OPENING KICK

► No. 14/13 Oklahoma opens its 2016 home season when it hosts the ULM Warhawks on Saturday at 6 p.m. CT at newly renovated Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium.

► Oklahoma is coming off a 33-23 loss to No. 15/13 Houston in the AdvoCare Texas Kickoff at NRG Stadium (home of the Houston Texans). **Baker Mayfield** registered his seventh 300-yard passing game as a Sooner (323 yards and two TDs), but the Sooners managed only 70 rushing yards.

► ULM, which won two games last year, posted a 38-21 home win over Southern on Saturday behind 208 passing yards (two TDs) and 150 rushing yards (one TD) from quarterback **Garrett Smith**. Running back **Ben Luckett** added 110 rushing yards and a score as the Warhawks registered a 533-376 total yardage advantage.

► Oklahoma is 74-15-4 in home openers at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium (16-1 under **Bob Stoops**) since it opened in 1923. OU has won 10 straight home openers (last such loss was in 2005 to TCU [17-10]).

► OU is 2-0 under Stoops in games following a season-opening loss. The Sooners bounced back from a 17-10 home defeat to TCU at the start of the 2005 season to beat Tulsa 31-15 at home. In 2009, OU lost 14-13 to BYU in Arlington, Texas, before responding to shut out Idaho State 64-0 in Norman.

► The Sooners are 4-0 all-time against Sun Belt teams. In addition to a 34-0 season-opening win over ULM in 2013, OU is 2-0 against Arkansas State and 1-0 vs. New Mexico State.

► OU has four players from the state of Louisiana on its roster: redshirt freshman offensive lineman **Cody Ford** (Pineville; Pineville HS), freshman receiver **Mykel Jones** (Patterson; Patterson HS), redshirt freshman linebacker **Arthur McGinnis** (New Orleans; Warren Easton HS) and freshman safety **Chanse Sylvie** (Shreveport; Calvary Academy). Ford (starting left guard) is the only one who played against Houston on Saturday.

► The Sooners are 49-7 (.875) in September under Stoops, outscoring teams by an average of 41 to 17. OU has won 19 of its last 21 September games dating back to 2009.

FIVE TOP STORYLINES

► Saturday's game will mark the first inside Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium since the south end of the venue was renovated in the offseason. Visible features of the \$160 million project this year include the bowling in of the south end zone, the addition of 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes, 1,976 club seats and an 8,500-square-foot video board that is the second largest in collegiate athletics. Capacity this season is 83,489.

► Oklahoma is 96-8 (.923) at home under **Bob Stoops** with all 104 of those games sellouts. It is the best home winning percentage among Power 5 schools during the time period (Ohio State is next at .876). OU has outscored its opponents by an average of 42-16 in those games.



Baker Mayfield ranks first in OU career completion percentage and second in career passing efficiency. Despite playing in only 14 games as a Sooner, he is also already tied for fourth in OU history in 300-yard passing games and ranks seventh in multiple categories (see below).

► The Sooners went 6-0 in Norman last season and averaged 47 points and 596 yards of total offense per game in the process (see chart to the right). It marked the 40th time in the history of Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium and 12th time under Stoops that OU went undefeated at home.

► Quarterback **Baker Mayfield** completed 68.6 percent of his pass attempts in OU's six home games last year for an average of 312.7 yards with 17 touchdowns and two interceptions. Mayfield amassed those numbers despite not seeing the field for 17 of OU's home possessions last year. He was pulled early because of comfortable leads against Akron, Texas Tech and Iowa State, and did not play in the second half versus TCU due to injury.

► Oklahoma has not lost back-to-back regular season games since Oct. 2 and 9, 1999, Stoops' debut season. OU has won 34 consecutive regular season games following a regular season loss.

HOME IS WHERE THE OFFENSE IS

Oklahoma enjoyed a perfect 6-0 home season in 2015, thanks largely to consistently high output from its offense.

RECAPPING THE LOSS TO HOUSTON (STATS RECAP ON PAGE 32)

► No. 3 Oklahoma scored on three of its first four possessions to take a 17-13 lead but was then held without a point on its next seven series in a 33-23 loss to No. 15 Houston in the AdvoCare Texas Kickoff in Houston, Texas.

► The Sooners scored a touchdown with 2:05 remaining in the fourth quarter, but a two-point conversion attempt that would have made it a one-possession game failed. Houston recovered OU's onside kick to ice the game.

