OPENING KICK

► No. 4/3/5 Oklahoma (8-1, 5-1 Big 12) goes for its 16th consecutive true road win when it plays at Kansas (1-9, 0-7) Saturday at 2:30 p.m. CT inside Memorial Stadium in Lawrence. The game will be televised by ESPN with **Dave Pasch**, **Greg McElroy** and **Tom Luginbill** announcing.

► An OU win against Kansas would give the Sooners their 14th straight road win in Big 12 play, which would set the outright league record. Texas also won 13 consecutive Big 12 road games from 2003 to 2006.

► Oklahoma is 74-27-6 all-time against Kansas and has won 12 straight in the series. It is OU's longest active winning streak against an opponent.

► Each of the last 12 meetings in the series have been OU victories by at least 15 points. The Sooners have outscored the Jayhawks 507-143 in those contests (average of 42-13) and have outgained them 5,899 yards to 3,000 (average of 492-250). The last three games have seen OU win by a combined score of 162-17. KU has been held to seven or fewer points in four of the last five meetings.

► The Sooners have won their last six games in Lawrence and have outscored the Jayhawks 235-69 (39-12 average) during the stretch. OU's last loss at Kansas came in 1997, the second year of the Big 12 Conference

► OU has won 22 of its last 23 Big 12 games dating back to the 2015 season. Its only loss came at the hands of Iowa State on Oct. 7.

► With a win Saturday, **Lincoln Riley** would tie the Oklahoma record record for most wins in a debut season, joining **Barry Switzer** (1973) and **Chuck Fairbanks** (1967) with 10 wins apiece.

► Oklahoma leads all FBS programs with its 37 seasons of at least 10 wins. A victory over Kansas would extend that number to 38. It would also mark OU's nation-leading 15th season of double-digit wins since 2000.

► OU is 68-13-2 all-time as the No. 3 team in the AP Poll (28-5 on the road), but has lost three of its last four such games, including to Iowa State this season. OU is 45-6 as the No. 3 AP team against unranked opponents, 22-3 on the road.

► The Sooners have gained at least 500 yards of total offense in each of the last eight games. It is the nation's longest active streak and tied for the fifth-longest in the FBS over the last 10 years. The next longest streak this year is three games.

FIVE KEY STORYLINES

► Oklahoma's 15-game true road winning streak is the longest active streak in the country and is the second longest in school history (OU won 24 in a row from 1953 to 1958). Alabama (14) and Wisconsin (seven) are the only other programs that own an active streak longer than six games. The Sooners' last true road loss came more than three full years ago (37-33 at TCU on Oct. 4, 2014). During the 15-game streak, the Sooners have outscored opponents 743-433 (50-29



Sophomore RB Rodney Anderson has rushed for at least 111 yards in each of the last four games. Over the last four weeks, Anderson leads the nation in yards from scrimmage per game (201.8) and ranks second in TDs from scrimmage (9), third in rushing yards (590) and ninth in rushing yards per game (147.5).

average) and have outgained them 8,798 yards to 6,456 (587-430 average). Seven of the 15 wins have come against top-25 teams.

► After finishing fourth in Heisman Trophy voting in 2015 and third in 2016, **Baker Mayfield** has been even better in 2017. Mayfield is 213-for-299 (71.2 percent) through the air with 31 touchdowns and five interceptions. He leads the country with his 202.1 pass efficiency rating (next best among Power 5 QBs is 174.2) after last year setting the FBS single-season record with a 196.4 mark. He also ranks first nationally in pass completion percentage, yards per pass attempt (11.9) and yards per completion (16.7; would be an FBS single-season record).

► In two games as a Sooner against Kansas, Mayfield has thrown for 619 yards on 43-of-56 passing (76.8 percent) with eight touchdowns and no interceptions (pass efficiency rating of 216.8). He only played one possession after halftime of OU's 62-7 win at KU in 2015, and only two possessions after half of the Sooners' 56-3 home win last year. Mayfield started at Kansas as a freshman for Texas Tech, going 33-for-51 for 368 yards and rushing for a TD before leaving late in the third quarter (injured) of a 56-14 win. He missed the next four games.

