Sooners Seek 11th 3-0 Start Under Stoops, Renew In-State Series With Tulsa

- OU is coming off a 16-7 win vs. WVU (9/7), while Tulsa registered a 30-27 comeback win vs. Colorado State (9/7).
- The Sooners have won seven straight regular season games dating back to 2012. OU is seeking to start 3-0 for the third time in the past four seasons under Bob Stoops. When ranked in the AP Poll, OU is 12-0 all-time vs. Tulsa.
- The Sooners are 17-7-1 all-time vs. Tulsa, winning 11 of the last 12 meetings since 1979.
- OU is 6-0 against Tulsa under Stoops, winning by an average margin of 30 points (46.7-16.7 ppg). OU has shut out the Golden Hurricane in three of those six meetings (58-0 in 2001, 37-0 in 2002 and 45-0 in 2009).
- Under Stoops, OU is a combined 17-3 (.850) against Oklahoma's other FBS schools (11-3 vs. Oklahoma State, 6-0 vs. Tulsa), including a 10-1 mark at home.
- The Sooners are ranked No. 14 in the AP Poll and are No. 13 in the USA Today Coaches Poll.
- The Sooners are 35-2 (.946) at home against non-conference foes under Stoops.
- The Sooners have won 35 consecutive games under Stoops when leading at halftime.

Oklahoma Defense Dominant in Season's First Two Games

- No FBS team that has faced two other FBS opponents has allowed fewer total points than Oklahoma (7).
- The Sooners held West Virginia to seven points, marking only the fifth time the Mountaineers were held to seven points or less in a regular season contest dating back to 2000.
- OU leads the Big 12 in scoring defense (3.5 ppg), total defense (276.5 ypg), third-down defense (5-29, 17.2%), pass defense efficiency (82.6) and Red Zone defense (0-2, 0.0%), while ranking second in rushing defense (103.5 ypg).
- The Sooners are tied for fourth in the FBS in scoring defense and are fifth in third-down defense.
- The Sooners own sizeable advantages in scoring differential +43 (50/7), rushing yards +461 (691/230), total yards +311 (864/553), first downs +18 (46/28) and third-down conversions +7 (12/5).

Ground Game Continues to Sizzle For Sooners

- Oklahoma leads the Big 12, averaging 310.5 rushing ypg. RB Brennan Clay is second in the league at 106.5 ypg and is averaging 7.1 yards per carry. Clay posted a career-high 170 yards (7.7 avg.) vs. West Virginia (9/7).
- OU is 15-0 with 300+ rushing yards under Stoops (2-0 in 2013) and owns a 56-1 mark since 1999 when racking up 200 or more rushing yards, including 28 straight wins. Oklahoma leads the Big 12 in time of possession (33:32).
- In six meetings during the Stoops' era, OU has outgained Tulsa by an average of 250.7 to 89.0 rushing ypg, producing 21 rushing TDs compared to two rushing touchdowns for the Golden Hurricane.

THE TEAMS AT A GLANCE



OKLAHOMA Sooners

Oklahoma is 2-0 for the fourth season in a row and the seventh time in the last eight seasons under head coach

Bob Stoops. After shutting out ULM, 34-0 (8/31), OU opened the Big 12 portion of its schedule with a hard-fought, 16-7 win over West Virginia (9/7).

Offense

The Oklahoma offense has been led by a potent rushing attack, highlighted last week by Brennan Clay's career-high 170 yards against West Virginia (9/7). Through two games the Sooners have rushed for 621 yards. Clay leads the team with 213 rushing yards, while Damien Williams (161) and Trevor Knight (145) have each rushed for over 100 yards this season.

Defense

Averaging just 3.5 points allowed per game, no team that has faced multiple FBS teams this season has been as stingy as the Sooners defense. The leader has been Corey Nelson, who boasts a team-high 15 tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss, 1.0 sack, one pass breakup and two quarterback hurries. Against West Virginia (9/7), OU forced four turnovers, including three fumbles and an interception. Safety Gabe Lynn had the pick and recovered one of the fumbles.

