OPENING KICK

► In one of the most anticipated regular season games of the Bob Stoops era, No. 14/14 Oklahoma hosts No. 3/4 Ohio State on Saturday at 6:30 p.m. CT at newly renovated Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium.

► The Sooners are coming off a 59-17 win over ULM in their home opener on Saturday. QB **Baker Mayfield** completed 14 of 20 passes for 244 yards and three touchdowns in one half of work, while RBs **Joe Mixon** (117), **Abdul Adams** (91) and **Samaje Perine** (58, two TDs) combined for 266 rushing yards. OU outgained ULM 640-350 on the night in front of the largest crowd to ever watch a sporting event in Oklahoma (87,037).

► In a game that included a lightning delay and second-half rainstorm, Ohio State dealt Tulsa a 48-3 defeat Saturday at Ohio Stadium. The Buckeyes capitalized on six Golden Hurricane turnovers and outgained TU, 417 yards to 188. QB **J.T. Barrett** was 14 for 22 passing for 149 yards and no touchdowns. OSU ran for 268 yards on the day (5.6 average) and four TDs. Up 6-3, the Buckeyes returned two interceptions for scores in the final 3:02 of the first half to lead 20-3.

► Ohio State is the highest ranked opponent to come to Norman since No. 2 Texas Tech departed Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium with a 65-21 loss in 2008. The other top-three AP team to come to Norman during the Stoops era was No. 1 Nebraska in 2000. The Sooners won that game 31-14 en route to a 13-0 record and national championship in Stoops' second season.

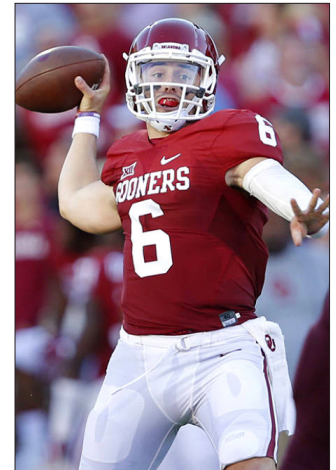
► Oklahoma is 41-2 (.953) at home under Stoops against non-conference opponents, winning the last seven (46-15 average score) and 25 of the last 26.

► OU is 132-77-5 (.629) all-time in top-25 matchups, with a 50-24 (.677) record under Stoops. When OU is the lower ranked team in such matchups, OU is 33-39-2 (.459) all-time and 11-11 under Stoops.

► The Sooners are 1-1 all-time against Ohio State and 60-44-3 against teams currently in the Big Ten. Most of those games occurred against Nebraska when Oklahoma and the Huskers were intraleague foes (OU is 45-38-3 against NU). The Sooners' last regular season game against a team in the Big Ten at the time of competition was versus Northwestern in 1997 at Soldier Field in Chicago (Northwestern won 24-0). Stoops is 7-2 against teams currently in the Big Ten (6-2 vs. Nebraska, 1-0 vs. Iowa).

► OU has three players from the state of Ohio on its roster: junior line-backer **Emmanuel Beal** (Reynoldsburg; Everest HS), redshirt sophomore offensive lineman **Alex Dalton** (Troy; Troy HS), and redshirt senior offensive lineman **Sam Grant** (North Royalton; St. Edward HS). Beal has nine tackles on the season while Dalton started at right guard against Houston in OU's opener.

► The Sooners are 50-7 (.877) in September under Stoops, outscoring teams by an average of 42 to 17. OU has won 20 of its last 22 September games dating back to 2009.



Baker Mayfield ranks first in OU career completion percentage (.685) and second in career passing efficiency (175.61); Sam Bradford ranks first at 175.62). He holds the school record for touchdown passes in his first 15 games (41), and has five TD passes without an interception this year.

