OPENING KICK

► No. 7 in this year's initial College Football Playoff rankings, Oklahoma (7-1, 4-1 Big 12) goes for its 19th consecutive true road win when it plays at Texas Tech (5-3, 3-2) on Saturday at 7 p.m. CT. The game will be televised nationally by ABC with **Steve Levy**, **Brian Griese** and **Todd McShay** announcing.

► OU has won each of its last six games against Texas Tech, averaging 49.8 points, 585.2 yards and 305.2 rushing yards per contest during the stretch.

► The Sooners have scored at least 38 points in each of their last eight games against the Red Raiders. It is the second-longest streak against an opponent in school history (OU scored at least 38 points in 11 straight games against Kingfisher College from 1908 through 1919).

► Oklahoma has won 29 of its last 31 games (.935) against Big 12 opponents dating back to the 2015 season. Its only two losses during that span came at the hands of Iowa State on Oct. 7 last year (38-31 in Norman) and Texas four Saturdays ago (48-45 in Dallas). Eighteen of those 29 victories have been by at least 15 points, and nine by at least 30 points.

► OU has won 13 straight November games (last loss on Nov. 8, 2014).

► Oklahoma and Texas Tech feature the top two offenses in the Big 12. The Sooners lead the league by averaging 48.9 points and 548.3 yards per game (rank fourth and fourth nationally), while Texas Tech ranks second at 42.2 points and 528.2 yards per contest (10th and seventh nationally).

► Oklahoma is coming off a 51-14 home win over Kansas State in which it gained a season-high 702 yards and scored on each of its first nine possessions. **Kyler Murray**, who exited the game for good with 8:20 left in the third quarter and OU ahead 48-7, was 19 for 24 for 352 yards and three touchdowns while running for 46 yards and a score. The Sooners held K-State to 245 yards and to 13 first downs.

► Texas Tech went toe-to-toe with Iowa State in Ames on Saturday before falling 40-31. The score was tied at 31 until the Cyclones registered a safety with 4:39 remaining and then scored on a 48-yard pass play on the ensuing possession. Freshman quarterback **Alan Bowman** was 32 for 56 passing for 323 yards and a touchdown, and had three interceptions. Tech threw for 323 yards, but managed just 30 rushing yards on 24 carries (1.2 average).

FIVE KEY STORYLINES

► Oklahoma owns a 19-6 (.760) all-time record against Texas Tech but has had more modest success against the Red Raiders in Lubbock, where it is 7-4. In the Big 12 era, the Sooners hold a 16-6 advantage (6-4 in Lubbock). OU has won its last three games at Jones AT&T Stadium (41-20 in 2012, 42-30 in 2014



Redshirt freshman **Kennedy Brooks** has rushed for 262 yards over the last two games on 23 carries (11.4 average). He is averaging 11.9 yards per rush on the season and is tied for the team lead with six rushing TDs despite registering just 38 carries.

DEFENSIVE TURNAROUND

Oklahoma's defense has been much more effective the last two games than the first six this season. OU has allowed scores on just two of its opponents' last 16 possessions.

and 66-59 in 2016). The Sooners are 7-0 in Lubbock when scoring at least 30 points and are 0-4 there when scoring less than 30 points.

► Oklahoma's 18-game true road winning streak is the longest active streak in the country and second longest in school history (OU won 24 in a row from 1953 to 1958). UCF (eight) holds the second-longest current streak, while no other Power Five program has a current streak longer than six games. The Sooners' last true road loss came more than four full years ago and occurred at TCU (37-33 on Oct. 4, 2014). OU has also won a record 16 straight Big 12 road games, breaking the previous league mark of 13 consecutive league road wins by Texas from 2003 to 2006. Since head coach **Lincoln Riley** joined the staff as offensive coordinator prior to the 2015 season, the Sooners are 16-0 in true road games (14-0 in true Big 12 road contests).

► In Big 12 play, Oklahoma leads the conference with its 579.2 yards of offense per game, which is 108.6 more yards per outing than the team with the second-best average (Texas Tech; 470.6). Making OU's offensive performance more impressive is the fact the Sooners have already faced three of the league's top four teams in total defense (1. Iowa State 349.6; 2. TCU 352.2; 4. Texas 390.2). OU ranks first in conference play with 338.4 passing yards per game while Texas Tech ranks second at 333.6. However, the Sooners own a passing efficiency rating of 229.4 to Tech's 131.3 (the Red Raiders have thrown 10 interceptions to OU's one).

► Oklahoma ranks 127th out of 130 FBS teams with just 61.5 offensive plays per game, but it ranks fourth nationally with its 548.3 yards per contest. That's because the Sooners lead the nation with a staggering 8.9 yards per play, a figure that would shatter the FBS single-season record of 8.6 by Hawaii in 2006. The OU single-season record of 8.3 yards per play was set last year, and the program's second-best figure is 7.6 in 1971. Alabama ranks second this year with its 8.3 yards per play, while Memphis and Mississippi are tied for third at 7.7. OU also leads the nation by gaining at least 10 yards on 31.9 percent of its plays (157 of 492). Alabama ranks second at 29.6 percent.

► Through eight games this season, quarterback **Kyler Murray** has a better passing efficiency rating (227.3), more total touchdowns (34), more yards per pass attempt (12.7), more yards per completion (17.4) and a higher pass TD-to-INT ratio (9.3) than **Baker Mayfield**, **Sam Bradford** and **Jason White** did through eight games the years they won their Heisman Trophies while at OU (see chart on the bottom of page 4 of these notes).

