OPENING KICK

► No. 5/5 Oklahoma plays its first road game of 2018 and goes for its 17th straight true road win when it takes on Iowa State on Saturday at 11 a.m. CT at Jack Trice Stadium in Ames. The contest will be televised nationally by ABC with **Dave Pasch**, **Greg McElroy** and **Tom Luginbill** announcing.

► The Sooners are making their 407th all-time appearance in the AP poll's top five this week, more than any other program. That means OU has been in the top five in 36 percent of all AP polls (1,138 total polls) which started in 1936. This is OU's 12th appearance in the AP top 5 since the start of 2017.

► Oklahoma owns a 74-6-2 (.915) all-time record against Iowa State and is 36-2-1 (.936) vs. the Cyclones in Ames. In the Big 12 era, the Sooners hold a 13-1 series advantage (6-0 in Ames).

► OU's .915 series winning percentage against Iowa State is the best by one FBS program against another (minimum of 50 games played).

► Oklahoma has won 25 of its last 26 games against Big 12 opponents dating back to the 2015 season, with its only loss coming at the hands of Iowa State on Oct. 7 last year (the Cyclones beat the No. 3 Sooners 38-31 in Norman). Fifteen of those 25 victories have been by at least 15 points, and seven by at least 35 points.

► Since the start of the 1999 season (which was **Bob Stoops'** first as OU head coach), the Sooners are 12-1 against Iowa State, with all 12 wins coming by double digits. The average score in those 13 contests has been 39-12. In OU's six road games against ISU during that period (the Sooners have won all six), it has outscored the Cyclones 229-82 (average of 38-14).

► OU is coming off a 49-21 home win over UCLA on Saturday in a game that saw the Sooners lead 42-7 in the fourth quarter. Quarterback **Kyler Murray** threw for a career-high 306 yards and three touchdowns while rushing for a team-high 69 yards and two more scores. **CeeDee Lamb** made seven receptions for 146 yards and a TD, and returned a punt 66 yards. OU's disruptive defense produced six sacks and 12 tackles for loss.

► After its Sept. 1 season opener against South Dakota State was canceled due to weather, Iowa State played its first game of 2018 on Saturday at Iowa and lost 13-3. The Cyclones only allowed 276 yards, but they gained just 188 (3.4 per play). ISU entered the year returning 65.4 percent of its passing yards, 90.2 percent of its rushing yards, 55.8 percent of its touchdowns and 45.8 percent of its receiving yards from last year's team that finished 8-5 overall and tied for fourth place in the Big 12.

► The Sooners have scored at least 30 points in 25 of their last 26 games (29 in the other). They have won 24 of those 26 contests. OU's 24-2 record since Oct. 1, 2016, is the nation's second best (Alabama is 25-2).



Sophomore receiver **CeeDee Lamb** caught seven passes for 146 yards (one shy of his career high) and a touchdown in Saturday's 49-21 win over UCLA. Lamb's 66-yard third-quarter punt return also set up a TD. He set an OU freshman record last year with 807 receiving yards, and he tied the school freshman standard with seven receiving TDs.

FIVE KEY STORYLINES

► Iowa State's only two wins against the Sooners since 1961 came in 1990 (33-31) and last season (38-31), both in Norman. OU has won 23 straight games in Ames and hasn't lost there since 1960 (10-6 score). ISU's six overall wins in the series have come by 1, 2, 4, 6, 7 and 13 points (average of 5.5 points). Its 13-point victory came in the first meeting in 1928 in Ames.

► Oklahoma's 16-game true road winning streak is the longest active streak in the country and second longest in school history (OU won 24 in a row from 1953 to 1958). Wisconsin (nine) is the program with the second-longest current streak, while no other program has a current streak longer than six games. The Sooners' last true road loss came almost four full years ago (37-33 at TCU on Oct. 4, 2014). During the 16-game streak, the Sooners have outscored opponents 784-436 (49-27 average) and have outgained them 9,267 yards to 6,611 (579-413 average). OU has scored at least 31 points in all 16 games, and seven of the wins have come against top-25 teams.