► OU's **Baker Mayfield** completed his first 11 pass attempts and finished 24 of 33 (73 percent) for 323 yards and two touchdowns, and the Sooners outgained Houston 6.6 yards per play to 5.1. But the Cougars controlled the clock (35:06 time of possession to 24:54) in handing OU its first season-opening loss since 2009.

► Houston outgained OU by just 17 yards (410 to 393), but the Sooners had two turnovers to UH's one. The Cougars also returned a 53-yard field goal try 100 yards for a touchdown.

► OU running back **Joe Mixon** accounted for 181 all-purpose yards. He ran for 40 yards on six carries and scored the game's first points on a 32-yard burst on the Sooners' first possession, and added 77 receiving yards on five catches (long of 60), as well as 64 yards on three kickoff returns (long of 25).

► Wide receiver **Dede Westbrook** caught a team-high eight passes for 70 yards, while **Mark Andrews** hauled in the only two touchdown catches of the game (64 and 25 yards). Andrews finished with three receptions for a team-high 94 yards.

► Redshirt juniors **Will Johnson** and **Ogbonnia Okoronkwo** paced OU with 10 and nine tackles respectively, both individual career highs. Johnson also recovered a fumble and Okoronkwo registered a pair of tackles for loss, one of them a sack.

► Houston quarterback **Greg Ward Jr.** completed 23 of 40 pass attempts (58 percent) for 321 yards and two TDs. OU held him to one yard rushing on 18 official carries (recorded two sacks).

SCOUTING ULM

► ULM is led by first-year head coach **Matt Viator**, who took over after a successful 10-year stint at McNeese State. Viator posted a winning percentage of .703 (79-36) at McNeese and tied for the program record in all-time wins with 79. He took the Cowboys to the FCS playoffs five times in his 10 seasons.

► The Warhawks went 2-11 in 2015 and posted a 1-7 mark in Sun Belt play that saw them finish in last place in the conference.

► ULM opened the 2016 season with a 38-21 home win over Southern on Saturday. The Warhawks piled up 533 yards of total offense, 325 of which came on the ground (7.1 yards per carry).

► The Warhawks return quarterback **Garrett Smith** for the 2016 season. Smith threw for 2,033 yards and 17 scores in 10 starts a year ago as a redshirt freshman and opened with 208 yards and a pair of scores on 20-of-33 passing against Southern. He also ran for 150 yards and a touchdown on 14 carries (10.7 yards per carry).

► Redshirt sophomore running back **Ben Luckett** also topped the 100-yard rushing mark against Southern. He carried the ball 18 times for 110 yards (6.1 ypc) and scored a touchdown. Luckett rushed for 509 yards on 94 attempts in 2015.

► Seven different Warhawks caught passes for ULM against Southern. Senior wide receiver **Ajalen Holley**, who was named to the preseason All-Sun Belt Second Team, led ULM with five grabs for 48 yards.

► ULM was disruptive on defense against Southern, recording 4.0 sacks and 7.0 tackles for loss while allowing just 376 total yards, only 137 of which came through the air. Sophomore linebacker **David Griffith** and senior safety **Tre' Hunter** led the team in tackles with 14 and 10, respectively. Each also recorded a sack. Hunter was a preseason All-Sun Belt Second Team pick.

SERIES WITH THE WARHAWKS

► In OU's lone all-time meeting against ULM, quarterback **Trevor Knight** rushed for 103 yards on 13 carries and threw three touchdown passes – two to **Jalen Saunders** – in his first career start, and No. 16 Oklahoma beat the Warhawks 34-0 in the 2013 season opener in Norman.

► OU rushed for 305 yards, with tailbacks **Damien Williams**, **Brennan Clay** and **Roy Finch** contributing 66, 43 and 42 yards, respectively. The Warhawks reached the Oklahoma 23 midway through the first quarter, but an offensive pass interference penalty took them out of scoring range. ULM didn't cross midfield again until two minutes into the fourth quarter. OU held ULM quarterback **Kolton Browning**, the preseason Sun Belt Offensive Player of the Year, to 128 yards passing.

► Current OU seniors **Matt Dimon**, **Ahmad Thomas** and **Jordan Wade** all made their Sooner debuts in the contest.

SOONERS DOMINANT AT HOME UNDER STOOPS

► The Sooners are 96-8 (.923) at home under **Bob Stoops** and have outscored their opponents 4,183-1,545 (42-16 average) in those games. Included was a school record 39-game home winning streak, as well as a pair of 19-game strings. The .923 home

winning percentage is the best among Power 5 schools over the last 17 years.