RECAPPING THE WIN AGAINST KANSAS STATE

► No. 8/8 Oklahoma recorded a season-high 702 yards of offense and scored on its first nine possessions in a 51-14 home win over Kansas State on Saturday. OU outgained the Wildcats by 457 yards (10.3 yards per play to 4.6) and registered 22 plays of at least 10 yards. It threw for 380 yards and ran for 322.

► **Kyler Murray** was 19 for 24 through the air for 352 yards and three TDs without an interception (243.6 rating), marking the seventh straight game he has thrown for at least three scores. He averaged 14.7 yards per pass attempt and 18.5 yards per completion. Murray, who also ran for 46 yards and a score, did not play the final 23:20 of the contest.

► **CeeDee Lamb** caught four passes for a career-high 160 yards (40.0 average) and touchdowns of 82 and 57 yards. It marked his seventh straight game with at least one TD catch (has nine during the stretch). **Grant Calcaterra** registered OU's other receiving score, a 35-yarder on the game's opening possession. It was his second TD grab of the year.

► **Kennedy Brooks** only had five carries but the redshirt freshman gained 94 yards (18.8 average) and scored on runs of 3 and 86 yards. The 86-yarder on OU's second play of the third quarter was the team's longest rush of the season and tied for its longest play. Brooks is averaging 11.9 yards per carry on the season.

► **Curtis Bolton** and **Kenneth Murray** led the Sooners with seven tackles each. Bolton and freshman **Jalen Redmond**, playing in his second-career game, each registered 2.5 tackles for loss.

► **Austin Seibert** was 3 for 3 on field goals and tallied 15 points. He moved into a tie for the NCAA career lead in both extra-point makes (274) and attempts (278). He also moved into fourth place on the Big 12 all-time scoring list (439 points) and into a tie for ninth on the NCAA's all-time kick scoring chart.

LAST YEAR VS. THE RED RAIDERS

► **Baker Mayfield** threw for four touchdowns and ran for another as the 10th-ranked Sooners surpassed the 600-yard mark of total offense (617) for the fifth time of the season in a 49-27 home win over Texas Tech on Oct. 28, 2017. The senior was 22 for 34 passing for 281 yards while also rushing for 20 yards.

► The Red Raiders entered the game allowing just 135 rushing yards per contest, but OU racked up 336 on the ground. In his first career start, sophomore running back **Rodney Anderson** ran for a then-career-high 181 yards and a touchdown on 24 carries (7.5 average).

YARDS-PER-PLAY LEADERS

Oklahoma led the nation with its 8.3 yards per play last year (the previous single-season school record was 7.6 in 1971). That was the second-highest figure in FBS history. ► Freshman **CeeDee Lamb** set school single-game freshman records with nine receptions and 147 receiving yards. He also tied the OU single-game freshman mark with two touchdown catches.

► After giving up 20 points and 211 yards in the first quarter (10.0 per play), OU gave up seven points and 226 yards the rest of the game (4.6 per play). Texas Tech managed just one score on its final nine possessions (six punts, one interception, one turnover on downs). **Caleb Kelly** recorded his first-career interception.

LAST TIME IN LUBBOCK

► In one of the wildest games in Oklahoma history, the Sooners and Texas Tech combined for an NCAA-record 1,708 yards (854 each), but it was OU that emerged with a 66-59 road win on Oct. 22, 2016.

► Playing for the first time at his former school, **Baker Mayfield** turned in his best career game, finishing with a career-high 545 passing yards (nine shy of the school record) and an OU-record seven passing TDs (without an interception). He completed 75 percent of his throws for an average of 15.1 yards per attempt and 20.2 yards per completion. His 564 yards of total offense were eight shy of his own program record.

► Running back **Joe Mixon** finished with 377 all-purpose yards, the most by an FBS player on the year, the second most in OU history and the fourth most in Big 12 annals. Mixon, who scored five TDs, registered a career-high 263 rushing yards and 114 receiving yards. He became just the second FBS player since 1996 to record at least three receiving TDs and two rushing TDs. His three receiving scores set an OU record for a running back, and he became the first player in OU history to log 200 yards rushing and 100 yards receiving in a game.

► Eventual Biletnikoff Award winner **Dede Westbrook** logged his fourth straight receiving game of at least 150 yards with a nine-catch, 202-yard, two-TD performance. The 202 yards were the sixth-most in school history at the time.

► OU became the first team in FBS history to feature a 500-yard passer (Mayfield, 545), a 200-yard rusher (Mixon, 263) and a 200-yard receiver (Westbrook, 202) in one game.

► The Sooners' 854 yards of total offense were the second most in school history and just 21 shy of the program record of 875 (1980 vs. Colorado).

► Oklahoma, which trailed for only 20 seconds on the night, outgained Tech 11.2 yards per play to 7.8 despite the fact both teams finished with 854 yards. The Red Raiders ran an OU-opponent-record 109 plays to the Sooners' 76. OU's nine TD drives averaged 69 yards, just 5.3 plays and only 1:49 of clock.

► Texas Tech quarterback Patrick Mahomes set the FBS record for total offense (819 yards) and tied the mark for passing yards (734). The teams' 1,279 combined passing yards also established an FBS record.

TRUE ROAD WARRIORS

► By the time Saturday arrives, the Sooners' last true road loss will have occurred 1,491 days ago. The last time OU lost a true road game was Oct. 4, 2014, when No. 4 OU dropped a 37-33 decision at No. 25 TCU. Eleven AP Top 25 teams lost that week, including four of the top six.

