OPENING KICK

► In a matchup of the two most successful programs of the Big 12 era, No. 20/22 Oklahoma plays Texas for the 111th time on Saturday at 11 a.m. CT. The game, to be played in Dallas for the 88th straight year, will be televised by FS1.

► OU has won nine Big 12 titles in the league's 20-year history, with no other program during that span winning more than three. All nine of OU's Big 12 titles have come in **Bob Stoops'** 17 years, with no other program winning more than two during the span. Texas ranks second with three Big 12 titles (last one in 2009).

► Saturday's game will mark just the second this season for OU against an unranked opponent. Under Stoops, the Sooners are 125-18 (.874) against unranked teams (74-14 [.841]) in Big 12 play vs. unranked competition.

► Oklahoma's two losses have come to current No. 6/5 Houston (at NRG Stadium in Houston) and No. 2/2 Ohio State (at home).

► OU is one of six teams to play three AP Top 25 teams so far in 2016, joining Auburn (1-2 vs. Top 25), Georgia (1-2), Ole Miss (1-2), USC (0-3) and Wisconsin (2-1). Georgia has played three ranked teams in five games, while the other schools have done it in their first four contests.

► Among OU head coaches who directed the Sooners for at least five years, only three have posted a winning record against Texas, and Stoops leads all of them in victories. He is 10-7 against the Longhorns, while **Barry Switzer** (1973-88) went 9-5-2 and **Bud Wilkinson** (1947-63) went 9-8. **Bennie Owen** (1905-26) went 8-8 against the Longhorns.

► The Sooners are coming off a 52-46 win at TCU on Saturday. After falling behind 21-7, OU outscored the Horned Frogs 42-3 in the second and third quarters, and then had to hang on to post its eighth straight true road win. **Baker Mayfield** threw for 274 yards and two touchdowns while running for 55 yards and two more scores. **Dede Westbrook** finished with a career-high 158 receiving yards and two TDs, while **Joe Mixon** (105 yards, 1 TD) and **Samaje Perine** (98 yards, 2 TDs) combined for 203 rushing yards and three scores.

► Texas posted home wins over Notre Dame (50-47 in double overtime) and UTEP (41-7) to start the season, but has dropped two games since (50-43 at Cal and 49-31 at Oklahoma State). In Stillwater on Saturday, UT ran for 329 yards, but gave up 392 yards through the air (20.6 per completion). It also had three point-after attempts blocked.

FIVE TOP STORYLINES

► Texas is the only Big 12 program with a winning record against the Sooners. Oklahoma is 44-61-5 in the series, but owns a 23-19-3 advantage since 1971. In the Big 12 era, OU is 11-9 against the Longhorns, while head coach **Bob Stoops** owns a 10-7 record in the series. The Sooners have won four of the last six meetings.



Wide receiver Dede Westbrook is coming off a 7-catch, career-high 158-yard performance against TCU in which he scored two touchdowns. He totaled 107 yards in the second quarter alone, marking just the 18th time in OU history a player posted a 100-yard receiving quarter.

OU-TEXAS: THE STOOPS ERA

► Dating back to the start of the 2012 season, the Sooners have won 21 of their last 26 regular season games away from home. In those 26 games, Oklahoma has outscored its opponents 985-644 (38-25 average). OU has scored at least 30 points in 20 of those 26 contests.

► This marks the fourth straight season that OU enters the Red River Showdown ranked in the AP Top 25 while Texas is unranked. Despite that fact, the Longhorns have won two of the last three meetings. The Sooners have been ranked in the AP poll at the time of the Red River game in each of the last 11 years and in 16 of Stoops' 18 seasons (not in 1999 or 2005). Texas was ranked in the first 14 meetings of the Stoops era.

► Seventy-seven of the 113 players on OU's roster hail from the states of Texas (45) and Oklahoma (32). Of the Sooners' 22 starters against TCU on Saturday, 11 are from Texas (six on offense, five on defense).

► OU has scored at least 55 points against Texas four times in the first 17 years of the Stoops era (63-14 in 2000, 65-13 in 2003, 55-17 in 2011 and 63-21 in 2012). The Sooners never reached the 55-point mark in the previous 93 matchups.

