OPENING KICK

► No. 4/4 Oklahoma plays its second home game to open its 125th season when it hosts South Dakota on Saturday at 6 p.m. CT at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. The contest will be televised on a pay-per-view basis by FOX Sports Oklahoma with **Ron Thulin**, **Gary Reasons** and **Lesley McCaslin** announcing.

► Saturday's game will mark the first meeting between the Sooners and Coyotes.

► OU head coach **Lincoln Riley** will turn 36 Thursday. He is the fourth-youngest FBS head coach.

► The Sooners are 42-11-1 overall and 20-2 at home as the No. 4 team in the AP poll. Against unranked opponents, OU is 33-4 (18-2 at home) as the AP's No. 4 squad.

► Oklahoma is coming off a 49-31 home win over Houston on Sunday in which it set a school record for total offense in a season-opening game (686 yards). Quarterback **Jalen Hurts** threw for 332 yards and ran for a career-high 176 to set the OU record for total offense by a player in his Sooner debut (508 yards; previous record was 396).

► South Dakota fell 31-17 at home in Saturday's season opener against Montana. In a game in which all of the scoring took place in the second and third quarters, USD finished with 352 yards (246 passing) while surrendering 510 (427 passing). It held the Grizzlies to 83 rushing yards (2.3 per attempt).

KEY STORYLINES

► Oklahoma has won two more Big 12 championships over the last 20 years (12) than it has lost home games. OU is 114-10 (.919) at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium since the start of the 1999 season, with all 124 of those games sellouts. It is the best home winning percentage among Power Five schools over the last 20 seasons (Ohio State is next at .888). OU has outscored its opponents by an average of 43-17 in those games. No school has won more than two Big 12 titles since the Sooners won their first in 2000.

► In their history, the Sooners have rushed for 300-plus yards and passed for 300-plus yards in a game 12 times. Six of those 12 occasions have come in the last 15 games (since the start of last season), and OU has accomplished the feat five times in the last eight contests (including Sunday versus Houston).

► OU averaged 11.25 yards per play against Houston, the third-highest average in school history (the record is 12.96 vs. West Virginia in 2017).



In a 49-31 win over Houston on Sunday, **Jalen Hurts** became the first player in OU history to pass for at least 300 yards and rush for at least 150 in a game. His 508 yards of total offense were the fifth most in school history and the most by a player making his Sooner debut. Hurts was named **Big 12 Player and Newcomer of the Week**, and **Maxwell Award Player of the Week**.

BIG GAINS

Oklahoma led the nation by gaining at least 10 yards on 31.0% of its offensive plays last season. The Sooners were up to their old tricks Sunday vs. Houston, going for at least 10 yards on 28 of their 61 plays (45.9%). The next highest week-one mark was 36.2% by Washington State.

The next highest figure in the FBS this past week was 8.96 by Washington State. It was the 13th time in OU history the Sooners have averaged at least 10.0 yards per play, and 10 of those occasions have been since the start of the 2016 season. The other three were in 1971, '80, '86.

► Last year the Sooners led the nation in both yards per rush (6.6) and yards per pass attempt (11.3). Last week against Houston they led the nation in yards per rush (9.6; next highest was 8.4 by Clemson) and were second in yards per pass attempt (13.8).

► OU is 8-3 against programs currently in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS), but has played only four such games since the start of the 1952 season. In those four contests, the Sooners beat Indiana State 49-0 in 1999 (**Bob Stoops'** first game as OU head coach), Chattanooga 57-2 in 2008, Idaho State 64-0 in 2009 and Florida A&M 69-13 in 2012. That's a combined total of 239-15. OU is 3-2 against Drake (games played between 1920 and '26) and 1-1 versus William & Mary (games played in 1942 and '51).

RECAPPING SUNDAY'S WIN OVER HOUSTON

► Making his Oklahoma debut, graduate transfer quarterback **Jalen Hurts** accounted for 508 yards of offense to Houston's 408 in a 49-31 home win over the Cougars on Sunday. He was named Big 12 Player and Newcomer of the Week on Tuesday, as well as Maxwell Award Player of the Week.