► Since 1980, OU's 18-game true road winning streak is tied for the third longest nationally, with only Miami (Fla.) (1984-88) and Ohio State (2012-16) holding longer streaks at 20 wins.

► During the 18-game streak, the Sooners have outscored opponents 873-490 (49-27 average) and have outgained them 10,322 yards to 7,360 (573-409 average). OU has scored at least 31 points in all 18 games and at least 41 points in 14 of them. Seven of the wins have come against top-25 teams.

► The Sooners have outgained their opponent in 17 of the 18 road wins. West Virginia in 2016 is the only home team to outgain OU during the stretch (579-485), but was still doubled up on the scoreboard (56-28).

► Thirteen of the 18 victories have been by double digits, seven by at least 25 points and five by at least 35 points.

BACK TO THE OLD STOMPING GROUND

► Texas Tech is the alma mater of OU head coach **Lincoln Riley**. A walk-on quarterback for the Red Raiders during the spring and summer of 2003, Riley spent seven years (2003-09) on former head coach Mike Leach's TTU staff in the roles of student assistant/offense (2003-05), offensive assistant (2006), wide receivers coach (2007) and inside receivers coach (2008-09). He also served as Tech's interim offensive coordinator and play-caller for the 2010 Alamo Bowl, a 41-31 victory over Michigan State.

► OU assistant head coach and defensive coordinator **Ruffin McNeill** (2000-09), co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach **Bill Bedenbaugh** (2000-06), outside receivers coach **Dennis Simmons** (2000-09) and director of sports performance for football **Bennie Wylie** (2003-09) also worked at Texas Tech while Riley was on staff. McNeill served as interim head coach for the 2010 Alamo Bowl win.

ANOTHER OU HEISMAN HOPEFUL

► After a competitive quarterback battle during preseason camp between redshirt junior **Kyler Murray** and redshirt sophomore **Austin Kendall**, head coach **Lincoln Riley** announced Aug. 22 that Murray had won the job. Through eight games, the decision has proved fruitful, with Murray ranking second nationally in completion percentage (.732), passing efficiency rating (227.3), yards per pass attempt (12.7), yards per completion (17.4), and points responsible for per game (25.5), third in passing touchdowns per game (3.5) and sixth in total offense per game (350.4 yards; didn't play

OU'S 18-GAME ROAD WINNING STREAK

in second half vs. Florida Atlantic or final 23:20 vs. Kansas State; OU only ran 40 plays vs. Army). He is the only player in the country averaging at least 250.0 passing yards (291.1) and at least 50.0 rushing yards (59.2) per game.

► Murray has thrown at least two touchdown passes in every game this year, and at least three in each of the last seven outings. He has 17 TD passes over the last four games.

► In Big 12 play, Murray owns healthy statistical leads in total offense at 392.0 yards per game (next most is 301.2 by Oklahoma State's Taylor Cornelius), passing yards at 331.6 per contest (next most is 312.8 by Texas Tech's Alan Bowman) and passing efficiency rating with his 240.5 mark (next best is 173.4 by West Virginia's Will Grier).

► A 5-10, 195-pounder from Allen, Texas, Murray is looking to become OU's fourth Heisman Trophy finalist in the last three years (**Baker Mayfield** in 2016 and '17 and **Dede Westbrook** in 2016), and its second straight winner (Mayfield). He has accounted for 34 touchdowns (28 passing, six rushing) and just four turnovers. He ranks second the team with 474 rushing yards (6.7 per carry) and is tied for the lead with six rushing TDs.

► Murray was the backup last season to Mayfield, who won OU's sixth Heisman Trophy as the Sooners claimed their third straight Big 12 title and made the College Football Playoff for the second time in three years.

► No school has ever produced back-to-back Heisman Trophy winners who were quarterbacks.

► Only seven times since the start of the Big 12 Conference in 1996 has a Sooner thrown for at least 300 yards and rushed for at least 65 in a game, and Murray has done it on three occasions this year. He passed for 306 yards and ran for 69 against UCLA, threw for a then-career-high 348 and rushed for 77 at Iowa State, and went for 304 and 92 against Texas. For his effort against UCLA, Murray was named Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week, Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week and the Davey O'Brien National Quarterback of the Week.

► In OU's 66-33 win over Baylor, Murray finished 17 for 21 for 432 yards, six touchdowns and no interceptions while adding 45 rushing yards and a score. His 348.0 passing efficiency rating set school and Big 12 records (as did his 20.6 yards per pass attempt and 25.4 yards per completion), and was the highest in the FBS since at least 1996.

► Through eight games, Murray has been considerably more efficient as a passer this season than Mayfield was the last two seasons when he twice set the FBS record in the category. Murray's 227.3 rating is 28 points better than Mayfield's existing record of 198.9 set last year, and 31 points better than Mayfield's 2016 mark of 196.4.

► Murray started his collegiate career at Texas A&M, where he played in eight games and made three starts in 2015. He was a consensus five-star recruit out of Allen High School and was named 2014 national high school player of the year by *Parade*, *Gatorade*, *MaxPreps* and *USA Today*. Murray went 43-0 as a high school starter and earned state titles each of his last three years.

► Also a baseball standout, Murray played center field for **Skip Johnson's** OU team and was a first-round pick (No. 9 overall) by the Oakland A's in June's Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. He was the only Big 12 player picked in the first round of the 2018 draft and he signed in mid-June. Murray hit .296 with 10 home runs, 13 doubles, 47 RBIs and 10 stolen bases in 51 games (50 starts) in 2018. He finished the year with a slash line of .296/.398/.556.