► Sophomore running back **Rodney Anderson** registered 61 yards from scrimmage (12.2 per game) and one touchdown over OU's first five contests, but over the last five outings has racked up 855 yards from scrimmage (171.0 per game) and 10 TDs (six rushing, four receiving). He has rushed for at least 111 yards in each of the last four outings, and has totaled 845 all-purpose yards during that stretch (211.3 average). Anderson's freshman season of 2015 ended in the second game due to a broken leg, and his redshirt freshman season of 2016 ended during August camp due to a broken bone in his neck.

► After registering 230 receiving yards and one touchdown on 14 receptions over OU's first five games, first-year receiver **Marquise Brown** has tallied 569 yards and three TDs on 26 catches over the last five outings. The sophomore junior college transfer is averaging 124.0 receiving yards over the last four outings with three scores. On the season, he has three games of at least 126 receiving yards, including a school-record 265-yard performance two weeks ago at Oklahoma State. Brown leads the Sooners with 799 receiving yards and 88.8 yards per game (ranks 19th nationally).

RECAPPING THE WIN OVER TCU (STATS ON PAGE 39)

► In a battle of first-place Big 12 teams, **Baker Mayfield** threw for 333 yards and tossed three TD passes without a turnover, and **Rodney Anderson** registered a career-high 290 all-purpose yards (11th-most in Oklahoma history) and scored four TDs as OU beat TCU 38-20 in Norman.

► TCU entered the contest allowing just 13.9 points per game and had given up just 24 total points over the last four contests. Oklahoma scored 17 points in the first quarter, and the Sooners' 38 first-half points were the most allowed in a game by TCU since OU's 52-46 win last season (span of 17 contests). OU averaged 11.0 yards per play in the first half (the Horned Frogs were allowing 4.4 per play on the year).

► TCU was also allowing a nation-low 69.7 yards per game entering the night and had not given up a rushing TD over the previous five contests, but OU ran for 96 yards and two scores on 15 carries (6.4 average) in the first half. The Sooners finished the game with 200 rushing yards and two rushing touchdowns.

► Mayfield was 18-for-27 passing and rushed for 50 yards. The game marked his 14th at OU in which he threw at least three TD passes without an interception.

► Anderson, who was named Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week for his efforts, finished with 151 rushing yards and a career-high 139 receiving yards to become the first FBS player since at least 1996 to register at least 139 rushing and 139 receiving yards in a game. He also became just third player in school history with at least 100 rushing yards and 100 receiving yards in a contest, joining **Joe Mixon** (last year at Texas Tech) and **Steve Sewell** (1984 vs. Kansas State). The sophomore tied a school record with four TDs in a half with two rushing and two receiving scores in the opening 30 minutes.

► TCU's 20 points marked the fewest allowed by OU in Big 12 play. Sophomore **Marquise Overton** led OU with six tackles and senior **Ogbonnia Okoronkwo** registered five stops along with a pair of tackles for loss.

► OU started four true freshmen on defense, including a trio of defensive backs who made their first career starts (safety **Robert Barnes** and cornerbacks **Tre Brown** and **Tre Norwood**). The Sooners held TCU to 14-for-29 passing (48.3 percent).

► Junior kicker **Austin Seibert** made his lone field goal attempt, a career-long 49 yarder (OU's longest since 2011).

SCOUTING KANSAS

► Coming off a 42-27 loss at Texas on Saturday in which it was outgained by just seven yards (371-364), Kansas is in search of its first Big 12 win. The Jayhawks have lost nine in a row since a 38-16 season-opening victory over Southeast Missouri.

► Kansas ranks 59th nationally in passing offense (240.4 ypg), 106th in total offense (359.5 ypg), 116th in rushing offense (119.1 ypg) and 120th in scoring offense (20.3 ppg).