Special Teams

Michael Hunnicutt has hit on 5-6 field goals this year, while Nick Hodgson has recorded touchbacks on nine of his 12 kickoffs this year. Punter Jed Barnett is averaging 44.0 yards per kick, while nine of his 12 punts have been fair caught and seven have landed inside the 20-yard line. Jalen Saunders has averaged 11.4 yards on his seven punt returns.



Tulsa Golden Hurricane

After opening the season with a 34-7 loss at Bowling Green (8/29), Tulsa bounced back in week two

with a 30-27 victory over Colorado State (9/7). Carl Salazar made a 34-yard field goal as time expired to cap the rally a 10-point fourth-quarter deficit.

Offense

Running back Trey Watts has been the cornerstone of the Tulsa offense so far, leading the team in both rushing yards (160) and receptions (13) and ranking third in receiving yards (91). Wide receiver Derek Patterson has been the big play threat, leading the team in receiving yards (106) and yards per catch (17.7). Quarterback Cody Green has thrown for 384 yards and three touchdowns with one interception, completing 52 percent of his passes in the process.

Defense

Through two games defensive back Michael Mudoh has put up an impressive 25 tackles. After posting 17 in the opener against Bowling Green (8/29), Mudoh followed with an eight-stop effort against Colorado State (9/7). He's also tied for the team lead in interceptions and passes broken up with one each. Tulsa ranks 12th in the country in 3rd-down defense, allowing teams to convert at only a 23.3 percent clip.

Special Teams

Carl Salazar has gone 3-5 on field goals this year, including the game-winner vs. Colorado State (9/7). Dalton Parks (37.0) and Cole Way (37.5), brother of former OU punter Tress Way, have split reps at punter. In the return game, Trey Watts has seen time on the punt (4.6) and kick return (20.2) units.

THE HEAD COACHES



**Bob Stoops
Oklahoma**

Bob Stoops has registered 151 career wins, needing only seven more to pass Barry Switzer (157) for the most victories in Oklahoma history, meaning the Sooners' head coach is poised to attain another historic milestone in 2013.

The only head coach to reach all four BCS games and the BCS National Championship Game, Stoops has guided the Sooners to four appearances in a national title contest, claiming college football's crown in 2000. Of Stoops' 14 bowl appearances with the Sooners, eight of those games have been of the BCS variety.

Along the way, he has picked up 17 coach of the year citations, including eight on the national level (only five coaches nationally have won more conference coach of the year awards), and watched five assistant coaches move into Football Bowl Subdivision head coaching positions.

From 1999-2012, no team from a BCS conference owned more victories or a better winning percentage than Oklahoma (149-37, .801). Under his direction, OU is one of two FBS schools with 11 seasons of at least 10 wins since 2000.

Among schools from BCS conferences, only Alabama (61) and Oregon (56) have compiled more victories over the past five seasons than Oklahoma (52), while only LSU and Stanford can join those three schools in boasting 10 or more victories in each of the past three campaigns.

Two Heisman winners and five Heisman finalists have been characteristic of the talent Stoops and his staff have attracted. The offenses have been among the best in college football history (the 2008 team was the first to score 60 or more points in five straight games en route to scoring an NCAA record 716 points).

The defense has been stingy and is the only program to produce two players who won the Thorpe and Nagurski Awards in the same season.

The son of a coach, Stoops was a four-year starter at Iowa. He began his coaching career in 1983 as a volunteer in the Hawkeye program under Hayden Fry, working through the ranks until he became co-defensive coordinator at Kansas State (1991-95).

Eventually, he left for Florida and a three-year stint as Steve Spurrier's defensive coordinator. It was with the Gators, and a national championship team in 1996, that the spotlight found Stoops and made him one of the hottest names in the profession.



**Bill Blankenship
Tulsa**

After two years at the helm of the Tulsa football program, Golden Hurricane alumnus Bill Blankenship has guided TU to an overall 19-8 record, becoming the second coach in school history to win 19 games in his first two seasons.

In 2012, Blankenship led the Hurricane to an 11-3 record, tying the 2008 team for the most wins in school history. His team posted a second consecutive 7-1 Conference USA mark, won the C-USA West Division title and C-USA Championship, while closing out the season with a 31-17 victory over Iowa State in the 54th Annual AutoZone Liberty Bowl.