HOORAY FOR "HOLLYWOOD"

► **Marquise Brown**, who hails from Hollywood, Fla., was one of the country's most explosive receivers last year, and 2018 is no different. Brown ranks 18th nationally in receiving yards per game (92.3) this season, and among players averaging at least 5.0 receptions per game he ranks second nationally with his 18.5 yards per catch. Hobbled in the first half of the TCU game two weeks ago, he did not start this past Saturday against Kansas State.

► Brown ranks first nationally this season with his seven catches of at least 40 yards, his five receptions of at least 50 yards, his three grabs of at least 60 yards and his two catches of at least 70 yards. His long receiving plays this season have gone for 77 yards (TD), 75 yards (TD), 65 yards (TD), 58 yards (TD), 50 yards (TD), 48 yards and 40 yards (TD).

► Since the start of the 2017 season, Brown leads the nation with his 12 catches of at least 50 yards. The next highest total among active players is eight. The 12 grabs for Brown have gone for 87, 84, 77, 77, 75, 66, 65, 58, 56, 52, 50 and 50 yards. Nine of those 12 receptions have resulted in a TD.

► Brown has started his OU career with 97 catches for 1,833 yards (18.9 average) and 16 TDs. His 1,833 receiving yards are 55 more than the Sooners with the second most yards in the first 21 games of a career (**Dede Westbrook** tallied 1,778 in his first 21 games in 2015 and '16 as a junior and senior). Brown's 14 receiving TDs are tied for third most in school history through 21 games (**Ryan Broyles** had 16 and Westbrook 15).

SILENCE OF THE LAMB

► While **Marquise Brown** has turned heads with his home-run-play ability, sophomore **CeeDee Lamb** has quietly put together one of the best two-year starts to a career by an OU receiver. The 6-2, 189-pounder from Richmond, Texas, has started 20 of his 22 games and has amassed 80 receptions for 1,482 yards (18.5 average) and 16 touchdowns.

► A freshman All-American by ESPN last year when he caught 46 passes for 807 yards and seven touchdowns in 14 contests (13 starts), Lamb is on pace to demolish those numbers this season, or already has. Through eight games, he has 34 catches for 674 yards and a team-high nine TDs. He has five career 100-yard receiving games, including three this year. He has at least one TD catch in each of the last seven games.

► Lamb is tied for second in OU history with his 16 receiving touchdowns in the first 22 games of a career (**Ryan Broyles** had 17).

OU's 1-2 LINEBACKING PUNCH

► No duo in the Big 12 averages more tackles per game than Oklahoma sophomore **Kenneth Murray** and redshirt senior **Curtis Bolton**. Both linebackers, Murray ranks second in the Big 12 (11th nationally) with his 11.5 tackles per outing, while Bolton ranks third (15th nationally) with 11.0.

► Over the last five games, Murray has an astounding 73 tackles (14.6 average) while Bolton has 66 (13.2).

► Murray has 92 tackles on the year, which is 14 more than his total last season (78) when he started all 14 games, earned freshman All-America honors from the Football Writers Association of America and *USA Today*, and was co-Big 12 Defensive Freshman of the Year. What makes Murray's 2018 tackle total even more impressive is the fact that he registered zero stops in the season opener against Florida Atlantic. Over the last seven games, he is averaging 13.1 tackles. Included was a 28-tackle effort against Army which, the most by an FBS player since at least 2000 (when the NCAA began tracking the record).

► Amazingly, Bolton's 88 tackles are 72 more than he had in his career (16) entering the year. Playing primarily on special teams and battling injuries prior to this season, his eight career starts have all come in 2018.

HERE'S THE KICKER

► Senior kicker/punter **Austin Seibert** ranks second in OU career scoring with 439 points and needs 11 points to tie kicker **Michael Hunnicutt** (2011-14) for the school record of 450. He is in fourth place in all-time Big 12 scoring and needs nine points to tie Hunnicutt for third place. Seibert needs 12 points to tie the Big 12 career scoring record of 451, held by Baylor's Aaron Jones (2010-13) and TCU's Jaden Oberkrom (2012-15).

► In Saturday's win vs. Kansas State, Seibert was 6 for 6 on PATs, extending his streak of makes to 144 dating back to 2016. Two games ago he broke the school record of 134 straight conversions held by **Uwe von Schamann** (1976-78).

► With his 439 points, Seibert is tied for ninth in FBS history among kickers. He needs 12 points to move into the top five. The record is 494 points by Arizona State's Zane Gonzalez (2013-16).

► Seibert is tied for the Big 12 and NCAA career lead in extra points made (274) and attempted (278). He shares the records with Baylor's Jones.

► For the third straight season, Seibert is handling OU's placekicking, punting and kickoff duties. He is one of just three players nationally this season to lead his team in each (San Jose State's Bryce Crawford and Rice's Jack Fox).

► Seibert also ranks second at OU in career field goals made (55) and PAT percentage (.986; 274-278), fourth in career field goal percentage (.775; 55-71) and fifth in career punting average (41.9).

ISN'T THAT SPECIAL

► Special teams have been a major positive for the Sooners through eight games. Among teams with at least 2.0 kick-off returns per game this season, OU ranks 10th nationally with its 26.2 average. That's thanks largely to sophomore cornerback **Tre Brown**, who ranks eighth in the country with his 28.7-yard average. He has compiled 316 yards on 11 returns, including an 86-yarder in the first quarter vs. UCLA that set up the tying touchdown after OU fell behind 7-0.

