Saturday's game will mark OU's first without Bob Stoops as head coach since Nov. 21, 1998, when the average U.S. gas price was \$0.99 a gallon. By Saturday, 6,859 days will have passed since that date. Stoops presided over the Sooners for 14,280 minutes of game time (not including overtimes).

OPENING KICK

► No. 7/8 Oklahoma begins its 123rd season of varsity football, and first under rookie head coach **Lincoln Riley**, when it hosts UTEP on Saturday at 2:30 p.m. CT at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. The game will be televised nationally by FOX with **Joe Davis**, **Brady Quinn** and **Bruce Feldman** announcing.

► Oklahoma is 93-23-6 all-time in season openers and is 75-15-4 in home openers at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, which opened in 1923. OU has won 11 straight home openers (last such loss was a 17-10 setback vs. TCU in 2005).

► Riley is the 22nd head coach in OU history. The program's first 21 coaches went 16-5 in their debut games. Ten of the 16 coaches who won their debut did so via shutout (V.L. Parrington in 1897, Mark McMahon in 1902, Fred Ewing in 1904, Bennie Owen in 1905, Lewie Hardage in 1932, Lawrence Jones in 1935, Dewey Luster in 1941, Jim Mackenzie in 1966, Chuck Fairbanks in 1967 and Bob Stoops in 1999).

► The Sooners are 24-1 all-time as the No. 7 team in the AP poll and have won their last eight games when holding that ranking.

► Oklahoma is looking to register its 15th season of at least 10 wins since the start of the 2000 campaign. The Sooners are the only FBS program to rack up 14 seasons of double-digit victories since 2000.

► OU is coming off an 11-2 season in which it won its final 10 games, captured a second straight Big 12 championship by going 9-0 in league play and claimed the Sugar Bowl title with a 35-19 win over Auburn in Bob Stoops' last year as head coach. The 10-game winning streak is the longest in the country entering 2017.

► UTEP posted a 4-8 record last year and went 2-6 in Conference USA (tied for fifth in West Division). After going 1-5 and averaging 15.7 points to start the season, the Miners went 3-3 to close the year while averaging 37.3 points a contest.



Lincoln Riley will make his head coaching debut Saturday. At 33, Riley is the youngest FBS head coach (he turns 34 on Sept. 5). He served as OU's offensive coordinator the last two seasons, leading the Sooners to No. 3 and 4 rankings in scoring offense in 2016 and 2015, respectively. He was named the Broyles Award winner in 2015 as the nation's top assistant coach.

FIVE KEY STORYLINES

► Saturday's game will mark Oklahoma's first under a head coach other than Bob Stoops since Nov. 21, 1998. Stoops, who retired on June 7, is OU's all-time wins leader (190-48 [.798]), directed the Sooners to 10 Big 12 Conference titles in his 18 years, led to the program to a bowl game every season, won the 2000 national championship and produced 37 first-team All-Americans, 83 NFL Draft picks and two Heisman Trophy winners (Jason White in 2003 and Sam Bradford in 2008). He now holds the title of special assistant to the athletics director.

► The Sooners will be looking to extend their nation-leading 10-game winning streak. They haven't lost since a 45-24 home defeat at the hands of Ohio State last year (Sept. 17). OU's streak is its longest since winning 11 straight over the 2010 and '11 seasons. The last time it won 12 consecutive games was in 2004 (started 12-0 before losing in Orange Bowl).

► OU is 3-0 against UTEP and has outscored the Miners by a combined margin of 147-21 (49-7 average score). This will mark the third time UTEP has served as the Sooners' season-opening opponent (also in 2000 in Norman [55-14] and 2012 in El Paso [24-7]).

► Oklahoma is 20-0 all-time against teams currently in Conference USA. It owns 7-0 marks against North Texas and Rice and a 3-0 record against UTEP. OU has also registered wins over Louisiana Tech, Middle Tennessee and UAB.