► OU has also won a record 14 straight Big 12 road games, breaking the previous league mark of 13 consecutive league road wins by Texas from 2003 to 2006. Since head coach **Lincoln Riley** joined the staff as offensive coordinator prior to the 2015 season, the Sooners are 14-0 in true road games (12-0 in true Big 12 road contests).

► In nine games as a Sooner (three starts), quarterback **Kyler Murray** has completed 46 of his 65 pass attempts (.707) for 874 yards and eight touchdowns with one interception, good for a 221.3 passing efficiency rating. For perspective, **Baker Mayfield's** FBS-record single-season efficiency rating last year was 198.9. Saturday's game at Iowa State will mark Murray's first collegiate road start. He started three home games as a freshman at Texas A&M in 2015, OU's West Virginia home game last season, and two home games this year.

► The Sooners are allowing 17.5 points per game, but the majority of opponent scoring has come with OU's defensive starters already removed due to huge leads. In the 63-14 win over Florida Atlantic, Oklahoma led 56-0 and didn't give up a score until 55 seconds remained in the third quarter. In the 49-21 victory over UCLA, OU led 42-7 before surrendering 14 points in the game's final 11:11. Opponents are averaging 4.7 yards per play through two games after OU allowed 5.8 yards per play in 14 games last season. The Sooners have been particularly disruptive behind the line of scrimmage, recording eight sacks (4.0 average) to rank seventh nationally and 21 tackles for loss (10.5 average) to rank sixth in the country. Last year OU averaged 1.9 sacks and 5.4 TFLs per contest. The eight sacks this season have come from seven players.

RODNEY ANDERSON TO MISS REST OF SEASON

Oklahoma head coach **Lincoln Riley** announced Sunday evening that preseason All-Big 12 running back **Rodney Anderson** will miss the rest of the 2018 season due to a knee injury sustained late in the first quarter of OU's 49-21 win over UCLA on Saturday.

"We're heartbroken for him," said Riley of Anderson. "He's overcome so much in his career, and if anybody can do it again it's Rodney. He's played a lot of great football and has a lot more ahead of him. He's just a tremendous person and player and we'll miss him on the field. But we know he'll be with us every step of the way as a team captain, and that other players will step up in his place."

A redshirt junior from Katy, Texas, who graduated in May and is pursuing a master's degree in human relations, Anderson started seven of 14 games in his first full season of action last year and finished with team highs of 1,161 rushing yards and 13 rushing touchdowns. He was also impactful as a receiver, registering 17 catches for 281 yards (16.5 average) and another five scores. The majority of Anderson's 2017 production came the last half of the season. Starting with OU's Oct. 21 game at Kansas State, he led all Power Five players the rest of the year (eight games) with 1,333 yards from scrimmage (166.6 average) and 16 total TDs.

Anderson's 2015 debut year was cut short when he sustained a season-ending broken leg in the second game at Tennessee. Then during 2016 preseason camp, a fractured vertebra in his neck again sidelined him for the season.

In this year's opening game against Florida Atlantic two weeks ago, Anderson carried five times for 100 yards and two touchdowns. He added 19 yards and another touchdown against UCLA before leaving the game.

RECAPPING SATURDAY'S WIN OVER UCLA

► No. 6 Oklahoma (2-0) registered its 31st consecutive victory over an unranked non-conference opponent by defeating UCLA (0-2) 49-21 in Norman. The Sooners improved to 4-1 all-time against the Bruins and to 3-0 in the series on Owen Field (have outscored them 146-48 in the home games).

► OU, which trailed 7-0, led 21-7 at halftime and 42-7 in the fourth quarter. It outgained UCLA 485 yards to 383 and converted 7-of-12 third downs (58 percent) to the Bruins' 5-of-15 (33 percent).

► Quarterback **Kyler Murray** accounted for five touchdowns on the day, earning him Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week, Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week and Davey O'Brien Quarterback of the Week honors. The redshirt junior was 19-for-33 through the air for 306 yards and three TDs (one interception), and rushed 10 times for 69 yards and a pair of scores. Saturday marked the first time since OU's 2014 game at Iowa State (**Trevor Knight** with 146) that a quarterback led the Sooners in rushing yards. Murray also became just the third Sooner since 1996 (the start of the Big 12 era) to throw for over 300 yards and rush for at least 65 yards, joining Knight and **Baker Mayfield**.

