OPENING KICK

► No. 5/6 Oklahoma plays its first road game under rookie head coach **Lincoln Riley** when it takes on No. 2/2 Ohio State on Saturday at 6:30 p.m. CT at Ohio Stadium in Columbus. The game will be televised nationally by ABC with **Chris Fowler, Kirk Herbstreit** and **Maria Taylor** announcing.

► Riley turned 34 this Tuesday (Sept. 5). He is the youngest FBS head coach.

► ESPN College GameDay will air from Columbus on Saturday, marking the 31st time the show will have been on hand for a game involving Oklahoma. Only Ohio State (40 times), Alabama (39), Florida (37) and Florida State (33) have been featured more often than OU. The Sooners are 21-9 in such games, including 10-2 in true road game matchups (last was a 58-23 win at Oklahoma State in 2015).

► OU has three Ohioans on its roster: senior linebacker **Emmanuel Beal** (Columbus; Everest HS), redshirt junior offensive lineman **Alex Dalton** (Troy; Troy HS), and walk-on freshman long snapper **Kasey Kelleher** (Peninsula; Woodridge HS). Beal was OU's second-leading tackler last year while Dalton was lost for the 2017 season due to a summer injury. Kelleher has yet to play.

► The Sooners are looking to register their 12th consecutive true road win, which would tie as the third longest streak in school history.

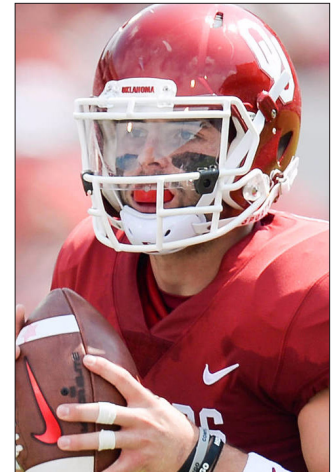
► OU is coming off a 56-7 home win over UTEP in which the Sooners racked up 676 yards of offense while holding the Miners to 176. OU's quarterbacks combined to go 32-for-36 for 496 yards and four touchdowns, posting a school-record 241.3 pass efficiency rating (minimum of 30 attempts). Mayfield played only the first half, going 19-for-20 for 329 yards and three TDs.

► Ohio State opened its season with a 49-21 road win over Indiana last Thursday. IU led 21-20 with less than five minutes left in the third quarter before the Buckeyes scored 28 unanswered points. Senior QB **J.T. Barrett** was 20-for-35 for 304 yards and three TDs, while running back **J.K. Dobbins** set a school record for a freshman in a season opener with 181 rushing yards (6.2 average).

FIVE KEY STORYLINES

► The last time Oklahoma lost was 51 weeks ago — to Ohio State. The Sooners have won 11 games since then, good for the nation's longest current streak, and OU's longest since winning 11 straight over the 2010 and '11 seasons. The last time it won 12 consecutive games was in 2004 (started 12-0 before losing in Orange Bowl).

► Saturday's contest will mark Oklahoma's second game at Ohio State. Forty years ago (Sept. 24, 1977), No. 3 OU knocked off No. 4 OSU in Columbus, 29-28, as **Uwe von Schamann** booted a 41-yard field goal with three seconds remaining. The game-winner is known to Sooners fans as "The Kick." OU was coached by **Barry Switzer** and the Buckeyes were coached by **Woody Hayes**.



Baker Mayfield was 19-for-20 for 329 yards and three TDs in one half of work in OU's 56-7 season-opening win over UTEP. The senior, who set the FBS single-season record last for passing efficiency rating last year (196.4), posted a 282.7 rating against the Miners. ► The Sooners have won 11 consecutive true road games (the fourth longest streak in school history) and are outscoring opponents 559-289 (51-26 average) in those contests. OU is averaging 570.8 yards per game during the streak while allowing 410.0 an outing. In the running game, OU is outgaining opponents 3,171 yards to 1,403 (288.3-127.5 average). QB **Baker Mayfield** is 9-0 as a Sooner in true road games. In those contests, he's completed 191-of-272 passes (70.2 percent) for 2,618 yards with 32 touchdowns against just five interceptions (6.4 ratio) for an efficiency rating of 186.2. Additionally, he's run 82 times for 309 yards (3.8 avg.) and seven scores.