► OU coaches have indicated that freshman **Kenneth Murray** will likely start at inside linebacker Saturday. If he does, Murray would become the first true freshman in 42 years to start a season opener at inside linebacker. Daryl Hunt was the last to do it in 1975, and went on to earn first-team All-America honors in 1977 and '78. Since Hunt, only four true frosh have started at inside linebacker for the Sooners in any game: Tyrell Peters in 1993, Rocky Calmus and Michael Delaney in 1998, and Dominique Alexander in 2013.

SOONERS DOMINANT AT HOME

► Oklahoma has won more Big 12 championships over the last 18 years (10) than it has lost home games. OU is 101-9 (.918) at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium since the start of the 1999 season, with all 110 of those games sellouts. It is the best home winning percentage among Power Five schools over the last 18 seasons (Ohio State is next at .882). OU has outscored its opponents by an average of 42-16 in those games.

► OU owns a 41-3 (.932) home non-conference record since the start of the 1999 season. The three home non-conference losses came to TCU in 2005 (17-10), Notre Dame in 2012 (30-13) and Ohio State last season (45-24).

NOTING OU'S 10-GAME WINNING STREAK

► Since losing 45-24 to No. 3 Ohio State on Sept. 17 last season, Oklahoma has rattled off 10 straight victories, good for the nation's longest streak.

► The Sooners have outscored their last 10 opponents by 185 points (an average of 18.5) and have outgained them by an average of 136.3 yards. On the ground, OU is outgaining teams by an average of 88.7 yards (254.3-165.6) during the streak.

► Dating back to Oct. 1, 2016, (OU's first win of the streak), the Sooners rank first nationally in completion percentage (72.1), passing TDs (34), TD percentage (12.0 percent of passes), efficiency rating (203.5; next highest is 185.3 and next highest Power 5 is 173.4), yards from scrimmage (5,776) and yards from scrimmage per game (577.6; next most is 560.1).

► OU ranks second nationally and leads all Power 5 schools since Oct. 1, 2016, with 60 touchdowns from scrimmage and 63 touchdowns overall. OU also leads all Power 5 schools and ranks third nationally with 465 points and 46.5 points per game.

► Quarterback **Baker Mayfield** has completed 72.9 percent of his passes over the last 10 games (average of 317.2 yards) with 33 TDs and just six interceptions. Dating back to Oct. 1 (and among QBs with at least 100 pass attempts), Mayfield ranks first nationally in pass completion percentage, passing touchdowns, yards per pass attempt (11.6), touchdown percentage (12.1 percent of passes) and efficiency rating (206.0; next closest is 194.8; next closest Power 5 QB is 175.5).

SCOUTING UTEP

► UTEP is led by fifth-year head coach **Sean Kugler**, who returned to his alma mater in December of 2012. Since Kugler's arrival, the Miners have posted a 18-31 record, including a 7-6 mark in 2014 that represented the program's first winning season since 2005. Kugler has coached two All-Americans at UTEP, two first-team All-Conference USA players, five second-team All-C-USA players, nine honorable mention All-C-USA players and 161 C-USA All-Freshman players.

► The Miners are coming off a 4-8 2016 in which they went 2-6 in conference play. After winning the season opener against New Mexico State, UTEP endured a five-game losing streak before righting the ship with a five-overtime victory over UTSA and a 3-3 mark to close the year.

► UTEP returns five offensive starters from a year ago, led by senior left guard **Will Hernandez**, who earned second-team All-America honors from the AP last season and was also named to the outlet's second team in the preseason this year.

► Hernandez is one of three starters along the offensive line returning in 2017, and they'll be providing protection for junior quarterback **Ryan Metz**. Metz threw for 1,375 yards and 14 touchdowns a year ago on 64.7-percent passing while registering four interceptions. The biggest hole for the team could be at running back, where it must replace the program's all-time leading rusher in Aaron Jones. A fifth-round draft pick by the Green Bay Packers in April, Jones accounted for 1,773 of the team's 2,226 rushing yards a year ago.