► Sophomore receiver **CeeDee Lamb** finished with seven catches for 146 yards (one shy of his career high) and a 35-yard score. He also returned two punts for 63 yards, including a career-long 66 yarder. Junior **Marquise Brown** hauled in four passes for 88 yards, one of them a 58-yard catch-and-run for a TD.

► OU's defense was disruptive, registering six sacks and 12 tackles for loss. Junior defensive end/linebacker **Mark Jackson Jr.** recorded a career-high 10 tackles and a tackle for loss, sophomore linebacker **Kenneth Murray** had nine

tackles, a career-high 2.5 TFLs and a sack, and redshirt senior linebacker **Curtis Bolton**, last week's Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week, finished with career highs of eight tackles, 2.0 TFLs and 1.5 sacks.

► The Sooners' special teams were also extremely effective. In addition to Lamb's 63-yard punt return, OU got an 85-yard first-quarter kickoff return from sophomore **Tre Brown**. It was the program's longest non-scoring play/return in the 95-year history of Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. Brown's other kick return was a 36-yarder.

► Six different Sooners reached the end zone in the victory: Murray (twice), Marquise Brown, Lamb, **Rodney Anderson**, **A.D. Miller**, and **Marcelias Sutton**.

SCOUTING IOWA STATE

► Iowa State is under the direction of third-year head coach **Matt Campbell**, who is 11-15 with the Cyclones. The 2017 Big 12 Coach of the Year led ISU to an 8-5 record and a 21-20 Liberty Bowl win over Memphis last season after a 3-9 debut year. His overall head coaching record is 46-30 in six-plus seasons, which includes a 35-15 mark in four years at Toledo.

► Iowa State's eight wins in 2017 marked its highest total since posting a 9-3 record in 2000. With a school-record three wins over ranked opponents, the Cyclones reached the top-25 for the first time since 2005. ISU set school single-season records for fewest turnovers (10), most passing yards per game (279.2) and tackles for loss (96) in 2017. Its 20.9 points allowed and 366.2 total yards allowed last year were the program's fewest this decade.

► Offensively, Iowa State returns running backs **David Montgomery** and **Mike Warren**, who have each recorded a 1,000-yard rushing season. Montgomery, a first-team All-Big 12 selection a year ago, ran for 1,146 yards in 2017, while Warren ran for more than 1,300 as a redshirt freshman in 2015. Quarterback **Kyle Kempt**, back in his sixth season of eligibility, set a school record with a 66.3 completion percentage last year, and owns a current streak of 151 passes without throwing an interception.

► The Cyclones dropped their season opener at Iowa on Saturday, 13-3. Iowa State mustered just 188 total yards (169 passing, 19 rushing) while holding the Hawkeyes to 271 total yards (166 passing, 105 rushing). Iowa collected four sacks while not allowing one. Kempt was 15-of-21 passing for 126 yards, spreading the ball around to nine receivers. **Hakeem Butler** led the receivers with three catches for 35 yards, and Montgomery paced the team with 44 rushing yards on 17 carries (2.6 average).

► Iowa State's scheduled season opener against South Dakota State on Sept. 1 was canceled by inclement weather with ISU leading 7-0 in the first quarter. It was the program's first football game canceled since 1963.

LAST YEAR VS. THE CYCLONES

► Oklahoma's winning streaks of 14 games overall, 17 in Big 12 play and 18 against Iowa State came to a halt last year with a 38-31 home loss to the Cyclones on Oct. 7. The Sooners led 24-13 at halftime but were outscored 25-7 afterward.

► On its second possession, OU took a 14-0 lead with 5:49 left in the first quarter, but the drive resulted in the loss of two starters for the rest of the game. Running back **Abdul Adams** was injured on the second play of the series following a seven-yard reception. He left the game and did not return after rushing for 42 yards on three carries (14.0 average). Receiver **CeeDee Lamb** scored on a 15-yard catch and run, but also left the contest after getting injured on the play. It was his team-leading fourth TD reception of the year.