► Since the start of the 2009 season, the Sooners are 14-2 against teams they lost to the previous season. The only occasions of losses they sustained to an opponent in consecutive seasons came to Baylor in 2013 and 2014, and Clemson in 2014 and 2015.

► Saturday's game will feature the top two programs in the Associated Press' all-time top 25 that was revealed in August 2016. Ohio State was slotted No. 1 and Oklahoma No. 2. According to the AP, its formula for determining its all-time ranking counted poll appearances (one point) to mark consistency, No. 1 rankings (one point) to acknowledge elite programs, and gave a bonus for AP championships (10 points). Ohio State, which has five national titles, accumulated 1,112 points while Oklahoma, which has won seven national championships, racked up 1,055 points. Joining the Sooners and Buckeyes in the top 10 were Notre Dame (1,042 points), Alabama (933), Southern California (974), Nebraska (901), Michigan (894), Texas (822), Florida State (714) and Florida (674).

RECAPPING THE WIN OVER UTEP (STATS ON PAGE 33)

► Oklahoma started the **Lincoln Riley** era with a bang Saturday by dealing UTEP a 56-7 defeat in front of 86,076 fans. It was OU's 111th consecutive home sellout.

► Eight Sooners accounted for the team's eight touchdowns. OU scored the game's final 49 points, and its 56 points represented the third most in a head coaching debut (Riley is the program's 22nd head coach).

► **Baker Mayfield** set an OU record for most completions to start a game (16) and finished 19-for-20 for 329 yards and three TDs. He did not play in the second half. Sophomore **Kyler Murray** went 10-for-11 for 149 yards and a score in his first action since 2015 when he was at Texas A&M.

► OU's 241.3 pass efficiency rating marked a school record (minimum of 30 attempts). Mayfield, who last year set the FBS single-season record for pass efficiency rating (196.4), posted a 282.7 figure Saturday, the second best in OU history (minimum 20 attempts).

► The Sooners threw for 496 yards (their fifth most since 2000) while limiting UTEP to 94 passing yards. The 402-yard difference through the air ranks as the second largest in school history (outgained Kansas State in 2011 by 462 yards [520-58]).

► Junior tight end **Mark Andrews**, OU's active career leader in receptions (57) and receiving touchdowns (15), caught a career-high seven passes for a career-high 134 yards and a score, all in the first half.

► Fourteen Sooners caught at least one pass in the game, the same number who registered at least one catch all of last season.

► **Rodney Anderson**, **Grant Calcaterra**, **CeeDee Lamb**, **Lee Morris**, **Marcelias Sutton** and **Jaxon Uhles** all scored their first career touchdowns Saturday, while **Dimitri Flowers** registered his first career rushing score.

► Defensively, the Sooners did not allow any points after UTEP's opening possession. Oklahoma gave up 167 total yards (73 rushing, 94 passing), its fewest since giving up 110 to Kansas State in a 55-0 rout on Oct. 17, 2015 (22 games ago). OU averaged 9.1 yards per play to the Miners' 3.5. **Ogbonnia Okoronkwo** registered four tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack.

► Lamb and **Kenneth Murray** started the game as true freshmen. Lamb (three catches, 21 yards, 1 TD) became just OU's third true freshman receiver to ever start a season opener, while Murray (three tackles) became the first OU true freshman in 42 years to start a season opener at inside linebacker. **Daryl Hunt** was the last to do it in 1975. Since Hunt, only four other true frosh have started at inside linebacker for the Sooners in any game: **Tyrell Peters** in 1993, **Rocky Calmus** and **Michael Delaney** in 1998 and **Dominique Alexander** in 2013.

► Eight total true freshmen saw action for the Sooners (three offensive players and five defensive).

SOONERS STRONG IN TOP-10 MATCHUPS

► Since the start of the 2000 season, Oklahoma is 15-9 (.625) in AP top-10 matchups. OU's record in regular season top-10 matchups in that span is 11-4 (.733).