Blankenship led Tulsa to an 8-5 record and an appearance in the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl at the end of the 2011 campaign, his first season as the Hurricane head coach. Blankenship has been a part of the Hurricane coaching staff for six years, including the last two as head coach.

In his six seasons, Tulsa teams have won 55 games, three Conference USA West Division titles (2007, 2008 and 2012), shared one West Division crown (2010), made three appearances in the C-USA Championship Game (2007, 2008 and 2012), won last year's C-USA title and played in five Bowl games. Blankenship has been a part of four 10-wins seasons in his six years on the Hurricane staff, as there is only nine years of 10+ wins in school history.

Before entering the collegiate ranks, Blankenship spent 23 years as an Oklahoma High School coach. Blankenship resigned as the head football coach at Tulsa's Union High School in December 2005 after leading his team to a second consecutive state championship at the Oklahoma Class 6A school.

Blankenship was a three-year letterman and quarterback at Tulsa during the 1975-79 seasons. After redshirting in 1976, Blankenship started eight games in the 1977 season and six contests in 1979. During his playing career, he threw for 2,113 yards and eight touchdowns. Blankenship earned a bachelor's degree in biology in 1979, and received a master's degree from Northeastern State in 1985.

He and his wife, Angie, have three sons, all of whom played college football. Their oldest son, Josh, played quarterback at Tulsa before earning All-America honors at Eastern Washington University, and is currently the head football coach at Muskogee (Okla.) High School. Caleb was an all-conference tight end at Tulsa, while their youngest son, Adam, played at Illinois State and is now the defensive ends coach on the Tulsa staff.

NORMAN, Okla. -- Landry Jones went 35 for 47 for 375 yards and Ryan Broyles came up just shy of his own school receptions record with 14 for 158 yards in a 47-14 season-opening win over Tulsa. Dominique Whaley ran for 131 yards and four TDs as the Sooners extended the nation's longest home winning streak to 37.

Broyles' 4-yard touchdown catch put Oklahoma up 30-0 with 4:23 left before halftime, and Tulsa (0-1) never mounted a challenge in Bill Blankenship's first game as head coach. Jones got in a groove early by hooking up with Broyles -- the nation's leader in 2010 with 131 receptions -- seven times for 120 yards in the first quarter, then everyone else got involved.

Whaley had three short touchdown runs in the first half and then ran through three potential tackles on a 32-yarder that pushed the Sooners lead to 44-7 late in the third quarter.

Tulsa went three-and-out three times in the first half and turned it over twice before finally getting on the board when Bryan Burnham caught a quick pass from Kinne against broken coverage and raced 56 yards to make it 30-7.

- With a 34-0 win over ULM (8/31), Oklahoma improved to 91-22-6 in season openers and 48-9-5 in home openers. The Sooners are 13-2 in season openers under Bob Stoops, including 11-2 in home season openers.
- OU is 5-0 under head coach Bob Stoops in the month of August, outscoring those foes by a combined 206-32 margin.

- It was the first shutout by OU in a season opener since a 37-0 win over Tulsa (8/30/02).
- OU forced six three-and-outs. Of ULM's 15 drives, 11 were four plays or fewer and none went for more than eight plays.
- OU allowed nine first downs, the fewest since the Sooners allowed nine in last year's home opener vs. Florida A&M (9/8/12). ULM had zero first downs rushing.
- OU held ULM QB Kolton Browning, the preseason Sun Belt Offensive Player of the Year, to 128 yards passing and no touchdowns. Browning totaled 131 yards of total offense vs. OU after averaging 295 yards last season.
- OU held ULM to 38 rushing yards, the lowest total by an OU opponent since Texas (10/8/11) had 36 yards. No Warhawk had more than nine yards rushing on the night.

