OPENING KICK

► In a matchup of the Big 12's two most successful programs, No. 7/5 Oklahoma meets No. 19/20 Texas for the 113th time on Saturday at 11 a.m. CT. The AT&T Red River Showdown, played in Dallas for the 90th straight year, will be televised by FOX with **Gus Johnson**, **Joel Klatt** and **Jenny Taft** announcing.

► Oklahoma has won 11 Big 12 titles in the first 22 years of the league, with no other program during that span winning more than three. All 11 of OU's Big 12 titles have come in the last 19 years, with no other program winning more than two during the span. Texas ranks second with three Big 12 titles (last one in 2009; OU has won five since then).

► Oklahoma has won 27 of its last 28 games against Big 12 opponents (including its last 10) dating back to the 2015 season. Its only loss during that span came at the hands of Iowa State on Oct. 7 last year (the Cyclones beat the No. 3 Sooners 38-31 in Norman). Sixteen of those 27 victories have been by at least 15 points, and eight by at least 30 points.

► The Sooners have been ranked in the AP's top 10 in 27 of the last 28 polls. The only time it wasn't during that stretch was following last year's loss to Iowa State (fell from third to 12th).

► Texas is the only Big 12 program with a winning record against the Sooners. Oklahoma trails 61-46-5 in the series, but owns a 25-19-3 (.564) advantage since 1971. In the Big 12 era, OU is 13-9 (.591) against the Longhorns. The Sooners have won six of the last eight meetings and 12 of the last 18.

► OU has scored at least 30 points in 27 of its last 29 games (29 and 28 in the other two). It has won 27 of those 29 contests. OU's 27-2 record since Oct. 1, 2016, is the nation's second best (Alabama is 28-2).

► The Sooners are coming off a 66-33 win over Baylor in which they set school records for yards per pass attempt (18.8), yards per completion (25.2) and pass efficiency rating (317.8). Quarterback **Kyler Murray** tied an OU record by accounting for seven touchdowns, six of them through the air. He was 17 for 21 for 432 yards and no interceptions, and ran for 45 yards and a score. His pass efficiency rating of 348.0 set school and Big 12 records, and was the highest by an FBS player since at least 1996. The team's 11.2 yards per play marked the third-highest total in program history.

► Texas posted its fourth straight victory by beating Kansas State 19-14 on the road Saturday. Quarterback **Sam Ehlinger** threw for 207 yards and a touchdown on 29-of-36 passing, and **D'Shawn Jamison** returned a punt 90 yards for the game's first points. The Longhorns held K-State to 217 yards (3.4 per play).



Quarterback **Kyler Murray** has accounted for 21 TDs and just two turnovers this year for unbeaten Oklahoma. The Texas native's 231.0 pass efficiency rating is 32 points higher than Baker Mayfield's FBS single-season record of 198.9 set last year. He has thrown for at least three TDs in each of the last four games (two in OU's first outing).

FIVE KEY STORYLINES

► This marks the first season since 2012 that both OU and Texas enter the Red River Showdown ranked in the AP Top 25. The Sooners have been ranked in the AP poll at the time of the Red River game in each of the last 13 years and in 18 of the last 19 seasons. Texas was unranked when playing the Sooners each of the last five years.

► Saturday's game will pit the Big 12's top scoring offense in Oklahoma (48.6 ppg) versus the league's second-best scoring defense in Texas (19.8 ppg). Last year OU set a school record with its 8.3 yards per play (believed to be the second-highest average in FBS history), and this year the Sooners are averaging a nation-leading 8.9 yards per snap (the FBS single-season record is 8.6 by Hawaii in 2006). Texas is allowing 4.8 yards per play.

► Dating back to the start of the 2012 season, the Sooners are 33-6 (.846) in regular season games away from home. In those 39 contests, Oklahoma has outscored its opponents 1,566-1,064 (40-27 average). OU has scored at least 30 points in 32 of those 39 games.

► Oklahoma has outscored its four opponents 243-116 this year. In the first half, the margin is 146-40. The last time OU allowed 40 or fewer combined first-half points through the first five games of a season was in 2013 (gave up 21). The defense has permitted scores on only seven of 32 first-half opponent possessions this year (22 percent).