► Sophomore quarterback **Carter Stanley** has started the last three games and is coming off a 268-yard, three-touchdown passing effort against Texas, while also running for 43 yards. On the year, he is 82-for-152 passing for 985 yards (123.1 average) with four touchdowns and six interceptions. Sophomore running back **Khalil Herbert** averages a team-high 68.9 rushing

yards per game and has run for a team-high four scores.

► On the other side of the ball, KU ranks 54th in pass defense (219.8 ypg), 109th in total defense (456.2 ypg), 114th in scoring defense (37.3 ppg) and 114th in rushing defense (236.4 ypg). Junior linebacker **Joe Dineen** leads the country with his 8.0 solo tackles per game, and ranks third nationally and first in the Big 12 with his 11.9 total tackles and 2.1 tackles for loss per contest.

LAST YEAR VS. THE JAYHAWKS

► Oklahoma outscored Kansas 49-0 in the second and third quarters in posting a 56-3 home win on Oct. 29, 2016. The Sooners outgained KU 538 yards to 170 for the game (7.6 per play to 2.6).

► **Baker Mayfield**, who didn't play the final 23:50 of the contest, was 16-for-24 for 236 yards and tossed four TD passes to four different players.

► **Dede Westbrook** set a school record with his fifth straight 100-yard receiving game. Westbrook, who finished with five catches for 105 yards, returned a first-quarter punt 71 yards for a touchdown and caught a 41-yard second-quarter TD pass en route to 230 all-purpose yards.

► Running backs **Joe Mixon** and **Abdul Adams** combined for 165 rushing yards on 22 carries (7.5 average). Adams, a freshman, finished with a career-high 91 yards on 13 rushes (7.0 per carry) while Mixon tallied 74 yards on nine rushes (8.2 per carry) and a touchdown.

► **Mark Andrews** (15 yards), **Dimitri Flowers** (nine yards) and Penn State grad transfer **Geno Lewis** (seven yards) all caught touchdown passes.

► Senior linebacker **Jordan Evans** spearheaded a stellar defensive effort with a game-high 10 tackles and a 33-yard interception return for a touchdown that put OU up 49-3. Cornerback **Jordan Thomas** registered his first interception of the year at the OU 2-yard line late in the first quarter.

► The OU defense recorded season lows in points allowed, yards allowed (170), rushing yards allowed (49), passing yards allowed (121) and first downs allowed (11).

FOUR SOONERS NAMED MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICANS

► Quarterback **Baker Mayfield**, tight end **Mark Andrews**, offensive lineman **Orlando Brown** and defensive end/linebacker **Ogbonnia Okoronkwo** were all named to the 25-member USA Today midseason All-America team. No other program had more than two honorees. See the left-hand box on page 4 for a full list of OU's midseason All-America honors.

MAYFIELD UP FOR THE CHALLENGE

► Playing away from home has not been an issue for **Baker Mayfield**, especially the last two seasons. In OU's 12 games away from Norman since the start of the 2016 season (eight true road contests, four at neutral sites), Mayfield has completed 262-of-465 passes (71.8 percent) for 4,304 yards (360.3 per game) and 37 touchdowns against just eight interceptions for a pass efficiency rating of 199.9. He has averaged 16.4 yards per completion and 11.8 yards per attempt. Mayfield has also rushed for six scores in those outings, helping OU to an 11-1 record (lone loss was to Houston in the 2016 opener at NRG Stadium in Houston).

► Mayfield is 13-0 in true road games as a Sooner, completing 287-of-403 passes (71.2 percent) for 4,295 yards (330.4 per game) and 45 touchdowns against just eight interceptions (5.6-to-1 ratio) for a pass efficiency rating of 193.6. He has averaged 14.96 yards per completion and 10.7 yards per attempt. Mayfield has also rushed for 10 scores in those outings.

► Even better, Mayfield is 11-0 in Big 12 road games at OU. He's completed 241-of-329 passes (73.3 percent) for 3,722 yards (338.4 per game) and 39 touchdowns against just six interceptions (6.5-to-1 ratio) for a pass efficiency rating of 203.8. He has averaged 15.4 yards per completion and 11.3 yards per attempt, and has added nine rushing scores.