► OU owns a 40-2 (.952) home non-conference record under Stoops and has outscored those opponents by an average margin of 45-14. The Sooners' only two home non-conference losses came to TCU in 2005 (17-10) and Notre Dame in 2012 (30-13).

► Oklahoma is 452-105-22 (.798) all-time at home and 380-84-15 (.807) at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium.

MARK ANDREWS: TOUCHDOWN MACHINE

► As a redshirt freshman last year, receiver **Mark Andrews** scored seven touchdowns on his 19 receptions (37 percent TD rate). That TD-to-catch ratio actually increased after the loss to Houston on Saturday, as Andrews registered two more scoring grabs (64 and 25 yards) on three total receptions (team-high and individual career-high 94 total yards) against the Cougars.

► The 6-5, 250-pounder from Scottsdale, Ariz., now has nine TDs on 22 career catches (41% TD rate), which equates to 2.5 points per total reception.

► Andrews' nine TD receptions are the most in OU history through the first 14 games of a career.

PERINE ON PACE TO SHATTER OU CAREER RUSHING RECORD

► After a stellar season that saw a continuation of his bruising, powerful style, RB **Samaje Perine** picked up third-team All-America honors last year and was selected to the All-Big 12 First Team. The Pflugerville, Texas, product racked up 1,713 rushing yards as a freshman (6.5 per carry) and 1,349 more as a sophomore last season (6.0 per carry), to give him 3,062 for his career. With 31 more yards against Houston on Saturday (on six carries), Perine already ranks 10th in Oklahoma history with 3,093 career rushing yards and is just 1,025 yards shy of **Billy Sims'** school record of 4,118 yards.

► Perine's 1,713 net rushing yards in 2014 were sixth most by a freshman in FBS history and second most in Big 12 and OU freshman annals, behind **Adrian Peterson's** 1,925 yards in 2004. Perine's total was fifth highest in a season in OU history, and he became the first freshman lead the Big 12 in rushing yards per game (131.8). Against Kansas that season, Perine amassed an FBS-record 427 rushing yards and five touchdowns on 34 carries. The record still stands.

► Only six Sooners during the 17-year **Bob Stoops** era have rushed for 2,000 career yards and only four have gotten to 3,000, and Perine reached both benchmarks faster than any of them. He reached the 2,000-yard mark Oct. 3 last year against West Virginia in only 326 career carries, faster than current NFL stars **DeMarco Murray** (342) and Peterson (365). He got to 3,000 yards Nov. 28 at Oklahoma State on his 472nd carry, bettering Peterson's mark of 550 carries. For his career, Perine is averaging a stout 6.3 yards per rush.

LOOKING BACK AT 2015

► Oklahoma finished the 2015 campaign with an 11-2 record, an outright Big 12 title (8-1 league mark) and a berth in the College Football Playoff (lost to No. 1-ranked Clemson as the No. 4 seed after holding a halftime lead). The 11 wins tied as OU's most in the last five years and resulted in a No. 5 ranking in the final AP poll.

► The Sooners led the country in average scoring margin (+21.5) and boasted the second-best combined ranking (32) in scoring offense and scoring defense among Power 5 teams. They finished the year ranked No. 4 in scoring offense (43.5 ppg) and No. 28 in scoring defense (22.0 ppg). Ohio State had a combined ranking of 30 (No. 28 in scoring offense, No. 2 in scoring defense) to lead Power 5 programs.

► Oklahoma is the highest scoring football program of all-time, and only two Sooner teams ever averaged more points than their 43.5 per game last season. OU accounted for more than 500 yards of offense in each of the final seven regular season games, and three of the top five single-game yardage totals of the 17-year **Bob Stoops** era were recorded last year (including the top figure of 773 vs. Tulsa).

► In the season's first six games, Oklahoma averaged 158.8 rushing yards on 3.8 yards per carry. Over the last six regular season outings, the Sooners averaged 311.2 rushing yards on 6.4 yards per attempt (most per carry in the nation during the stretch). Meanwhile, OU allowed only 128.8 rushing yards (3.5 yards per carry) over those final six games.

► Over the last seven games of the regular season (all wins), OU outscored its opponents by 228 points (an average of 32.6) and outgained them by an average of 251.8 yards.

► Oklahoma led the Big 12 with nine first-team all-conference selections (five offensive and four defensive) and landed six more on the second team. Three more were honorable mention All-Big 12 picks. Stoops was named Big 12 Coach of the Year for the fifth time, quarterback **Baker Mayfield** was named Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year and wide receiver **Dede Westbrook** was named Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year.