SOONERS MAKING BIG GAINS

Oklahoma is averaging a robust 6.86 yards per offensive play. Only one OU team in the **Bob Stoops** era has averaged more yards per play for an entire season than the Sooners' 6.86 this year (the **Sam Bradford**-led 2008 squad that played in the BCS Championship Game averaged 6.93).

RECAPPING THE WIN OVER TCU (STATS RECAP ON PAGE 34)

► Oklahoma held a 49-24 lead entering the fourth quarter but had to hang on for a 52-46 win at TCU on Saturday, the Sooners' eighth straight victory in a true road game. After trailing 21-7 at the end of the first quarter, OU outscored the Horned Frogs 42-3 in the second and third quarters. TCU made it a 49-46 game with 5:36 remaining before **Austin Seibert** put OU up by six with a 35-yard field goal with 1:55 to go. The Sooners held on the ensuing series, not allowing a first down.

► Six Sooners who started in the last game against Ohio State did not play against TCU due to injury (two offensive, four defensive).

► Quarterback **Baker Mayfield** completed 23 of 30 pass attempts for 274 yards and two touchdowns while running for 55 yards and two more scores as the Sooners won their 36th straight regular season game following a regular season loss.

► Running backs **Joe Mixon** (105 yards on 16 carries, 1 TD) and **Samaje Perine** (98 yards on 17 carries, 2 TDs) combined for 203 rushing yards and three scores. It was Mixon's fourth career 100-yard rushing game (second this year), while Perine's 98 yards marked a season high. Mixon finished with 221 all-purpose yards (70 receiving on five catches and 46 kick return).

► Wide receiver **Dede Westbrook** finished with a game-high seven catches for a career-high 158 yards and two TDs. His scores came in the second quarter from 67 and 40 yards out.

► Linebackers **Jordan Evans** (10 tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss) and **Ogbonnia Okoronkwo** (6 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss) combined for 16 tackles and 4.5 TFLs. Both of Okoronkwo's sacks came on TCU's final possession to help preserve the win.

► **Steven Parker's** first-quarter interception was the first of the junior safety's career and the first by a Sooner this season.

SCOUTING TEXAS

► Third-year head coach **Charlie Strong** leads the Texas Longhorns into the Cotton Bowl at 2-2. Texas defeated then-No. 10 Notre Dame, 50-47, in double overtime to open its season and then bested UTEP, 41-7, both at home. Since then, the Longhorns have dropped road games to California (50-43) and Oklahoma State (49-31).

► Texas has been potent under first-year offensive coordinator **Sterlin Gilbert**. The Longhorns have topped the 30-point mark in all four games and have surpassed 40 three times. UT ranks 15th nationally in total offense (517.3 yards per contest).

► True freshman **Shane Buechele** is Texas' primary quarterback. He is completing 65.5 percent of his passes and has thrown for 959 yards with eight touchdowns and three interceptions. Senior **Tyrone Swoopes**, utilized primarily in short yardage and red zone situations, has been a weapon for UT, racking up five rushing touchdowns and consistently delivering first downs. He has 27 carries for 112 yards (4.1 per rush) and is 5 for 8 through the air for 66 yards with an interception.

► Five different Longhorns have at least 10 catches on the year and six have hauled in a touchdown pass. Sophomore WR **John Burt** leads the team in receiving with 14 grabs for 191 yards and one score. RBs **D'Onta Foreman** and sophomore **Chris Warren III**, both weighing around 250 pounds, have been effective. Foreman leads the team in rushing with 436 yards on 62 carries (7.0 average, five TDs), while Warren has 367 yards on the same number of rushes (5.9 average, three TDs).

► Texas ranks 87th nationally in total defense (opponents average 428.5 yards per game) and 116th nationally in scoring defense (opponents average 38.3 points a contest). The Longhorns have yet to record an interception in 2016.

► Sophomore DE/OLB **Breckyn Hager** has been a standout through four games. Hager ranks second on the team with 23 total tackles, while adding a team-high 3.5 tackles for loss and tying a team high with 2.0 sacks. Sophomore LB **Malik Jefferson** was a freshman All-American and the Big 12 Defensive Freshman of the Year in 2015. The 2016 Big 12 Preseason Defensive Player of the Year has 23 tackles and 1.0 tackle for loss (a sack).