OFFENSE HAS ROLLED UNDER RILEY, MAYFIELD

► Oklahoma has a legitimate claim as the nation's most productive offense since the start of the 2015 season, which was **Lincoln Riley's** first year as OU's offensive coordinator and quarterback **Baker Mayfield's** first playing for the Sooners. Riley called plays as the program's offensive coordinator and continues to as head coach.

► The Sooners have posted a 31-5 (.861) record since Riley's and Mayfield's OU debut (23-2 in Big 12 play), with Mayfield the starter in all 36 contests. That record is tied for third best in the country with Ohio State since the start of 2015. Only Alabama (38-2) and Clemson (37-3) have better records during that span.

► Since the start of the 2015 season, OU ranks first nationally in passing efficiency rating (186.9; next closest is 164.6 and next closest Power 5 is 161.1), completion percentage (69.5), points per game (43.9) and total offense (558.7) and is sixth in passing offense (334.1; fifth in Power 5) and 19th in rushing offense (224.6; ninth in Power 5).

► In 36 games since the start of the 2015 season, OU has registered at least 500 yards of total offense 27 times, including in 17 of the last 20 outings, topped the 600-yard mark on 13 occasions and gone over 700 yards four times. Similarly, OU has scored at least 30 points in 31 of 36 games during the Riley/Mayfield regime, at least 40 points 22 times, at least 50 points 14 times and at least 60 points four times.

► Four of OU's top five single-game total offense yardage figures since 2000, and six of the top nine have come over the last 29 games (1,854 at Texas Tech in 2016; 2,785 at Oklahoma State this season; 3,773 vs. Tulsa in 2015; 5,710 at Kansas in 2015; 7,684 vs. Iowa State in 2015; 9,676 vs. UTEP this season).

OFFENSIVE JUGGERNAUTS

Lincoln Riley joined the Oklahoma staff prior to the 2015 season, the same year **Baker Mayfield** began his OU playing career. Since the start of that campaign, the Sooners can lay legitimate claim to being the nation's most productive overall offense. Below are OU's offensive numbers and national ranks since the start of 2015, as well as a look at the nation's best records.

MORE MAYFIELD

► **Baker Mayfield** is the only player in FBS history to register at least 13,500 passing yards (1,392) and at least 1,000 rushing yards (1,003).

► Mayfield is 23-2 in Big 12 games as a Sooner, completing 499-of-706 passes (70.7 percent) for 7,716 yards (308.6 per game) and 77 touchdowns against just 14 interceptions (5.5-to-1 ratio) for a pass efficiency rating of 194.5. He has averaged 15.5 yards per completion and 10.9 yards per attempt, and has rushed for 14 scores in those outings.

► Mayfield has thrown a TD pass in a Big 12-record-tying 36 consecutive games (every contest of his OU career; shares the mark with Texas Tech's Graham Harrell [2006-08]). Only three players have longer streaks in FBS history (see charts to the right). Mayfield has thrown at least two TD passes in a Big 12-record 23 straight contests (71 TDs to 13 interceptions during the stretch). That is the second-longest FBS streak since at least 1996 (behind 26 by Boise State's Kellen Moore from 2010-11), and likely ever.

► Including his 2013 campaign at Texas Tech, Mayfield is averaging 9.73 yards per pass attempt for his career. Only two FBS players who have finished their career boast a higher average (9.90 by Boise State's Ryan Dinwiddie from 2000-03; 9.82 by BYU's Ty Detmer from 1988-91). At OU, Mayfield is averaging 10.67 yards per attempt.

► Mayfield ranks ninth in FBS history with 119 career TD passes (12 at Texas Tech, 107 at Oklahoma). He needs two TD pass to tie BYU's Ty Detmer (1988-91) and Georgia's Aaron Murray (2010-13) for seventh, and four to tie Oklahoma's **Landry Jones** (2009-12) ranks for sixth. The record is 155 by Houston's Case Keenum (2007-11).