► Through five games this season, quarterback **Kyler Murray** has a better passing efficiency rating (231.0), more total touchdowns (21), more yards per pass attempt (13.4), more yards per completion (19.0) and more rushing yards per game (57.0) than **Baker Mayfield**, **Sam Bradford** and **Jason White** did through five games the years they won their Heisman Trophies while at OU (see chart on the bottom of page 3 of these notes).

RECAPING SATURDAY'S WIN OVER BAYLOR

► Sixth-ranked Oklahoma racked up 607 yards of offense and averaged 11.2 yards per play (tied for the third-highest figure in program history) in defeating Baylor 66-33 in Norman on Saturday. The Sooners, whose point total was tied for their second highest against a Big 12 opponent, were remarkably efficient on offense, registering 10 plays of more than 20 yards (eight of at least 30 yards and six of at least 40 yards).

► OU, which never trailed, set school records for yards per pass attempt (18.8), yards per completion (25.2) and pass efficiency rating (317.8). Quarterback **Kyler Murray** entered the game on OU's second possession and finished the day 17 for 21 for 432 yards, six touchdowns and no interceptions while adding 45 rushing yards and a score. His 348.0 passing efficiency rating set school and Big 12 records (as did his 20.6 yards per pass attempt and 25.4 yards per completion) and was the highest in the FBS since at least 1996.

► **Marquise Brown** (132 yards, TDs of 24 and 50 yards), **CeeDee Lamb** (101 yards, 86-yard TD) and **Lee Morris** (61 yards, TDs of 9 and 43 yards) led OU's receivers, while running back **Kennedy Brooks** ran for team and career highs of 107 yards on eight carries (13.4 average) and two scores (34 and 49 yards).

► One week after registering 28 tackles against Army, linebacker **Kenneth Murray** posted a team-high 17 against the Bears, and was followed by linebacker **Curtis Bolton** (16) and safety **Kahlil Haughton** (11). Freshman defensive end **Ronnie Perkins** (three quarterback hurries) and linebacker **Caleb Kelly** each had two of OU's six sacks, while corner-back **Trey Brown** tallied an OU-season-high four pass breakups.

► The Sooners were without three of their five team captains. Running back **Rodney Anderson** is out for the year with a leg injury, and guard **Ben Powers** and defensive end **Kenneth Mann** also missed the game due to injury.

LAST YEAR IN DALLAS

► Oklahoma jumped to a 20-0 second-quarter lead, fell behind 24-23 with 8:01 remaining in the fourth and then scored on a 59-yard pass 1:08 later for the final points of a 29-24 win over Texas on Oct. 14, 2017.

► OU outgained the Longhorns by 90 yards (518-428) despite running 15 fewer plays, and averaged 7.7 yards per play to Texas' 5.2. The Sooners limited UT to a 48.9 pass completion percentage (21 for 43).

► **Lincoln Riley** became just the fifth OU head coach to win in his debut against Texas, joining **Bennie Owen** in 1905, **Jim Mackenzie** in 1966, **Barry Switzer** in 1973 and **John Blake** in 1996.

► **Baker Mayfield**, who set a school record by reaching 200 consecutive pass attempts without an interception (his streak ended with a second-quarter pickoff), was 17 for 27 for 302 yards and two touchdowns in improving to 2-1 against the Longhorns as OU's starting quarterback.

► The recipient of Mayfield's final TD pass, **Mark Andrews** finished with four grabs for 104 yards. **Marquise Brown** added four catches for 73 yards and **CeeDee Lamb** hauled in three receptions for 74 yards after missing the final three quarters of the previous week's game due to injury.

► In their Red River rivalry debuts, **Trey Sermon** rushed 20 times for 96 yards and **Rodney Anderson** carried 10 times for 48 yards, including a 15-yard TD rush in the second quarter that put OU ahead 17-0.

► **Emmanuel Beal** and **Kenneth Murray** led OU with seven tackles each, while **Ogbonnia Okoronkwo**, **D.J. Ward** and **Amani Bledsoe** each registered a sack. Ward finished with 2.0 tackles for loss while Okoronkwo also forced a fumble, broke up a pass and registered five quarterback hurries to earn Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week honors.

► Punter/placekicker **Austin Seibert** had a banner day, going 3-for-3 on field goals (25, 28, 36 yards) and 3-for-3 on extra points, averaging 47.0 yards on his five punts (three over 50 yards, two downed inside the 20-yard line [one at the 1-yard line]) and registering seven touchbacks on his eight kickoffs (made a tackle on the non-touchback).