► Hurts was 20 for 23 through the air for 332 yards and three touchdowns while running 16 times for a career-high 176 yards (11.0 average) and three more scores. His 508 yards of total offense were 112 more than the previous school record for a Sooner debut, held by **Baker Mayfield** (396 vs. Akron in 2015). The total offense figure represented the fifth-highest total by an OU player in any game and the second highest by a Sooner inside Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium (Mayfield had 572 vs. Tulsa in 2015).

► Hurts became the first Sooner to ever throw for at least 300 yards and rush for at least 150 in a game. He is the only player in Big 12 history to throw for at least 300 and rush for at least 150 while completing at least 80 percent of his passes.

► Hurts' 251.3 passing efficiency rating was the third best in school history among quarterbacks who attempted at least 23 passes in a game.

► Hurts' 176 rushing yards were the second-most by an OU quarterback. Only **Thomas Lott** (195 vs. Kansas State in 1976) ran for more in a game.

► Redshirt sophomore receiver **Charleston Rambo** caught three passes for a career-high 105 yards. One of his grabs went for 56 yards and a touchdown on the first possession of the third quarter. Junior receiver **CeeDee Lamb** caught two passes for 46 yards (one for a 45-yard score) to put him over the 2,000-yard mark for his career.

► OU's 686 yards were the fourth most nationally on the week and the most in a season opener in program history.

► The Sooner defense held a Houston offense that last year ranked seventh nationally in total yards per game (512.5) to 408 yards Sunday (5.9 per play).

► Junior linebacker **Kenneth Murray**, the Big 12 Preseason Defensive Player of the Year, led the Sooners with 13 tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss while recording a pass breakup and a quarterback hurry. Sophomore defensive lineman **Ronnie Perkins** registered seven tackles, 1.0 sack, 2.0 tackles for loss and a forced fumble.

► OU registered 13 first downs on 17 first-quarter plays and 20 first downs on 35 first-half plays.

► Eleven players made their first start as Sooners on Sunday. For nine of those 11, it was their first career start.

SCOUTING THE COYOTES

► South Dakota is in its fourth season under **Bob Nielson**, who is in his 27th year as a head coach and is one of just 14 active NCAA coaches with at least 200 wins. He owns a 16-20 record at USD. The Coyotes, a member of the Missouri Valley Football Conference, went 4-7 in 2018.

► The Coyotes dropped their season opener at home against FCS No. 25 Montana by a 31-17 score on Saturday. USD gained 352 yards of total offense (106 rushing, 246 passing) and allowed 510 yards (83 rushing, 427 passing). Senior quarterback **Austin Simmons** completed 23 of 33 passes for 246 yards, two touchdowns and an interception. Receiver **Cody Kase** caught 11 passes for 144 yards and two scores.

► In 2018, South Dakota averaged 26.7 points and 411.2 yards per game (125.4 rushing, 285.8 passing) while allowing 34.2 points and 430.0 yards (210.8 rushing, 219.2 passing) per contest.

► Simmons passed for 3,124 yards and 18 touchdowns last season, completing 61 percent of his throws. He rushed for 332 yards and five TDs. **Henry Kai**, who ran once for four yards on Saturday, led the Coyotes with 509 rushing yards and seven scores in 2018. Case had 17 receptions for 163 yards last year, but the receiving corps was led by **Dakarai Allen** (48 catches, 703 yards, five TDs) and **Levi Falck** (45 catches, 493 yards, two TDs), both of whom return this season.

► Linebacker **Jack Cochrane**, who tallied a team-high nine tackles last week, is South Dakota's leading returning tackler. He totaled 79 stops and 3.5 tackles for loss last year. Defensive lineman **Darin Greenfield** was disruptive up front, recording 58 tackles, 14.5 tackles for loss, six sacks and 13 QB hurries. Defensive back **Mark Collins Jr.**, who paced the defense with 13 pass breakups and added an interception last year, recorded one of USD's two interceptions in the season opener.