► Among teams that average at least 1.3 punt returns per game, OU ranks 25th nationally with its 12.1 yards per return. Sophomore receiver **CeeDee Lamb** is averaging 10.5 yards on his 10 returns, and had a 66-yard runback vs. UCLA. Junior receiver **Lee Morris** has one return for 28 yards.

► Last year, OU ranked 98th nationally in kick return average (19.3 yards) and 97th in punt return average (5.6).

► Opponents have only returned five punts this season and they have gone for a combined 23 yards (10th fewest in nation). OU also registered its first blocked punt since 2013 in the opener against Florida Atlantic, and it resulted in its first blocked punt TD since 2002. Morris registered the block and **Curtis Bolton** fell on the ball in the end zone.

► Senior kicker/punter **Austin Seibert** is 51 for 51 on PATs this season after going 81 for 81 last year. His streak of 144

makes going back to 2016 is the third longest in the nation and an OU school record. Fifty-four of his 63 kickoffs this season have resulted in touchbacks (his 85.7 percent rate is fifth best in the country). He had a streak of 32 touchbacks snapped at TCU two games ago following a 15-yard post-TD celebration penalty that was enforced on the kickoff (he still kicked the ball to the 1-yard line).

RILEY'S FAST START

► The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, **Lincoln Riley** became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. The previous record for wins by a first-year OU head coach was 10 by **Chuck Fairbanks** in 1967 and **Barry Switzer** in 1973. Switzer holds the Sooners' record for most wins in his first two seasons as head coach (21 in 1973-74). Riley, who turned 35 on Sept. 5, needs two more wins in 2018 to tie the mark. He was the second-youngest FBS head coach entering this season.

OFFENSE HAS ROLLED UNDER RILEY

► Oklahoma owns the nation's most productive offense since the start of the 2015 season, which was **Lincoln Riley's** first year as OU's offensive coordinator. Riley called plays as the program's offensive coordinator and continues to as head coach.

► Since the start of the 2015 season, OU ranks first nationally in points per game (45.0), total offense (554.3), touchdowns from scrimmage (274; next most is 247), passing efficiency rating (191.8; next best is 160.0), completion percentage (69.8), and yards per pass attempt (10.7), and is sixth in passing offense (326.9) and 14th in rushing offense (227.3).

► In 48 games since the start of the 2015 season, OU has registered at least 500 yards of total offense 35 times, including in 25 of the last 32 outings, topped the 600-yard mark on 17 occasions and gone over 700 yards five times. Similarly, OU has scored at least 30 points in 42 of 48 games since Riley's arrival, at least 40 points 32 times, at least 50 points 19 times and at least 60 points seven times.

► The Sooners have registered at least 700 yards of offense 11 times in their history, and five of those occasions have come since the start of the 2015 season: 854 at Texas Tech in 2016; 785 at Oklahoma State in 2017; 773 vs. Tulsa in 2015; 710 at Kansas in 2015; 702 vs. Kansas State in 2018.

► The Sooners have posted a 41-7 (.854) record since Riley's first season at OU (29-3 in Big 12 play). That mark is fourth best in the country since the start of 2015. Only Alabama (48-3), Clemson (47-4) and Ohio State (41-6) have better records.

GOING FOR BIG 12 FOUR-PEAT

► If Oklahoma wins the 2018 Big 12 title, it will mark the program's fourth straight league crown. The last time the Sooners won four consecutive conference championships was 1984-87 under head coach **Barry Switzer**.

► OU is the only program to win three straight Big 12 titles, and it has done so twice (also from 2006-08). Baylor (2013-14) is the only other program to win two Big 12 championships in a row.

► The last Power Five program to win four straight outright league titles was Florida from 1993 through 1996.

SOONERS HAVE DOMINATED BIG 12 ERA

► OU's performance in the Big 12 Conference this millennium has been nothing short of dominant. The Sooners have won 11 Big 12 titles in the last 17 seasons, with no other program during that span winning more than two.

► Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed 11 league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each).

► OU is 128-28 (.821) in regular season Big 12 play since the start of the 2000 season. That's 21 more wins than the program with the next most victories during that period (Texas; 107-49) and 40 more than the program with the third most (Oklahoma State; 88-68).

EXTRA POINTS

► Forty-one of Oklahoma's 50 offensive touchdown drives (82 percent) have taken less than three minutes of game clock. That excludes the overtime TD drive vs. Army that took two plays.

► The Sooners are averaging 0.78 points per offensive play this season. Going back to 1996, the highest end-of-season figure was 0.69 by Florida State in 2013. OU's number in the first half of games this season is 0.82.

► OU opponents have run 586 plays this season to the Sooners' 492. That's an average of 11.8 more per game. Despite that, OU has outgained its foes by 1,339 yards on the year (8.9 yards per play to 5.2).

► Texas Tech has run 205 more plays than OU on the season (697-492), but the Sooners have gained 160 more yards.

► In the last two games, OU held TCU to 275 yards and Kansas State to 245. The last time the Sooners held consecutive conference opponents to 275 yards or less was in 2011 (259 vs. Texas; 252 at Kansas).

► Despite losing preseason All-Big 12 running back **Rodney Anderson** for the season due to an injury against UCLA in the second game of the year, Oklahoma leads the Big 12 and ranks 13th nationally with its 236.1 rushing yards per game (Oklahoma State ranks second in the league at 198.6). More impressively, OU ranks second nationally with its 6.6 yards per rush, which is almost two full yards more than the No. 2 team in the category (OSU averages 4.8).