MURRAY ANOTHER OU HEISMAN HOPEFUL

► After a competitive battle during August camp, head coach **Lincoln Riley** announced Aug. 22 that redshirt junior **Kyler Murray** would be OU's starting quarterback for the season opener against Florida Atlantic and that redshirt sophomore **Austin Kendall** would be his backup. Through five games, Riley's decision has proved fruitful, with Murray ranking first nationally in yards per pass attempt (13.4) and yards per completion (19.0), second in passing efficiency rating (231.0) and points responsible for (126), third in passing touchdowns (17), fifth in total offense per game (349.0 yards; didn't play in second half vs. Florida Atlantic, OU only ran 40 plays vs. Army) and 10th in passing yards (1,460) and completion percentage (.706). He is the only player averaging at least 250.0 passing yards (292.0) and at least 50.0 rushing yards (55.2) per game.

► Murray has thrown at least two touchdowns passes in every game this season, and at least three in each of the last four contests.

► A 5-10, 195-pounder from Allen, Texas, Murray is looking to become OU's fourth Heisman Trophy finalist in the last three years (**Baker Mayfield** in 2016 and '17 and **Dede Westbrook** in 2016), and its second straight winner (Mayfield). He has accounted for 21 touchdowns (17 passing, four rushing) and just two turnovers (interceptions). He ranks second on the team with 276 rushing yards (5.9 per carry) and paces the squad with four rushing TDs.

► Murray was the backup last season to Mayfield, who won OU's sixth Heisman Trophy as the Sooners claimed their third straight Big 12 title and made the College Football Playoff for the second time in three years.

► No school has ever produced back-to-back Heisman Trophy winners who were quarterbacks.

► Only six times since the start of the Big 12 Conference in 1996 has a Sooner thrown for at least 300 yards and rushed for at least 65 in a game, and Murray has done it twice (vs. UCLA and Iowa State). He passed for 306 yards and ran for 69 against UCLA before throwing for a career-high 348 and rushing for 77 at Iowa State. For his effort against UCLA, Murray was named Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week, Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week and the Davey O'Brien National Quarterback of the Week.

► Through five games, Murray has been considerably more efficient as a passer this season than Mayfield was the last two seasons when he twice set the single-season FBS record in the category. Murray's 231.7 rating is 33 points better than Mayfield's existing record of 198.9 set last year, and 35 points better than Mayfield's 2016 mark of 196.4.

► Murray started his collegiate career at Texas A&M, where he played in eight games and made three starts in 2015. He was a consensus five-star recruit out of Allen High School and was named 2014 national high school player of the year by *Parade*, *Gatorade*, *MaxPreps* and *USA Today*. Murray went 43-0 as a high school starter and earned state titles each of his last three years.

► Also a baseball standout, Murray played center field for **Skip Johnson's** OU team and was a first-round pick (No. 9 overall) by the Oakland A's in June's Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. He was the only Big 12 player picked in the first round of the 2018 draft and he signed in mid-June. Murray hit .296 with 10 home runs, 13 doubles, 47 RBIs and 10 stolen bases in 51 games (50 starts) in 2018. He finished the year with a slash line of .296/.398/.556.

HOORAY FOR "HOLLYWOOD"

► **Marquise Brown**, who hails from Hollywood, Fla., was one of the country's most explosive receivers last year, and 2018 is no different. Brown ranks eighth nationally in receiving yards per game (108.8) this season, and among players averaging at least four receptions per game he ranks second in the nation with his 22.7 yards per catch.

► Brown ranks first nationally this season with his six catches of at least 40 yards (next highest total is four), his four receptions of at least 50 yards and his two grabs of at least 60 yards. His long receiving plays this season have gone for 75 yards (TD), 65 yards (TD), 58 yards (TD), 50 yards (TD), 48 yards and 40 yards (TD).

Communication

► Since the start of the 2017 season, Brown leads the nation with his 11 catches of at least 50 yards. The next highest total among active players is seven (four players). The 11 grabs for Brown have gone for 87, 84, 77, 75, 66, 65, 58, 56, 52, 50 and 50 yards. Eight of those 11 receptions have resulted in a touchdown.

► Brown has started his OU career with 81 catches for 1,639 yards (20.2 average) and 12 TDs. His 1,639 receiving yards are 305 more than the Sooners with the second most yards in the first 18 games of a career (**Jalen Saunders** tallied 1,334 in 2012 and '13 as a junior and senior). Brown's 12 receiving TDs are the second most in school history through 18 games (**Ryan Broyles** had 14).