► The last time the Sooners played an AP top-2 opponent on the road was in 2000 (No. 8 OU beat No. 2 Kansas State 41-31). They went 13-0 that year and earned their seventh national championship.

► Saturday's game will mark just Oklahoma's eighth AP top-10 matchup on the road since the start of the 2000 campaign. The Sooners are 5-2 in those contests and have won the last two (2016 at West Virginia and 2015 at Oklahoma State) and four of the last five.

► This week's game will mark just OU's third regular season AP top-10 matchup against a non-conference opponent since 2000 (No. 1 Oklahoma won 23-13 at No. 5 Florida State in 2011; No. 5 Notre Dame won 30-13 at No. 8 OU in 2012).

NOTING OU'S 11-GAME WINNING STREAK

- ▶ Since losing 45-24 to No. 3 Ohio State on Sept. 17 last season, Oklahoma has rattled off 11 straight victories, good for the nation's longest streak. Five of those 11 wins were against ranked teams.
- ▶ The Sooners have outscored their last 11 opponents by 234 points (an average of 21.3) and have outgained them by an average of 170.2 yards. On the ground, OU is outgaining teams by an average of 90.3 yards (247.5-157.2) during the streak.
- ▶ Dating back to Oct. 1, 2016, (OU's first win of the streak), the Sooners rank first nationally in completion percentage (74.0), passing TDs (38), TD percentage (11.9 percent of passes), efficiency rating (207.7; next highest is 181.9 and next highest Power 5 is 173.4), yards from scrimmage (6,452) and yards from scrimmage per game (586.5; next most is 547.3).
- ▶ OU is tied for the national lead since Oct. 1, 2016, with 68 touchdowns from scrimmage and leads all Power 5 schools (second overall) with 71 total touchdowns. OU also leads all Power 5 schools and ranks second nationally with 521 points and 47.4 points per game.

▶ Quarterback **Baker Mayfield** has completed 74.4 percent of his passes over the last 11 games (average of 318.3 yards) with 36 TDs and just six interceptions. Dating back to Oct. 1 (and among QBs with at least 100 pass attempts), Mayfield ranks first nationally in pass completion percentage, passing touchdowns, yards per pass attempt (12.0), touchdown percentage (12.3 percent of passes) and efficiency rating (211.2; next closest is 190.2; next closest Power 5 QB is 174.0).

SCOUTING OHIO STATE

- ▶ Head coach **Urban Meyer** is in his sixth year at Ohio State. He is 62-6 at OSU, having won at least 11 games in each of his five seasons there and posting a 34-2 home record. Meyer led the Buckeyes to a national championship in 2014. The title was the third of his career (won with Florida in 2006 and 2008 [beat Oklahoma]).
- ▶ OSU returned 15 starters from its 2016 team that went 11-2 and finished the year as a College Football Playoff semifinalist. The Buckeyes returned eight starters on offense and seven on defense.
- ▶ In his collegiate debut in a 49-21 road win over Indiana on Thursday, Ohio State running back **J.K. Dobbins** ran for 181 yards on 29 carries. Dobbins became the second true freshman OSU running back to start in his collegiate debut, and his 181 yards set a first-game freshman school rushing record and ranked as the sixth most nationally in week one.

▶ Senior quarterback **J.T. Barrett** was 20-of-35 passing for 304 yards and three touchdowns against Indiana. He also ran for 61 yards on 13 attempts and a touchdown. Barrett set his 24th school record against the Hoosiers with 365 total offensive yards, which gave him a school-best 9,211 yards. In 37 career games, Barrett has thrown for 72 touchdowns (against 21 interceptions) and run for 32.

▶ Defensively, Ohio State surrendered just 17 yards on the ground against the Hoosiers, tallied five sacks and forced three turnovers it turned into 17 points. Three Buckeyes defensive backs were picked in the first round of April's NFL Draft.

▶ Indiana outgained OSU 286-216 in the first half and led 14-13, before the Buckeyes outgained the Hoosiers 380-151 and outscored them 36-7 after halftime.