► Leading the UTEP defense is senior linebacker **Alvin Jones**, who was named to the Preseason All-Conference USA Team, along with Hernandez. Jones led the Miners with 93 tackles last year and is one of seven starters returning on defense.

SERIES WITH THE MINERS

► Oklahoma is 3-0 all-time with UTEP, outscoring the Miners by a combined 147-21 (49-7 average score). In Norman, OU is 2-0 in the series and has outscored UTEP by a 123-14 count.

► OU and UTEP last met in 2012, a 24-7 season-opening victory for the Sooners in El Paso. Damien Williams ran for 103 yards on 10 carries, a performance that was highlighted by a 65-yard touchdown run with three minutes left in the fourth quarter to seal the win. Also aiding the offense was Kenny Stills, who caught six passes for 121 yards and another score. The Sooners' defense held UTEP to no offensive points (blocked punt returned for a score), 48 passing yards and 255 total yards.

► The last meeting in Norman came in the third game of the 2002 season and resulted in a 68-0 Oklahoma win. The Sooners recorded 549 yards of offense, but the defense was just as responsible for the the program's largest victory margin in 13

years. OU registered five takeaways, two of them interception returns for scores (a 50-yarder by Antonio Perkins and a 45-yarder by Michael Hawkins). Nate Hybl threw for 278 yards and two touchdowns while Quentin Griffin ran for 108 yards and two scores.

2016 REVIEW: BIG 12 AND SUGAR BOWL CHAMPS

► Oklahoma rebounded from a 1-2 start in 2016 by winning all nine of its Big 12 games to claim a second straight league title, and capped the season with a 35-19 Sugar Bowl victory over Auburn. OU, which finished the year No. 3 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 5 in the AP Poll, became the first Big 12 team to go 9-0 in regular season conference play.

► OU's Big 12 title was its 10th in 18 years under former head coach Bob Stoops. No other Big 12 program won more than two league championships during that time span.

► The Sooners boasted arguably the best offense in the country, leading the nation in passing efficiency rating (FBS record 193.79) and pass completion percentage (.706), while ranking second in total offense (554.8 ypg), third in scoring offense (43.9 ppg), fourth in third down conversion percentage (.515), 12th in passing offense (318.0 ypg), 18th in rushing offense (236.8 ypg) and 25th in time of possession (32:16).

► Oklahoma is the highest scoring football program of all-time, and only three Sooner teams ever averaged more points than its 43.9 per game last season. OU's 7.5 yards per play in 2016 rank as second most in school history (the 1971 team averaged 7.6).

► With 86 yards against Auburn in the Sugar Bowl, junior running back Samaje Perine became OU's career rushing leader. Perine, who declared for the NFL Draft following the season, finished his career with 4,122 rushing yards to break Billy Sims' former school record of 4,118. Perine rushed for 49 TDs in his career and averaged 6.0 yards per carry.

► Maligned for first half of the season, Oklahoma's defense was much stronger the final six games of the year. In OU's first seven contests, opponents averaged 36.7 points and 475.9 yards. Over the last six outings, the Sooners held foes to an average of 19.7 points and 380.8 yards. OU, which led the Big 12 in opponent pass completion percentage (.547), held each of its last four opponents to sub-50-percent passing (those four teams, all ranked, combined to complete 45.6 percent of their pass attempts vs. the Sooners [57-of-125]).

► OU led the Big 12 with seven first-team all-league selections (five offensive and two defensive) and landed five more on the second team. Seven more were honorable mention All-Big 12 picks. Stoops was named Big 12 Coach of the Year for the sixth time, wide receiver Dede Westbrook was named Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year and left tackle **Orlando Brown** was named Big 12 Offensive Lineman of the Year.

► Westbrook became OU's first unanimous All-American since 2004 (offensive tackle Jammal Brown and running back Adrian Peterson) when he was named to the first team by each of the five official All-America squads (AFCA, AP, FWAA, Sporting News and Walter Camp Foundation). OU now boasts 32 unanimous All-Americans, more than any other program. Westbrook is also the Sooners' 77th consensus All-American, more than any other school in the modern era.