OU's 1-2 LINEBACKING PUNCH

► No duo in the country averages more tackles per game than Oklahoma sophomore **Kenneth Murray** and redshirt senior **Curtis Bolton**. Both linebackers, Murray ranks sixth nationally (first in the Big 12) with his 12.8 tackles per outing, while Bolton is tied for eighth nationally (third in Big 12) with 12.4.

► Over the last two games, Murray has an astounding 45 tackles while Bolton has 40. The 85 combined stops are the most over back-to-back games by an FBS duo since at least 2012 (next most is 72 by Kent State's Nick Cuthbert [37] and Kevin Bourne [35] in 2016). It's also the most by a Big 12 duo since at least 2003. The next highest back-to-back total this year is 64 by New Mexico State's Javahn Ferguson (39) and Leon McQuaker (25).

► Murray has 64 tackles on the year, which is just 14 shy of his total last season when he started all 14 games, earned freshman All-America honors from the Football Writers Association of America and *USA Today*, and was co-Big 12 Defensive Freshman of the Year. What makes Murray's 2018 tackle total even more astounding is the fact that he registered zero stops in the season opener against Florida Atlantic. Over the last four games, he is averaging 16.0 tackles. Included was a 28-tackle effort against Army which, according to available stats, is an OU record and the most by an FBS player since at least 2000 (when the NCAA began tracking the record).

► Amazingly, Bolton's 62 tackles are 46 more than he had in his career (16) entering the year. Playing primarily on special teams and battling injuries prior to this season, his five career starts have all come in 2018.

HERE'S THE KICKER

► Senior kicker/punter **Austin Seibert** ranks second in OU career scoring with 405 points and needs 45 points to tie kicker **Michael Hunnicutt** (2011-14) for the school record of 450. He ranks sixth in all-time Big 12 scoring and needs nine points to tie Texas Tech running back Taurean Henderson (2002-05) for fifth place. Seibert needs 46 points to tie the Big 12 career scoring record of 406, held by Baylor's Aaron Jones (2010-13) and TCU's Jaden Oberkrom (2012-15).

► With his 405 points, Seibert is tied for 22nd place in FBS history among kickers. He needs two points to move into the top 20. The record is 494 points by Arizona State's Zane Gonzalez (2013-16).

► Seibert ranks first at OU and second in the Big 12 in career extra points made (255), and needs 19 to tie the conference record of 274 held by Baylor's Jones.

► For the third straight season, Seibert is handling OU's placekicking, punting and kickoff duties. He is one of just three players nationally this season to lead his team in each (San Jose State's Bryce Crawford and Rice's Jack Fox).

► Seibert also ranks second at OU in career field goals made (50) and PAT percentage (.985; 255-259), fourth in career field goal percentage (.758; 50-66) and fifth in career punting average (41.9).

ISN'T THAT SPECIAL

► Special teams have been a major positive for the Sooners through five games. Among teams with at least 10 kickoff returns this season, OU ranks sixth nationally with its 28.6 average. That's thanks largely to sophomore cornerback **Tre Brown**, who ranks fifth in the country with his 32.8-yard average. He has compiled 197 yards on six returns, including an 86-yarder in the first quarter vs. UCLA that set up the tying touchdown after OU fell behind 7-0.

► Among teams with at least eight punt returns, OU ranks 19th nationally with its 14.5 average. Sophomore receiver **CeeDee Lamb** is averaging 12.6 yards on his seven returns, thanks largely to a 66-yard runback vs. UCLA. Redshirt junior receiver **Lee Morris** has one return for 28 yards.

► Last year, OU ranked 98th nationally in kick return average (19.3 yards) and 97th in punt return average (5.6).

► Opponents have only returned three punts this season and they have gone for a combined -1 yard (third fewest in nation). OU also registered its first blocked punt since 2013 in the opener against Florida Atlantic, and it resulted in its first blocked punt TD since 2002. Morris registered the block and **Curtis Bolton** fell on the ball in the end zone.

► Senior kicker/punter **Austin Seibert** is 32 for 32 on PATs this season after going 81 for 81 last year. His streak of 125 makes going back to 2016 is the third longest in the nation. Thirty-five of his 37 kickoffs this season have resulted in touchbacks (his 94.6 percent rate is second best in the nation), and he has a current streak of 23 touchbacks.