SERIES WITH THE BUCKEYES

▶ The Sooners are 1-2 all-time against Ohio State, winning 29-28 in Columbus in 1977, and losing 24-14 in Norman in 1983 and 45-24 in Norman last year. Both programs were ranked in the top 15 of the AP poll in all three games (OU's average rank has been 6.3 and OSU's has been 4.3).

▶ The first meeting resulted in one of the most iconic endings in OU history, as **Uwe von Schamann** kicked a 41-yard field goal with less than 10 seconds to play to give the No. 3 Sooners a 29-28 win over the No. 4 Buckeyes. Oklahoma raced out to a 17-0 first-quarter lead after **Elvis Peacock** ran in a **Thomas Lott** fumble for a touchdown and **Billy Sims** scored from 14 yards out. The lead grew to 20-0 early in the second quarter, but Ohio State scored four consecutive touchdowns to lead 28-20 with under seven minutes to play in the third quarter. Oklahoma lost Lott and Sims to injuries in the contest but managed to cut the deficit to 28-26 with less than two minutes to play on a touchdown run by Peacock. The two-point conversion try was no good, so OU attempted an onside kick, which **Mike Babb** successfully recovered. OU gained 27 yards over the next four plays, setting up Von Schamann's dramatic kick.

▶ In the rematch six years later, Ohio State quarterback **Mike Tomczak** connected with tight end **John Frank** for two touchdowns for an early lead and the sixth-ranked Buckeyes posted a 24-14 upset over the second-ranked Sooners. OU played most of the game without star running back **Marcus Dupree**, who was sidelined with a bruised knee with nine minutes left in the first half. Dupree gained just 30 yards and had fumble that OSU converted into a touchdown. It was the only turnover of the game for the Sooners. **Spencer Tillman** gained 83 yards on 13 carries for Oklahoma, 37 of them on a touchdown run.

▶ A Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium record crowd of 87,979 saw the 14th-ranked Sooners fall to No. 3 Ohio State last season, 45-24. Trailing late in the first quarter, the Sooners cut the deficit to 14-7 when sophomore **Joe Mixon** went 97 yards for a kickoff return touchdown, but OU never get any closer. Mixon had 225 all-purpose yards with 132 on kickoff returns, 78 rushing and 15 receiving. **Baker Mayfield** threw for 226 yards and two touchdowns, one to **A.D. Miller** and one to **Mark Andrews**, but he also threw a pair of interceptions, including one that was returned for a touchdown by **Jerome**

NATION'S BEST OFFENSE

Lincoln Riley joined the Oklahoma staff prior to the 2015 season, the same year **Baker Mayfield** began his OU playing career. Since the start of that campaign, the Sooners can lay legitimate claim to being the nation's most productive overall offense. MAYFIELD/BARRETT COMPARISON

OFFENSE HAS ROLLED UNDER RILEY, MAYFIELD

► Oklahoma has a legitimate claim as the nation's most productive offense since the start of the 2015 season, which was **Lincoln Riley's** first year as OU's offensive coordinator and quarterback **Baker Mayfield's** first campaign playing for the Sooners. Riley called plays as the program's offensive coordinator and continues to as head coach.

► The Sooners have posted a 23-4 (.852) record since Riley's and Mayfield's OU debut (17-1 in Big 12 play), with Mayfield the starter in all 27 contests.

► Since the start of the 2015 season, OU ranks first nationally in passing efficiency rating (182.4; next closest is 175.4), second in completion percentage (.693), third in scoring offense (44.2; second in Power 5), third in total offense (547.4), eighth in passing offense (319.9; sixth in Power 5) and 18th in rushing offense (227.6; ninth in Power 5).

► In 27 games since the start of the 2015 season, OU has registered at least 500 yards of total offense 19 times, including in nine of the last 11 outings. The Sooners have topped the 600-yard mark on nine occasions over the last 27 contests.

► Four of OU's top six single-game total offense yardage figures since 2000, and five of the top eight, have come over the last 25 games (1 – 854 at Texas Tech in 2016; 2 – 773 vs. Tulsa in 2015; 4 – 710 at Kansas in 2015; 6 – 684 vs. Iowa State in 2015; 8 – 676 vs. UTEP on Saturday).

