OPENING KICK

- ▶ No. 19/17 Oklahoma plays its first road game of 2015 when it travels to face No. 23/23 Tennessee on Saturday at 5 p.m. CT. The game will be televised by ESPN and will air nationally on Westwood One Sports radio.
- ▶ The Sooners are coming off a 41-3 home win over Akron. They outgained the Zips 539-226 on the night and outscored them 35-3 in the second and third quarters.
- ▶ Tennessee amassed 604 yards of total offense (399 on the ground) in a 59-30 win over Bowling Green on Saturday in Nashville, Tenn. The Volunteers surrendered 557 yards of total offense (433 through the air).
- ▶ Saturday's game will mark just the second for OU in the Volunteer State. The Sooners posted a 24-3 win at Vanderbilt (Nashville) on Sept. 11, 1976 (39 years and 1 day from this Saturday's matchup).
- ▶ The Sooners are 47-6 in September under Stoops (have outscored their opponents by an average count of 42-16 in those games).

FIVE TOP STORYLINES

- ▶ OU owns a 2-1 record against Tennessee. The Sooners posted a 34-10 home win over the Volunteers last year (Sept. 13) behind 308 passing yards and two touchdowns (one throwing, one running) by **Trevor Knight**. The other meetings came in the 1939 Orange Bowl (17-0 Tennessee; was OU's first bowl appearance) and the 1968 Orange Bowl (26-24 Oklahoma).
- ▶ With a Neyland Stadium capacity of 102,455 (fifth largest in college football), Saturday's crowd will mark the largest to ever witness an Oklahoma football game. The Sooners' previous largest crowd was 96,009 (OU beat Texas 55-17 in 2011 at the Cotton Bowl in Dallas). The largest crowd to ever see the Sooners play a true road game was 88,119 (OU beat Ohio State 29-28 in 1977).
- ▶ OU head coach **Bob Stoops** is 5-4 against teams in the SEC at the time of competition and has won two straight (34-10 vs. Tennessee last year and 45-31 vs. Alabama in 2014 Sugar Bowl). Including former Big 12 Conference members Missouri and Texas A&M, Stoops is 24-7 against current SEC programs
- With new offensive coordinator **Lincoln Riley** calling the plays, OU racked up 439 passing yards Saturday against Akron, more than in any game last season. Riley spent the last five years as offensive coordinator at East Carolina, setting the Pirates' top five passing seasons of all-time. Last year, ECU ranked third nationally in passing offense (372 ypg) and fifth in total offense (533 ypg).

▶ OU is 11-4 in non-conference road games under Stoops and has won five straight such games dating back to 2009. Among the wins, OU has knocked off No. 22 Notre Dame in 2013 (35-21) and No. 5 Florida State in 2011 (23-13). The Sooners are 50-27 against AP top-25 teams under Stoops. Since he began coaching in Norman in 1999, that .649 winning percentage is third



In his OU debut, Baker Mayfield threw for 388 yards — a school record for a season opener — and three TDs while running for another in the Sooners' 41-3 win over Akron. He played less than three quarters.

best in the nation behind USC's .677 mark (44-21) and Ohio State's .653 percentage (49-26). OU is 13-9 on the road against AP top-25 teams under Stoops.

RECAPPING THE OPENER VS. AKRON

- ▶ Holding just a 3-0 lead until the 6-minute mark of the second quarter, the Oklahoma offense kicked into high gear the next 18 minutes against Akron on Saturday in an eventual 41-3 home win. The Sooners rattled off 35 points during the stretch to win their sixth consecutive season opener.
- ▶ Junior quarterback **Baker Mayfield**, who sat out last year and lost a year of eligibility after transferring from Texas Tech, made his OU debut a successful one with 388 passing yards and four touchdowns (three passing) without an interception in less than three quarters of work. His 388 yards through the air were the most by a Sooner in a season opener (**Sam Bradford** held the previous record of 363 yards against North Texas in 2007).
- ▶ 0U netted 100 rushing yards and was held to 3.0 yards per carry. Sophomore **Samaje Perine** led the Sooners with 33 yards on the ground on 11 carries and tallied his 22nd career rushing touchdown.
- ▶ Freshman running back **Joe Mixon** had quite the collegiate debut, catching three passes for 115 yards, including a 76-yard touchdown from Mayfield in the third quarter. It marked the longest reception by a freshman running back in OU history. Mixon also became the first OU running back since 2012 (**Trey Millard**) to record more than 100 yards receiving in a game.