RILEY'S FAST START

► The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, **Lincoln Riley** became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. The previous record for wins by a first-year OU head coach was 10 by **Chuck Fairbanks** in 1967 and **Barry Switzer** in 1973. Switzer holds the Sooners' record for most wins in his first two seasons as head coach (21 in 1973-74). Riley, who turned 35 on Sept. 5, needs four more wins in 2018 to tie the mark. He was the second-youngest FBS head coach entering this season.

MURRAY: BY AIR AND BY LAND

Junior **Kyler Murray** is one of only five quarterbacks nationally who average at least 200 passing yards and 50 rushing yards per game this season (and is the only one to average at least 250 and 50). He leads the group in passing yards per game (292.0), passings TDs (17) and total TDs (21).

OFFENSE HAS ROLLED UNDER RILEY

► Oklahoma has a legitimate claim as the nation's most productive offense since the start of the 2015 season, which was **Lincoln Riley's** first year as OU's offensive coordinator. Riley called plays as the program's offensive coordinator and continues to as head coach.

► Since the start of the 2015 season, OU ranks first nationally in passing efficiency rating (190.7; next closest is 161.2), completion percentage (69.4), points per game (44.7), total offense (551.9), touchdowns from scrimmage (255) and yards per pass attempt (10.7), and is fifth in passing offense (328.7) and 17th in rushing offense (223.2).

► In 45 games since the start of the 2015 season, OU has registered at least 500 yards of total offense 32 times, including in 22 of the last 29 outings, topped the 600-yard mark on 16 occasions and gone over 700 yards four times. Similarly, OU has scored at least 30 points in 39 of 45 games during the Riley regime, at least 40 points 29 times, at least 50 points 17 times and at least 60 points seven times.

► Four of OU's top five single-game total offense figures since 2000, and six of the top nine have come since the start of the 2015 season (1. 854 at Texas Tech in 2016; 2. 785 at Oklahoma State in 2017; 3. 773 vs. Tulsa in 2015; 5. 710 at Kansas in 2015; 7. 684 vs. Iowa State in 2015; 9. 676 vs. UTEP in 2017).

► The Sooners have posted a 39-6 (.867) record since Riley's OU debut (27-2 in Big 12 play). That record is fourth best in the country since the start of 2015. Only Alabama (46-3), Clemson (45-4) and Ohio State (40-5) have better records during that span.

GOING FOR BIG 12 FOUR-PEAT

► If Oklahoma wins the 2018 Big 12 title, it will mark the program's fourth straight league crown. The last time the Sooners won four consecutive conference championships was 1984-87 under head coach **Barry Switzer**.

► Oklahoma is the only program to win three straight Big 12 titles, and it has done so twice (also from 2006-08). Baylor (2013-14) is the only other program to win two Big 12 championships in a row.

► The last Power Five program to win four straight outright league titles was Florida from 1993 through 1996.

SOONERS HAVE DOMINATED BIG 12 ERA

► OU's performance in the Big 12 Conference this millennium has been nothing short of dominant. The Sooners have won 11 Big 12 titles in the last 17 seasons, with no other program during that span winning more than two.

► Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed 11 league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each).

► OU is 126-27 (.824) in regular season Big 12 play since the start of the 2000 season. That's 21 more wins than the program with the next most victories during that period (Texas; 105-48) and 38 more than the program with the third most (Oklahoma State; 87-66).

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (645) than any other program. Only Boise State owns a better winning percentage (.771; played 450 fewer games) during that span than OU (.767).

► OU is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 35,359 points (in 1,265 games).

► No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 38. In addition, OU's 24 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.

► Since former head coach Bob Stoops arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads all Power Five conference programs in wins (207) and points scored (9,780).

► Only Ohio State (106) has been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll more weeks than Oklahoma (102). OU's 408 weeks in the AP's top five are most of any school (Alabama next with 387 and Ohio State third with 368). The AP Poll was introduced in 1936.

► Only Ohio State (613) has more all-time top-10 AP poll appearances than OU (578).

► Only Alabama (10) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

EXTRA POINTS

► ESPN College GameDay will air from Dallas on Saturday, marking the 34th time the show will have been on hand for a game involving Oklahoma. Only Ohio State (43 times), Alabama (41) and Florida (37) have been featured more often than OU. The Sooners are 23-10 in such games, including 3-2 in Red River Shootouts. This marks College GameDay's first appearance at the OU-Texas game since 2011, a 55-17 Sooners win.

