OPENING KICK

► Owner of the nation's longest active winning streak at 13 games, No. 3/3 Oklahoma travels to face Baylor on Saturday at 5:30 p.m. CT at McLane Stadium (45,140 capacity). The game will be televised nationally by FS1 with **Justin Kutcher, Mark Helfrich and Petros Papadakis** announcing.

► Oklahoma owns a 23-3 (.885) all-time record against Baylor and is 11-2 vs. the Bears in Waco. In the Big 12 era, the Sooners hold an 18-3 series advantage (9-2 on the road).

► OU's 12-game true road winning streak is the longest active streak in the country and tied for the third longest in school history. The program's only longer streaks were 14 games (1973-76) and 24 games (1953-58). Only three other teams own an active streak longer than four games (Alabama and Clemson have won 11 straight true road games and Washington seven).

► Oklahoma has won 16 consecutive Big 12 Conference games, the second longest streak in school history (won 17 from 2003 to 2005) and the fifth longest since the league formed in 1996 (Kansas State holds the record with 21 straight from 1997 to 1999).

► Saturday will mark 371 days since OU's last loss (vs. Ohio State on Sept. 17, 2016) and 714 days since its last Big 12 defeat (vs. Texas on Oct. 10, 2015).

► OU is 14-6 (.700) all-time in Big 12 openers. It has won its last four Big 12 openers and eight of its last nine. The Sooners are also 15-5 all-time in their first Big 12 road game of a season (won last six).

► This marks the 126th time since the start of the 2000 season that OU has been ranked in the top five of the AP poll. Only Alabama (132 times) has more top-five rankings during that period.

► **Lincoln Riley** is the fifth head coach in OU history (out of 22) to start his career 3-0. A win against Baylor would make him just the third coach to start 4-0, joining **V.L. Parrington** (1897-98) and **Jim Mackenzie** (1966).

► OU is coming off a 56-14 home win over Tulane, outgaining the Green Wave 631 yards to 291 (10.2 yards per play to 3.9). **Baker Mayfield** threw for 331 yards and four touchdowns without an interception. Five of the Sooners' seven offensive TDs were scored by first-year players.

► Trailing 24-20 through three quarters Saturday, Baylor was outscored 10-0 in the fourth quarter of a 34-20 loss at Duke. The Bears, who completed 35 percent of their passes (12-of-34) and threw three interceptions, were outgained 430 yards to 320. While the Sooners have won 12 straight true road games, Baylor has lost its last four at home.



Sophomore Parnell Motley has been OU's defensive catalyst the last two weeks, registering key interceptions in wins at Ohio State and versus Tulane. He returned his pick against the Green Wave 77 yards for a touchdown. The cornerbacks ranks fourth on the team with 14 tackles and has 2.0 TFLs.

OU'S LAST 12 TRUE ROAD GAMES – ALL WINS

Oklahoma enters the Baylor contest riding a 12-game road winning streak, longest in the nation. The average score in those games has been 49-25, and OU has averaged 564 yards.

FIVE KEY STORYLINES

► Oklahoma hasn't lost in more than a calendar year (to Ohio State on Sept. 17, 2016), giving it the nation's longest current streak (13) and OU's longest since winning 14 straight over the 2002 and '03 seasons. The last time the Sooners lost a Big 12 game was Oct. 10, 2016 — more than 700 days ago. They are 17-1 in Big 12 play the last two seasons with a pair of league championships to their credit.

► After finishing fourth in Heisman Trophy voting in 2015 and third in 2016, quarterback **Baker Mayfield** is off to his best career start in 2017. In two-and-a-half games (he did not play after halftime against UTEP), Mayfield is 63-for-82 (76.8 percent) through the air with 10 touchdowns and no interceptions. He is averaging 348.7 passing yards per game and 209.2 per half played. Mayfield owns a 226.9 pass efficiency rating (best nationally among players who have played multiple games) after last year setting the FBS single-season record with a 196.4 mark.

► Oklahoma boasts one of the best big-play passing attacks early in 2017. The Sooners have already completed a nation-leading 23 passes of 20-plus yards. Conversely, among teams that have played at least three games this season, OU is tied for first with Mississippi State by allowing just two completions of 20 or more yards. The Sooners are also the only team in the country with two completions of at least 80 yards.