FIRST-TIMERS

► Fifteen players made their first appearance in an Oklahoma uniform on Sunday. Eleven players made their first OU starts in the game: redshirt senior OL **R.J. Proctor**, senior QB **Jalen Hurts**, redshirt junior OLB **Jon-Michael Terry**, junior DL **LaRon Stokes**, redshirt sophomore OL **Marquis Hayes**, **Tyrese Robinson** and **Adrian Ealy**, redshirt sophomore WR **Charleston Rambo**, sophomore LB **DaShaun White** and sophomore S **Delarrin Turner-Yell** and **Pat Fields**. The starts were the first in the careers of all but Proctor and Hurts.

► Ten first-year Sooners saw the field Sunday against Houston. They were Proctor, Hurts, Stokes, junior RB **Rhamondre Stevenson** and six true freshmen (WR **Trejan Bridges**, CB **Jaden Davis**, WR **Jadon Haselwood**, TE **Austin Stogner**, DL **Marcus Stripling** and DL **David Ugwoegbu**).

BIG-PLAY SOONERS

► Despite ranking 104th out of 130 FBS teams last season in offensive plays per game (just 66.3), Oklahoma led the country in plays of at least 20 yards (111) and at least 30 yards (59), and ranked second in plays of at least 40 yards (34; Clemson had 35 in one more game).

► On Sunday against Houston, the Sooners picked up where they left off in 2018. They led all teams in plays of at least 20 yards (11), 30 yards (seven) and 40 yards (five), despite 108 teams running more plays than their 61.

THREE NEW DEFENSIVE COACHES

► **Alex Grinch** (defensive coordinator and safeties), **Roy Manning** (cornerbacks) and **Brian Odom** (inside linebackers) made their Oklahoma coaching debuts Sunday against Houston after being hired in January.

► Grinch arrived at OU after serving the 2018 season as co-defensive coordinator and safeties coach at Ohio State. He made his mark in three years (2015-17) as defensive coordinator and secondary coach at Washington State when he took the Cougars from a 99th-ranked unit in total defense the year before he arrived (442.3 ypg) to a 16th-ranked unit in his third season (323.3 ypg). WSU also improved from 127th in pass defense (296.6 ypg) to ninth (170.9 ypg).

► Manning and Odom were on staff at Washington State with Grinch. Manning served the 2018 season as outside linebackers and special teams coach at UCLA, while Odom spent the last two seasons as outside linebackers coach at Missouri. Odom was an OU running back and special teams player in 2000 (redshirted when Sooners won a national championship) and '01.

► Assistant head coach **Ruffin McNeill**, who served as OU's defensive tackles coach last season before being named interim defensive coordinator in early October, is coaching outside linebackers in 2019, while **Calvin Thibodeaux** mentors the defensive line.

SOONERS CELEBRATING 125TH SEASON

► The 2019 Oklahoma football campaign marks the 125th in the program's illustrious history, and the Sooners are celebrating that colorful and accomplished past throughout the fall. The "125" logo will be featured on the backs of helmets and on Owen Field during the 2019 season, as well as on various fan merchandise and apparel. The OU Athletics Department is also planning a variety of content, collectibles and activities that will honor the Sooners' storied past.

► In their first 124 years, the Sooners amassed an 896-325-53 (.724) record, good for the fifth-best winning percentage nationally during the period, and posted only 13 losing seasons.

RILEY'S FAST START

► The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, **Lincoln Riley** was named the Oklahoma's 22nd head man on June 7, 2017, and quickly set school records for wins by a first-year head coach (12) and victories in his first two seasons (24). No one at any school in the last 125 years (since Penn's George Woodruff in 1892-93) won more games in his first two seasons as a college head coach. In addition to his 24-4 record in his first two years, Riley won two Big 12 titles, participated in two College Football Playoffs and produced seven first-team All-Americans, two Heisman Trophy winners and two No. 1 overall NFL Draft picks in his two years as OU's head coach. He will turn 36 on Thursday.