► **Baker Mayfield** and Westbrook each were national award winners in 2016. For the second year in a row, Mayfield won the Burlsworth Trophy, given to the nation's best player who began his career as a walk-on. Westbrook became OU's first winner of the Biletnikoff Award, presented to the nation's outstanding receiver. Mayfield and Westbrook were each Heisman Trophy finalists, with the quarterback finishing third and the receiver fourth.

WELCOME BACK

► Not including specialists, the Sooners return 16 players who started at least six games last year (nine on offense, seven on defense). Nine other position players who started at least one game a year ago (five offense, four defense) are also back. In addition, OU returns its placekicker, punter, long snapper and holder.

► OU welcomes back its statistical leaders in passing yards (**Baker Mayfield**; 3,965), passing TDs (Mayfield; 40), sacks (**Ogbonnia Okoronkwo**; 9.0), tackles for loss (Okoronkwo; 12.0) and pass breakups (**Jordan Thomas**; 17).

PREVIEWING THE OFFENSE

► Despite returning nine of 11 starters on offense, the Sooners face the challenge of replacing key statistical production on that side of the ball under first-year co-coordinators **Cale Gundy** and **Bill Bedenbaugh**. OU welcomes back quarterback **Baker Mayfield**, who set the FBS single-season record for passing efficiency rating last year (196.39), as well as all five offensive line starters, but will be without three of the nation's top skill players last year in Biletnikoff winner Dede Westbrook (80 catches for 1,524 yards and 17 TDs), and running backs Joe Mixon (school-record 2,331 all-purpose yards and 16 total TDs) and Samaje Perine (1,060 rushing yards and 13 total TDs). In all, the Sooners return 65.3 percent of their total offense yards, 99.4 percent of their passing yards, 19.6 percent of their rushing yards and 34.6 percent of their receiving yards.

► Mayfield, a redshirt senior, has been phenomenal in his two years at OU, leading it to a 22-4 record (17-1 in Big 12 play) and completing 69.5 percent of his pass attempts for 7,665 yards and 76 TDs against just 15 interceptions. OU's career leader in completion percentage and passing efficiency rating (184.3; only one other player is above 153.0 and that's Sam Bradford at 175.6), Mayfield finished fourth in Heisman Trophy voting in 2015 and third last year. He led the nation last season in passing efficiency rating, completion percentage (.709) and yards per pass attempt (11.1), while ranking second in yards per completion (15.6), fourth in points responsible for per game (21.5) and sixth in passing TDs (40). His 10 completions of at least 60 yards last year were the most by an FBS player since at least 2010.

► Key to Mayfield's success last year was an offensive line unit that returns intact in 2017. Anchored by junior and two-year starting left tackle **Orlando Brown** (the 2016 Big 12 Offensive Lineman of the Year), the unit led the league last year by allowing just 1.6 sacks per game while paving the way for a ground game that averaged 236.8 yards per contest. Joining Brown as returning starters are left guard **Ben Powers**, center **Erick Wren**, right guard **Dru Samia** and right tackle **Bobby Evans**. Guard **Gody Ford** and guard/center **Jonathan Alvarez**, who each started the first three games last year before getting injured, also return.

► Replacing Westbrook will be no small task. But then again, few experts predicted Westbrook would match — much less exceed — the production of wideout Sterling Shepard after his graduation in 2015. The Sooners return six of their top nine pass catchers from a year ago, including tight end **Mark Andrews**, who caught 31 balls for 489 yards (15.8 per catch) and seven TDs. Receivers **A.D. Miller** (12 catches, 145 yards, 2 TDs), **Jeffery Mead** (10 catches, 150 yards, 3 TDs) and **Mykel Jones** (13 catches, 106 yards, 0 TDs) could all see elevated roles in 2017 as OU also looks to replace the production of senior Geno Lewis (32 catches, 388 yards, 2 TDs). The Sooners also welcome Kentucky grad transfer **Jeff Badet**, who led the SEC and ranked sixth nationally last year with his 21.6 yards per catch, and four-star newcomers **Marquise Brown** (sophomore receiver), **Grant Calcaterra** (freshman tight end) and **CeeDee Lamb** (freshman receiver). Redshirt junior **Nick Basquine** (20 catches, 265 yards, 2 TDs) was lost for the season with an Achilles tendon injury in training camp.