LAST YEAR AT THE COTTON BOWL

► No. 10/9 Oklahoma was looking for its fifth win against Texas in the last six years but never led in a 24-17 setback at the Cotton Bowl. The Sooners were outgained by 90 yards on the day (368 to a season-low 278) and failed to force a turnover while committing one that led to seven points.

► Junior quarterback **Baker Mayfield** completed 20 of his 28 pass attempts for 211 yards and a touchdown (no interceptions), but was sacked six times for a loss of 45 yards. He was 14 for 16 for 166 yards in the second half. On non-sack plays, Mayfield rushed for 40 yards on 12 carries on the day. His 71.4-percent completion rate was his second best of the season at the time.

► The Sooners held Texas to just 55 yards passing on 12 attempts, but were outgained 338-117 on the ground. **Samaje Perine** led OU in rushing yards for the fifth time in five games, but was limited to 36 yards on 10 carries.

► **Sterling Shepard** recorded game highs of six catches and 95 receiving yards. His 50-yard third-quarter reception set up OU's first touchdown, a **Dimitri Flowers** two-yard catch. It was Flowers' first career touchdown.

► **Jordan Evans** paced OU in tackles with a game-high 11 stops. **Eric Striker** recorded 2.0 sacks for the second straight game.

► Texas went up 7-0 with 7:52 left in the first quarter and scored another touchdown with 5:37 remaining in the period after a fumble by OU's **Alex Ross** on a kickoff return. The Sooners cut the deficit to seven points on two occasions (17-10 and 24-17).

MAYFIELD PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF

► Junior quarterback **Baker Mayfield** is picking up where he left off in 2015 when he finished fourth in Heisman Trophy voting and was named national player of the year by Sporting News. Mayfield, who completed 68.1 percent of his passes for 3,700 yards and 36 touchdowns against only seven interceptions last year, is 78 for 115 (67.8 percent) this season with nine TDs and two picks.

► Mayfield is averaging 266.8 passing yards through four games, but he did not play in the second half against ULM after directing the Sooners to six touchdown drives and a 42-0 halftime lead. He is averaging 152.4 passing yards per half played, which equates to a 304.8 average per game.

► Mayfield's 168.11 passing efficiency rating ranks second in the Big 12 behind Texas Tech's Patrick Mahomes.

► **Mayfield** has accounted for 54 touchdowns as a Sooner, the most by a player in the first 17 games of an OU career. He ranks second behind **Sam Bradford** with 45 touchdown passes through his first 17 games (Bradford had 48; see chart to the right).

► Mayfield owns a 5.0 touchdown-to-interception ratio as a Sooner (45 to 9).

MIXON MAKING THE MOST OF HIS CARRIES

► Redshirt sophomore running back **Joe Mixon** has amassed 340 yards on just 44 carries this season, good for a league-best 7.7 yards per rush.

► For his career, Mixon is averaging 6.96 yards per carry, the most in the 18-year **Bob Stoops** era among players with at least 100 attempts. Following Mixon in the top five are **Alex Ross** (6.39 average; 123 carries), **Samaje Perine** (6.14; 539), **Dominique Whaley** (5.72; 152) and **Trevor Knight** (5.65; 151). See the top 10 in chart to the right.

► On OU's all-time chart, Mixon ranks seventh with his 6.96 career rushing yards per carry (minimum 100 attempts). He ranks fifth among running backs, trailing only **Greg Pruitt** (7.40 average; 1970-72), **Marcus Dupree** (7.24; 1982-83); **Buck McPhail** (7.06; 1950-52) and **Leon "Mule Train" Heath** (7.03; 1948-50). See the top 10 in chart to the right.

► Mixon leads the Big 12 and ranks fourth nationally (see chart at bottom of this page) with his 191.5 all-purpose yards per game this season. He is averaging 85.0 rushing yards per game (ranks fourth in Big 12), 40.5 receiving yards per contest (ranks third on team), a Big 12-leading 30.2 yards per kickoff return and 11.0 yards per punt return.

