunnicutt became the first kicker in OU history to hit four field goals in two different games (Kansas, 10/15/11; Iowa State, 11/26/11).
- Among kickers who made 20 or more field goals last season, Hunicutt ranked ranked No. 5 with an 87.5 (21-of-24) conversion percentage.

What Can Brown Do For You?

- Senior wide receiver Justin Brown has shown his playmaking ability on both offense and special teams in 2012.
- Brown ranks fifth in the NCAA with an average of 22.0 yards per punt.
- Brown returned three punts for a career-high 102 yards against Florida A&M (9/8), which tied for the 19th-most punt return yards in a game in Oklahoma history and is the 10th-best performance so far in the 2012 college football season.
- Brown's 102 total punt return yards made him the 12th player under Stoops with 100 or more punt return yards in a game and the first player since Ryan Broyles had 209 yards vs. Oklahoma State (11/28/09) to do so.
- A 62-yard punt return in the second quarter
 was a career long for Brown, besting a 43-yard
 return earlier in the game in the first quarter.
 It was the longest by a Sooner since Ryan
 Broyles' 87-yard punt return vs. Oklahoma State
 (11/28/09).
- Brown became the 11th player in 0U history to have three separate plays of 40 yards or more (46-yard reception, 43-yard punt return, 62-yard punt return) and the first since Ryan Broyles had two punt returns and a reception of over 40 yards against Oklahoma State (11/28/09). It's the 12th time an 0U player has accomplished the feat overall.

Best Program of the BCS Era

The Sept. 17, 2012, "Franchise Issue" of ESPN The Magazine, sought to find the best program in the BCS era. Sooners fans will be pleased with the results as Oklahoma was chosen as the No. 1 team.

- Football Revenue (No. 12) 2010 figures, per U.S. Department of Education.
- Academics (No. 33) US News and World Report ranking in 2012; Academic Progress Rate in 2010-11.
- NCAA Violations (Grade: B) Grade based on severity of sanctions since 1998.



THE PROGRAM

- Oklahoma's all-time record stands at 823-308-53 (.717) in 117 seasons.
- Since WWII, OU leads the nation with 579 victories.
- The Sooners have captured seven national championships (1950, 1955, 1956, 1974, 1975, 1985, 2000).
- OU has 45 bowl appearances (No. 7 nationally) with 27 bowl victories (No. 4 nationally) and an all-time record of 27-17-1 (.611).
- OU has 43 conference championships, including seven Big 12 titles overall (no other school has more than three).
- Oklahoma is the only program in FBS history to have four coaches with 100 or more wins.
- With a 69-13 win over Florida A&M (9/8/12),
 Oklahoma became the first program in college
 football history to break the 32,000-mark in
 all-time points scored (32, 035). No program
 has scored more points than OU.
- OU has 153 All-Americans and 73 consensus All-Americans, including NCAA career receptions leader Ryan Broyles in 2011.
- Under Stoops, OU has had 33 All-Americans, including 23 consensus. Of the 33 players, 15 were on offense, 16 on defense and two on special teams representing 14 different positions.
- Oklahoma boasts five Heisman winners.
 Sooners have also won the Bednarik (1), Butkus (4), Camp (4), Lombardi (3), Maxwell (2),
 Nagurski (2), O'Brien (3), Outland (5), Tatupu (1), Thorpe (3) and Unitas (1).

- Sooner teams have gone undefeated 14 times in program history, the first in 1896 and the latest in 2000.
- Oklahoma's 47-game win streak from 1953-57 is still the NCAA D-I record.
- Oklahoma has had 102 Academic All-Big 12 honorees under Stoops.
- The Sooners have gone 78-3 at home in Stoops' 14 seasons. In all, Oklahoma has won 81 percent of its home games since Gaylord Family