▶ Ten Sooners caught at least one pass on the night, with six of those players recording the first reception(s) of their careers (Mixon, redshirt freshman **Mark**



Redshirt freshman Joe Mixon totaled 142 yards in his OU debut Saturday, including 115 yards on three catches (one for a TD).

Andrews, sophomore Jeffery Mead [first catch was a touchdown], junior Daniel Brooks and junior college transfers Jarvis Baxter and Dede Westbrook [grabbed one for a touchdown]). Thirteen Sooners logged at least one catch all of last season.

- ▶ The Oklahoma defense was stout all night, surrendering just 138 rushing yards and 88 passing yards for an average of only 3.2 yards per play. Akron's lone points followed an OU fumble on a punt that gave the Zips a short field.
- ► The Sooners forced eight three-and-outs on Akron's 16 possessions. The defense was paced by junior **Dominique Alexander's** 10 tackles and career-high 2.5 tackles for loss (one sack).
- ► Five newcomers made their first starts at the FBS level, including three freshmen: junior college receivers Baxter and Westbrook, redshirt freshman **Orlando Brown** (left tackle) and true freshmen **Dru Samia** (right tackle) and **P.J. Mbanasor** (cornerback). True freshman **Austin Seibert** handled OU's placekicking and punting duties.
- ▶ Seibert was sensational in his debut and became the first true freshman in OU history to start a season opener as both the placekicker and punter. He made both of his field goal attempts (35 and 41 yards), was perfect on his five extra point tries and averaged 49.7 yards on six punts with a long of 53 yards. Three of his punts went at least 50 yards.
- ▶ The game was played in front of a crowd of 85,370, which marked OU's 99th straight home sellout.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE

- ▶ **Butch Jones** (Ferris State, '90) is in his third season as head coach at Tennessee, owning a 13-13 overall record and a 5-11 mark in SEC play. Jones is in his ninth season as a head coach and sports a 63-40 record with additional stops at Central Michigan and Cincinnati.
- ▶ Tennessee defeated Bowling Green 59-30 Saturday in a neutral-site game at Nissan Stadium in Nashville, Tenn.
- ▶ The Volunteers racked up 399 rushing yards, their highest total since running for 406 yards against Vanderbilt in 1994. **Alvin Kamara** ran for 144 yards and two touchdowns, while **Jalen Hurd** added 123 yards and three scores. It was the first time since 2009 that UT had multiple 100-yard rushers in the same game.
- ► Kamara's 144 rushing yards were the most ever by a Vol playing in his first game. He was rated as Athlon Sports' No. 2 junior college running back and Lindy's SEC Newcomer of the Year entering the season.
- ▶ Junior quarterback **Joshua Dobbs**, who went 4-1 as a starter last season, completed 15 of 22 pass attempts against Bowling Green for 205 yards and two touchdowns. He also ran 12 times for 89 yards and a score.
- ▶ Tennessee played 15 true freshmen against Bowling Green. Last season, the Vols led the country by playing 23 true freshmen, including a school-record 21 in the 2014 season opener against Utah State.
- ▶ The Vols opened the 2015 season ranked No. 25 in the AP and Amway Coaches Top 25 Polls. It was the first time Tennessee opened the season ranked since starting at No. 18 in both polls in 2008.