► In Big 12 play, the Sooners rank second in rushing defense (118.0 yards per game) and second in yards per carry allowed (3.5). On the season, OU is tied for third in the league in yards per play allowed (5.2).

► **Kyler Murray** has won four Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week honors, tying OU's single-season record set by **Baker Mayfield** last year.

► **Kennedy Brooks**, who has 454 yards on 38 rushes this year, is averaging 11.9 yards per carry. The OU single-season yards-per-carry record among players with at least 400 rushing yards is 9.5 by **Leon "Mule Train" Heath** in 1949.

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and the second-largest collegiate video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

► Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.

► In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.

► The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).

► In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.

► Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and its existing figure of 83,489 (2016).

► In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

► The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.

► The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that has initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.

► The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons will benefit from two new clubs.

► Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.

► All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.

► The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.

► A significantly larger and more more detailed video board has replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The new board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

LINCOLN RILEY

**SECOND SEASON AS HEAD COACH • SET OU RECORD FOR WINS IN A DEBUT SEASON (12) IN 2017
DIRECTED SOONERS TO 2017 BIG 12 TITLE AND COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF NO. 2 SEED
WINNER OF 2015 BROYLES AWARD AS NATION'S TOP ASSISTANT COACH**

After presiding over two of the most prolific offenses in OU history as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2015 and 2016, Lincoln Riley took over the program's head coaching reins on June 7, 2017, following the retirement of one of the most accomplished coaches of the last quarter century in Bob Stoops. OU's 22nd head coach, all Riley did in his first year at the helm was lead the Sooners to their 11th Big 12 title, a No. 2 seed in the College Football Playoff and a No. 3 final ranking in the AP and coaches polls.

The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, Riley became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. The previous record for wins by a first-year OU head coach was 10 by Chuck Fairbanks in 1967 and Barry Switzer in 1973. The next highest figure is eight.

Originally from the 5,000-person West Texas town of Muleshoe, Riley, who continues to call Oklahoma's offensive plays as head coach, has made his name as perhaps the best up-and-coming star in college football by overseeing a balanced — and explosive — OU offense the last three seasons.

Since the start of the 2015 campaign, OU ranks first nationally in points per game (45.0), total offense (554.3), touchdowns from scrimmage (274; next most is 247), passing efficiency rating (191.8; next best is 160.0), completion percentage (69.8), and yards per pass attempt (10.7), and is sixth in passing offense (326.9) and 14th in rushing offense (227.3). With that kind of offensive production, it's no surprise the Sooners have posted a 41-7 (.854) record since Riley's arrival (29-3 in Big 12 play). OU's overall mark since 2015 is fourth best nationally, with only Alabama (48-3), Clemson (47-4) and Ohio State (41-6) having better records during that span.

Individual player honors and accomplishments have been abundant under Riley's tutelage. Quarterback Baker Mayfield became OU's sixth Heisman Trophy winner in 2017 after finishing third in 2016 voting and fourth in 2015. Mayfield also won the Maxwell Award, Davey O'Brien Award, Manning Award and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award, and was named AP Player of the Year. All-America wide receiver Dede Westbrook finished fourth in Heisman voting in 2016 and became OU's first winner of the Biletnikoff Award, while tight end Mark Andrews claimed the school's first Mackey Award in 2017. Four Sooners earned first-team All-America honors in 2017: Mayfield, Andrews, left tackle Orlando Brown and defensive end/linebacker Ogbornia Okoronkwo. Running back Joe Mixon finished second nationally and set the OU single-season record with 2,331 all-purpose yards in 2016, while backfield mate Samaje Perine set the school career rushing record with 4,122 yards in only three seasons.

Oklahoma's newest head man joined the Sooners in January 2015 after he caught the eye of Stoops during a highly successful five-year stint as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Ruffin McNeill at East Carolina from 2010-14. With OU looking for a new play caller and wanting to get back to the up-tempo attack it helped make mainstream, Riley's numbers at ECU made him the perfect hire.

At East Carolina, Riley installed and directed a spread offensive scheme that made an immediate impact as the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual school offensive records in his five seasons with the program. His squads recorded the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four marks for total offense in a season.

He spent his final season with the Pirates serving in the role of assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach in 2014 as the team ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 ypg) and was fifth in total offense (533.0 ypg). With Riley calling the shots, the Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense.

Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down conversion percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone scoring efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

Among his notable pupils, Riley helped transform a pair of East Carolina wide receivers into the most productive pass catchers in FBS history. He guided walk-on Justin Hardy to 387 career catches, breaking the NCAA record previously held by OU's Ryan Broyles (349). Hardy's 4,541 career receiving yards rank third all-time in FBS annals as he flourished in Riley's offense, registering three 1,000-yard seasons at ECU that culminated with a 121-catch, 1,494-yard year as a senior in 2014. Riley also coached recent second-round NFL draft selection Zay Jones for the first two years of his career. Jones went on to break Hardy's record and is the NCAA's leader in career receptions (399) and receptions in a season (158 in 2016).

Already overseeing Mayfield's record-setting career, Riley also developed dynamic quarterbacks Dominique Davis and Shane Carden at ECU. Conference USA's 2010 Newcomer of the Year, Davis set ECU career marks for completions and TD passes despite playing just two seasons. Davis ranked second among FBS signal callers with 393 completions and 46 total touchdowns in 2010. He set an NCAA record with 36 straight completions in 2011.