► Mayfield (Burlsworth Trophy) and center **Ty Darlington** (William V. Campbell Trophy, Wuerffel Trophy and Bobby Bowden Award) were national award winners. First-year OU offensive coordinator **Lincoln Riley** was named the Broyles Award winner.

WELCOME BACK

► Not including specialists, the Sooners returned 13 players who started at least five games last year (seven on offense, six on defense). Eleven other position players who started at least one game a year ago are also back. OU returned its placekicker, punter and both long snappers, as well.

► The Sooners returned their statistical leaders in passing yards (**Baker Mayfield**), rushing yards (**Samaje Perine**), total offense (Mayfield), all-purpose yards (Perine) and scoring (**Austin Seibert**). Four of the program's top five rushers are back in the fold (including the top three), as are 13 of the 17 players who caught at least one pass last year.

LOOKING AT OU'S OFFENSE

► Oklahoma welcomed back the bulk of its offensive statistical production from 2015, returning 92.1 percent of its total offense, 92.4 percent of its passing yards, 91.7 percent of its rushing yards, 53.6 percent of its receiving yards and 81.3 percent of its scoring. The offense is under the direction of second-year coordinator **Lincoln Riley**, winner of the 2015 Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach. Riley turned 33 this Monday.

► Redshirt-junior **Baker Mayfield** is back under center after a stellar first season in Norman. The Texas Tech transfer finished fourth in Heisman Trophy voting and was named national player of the year by Sporting News after completing 68.1 percent of his passes for 3,700 yards and 36 touchdowns against only seven interceptions. He ranked third nationally in passing efficiency rating (173.3), third in yards per pass attempt (9.37), fourth in completion percentage, sixth in points responsible for (258) and sixth in passing TDs.

► Two-time All-Big 12 First Team performer **Samaje Perine** headlines a rushing attack that returned 31 of OU's 32 touchdowns on the ground from 2015. Now a junior, Perine ran for 1,349 yards (103.8 per game) and a Big 12-high 16 scores last year. His nifty 6.0 yards per carry weren't even tops on the team. That honor went to **Joe Mixon**, who rushed for 6.7 yards per attempt. Mixon, a sophomore this year, netted 753 rushing yards (57.9 per game), ran for seven TDs and caught four more. Mayfield was no slouch with his legs, either, totaling 405 rushing yards (31.2 per contest) and seven scores on the year. Senior **Daniel Brooks** (150 yards; 5.4 per carry) also returns. Redshirt freshman **Rodney Anderson**, who missed the final 11 games last year due to a leg injury, was recently ruled out for the 2016 season with a neck injury.

► OU lost two of its top three receivers to the NFL in **Sterling Shepard**, an ESPN first-team All-American last year, and **Durron Neal**. Shepard finished his career ranked second in OU history in receptions (233) and receiving yards (3,482), and third in touchdown receptions (26) and 100-yard receiving games (12). Last year he led the Sooners with 86 catches for 1,288 yards (99.1 per game) and 11 touchdowns. Neal ranked third on the squad with 44 catches and 559 yards (43.0 per game). Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year **Dede Westbrook** is the prime candidate to step into the leading role in 2016, ranking second on the team last year in receptions (46) and yards (743; 57.2 average). He led OU with eight catches against Houston on Saturday. Sophomore **Mark Andrews** is also expected to be targeted more often after a strong opening year that saw him score seven TDs on his 19 receptions. He added two more scores on three catches Saturday.

► The Sooners return three of their starting offensive linemen from last year, but the two they lost (**Ty Darlington** and **Nila Kasitati**) earned All-Big 12 First Team honors last season. **Orlando Brown** (Sporting News freshman All-American; 13 starts) and **Dru Samia** (nine starts), both freshmen last year, were the starters at left and right tackle, respectively. Also back is junior **Jonathan Alvarez**, who started 10 games (nine at left guard) and has moved to center. Redshirt freshman **Cody Ford** and redshirt sophomore **Alex Dalton** started at left and right guard, respectively, against Houston.

LOOKING AT OU'S DEFENSE

► OU had more to replace on defense than it did on offense, returning 55.5 percent of its tackle production, 43.9 percent of its tackles for loss, 47.5 percent of its sacks, 50.0 percent of its interceptions and 57.1 percent of its fumble recoveries. Under the tutelage of coordinator **Mike Stoops**, last year's unit led the Big 12 in total defense (364.5 ypg), scoring defense (22.0 ppg), passing defense (202.8 ypg), pass efficiency defense (108.5) and sacks (3.08 per game). OU also finished second in the league in rushing defense (161.7 ypg) and interceptions (1.5 per game).