► The Sooners have won 12 consecutive true road games (tied for the third longest streak in school history) and are outscoring opponents 590-305 (49-25 average) in those contests. OU is averaging 564.1 yards per game during the streak while allowing 405.0 an outing. In the running game, OU is outgaining opponents 3,275 yards to 1,570 (272.9-130.8 average). Mayfield is 10-0 as a Sooner in true road games. In those contests, he's completed 218-of-307 passes (71.0 percent) for 3,004 yards with 35 touchdowns against just five interceptions (7.0 ratio) for an efficiency rating of 187.6. Additionally, he's run 89 times for 304 yards (3.4 avg.) and seven scores.

► OU owns the nation's second best combined ranking (24) in total offense and total defense. The Sooners rank No. 4 nationally in yards per game (599.0) and No. 20 in yards allowed per game (269.3). Only Clemson (23) has a better combined ranking (No. 15 total offense/No. 8 total defense). Other teams that rank in the top 20 of both are Duke (20 offense/7 defense), Wisconsin (16/13) and TCU (19/15).

RECAPPING THE WIN OVER TULANE (STATS ON PAGE 34)

► Sophomore cornerback **Parnell Motley** intercepted a pass and returned it 77 yards for a touchdown to break a 14-14 tie and springboard the Sooners to a 56-14 home win over Tulane on Saturday in the first meeting between the programs. It was Motley's second career pick and second in as many weeks.

► The Sooners averaged 10.18 yards per play, their most ever on Owen Field.

► After allowing touchdowns on Tulane's first two possessions, OU did not surrender any more points. The Green Wave amassed 157 yards in the first quarter (7.9 per play), but was held to 134 yards the rest of the night (2.5 per play). In the second half, OU allowed just 67 yards on 31 plays (2.2 average). Tulane finished with 54 passing yards.

► OU quarterbacks **Baker Mayfield** and **Kyler Murray** combined to complete 20 of their 30 pass attempts for 434 yards and five touchdowns without an interception. Mayfield was 17-for-27 for 331 yards and four scores, while Murray was 3-for-3 for 103 yards and a TD. Each had a completion of more than 80 yards. It marked the first time in school history OU had two passes go for 80-plus yards in the same game.

► Mayfield moved past **Sam Bradford** into second place on OU's all-time passing yardage list (now has 8,711).

► Sophomore receiver **Marquise Brown** recorded game highs of six catches and 155 receiving yards, as well as an 87-yard touchdown, the fifth longest in OU history and second longest in a home game. His 155 yards were the most by a Sooner this season, and his 141 receiving yards after halftime set an OU record for receiving yards in a second half. Brown was named Big 12 Newcomer of the Week for his efforts.

► Freshman receiver **CeeDee Lamb** had a banner day despite getting ejected in the second quarter for targeting while delivering a block. Lamb, who caught TD passes of 82 and 22 yards from Mayfield, finished with four catches for 131 yards. He became the first OU freshman to record at least 100 receiving yards and two TD receptions in a game.

► Running backs **Abdul Adams** (11.6) and **Marcelias Sutton** (10.5) each averaged more than 10 yards per carry. Adams finished with 93 yards on eight rushes (long of 49) while Sutton totaled 63 yards on six carries (long of 18). Sutton ran for a nine-yard score while Adams caught a 20-yard pass for his first career touchdown.

► OU's other two touchdowns were scored by redshirt senior receiver **Jordan Smallwood** and freshman running back **Trey Sermon** in the fourth quarter. Smallwood registered his second TD in as many weeks (first career receiving) with an 11-yard grab, while Sermon also notched his second TD in two weeks (first career rushing) with an 11-yard carry.

► Redshirt senior **Ogbonnia Okoronkwo** finished with a team-high-tying nine tackles and added 1.0 sack and 2.0 tackles for loss while also forcing a fumble. Redshirt sophomore **Neville Gallimore's** nine tackles marked a career high.

SOONERS HAVE DOMINATED BIG 12 ERA

► OU's performance in the Big 12 Conference this millennium has been nothing short of dominant. The Sooners have won 10 Big 12 titles in the last 17 seasons, with no other program during that span winning more than two.

► Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed 10 league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each).