PERINE APPROACHING OU CAREER RUSHING MARK

► After a stellar season that saw a continuation of his bruising, powerful style, RB **Samaje Perine** picked up third-team All-America honors last year and was selected to the All-Big 12 First Team. The Pflugerville, Texas, product racked up 1,713 rushing yards as a freshman (6.5 per carry) and 1,349 more as a sophomore last season (6.0 per carry), to give him 3,062 for his career. With 247 more yards this season (on 50 carries), Perine already ranks **eighth** in Oklahoma history with 3,309 career rushing yards and is just 809 yards shy of **Billy Sims'** school record of 4,118 yards.

► Perine's 1,713 net rushing yards in 2014 were sixth most by a freshman in FBS history and second most in Big 12 and OU freshman annals, behind **Adrian Peterson's** 1,925 yards in 2004. Perine's total was fifth highest in a season in OU history, and he became the first freshman lead the Big 12 in rushing yards per game (131.8). Against Kansas that season, Perine amassed an FBS-record 427 rushing yards and five touchdowns on 34 carries. The record still stands.

► Only six Sooners during the 17-year **Bob Stoops** era have rushed for 2,000 career yards and only four have gotten to 3,000.

and Perine reached both benchmarks faster than any of them. He reached the 2,000-yard mark Oct. 3 last year against West Virginia in only 326 career carries, faster than current NFL stars **DeMarco Murray** (342) and Peterson (365). He got to 3,000 yards Nov. 28 at Oklahoma State on his 472nd carry, bettering Peterson's mark of 550 carries. For his career, Perine is averaging a stout 6.1 yards per rush.

MARK ANDREWS: TOUCHDOWN MACHINE

► As a redshirt freshman last year, receiver **Mark Andrews** scored seven touchdowns on his 19 receptions (37 percent TD rate). Andrews hasn't done anything to hurt that TD-to-catch ratio through four games this season, as he has registered four more scoring grabs (64 and 25 yards against Houston; 39 yards vs. ULM; 5 yards vs. Ohio State) on 11 total receptions.

► The 6-5, 250-pounder from Scottsdale, Ariz., now has 11 TDs on 30 career catches (36.7% TD rate), which equates to 2.2 points per total reception. He recorded his 10th career TD catch on his 23rd reception, making him the fastest player to reach double-digit receiving TDs.

► Andrews' 11 TD receptions rank as the second most in OU history through the first 17 games of a career (All-American and former Detroit Lion **Ryan Broyles** caught 12 TDs passes in his first 17 games).

► Of all active FBS players with at least 10 career TD receptions, Andrews has the best TD-to-catch ratio at 36.7 percent. The next closest players are Toledo's Michael Roberts (11 TDs on 39 catches; 28.2%), North Carolina's Mack Hollins (20 on 78; 25.6%), Michigan State's Josiah Price (18 on 78; 23.1%) and Texas Tech's Jonathan Giles (10 on 46; 21.7%).

► Andrews is averaging a team-high 19.7 yards per catch this year.

NOTING OU'S DEFENSE

► Oklahoma ranks 88th out of 128 teams in total defense at 429.3 yards per game, but it has faced three of the nation's top offenses. Ohio State ranks fourth in total offense at 576.3 yards per game, TCU ranks sixth at 563.6 yards and Houston 19th at 506.0. The Sooners held Ohio State to 133 yards below the Buckeyes' current average, Houston to 96 yards below its current average and TCU to 50 yards below its current average.

► Due mainly to injuries, 18 different Sooners have started on defense through four games.

► OU, which ranks second in the Big 12 and 40th nationally in rushing defense (130.8 yards allowed per game), has held three of its four opponents to less than 90 yards on the ground (89 by Houston, 78 by ULM and 65 by TCU). Ohio State rushed for 291.

► Outside linebacker **Ogbonnia Okoronkwo** is tied for the Big 12 lead with his 1.0 sack per game, while inside linebacker **Jordan Evans** ranks third in the league with his 8.5 tackles per contest.

SOONERS HAVE DOMINATED BIG 12 ERA

► Oklahoma's performance in the Big 12 Conference since **Bob Stoops** took over as head coach in 1999 has been nothing short of dominant. The Sooners have won nine Big 12 titles in Stoops' 17 seasons, with no other program during that span winning more than two.

► Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed nine league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each).

► OU owns a league-best 113-29 (.796) record in regular season Big 12 games during the Stoops era. Texas ranks second with a 101-41 (.711) record and is followed by TCU (22-16; .579), Kansas State (78-64; .549), Oklahoma State (77-66; .538), Texas Tech (72-70; .507), West Virginia (16-21; .432), Baylor (49-94; .343), Iowa State (41-102; .287) and Kansas (32-110; .225).

SOONERS DEBUT RENOVATED STADIUM

► OU has played two games inside Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium since the south end of the venue was renovated in the offseason, and both contests set attendance records for sporting events in the state (87,037 vs. ULM and 87,979 vs. Ohio State). Visible features of the \$160 million project this year include the bowling in of the south end zone, the addition of 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes, 1,976 club seats and an 8,500-square-foot video board that is the second largest in collegiate athletics. Capacity this season is 83,489.

► The south end zone phase of the renovation will be completed in spring 2017, with a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, sports medicine facility, nutrition center, meeting rooms and equipment rooms all under construction. The third floor of the building will house all of the football offices and the team's video department.

► More stadium information is on page 6 of these game notes.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (619) and a better winning percentage (.762) than any other program.

► OU is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 34,071 points (in 1,237 games).

► No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 36. In addition, OU's 22 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.

► Since **Bob Stoops'** arrival in 1999, OU leads all Power Five conference programs in wins (181) and points scored (8,499).

► Only Ohio State (105) has been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll more weeks than Oklahoma (101). OU's 391 weeks in the AP's top five are more than any other school. The AP Poll was introduced in 1936.

► Only Alabama (9) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

A QUICK REVIEW OF 2015

► Oklahoma finished the 2015 campaign with an 11-2 record, an outright Big 12 title (8-1 league mark) and a berth in the College Football Playoff (lost to No. 1-ranked Clemson as the No. 4 seed after holding a halftime lead). The 11 wins tied as OU's most in the last five years and resulted in a No. 5 ranking in the final AP poll.

► The Sooners led the country in average scoring margin (+21.5) and boasted the second-best combined ranking (32) in scoring offense and scoring defense among Power 5 teams. They finished the year ranked No. 4 in scoring offense (43.5 ppg) and No. 28 in scoring defense (22.0 ppg). Ohio State had a combined ranking of 30 (No. 28 in scoring offense, No. 2 in scoring defense) to lead Power 5 programs.

► Oklahoma is the highest scoring football program of all-time, and only two Sooner teams ever averaged more points than their 43.5 per game last season. OU accounted for more than 500 yards of offense in each of the final seven regular season games, and three of the top five single-game yardage totals of the 17-year **Bob Stoops** era were recorded last year (including the top figure of 773 vs. Tulsa).

► In the season's first six games, Oklahoma averaged 158.8 rushing yards on 3.8 yards per carry. Over the last six regular season outings, the Sooners averaged 311.2 rushing yards on 6.4 yards per attempt (most per carry in the nation during the stretch). Meanwhile, OU allowed only 128.8 rushing yards (3.5 yards per carry) over those final six games.

► Over the last seven games of the regular season (all wins), OU outscored its opponents by 228 points (an average of 32.6) and outgained them by an average of 251.8 yards.

► Oklahoma led the Big 12 with nine first-team all-conference selections (five offensive and four defensive) and landed six more on the second team. Three more were honorable mention All-Big 12 picks. Stoops was named Big 12 Coach of the Year for the fifth time, quarterback **Baker Mayfield** was named Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year and wide receiver **Dede Westbrook** was named Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year.

► Mayfield (Burlsworth Trophy) and center **Ty Darlington** (William V. Campbell Trophy, Wuerffel Trophy and Bobby Bowden Award) were national award winners. First-year OU offensive coordinator **Lincoln Riley** was named the Broyles Award winner.

EXTRA POINTS

► Oklahoma has played more games against Texas and Oklahoma State (110 each) than any other opponent.

► Seven of OU's 10 wins against Texas under **Bob Stoops** have been by double digits and four have been by at least 30 points.