LAST YEAR AGAINST THE VOLS

- ▶ In a game that was closer than the final score indicated, No. 4 Oklahoma downed unranked Tennessee 34-10 last year in Norman on Sept. 13. OU outgained the Vols 454-313 on the night and had 21 first downs to UT's 18.
- ▶ Then-sophomore quarterback **Trevor Knight** passed for 308 yards and a touchdown, and ran for another score. He was 20 for 33 with one interception while running for 17 yards on five carries.
- ▶ Sterling Shepard caught five passes for a game-high 109 yards while **Durron Neal** had career highs of seven receptions and 71 yards. **Samaje Perine** ran nine times for 67 yards and **Keith Ford** carried the ball 15 times for 56 yards and a score.
- ▶ With Tennessee driving, OU senior cornerback **Julian Wilson** iced the win with a 100-yard interception return with 10:57 left in the fourth quarter for the game's final tally of the night.
- ► Tennessee quarterback **Justin Worley** was 21 for 44 with two interceptions and a touchdown en route to a 201-yard performance through the air. **Jalen Hurd** carried the ball 14 times for 97 yards.

YOUTH IS SERVED ON O-LINE

- ▶ The Sooners are charged with the task of replacing three of five starters from an offensive line unit that led the nation by surrendering only nine sacks in 2014 and that paved the way for a rushing attack that led the Big 12 with 261.2 yards a contest. Gone are LT **Tyrus Thompson** (Minnesota Vikings, 6th round), LG **Adam Shead** and RT **Daryl Williams** (Carolina Panthers, 4th round). Returning starters are senior C **Ty Darlington** (15 career starts) and senior RG **Nila Kasitati** (14 career starts).
- ▶ Three OU offensive linemen made their first career starts Saturday against Akron and two of those three played in their first career games.
- ► For the first time in school history, OU started two freshmen at tackle. Redshirt freshman **Orlando Brown** started at left tackle and true freshman **Dru Samia** started on the right side. They became the ninth and 10th freshmen to start at tackle in OU history.
- ▶ Also making his first career start was sophomore left guard **Jonathan Alvarez**. Alvarez played in one game last season and that was the opener against Louisiana Tech.
- ▶ The Sooners surrendered just one sack on 43 pass plays against Akron. OU ball carriers averaged 3.0 yards per carry.

FIVE SOONERS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12

- ► Five OU players were named to the 2015 Preseason All-Big 12 Teams. Offensively, the Sooners were represented by sophomore RB **Samaje Perine**, senior WR **Sterling Shepard** and junior kick returner **Alex Ross**, while the defense saw senior OLB **Eric Striker** and junior CB **Zack Sanchez** recognized.
- ▶ The five selections tied OU with TCU for the second most in the league, trailing only Baylor's seven honorees. Oklahoma and Baylor were also the only teams to have multiple players chosen on both offense and defense.
- ▶ Perine led the Big 12 in rushing last season, totaling 1,713 yards, which placed him fifth on the OU all-time single-season chart. He also scored 21 touchdowns, a Big 12 single-season record for rushing touchdowns by a freshman.
- ▶ Shepard was a first-team All-Big 12 honoree last season for the first time in his career. The standout wide receiver racked up 970 receiving yards and five touchdowns on 51 catches in 2014, despite being hampered the last six games with an injury that limited his production. He totaled 911 receiving yards in OU's first seven games (130.1 average).
- ▶ Ross emerged last season as one of the most dynamic return men in the game. He tallied 718 kickoff return yards and two touchdowns on 23 attempts for an average of 31.2 yards per return. His two kick returns for touchdowns tied for second most in the country, while his average was third best in the nation.
- ▶ A unanimous first-team All-Big 12 selection in 2014, Striker posted a team-high 17.0 tackles for loss and 9.0 sacks to go along with 68 tackles, five pass breakups and two fumble recoveries a year ago. With 15.5 career sacks, Striker has more than any linebacker in OU history.
- ▶ Like Striker, Sanchez was also placed on the All-Big 12 First Team by the coaches and media last season. He led the team with six interceptions and eight pass breakups, and added 43 tackles. His six INTs ranked second in the Big 12 and 13th nationally.