WELCOME BACK

► Not including specialists, the Sooners returned 16 players in 2017 who started at least six games last year (nine on offense, seven on defense). Nine other position players who started at least one game a year ago (five offense, four defense) are also back. In addition, OU returned its placekicker, punter, long snapper and holder.

► OU welcomed back its statistical leaders in passing yards (**Baker Mayfield**; 3,965), passing TDs (Mayfield; 40), sacks (**Ogbonnia Okoronkwo**; 9.0), tackles for loss (Okoronkwo; 12.0) and pass breakups (**Jordan Thomas**; 17).

2016 REVIEW: BIG 12 AND SUGAR BOWL CHAMPS

► Oklahoma rebounded from a 1-2 start in 2016 by winning all nine of its Big 12 games to claim a second straight league title, and capped the season with a 35-19 Sugar Bowl victory over Auburn. OU, which finished the year No. 3 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 5 in the AP Poll, became the first Big 12 team to go 9-0 in regular season conference play.

► OU's Big 12 title was its 10th in 18 years under former head coach **Bob Stoops**. No other Big 12 program won more than two league championships during that time span.

► The Sooners boasted arguably the best offense in the country, leading the nation in passing efficiency rating (FBS record 193.79) and pass completion percentage (.706), while ranking second in total offense (554.8 ypg), third in scoring offense (43.9 ppg), fourth in third down conversion percentage (.515), 12th in passing offense (318.0 ypg), 18th in rushing offense (236.8 ypg) and 25th in time of possession (32:16).

► Oklahoma is the highest scoring football program of all-time, and only three Sooner teams ever averaged more points than its 43.9 per game last season. OU's 7.5 yards per play in 2016 rank as second most in school history (the 1971 team averaged 7.6).

► With 86 yards against Auburn in the Sugar Bowl, junior running back **Samaje Perine** became OU's career rushing leader. Perine, who declared for the NFL Draft following the season, finished his career with 4,122 rushing yards to break **Billy Sims'** former school record of 4,118. Perine rushed for 49 TDs in his career and averaged 6.0 yards per carry.

► Maligned for first half of the season, Oklahoma's defense was much stronger the final six games of the year. In OU's first seven contests, opponents averaged 36.7 points and 475.9 yards. Over the last six outings, the Sooners held foes to an average of 19.7 points and 380.8 yards. OU, which led the Big 12 in opponent pass completion percentage (.547), held each of its last four opponents to sub-50-percent passing (those four teams, all ranked, combined to complete 45.6 percent of their pass attempts vs. the Sooners [57-of-125]).

► OU led the Big 12 with seven first-team all-league selections (five offensive and two defensive) and landed five more on the second team. Seven more were honorable mention All-Big 12 picks. Stoops was named Big 12 Coach of the Year for the sixth time, wide receiver **Dede Westbrook** was named Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year and left tackle **Orlando Brown** was named Big 12 Offensive Lineman of the Year.

► Westbrook became OU's first unanimous All-American since 2004 (offensive tackle **Jammal Brown** and running back **Adrian Peterson**) when he was named to the first team by each of the five official All-America squads (AFCA, AP, FWAA, Sporting News and Walter Camp Foundation). OU now boasts 32 unanimous All-Americans, more than any other program. Westbrook is also the Sooners' 77th consensus All-American, more than any other school in the modern era.

► **Baker Mayfield** and Westbrook each were national award winners in 2016. For the second year in a row, Mayfield won the Burlsworth Trophy, given to the nation's best player who began his career as a walk-on. Westbrook became OU's first winner of the Biletnikoff Award, presented to the nation's outstanding receiver. Mayfield and Westbrook were each Heisman Trophy finalists, with the quarterback finishing third and the receiver fourth.