FIVE TOP STORYLINES

► Saturday's game will feature the top two programs in the Associated Press' all-time top 25 that was revealed on Aug. 2. Ohio State was slotted No. 1 and Oklahoma No. 2. According to the AP, its formula for determining its all-time ranking counted poll appearances (one point) to mark consistency, No. 1 rankings (one point) to acknowledge elite programs, and gave a bonus for AP championships (10 points). Ohio State, which has five national titles, accumulated 1,112 points while Oklahoma, which has won seven national championships, racked up 1,055 points. Joining the Sooners and Buckeyes in the top 10 were Notre Dame (1,042 points), Alabama (933), Southern California (974), Nebraska (901), Michigan (894), Texas (822), Florida State (714) and Florida (674).

► Oklahoma is 97-8 (.924) at home under **Bob Stoops** with all 105 of those games sellouts. It is the best home winning percentage among Power 5 schools during the time period (Ohio State is next at .877). OU has outscored its foes by an average of 42-16 in those games.

► Stoops hails from Youngstown, Ohio, and Saturday's game will mark the first for him against Ohio State since his time at the University of Iowa in the 1970s and '80s. Stoops went 0-2 against the Buckeyes as a player (lost in 1979 and '80; the programs did not meet in 1981 or '82) and 2-3 after graduating. The Hawkeyes beat OSU in 1983 and lost in 1984 while Stoops was a graduate assistant, and went 1-2 against the Buckeyes when Stoops was an Iowa volunteer coach (lost in 1985 and '86, won in 1987). Saturday's game will mark the fifth for OU under Stoops against a team from Ohio. The Sooners beat Bowling Green in 2004 (40-24 in Norman), Cincinnati in 2008 (52-26 in Norman) and 2010 (31-29 in Cincinnati), and Akron in 2015 (41-3 in Norman). OU defensive coordinator **Mike Stoops** is also from Youngstown, Ohio, while inside linebackers coach **Tim Kish** hails from Westerville, Ohio.

► Since **Lincoln Riley** was named offensive coordinator prior to the 2015 season, OU is 7-0 at home and has averaged 49 points and 602 yards of total offense per game in the process (see chart on top right of this page).

► Quarterback **Baker Mayfield** has completed 68.8 percent of his pass attempts in his seven home games as a Sooner for an average of 302.9 yards with 20 touchdowns and two interceptions (10-to-1 ratio). He has amassed those numbers despite not seeing the field for 24 of OU's home possessions during the stretch. He has been pulled early in four games because of comfortable leads (did not play in the second half Saturday against ULM), and missed the second half versus TCU last year due to injury.

RECAPPING THE WIN OVER ULM (STATS RECAP ON PAGE 33)

► In the first game at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium since its offseason renovation, No. 14 Oklahoma scored touchdowns on its first four possessions and on six of its first eight in a 59-17 home win over ULM on Saturday. The Sooners led 42-0 at halftime on the strength of 459 total yards, and played reserves much of the second half.

► Quarterback **Baker Mayfield** did not play after halftime, but still racked up 244 yards on 14 of 20 passing without an interception. He threw TDs to **Mark Andrews** (39 yards), **Dimitri Flowers** (8 yards) and **Nick Basquine** (62 yards). The catch for Basquine was the first of his career.

► **Joe Mixon** rushed for 117 yards on 13 carries (9.0 average) – his third career 100-yard outing – and **Samaje Perine** added 58 yards and two TDs on 10 carries (5.8 average). Neither played in the second half. Receiver **Jarvis Baxter** took a reverse 40 yards for a second-quarter score, and true freshman **Abdul Adams** made his collegiate debut in the second half, finishing with 91 yards on 18 rushes (5.1 average).

► **Austin Kendall**, who became OU's first true freshman to play at QB since **Keith Nichol** in 2007, directed the Sooners' offense the entire second half and completed 12 of 15 passes for 108 yards. He threw TDs to **A.D. Miller** (3 yards; first of Miller's career) and **Jeffery Mead** (6 yards; second of Mead's career).

► Senior linebacker **Jordan Evans** paced the Sooners with 10 tackles, while redshirt freshman **Neville Gallimore** added eight, including a sack and 3.0 tackles for loss.