PERINE BACK FOR MORE

- ▶ RB **Samaje Perine** became the first freshman in Big 12 history to lead the league in rushing, averaging 131.8 yards per game in 2014. That average ranked him eighth in the nation, as well.
- ▶ The 1,713 net rushing yards for Perine were sixth most by a freshman in FBS history and second most in Big 12 and 0U freshman annals, behind **Adrian Peterson's** 1,925 yards in 2004. Perine's total was fifth highest in a season in OU annals.
- ▶ Perine, who bench presses 440 pounds, tied for second in OU history with three 200-yard rushing games last year. He was one of six players, and the only freshman, to have three 200-yard games in 2014.
- ▶ Perine's 21 rushing touchdowns were the most ever in a season by a Big 12 freshman. He led the Big 12 in the category and the total ranked as the fourth most in a season by a Sooner.
- ▶ Against Kansas (11/22), Perine amassed an FBS-record 427 rushing yards and five touchdowns on 34 carries. The yardage ranked seventh all-time in NCAA history for all levels and divisions.

VAUNTED RUSHING ATTACK LOOKS EVEN DEEPER

- ▶ Oklahoma averaged 261.2 rushing yards per game in 2014, the highest total in the **Bob Stoops** era. It easily passed the previous Stoops-era standard of 223.9 yards per game set in 2013.
- ▶ The team's 6.1 yards per carry marked OU's most since Stoops arrived in 1999. Previously, the best under Stoops came in 2013 when the Sooners averaged 5.2 yards per rush.
- ▶ Compared to the 2013 season, OU improved in total rushing yards (+484), rushing yards per game (+37.3), yards per carry (+0.9) and runs of 10 or more yards (+10) in 2014.
- ▶ Oklahoma produced two of the six 500-yard FBS team rushing performances in 2014 as it ran for 510 yards against lowa State (11/1) and Kansas (11/22).
- ▶ As good as the Sooners were on the ground in 2014, they could be even better this year. OU welcomes back its top two ground gainers from last season in sophomore **Samaje Perine** (1,713 yards, 21 TDs) and junior **Alex Ross** (595 yards, 4 TDs), and will introduce redshirt freshman **Joe Mixon**. Mixon, who sat out last year due to a team suspension, was a five-star recruit out of Freedom High School in Oakley, Calif., after rushing for 1,704 yards and 23 touchdowns as a senior in 2013. Also new to the backfield is true freshman **Rodney Anderson**, who was rated as the No. 2 running back in the country last year by 247Sports.

RILEY RETURNS TO BIG 12 AS OU'S OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

▶ **Lincoln Riley** made his OU debut as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Saturday vs. Akron. The 32-year-old (he celebrated his birthday this past Saturday) from Muleshoe, Texas, is no stranger to the Big 12, having played quarterback at Texas Tech under **Mike Leach** and then serving seven years on the TTU staff (the Red Raiders played in bowl games all seven years and won five).

- ▶ Riley comes to Norman with the reputation as one of the brightest young coaches in the college game. He spent the last five seasons at East Carolina, where the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual records with their up-tempo, spread offensive scheme. His five squads own the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four positions for total offense in a season.
- ▶ Last season, ECU ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 yards per game) and ranked fifth in total offense (533.0 yards per game).
- ▶ The Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense in 2014. By comparison, OU has not reached that figure since recording 7,670 yards of total offense in 2008.
- ▶ Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

MIKE STOOPS GUIDES DEFENSE

- ▶ Oklahoma associate head coach and defensive coordinator **Mike Stoops** is in his fourth season on the staff after previously quiding the OU 'D' from 1999-03.
- ▶ Last year's Oklahoma defense ranked fourth nationally by allowing only 3.02 yards per carry. It was the lowest opponent average since OU permitted 2.80 yards per rush in 2009.
- ▶ Stoops' defenses have posted six shutouts, including five in his first stint in Norman.
- ▶ In his first OU stint, four of his five units finished No. 7 or better nationally in scoring defense and in the top 10 for total defense.
- ► From 2000-03, Stoops' defenses finished in the top 25 in pass defense and rush defense each year and in pass efficiency defense and turnovers twice.
- ▶ Stoops is the only coach to have an athlete win both the Nagurski and Thorpe awards in the same season, and it happened twice (Roy Williams in 2001 and Derrick Strait in 2003).