Knight Wins in Sooners' Debut

- QB Trevor Knight started for OU against ULM (8/31), becoming the first freshman to get the nod in a season opener since Sam Bradford started in a 79-10 win vs. North Texas (9/1/07).
- Knight is the 14th freshman QB overall to start a game at Oklahoma, and the fourth to start a season opener. OU freshman QBs are 4-0 all-time in season openers.
- Against ULM, Knight ran 13 times for 103 yards and was 11-28 passing for 86 yards and 3 TDs.
- Knight becomes just the second QB in the Stoops era to run for 100+ yards, joining Jason White who rushed for 117 yards on 12 carries at Kansas (10/13/01).
- Knight is the first OU freshman QB to rush for 100 yards since Steven Collins had 135 yards vs. Kansas State (11/11/89).
- Knight's 103 rushing yards were the second-most by an OU QB in his first-career start, just behind Steve Davis's 110 yards vs. Baylor (9/15/73).
- Knight is the 10th player and third QB in Sooner history to rush for 100+ yards in a career debut.
- Knight threw his first-career TD pass on a 12-yard throw to Jalen Saunders at the 11:15 mark in the second quarter. He became the second OU freshman QB to throw a TD pass in a season opener, joining Bradford in 2007.
- Knight's three TD passes tied Sam Bradford for the most by an OU freshman QB in a career debut.
- With the victory, Knight became one of five freshman QBs to start and win in week 1 of 2013.

Mobile Quarterbacks

- Oklahoma QBs (Trevor Knight – 5, Blake Bell – 1) combined for six runs of 10+ yards vs. ULM (8/31).
- Knight followed that up with a pair of 14-yard runs against West Virginia (9/7), while Bell had a 10-yard run and 11-yard run.
- Knight has seven runs of 10 yards or more, while Bell has three of the same. OU QBs had four runs of 10+ yards during the entire 2012 season.

- OU is 15-0 when rushing for over 300 yards under Stoops. The Sooners totaled 305 yards in the opener against ULM (8/31) and followed that with 316 against West Virginia (9/7).
- OU recorded back-to-back 300-yard rushing games for the first time since doing so against Texas (321) and Baylor (397) in October 1997.

About the Offense

- Under Stoops, OU has produced career leaders in passing, receiving, total offense and all-purpose yards, four top-10 career rushers and season record holders in rushing, passing, total offense and receiving yards.
- Stoops' teams have set over 65 OU school records.
- OU has scored in 190 straight games (11/7/98).
- Since Stoops' arrival, Oklahoma has scored 6,894 points - an average of 36.7 per game.
- OU is the highest-scoring team in history. The Sooners have 32,497 points in 1,196 games, while Nebraska is next with 31,299 points in 1,251 games.

Clay Tops 1,000-Yard Mark in Career

- With a 33-yard rush in the first quarter against West Virginia (9/7), Brennan Clay eclipsed the 1,000-yard career rush mark, becoming the 70th Sooner to do so.
- Clay finished with 22 rushes for a career-high 170 yards on the night, the second 100-yard game of his career, and he now has 1,169 career rush yards.
- The marks broke the previous career best from Clay of 157 rushing yards set last year at Iowa State (11/3/12).
- The 170 yards were the most by a Sooner since DeMarco Murray went for 208 yards in the season opener against Utah State (9/4/10).

Williams Passes 1,000 Career Yards

- Senior running back Damien Williams rushed for 66 yards on 16 carries against ULM (8/31) to go over the 1,000 yard mark for his career.
- He became the 69th Sooner to do so, and he now has 1,107 rushing yards in his career.

Saunders Scores Twice in Opener

- Senior wide receiver Jalen Saunders caught the 19th and 20th TD receptions of his career against ULM (8/31), his fourth and fifth as a Sooner. Saunders' TD receptions went for 12 and 18 yards, respectively.
- It was his first multi-TD reception game as a Sooner and fourth of his career. He finished with 30 yards receiving on three catches to lead OU.
- Despite missing four games in 2012 after transferring from Fresno State, Saunders finished third on the team in receptions (62) and yards (829), while his 92.1 receiving yards/game led OU.
- With seven catches for 108 yards and a TD at TCU (12/1/12), Saunders recorded his ninth career 100-yard game and fourth of the 2012 season.
- Saunders had an 81-yard punt return for a score vs. OSU (11/24/12), his first-career punt return TD, earning himself Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week honors.
- Against Notre Dame (10/27/12), Saunders tied an OU record with 15 catches and had a career-high 181 yards.