HURTS WINS STARTING QB JOB

► After a competitive battle during August camp, head coach **Lincoln Riley** announced Aug. 19 that senior **Jalen Hurts** will be OU's starting quarterback to start the season, and that redshirt freshman **Tanner Mordecai** would be his backup, and freshman **Spencer Rattler** would be third on the depth chart.

► A graduate transfer from Alabama who arrived at OU in January, Hurts follows in the footsteps of OU Heisman Trophy winners **Baker Mayfield** (2017) and **Kyler Murray** (2018). He started 14 games in each of the Crimson Tide's 2016 and 2017 seasons, and saw action in 13 games in 2018. He played in three College Football Playoff National Championships and helped Alabama to the 2017 national title. UA went 41-3 in his three seasons in Tuscaloosa.

RILEY'S RARE FEAT

Lincoln Riley is just one of five people to win at least 24 games in his first two seasons as a college head coach. The last time a head coach won more games than Riley in his first two seasons was 1892 and '93 (125 years ago).

OU is the only program nationally that can boast four coaches who each registered at least 100 career wins (Bennie Owen, 122; Bud Wilkinson, 145; Barry Switzer, 157; Bob Stoops, 190). With 25 wins, current head coach Lincoln Riley is a quarter of the way to 100 victories after just 29 games, and owns the best winning percentage of the quintet.

Political science

► Hurts led the Crimson Tide to a 26-2 record in his 28 starts over the 2016 and 2017 seasons. One of his appearances in 2018 came in the SEC Championship when he replaced injured starter Tua Tagovailoa and rallied UA to a 35-28 win after it trailed 28-21 when he entered the game in the fourth quarter. Hurts threw a 10-yard pass with 7:08 left to tie the game at 28 and ran for a 15-yard score with 1:04 remaining for the game's final points.

► From Channelview, Texas, Hurts owns the Alabama quarterback career record with 23 rushing touchdowns and ranks second in school history with 1,976 career rushing yards and 71 touchdowns responsible for. He amassed 7,602 yards of total offense and threw for 48 touchdowns, both good for third place in UA history.

► In his debut season of 2016, Hurts was named SEC Freshman of the Year, a freshman All-American by ESPN and *USA Today* and a finalist for the Manning Award. He completed 62.8 percent of his passes for 2,780 yards and 23 touchdowns against nine interceptions. He also ran for an Alabama quarterback-record 954 yards (5.0 per carry) and 13 TDs. In the second game of the season, Hurts became the first UA freshman quarterback to start a game under head coach Nick Saban, and he went on to start each of the next 27 contests. The Crimson Tide won its first 14 games in 2016 before falling to Clemson in the CFP National Championship, 35-31.

► Hurts' 2017 sophomore season saw him complete 154 of 255 pass attempts (60.4 percent) for 2,081 yards and 17 touchdowns versus just one interception. He rushed for 855 yards (5.6 per carry) and eight scores, and was named a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist. Hurts registered three games of at least 100 rushing yards and was named offensive MVP in Alabama's 24-6 win over Clemson in the CFP Semifinal at the Allstate Sugar Bowl.

► Last season, Hurts played in 13 games, completing 51 of his 70 passes (72.9 percent) for eight touchdowns with two interceptions, good for a 196.7 passing efficiency rating. He also ran for 167 yards (4.6 per carry) and two TDs.

NO LITTLE LAMB

► A preseason All-Big 12 selection and a preseason first-team All-American by The Athletic, junior wide receiver **CeeDee Lamb** is continuing his ascent on OU's charts this season. The Richmond, Texas, product has 113 catches for 2,011 yards and 19 touchdowns in his two-plus years as a Sooner. His 19 TDs already rank tied for ninth in school history and he needs seven more to move into the top three.

► Last year, Lamb, who has started 27 of his 29 career games, caught 65 passes for 1,158 yards, the sixth-highest yardage total in single-season school history. He caught at least one touchdown pass in seven consecutive games and finished with a team-high 11 TD grabs. If he repeats his 65-catch performance this year, he would move into sixth place on OU's all-time receptions list (would give him 176).