Carden took over the job in 2012 and went on to break the majority of Davis' records, becoming the first 4,000-yard passer in program history and setting single-season standards for completion percentage (70.5 in 2013) and passing yards (4,736 in 2014). Carden earned Conference USA MVP honors in 2013 and was the American Conference's Offensive Player of the Year in 2014. He led all FBS passers with 392 completions in 2014.

Prior to East Carolina, Riley spent seven seasons on the staff at Texas Tech, where he was part of seven bowl teams and five bowl wins. During that span, Red Raiders quarterbacks won NCAA passing titles in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007. A walk-on quarterback at Tech during the spring and summer of 2003 who then became a student coach, Riley immersed himself in head coach Mike Leach's offense and worked his way into a full-time position as wide receivers coach in 2007. He served as inside receivers coach in 2008 and '09, and eventually called plays as interim offensive coordinator in the 2010 Alamo Bowl, where the Red Raiders racked up 579 yards in a 41-31 victory over Michigan State to cap the 2009 season.

Under Riley's guidance in 2007, wide receiver Michael Crabtree won the Biletnikoff Award after smashing Big 12 records and NCAA freshman standards with 134 receptions for 1,962 yards. Crabtree also accumulated 22 touchdown catches his first season. In fact, wide receiver Danny Amendola joined Crabtree that year as Texas Tech receivers who each amassed 100-catch, 1,000-yard efforts.

A 2006 Texas Tech graduate who earned a Bachelor of Science degree in exercise and sport sciences, Riley and his wife, Caitlin, have two daughters, Sloan and Stella.

NORMAN — Oklahoma registered its largest margin of victory in a season opener since 2008 by beating Florida Atlantic by 49 points. The Sooners, who led 42-0 at halftime, and 56-0, outgained the AP's 30th-ranked team 650 yards to 324 (10.5 yards per play to 4.4).

Kyler Murray was 9-for-11 through the air for 209 yards and two touchdowns for a gaudy 301.4 passing efficiency rating. He also ran for 23 yards on four carries before exiting the game for good late in the second quarter. Murray's TD throws both went for 65 yards, the first to then-walk-on receiver Lee Morris and the second to Marquise Brown.

Running back Rodney Anderson led a potent ground charge that finished with 316 yards on 39 carries (8.1 average). Anderson carried just five times but amassed 100 yards and scored on jaunts of 30 and 65 yards.

OU's defense didn't allow a point until 55 seconds were left in the third quarter. The first-half shutout was the Sooners' first since 2015. On special teams, Morris registered OU's first blocked punt since 2013 in the first quarter. Curtis Bolton fell on the ball in the end zone for the program's first TD on a blocked punt since 2002.

NORMAN — The Sooners registered their 31st consecutive victory over an unranked non-conference opponent by easily handling UCLA. OU, which led 21-7 at halftime and 42-7 in the fourth quarter, outgained the Bruins 485 yards to 383.

Quarterback Kyler Murray was 19-for-33 passing for 306 yards and three TDs, and rushed 10 times for 69 yards and a pair of scores. It marked the first time since OU's 2014 game at Iowa State (Trevor Knight, 146) that a quarterback led the team in rushing yards.

Receiver CeeDee Lamb finished with seven catches for 146 yards (one shy of his career high) and a 35-yard score. He also returned two punts for 63 yards, including a career-long 66 yarder. Marquise Brown hauled in four passes for 88 yards, one of them a 58-yard catch-and-run for a TD.

Oklahoma's defense registered six sacks and 12 tackles for loss. Defensive end/linebacker Mark Jackson Jr. recorded a career-high 10 tackles and a TFL, and linebacker Kenneth Murray finished with nine tackles and 2.5 TFLs.

The Sooners also got an 85-yard kickoff return from Tre Brown, the longest non-scoring play/return by OU in the 95-year history of Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium.

AMES, Iowa — Kyler Murray threw for a career-high 348 yards and three touchdowns in his first career road start, and Marquise Brown caught nine passes for 191 yards and a score as Oklahoma registered a 37-27 win at Iowa State. It was the Sooners' nation-leading 17th consecutive true road win and their Big 12-record 15th straight league road victory. The Sooners, who never trailed, won for the 24th straight time in Ames. Murray completed 21 of his 29 pass attempts and averaged 12.0 yards per pass attempt and 16.6 yards per completion. His 77 rushing yards came on 15 carries (5.1 average).

Brown registered 189 of his 191 receiving yards before halftime, setting the school record for receiving yards in a half. Included in his total was a 75-yard first-quarter bomb from Murray that resulted in OU's first touchdown of the day and a 10-0 lead. Running back Trey Sermon, who got the start in place of injured Rodney Anderson, carried 13 times for 74 yards (5.7 average) and notched a 22-yard TD run.

Austin Seibert was exceptional on special teams, making all three of his field goal attempts (21, 31 and 42 yards), averaging 48.5 yards on his two punts (long of 53) and registering touchbacks on all eight of his kickoffs.

NORMAN — Sophomore linebacker Kenneth Murray made a school-record 28 tackles (previous record was 24), the most in the FBS since at least 2000, and Kyler Murray threw for three touchdowns and ran for another as No. 5/5 Oklahoma downed Army West Point 28-21 in overtime.

The Black Knights ran 87 plays to Oklahoma's 40, and held a 44:41 to 15:19 advantage in time of possession. OU's possession time total was the lowest by a Big 12 team in the 23-year history of the league, and was the lowest by an FBS team in victory since at least 1996.