► **Baker Mayfield** set a Big 12 record by throwing for at least two touchdowns in his 18th straight game (broke **Sam Bradford's** league standard) and finished 24-for-33 for 306 yards and two TDs. He added a season-high 57 rushing yards, including a 13-yard score.

► **Trey Sermon** replaced Adams and ran for 90 yards on 11 carries (5.0 average). He scored the game's first points on a 23-yard pass from Mayfield.

► OU held the Cyclones to 81 rushing yards (2.5 per carry), but ISU reserve quarterback **Kyle Kempt** completed 18-of-24 passes for 343 yards and three touchdowns. Running back **David Montgomery** ran for 55 yards on 17 carries (3.2 average) and caught a team-high seven passes for 89 yards.

► The defeat for OU was its first at the hands of Iowa State since 1990 and second since 1961. The Cyclones improved to 6-74-2 in the series.

SPECIAL TEAMS HAVE BEEN SPECIAL

► Special teams have been a major positive for the Sooners through two games. Among teams with at least three kickoff returns this season, OU leads the nation with its 47.3 average on the strength of **Tre Brown**. The sophomore cornerback, who paces the country in kickoff return yards, has compiled 142 yards on three returns, including an 86-yarder in the first quarter on Saturday that set up the tying touchdown after UCLA took a 7-0 lead.

OU'S 16-GAME ROAD WINNING STREAK

Oklahoma enters the Iowa State contest riding a 16-game road winning streak, longest in the nation. The average score in those games has been 49-27, and OU has averaged 579 yards.

► Among teams with at least six punt returns, OU ranks fourth nationally with its 18.2 average. Sophomore receiver **CeeDee Lamb** is averaging 16.2 yards on his five returns, thanks largely to a 66-yard runback vs. UCLA. Redshirt junior receiver **Lee Morris** has one return for 28 yards.

► Last year, OU ranked 98th nationally in kick return average (19.3 yards) and 97th in punt return average (5.59).

► Opponents have only returned one punt this season and it went for -1 yard. The Sooners also registered their first blocked punt since 2013 in the opener against Florida Atlantic, and it resulted in their first blocked punt TD since 2002. Morris registered the block and **Curtis Bolton** fell on the ball in the end zone.

► Senior kicker/punter **Austin Seibert** is 15-for-15 on PATs this season after going 81-for-81 last year. His streak of 108 makes is the third longest in the nation. Twelve of his 14 kickoffs this season have also resulted in touchbacks.

► Seibert ranks first at OU and second in the Big 12 in all-time extra points made (238), 36 behind the conference record of 274 set by Baylor's Aaron Jones (2010-13). He ranks 11th all-time in Big 12 scoring (376 points) and fourth in points per game (9.0).

GOING FOR BIG 12 FOUR-PEAT

► If Oklahoma wins the 2018 Big 12 title, it will mark the program's fourth straight league crown. The last time the Sooners won four consecutive conference championships was 1984-87 under head coach **Barry Switzer**.

► Oklahoma is the only program to win three straight Big 12 titles, and it has done so twice (also from 2006-08). Baylor (2013-14) is the only other program to win two Big 12 championships in a row.

► The last Power Five program to win four straight outright league titles was Florida from 1993 through 1996.

LEAGUE-HIGH SEVEN SOONERS ON PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12 TEAM

► A league-high seven OU players, representing eight spots, were named to the 2018 Preseason All-Big 12 Football Team that was announced in July and chosen by media representatives who cover the league. The Sooners' eight over-all selections were three more than the team with the next most (West Virginia). OU also boasted six offensive picks, twice as many the Mountaineers, who had the second most.

► Junior running back **Rodney Anderson**, junior wide receiver **Marquise Brown**, sophomore tight end **Grant Calcaterra**, junior offensive lineman **Bobby Evans**, senior offensive lineman **Ben Powers** and senior kicker/punter **Austin Seibert** were among the 29 players named to the all-league squad by position. Freshman defensive back **Brendan Radley-Hiles** was named Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year.