► Stoops is 55-16 all-time in the month of October. He's won four straight October games dating to last season and five his last six. OU is outscoring teams by an average of 36-21 (2,544-1,459) in the month.

► This marks just the fifth time in school history that Oklahoma has started a season by playing three ranked teams in its first four games. The Sooners also did it in 1981 (started 1-2-1), 1973 (3-0-1), 1960 (1-2-1) and 1954 (4-0).

► The Sooners have recorded one interception this season (by **Steven Parker** on Saturday at TCU). Last year, they ranked second in the Big 12 and eighth nationally with 20 interceptions (1.5 per contest). Texas is one of four teams nationally that has yet to record an interception this season.

► Quarterback **Austin Kendall** made his collegiate debut Sept. 10 against ULM and has already set the OU single-season record for most yards by a true freshman in the Stoops era. Kendall's 12 completions and two touchdowns have him tied for most completions and passing TDs in a season by a true freshman in the Stoops era. **Paul Thompson** completed 12 passes and threw for two TDs in five games as a true frosh in 2002. Other true freshman QBs to play under Stoops were **Jason White** in 1999 (3 games; 1 for 2 passing; 9 yards; 0 TDs) and **Keith Nichol** in 2007 (3 games; 2 for 7 passing; 15 yards; 0 TDs).

► Oklahoma has registered more than 500 yards of total offense in nine of its last 11 regular season games (averaging 556.4 yards in those 10 contests).

► The Sooners are looking for their 14th season of at least 10 wins under Stoops. Oklahoma is the only FBS program to rack up 13 seasons of double-digit victories since 2000.

► Oklahoma is 4-2 all-time in overtime games. Under Stoops it is 3-2.

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and the second-largest collegiate video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.
- In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director **Bennie Owen** suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and its existing figure of 83,489 (2016).
- In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

CURRENT RENOVATION

- The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project is being carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the Sept. 10 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that has initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.
- The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons will benefit from two new clubs.
- Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They will each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- The new building will allow for all student-athlete services to be moved to the ground floor. That space, to be completed in spring 2017, will include a new locker room, strength and conditioning room, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building will house all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- The weight room will nearly triple in size to 26,600 square feet and include a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also will grow substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.

- ▶ Has 13 seasons of 10 or more wins, the most of any FBS coach since 2000.
- ▶ Oklahoma is 56-30 (.651) vs. AP Top 25 teams in the Stoops era. The win percentage is the second best in the country during the span (Ohio State - .658).
- ▶ In the Stoops era, no program has more AP top-five appearances than OU's 122. Alabama (118) is next, followed by Ohio State (103), USC (86) and Florida (82) and Texas (82).
- ▶ Owns a 97-9 home record, which included a school-record 39-game winning streak (ninth longest in college football history) and two 19-game strings.
- ▶ OU is a combined 23-11 under Stoops against their two biggest rivals (13-4 vs. Oklahoma State and 10-7 against Texas).

CONFERENCE SUPREMACY

- ▶ Stoops has coached OU to nine Big 12 championships. No other program has won more than two Big 12 titles in his 17 seasons.
- ▶ Owns a 64-19 overall mark since 2010 and a 41-13 league record, both of which are the best of any Big 12 team during that span.
- ▶ Has guided the Sooners to more wins against AP Top 25 teams than any Big 12 program since 2010. OU is the only program in the conference with a winning record in such games (20-14).

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

- ▶ Stoops has produced 36 first-team All-Americans, two AP Players of the Year and 79 NFL Draft picks as OU's head coach.
- ▶ Stoops has coached two Heisman Trophy winners (Jason White in 2003 and Sam Bradford in 2008) and five Heisman finalists.
- ▶ Two different Sooners have claimed the following honors since he took over at OU: Nagurski Award (Roy Williams, Derrick Strait), Thorpe Award (Roy Williams, Derrick Strait) and Butkus Award (Rocky Calmus, Teddy Lehman).
- ▶ At least one of his OU players has earned each one of these accolades: the Bednarik Award, Lombardi Award, Walter Camp Award, Maxwell Award, Unitas Award, Outland Trophy, Burlsworth Trophy, Campbell Trophy, Wuerffel Trophy and the Mosi Tatupu Award.