 Oklahoma Memorial opened in 1923.
- Oklahoma has played in front of 81 consecutive home sellouts - every game of Stoops' tenure.
- Including the seven Sooners picked in the 2012 NFL Draft, OU has had 357 players picked alltime in the draft.
- Oklahoma has 42 first-round picks, including three No. 1 overall selections.
- In 2010, Sooners were chosen with three of the first four picks in the draft, with QB Sam Bradford at No. 1, DT Gerald McCoy at No. 3 and OT Trent Williams at No. 4.
- Bob Stoops' career average of 10.7 wins per year is tops among active FBS head coaches with at least 10 years of experience.
- Stoops is the only active head coach on the FBS level to have reached a bowl game in each of his first 13 seasons. Georgia's Mark Richt (11) comes in second.
- Of the 13 bowls, eight have been BCS bowl games and four have been for the BCS title.

- OU is 67-4 when ranked and 11-0 when unranked at home
- Oklahoma is 34-1 in non-conference games at home under Stoops and 44-3 in Big 12 games.
- OU is 47-0 under Stoops when scoring 40 points or more at home and 35-0 at home when allowing 10 points or fewer.

Streaks

- Only one game has gone into overtime, a 37-30 OU win vs. Baylor (10/22/05).

Attendance Lately

- In 2011, Oklahoma ranked No. 13 nationally in average attendance at 85,161.
- OU's average attendance last season was 103.7% of Memorial Stadium's official capacity.
- Only Oregon, TCU, Nebraska and Texas A&M had higher percentages over capacity.
- In 2011, OU's win over Texas A&M drew the highest attendance in stadium history at 85,709.

Record-Setting Attendance

- Oklahoma has drawn 6,282,300 fans for Bob Stoops' 82 home games (started in 1999) and all have been sold out.
- The current string of sellouts is the longest in school history, eclipsing a mark of 69 from 1971-84.
- In 2011, Oklahoma fans set a record for average season attendance at 85,161.
- OU has exceeded the seating capacity of 82,112 at Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium in 50 straight games.
- The top nine seasons for home attendance at Oklahoma have been during Stoops' tenure as head coach.
- Of the top 10 crowds at Gaylord Family –
 Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, all have come in the
 past six years.



EL PASO, Texas -- Riding its defense all night and scoring a pair of touchdowns in the fourth quarter, No. 4 Oklahoma survived a scare by slogging out a 24-7 win over Texas-El Paso on Saturday night.

Oklahoma labored from the start of its opener, unable to generate much of a running game or get anything going downfield.

Tied at halftime and up just 10-7 after three quarters, the Sooners finally created a gap from the gritty Miners by stuffing UTEP on a fake punt to set up an 18-yard touchdown pass to Brannon Green midway through the fourth quarter.

They finally sealed it in the closing minutes, when Damien Williams burst through the right side and ran to the left pylon for a 65-yard touchdown run.

Jones threw for 222 yards and a pair of touchdowns on 21 of 36 passing while Williams had 103 yards on 10 carries, giving the Sooners a respectable 204 yards on the ground with his big run late.

Nathan Jeffery ran for 177 yards and returned a blocked punt 24 yards for a touchdown for UTEP, which also blocked a field goal to remain tied with Oklahoma at the half.

BIG 12 NEWS AND NOTES

- In Saturday's games, seven Big 12 quarterbacks combined to complete 172 of 234 passes (73.5 percent) for 2,653 yards and 24 touchdowns. That's an average of 379 yards per game and 15.4 yards per completion.
- The Big 12's non-conference record is 26-3 to lead the nation with a .897 non-conference win percentage. The three non-league losses are the fewest of all FBS conferences.
- All four Big 12 conference games this week feature ranked teams, with one matching top 10 teams and another pitting top 25 squads.
- Nine of 10 Big 12 teams is receiving votes in the AP/ Coaches polls, with five top 15 teams in the Coaches Poll (Big 12 and SEC account for 10 of the top 15 spots). The Conference has six ranked teams in the Coaches Poll, and five in AP.
- · The Big 12 is a nation-leading 25-3 in nonconference games. Since last season Big 12 teams are 52-6 against non-conference foes.