► In 300 minutes of play this season (plus an overtime period), OU has trailed for 1 minute, 39 seconds (UCLA led 7-0).

► OU ranks second nationally (first among Power Five teams) in plays of at least 40 yards (14), 50 yards (eight) and 60 yards (five) this season.

► The Sooners have been disruptive behind the line of scrimmage, recording 39 tackles for loss (7.8 average) to rank 20th nationally. Last year, OU averaged 5.4 TFLs per game. OU's 15 sacks this season have come from eight players.

► Since the start of the 2017 season, Oklahoma is averaging 26.9 points in the first half. It has scored at least 20 first-half points in 17 of 19 games, and at least 28 points in 10 of those contests.

► OU committed just 13 turnovers last year (six interceptions and seven fumbles lost), or less than one per game. That marked the second-lowest total in school history (11 in 2008). It has three total turnovers in five games this season. OU's 16 turnovers since the start of the 2017 campaign are tied for fifth fewest nationally.

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and the second-largest collegiate video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

► Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.

► In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.

► The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).

► In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.

► Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and its existing figure of 83,489 (2016).

► In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

► The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.

► The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that has initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.

► The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons will benefit from two new clubs.

► Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.

► All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.

► The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.

► A significantly larger and more more detailed video board has replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The new board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

**SECOND SEASON AS HEAD COACH • SET OU RECORD FOR WINS IN A DEBUT SEASON (12) IN 2017
DIRECTED SOONERS TO 2017 BIG 12 TITLE AND COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF NO. 2 SEED
WINNER OF 2015 BROYLES AWARD AS NATION'S TOP ASSISTANT COACH**

After presiding over two of the most prolific offenses in OU history as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2015 and 2016, Lincoln Riley took over the program's head coaching reins on June 7, 2017, following the retirement of one of the most accomplished coaches of the last quarter century in Bob Stoops. OU's 22nd head coach, all Riley did in his first year at the helm was lead the Sooners to their 11th Big 12 title, a No. 2 seed in the College Football Playoff and a No. 3 final ranking in the AP and coaches polls.

The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, Riley became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. The previous record for wins by a first-year OU head coach was 10 by Chuck Fairbanks in 1967 and Barry Switzer in 1973. The next highest figure is eight.

Originally from the 5,000-person West Texas town of Muleshoe, Riley, who continues to call Oklahoma's offensive plays as head coach, has made his name as perhaps the best up-and-coming star in college football by overseeing a balanced — and explosive — OU offense the last three seasons.

Since the start of the 2015 campaign, OU ranks first nationally in passing efficiency rating (190.7; next closest is 161.2), completion percentage (69.4), points per game (44.7), total offense (551.9), touchdowns from scrimmage (255) and yards per pass attempt (10.7), and is fifth in passing offense (328.7) and 17th in rushing offense (223.2). With that kind of offensive production, it's no surprise the Sooners have posted a 39-6 (.867) record since Riley's arrival (27-2 in Big 12 play). OU's overall mark since 2015 is fourth best nationally, with only Alabama (46-3), Clemson (45-4) and Ohio State (40-5) having better records during that span.

Individual player honors and accomplishments have been abundant under Riley's tutelage. Quarterback Baker Mayfield became OU's sixth Heisman Trophy winner in 2017 after finishing third in 2016 voting and fourth in 2015. Mayfield also won the Maxwell Award, Davey O'Brien Award, Manning Award and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award, and was named AP Player of the Year. All-America wide receiver Dede Westbrook finished fourth in Heisman voting in 2016 and became OU's first winner of the Biletnikoff Award, while tight end Mark Andrews claimed the school's first Mackey Award in 2017. Four Sooners earned first-team All-America honors in 2017: Mayfield, Andrews, left tackle Orlando Brown and defensive end/linebacker Ogbornia Okoronkwo. Running back Joe Mixon finished second nationally and set the OU single-season record with 2,331 all-purpose yards in 2016, while backfield mate Samaje Perine set the school career rushing record with 4,122 yards in only three seasons.

Oklahoma's newest head man joined the Sooners in January 2015 after he caught the eye of Stoops during a highly successful five-year stint as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Ruffin McNeill at East Carolina from 2010-14. With OU looking for a new play caller and wanting to get back to the up-tempo attack it helped make mainstream, Riley's numbers at ECU made him the perfect hire.