► Mayfield owns a 174.3 career passing efficiency rating. Among FBS players who have finished their career, only OU's **Sam Bradford** (175.6 from 2007-09) owns a higher mark. Mayfield's efficiency rating as a Sooner is an astounding 189.4.

► If Mayfield finishes in the top four of Heisman Trophy voting this year, he'll become the fifth player and first since Georgia's Herschel Walker (1980-82) to accomplish the feat three times. The other three to do it were Glenn Davis (Army; 1944-46), Doc Blanchard (also Army; 1944-46) and Doak Walker (SMU; 1947-49). Mayfield finished fourth in 2015 and third last year.

► Mayfield threw 21 TD passes between interceptions (from the third-to-last game last year and this year's Texas contest on Oct. 14). His school-record streak of attempts without an interception reached 200.

OFFENSE EVEN BETTER AFTER LOSS OF KEY WEAPONS

► Despite losing three highly accomplished offensive skill players to the NFL Draft in the spring, OU leads the nation in yards per game (600.7; next most is 573.7 and third most is 546.5) and yards per play this year (8.5). The departed trio of Biletnikoff Award winner **Dede Westbrook** (1,524 receiving yards, 18 total TDs last year), **Samaje Perine** (OU's all-time rushing leader; 1,060 rushing yards, 12 rushing TDs last year) and **Joe Mixon** (single-season OU record of 2,331 all-purpose yards, 16 TDs last year) accounted for 5,447 all-purpose yards and 47 touchdowns last season.

► Last year the Sooners averaged 7.5 yards per play, the second-highest figure in school history (the 1971 team averaged 7.6), but this year's squad is averaging 1.0 more yard per play. OU's 600.7 yards per game this year are 45.9 more per contest than last season (554.8).

► OU has registered more than 500 yards in nine of its 10 games this year (490 at Ohio State in the other), and has racked up more than 600 yards in six contests. OU surpassed the 600-yard mark in four games all of last season.

► Three of the Sooners' top six single-game yards-per-play figures have come this season (4th – 10.6 at Baylor; 5th – 10.3 at Oklahoma State; and 6th – 10.2 vs. Tulane).

► Fourteen Sooners have scored at least one offensive touchdown this year, two more players than all of last season. Eleven Sooners have made at least one TD catch this year, two more than in 2016.

IMPACT FRESHMEN

► Three of Oklahoma's top playmakers on either side of the ball are true freshmen. Running back **Trey Sermon** ranks second on the team with his 567 rushing yards (56.7 per game) and is tied for third by amassing six total touchdowns (four rushing, two receiving). Sermon is averaging 5.8 yards per carry and has caught 14 passes for 120 yards (12.0 average). In a three-game span against Baylor, Iowa State and Texas to start Big 12 play, he averaged 111.3 rushing yards and 6.7 yards per carry.

► Wide receiver **CeeDee Lamb**, who last year as a high school senior registered 2,032 receiving yards and 33 touchdowns, leads the Sooners with six receiving scores. He ranks third with 35 catches and 64.4 receiving yards per game despite missing the final three quarters of the Oct. 7 Iowa State contest due to an injury. He ranks second nationally among freshmen with his 18.4 yards per catch and is on pace to finish the year (assuming at least 13 games) with more than 837 receiving yards, which would break **Kenny Stills'** OU freshman record of 786 set in 2010. Lamb is just one score off teammate **Mark Andrews'** freshman receiving TD record of seven in 2015.

► **Kenneth Murray** has started every game at middle linebacker and ranks third on the team with 53 tackles (5.3 per contest). He is OU's first true freshman in 42 years to start a season opener at inside linebacker (**Daryl Hunt** was the last to do it in 1975).

GETTING DEFENSIVE

► Senior defensive end/linebacker **Ogbonnia Okoronkwo** leads the Big 12 and is tied for 11th nationally with 8.0 sacks (0.8 per game), is tied for the Big 12 lead and tied for seventh nationally with three forced fumbles, and ranks second in the league and seventh nationally with 16.0 tackles for loss (1.6 per game). He has 21.0 career sacks to rank second at OU among linebackers and tied for seventh with **Jonathan Jackson** among all players.