MURRAY GETS THE CALL AT QB

► After a competitive battle during August camp, head coach **Lincoln Riley** announced Aug. 22 that redshirt junior **Kyler Murray** would be OU's starting quarterback for the season opener against Florida Atlantic and that redshirt sophomore **Austin Kendall** would be his backup.

► A 5-10, 195-pounder from Allen, Texas, Murray was the backup last season to **Baker Mayfield**, who won OU's sixth Heisman Trophy as the Sooners claimed their third straight Big 12 title and made the College Football Playoff for the second time in three years.

► Amazingly, Murray was more efficient as a passer last season than was Mayfield — the man who holds the top two single-season passing efficiency ratings in major college football history. Murray completed 18 of his 21 throws for 359 yards and three touchdowns without an interception in seven games in 2017. He boasted an eye-popping 276.5 efficiency rating to Mayfield's record-setting 198.9 mark, but didn't have near enough pass attempts to qualify in the category.

► Murray started his collegiate career at Texas A&M, where he played in eight games and made three starts in 2015. He was a consensus five-star recruit out of Allen High School and was named 2014 national high school player of the year by *Parade*, *Gatorade*, *MaxPreps* and *USA Today*. Murray went 43-0 as a high school starter and earned state titles each of his last three years.

► Also a standout on the diamond, Murray played center field for **Skip Johnson's** OU baseball team and was a first-round pick (No. 9 overall) by the Oakland A's in June's Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. He was the only Big 12 player picked in the first round of the 2018 draft and he signed in mid-June. Murray hit .296 with 10 home runs, 13 doubles, 47 RBIs and 10 stolen bases in 51 games (50 starts). He finished the year with a slash line of .296/.398/.556.

RILEY'S FAST START

► The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, **Lincoln Riley** became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. The previous record for wins by a first-year OU head coach was 10 by **Chuck Fairbanks** in 1967 and **Barry Switzer** in 1973. Switzer holds the Sooners' record for most wins in his first two seasons as head coach (21 in 1973-74). Riley, who turned 35 last Wednesday (Sept. 5), needs nine wins in 2018 to tie the mark. He was the second-youngest FBS head coach entering this season.

OFFENSE HAS ROLLED UNDER RILEY

► Oklahoma has a legitimate claim as the nation's most productive offense since the start of the 2015 season, which was **Lincoln Riley's** first year as OU's offensive coordinator. Riley called plays as the program's offensive coordinator and continues to as head coach.

► Since the start of the 2015 season, OU ranks first nationally in passing efficiency rating (187.8; next closest is 162.3), completion percentage (69.3), points per game (44.8), total offense (556.0) and touchdowns from scrimmage (238), and is second in yards per pass attempt (10.5), sixth in passing offense (329.6) and 19th in rushing offense (226.4; 10th in Power Five).

► In 42 games since the start of the 2015 season, OU has registered at least 500 yards of total offense 30 times, in-

cluding in 20 of the last 26 outings, topped the 600-yard mark on 15 occasions and gone over 700 yards four times. Similarly, OU has scored at least 30 points in 37 of 42 games during the Riley regime, at least 40 points 28 times, at least 50 points 16 times and at least 60 points six times.

► Four of OU's top five single-game total offense figures since 2000, and six of the top nine have come over the last 40 games (1. 854 at Texas Tech in 2016; 2. 785 at Oklahoma State in 2017; 3. 773 vs. Tulsa in 2015; 5. 710 at Kansas in 2015; 7. 684 vs. Iowa State in 2015; 9. 676 vs. UTEP in 2017).

► The Sooners have posted a 36-6 (.857) record since Riley's OU debut (25-2 in Big 12 play). That record is fourth best in the country since the start of 2015. Only Alabama (43-3), Clemson (42-4) and Ohio State (37-5) have better records during that span.

SOONERS HAVE DOMINATED BIG 12 ERA

► OU's performance in the Big 12 Conference this millennium has been nothing short of dominant. The Sooners have won 11 Big 12 titles in the last 17 seasons, with no other program during that span winning more than two.

► Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed 11 league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each).

► OU is 124-27 (.821) in regular season Big 12 play since the start of the 2000 season. That's 21 more wins than the program with the next most victories during that period (Texas; 103-48) and 38 more than the program with the third most (Oklahoma State; 86-65).

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (642) than any other program. Only Boise State owns a better winning percentage (.773; played 449 fewer games) during that span than OU (.767).

► OU is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 35,228 points (in 1,262 games).

► No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 38. In addition, OU's 24 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.

► Since former head coach Bob Stoops arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads all Power Five conference programs in wins (204) and points scored (9,649).

► Only Ohio State (105) has been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll more weeks than Oklahoma (101). OU's 407 weeks in the AP's top five are most of any school (Alabama next with 384 and Ohio State third with 365). The AP Poll was introduced in 1936.

► Only Ohio State (610) has more all-time top-10 AP poll appearances than OU (575).

► Only Alabama (10) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

EXTRA POINTS

► OU head coach **Lincoln Riley** turned 35 last Wednesday (Sept. 5). He is the second-youngest head coach in the FBS.

► The Sooners have been ranked in the AP's top 10 in 24 of the last 25 polls. The only time it wasn't during that stretch was following last year's loss to Iowa State (fell from third to 12th).

► Saturday's game will mark OU's only contest in its first six in which it is not the designated home team. Four of the Sooners' first five contests are at home, and OU is the designated home team for its Oct. 6 game vs. Texas in Dallas.

► Oklahoma has outscored its two opponents 112-35. In the first through third quarters, the margin is 91-14.

► OU's 112 points are its most combined points in the first two games of a season since totaling 130 points in the first two contests in 2007 against North Texas and Miami (Fla.). The Sooners' 112 points are also their third most through two games over the past 100 seasons (130 in 2007, 117 in 1972).

► The Sooners are 23-4-1 (.839) all-time as the No. 5 team in the AP Poll and have won three straight games when ranked fifth and 10 of their last 11.

► Oklahoma committed just 13 turnovers last year (six interceptions and seven fumbles lost), or less than one per game. That marked the second-lowest total in OU history (11 in 2008). It has one turnover in two games this season.

► Receiver **Drake Stoops**, son of OU's all-time wins leader (190) **Bob Stoops**, made two catches for 16 yards in the opener against Florida Atlantic. He is believed to be the first true freshman walk-on in program history to register a catch in a season-opening game.

► Since the start of the 2017 season, OU is averaging 27.3 points in the first half. It has scored at least 20 first-half points in 14 of 16 games, and at least 28 points in nine of those contests. Over the last nine contests, the Sooners are averaging 32.0 first-half points. Four of those nine opponents were ranked in the top 12 of the AP poll at the time of competition.

► Oklahoma has won more Big 12 championships over the last 19 years (11) than it has lost home games. OU is 108-10 (.915) at Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium since the start of the 1999 season, with all 118 of those games sellouts. It is the best home winning percentage among Power Five schools over the last 19-plus seasons (Ohio State is next at .884). OU has outscored its opponents by an average of 42-16 in those games.

► Oklahoma is looking to register its 16th season of at least 10 wins since the start of the 2000 campaign. The Sooners are the only FBS program to rack up 15 seasons of double-digit victories since 2000.

► Oklahoma, Alabama and Clemson have all finished in the final AP top 5 each of the past three seasons.

► OU has had at least four players selected in each of the last 11 NFL Drafts. LSU (also 11) is the only other school that can make that claim.

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and the second-largest collegiate video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

► Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.

► In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.

► The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).

► In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.

► Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and its existing figure of 83,489 (2016).

► In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

► The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.

► The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that has initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.

► The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons will benefit from two new clubs.

► Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.

► All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.

► The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.