After being named Sporting News' 2015 national player of the year and finishing fourth in Heisman Trophy voting that year, QB **Baker Mayfield** posted even better numbers in 2016 when he finished third in Heisman balloting:

ANOTHER CHALLENGING SCHEDULE

► The Sooners are accustomed to playing one of the nation's toughest schedules, and 2017 will be no different. Five of OU's 12 regular season games will be against teams ranked in the preseason AP poll (at No. 2 Ohio State [11-2 in 2016], at No. 10 Oklahoma State [10-3], at No. 20 Kansas State [9-4], vs. No. 22 West Virginia [10-3] and vs. No. 23 Texas [5-7] in Dallas). TCU is at No. 26 in the preseason poll.

► *Sports Illustrated* ranked two of the Sooners' games among its 10 best in the nation for 2017. OU's Sept. 9 contest at Ohio State and its Nov. 4 outing at Oklahoma State both made the list.

SOONERS HAVE DOMINATED BIG 12 ERA

► OU's performance in the Big 12 Conference this millennium has been nothing short of dominant. The Sooners have won 10 Big 12 titles in the last 17 seasons, with no other program during that span winning more than two.

► Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed 10 league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each).

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (629) than any other program. Only Boise State owns a better winning percentage (.772; played 449 fewer games) during that span than OU (.764).

► OU is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 34,540 points (in 1,247 games).

► No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 37. In addition, OU's 22 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.

► Since former head coach **Bob Stoops** arrived at OU in 1999, the Sooners lead all Power Five conference programs in wins (191) and points scored (8,968).

► Only Ohio State (105) has been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll more weeks than Oklahoma (102). OU's 396 weeks in the AP's top five are most of any school (Alabama next with 367 and Ohio State third with 359). The AP Poll was introduced in 1936.

► Only Alabama (9) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

TWO MORE OU HEISMAN FINALISTS

► Oklahoma quarterback **Baker Mayfield** and wide receiver **Dede Westbrook** comprised 40 percent of last year's group of Heisman Trophy finalists. They became the sixth and seventh finalists during the 18-year Bob Stoops era, more than any other school during that time span. OU boasts eight finalists since the Heisman started naming them in 1982.

► Mayfield finished third in Heisman voting last year while Westbrook finished fourth. It marked just the fourth time since 1955 and first since 2004 that a pair of teammates finished in the top four of the Heisman balloting. OU's **Adrian Peterson** and **Jason White** were the last to do it in 2004. They finished third and fourth, respectively.

► Last year marked the first time in the 82-year history of the Heisman Trophy that a quarterback and wide receiver from the same team each finished in the top four of the voting. Mayfield also finished fourth in 2015.

EXTRA POINTS

► The Sooners are looking to register their 15th season of at least 10 wins since the start of the 2000 campaign. They are the only FBS program to rack up at least 14 seasons of double-digit victories since 2000.

► Oklahoma has won more Big 12 championships since the start of the 2000 season (10) than it has lost home games (nine).

► With his 329-yard first-half passing effort against UTEP on Saturday, **Baker Mayfield** now owns three of OU's five best all-time marks for passing yards in a half (2. 332 at Kansas in 2015; 3. 329 vs. UTEP; 5. 316 vs. Tulsa in 2015).

► Mayfield was 11-for-12 passing for 213 yards and three TDs in the second quarter against UTEP. The 213 yards rank as the second most by a Sooner in any quarter (**Joey Halzle** threw for 230 yards in the fourth quarter against Texas Tech in 2007).

► OU quarterback **Kyler Murray** was rated in August by MaxPreps as the best high school signal-caller of the last decade. A redshirt sophomore who transferred from Texas A&M following the 2015 season, he was a consensus five-star recruit at Allen (Texas) High School and earned national-player-of-the-year honors from Gatorade, MaxPreps, Parade and USA Today following his senior year in 2014. Murray rolled up 14,500 rushing and receiving yards, as well as 186 touchdowns in his three seasons.

► Of all active FBS players with at least 12 career TD receptions, **Mark Andrews** has the best TD-to-catch ratio at 26.3 percent (15 TDs on 57 catches). The next closest players are Clemson's Deon Cain (15 TDs on 74 catches; 20.3%), LSU's Jonathan Giles (16-84; 19.1%), Miami Ohio's Ryan Smith (12-64; 18.8%) and Old Dominion's Jonathan Duhart (18-100; 18.0%). Twenty-five percent of Andrews' career catches (14 of 57) have come in season-opening games.