► With the departure of Mixon and Perine, OU returns just 19.6 percent of its rushing yards, and almost all of that came from now-sophomore **Abdul Adams** (283 yards; 5.3 ypc), Mayfield (177 yards; 2.3 ypc) and senior H-back **Dimitri Flowers** (115 yards [all in one game]; 5.2 ypc). Adams will battle redshirt sophomore **Rodney Anderson**, junior college transfer **Marcelias Sutton** and freshman **Trey Sermon** for carries in 2017. Anderson is in his third year on campus but has played in only two games due to injuries that ended his 2015 and 2016 seasons (missed all of last year).

PREVIEWING THE DEFENSE

► After leading the Big 12 in the majority of defensive categories in 2015 under coordinator **Mike Stoops**, the Sooners experienced their struggles the first half of 2016. OU responded to limit opponents much more effectively the final six games, though, and returns the majority of its key players for 2017. Despite losing its leading tackler in linebacker Jordan Evans, the Sooners bring back 61.9 percent of their tackle production, 61.0 percent of their tackles for loss, 66.0 percent of their sacks and 44.4 percent of their interceptions.

► Headlining OU's cast of defensive returners are defensive end/outside linebacker **Ogbonnia Okoronkwo** and cornerback **Jordan Thomas**, both seniors and both preseason All-Big 12 picks. Okoronkwo, a second-team all-conference choice last year, ranked third on the squad with 71 tackles while posting team highs of 12.0 tackles for loss, 9.0 sacks and seven QB hurries. Thomas, a first-team all-league honoree in 2016, registered a Big 12-high 17 pass breakups last year, tied for third most in OU single-season history. He needs 11 more to tie for third place on the school's career chart and 18 to tie for second.

► Oklahoma returns six of its top eight tacklers from last season and eight of its top 11, including senior linebacker **Emmanuel Beal**, who ranked second with 81 stops, Okoronkwo, who ranked third, and senior safety **Steven Parker**, who ranked fifth with 63.

► OU's defensive line features familiar faces in tackle **Matt Romar** and end **D.J. Ward**, both redshirt seniors, and redshirt sophomore tackle **Neville Gallimore**. Sophomore outside linebacker **Caleb Kelly** was highly effective as a starter the last six weeks of the season. Kelly dominated in the Sugar Bowl with his 12 tackles as OU limited Auburn to just 339 yards of offense.

► The Sooners have one more defensive coach on staff than they did last year. One week after he was promoted to head coach, **Lincoln Riley** hired mentor and 37-year coaching veteran **Ruffin McNeill** as assistant head coach and defensive tackles coach. The former East Carolina head coach and Texas Tech defensive coordinator joins defensive ends coach **Calvin Thibodeaux** in guiding OU's defensive line. Thibodeaux coached ends and tackles last year.

PREVIEWING THE SPECIAL TEAMS

► For the second year in a row, **Austin Seibert** handled punting and placekicking duties for the Sooners in 2016, and special teams coordinator Jay Boulware hinted recently that Seibert could be in line to do the same this year. Seibert has made 29 of his 39 career field goal attempts (73.6 percent) with a long of 46. With great hang time to allow his coverage team to get into position, he has also punted 105 times for an average of 41.6 yards, has forced 59 fair catches and has pinned opponents inside their own 20-yard line 45 times. Seibert, on the 2017 Ray Guy Award watch list, stayed busy all of last year as he also handled kickoff duties, and with the Sooners' prolific offense, he had plenty of chances. He kicked 99 times, forcing a touch-back on half of those (49). Also on the roster at the kicking positions are redshirt junior **Kyle Pfau**, redshirt freshman **Reece Morrison** and freshman **Reeves Mundschau**, who was rated by 247Sports as the nation's No. 2 punter.