At East Carolina, Riley installed and directed a spread offensive scheme that made an immediate impact as the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual school offensive records in his five seasons with the program. His squads recorded the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four marks for total offense in a season.

He spent his final season with the Pirates serving in the role of assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach in 2014 as the team ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 ypg) and was fifth in total offense (533.0 ypg). With Riley calling the shots, the Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense.

Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down conversion percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone scoring efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

Among his notable pupils, Riley helped transform a pair of East Carolina wide receivers into the most productive pass catchers in FBS history. He guided walk-on Justin Hardy to 387 career catches, breaking the NCAA record previously held by OU's Ryan Broyles (349). Hardy's 4,541 career receiving yards rank third all-time in FBS annals as he flourished in Riley's offense, registering three 1,000-yard seasons at ECU that culminated with a 121-catch, 1,494-yard year as a senior in 2014. Riley also coached recent second-round NFL draft selection Zay Jones for the first two years of his career. Jones went on to break Hardy's record and is the NCAA's leader in career receptions (399) and receptions in a season (158 in 2016).

Already overseeing Mayfield's record-setting career, Riley also developed dynamic quarterbacks Dominique Davis and Shane Carden at ECU. Conference USA's 2010 Newcomer of the Year, Davis set ECU career marks for completions and TD passes despite playing just two seasons. Davis ranked second among FBS signal callers with 393 completions and 46 total touchdowns in 2010. He set an NCAA record with 36 straight completions in 2011.

Carden took over the job in 2012 and went on to break the majority of Davis' records, becoming the first 4,000-yard passer in program history and setting single-season standards for completion percentage (70.5 in 2013) and passing yards (4,736 in 2014). Carden earned Conference USA MVP honors in 2013 and was the American Conference's Offensive Player of the Year in 2014. He led all FBS passers with 392 completions in 2014.

Prior to East Carolina, Riley spent seven seasons on the staff at Texas Tech, where he was part of seven bowl teams and five bowl wins. During that span, Red Raiders quarterbacks won NCAA passing titles in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007. A walk-on quarterback at Tech during the spring and summer of 2003 who then became a student coach, Riley immersed himself in head coach Mike Leach's offense and worked his way into a full-time position as wide receivers coach in 2007. He served as inside receivers coach in 2008 and '09, and eventually called plays as interim offensive coordinator in the 2010 Alamo Bowl, where the Red Raiders racked up 579 yards in a 41-31 victory over Michigan State to cap the 2009 season.

Under Riley's guidance in 2007, wide receiver Michael Crabtree won the Biletnikoff Award after smashing Big 12 records and NCAA freshman standards with 134 receptions for 1,962 yards. Crabtree also accumulated 22 touchdown catches his first season. In fact, wide receiver Danny Amendola joined Crabtree that year as Texas Tech receivers who each amassed 100-catch, 1,000-yard efforts.

A 2006 Texas Tech graduate who earned a Bachelor of Science degree in exercise and sport sciences, Riley and his wife, Caitlin, have two daughters, Sloan and Stella.

NORMAN — Oklahoma registered its largest margin of victory in a season opener since 2008 by beating Florida Atlantic by 49 points. The Sooners, who led 42-0 at halftime, and 56-0, outgained the AP's 30th-ranked team 650 yards to 324 (10.5 yards per play to 4.4).

Kyler Murray was 9-for-11 through the air for 209 yards and two touchdowns for a gaudy 301.4 passing efficiency rating. He also ran for 23 yards on four carries before exiting the game for good late in the second quarter. Murray's TD throws both went for 65 yards, the first to then-walk-on receiver Lee Morris and the second to Marquise Brown.

Running back Rodney Anderson led a potent ground charge that finished with 316 yards on 39 carries (8.1 average). Anderson carried just five times but amassed 100 yards and scored on jaunts of 30 and 65 yards.

OU's defense didn't allow a point until 55 seconds were left in the third quarter. The first-half shutout was the Sooners' first since 2015. On special teams, Morris registered OU's first blocked punt since 2013 in the first quarter. Curtis Bolton fell on the ball in the end zone for the program's first TD on a blocked punt since 2002.

NORMAN — The Sooners registered their 31st consecutive victory over an unranked non-conference opponent by easily handling UCLA. OU, which led 21-7 at halftime and 42-7 in the fourth quarter, outgained the Bruins 485 yards to 383.