SCOUTING OHIO STATE

► No. 3/4 Ohio State is 2-0 after posting home wins over Bowling Green (77-10) and Tulsa (48-3) to start the season.

► Head coach **Urban Meyer** is in his fifth year at the Ohio State helm. He is 52-4 at OSU, having won at least 12 games in each of his first four seasons, and is a perfect 18-0 in true road games. Meyer led the Buckeyes to a national championship in 2014. The title was the third of career (won with Florida in 2006 and 2008 [beat Oklahoma]).

► OSU returned just six starters from its 2015 team that went 12-1 and defeated Notre Dame, 44-28, in the Fiesta Bowl. OSU had 12 total players selected in the 2016 NFL Draft, including five in the first round. In OSU's season opener against Bowling Green, 26 freshmen saw action (17 redshirt and nine true).

► Ohio State was dominant in its first two contests. The Buckeyes are tied for third in the nation in total defense, allowing just 216.0 yards per game, and rank first in turnover margin at +7. OSU has also been prolific on offense, using a balanced attack to rank fifth nationally in total offense at 596.5 yards per game (313.5 rushing, 283.0 passing).

HOME IS WHERE THE OFFENSE IS

Oklahoma has enjoyed especially productive offensive output in its seven home games since Lincoln Riley was named offensive coordinator.

► Junior quarterback **J.T. Barrett** has passed for 498 yards and six touchdowns on 66.0 percent passing while throwing one interception. He's also added 85 yards and three scores on the ground. All six of Barrett's TD passes came in the opener against Bowling Green. He set the school record for touchdowns responsible for in that game (seven).

► Ohio State ranks ninth nationally in rushing yards per game. The Buckeyes are led by redshirt freshman running back **Mike Weber**, who has piled up 228 yards on 36 attempts (6.3 ypc). Junior H-back **Curtis Samuel** is a dangerous weapon OSU uses all over the field. Samuel leads the Buckeyes in receiving with 14 catches for 239 yards and two touchdowns, and has also rushed for 162 yards on 21 carries (7.7 ypc).

► The Ohio State defense has already forced nine turnovers this season, seven of them interceptions. The unit has also logged four sacks and 11 tackles for loss. Junior linebacker **Raekwon McMillan** leads the team with 12 tackles, while sophomore safety **Malik Hooker** has a nation-leading three interceptions (70 yards) to go along with eight tackles.

SERIES WITH THE BUCKEYES

► The Sooners are 1-1 all-time against Ohio State, winning 29-28 in Columbus on Sept. 24, 1977, and losing 24-14 in Norman on Sept. 17, 1983. Both programs were ranked in the top six of the AP poll in both games.

► The first meeting resulted in one of the most iconic endings in OU history, as **Uwe Von Schamann** kicked a 41-yard field goal with less than 10 seconds to play to give the No. 3 Sooners a 29-28 win over the No. 4 Buckeyes. Oklahoma raced out to a 17-0 first-quarter lead after **Elvis Peacock** ran in a **Thomas Lott** fumble for a touchdown and **Billy Sims** scored from 14 yards out. The lead grew to 20-0 early in the second quarter, but Ohio State scored four consecutive touchdowns to lead 28-20 with under seven minutes to play in the third quarter. Oklahoma lost Lott and Sims to injuries in the contest but managed to cut the deficit to 28-26 with less than two minutes to play on a touchdown run by Peacock. The two-point conversion try was no good, so OU attempted an onside kick, which **Mike Babb** successfully recovered. OU gained 27 yards over the next four plays, setting up Von Schamann's dramatic kick.

► In the rematch six years later, Ohio State quarterback **Mike Tomczak** connected with tight end **John Frank** for two touchdowns for an early lead and the sixth-ranked Buckeyes posted a 24-14 upset over the second-ranked Sooners. OU played most of the game without star running back **Marcus Dupree**, who was sidelined with a bruised knee with nine minutes left in the first half. Dupree gained just 30 yards and had fumble that OSU converted into a touchdown. It was the only turnover of the game for the Sooners. **Spencer Tillman** gained 83 yards on 13 carries for Oklahoma, 37 of them on a touchdown run.