► The Sooners are 1-2 all-time against Ohio State, but are 60-45-3 against teams currently in the Big Ten. Most of those games occurred against Nebraska when Oklahoma and the Huskers were intraleague foes (OU is 45-38-3 against NU). The Sooners' last regular season true road game against a team in the Big Ten at the time of competition was against Minnesota in the 1985 season opener. OU won 13-7 and went on to win the national title. Since 2000, OU is 7-3 against teams currently in the Big Ten (6-2 vs. Nebraska, 1-0 vs. Iowa, 0-1 vs. Ohio State).

► Oklahoma is 21-5-1 (.796) as the No. 5 team in the AP poll and 6-3 as the No. 5 team in true road games.

► The Sooners are 4-2 all-time in overtime games. The last one was a 31-24 double-overtime win at No. 23 Tennessee in 2015.

► OU has had at least four players selected in each of the last 10 NFL Drafts. LSU (also 10) is the only other school that can make that claim.

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and the second-largest collegiate video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

► Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.

► In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director **Bennie Owen** suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.

► The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).

► In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.

► Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and its existing figure of 83,489 (2016).

► In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

► The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.

► The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that has initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.

► The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons will benefit from two new clubs.

► Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.

► All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.

► The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.

LINCOLN RILEY

**FIRST SEASON AS HEAD COACH • YOUNGEST HEAD COACH IN FOOTBALL BOWL SUBDIVISION
WINNER OF 2015 BROYLES AWARD AS NATION'S TOP ASSISTANT COACH**

A new era of Oklahoma football is underway. After presiding over two of the most prolific offensive seasons in program history, 34-year-old Lincoln Riley took over the OU head coaching reins on June 7, 2017, following the retirement of one of the most accomplished coaches of the last quarter century in Bob Stoops. OU's 22nd head coach, Riley served as the program's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach the last two seasons.

The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach, Riley takes over a program fresh off a 10th Big 12 championship and that is primed for more with a \$160 million south end zone project now complete. With some of the country's most eye-catching facilities, a highly touted 2017 recruiting class and coaching and support staffs that remain completely intact, Oklahoma's championship expectations are not altered in the least.

Originally from the 5,000-person West Texas town of Muleshoe, Riley made his name as perhaps the best up-and-coming star in college football by overseeing a balanced and explosive Oklahoma offense the last two seasons. In 2016, the Sooners led the nation in passing efficiency rating (their mark of 193.79 set an FBS record) and pass completion percentage (.706), while ranking second in total offense (554.8 ypg) and third in scoring offense (43.9 ppg) and third-down conversion percentage (.515). Only one team in school history averaged more yards per play than the Sooners' 7.5 in 2016 (the 1971 squad averaged 7.6). OU's potent offensive attack is a big reason the Sooners won a second straight Big 12 title and handled Auburn 35-19 in the Sugar Bowl.

Individual player accomplishments were abundant in 2016 under Riley's tutelage. Quarterback Baker Mayfield and wide receiver Dede Westbrook finished third and fourth in Heisman Trophy voting, respectively, marking just the fourth time since 1955 and first since 2004 that a pair of teammates from any school finished in the top four of Heisman balloting. Westbrook, the Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year, was OU's first unanimous All-American since 2004 and the Sooners' first recipient of the Biletnikoff Award as the nation's outstanding receiver. Running back Joe Mixon finished second nationally and set the OU single-season record with 2,331 all-purpose yards, while backfield mate Samaje Perine set the school career rushing record with 4,122 yards in only three seasons.

Riley was just as good for OU in his first season as offensive coordinator, earning the 2015 Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach after the Sooners ranked fourth nationally in scoring (43.5 ppg) and seventh in total offense (530.2 ypg). Mayfield, who finished fourth in Heisman voting, was the Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year and *Sporting News* national player of the year, while Westbrook was Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year. With Riley leading a high-flying attack, eight offensive players earned all-league honors.