► A true unknown heading into preseason camp was the identity of OU's return men for 2017. Joe Mixon (21) and Dede Westbrook (nine) were responsible for 30 of OU's 35 kickoff returns last season, and all 12 of OU's punt returns were recorded by players no longer on the roster (including five by Westbrook and four by Mixon). **Mykel Jones** (two) and H-back **Carson Meier** (one) are the only returning players who ran back a kickoff last year, though Meier was an up-man. Joining Jones as possible candidates to return punts and kicks are running backs **Rodney Anderson** and **Marcelias Sutton**, and first-year Sooner receivers **Jeff Badet**, **Marquise Brown** and **CeeDee Lamb**. A graduate transfer from Kentucky, Badet ranked sixth in the SEC last year by averaging 22.9 yards on his 15 kickoff returns.

MAYFIELD EVEN BETTER IN 2016

► Redshirt sophomore walk-on quarterback **Connor McGinnis** is back as the Sooners' holder this season, as is senior **Wesley Horky**, who handled punt and kick snaps a year ago. Horky was also one of OU's leading tacklers in punt coverage.

ANOTHER CHALLENGING SCHEDULE

► The Sooners are accustomed to playing one of the nation's toughest schedules, and 2017 will be no different. Five of OU's 12 regular season games will be against teams ranked in the preseason AP poll (at No. 2 Ohio State [11-2 in 2016], at No. 10 Oklahoma State [10-3], at No. 20 Kansas State [9-4], vs. No. 22 West Virginia [10-3] and vs. No. 23 Texas [5-7] in Dallas). TCU is at No. 26 in the preseason poll.

► *Sports Illustrated* ranked two of the Sooners' games among its 10 best in the nation for 2017. OU's Sept. 9 contest at Ohio State and its Nov. 4 outing at Oklahoma State both made the list.

SOONERS HAVE DOMINATED BIG 12 ERA

► OU's performance in the Big 12 Conference this millennium has been nothing short of dominant. The Sooners have won 10 Big 12 titles in the last 17 seasons, with no other program during that span winning more than two.

► Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed 10 league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each).

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (628) than any other program. Only Boise State owns a better winning percentage (.772; played 449 fewer games) during that span than OU (.764).

► OU is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 34,484 points (in 1,246 games).

► No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 37. In addition, OU's 22 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.

► Since former head coach Bob Stoops arrived at OU in 1999, the Sooners lead all Power Five conference programs in wins (190) and points scored (8,912).

► Only Ohio State (105) has been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll more weeks than Oklahoma (102). OU's 395 weeks in the AP's top five are more than any other school. The AP Poll was introduced in 1936.

► Only Alabama (9) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

TWO MORE OU HEISMAN FINALISTS

► Oklahoma quarterback **Baker Mayfield** and wide receiver Dede Westbrook comprised 40 percent of last year's group of Heisman Trophy finalists. They became the sixth and seventh finalists during the 18-year Bob Stoops era, more than any other school during that time span. OU boasts eight finalists since the Heisman started naming them in 1982.

► Mayfield finished third in Heisman voting last year while Westbrook finished fourth. It marked just the fourth time since 1955 and first since 2004 that a pair of teammates finished in the top four of the Heisman balloting. OU's Adrian Peterson and Jason White were the last to do it in 2004. They finished third and fourth, respectively.

► Last year marked the first time in the 82-year history of the Heisman Trophy that a quarterback and wide receiver from the same team each finished in the top four of the voting. Mayfield also finished fourth in 2015.

EXTRA POINTS

► Oklahoma has won more Big 12 championships since the start of the 2000 season (10) than it has lost home games (nine).