SOONERS DOMINANT AT HOME UNDER STOOPS

► The Sooners are 97-8 (.924) at home under **Bob Stoops** and have outscored their opponents by an average of 42-16 in those games. Included was a school record 39-game home winning streak, as well as a pair of 19-game strings. The .924 home winning percentage is the best among Power 5 schools over the last 18 seasons.

► OU owns a 41-2 (.953) home non-conference record under Stoops and has outscored those opponents by an average margin of 45-14. The Sooners' only two home non-conference losses came to TCU in 2005 (17-10) and Notre Dame in 2012 (30-13).

► Oklahoma is 453-105-22 (.800) all-time at home and 381-84-15 (.809) at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium.

MAYFIELD PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF

► Junior quarterback **Baker Mayfield** is picking up where he left off in 2015 when he finished fourth in Heisman Trophy voting and was named national player of the year by Sporting News. Mayfield, who completed 68.1 percent of his passes for 3,700 yards and 36 touchdowns against only seven interceptions last year, is 38 for 53 (71.7 percent) this season with five TDs and no picks.

► Mayfield is averaging 283.5 passing yards through two games, but he did not play in the second half against ULM on Saturday after directing the Sooners to six touchdown drives and a 42-0 halftime lead. He is averaging 189.0 passing yards per half, which equates to a 378.0 average per game.

► Mayfield's 192.7 passing efficiency rating leads the Big 12 and ranks fourth nationally among quarterbacks who have played at least two games (ranks second among Power 5 players with at least 50 attempts).

► Mayfield is the only Big 12 starting signal caller who has not thrown an interception this season.

► In first-half play so far this season, Mayfield has completed 79.3 percent of his passes (23 for 29) for an average of 203.0 yards. He started 11 for 11 against Houston and 11 of 12 against ULM.

► **Mayfield** has thrown 41 touchdown passes as a Sooner, the most by a player in the first 15 games of an OU career. Mayfield and **Josh Heupel** also rank first at OU with their 48 TDs accounted for through their first 15 games (see chart above).

MARK ANDREWS: TOUCHDOWN MACHINE

► As a redshirt freshman last year, receiver **Mark Andrews** scored seven touchdowns on his 19 receptions (37 percent TD rate). That TD-to-catch ratio has actually increased through two games this season, as Andrews has registered

three more scoring grabs (64 and 25 yards against Houston; 39 yards vs. ULM) on five total receptions.

► The 6-5, 250-pounder from Scottsdale, Ariz., now has 10 TDs on 24 career catches (41.7% TD rate), which equates to 2.5 points per total reception. He recorded his 10th career TD catch on his 23rd reception, making him the fastest player to reach double-digit receiving TDs (see chart on previous page).

► Andrews' 10 TD receptions are tied for the most in OU history through the first 15 games of a career (All-American and former Detroit Lion **Ryan Broyles** also accomplished the feat).

► Of all active FBS players with at least 10 career TD receptions, Andrews has the best TD-to-catch ratio at 41.7%. The next closest players are Michigan State's Josiah Price (17 TDs on 67 catches; 25.4%), North Carolina's Mack Hollins (17 on 69; 24.6%), SMU's Courtland Sutton (13 on 61; 21.3%) and West Virginia's Shelton Gibson (11 on 53; 20.8%).

PERINE COULD BREAK OU CAREER RUSHING RECORD THIS SEASON

► After a stellar season that saw a continuation of his bruising, powerful style, RB **Samaje Perine** picked up third-team All-America honors last year and was selected to the All-Big 12 First Team. The Pflugerville, Texas, product racked up 1,713 rushing yards as a freshman (6.5 per carry) and 1,349 more as a sophomore last season (6.0 per carry), to give him 3,062 for his career. With 89 more yards this season (on 16 carries), Perine already ranks 10th in Oklahoma history with 3,151 career rushing yards and is just 967 yards shy of **Billy Sims'** school record of 4,118 yards.