NOTING OU'S 13-GAME WINNING STREAK

► Since losing 45-24 to No. 3 Ohio State on Sept. 17 last season, Oklahoma has rattled off 13 straight victories, good for the nation's longest streak and the ninth longest in OU history. Six of those 13 wins have come against teams ranked at the time of competition.

► The Sooners have outscored their last 13 opponents by 291 points (an average of 22.4) and have outgained them by an average of 180.9 yards. On the ground, OU is outgaining teams by an average of 68.5 yards (232.6-164.1) during the streak.

► Since Oct. 1, 2016, (OU's first win of the streak), the Sooners rank first nationally in completion percentage (73.7), passing TDs (46), TD percentage (11.0 percent of passes), efficiency rating (209.6; next highest is 181.6), yards from scrimmage (7,573) and yards from scrimmage/game (582.5; next most is 557.3 and next highest Power 5 total is 538.3).

► OU leads the nation since Oct. 1, 2016, with 79 touchdowns from scrimmage, 83 total touchdowns, 608 points and 46.8 points per game.

► Quarterback **Baker Mayfield** has completed 73.8 percent of his passes over the last 13 games (average of 324.5 yards) with 43 TDs and just six interceptions. Dating back to Oct. 1 (and among QBs with at least 100 pass attempts), Mayfield ranks first nationally in pass completion percentage, passing touchdowns, yards per pass attempt (11.9), touchdown percentage (12.1 percent of passes) and efficiency rating (210.2; next closest is 179.4).

SCOUTING BAYLOR

► Baylor enters this weekend's contest in search of its first win in the 2017 campaign. The Bears lost to Liberty (48-45) and UTSA (17-10) at home before dropping a 34-20 decision at Duke on Saturday.

► BU is under the direction of first-year head coach **Matt Rhule**. Most recently the head coach at Temple from 2013-16, Rhule guided the Owls to a 28-23 record, and to 10-win efforts in his final two years. Rhule spent 2012 as an assistant coach with the NFL's New York Giants after serving in various assistant coaching and coordinator roles with the Owls during the 2006-11 seasons.

► Offensively, Baylor ranks 91st nationally in scoring (25.0 ppg), 91st in total offense (375.3 ypg), 84th in rushing offense (149.3 ypg) and 69th in passing offense (226.0 ypg).

► Sophomore quarterback **Zach Smith** made his first start of the season and fifth of his career last weekend, completing 12 of his 34 passes for 263 yards and three touchdowns while also throwing three interceptions. Smith also saw action in the Bears' previous two games. He is 13-for-36 on the year with three TDs and four picks.

► Senior quarterback **Anu Solomon** started the first two games of the season, completing 24 of 55 passes for 399 yards and four touchdowns against two interceptions. He is also the team's second-leading rusher with 106 yards on the ground (6.6 per carry). Solomon played his first three seasons at Arizona, where he amassed 6,922 passing yards and 49 touchdowns against 16 interceptions in 30 games (27 starts).

► Freshman running back **John Lovett** leads the Baylor rushing attack by averaging 60.7 yards per game. He has two rushing touchdowns. Of Lovett's 182 rushing yards, 161 came in the first two games. He established his career high of 89 yards against Liberty.

► Defensively, Baylor is giving up 463.3 yards per game to rank 110th nationally. Sophomore linebacker **Clay Johnston** leads the team with 29 tackles and ranks second in the Big 12 with 6.5 tackles for loss. Sophomore safety **Henry Black** has the team's lone interception.

LAST YEAR VS. THE BEARS

► Oklahoma raced to a 21-0 lead at home against Baylor, led 21-10 at halftime and scored two more touchdowns in the first six minutes of the third quarter to go up 35-10 in an eventual 45-24 victory on Nov. 12, 2016. It was OU's 14th straight Big 12 win and improved its all-time record against Baylor to 23-3.

► Quarterback **Baker Mayfield** was 20-for-25 passing for 300 yards and two touchdowns, and ran for another score. He improved his nation-leading pass efficiency rating to 195.2.

NATION'S BEST OFFENSE

Lincoln Riley joined the Oklahoma staff prior to the 2015 season, the same year **Baker Mayfield** began his OU playing career. Since the start of that campaign, the Sooners can lay legitimate claim to being the nation's most productive overall offense. Below are OU's offensive numbers and national ranks since the start of 2015.