► A significantly larger and more more detailed video board has replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The new board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

**SECOND SEASON AS HEAD COACH • SET OU RECORD FOR WINS IN A DEBUT SEASON (12) IN 2017
DIRECTED SOONERS TO 2017 BIG 12 TITLE AND COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF NO. 2 SEED
WINNER OF 2015 BROYLES AWARD AS NATION'S TOP ASSISTANT COACH**

After presiding over two of the most prolific offenses in OU history as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2015 and 2016, Lincoln Riley took over the program's head coaching reins on June 7, 2017, following the retirement of one of the most accomplished coaches of the last quarter century in Bob Stoops. OU's 22nd head coach, all Riley did in his first year at the helm was lead the Sooners to their 11th Big 12 title, a No. 2 seed in the College Football Playoff and a No. 3 final ranking in the AP and coaches polls.

The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, Riley became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. The previous record for wins by a first-year OU head coach was 10 by Chuck Fairbanks in 1967 and Barry Switzer in 1973. The next highest figure is eight.

Originally from the 5,000-person West Texas town of Muleshoe, Riley, who continues to call Oklahoma's offensive plays as head coach, has made his name as perhaps the best up-and-coming star in college football by overseeing a balanced — and explosive — OU offense the last three seasons.

Since the start of the 2015 campaign, OU ranks first nationally in passing efficiency rating (187.8; next closest is 162.3), completion percentage (69.3), points per game (44.8), total offense (556.0) and touchdowns from scrimmage (238), and is second in yards per pass attempt (10.5), sixth in passing offense (329.6) and 19th in rushing offense (226.4; 10th in Power Five). With that kind of offensive production, it's no surprise the Sooners have posted a 36-6 (.857) record since Riley's arrival (25-2 in Big 12 play). OU's overall mark since 2015 is fourth best nationally, with only Alabama (43-3), Clemson (42-4) and Ohio State (37-5) having better records during that span.

Individual player honors and accomplishments have been abundant under Riley's tutelage. Quarterback Baker Mayfield became OU's sixth Heisman Trophy winner in 2017 after finishing third in 2016 voting and fourth in 2015. Mayfield also won the Maxwell Award, Davey O'Brien Award, Manning Award and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award, and was named AP Player of the Year. All-America wide receiver Dede Westbrook finished fourth in Heisman voting in 2016 and became OU's first winner of the Biletnikoff Award, while tight end Mark Andrews claimed the school's first Mackey Award in 2017. Four Sooners earned first-team All-America honors in 2017: Mayfield, Andrews, left tackle Orlando Brown and defensive end/linebacker Ogbornia Okoronkwo. Running back Joe Mixon finished second nationally and set the OU single-season record with 2,331 all-purpose yards in 2016, while backfield mate Samaje Perine set the school career rushing record with 4,122 yards in only three seasons.

Oklahoma's newest head man joined the Sooners in January 2015 after he caught the eye of Stoops during a highly successful five-year stint as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Ruffin McNeill at East Carolina from 2010-14. With OU looking for a new play caller and wanting to get back to the up-tempo attack it helped make mainstream, Riley's numbers at ECU made him the perfect hire.

At East Carolina, Riley installed and directed a spread offensive scheme that made an immediate impact as the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual school offensive records in his five seasons with the program. His squads recorded the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four marks for total offense in a season.

He spent his final season with the Pirates serving in the role of assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach in 2014 as the team ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 ypg) and was fifth in total offense (533.0 ypg). With Riley calling the shots, the Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense.

Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down conversion percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone scoring efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

Among his notable pupils, Riley helped transform a pair of East Carolina wide receivers into the most productive pass catchers in FBS history. He guided walk-on Justin Hardy to 387 career catches, breaking the NCAA record previously held by OU's Ryan Broyles (349). Hardy's 4,541 career receiving yards rank third all-time in FBS annals as he flourished in Riley's offense, registering three 1,000-yard seasons at ECU that culminated with a 121-catch, 1,494-yard year as a senior in 2014. Riley also coached recent second-round NFL draft selection Zay Jones for the first two years of his career. Jones went on to break Hardy's record and is the NCAA's leader in career receptions (399) and receptions in a season (158 in 2016).