► OU reserve quarterback **Kyler Murray** was rated this month by MaxPreps as the best high school signal-caller of the last decade. Murray, a redshirt sophomore who transferred from Texas A&M following the 2015 season, was a consensus five-star recruit out of Allen (Texas) High School and earned national-player-of-the-year honors from Gatorade, MaxPreps, Parade and USA Today following his senior year in 2014. He rolled up 14,500 rushing and receiving yards, as well as 186 total touchdowns in his three seasons.

► Head coach **Lincoln Riley** will turn 34 next week (Sept. 5). He is the youngest FBS head coach.

► Four of OU's top six single-game total offense yardage figures since 2000 have come the last two seasons with Riley as offensive coordinator (1 – 854 at Texas Tech in 2016; 2 – 773 vs. Tulsa in 2015; 4 – 710 at Kansas in 2015; 6 – 684 vs. Iowa State in 2015).

► Of all active FBS players with at least 11 career TD receptions, **Mark Andrews** has the best TD-to-catch ratio at 28.0 percent (14 TDs on 50 catches). The next closest players are Boise State's Cedrick Wilson and San Diego State's Mikah Holder (11 TDs on 56 catches; 19.6%).

► Oklahoma is 4-2 all-time in overtime games. The last one was a 31-24 double-overtime win at No. 23 Tennessee in 2015.

► In the last six seasons, 31 Sooners have been taken in the NFL Draft (the Big 12 school with the next highest total is Baylor with 20). Those 31 picks are the seventh most of any school over the last six years. Only Alabama (49), LSU (40), Florida State (40), Ohio State (37), Florida (37) and Clemson (33) have had more.

► OU has had at least four players selected in each of the last 10 NFL Drafts. LSU (also 10) is the only other school that can make that claim.

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and the second-largest collegiate video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.
- In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director **Bennie Owen** suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and its existing figure of 83,489 (2016).
- In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

- The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that has initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.
- The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons will benefit from two new clubs.
- Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.

LINCOLN RILEY

**FIRST SEASON AS HEAD COACH • YOUNGEST HEAD COACH IN FOOTBALL BOWL SUBDIVISION
WINNER OF 2015 BROYLES AWARD AS NATION'S TOP ASSISTANT COACH**

A new era of Oklahoma football is underway. After presiding over two of the most prolific offensive seasons in program history, 33-year-old Lincoln Riley took over the OU head coaching reins on June 7, 2017, following the retirement of one of the most accomplished coaches of the last quarter century in Bob Stoops. OU's 22nd head coach, Riley served as the program's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach the last two seasons.

The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach, Riley takes over a program fresh off a 10th Big 12 championship and that is primed for more with a \$160 million south end zone project now complete. With some of the country's most eye-catching facilities, a highly touted 2017 recruiting class and coaching and support staffs that remain completely intact, Oklahoma's championship expectations are not altered in the least.

Originally from the 5,000-person West Texas town of Muleshoe, Riley made his name as perhaps the best up-and-coming star in college football by overseeing a balanced and explosive Oklahoma offense the last two seasons. In 2016, the Sooners led the nation in passing efficiency rating (their mark of 193.79 set an FBS record) and pass completion percentage (.706), while ranking second in total offense (554.8 ypg) and third in scoring offense (43.9 ppg) and third-down conversion percentage (.515). Only one team in school history averaged more yards per play than the Sooners' 7.5 in 2016 (the 1971 squad averaged 7.6). OU's potent offensive attack is a big reason the Sooners won a second straight Big 12 title and handled Auburn 35-19 in the Sugar Bowl.

Individual player accomplishments were abundant in 2016 under Riley's tutelage. Quarterback Baker Mayfield and wide receiver Dede Westbrook finished third and fourth in Heisman Trophy voting, respectively, marking just the fourth time since 1955 and first since 2004 that a pair of teammates from any school finished in the top four of Heisman balloting. Westbrook, the Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year, was OU's first unanimous All-American since 2004 and the Sooners' first recipient of the Biletnikoff Award as the nation's outstanding receiver. Running back Joe Mixon finished second nationally and set the OU single-season record with 2,331 all-purpose yards, while backfield mate Samaje Perine set the school career rushing record with 4,122 yards in only three seasons.