► Running backs **Joe Mixon** (124) and **Samaje Perine** (100) combined for 224 rushing yards and three rushing TDs. Mixon, whose 56-yard fourth-quarter TD dash represented OU's longest scoring run of the year at that point, also caught five passes for 63 yards. Mixon missed the previous game (team suspension) and Perine had missed the last three (injury).

► Wide receiver **Dede Westbrook** saw his six-game streak of 100-yard receiving performances snapped, as he finished with four catches for 88 yards. He did haul in two TD passes (29 and 40 yards) and tallied 169 all-purpose yards on the day.

► Linebacker **Jordan Evans** finished with a team-high nine tackles, two sacks, two interceptions and two pass breakups. He became the first player in OU history and the first FBS player since at least 2012 to record at least two interceptions and two sacks in a game. Evans' first pickoff came at the OU goal line and led to a 91-yard TD drive that put the Sooners up 21-0. He returned his second one 23 yards to the Baylor 1-yard line. Perine scored on the next play for a 35-10 lead. Evans was named Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week.

► OU registered nine pass breakups, its most since also finishing with nine in 2011 against Texas A&M.

LAST TIME IN WACO

► Playing its first AP top-five opponent since the 2014 Sugar Bowl, Oklahoma handled previously unbeaten Baylor 44-34 on the road on Nov. 14, 2015. Continuing a month-long trend, the Sooners were dominant on both sides of the ball, racking up 511 yards of offense and holding the No. 4 Bears to 416, which was 250 less than their nation-leading average of 666. The victory snapped Baylor's 20-game home winning streak.

► Baylor entered the game averaging 2.6 punts and 1.5 three-and-out possessions per game this season, but OU forced the Bears to punt six times and into five three-and-outs. The Sooners also registered two interceptions and a fumble recovery.

► QB **Baker Mayfield** was 24-for-34 through the air for 270 yards and three TDs, and ran for 76 more yards and another score. His scrambling 7-yard TD pass to **Dimitri Flowers** on third down with 4:47 left marked the game's final points. Mayfield connected with receiver **Sterling Shepard** for 14 completions (one shy of Shepard's school-record-sharing 15) for 177 yards and two TDs.

► Running back **Samaje Perine** produced 166 of OU's 241 rushing yards on 28 carries (5.9 average) and scored on runs of 6 and 55 yards (the latter was his longest rush of the season).

DEFENSE OFF TO STRONG START

► Oklahoma's defense is off to a stellar start in 2017 after encountering some rough patches last year. Through three games, OU is allowing 12.3 points and 269.3 yards per contest to rank 13th and 20th nationally. Last season, the Sooners surrendered 28.8 points and 432.0 yards per game on the season to rank 68th and 82nd in the country.

► Senior defensive end/linebacker **Ogbornia Okoronkwo** leads the Big 12 with 3.5 sacks and is tied for second with 6.5 tackles for loss. He has 16.5 career sacks to rank second at OU among linebackers.

► A year after allowing 269.4 passing yards per outing on the season, OU has limited its first three opponents to an average of 110.3 per game.

NO PASSING FANCY

► During its 13-game winning streak, Oklahoma has held every opponent to under a 60 percent pass completion rate. Over the last eight games, OU opponents have combined to complete just 49.8 percent of their passes (114-for-229). Four of those eight have been held to a mark below 50 percent.

► By comparison, OU has completed at least 60 percent of its passes in all 13 games during the streak, and at least 70 percent in eight of those contests.

OFFENSE HAS ROLLED UNDER RILEY, MAYFIELD

► Oklahoma has a legitimate claim as the nation's most productive offense since the start of the 2015 season, which was **Lincoln Riley's** first year as OU's offensive coordinator and quarterback **Baker Mayfield's** first playing for the Sooners. Riley called plays as the program's offensive coordinator and continues to as head coach.

► The Sooners have posted a 25-4 (.862) record since Riley's and Mayfield's OU debut (17-1 in Big 12 play), with Mayfield the starter in all 29 contests. That record is tied for third best in the country with Ohio State since the start of 2015. Only Alabama and Clemson (both 31-2) have better records in that span.

► Since the start of the 2015 season, OU ranks first nationally in passing efficiency rating (185.0; next closest is 171.2), second in completion percentage (.695) and points per game (44.1), third in total offense (548.3), eighth in passing offense (326.1; sixth in Power 5) and 22nd in rushing offense (222.3; 11th in Power 5).