- Under Stoops, the OU defense has given up an average of just 18.6 points per game.
- OU has not allowed a score in the red zone this season, with both ULM and WVU going 0 for 1 in each respective game.

Stoops Guides Defense

- OU associate head coach and defensive coordinator Mike Stoops is back for his second season on the coaching staff after previously guiding the OU 'D' from 1999-03.
- With the shutout in the 2013 opener over ULM, Stoops' defenses have posted six shutouts, including five in his first stint in Norman.
- In his first stint at OU, four of Stoops' five defenses finished No. 7 or better nationally in scoring defense and top 10 for total defense.
- From 2000-03, Stoops' defenses also finished in the top 25 in pass defense and rush defense every season and in pass efficiency defense and turnovers forced twice.
- In addition, Stoops is the only coach to have an athlete win both the Nagurski and Thorpe awards in the same season, doing so twice with Roy Williams in 2001 and Derrick Strait in 2003.

Staying Strong on 3rd Down

- After holding WVU (9/7) to just 3 of 13 on third down, OU has held opponents to a combined 5 of 29 in its two games this season to rank fifth in the country.

Colvin Leading at Corner

- Senior Aaron Colvin finds his name littered on the preseason watch lists: Bednarik, Lott IMPACT, Nagurski and Thorpe. He was also named a preseason Second-Team All-American and preseason All-Big 12 First Team honoree by Phil Steele.
- An All-Big 12 First Team selection by AP and the coaches in 2012, Colvin led the team with 11 pass breakups, finished second on the squad with four interceptions and was third on the team with 61 tackles (47 solo).
- The Owasso, Okla., native has played in 39 career games (26 starts) with the Sooners. He opened all 13 games at cornerback for OU in 2012 after starting 12 games at safety in 2011.
- He owns 179 career tackles (126 solo), 10.0 tackles for loss, four interceptions, 2.5 sacks, two fumble recoveries and 20 pass breakups.

Defensive TDs at 43 in Stoops Era

- Oklahoma has recorded 43 defensive touchdowns under Bob Stoops.
- Thirteen of those TDs have come via fumble return.
- The defense has scored at least one touchdown in all of Stoops' 14 seasons.

About the Special Teams

Oklahoma's special teams under Bob Stoops ...

- There have been 30 special teams touchdowns.
- Those 29 have come via five different kinds of plays -- punt returns, fake field goals, blocked punts, kickoff returns and a fake punt. Special teams also owns four safeties in that span.
- Oklahoma has returned eight kickoffs and 18 punts for touchdowns and has blocked 28 kicks.

Many Happy Returns

- Kickoff Returns -- 119 returns of 25 yards or more with eight touchdowns.

Hunnicuttt Through the Uprights

- Against West Virginia (9/7), Michael Hunnicutt hit a season-long 44-yard field goal in the first quarter, a 21-yarder in the second and a 32-yarder in the fourth. He's 5-6 this year.
- He is now 43 of 51 (.843) for his career.
- It was the 13th multi-field goal game of Hunnicutt's career and his third straight multi-FG game dating back to the Cotton Bowl.
- Hunnicutt's field goals give him 43 for his career, tied for fifth in the OU record book with Trey DiCarlo (2002-04).

Boomers from Barnett

- Jed Barnett, a transfer from Laney College, has averaged 44.0 yards per punt in 2013.
- Nine of his 12 punts have been fair caught and seven have landed inside the 20-yard line.
- Three of Barnett's punts have gone for at least 50 yards, including a career-long 54-yarder in the opener against ULM (8/31).

- As Bob Stoops enters his 15th year as head coach at Oklahoma, he has worked the entire time with President David Boren and Director of Athletics Joe Castiglione.
- It's the longest active pairing between an FBS president, athletics director and head football coach.

Best Program of the BCS Era

The Sept. 17, 2012, "Franchise Issue" of *ESPN The Magazine* sought to find the best program in the BCS era. Sooners fans will be pleased with the results as Oklahoma was chosen as the No. 1 team.