► Four of the five starters gone from last year earned All-Big 12 First Team honors (LB **Dominique Alexander**, CB **Zack Sanchez**, LB **Eric Striker** and DE **Charles Tapper**). Three of OU's returning defensive starters earned All-Big 12 Second Team acclaim (senior LB **Jordan Evans**, senior S **Ahmad Thomas** and junior CB **Jordan Thomas**).

► OU took its biggest hit at linebacker with the departures of Alexander (team-high 103 tackles), Striker (67 tackles, team highs of 19.0 tackles for loss and 7.5 sacks) and **Devante Bond** (43 tackles, 7.0 tackles for loss).

► Evans is OU's top returnee in tackles (ranked second on team with 83), while Ahmad Thomas (75) and junior S **Steven Parker** (60) ranked third and fifth on the squad. Jordan Thomas registered five interceptions last year to lead returning players, and junior DL **Charles Walker** recorded 10.0 tackles for loss and 6.0 sacks to pace the returnees.

LOOKING AT OU'S SPECIAL TEAMS

► **Austin Seibert** locked up both the kicking and punting duties a year ago as true freshman and was rock solid for OU in both roles. He punted 57 times for an average of 42.0 yards, with 11 going longer than 50 yards, to earn All-Big 12 Second Team honors. Seibert was an expert in hang time and placement, as he forced 30 fair catches and had 23 punts downed inside the 20-yard line. OU led the nation by allowing just 1.1 yards per punt return on the season. As a placekicker, he made 18 of 23 field

goal attempts and 70 of 72 PATs. Seibert also added kickoffs to his list of duties against Houston on Saturday.

► Oklahoma is replacing one of its best kick returners in program history with the departure of **Alex Ross** to Missouri as a graduate transfer. Ross was a second-team All-American two years ago when he averaged 31.2 yards per return and scored two touchdowns. **Joe Mixon** and **Daniel Brooks** were OU's return men against Houston on Saturday. Mixon returned three kickoffs for a total of 64 yards in the game. Both he and Brooks are explosive athletes who can make game-changing plays in the return game, but are also veterans who can be trusted to secure the football.

► The Sooners' punt return position was in question after the graduation of **Sterling Shepard**, who was responsible for 19 of the team's 22 returns last year. **Jarvis Baxter** was OU's primary deep man against Houston, but **Michiah Quick** was the only Sooner who logged a return in the game (10 yards).

THIBODEAUX HIRED AS DEFENSIVE LINE COACH

Bob Stoops looked to one of his former players to fill a vacant defensive line coach position last winter. He hired former OU All-Big 12 defensive end **Calvin Thibodeaux** on Feb. 24, replacing Diron Reynolds.

Thibodeaux (pronounced TIB-uh-doe) returned to OU after serving the last five seasons as an assistant coach at Kansas (2015; defensive line), Tulsa (2012-14; defensive tackles) and Dartmouth (2011; defensive line). He was also the defensive line coach at Navarro Junior College in 2010 and served as a defensive graduate assistant at Houston during the 2008 and '09 seasons.

Thibodeaux played at OU from the 2002 through 2006 seasons, helping the Sooners win three Big 12 championships and make appearances in the Rose, Sugar (BCS Championship), Orange (BCS Championship), Holiday and Fiesta Bowls, respectively. He was limited to five games due to injury in 2004 and received a medical hardship. He finished his OU career with 90 tackles, 28.5 tackles for loss and 13.0 sacks. He was a second-team All-Big 12 pick in 2005, logging 44 tackles, 17 tackles for loss and a league-high 10.0 sacks, sixth most in school history.

BEDENBAUGH, COOKS PROMOTED

Assistant coaches **Bill Bedenbaugh** and **Kerry Cooks** were promoted to assistant coordinator positions by head coach **Bob Stoops** in July. Bedenbaugh (pronounced BEE-din-bo) is now assistant offensive coordinator and offensive line coach, while Cooks is now assistant defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach. Stoops said the title changes will not affect the Sooners' play-calling responsibilities of associate head coach and defensive coordinator **Mike Stoops** and offensive coordinator **Lincoln Riley**.

SOONERS HAVE DOMINATED BIG 12 ERA

► Oklahoma's performance in the Big 12 Conference since **Bob Stoops** took over as head coach in 1999 has been nothing short of dominant. The Sooners have won nine Big 12 titles in Stoops' 17 seasons, with no other program during that span winning more than two.

► Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed nine league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each).

► OU owns a league-best 112-29 (.794) record in regular season Big 12 games during the Stoops era. Texas ranks second with a 101-40 (.716) record and is followed by TCU (21-15; .583), Kansas State (78-63; .553), Oklahoma State (76-65; .539), Texas Tech (71-70; .504), West Virginia (15-21; .417), Baylor (47-94; .333), Iowa State (41-100; .291) and Kansas (32-109; .227).

OU NO. 2 IN AP'S ALL-TIME RANKING

► The Associated Press unveiled its all-time top-25 on Aug. 2 and the Sooners were slotted in the No. 2 spot behind Ohio State. According to the AP, its formula for determining its all-time ranking counted poll appearances (one point) to mark consistency, No. 1 rankings (one point) to acknowledge elite programs, and gave a bonus for AP championships (10 points). Ohio State, which has five national titles, accumulated 1,112 points while Oklahoma, which has won seven national championships, racked up 1,055 points. Joining the Sooners and Buckeyes in the top 10 were Notre Dame (1,042 points), Alabama (933), Southern California (974), Nebraska (901), Michigan (894), Texas (822), Florida State (714) and Florida (674).

► Oklahoma hosts Ohio State on Sept. 17. It will mark the third meeting between the programs and first since 1983.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (617) and a better winning percentage (.762) than any other program.

► OU is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 33,936 points (in 1,234 games).

► No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 36. In addition, OU's 22 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.

► Since **Bob Stoops'** arrival in 1999, OU leads all Power Five conference programs in wins (179) and points scored (8,364).

► Only Ohio State (105) has been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll more weeks than Oklahoma (101). OU's 391 weeks in the AP's top five are more than any other school. The AP Poll was introduced in 1936.

► Only Alabama (9) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

EXTRA POINTS

► Oklahoma is 50-4 (.926) all-time under Stoops against unranked non-conference teams and has won 26 straight such games (last loss was at UCLA in 2005).

► **Baker Mayfield** has thrown 38 touchdown passes as a Sooner, tied for the most by a player in the first 14 games of an OU career. **Josh Heupel** also threw 38 in his first 14 games, while **Sam Bradford** threw 36. Mayfield and Heupel also rank first at OU with their 45 TDs accounted for through their first 14 games (38 passing and 7 rushing each).

► The Sooners are looking for their 14th season of at least 10 wins under Bob Stoops. Oklahoma is the only FBS program to rack up 13 seasons of double-digit victories since 2000.

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and the second-largest collegiate video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.
- In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director **Bennie Owen** suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and its existing figure of 83,489 (2016).
- In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

CURRENT RENOVATION

- The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project is being carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- The first phase of the building project will be completed prior to this week's home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that has initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.
- The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons will benefit from two new clubs.
- Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They will each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- The new building will allow for all student-athlete services to be moved to the ground floor. That space, to be completed in spring 2017, will include a new locker room, strength and conditioning room, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building will house all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- The weight room will nearly triple in size to 26,600 square feet and include a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also will grow substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.

- ▶ OU is a combined 23-11 under Stoops against their two biggest rivals (13-4 vs. Oklahoma State and 10-7 against Texas).

CONFERENCE SUPREMACY

- ▶ Stoops has coached OU to nine Big 12 championships. No other program has won more than two Big 12 titles in his 17 seasons.
- ▶ Owns a 62-18 overall mark since 2010 and a 40-13 league record, both of which are the best of any Big 12 team during that span.
- ▶ Has guided the Sooners to more wins against AP Top 25 teams than any Big 12 program since 2010. OU is the only program in the conference with a winning record in such games (19-13).

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

- ▶ Stoops has produced 36 first-team All-Americans, two AP Players of the Year and 79 NFL Draft picks as OU's head coach.
- ▶ Stoops has coached two Heisman Trophy winners (Jason White in 2003 and Sam Bradford in 2008) and five Heisman finalists.
- ▶ Two different Sooners have claimed the following honors since he took over at OU: Nagurski Award (Roy Williams, Derrick Strait), Thorpe Award (Roy Williams, Derrick Strait) and Butkus Award (Rocky Calmus, Teddy Lehman).
- ▶ At least one of his OU players has earned each one of these accolades: the Bednarik Award, Lombardi Award, Walter Camp Award, Maxwell Award, Unitas Award, Outland Trophy, Burlsworth Trophy, Campbell Trophy, Wuerffel Trophy and the Mosi Tatupu Award.