► Okoronkwo has recorded at least half a sack in eight of 10 games and at least one full sack in seven contests. He has at least 1.0 tackle for loss in every outing and at least 2.0 TFLs in five games.

► Sophomore defensive lineman **Kenneth Mann** ranks fourth in the Big 12 with his 5.0 sacks while senior defensive end **D.J. Ward** is tied for seventh with 4.5 sacks. **Parnell Motley** is tied for seventh in the league with two interceptions (returned one 77 yards for a TD against Tulane).

NO PASSING FANCY

► Oklahoma has held 16 of its last 20 opponents to under a 60 percent pass completion rate. Over the last 15 games, OU opponents have combined to complete just 54.8 percent of their passes (264-for-482), ranking the Sooners second in the Big 12 and 29th nationally out of 129 teams. Six of those 15 have been held to a mark below 50 percent.

► By comparison, OU has completed at least 60 percent of its passes in each of its last 20 games, and at least 70 percent in 10 of those.

SOONERS HAVE DOMINATED BIG 12 ERA

► OU's performance in the Big 12 Conference this millennium has been nothing short of dominant. The Sooners have won 10 Big 12 titles in the last 17 seasons, with no other program during that span winning more than two.

► Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed 10 league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each).

► OU is 122-27 (.819) in Big 12 play since the start of the 2000 season. That's 20 more wins than the team with the next most victories during that period (Texas; 102-47) and 37 more than the team with the third most (Oklahoma State; 85-64).

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (641) than any other program. Only Boise State owns a better winning percentage (.772; played 459 fewer games) during that span than OU (.763).

► OU is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 34,930 points (in 1,256 games).

► No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 37. In addition, OU's 22 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.

► Since former head coach **Bob Stoops** arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads all Power 5 conference programs in wins (199) and points scored (9,358).

► Only Ohio State (105) has been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll more weeks than Oklahoma (102). OU's 402 weeks in the AP's top five are most of any school (Alabama next with 377 and Ohio State third with 360). The AP Poll was introduced in 1936.

► Only Ohio State (603) has more all-time top-10 AP poll appearances than OU (568).

► Only Alabama (9) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

EXTRA POINTS

► Oklahoma has three Kansas natives on its roster in defensive lineman **Amani Bledsoe** (Lawrence; Lawrence HS) and offensive linemen **Quinn Mittermeier** (Topeka; Washburn Rural HS) and **Ben Powers** (Wichita; Kapaun Mt. Carmel HS).

► Sooners defensive ends coach **Calvin Thibodeaux** served the 2015 season as Kansas' defensive line coach. Second-year Kansas quarterbacks coach Garrett Riley is the younger brother of OU head coach **Lincoln Riley**.

► The Sooners have won 22 of their last 23 Big 12 Conference games. Six of those 19 victories have been by a touchdown or less, four by 8-14 points, four by 15-21 points and the other eight by at least 22 points (six by at least 35 points).

► Oklahoma has scored at least 30 points in 19 of its last 20 games (its school-record streak of 15 games was halted Oct. 14 in a 29-24 win over Texas).

► OU has won its last 11 games in the month of November (last loss won Nov. 8, 2014, to Baylor).

► Junior kicker/punter **Austin Seibert** ranks fifth nationally by registering touchbacks on 78.2 percent of his kickoffs (61 of 78). The junior is 10-for-12 on field goal attempts on the season (8-for-8 the last five games) and has made all 57 point-after attempts.

► Senior fullback **Dimitri Flowers** has scored a team-high eight touchdowns on his 33 touches this season (one every 4.1 touches). He is one of three players in the country to have at least four rushing touchdowns and four receiving scores, joining teammate **Rodney Anderson** and North Carolina State's Jaylen Samuels.

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and the second-largest collegiate video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

► Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.

► In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director **Bennie Owen** suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.

► The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).

► In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.

► Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and its existing figure of 83,489 (2016).

► In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

► The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.

► The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that has initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.