► Lamb was the only player in the country last year with multiple receptions of 80 yards. He registered an 86-yard catch against Baylor and an 82-yard grab vs. Kansas State, both for scores. He also caught an 82-yard TD pass as a freshman against Tulane.

► Also a 2019 preseason AP second-team All-American as an all-purpose player, Lamb ranked eighth nationally in 2018 with his 8.2 yards per punt return.

MURRAY NAMED PRESEASON BIG 12 DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

► Junior linebacker **Kenneth Murray**, who ranked second in the Big 12 and 13th nationally last season with his 155 total tackles (most by a Sooner since Curtis Lofton had 157 in 2007), was named 2019 Preseason Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year by media who cover the league.

► Murray registered nine games of double-digit tackles last season as a second-team All-Big 12 performer, including three contests of at least 15 stops (28 vs. Army [most by an FBS player since at least 2000], 17 vs. Baylor and 15 vs. Alabama in CFP Semifinal at the Orange Bowl).

► Murray, who has started all 29 games since the start of 2017, has 22.5 career tackles for loss and 6.0 sacks. His fumble recovery against Oklahoma State last season with the game tied at 41 helped OU post a 48-47 win.

RECAPPING 2018

► **Lincoln Riley's** second season as Oklahoma head coach was another highly accomplished one, as the Sooners won a fourth straight Big 12 title (beat Texas 39-27 in the conference championship) and, for the second straight year, went 12-2 overall, 8-1 in league play and qualified for the College Football Playoff. At No. 4, OU also finished in the AP top five for the fourth straight year, a first for the program since the 1971-76 seasons. The Sooners produced three first-team All-Americans in receiver **Marquise Brown**, quarterback **Kyler Murray** (also won OU's second straight and seventh Heisman Trophy) and offensive lineman **Ben Powers** (consensus).

► The Sooners led the nation in 2019 in total offense (570.3 ypg), scoring offense (48.4 ppg), yards per play (FBS-record 8.6), yards per rush (6.6), yards per pass attempt (11.3), touchdowns per game (6.4) and plays of 20-plus yards (111), and ranked second in passing efficiency rating (194.9) and third in first downs (369). They were the only team last season (and just the eighth since at least 1996) with at least 40 passing touchdowns (43) and at least 40 rushing TDs (42), and rushed for at least 300 yards and passed for at least 300 in a game a school-record five times (the feat had only been accomplished six times in school history entering the season).

► OU also became the first FBS team to ever produce a 4,000-yard passer (Murray had 4,361), at least two 1,000-yard rushers (**Kennedy Brooks** had 1,056 and Murray 1,001) and at least two 1,000-yard receivers (Brown had 1,318 and **CeeDee Lamb** 1,158).

EIGHT SOONERS DRAFTED

Oklahoma had eight players selected in the 2019 NFL Draft, a number exceeded by only Alabama (10) and Ohio State (nine). The eight draftees were the Sooners' most since 2005. The draft marked the first since 1988 (31 years) that OU had seven offensive players and four offensive linemen selected. Quarterback **Kyler Murray** became the Sooners' second straight No. 1 overall pick (Baker Mayfield in 2018), making OU the only school to ever produce first-round quarterback selections in consecutive drafts. OU is the only program in the country that has had at least four players drafted each of the last 12 years.

► The Sooners made their 20th consecutive bowl appearance, by far the longest streak in school history. The previous record was eight straight (1975-82).

► Riley was named Big 12 Co-Coach of the Year, **Kyler Murray** was Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year, **Dru Samia** was Big 12 Tri-Offensive Lineman of the Year and **Austin Seibert** became OU's first-ever Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Year.

► Oklahoma's offensive line won the fourth-annual Joe Moore Award, given to the best O-line unit in the country. Starters were **Bobby Evans** (left tackle), Powers (left guard), **Creed Humphrey** (center), Samia (right guard) and **Cody Ford** (right tackle). The unit was coached by co-offensive coordinator **Bill Bedenbaugh**.

► In addition to delivering OU's seventh Heisman Trophy (tied for the most by any school), Murray won the Davey O'Brien Award, Manning Award and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award. He was also named the AP Player of the Year.