► Perine's 1,713 net rushing yards in 2014 were sixth most by a freshman in FBS history and second most in Big 12 and OU freshman annals, behind **Adrian Peterson's** 1,925 yards in 2004. Perine's total was fifth highest in a season in OU history, and he became the first freshman lead the Big 12 in rushing yards per game (131.8). Against Kansas that season, Perine amassed an FBS-record 427 rushing yards and five touchdowns on 34 carries. The record still stands.

► Only six Sooners during the 17-year **Bob Stoops** era have rushed for 2,000 career yards and only four have gotten to 3,000, and Perine reached both benchmarks faster than any of them. He reached the 2,000-yard mark Oct. 3 last year against West Virginia in only 326 career carries, faster than current NFL stars **DeMarco Murray** (342) and Peterson (365). He got to 3,000 yards Nov. 28 at Oklahoma State on his 472nd carry, bettering Peterson's mark of 550 carries. For his career, Perine is averaging a stout 6.3 yards per rush.

SOONERS DEBUT RENOVATED STADIUM

► Saturday's 59-17 win over ULM marked the first game inside Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium since the south end of the venue was renovated in the offseason. Visible features of the \$160 million project this year include the bowling in of the south end zone, the addition of 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes, 1,976 club seats and an 8,500-square-foot video board that is the second largest in collegiate athletics. Capacity this season is 83,489.

► The south end zone phase of the renovation will be completed in spring 2017, with a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, sports medicine facility, nutrition center, meeting rooms and equipment rooms all under construction. The third floor of the building will house all of the football offices and the team's video department.

► More stadium information is on page 6 of these game notes.

LOOKING BACK AT 2015

► Oklahoma finished the 2015 campaign with an 11-2 record, an outright Big 12 title (8-1 league mark) and a berth in the College Football Playoff (lost to No. 1-ranked Clemson as the No. 4 seed after holding a halftime lead). The 11 wins tied as OU's most in the last five years and resulted in a No. 5 ranking in the final AP poll.

► The Sooners led the country in average scoring margin (+21.5) and boasted the second-best combined ranking (32) in scoring offense and scoring defense among Power 5 teams. They finished the year ranked No. 4 in scoring offense (43.5 ppg) and No. 28 in scoring defense (22.0 ppg). Ohio State had a combined ranking of 30 (No. 28 in scoring offense, No. 2 in scoring defense) to lead Power 5 programs.

► Oklahoma is the highest scoring football program of all-time, and only two Sooner teams ever averaged more points than their 43.5 per game last season. OU accounted for more than 500 yards of offense in each of the final seven regular season games, and three of the top five single-game yardage totals of the 17-year **Bob Stoops** era were recorded last year (including the top figure of 773 vs. Tulsa).

► In the season's first six games, Oklahoma averaged 158.8 rushing yards on 3.8 yards per carry. Over the last six regular season

outings, the Sooners averaged 311.2 rushing yards on 6.4 yards per attempt (most per carry in the nation during the stretch). Meanwhile, OU allowed only 128.8 rushing yards (3.5 yards per carry) over those final six games.

- ▶ Over the last seven games of the regular season (all wins), OU outscored its opponents by 228 points (an average of 32.6) and outgained them by an average of 251.8 yards.
- ▶ Oklahoma led the Big 12 with nine first-team all-conference selections (five offensive and four defensive) and landed six more on the second team. Three more were honorable mention All-Big 12 picks. Stoops was named Big 12 Coach of the Year for the fifth time, quarterback **Baker Mayfield** was named Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year and wide receiver **Dede Westbrook** was named Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year.
- ▶ Mayfield (Burlsworth Trophy) and center **Ty Darlington** (William V. Campbell Trophy, Wuerffel Trophy and Bobby Bowden Award) were national award winners. First-year OU offensive coordinator **Lincoln Riley** was named the Broyles Award winner.