Oklahoma's newest head man joined the Sooners in January 2015 after he caught the eye of Stoops during a highly successful five-year stint as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Ruffin McNeill at East Carolina from 2010-14. With OU looking for a new play caller and wanting to get back to the up-tempo attack it helped make mainstream, Riley's numbers at ECU made him the perfect hire.

At East Carolina, Riley installed and directed a spread offensive scheme that made an immediate impact as the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual school offensive records in his five seasons with the program. His squads recorded the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four marks for total offense in a season.

He spent his final season with the Pirates serving in the role of assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach

in 2014 as the team ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 ypg) and was fifth in total offense (533.0 ypg). With Riley calling the shots, the Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense.

Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down conversion percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone scoring efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

Among his notable pupils, Riley helped transform a pair of East Carolina wide receivers into the most productive pass catchers in FBS history. He guided walk-on Justin Hardy to 387 career catches, breaking the NCAA record previously held by OU's Ryan Broyles (349). Hardy's 4,541 career receiving yards rank third all-time in FBS annals as he flourished in Riley's offense, registering three 1,000-yard seasons at ECU that culminated with a 121-catch, 1,494-yard year as a senior in 2014. Riley also coached recent second-round NFL draft selection Zay Jones for the first two years of his career. Jones went on to break Hardy's record and is the NCAA's leader in career receptions (399) and receptions in a season (158 in 2016).

Already overseeing Mayfield's record-setting career, Riley also developed dynamic quarterbacks Dominique Davis and Shane Carden at ECU. Conference USA's 2010 Newcomer of the Year, Davis set ECU career marks for completions and TD passes despite playing just two seasons. Davis ranked second among FBS signal callers with 393 completions and 46 total touchdowns in 2010. He set an NCAA record with a stretch of 36 straight completions in 2011.

Carden took over the job in 2012 and went on to break the majority of Davis' records, becoming the first 4,000-yard passer in program history and setting single-season standards for completion percentage (70.5 in 2013) and passing yards (4,736 in 2014). Carden earned Conference USA MVP honors in 2013 and was the American Conference's Offensive Player of the Year in 2014. He led all FBS passers with 392 completions in 2014.

Prior to East Carolina, Riley spent seven seasons on the staff at Texas Tech, where he was part of seven bowl teams and five bowl wins. During that span, Red Raiders quarterbacks won NCAA passing titles in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007. A walk-on quarterback at Tech during the spring and summer of 2003 who then became a student coach, Riley immersed himself in head coach Mike Leach's offense and worked his way into a full-time position as wide receivers coach in 2007. He served as inside receivers coach in 2008 and '09, and eventually called plays as interim offensive coordinator in the 2010 Alamo Bowl, where the Red Raiders racked up 579 yards in a 41-31 victory over Michigan State to cap the 2009 season.

Under Riley's guidance in 2007, wide receiver Michael Crabtree won the Biletnikoff Award after smashing Big 12 records and NCAA freshman standards with 134 receptions for 1,962 yards. Crabtree also accumulated 22 touchdown catches his first season. In fact, wide receiver Danny Amendola joined Crabtree that year as Texas Tech receivers who each amassed 100-catch, 1,000-yard efforts.

A 2006 Texas Tech graduate who earned a Bachelor of Science degree in exercise and sport sciences, Riley and his wife, Caitlin, have two daughters, Sloan and Stella.

NORMAN — Oklahoma ushered in the Lincoln Riley era with a commanding 56-7 home win over UTEP. OU racked up 676 total yards of offense and eight different Sooners scored a touchdown.

Making his 27th straight start, quarterback Baker Mayfield opened the season by completing his first 16 passes — the most consecutive completions to start a game in program history. Only playing in the first half, Mayfield finished the opener 19-for-20 through the air for 329 yards and three TDs (282.7 efficiency rating). His passing yardage pushed Mayfield past Jason White (7,922) into third place on OU's career passing yards list (7,994).

Junior tight end Mark Andrews hauled in career highs of seven catches (one touchdown) and 134 yards while only playing the first half. Fourteen Sooners caught at least one pass, the same number who made at least one reception in all of 2016.