Quarterback Kyler Murray was 19-for-33 passing for 306 yards and three TDs, and rushed 10 times for 69 yards and a pair of scores. It marked the first time since OU's 2014 game at Iowa State (Trevor Knight, 146) that a quarterback led the team in rushing yards.

Receiver CeeDee Lamb finished with seven catches for 146 yards (one shy of his career high) and a 35-yard score. He also returned two punts for 63 yards, including a career-long 66 yarder. Marquise Brown hauled in four passes for 88 yards, one of them a 58-yard catch-and-run for a TD.

Oklahoma's defense registered six sacks and 12 tackles for loss. Defensive end/linebacker Mark Jackson Jr. recorded a career-high 10 tackles and a TFL, and linebacker Kenneth Murray finished with nine tackles and 2.5 TFLs.

The Sooners also got an 85-yard kickoff return from Tre Brown, the longest non-scoring play/return by OU in the 95-year history of Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium.

AMES, Iowa — Kyler Murray threw for a career-high 348 yards and three touchdowns in his first career road start, and Marquise Brown caught nine passes for 191 yards and a score as Oklahoma registered a 37-27 win at Iowa State. It was the Sooners' nation-leading 17th consecutive true road win and their Big 12-record 15th straight league road victory. The Sooners, who never trailed, won for the 24th straight time in Ames. Murray completed 21 of his 29 pass attempts and averaged 12.0 yards per pass attempt and 16.6 yards per completion. His 77 rushing yards came on 15 carries (5.1 average).

Brown registered 189 of his 191 receiving yards before halftime, setting the school record for receiving yards in a half. Included in his total was a 75-yard first-quarter bomb from Murray that resulted in OU's first touchdown of the day and a 10-0 lead. Running back Trey Sermon, who got the start in place of injured Rodney Anderson, carried 13 times for 74 yards (5.7 average) and notched a 22-yard TD run.

Austin Seibert was exceptional on special teams, making all three of his field goal attempts (21, 31 and 42 yards), averaging 48.5 yards on his two punts (long of 53) and registering touchbacks on all eight of his kickoffs.

NORMAN — Sophomore linebacker Kenneth Murray made a school-record 28 tackles (previous record was 24), the most in the FBS since at least 2000, and Kyler Murray threw for three touchdowns and ran for another as No. 5/5 Oklahoma downed Army West Point 28-21 in overtime.

The Black Knights ran 87 plays to Oklahoma's 40, and held a 44:41 to 15:19 advantage in time of possession. OU's possession time total was the lowest by a Big 12 team in the 23-year history of the league, and was the lowest by an FBS team in victory since at least 1996.

Trey Sermon paced the Sooners with 119 yards on 18 carries (6.6 average) while Kyler Murray added 71 yards on seven rushes (10.1 average). CeeDee Lamb caught two touchdown passes, including a 10-yarder that represented the game's only overtime score. OU averaged 8.9 yards per play on the evening while Army averaged 4.4.

With the game tied at 21 and with Army driving late in the fourth quarter, OU's Kenneth Mann registered his first career interception. Austin Seibert missed a 33-yard field goal attempt as time expired before the Sooners prevailed in the extra session.

Linebacker Curtis Bolton finished with 23 tackles, third most in OU history.

NORMAN — Quarterback Kyler Murray tied the school record for touchdowns accounted for in a game with seven as No. 6/5 Oklahoma (5-0, 2-0) downed Baylor (3-2, 1-1) by a 66-33 count in Norman. Murray, who also set the school and Big 12 single-game record for passing efficiency rating (348.0; the previous OU record was 303.3) was 17 for 21 for 432 yards and six touchdowns, while rushing 10 times for 45 yards and a score.

OU's 66 points were tied for its second most against a Big 12 team. The Sooners racked up 607 yards and averaged 11.24 yards per play (tied for third highest in school history).

Marquise Brown (132 yards, 2 TDs), CeeDee Lamb (101 yards, 1 TD) and Lee Morris (61 yards, 2 TDs) led OU's receivers, while Kennedy Brooks ran for team and career highs of 107 yards on eight carries (13.4 average) and two scores.

One week after registering 28 tackles against Army, Kenneth Murray posted a team-high 17 against the Bears, and was followed by Curtis Bolton (16) and Kahlil Haughton (11). Freshman defensive end Ronnie Perkins had 2.0 sacks and three quarterback hurries.