► In 29 games since the start of the 2015 season, OU has registered at least 500 yards of total offense 20 times, including in 10 of the last 13 outings. The Sooners have topped the 600-yard mark on 10 occasions over the last 29 contests. Similarly, OU has scored at least 30 points in 25 of 29 games during the Riley/Mayfield regime, at least 40 points 18 times and at least 50 points 13 times.

MAYFIELD EVEN BETTER IN 2016

After being named Sporting News' 2015 national player of the year and finishing fourth in Heisman Trophy voting that year, QB **Baker Mayfield** posted even better numbers in 2016 when he finished third in Heisman balloting:

► Four of OU's top six single-game total offense yardage figures since 2000, five of the top eight, and six of the top 10 have come over the last 27 games (1. 854 at Texas Tech in 2016; 2. 773 vs. Tulsa in 2015; 4. 710 at Kansas in 2015; 6. 684 vs. Iowa State in 2015; 8. 676 vs. UTEP this season; 10. 672 vs. Texas in 2016).

MORE MAYFIELD

► **Baker Mayfield** has thrown a touchdown pass in a school-record 29 consecutive games. He's thrown at least two TD passes in 16 straight contests (50 TDs to eight interceptions during the stretch).

► Mayfield has thrown 15 TD passes since his last interception, which came six games ago at West Virginia. He has attempted 133 consecutive passes without being intercepted.

► Mayfield's 10 touchdown passes this year are the most by any quarterback who has not thrown an interception. Texas Tech's Nic Shimonek has nine, while Virginia Tech's Josh Jackson and Vanderbilt's Kyle Shurmer each have eight.

► Mayfield completed his first 16 pass attempts against UTEP (school record to start a game) and his final 14 pass attempts at Ohio State.

► With his 329-yard first-half passing effort against UTEP in the season opener, **Baker Mayfield** now owns three of OU's five best all-time marks for passing yards in a half (2. 332 at Kansas in 2015; 3. 329 vs. UTEP; 5. 316 vs. Tulsa in 2015).

► Mayfield was 11-for-12 passing for 213 yards and three TDs in the second quarter against UTEP. The 213 yards rank as the second most by a Sooner in any quarter (**Joey Halzle** threw for 230 yards in the fourth quarter against Texas Tech in 2007).

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (631) than any other program. Only Boise State owns a better winning percentage (.770; played 449 fewer games) during that span than OU (.764).

► OU is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 34,627 points (in 1,249 games).

► No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 37. In addition, OU's 22 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.

► Since former head coach **Bob Stoops** arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads all Power 5 conference programs in wins (193) and points scored (9,055).

► Only Ohio State (105) has been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll more weeks than Oklahoma (102). OU's 398 weeks in the AP's top five are most of any school (Alabama next with 369 and Ohio State third with 359). The AP Poll was introduced in 1936.

► Only Alabama (9) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

EXTRA POINTS

► Oklahoma's 13-game winning streak is only the ninth longest in school history.

► Last year the Sooners averaged 7.5 yards per play, the second-highest figure in school history (the 1971 team averaged 7.6). This season OU is averaging a staggering 8.6 yards per play to rank second nationally behind Maryland (9.1). The Ter-rapins have played one fewer game.

► The Sooners have won their last 10 Big 12 road games, which is a school record and is tied for the second longest streak in the league's history (Texas won 13 true road games in a row from 2003 to 2006).

► OU is 64-11-2 (.844) all-time as the No. 3 team in the AP Poll, including 25-5 (.833) in road games. However, dating back to 2009, it has lost its last two games and four of its last six when ranked No. 3.

► The Sooners are 3-0 to start a season for the eighth time in the last 11 years. They're looking to go to 4-0 for the fourth time in the last five seasons.

► Of all active FBS players with at least 13 career TD receptions, **Mark Andrews** has the best TD-to-catch ratio at 23.8 percent (15 TDs on 63 catches). The next closest players are LSU's Jonathan Giles (16 TDs on 84 catches; 19.1%), Clemson's Deon Cain (15-80; 18.8%), Old Dominion's Jonathan Duhart (19-102; 18.6%) and Boise State's Cedrick Wilson (13-72; 18.1%).