Riley was just as good for OU in his first season as offensive coordinator, earning the 2015 Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach after the Sooners ranked fourth nationally in scoring (43.5 ppg) and seventh in total offense (530.2 ypg). Mayfield, who finished fourth in Heisman voting, was the Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year and *Sporting News* national player of the year, while Westbrook was Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year. With Riley leading a high-flying attack, eight offensive players earned all-league honors.

Oklahoma's newest head man joined the Sooners in January 2015 after he caught the eye of Stoops during a highly successful five-year stint as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Ruffin McNeill at East Carolina from 2010-14. With OU looking for a new play caller and wanting to get back to the up-tempo attack it helped make mainstream, Riley's numbers at ECU made him the perfect hire.

At East Carolina, Riley installed and directed a spread offensive scheme that made an immediate impact as the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual school offensive records in his five seasons with the program. His squads recorded the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four marks for total offense in a season.

He spent his final season with the Pirates serving in the role of assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach

in 2014 as the team ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 ypg) and was fifth in total offense (533.0 ypg). With Riley calling the shots, the Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense.

Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down conversion percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone scoring efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

Among his notable pupils, Riley helped transform a pair of East Carolina wide receivers into the most productive pass catchers in FBS history. He guided walk-on Justin Hardy to 387 career catches, breaking the NCAA record previously held by OU's Ryan Broyles (349). Hardy's 4,541 career receiving yards rank third all-time in FBS annals as he flourished in Riley's offense, registering three 1,000-yard seasons at ECU that culminated with a 121-catch, 1,494-yard year as a senior in 2014. Riley also coached recent second-round NFL draft selection Zay Jones for the first two years of his career. Jones went on to break Hardy's record and is the NCAA's leader in career receptions (399) and receptions in a season (158 in 2016).

Already overseeing Mayfield's record-setting career, Riley also developed dynamic quarterbacks Dominique Davis and Shane Carden at ECU. Conference USA's 2010 Newcomer of the Year, Davis set ECU career marks for completions and TD passes despite playing just two seasons. Davis ranked second among FBS signal callers with 393 completions and 46 total touchdowns in 2010. He set an NCAA record with a stretch of 36 straight completions in 2011.

Carden took over the job in 2012 and went on to break the majority of Davis' records, becoming the first 4,000-yard passer in program history and setting single-season standards for completion percentage (70.5 in 2013) and passing yards (4,736 in 2014). Carden earned Conference USA MVP honors in 2013 and was the American Conference's Offensive Player of the Year in 2014. He led all FBS passers with 392 completions in 2014.

Prior to East Carolina, Riley spent seven seasons on the staff at Texas Tech, where he was part of seven bowl teams and five bowl wins. During that span, Red Raiders quarterbacks won NCAA passing titles in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007. A walk-on quarterback at Tech during the spring and summer of 2003 who then became a student coach, Riley immersed himself in head coach Mike Leach's offense and worked his way into a full-time position as wide receivers coach in 2007. He served as inside receivers coach in 2008 and '09, and eventually called plays as interim offensive coordinator in the 2010 Alamo Bowl, where the Red Raiders racked up 579 yards in a 41-31 victory over Michigan State to cap the 2009 season.

Under Riley's guidance in 2007, wide receiver Michael Crabtree won the Biletnikoff Award after smashing Big 12 records and NCAA freshman standards with 134 receptions for 1,962 yards. Crabtree also accumulated 22 touchdown catches his first season. In fact, wide receiver Danny Amendola joined Crabtree that year as Texas Tech receivers who each amassed 100-catch, 1,000-yard efforts.

A 2006 Texas Tech graduate who earned a Bachelor of Science degree in exercise and sport sciences, Riley and his wife, Caitlin, have two daughters, Sloan and Stella.