Top 5 Programs of the BCS Era

ESPN the Magazine created three major categories of FBS success (on-field success, off-field success, traditions of success), then split them into nine factors (see below). Oklahoma ranked near the top in almost every category:

- Strength of Schedule (No. 1) - Average strength of schedule since 2003.
- Stadium Edge (No. 2) - *SportsNation* poll results for game-day experience; home win percentage; differential between home and road win percentages.
- Title Track (No. 2) - National titles [since 1936, emphasizing BCS era]; BCS bowl bids and wins; league titles; years in final AP Top 25 poll and AP top 10.
- Head Coach (No. 3) - Tenure [CFB and NFL]; winning percentage; average turnover margin and average penalties per game [all since 2001].
- Player Success (No. 7) - NFL draft picks [weighted by round]; Heisman winners [all].
- Recruiting (No. 10) - Total ESPN 150 signees [since 2007].
- Football Revenue (No. 12) - 2010 figures, per U.S. Department of Education.
- Academics (No. 33) - *US News and World Report* ranking in 2012; Academic Progress Rate in 2010-11.
- NCAA Violations (Grade: B) - Grade based on severity of sanctions since 1998.



THE PROGRAM

- Oklahoma's all-time record stands at 833-310-53 (.719) in 119 seasons.
- Since WWII, OU leads the nation with 589 victories.
- The Sooners have captured seven national championships (1950, 1955, 1956, 1974, 1975, 1985, 2000).
- OU has 46 bowl appearances (No. 7 nationally) with 27 bowl victories (No. 4 nationally) and an all-time record of 27-18-1 (.598).
- OU has 44 conference championships, including eight Big 12 titles overall (no other school has more than three).
- Oklahoma is the only program in FBS history to have four coaches with 100 or more wins.
- With a 69-13 win over Florida A&M (9/8/12), Oklahoma became the first program in college football history to break the 32,000-mark in all-time points scored. No program has scored more points than OU.
- OU has 153 All-Americans and 73 consensus All-Americans, including NCAA career receptions leader Ryan Broyles in 2011.
- Under Stoops, OU has had 33 All-Americans, including 23 consensus. Of the 33 players, 15 were on offense, 16 on defense and two on special teams spanning 14 different positions.
- Oklahoma boasts five Heisman winners. Sooners have also won the Bednarik (1), Butkus (4), Camp (4), Lombardi (3), Maxwell (2), Nagurski (2), O'Brien (3), Outland (5), Tatupu (1), Thorpe (3) and Unitas (1).
- Sooner teams have gone undefeated 14 times in program history, the latest being in 2000.
- Oklahoma's 47-game win streak from 1953-57 is still the NCAA D-I record.
- Oklahoma has had 116 Academic All-Big 12 honorees under Stoops.
- The Sooners have gone 83-5 at home in Stoops' 15 seasons. In all, Oklahoma has won 81 percent of its home games since Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial opened in 1923.
- Oklahoma has played in front of 88 consecutive home sellouts - every game of Stoops' tenure.
- Including the six Sooners picked in the 2013 NFL Draft, OU has had 363 players picked all-time in the draft.
- Oklahoma has 43 first-round picks, including three No. 1 overall selections.
- In 2010, Sooners were chosen with three of the first four picks in the draft, with QB Sam Bradford at No. 1, DT Gerald McCoy at No. 3 and OT Trent Williams at No. 4.
- Bob Stoops' career average of 10.6 wins per year is tops among active FBS head coaches with at least 10 years of experience.
- Stoops is the only active head coach on the FBS level to have reached a bowl game in each of his first 14 seasons. Georgia's Mark Richt (12) comes in second.
- Of the 14 bowls, eight have been BCS bowl games and four have been for the BCS title.

- The Sooners are 83-5 on Owen Field under Stoops.
- OU is 72-5 when ranked and 11-0 when unranked at home.
- Oklahoma is 35-2 in non-conference games at home under Stoops and 48-3 in Big 12 games.
- OU is 50-0 under Stoops when scoring 40 points or more at home and 38-0 at home when allowing 10 points or fewer.

Streaks

- Oklahoma has wins over top 10 teams including No. 1 Nebraska (2000), No. 2 Texas Tech (2008) and No. 9 Iowa State (2002) during that time.
- From 2005-11, Oklahoma won 39 straight home games, a stadium record.
- The streak was the fifth-longest home win streak in the modern football era. OU has been sold out at home for every game of the Stoops era, a school-record of 86 consecutive games.
- Under Stoops, OU won its first 17 home games stretching almost over his first three seasons from 1999-01.
- The Sooners also had a 19-game streak under Stoops from 2002-04.