COOKS, REYNOLDS, SIMMONS JOIN COACHING STAFF

- ▶ New to the assistant coaching staff this season are defensive backs coach **Kerry Cooks**, defensive line coach **Diron Reynolds** and outside receivers coach **Dennis Simmons**.
- ▶ Cooks joined the OU staff after spending the past five seasons at Notre Dame. Last season, the Fighting Irish tied for 15th in the country with 16 interceptions. With Cooks serving as co-defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach in 2013, Notre Dame ranked 15th in passing yards allowed per game (198.2 ypg). Cooks also had coaching stops at Wisconsin, Minnesota, Western Illinois and Kansas State. He was an All-Big Ten selection as a defensive back at lowa in 1997 and was picked in the fifth round of the 1998 NFL Draft by the Minnesota Vikings.
- ▶ Reynolds spent last season at Stanford as assistant defensive line coach, helping the Cardinal rank third in the nation in total defense by permitting 282.4 yards per game, and fifth in sacks with 46. He preceded his time at Stanford by spending 12 seasons in the NFL. Most recently, Reynolds was the assistant defensive line coach for five seasons with the Minnesota Vikings, but also spent time with the Miami Dolphins and Indianapolis Colts.
- ▶ Simmons came to Norman after coaching outside receivers at Washington State for the past three seasons. Simmons is no stranger to the Sooners' new offense, learning the system with the Cougars and previously with **Mike Leach** at Texas Tech. In 2014, Washington State led all FBS schools in passing yards, averaging 477.7 yards per game. Simmons also has familiarity with **Lincoln Riley**, working with him at Texas Tech (2008-09) and East Carolina (2010-11).

NEW RESPONSIBILITIES FOR SOME RETURNING ASSISTANT COACHES

- ▶ Mike Stoops will once again serve as associate head coach and defensive coordinator this season but will switch from overseeing the safeties for the last two years to the outside linebackers in 2015.
- ▶ After 16 seasons as OU's running backs coach, **Cale Gundy** shifts to coaching the team's inside receivers while adding the title of assistant head coach.
- ▶ **Jay Boulware** spent his first two seasons coaching Oklahoma's tight ends and special teams. He will continue to coach special teams in year three, but has moved to running backs coach.
- ▶ Tim Kish has moved from assistant defensive coordinator and linebackers coach to inside linebackers coach.

EXPERIENCED INSIDE LINEBACKERS

- ▶ The Sooners return an experienced core of inside linebackers, with three players in the group each tallying more than 90 tackles in a season.
- ▶ **Dominique Alexander** and **Jordan Evans**, who each started all 13 games last year, paced 0U with 107 and 93 tackles, respectively, as sophomores.
- ▶ Alexander was a second-team All-Big 12 selection by the Associated Press last year and is on preseason watch lists this season for the Butkus, Nagurski and Rotary Lombardi Awards. Evans, an Academic All-Big 12 First Team honoree, is the son of **Scott Evans**, a three-time All-Big Eight defensive tackle for the Sooners (1988-90).
- ► Senior **Frank Shannon**, who was not enrolled at 0U last year, led the Sooners with 92 tackles in 2013. He started all 13 games and was an honorable mention All-Big 12 choice.
- ▶ The Alexander/Evans/Shannon trio has combined for 444 career tackles.

"ABOVE THE RIM" CLUB

► Seven wide receivers or tight ends on OU's 2015 roster are listed at 6-3 or taller, and all had yet to catch a pass on the college level prior to Saturday vs. Akron. Two of those targets who figure to see ample playing time this season are sophomore WR **Jeffery Mead** and redshirt freshman TE **Mark Andrews**, who both stand 6-5.

- ▶ The lanky 188-pound Mead caught two passes for 31 yards against Akron on Saturday, including an 11-yarder for a touchdown on his first career reception. Mead also stood out in OU's spring game, catching four passes for a game-high 93 yards.
- ▶ Andrews, who also experienced success in the Sooners' spring game with two catches for 56 yards, reeled in four balls for 50 yards against Akron.
- ▶ Other inviting targets because of their size are WR **Dahu Green** (6-4 true freshman), TE **Connor Knight** (6-4 redshirt junior), TE **Carson Meier** (6-5 redshirt freshman), WR **A.D. Miller** (6-3 true freshman) and WR **Dallis Todd** (6-3 redshirt freshman).