► The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons will benefit from two new clubs.

► Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.

► All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.

► The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.

LINCOLN RILEY

**FIRST SEASON AS HEAD COACH • YOUNGEST HEAD COACH IN FOOTBALL BOWL SUBDIVISION
WINNER OF 2015 BROYLES AWARD AS NATION'S TOP ASSISTANT COACH**

A new era of Oklahoma football is underway. After presiding over two of the most prolific offensive seasons in program history, 34-year-old Lincoln Riley took over the OU head coaching reins on June 7, 2017, following the retirement of one of the most accomplished coaches of the last quarter century in Bob Stoops. OU's 22nd head coach, Riley served as the program's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach the last two seasons.

The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach, Riley takes over a program fresh off a 10th Big 12 championship and that is primed for more with a \$160 million south end zone project now complete. With some of the country's most eye-catching facilities, a highly touted 2017 recruiting class and coaching and support staffs that remain completely intact, Oklahoma's championship expectations are not altered in the least.

Originally from the 5,000-person West Texas town of Muleshoe, Riley made his name as perhaps the best up-and-coming star in college football by overseeing a balanced and explosive Oklahoma offense the last two seasons. In 2016, the Sooners led the nation in passing efficiency rating (their mark of 193.79 set an FBS record) and pass completion percentage (.706), while ranking second in total offense (554.8 ypg) and third in scoring offense (43.9 ppg) and third-down conversion percentage (.515). Only one team in school history averaged more yards per play than the Sooners' 7.5 in 2016 (the 1971 squad averaged 7.6). OU's potent offensive attack is a big reason the Sooners won a second straight Big 12 title and handled Auburn 35-19 in the Sugar Bowl.

Individual player accomplishments were abundant in 2016 under Riley's tutelage. Quarterback Baker Mayfield and wide receiver Dede Westbrook finished third and fourth in Heisman Trophy voting, respectively, marking just the fourth time since 1955 and first since 2004 that a pair of teammates from any school finished in the top four of Heisman balloting. Westbrook, the Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year, was OU's first unanimous All-American since 2004 and the Sooners' first recipient of the Biletnikoff Award as the nation's outstanding receiver. Running back Joe Mixon finished second nationally and set the OU single-season record with 2,331 all-purpose yards, while backfield mate Samaje Perine set the school career rushing record with 4,122 yards in only three seasons.

Riley was just as good for OU in his first season as offensive coordinator, earning the 2015 Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach after the Sooners ranked fourth nationally in scoring (43.5 ppg) and seventh in total offense (530.2 ypg). Mayfield, who finished fourth in Heisman voting, was the Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year and *Sporting News* national player of the year, while Westbrook was Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year. With Riley leading a high-flying attack, eight offensive players earned all-league honors.

Oklahoma's newest head man joined the Sooners in January 2015 after he caught the eye of Stoops during a highly successful five-year stint as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Ruffin McNeill at East Carolina from 2010-14. With OU looking for a new play caller and wanting to get back to the up-tempo attack it helped make mainstream, Riley's numbers at ECU made him the perfect hire.

At East Carolina, Riley installed and directed a spread offensive scheme that made an immediate impact as the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual school offensive records in his five seasons with the program. His squads recorded the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four marks for total offense in a season.

He spent his final season with the Pirates serving in the role of assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach

in 2014 as the team ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 ypg) and was fifth in total offense (533.0 ypg). With Riley calling the shots, the Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense.

Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down conversion percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone scoring efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

Among his notable pupils, Riley helped transform a pair of East Carolina wide receivers into the most productive pass catchers in FBS history. He guided walk-on Justin Hardy to 387 career catches, breaking the NCAA record previously held by OU's Ryan Broyles (349). Hardy's 4,541 career receiving yards rank third all-time in FBS annals as he flourished in Riley's offense, registering three 1,000-yard seasons at ECU that culminated with a 121-catch, 1,494-yard year as a senior in 2014. Riley also coached recent second-round NFL draft selection Zay Jones for the first two years of his career. Jones went on to break Hardy's record and is the NCAA's leader in career receptions (399) and receptions in a season (158 in 2016).