► Redshirt sophomore receiver **Lee Morris** has recorded his lone two career catches this season, and both have resulted in touchdowns (a 43-yarder vs. UTEP and an 18-yarder at Ohio State). Morris is a walk-on.

► OU quarterback **Kyler Murray** was rated in August by MaxPreps as the best high school signal-caller of the last decade. A redshirt sophomore who transferred from Texas A&M following the 2015 season, he was a consensus five-star recruit at Allen (Texas) High School and earned national-player-of-the-year honors from Gatorade, MaxPreps, Parade and USA Today following his senior year in 2014. Murray rolled up 14,500 rushing and receiving yards, as well as 186 touchdowns in his three seasons.

► Oklahoma's game at Ohio State marked the third time an OU team ranked fifth in the AP poll faced the No. 2 team. The Sooners have won all three games and have outscored their opponents by a combined 123-41 margin (beat Nebraska 27-7 in 1985 [OU went on to win the national championship], Texas Tech 65-21 in 2008 [OU went on to play in the BCS Championship Game] and Ohio State 31-16).

► The Sooners are looking to register their 15th season of at least 10 wins since the start of the 2000 campaign. They are the only FBS program to rack up at least 14 seasons of double-digit victories since 2000.

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and the second-largest collegiate video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

► Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.

► In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director **Bennie Owen** suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.

► The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).

► In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.

► Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and its existing figure of 83,489 (2016).

► In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

► The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.

► The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that has initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.

► The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons will benefit from two new clubs.

► Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.

► All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.

► The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.

LINCOLN RILEY

**FIRST SEASON AS HEAD COACH • YOUNGEST HEAD COACH IN FOOTBALL BOWL SUBDIVISION
WINNER OF 2015 BROYLES AWARD AS NATION'S TOP ASSISTANT COACH**

A new era of Oklahoma football is underway. After presiding over two of the most prolific offensive seasons in program history, 34-year-old Lincoln Riley took over the OU head coaching reins on June 7, 2017, following the retirement of one of the most accomplished coaches of the last quarter century in Bob Stoops. OU's 22nd head coach, Riley served as the program's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach the last two seasons.

The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach, Riley takes over a program fresh off a 10th Big 12 championship and that is primed for more with a \$160 million south end zone project now complete. With some of the country's most eye-catching facilities, a highly touted 2017 recruiting class and coaching and support staffs that remain completely intact, Oklahoma's championship expectations are not altered in the least.

Originally from the 5,000-person West Texas town of Muleshoe, Riley made his name as perhaps the best up-and-coming star in college football by overseeing a balanced and explosive Oklahoma offense the last two seasons. In 2016, the Sooners led the nation in passing efficiency rating (their mark of 193.79 set an FBS record) and pass completion percentage (.706), while ranking second in total offense (554.8 ypg) and third in scoring offense (43.9 ppg) and third-down conversion percentage (.515). Only one team in school history averaged more yards per play than the Sooners' 7.5 in 2016 (the 1971 squad averaged 7.6). OU's potent offensive attack is a big reason the Sooners won a second straight Big 12 title and handled Auburn 35-19 in the Sugar Bowl.

Individual player accomplishments were abundant in 2016 under Riley's tutelage. Quarterback Baker Mayfield and wide receiver Dede Westbrook finished third and fourth in Heisman Trophy voting, respectively, marking just the fourth time since 1955 and first since 2004 that a pair of teammates from any school finished in the top four of Heisman balloting. Westbrook, the Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year, was OU's first unanimous All-American since 2004 and the Sooners' first recipient of the Biletnikoff Award as the nation's outstanding receiver. Running back Joe Mixon finished second nationally and set the OU single-season record with 2,331 all-purpose yards, while backfield mate Samaje Perine set the school career rushing record with 4,122 yards in only three seasons.

Riley was just as good for OU in his first season as offensive coordinator, earning the 2015 Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach after the Sooners ranked fourth nationally in scoring (43.5 ppg) and seventh in total offense (530.2 ypg). Mayfield, who finished fourth in Heisman voting, was the Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year and *Sporting News* national player of the year, while Westbrook was Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year. With Riley leading a high-flying attack, eight offensive players earned all-league honors.