BREAKING DOWN THE SOONERS

- ▶ Oklahoma enters the 2015 season with 118 players on its roster:
 - 47 freshmen (31 true freshmen, 16 redshirt freshmen)
 - 31 sophomores (14 true sophomores, 17 third-year sophomores)
 - 25 juniors (13 true juniors, 12 fourth-year juniors)
 - 15 seniors (seven true seniors, eight fifth-year seniors)
- ▶ A total of 33 players started at least one game for the Sooners in 2014. Of those, 19 are 2015 returnees (58 percent).
- ▶ On Oklahoma's active roster, 11 players have started at least 10 games in their careers.
- ▶ OU returns 12 of its 22 regular starters from a year ago (six on offense and six on defense). In addition, the Sooners return their primary kick and punt returners from 2014, both long snappers and their kickoff specialist.
- ▶ The Sooners return 40 players who have earned letters during their OU careers.
- ▶ Here's how the Sooners break down geographically: Texas (50), Oklahoma (31), California (8), Florida (4), Louisiana (4), Canada (2), Georgia (2), Mississippi (2), Ohio (2), Alabama (1), Alaska (1), Arizona (1), Illinois (1), Kansas (1), Maryland (1), Missouri (1), New Jersey (1), New York (1), South Dakota (1), Tennessee (1), Utah (1) and Virginia (1).

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

- ▶ Oklahoma has spent more weeks ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll (101) all-time than any other program. Additionally, OU's 389 weeks in the AP's top five are more than any other school. The AP Poll was introduced in 1936.
- ▶ During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (607) and a better winning percentage (.762) than any other program.
- ▶ 0U is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 33,388 points (in 1,221 games). Nebraska ranks second with 32,112 points (in 1,304 games).

- ▶ No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 35. In addition, OU's 21 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.
- ▶ Since **Bob Stoops**' arrival in 1999, OU leads all Power Five conference programs in wins (169) and points scored (7,833).
- ▶ Only Alabama (9) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

SOONERS AND THE NFL

- ▶ As of Sept. 7, 34 former Sooners are on an NFL roster.
- ▶ Since **Bob Stoops**' arrival in 1999, 75 Sooners have been selected in the NFL Draft.
- ▶ In the last five seasons, 27 Sooners have been taken in the NFL Draft (the Big 12 school with the next highest total is Baylor with 17). Those 27 picks are the fifth most of any school over the last five years. Only Alabama (37), Florida State (37), LSU (33) and Georgia (28) have had more.
- ▶ OU has had at least four players selected in every NFL Draft since 2008. LSU is the only other school that can make that claim.
- ▶ Fifteen Sooners have been taken in the NFL Draft first round in the last five years. No other Big 12 school has had more than nine in that same span.

OU'S STRONG BOWL HISTORY

- ▶ Head coach **Bob Stoops** has taken the Sooners to a bowl game in all 16 of his seasons. The only schools with longer bowl streaks recognized by the NCAA are Virginia Tech (22), Georgia (18) and Georgia Tech (18).
- ▶ The Sooners' 28 bowl wins are tied for the third most in college football history with Georgia and Penn State. Only Alabama (34) and USC (33) have more.
- ▶ 0U is one of 15 schools to play in at least 40 bowl games. Among those 15 teams, Oklahoma has the fourth highest winning percentage at .594 (28-19-1).

OUICK KICKS

- ▶ Oklahoma was ranked No. 19 in both the Associated Press and Amway Coaches top 25 preseason polls, its lowest ranking in both polls to start a year since its national championship season of 2000. OU started at No. 19 in both polls that year, as well.
- ▶ The Sooners are looking for their 13th season of at least 10 wins under **Bob Stoops**. Oklahoma is the only FBS program to rack up 12 seasons of double-digit victories since 2000.
- ▶ As defensive coordinator at Florida from 1996-98, Stoops went 2-1 against Tennessee. In 1996, the fourth-ranked Gators won 35-29 in Knoxville over Peyton Manning and No. 2 Tennessee en route to the national championship. The next year in Gainesville, third-ranked UF won again, 33-20, over Manning and No. 4 UT. Stoops' lone loss to the Vols came in 1998 when the second-ranked Gators fell 20-17 in overtime at No. 6 Tennessee. UT went on to win the national title.