Already overseeing Mayfield's record-setting career, Riley also developed dynamic quarterbacks Dominique Davis and Shane Carden at ECU. Conference USA's 2010 Newcomer of the Year, Davis set ECU career marks for completions and TD passes despite playing just two seasons. Davis ranked second among FBS signal callers with 393 completions and 46 total touchdowns in 2010. He set an NCAA record with 36 straight completions in 2011.

Carden took over the job in 2012 and went on to break the majority of Davis' records, becoming the first 4,000-yard passer in program history and setting single-season standards for completion percentage (70.5 in 2013) and passing yards (4,736 in 2014). Carden earned Conference USA MVP honors in 2013 and was the American Conference's Offensive Player of the Year in 2014. He led all FBS passers with 392 completions in 2014.

Prior to East Carolina, Riley spent seven seasons on the staff at Texas Tech, where he was part of seven bowl teams and five bowl wins. During that span, Red Raiders quarterbacks won NCAA passing titles in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007. A walk-on quarterback at Tech during the spring and summer of 2003 who then became a student coach, Riley immersed himself in head coach Mike Leach's offense and worked his way into a full-time position as wide receivers coach in 2007. He served as inside receivers coach in 2008 and '09, and eventually called plays as interim offensive coordinator in the 2010 Alamo Bowl, where the Red Raiders racked up 579 yards in a 41-31 victory over Michigan State to cap the 2009 season.

Under Riley's guidance in 2007, wide receiver Michael Crabtree won the Biletnikoff Award after smashing Big 12 records and NCAA freshman standards with 134 receptions for 1,962 yards. Crabtree also accumulated 22 touchdown catches his first season. In fact, wide receiver Danny Amendola joined Crabtree that year as Texas Tech receivers who each amassed 100-catch, 1,000-yard efforts.

A 2006 Texas Tech graduate who earned a Bachelor of Science degree in exercise and sport sciences, Riley and his wife, Caitlin, have two daughters, Sloan and Stella.

NORMAN — Oklahoma registered its largest margin of victory in a season opener since 2008 by beating Florida Atlantic by 49 points. The Sooners, who led 42-0 at halftime, and 56-0, outgained the AP's 30th-ranked team 650 yards to 324 (10.5 yards per play to 4.4).

Kyler Murray was 9-for-11 through the air for 209 yards and two touchdowns for a gaudy 301.4 passing efficiency rating. He also ran for 23 yards on four carries before exiting the game for good late in the second quarter. Murray's TD throws both went for 65 yards, the first to then-walk-on receiver Lee Morris and the second to Marquise Brown.

Running back Rodney Anderson led a potent ground charge that finished with 316 yards on 39 carries (8.1 average). Anderson carried just five times but amassed 100 yards and scored on jaunts of 30 and 65 yards.

OU's defense didn't allow a point until 55 seconds were left in the third quarter. The first-half shutout was the Sooners' first since 2015. On special teams, Morris registered OU's first blocked punt since 2013 in the first quarter. Curtis Bolton fell on the ball in the end zone for the program's first TD on a blocked punt since 2002.

NORMAN — The Sooners registered their 31st consecutive victory over an unranked non-conference opponent by easily handling UCLA. OU, which led 21-7 at halftime and 42-7 in the fourth quarter, outgained the Bruins 485 yards to 383.

Quarterback Kyler Murray was 19-for-33 passing for 306 yards and three TDs, and rushed 10 times for 69 yards and a pair of scores. It marked the first time since OU's 2014 game at Iowa State (Trevor Knight, 146) that a quarterback led the team in rushing yards.

Receiver CeeDee Lamb finished with seven catches for 146 yards (one shy of his career high) and a 35-yard score. He also returned two punts for 63 yards, including a career-long 66 yarder. Marquise Brown hauled in four passes for 88 yards, one of them a 58-yard catch-and-run for a TD.

Oklahoma's defense registered six sacks and 12 tackles for loss. Defensive end/linebacker Mark Jackson Jr. recorded a career-high 10 tackles and a TFL, and linebacker Kenneth Murray finished with nine tackles and 2.5 TFLs.

The Sooners also got an 85-yard kickoff return from Tre Brown, the longest non-scoring play/return by OU in the 95-year history of Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium.