THIBODEAUX HIRED AS DEFENSIVE LINE COACH

Bob Stoops looked to one of his former players to fill a vacant defensive line coach position last winter. He hired former OU All-Big 12 defensive end **Calvin Thibodeaux** on Feb. 24, replacing Diron Reynolds.

Thibodeaux (pronounced TIB-uh-doe) returned to OU after serving the last five seasons as an assistant coach at Kansas (2015; defensive line), Tulsa (2012-14; defensive tackles) and Dartmouth (2011; defensive line). He was also the defensive line coach at Navarro Junior College in 2010 and served as a defensive graduate assistant at Houston during the 2008 and '09 seasons.

Thibodeaux played at OU from the 2002 through 2006 seasons, helping the Sooners win three Big 12 championships and make appearances in the Rose, Sugar (BCS Championship), Orange (BCS Championship), Holiday and Fiesta Bowls, respectively. He was limited to five games due to injury in 2004 and received a medical hardship. He finished his OU career with 90 tackles, 28.5 tackles for loss and 13.0 sacks. He was a second-team All-Big 12 pick in 2005, logging 44 tackles, 17 tackles for loss and a league-high 10.0 sacks, sixth most in school history.

BEDENBAUGH, COOKS PROMOTED

Assistant coaches **Bill Bedenbaugh** and **Kerry Cooks** were promoted to assistant coordinator positions by head coach **Bob Stoops** in July. Bedenbaugh (pronounced BEE-din-bo) is now assistant offensive coordinator and offensive line coach, while Cooks is now assistant defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach. Stoops said the title changes will not affect the Sooners' play-calling responsibilities of associate head coach and defensive coordinator **Mike Stoops** and offensive coordinator **Lincoln Riley**.

SOONERS HAVE DOMINATED BIG 12 ERA

- ▶ Oklahoma's performance in the Big 12 Conference since **Bob Stoops** took over as head coach in 1999 has been nothing short of dominant. The Sooners have won nine Big 12 titles in Stoops' 17 seasons, with no other program during that span winning more than two.
- ▶ Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed nine league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each).
- ▶ OU owns a league-best 112-29 (.794) record in regular season Big 12 games during the Stoops era. Texas ranks second with a 101-40 (.716) record and is followed by TCU (21-15; .583), Kansas State (78-63; .553), Oklahoma State (76-65; .539), Texas Tech (71-70; .504), West Virginia (15-21; .417), Baylor (47-94; .333), Iowa State (41-100; .291) and Kansas (32-109; .227).

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

- ▶ During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (618) and a better winning percentage (.762) than any other program.
- ▶ OU is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 33,995 points (in 1,235 games).
- ▶ No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 36. In addition, OU's 22 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.
- ▶ Since **Bob Stoops'** arrival in 1999, OU leads all Power Five conference programs in wins (180) and points scored (8,423).
- ▶ Only Ohio State (105) has been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll more weeks than Oklahoma (101). OU's 391 weeks in the AP's top five are more than any other school. The AP Poll was introduced in 1936.
- ▶ Only Alabama (9) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

EXTRA POINTS

- ▶ Quarterback **Austin Kendall** made his collegiate debut Saturday against ULM and has already set the OU single-season record for most yards by a true freshman in the **Bob Stoops** era. Kendall's 12 completions and two touchdowns have him tied for most completions and passing TDs in a season by a true freshman in the Stoops era. **Paul Thompson** completed 12 passes and threw for two TDs in five games as a true frosh in 2002. Other true freshman QBs to play under Stoops were **Jason White** in 1999 (3 games; 1 for 2 passing; 9 yards; 0 TDs) and **Keith Nichol** in 2007 (3 games; 2 for 7 passing; 15 yards; 0 TDs).
- ▶ Oklahoma has registered more than 500 yards of total offense in eight of its last nine regular season games (averaging 575.9 yards in those nine contests).
- ▶ The Sooners are looking for their 14th season of at least 10 wins under Stoops. Oklahoma is the only FBS program to rack up 13 seasons of double-digit victories since 2000.
- ▶ OU is 60-8 (.882) under Stoops against non-conference teams during the regular season, winning 20 of the last 22.
- ▶ Oklahoma is 23-6 (.793) all-time as the No. 14 team in the AP poll, including 10-1 (.909) under Stoops.
- ▶ In games where both teams are ranked 14th or better, the Sooners are 29-15 (.659) under Stoops, including 9-9 when they are the lower ranked team.
- ▶ Oklahoma is 4-2 all-time in overtime games. Under Stoops it is 3-2.