Trey Sermon paced the Sooners with 119 yards on 18 carries (6.6 average) while Kyler Murray added 71 yards on seven rushes (10.1 average). CeeDee Lamb caught two touchdown passes, including a 10-yarder that represented the game's only overtime score. OU averaged 8.9 yards per play on the evening while Army averaged 4.4.

With the game tied at 21 and with Army driving late in the fourth quarter, OU's Kenneth Mann registered his first career interception. Austin Seibert missed a 33-yard field goal attempt as time expired before the Sooners prevailed in the extra session.

Linebacker Curtis Bolton finished with 23 tackles, third most in OU history.

NORMAN — Quarterback Kyle Murray tied the school record for touchdowns accounted for in a game with seven as No. 6/5 Oklahoma (5-0, 2-0) downed Baylor (3-2, 1-1) by a 66-33 count in Norman. Murray, who also set the school and Big 12 single-game record for passing efficiency rating (348.0); the previous OU record was 303.3) was 17 for 21 for 432 yards and six touchdowns, while rushing 10 times for 45 yards and a score.

OU's 66 points were tied for its second most against a Big 12 team. The Sooners racked up 607 yards and averaged 11.24 yards per play (tied for third highest in school history).

Marquise Brown (132 yards, 2 TDs), CeeDee Lamb (101 yards, 1 TD) and Lee Morris (61 yards, 2 TDs) led OU's receivers, while Kennedy Brooks ran for team and career highs of 107 yards on eight carries (13.4 average) and two scores.

One week after registering 28 tackles against Army, Kenneth Murray posted a team-high 17 against the Bears, and was followed by Curtis Bolton (16) and Kahlil Haughton (11). Freshman defensive end Ronnie Perkins had 2.0 sacks and three quarterback hurries.

DALLAS — Oklahoma scored 21 straight fourth-quarter points to tie the game at 45 with 2:38 remaining, but Texas' Cameron Dicker kicked a 40-yard field goal with nine seconds left to give the Longhorns a 48-45 win in the highest-scoring Red River Showdown ever. The loss was just the Sooners' second in the last 29 games against Big 12 opponents.

Texas led 24-17 at halftime and took a 45-24 lead with 56 seconds left in the third quarter. OU quarterback Kyle Murray hit Lee Morris for a 19-yard touchdown with 8:28 to go in the fourth, and then ran for a 67-yard score three minutes later. Trey Sermon's 7-yard TD run tied the game before Texas drove 52 yards to set up the game-winning field goal.

Murray finished with 304 passing yards and a game-high 92 rushing yards. He was 19 for 26 through the air with four TDs and an interception, and lost his first fumble of the year in the third quarter.

Marquise Brown caught nine passes for 131 yards and two TDs, including a 77-yarder which was OU's longest-ever pass play against Texas. CeeDee Lamb caught six passes for 75 yards and a score. OU outgained Texas 532 yards to 501 (9.2 yards per play to 6.7).

FORT WORTH, Texas — Oklahoma outgained TCU 536 yards to 275 and produced a pair of 100-yard rushers in a 52-27 road win. The victory extended OU's true-road-game winning streak to a nation-leading 18 contests.

The Sooners' 52 points were tied for their most ever against TCU (also two years ago in Fort Worth) and the game marked the fourth straight in the series that OU scored at least 38 points. The Horned Frogs' 275 yards were the third fewest by an OU opponent in the 21-game Lincoln Riley era.

Kennedy Brooks ran for a career-high 168 yards on 18 carries (9.3 average) and a touchdown, and Trey Sermon added 110 yards and two TDs on 17 carries (6.5 average) as the Sooners registered a 323-112 advantage in rushing yards. Tyler Murray was 19 for 24 through the air for 213 yards and four TDs without an interception, marking the sixth straight game he has thrown for at least three scores.

CeeDee Lamb caught five passes for 91 yards and a score, while Lee Morris added two TD receptions on his two catches. Carson Meier recorded his second-career TD grab.

The Horned Frogs completed just 40 percent of their pass attempts (10 for 25) and averaged 3.7 yards per rush (long of 16). Kenneth Murray led the Sooners with 11 tackles (two for loss and one sack), and Parnell Motley recorded his third interception of the season to set up OU's final score late in the game.

NORMAN — Tyler Murray threw for 352 yards and three touchdowns, and ran for 46 yards and another score as Oklahoma scored on its first nine possessions and registered a season-high 702 yards in a 51-14 win over Kansas State on Homecoming.

Murray, who did not play in the last 23:20 of the game, was 19 for 24 through the air and registered his seventh straight game of at least three TD passes.

CeeDee Lamb caught four passes for a career-high 160 yards (40.0 average) and touchdowns of 82 and 57 yards. It was his seventh straight game with at least one touchdown grab. Grant Calcaterra registered OU's other receiving score, a 35-yarder on the game's opening possession. Kennedy Brooks gained 94 yards on just five carries (18.8 average) and scored on runs of 3 and 86 yards. The 86-yarder was OU's longest rush of the season and tied as its longest play of the year.

Curtis Bolton and Kenneth Murray led the Sooners with seven tackles each. Bolton and freshman Jalen Redmond, playing in his second-career game, each registered 2.5 tackles for loss. OU surrendered points on just two of Kansas State's 11 possessions. Austin Seibert was 3 for 3 on field goals and tallied 15 points. He tied the NCAA career records in extra-point makes (274) and attempts (278).