Margin of Victory

- The Sooners have posted 11 shutouts against incoming opponents, including three against Big 12 foes.
- Oklahoma's biggest wins are a 77-0 defeat of Texas A&M (11/8/03) and a 68-0 win over UTEP (9/14/02).
- OU's average margin of victory at home has been 22 points or higher six of the past seven seasons and 11 of 14 seasons under Stoops.
- OU's five losses at home in the last 14 seasons have come by a combined 35 points, an average of 7.0 points per game.
- Only two games have gone into overtime, a 37-30 win vs. Baylor (10/22/05) and a 51-48 triumph over Oklahoma State (11/24/12).

Attendance Lately

- OU's average attendance in 2012 was 103.8% of Memorial Stadium's official capacity.
- Only Oregon (106.5), Nebraska (105.5) and Texas A&M (105.4) had higher percentages than the Sooners.
- In 2012, Oklahoma ranked No. 13 nationally in average attendance at 85,243.

Record-Setting Attendance

- Oklahoma has drawn 6,708,703 fans for Bob Stoops' 88 home games (started in 1999) and all have been sold out.
- The current string of sellouts is the longest in school history, eclipsing a mark of 69 from 1971-84.
- A school-record 86,031 fans witnessed Oklahoma's home game against Notre Dame (10/27/12), the largest crowd ever to witness a sporting event in the state of Oklahoma.
- In 2012, Oklahoma fans set a record for average season attendance at 85,243. That broke the mark of 85,161 that was set last season.
- OU has exceeded the seating capacity of 82,112 at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium in 54 straight games.
- The top 10 seasons for home attendance at Oklahoma have been during Stoops' tenure as head coach.
- Of the top 10 crowds at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, all have come in the past six years.

Home Winning Percentage

Since the start of the 1999 season, Bob Stoops' first season at OU, Oklahoma is second nationally in home winning percentage at .943, holding a record of 82-5 over that span.

NORMAN, Okla. -- Trevor Knight rushed for 103 yards on 13 carries and threw three touchdown passes -- two to Jalen Saunders -- in his first start, and No. 16 Oklahoma beat ULM 34-0.

Oklahoma gave coach Bob Stoops his 150th career win, putting him seven behind Barry Switzer on the Sooners' career coaching wins list. Oklahoma is 5-0 under Stoops in August games and 14-1 in home openers.

The shutout was the 14th under Stoops and the first in a season opener since doing it in a 37-0 win vs. Tulsa (8/30/02).

Knight became the first Oklahoma quarterback to rush for 100 or more yards in a game since Jason White had 117 yards rushing against Kansas on Oct. 13, 2001. A redshirt freshman, Knight was the fourth freshman quarterback to start a season for Oklahoma in modern times, joining Steve Collins (1989), Eric Moore (1995) and Sam Bradford (2007).

ULM upset then-No. 8 Arkansas on the road to open the 2012 season, but the Warhawks didn't get untracked offensively against a revamped Oklahoma defense. The Warhawks crossed midfield only twice and recorded only nine first downs and 166 yards of offense.

NORMAN, Okla. -- A pounding rushing attack, and a relentless defense gave No. 16 Oklahoma a 16-7 win over West Virginia to open Big 12 play.

Brennan Clay had a career-high 170 yards rushing to lead the Sooner ground attack that went for 316 yards. Clay finished with 22 carries and topped his previous best of 157 yards rushing against Iowa State (11/3/12) and rushed for the most yardage by an OU player since DeMarco Murray had 208 yards vs. Utah State (9/4/10).

The No. 16 Sooners (2-0, 1-0 Big 12) scored the game's final 16 points after trailing 7-0 in the first quarter. Senior fullback Trey Millard caught a 1-yard touchdown and junior kicker Michael Hunnicutt tacked on three field goals.

The win was the ninth straight for the Sooners over Big 12 opponents and gave OU its 12th season starting 2-0 in the last 15 seasons under head coach Bob Stoops.