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and the second-largest collegiate video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.
- In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director **Bennie Owen** suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and its existing figure of 83,489 (2016).
- In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

CURRENT RENOVATION

- The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project is being carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- The first phase of the building project was completed prior to last week's home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that has initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.
- The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons will benefit from two new clubs.
- Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They will each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- The new building will allow for all student-athlete services to be moved to the ground floor. That space, to be completed in spring 2017, will include a new locker room, strength and conditioning room, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building will house all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- The weight room will nearly triple in size to 26,600 square feet and include a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also will grow substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.

- ▶ Bob Stoops is the winningest coach in Oklahoma history at 180-47 (.793).
- ▶ Has won more games in his first 17 years than any college coach.
- ▶ Reached 150 wins in 187 games (sixth fastest all-time)
- ▶ Has led the Sooners to a school-record 17 consecutive bowl berths (the previous record was eight under Barry Switzer). Never had an OU coach taken even his first three teams to bowls.
- ▶ Is the only coach in the BCS era to win a national championship and every BCS bowl game (Fiesta, Orange, Rose, Sugar).
- ▶ Since he took over at OU in 1999, has coached Sooners to more wins than any other Power Five program during that time span.
- ▶ Under his direction, Oklahoma is one of only five Power Five programs to average 10 wins per year over the last 10 seasons.
- ▶ Has 13 seasons of 10 or more wins, the most of any FBS coach since 2000.
- ▶ Oklahoma is 55-29 (.655) vs. AP Top 25 teams in the Stoops era. The win percentage is the best in the country during the span.
- ▶ In the Stoops era, no program has more AP top-five appearances than OU's 122. Alabama (115) is next, followed by Ohio State (100), USC (86) and Florida (82) and Texas (82).
- ▶ Owns a 97-8 home record, which included a school-record 39-game winning streak (ninth longest in college football history) and two 19-game strings.
- ▶ OU is a combined 23-11 under Stoops against their two biggest rivals (13-4 vs. Oklahoma State and 10-7 against Texas).

CONFERENCE SUPREMACY

- ▶ Stoops has coached OU to nine Big 12 championships. No other program has won more than two Big 12 titles in his 17 seasons.
- ▶ Owns a 63-18 overall mark since 2010 and a 40-13 league record, both of which are the best of any Big 12 team during that span.
- ▶ Has guided the Sooners to more wins against AP Top 25 teams than any Big 12 program since 2010. OU is the only program in the conference with a winning record in such games (19-13).

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

- ▶ Stoops has produced 36 first-team All-Americans, two AP Players of the Year and 79 NFL Draft picks as OU's head coach.
- ▶ Stoops has coached two Heisman Trophy winners (Jason White in 2003 and Sam Bradford in 2008) and five Heisman finalists.
- ▶ Two different Sooners have claimed the following honors since he took over at OU: Nagurski Award (Roy Williams, Derrick Strait), Thorpe Award (Roy Williams, Derrick Strait) and Butkus Award (Rocky Calmus, Teddy Lehman).
- ▶ At least one of his OU players has earned each one of these accolades: the Bednarik Award, Lombardi Award, Walter Camp Award, Maxwell Award, Unitas Award, Outland Trophy, Burlsworth Trophy, Campbell Trophy, Wuerffel Trophy and the Mosi Tatupu Award.