WINNING LEGACY

- ▶ Bob Stoops is the winningest coach in Oklahoma history with a 169-44 overall record. He ranks third at OU with his .793 career winning percentage.
- ▶ Won more games in his first 16 years than any college coach.
- ▶ Reached 100 wins in 122 games (tied for ninth fastest all-time pace).
- ▶ Has led the Sooners to a school-record 16 consecutive bowl berths.
- ► Since he took over at OU in 1999, has coached Sooners to more wins than any other Power Five program has accumulated during that time span.
- ► Has directed the Sooners to the second highest winning percentage of any Power Five program since 1999, trailing only Ohio State.
- ▶ Is the only coach in the BCS era to win a national championship and every BCS bowl game (Fiesta, Orange, Rose, Sugar).
- ▶ Under his direction, Oklahoma is one of only nine Power Five programs to average 10 wins per year over the last five seasons.
- ▶ Has 12 seasons of 10 or more wins, the most of any FBS coach since 2000.
- ► Has led OU to a 49-26 record against AP Top 25 foes since 2000.
- ▶ Owns a 91-8 home record, which included a school-record 39 game winning streak (ninth longest in college football history) and two 19-game strings.
- ▶ The Sooners are a combined 22-10 under Stoops against their two biggest rivals (10-6 against Texas and a 12-4 vs. Oklahoma State).

CONFERENCE SUPREMACY

- ▶ Stoops has coached OU to eight Big 12 championships, more than twice as many as any other school (Texas is next with three).
- ▶ Owns a 52-15 overall mark the last five-plus years and a 32-12 league record, both of which are the best of any Big 12 team during that span.
- ▶ Has guided the Sooners to more wins against AP Top 25 teams than any Big 12 team over the last five years. OU is the only program in the conference to own a winning record in such games (14-11).

TURNING OUT TALENT

- ▶ Stoops has produced 34 first-team All-Americans, two AP Players of the Year and 78 NFL Draft picks as OU's head coach.
- ► Stoops has coached two Heisman Trophy winners (Jason White in 2003 and Sam Bradford in 2008) and five Heisman finalists.
- ▶ Under his guidance, OU became the first program to produce two players who claimed the Thorpe and Nagurski Awards in the same season (Roy Williams in 2001 and Derrick Strait in 2003).
- ► Two different Sooners have claimed the following honors since he took over at OU: Nagurski Award (Roy Williams, Derrick Strait), Thorpe Award (Roy Williams, Derrick Strait) and Butkus Award (Rocky Calmus, Teddy Lehman).
- At least one of his OU players has earned each one of these accolades: the Bednarik Award, Lombardi Award, Walter Camp Award, Maxwell Award, Unitas Award, Outland Trophy, Wuerffel Trophy and the Mosi Tatupu Award.



OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project will bowl in the south end of the facility and is slated to be completed in time for the 2016 season.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- ▶ Gaylord Family Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.
- ▶ In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director **Bennie Owen** suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- ▶ The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- ▶ In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998) and its existing figure of 82,112 (2003)
- ▶ In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

CURRENT RENOVATION

- ▶ The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project will be constructed entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- ▶ The first phase of the building project will be completed prior to the 2016 season and will focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect will result in completing the south end zone seating bowl, a feature that will initially increase seating capacity to more than 84,000 seats.
- ▶ The seating bowl will feature an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure will feature 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons will benefit from two new clubs.
- ▶ Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility will be a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They will each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- ▶ The new building will allow for all student-athlete services to be moved to the ground floor. That space will include a new locker room, strength and conditioning room, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building will house all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- ▶ The weight room will nearly triple in size to 26,600 square feet and include a 70-yard indoor turfed speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also will grow substantially to nearly 10.000 square feet.