Already overseeing Mayfield's record-setting career, Riley also developed dynamic quarterbacks Dominique Davis and Shane Carden at ECU. Conference USA's 2010 Newcomer of the Year, Davis set ECU career marks for completions and TD passes despite playing just two seasons. Davis ranked second among FBS signal callers with 393 completions and 46 total touchdowns in 2010. He set an NCAA record with a stretch of 36 straight completions in 2011.

Carden took over the job in 2012 and went on to break the majority of Davis' records, becoming the first 4,000-yard passer in program history and setting single-season standards for completion percentage (70.5 in 2013) and passing yards (4,736 in 2014). Carden earned Conference USA MVP honors in 2013 and was the American Conference's Offensive Player of the Year in 2014. He led all FBS passers with 392 completions in 2014.

Prior to East Carolina, Riley spent seven seasons on the staff at Texas Tech, where he was part of seven bowl teams and five bowl wins. During that span, Red Raiders quarterbacks won NCAA passing titles in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007. A walk-on quarterback at Tech during the spring and summer of 2003 who then became a student coach, Riley immersed himself in head coach Mike Leach's offense and worked his way into a full-time position as wide receivers coach in 2007. He served as inside receivers coach in 2008 and '09, and eventually called plays as interim offensive coordinator in the 2010 Alamo Bowl, where the Red Raiders racked up 579 yards in a 41-31 victory over Michigan State to cap the 2009 season.

Under Riley's guidance in 2007, wide receiver Michael Crabtree won the Biletnikoff Award after smashing Big 12 records and NCAA freshman standards with 134 receptions for 1,962 yards. Crabtree also accumulated 22 touchdown catches his first season. In fact, wide receiver Danny Amendola joined Crabtree that year as Texas Tech receivers who each amassed 100-catch, 1,000-yard efforts.

A 2006 Texas Tech graduate who earned a Bachelor of Science degree in exercise and sport sciences, Riley and his wife, Caitlin, have two daughters, Sloan and Stella.

NORMAN — Oklahoma ushered in the Lincoln Riley era with a commanding 56-7 home win over UTEP. OU racked up 676 total yards of offense and eight different Sooners scored a touchdown.

Making his 27th straight start, quarterback Baker Mayfield opened the season by completing his first 16 passes – the most consecutive completions to start a game in program history. Only playing in the first half, Mayfield finished the opener 19-for-20 through the air for 329 yards and three TDs (282.7 efficiency rating). His passing yardage pushed Mayfield past Jason White (7,922) into third place on OU's career passing yards list (7,994).

Junior tight end Mark Andrews hauled in career highs of seven catches (one touchdown) and 134 yards while only playing the first half. Fourteen Sooners caught at least one pass, the same number who made at least one reception in all of 2016.

DALLAS — Oklahoma jumped to a 20-0 second-quarter lead, fell behind 24-23 with 8:01 remaining in the fourth and then scored on a 59-yard pass 1:08 later for the final points of a 29-24 win over Texas at the Cotton Bowl.

Baker Mayfield, who set a school record by reaching 200 consecutive pass attempts without an interception (he was picked off in the second quarter), was 17-for-27 for 302 yards and two touchdowns in improving to 2-1 against the Longhorns as OU's starting quarterback. NORMAN — Rodney Anderson ran for 151 yards and racked up 139 receiving yards and added four first-half touchdowns as No. 5 Oklahoma grabbed sole possession of first place in the Big 12 with a 38-20 victory over No. 8 TCU. Anderson became just the third player in OU history to eclipse the century mark in rushing and receiving in the same game, and his 290 all-purpose yards were good for the 11th most in program history.

Baker Mayfield threw for 333 yards and three touchdowns while adding 50 yards on the ground. OU netted 200 rushing yards against a Horned Frogs defense that entered the contest allowing a nation-low 69.7 rushing yards per game. Mayfield threw for 299 yards in the first half as the Sooners raced to a 38-14 halftime lead.