Oklahoma's newest head man joined the Sooners in January 2015 after he caught the eye of Stoops during a highly successful five-year stint as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Ruffin McNeill at East Carolina from 2010-14. With OU looking for a new play caller and wanting to get back to the up-tempo attack it helped make mainstream, Riley's numbers at ECU made him the perfect hire.

At East Carolina, Riley installed and directed a spread offensive scheme that made an immediate impact as the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual school offensive records in his five seasons with the program. His squads recorded the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four marks for total offense in a season.

He spent his final season with the Pirates serving in the role of assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach

in 2014 as the team ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 ypg) and was fifth in total offense (533.0 ypg). With Riley calling the shots, the Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense.

Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down conversion percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone scoring efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

Among his notable pupils, Riley helped transform a pair of East Carolina wide receivers into the most productive pass catchers in FBS history. He guided walk-on Justin Hardy to 387 career catches, breaking the NCAA record previously held by OU's Ryan Broyles (349). Hardy's 4,541 career receiving yards rank third all-time in FBS annals as he flourished in Riley's offense, registering three 1,000-yard seasons at ECU that culminated with a 121-catch, 1,494-yard year as a senior in 2014. Riley also coached recent second-round NFL draft selection Zay Jones for the first two years of his career. Jones went on to break Hardy's record and is the NCAA's leader in career receptions (399) and receptions in a season (158 in 2016).

Already overseeing Mayfield's record-setting career, Riley also developed dynamic quarterbacks Dominique Davis and Shane Carden at ECU. Conference USA's 2010 Newcomer of the Year, Davis set ECU career marks for completions and TD passes despite playing just two seasons. Davis ranked second among FBS signal callers with 393 completions and 46 total touchdowns in 2010. He set an NCAA record with a stretch of 36 straight completions in 2011.

Carden took over the job in 2012 and went on to break the majority of Davis' records, becoming the first 4,000-yard passer in program history and setting single-season standards for completion percentage (70.5 in 2013) and passing yards (4,736 in 2014). Carden earned Conference USA MVP honors in 2013 and was the American Conference's Offensive Player of the Year in 2014. He led all FBS passers with 392 completions in 2014.

Prior to East Carolina, Riley spent seven seasons on the staff at Texas Tech, where he was part of seven bowl teams and five bowl wins. During that span, Red Raiders quarterbacks won NCAA passing titles in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007. A walk-on quarterback at Tech during the spring and summer of 2003 who then became a student coach, Riley immersed himself in head coach Mike Leach's offense and worked his way into a full-time position as wide receivers coach in 2007. He served as inside receivers coach in 2008 and '09, and eventually called plays as interim offensive coordinator in the 2010 Alamo Bowl, where the Red Raiders racked up 579 yards in a 41-31 victory over Michigan State to cap the 2009 season.

Under Riley's guidance in 2007, wide receiver Michael Crabtree won the Biletnikoff Award after smashing Big 12 records and NCAA freshman standards with 134 receptions for 1,962 yards. Crabtree also accumulated 22 touchdown catches his first season. In fact, wide receiver Danny Amendola joined Crabtree that year as Texas Tech receivers who each amassed 100-catch, 1,000-yard efforts.

A 2006 Texas Tech graduate who earned a Bachelor of Science degree in exercise and sport sciences, Riley and his wife, Caitlin, have two daughters, Sloan and Stella.

Making his 27th straight start, quarterback Baker Mayfield opened the season by completing his first 16 passes — the most consecutive completions to start a game in program history. Only playing in the first half, Mayfield finished the opener 19-for-20 through the air for 329 yards and three TDs (282.7 efficiency rating). His passing yardage pushed Mayfield past Jason White (7,922) into third place on OU's career passing yards list (7,994).

Junior tight end Mark Andrews hauled in career highs of seven catches (one touchdown) and 134 yards while only playing the first half. Fourteen Sooners caught at least one pass, the same number who made at least one reception in all of 2016.

NORMAN — Baker Mayfield passed for 331 yards and four touchdowns as No. 2 Oklahoma followed its impressive victory at Ohio State with a 56-14 home win over Tulane.

CeeDee Lamb caught four passes for 131 yards and two touchdowns, one of them an 82-yarder, while Marquise Brown had career highs of six catches for 155 yards, including an 87-yard touchdown grab in the fourth quarter. It marked the first time in OU history it registered two pass plays of at least 80 yards in a contest.