► Three Sooners earned freshman All-America honors. They were Brooks (*USA Today*), Humphrey (FWAA and The Athletic) and defensive end **Ronnie Perkins** (ESPN).

► Brooks averaged 8.87 yards per rush, second most in school history (**Greg Pruitt** averaged 8.98 in 1971) and second most in Big 12 history (West Virginia's Tavon Austin averaged 8.93 in 2012).

► Last year marked the first season in school history in which five players scored at least 10 touchdowns. Running back **Trey Sermon** led the way with 13 TDs (all rushing) and was followed by Brooks and Murray (12 rushing each), Lamb (11 receiving) and Brown (10 receiving). Hawaii in 2006 is the only other team since at least 1996 that has had five players score 10 TDs each. OU's **Lee Morris** added eight receiving TDs.

► Brown and Lamb represent the first OU duo to ever record at least 1,000 receiving yards each in a season.

► OU's eight-game streak (Sept. 29-Nov. 23) of scoring at least 45 points tied for the longest among FBS teams since at least 1980 (Baylor also did it across the 2011 and '12 seasons) and was the longest same-season streak in at least the last 39 years.

► The Sooners became the first team in FBS history to record at least 500 yards of offense in nine regular season conference games (also did it in Big 12 Championship vs. Texas).

► OU's 12 wins were tied for the second most in program history.

OFFENSE HAS ROLLED UNDER RILEY

► Oklahoma owns the nation's most productive offense since the start of the 2015 season, which was **Lincoln Riley's** first year as OU's offensive coordinator. Riley called plays as the program's offensive coordinator and continues to as head coach.

► Since the start of the 2015 season, OU ranks first nationally in points per game (45.4; next most is 41.4), total offense (561.6; next most is 529.7), touchdowns from scrimmage (315; next most is 294), pass efficiency rating (190.2; next best is 161.3), completion percentage (69.4; tied) and yards per pass attempt (10.7), and is fourth in passing offense (328.3) and 10th in rushing offense (233.3).

► In 55 games since the start of the 2015 season, OU has registered at least 500 yards of total offense 41 times, including in 31 of the last 39 outings, topped the 600-yard mark on 21 occasions and gone over 700 yards six times. Similarly, OU has scored at least 30 points in 49 of 55 games since Riley's arrival, at least 40 points 37 times, at least 50 points 22 times and at least 60 points seven times.

► The Sooners have registered at least 700 yards of offense 12 times in their history, and six of those occasions have come since the start of the 2015 season: 854 at Texas Tech in 2016; 785 at Oklahoma State in 2017; 773 vs. Tulsa in 2015; 710 at Kansas in 2015; 702 vs. Kansas State in 2018; 702 vs. Oklahoma State in 2018.

GOING FOR BIG 12 FIVE-PEAT

► If Oklahoma wins the 2019 Big 12 title, it will mark the program's fifth straight league crown. The last time the Sooners won at least five consecutive conference championships was 1972-80 under head coaches **Chuck Fairbanks** (1972) and **Barry Switzer**.

► OU is the only program to win three straight Big 12 titles, and it has done so twice (also from 2006-08). Baylor (2013-14) is the only other program to win two Big 12 championships in a row.

► The last Power Five program to win five straight outright league titles was Alabama (SEC) from 1971 through 1975.

BIG 12'S BELL COW

► Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed 12 league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each). All 12 of the Sooners' titles have come since the start of the 2000 campaign, with no other program during that span winning more than two. OU is 132-28 (.825) in regular season Big 12 play since the start of the 2000 season. That's 22 more wins than the program with the next most victories during that period (Texas; 110-50) and 43 more than the program with the third most (Oklahoma State; 89-71).

RILEY SECURES ANOTHER TOP-10 RECRUITING CLASS

Lincoln Riley's 2018 recruiting class — his first as head coach at OU — was a consensus top-10 one. His 2019 class was ranked even higher. The Sooners' "New Wave 19" class was rated No. 4 nationally by ESPN, No. 5 by Rivals and No. 6 by 247Sports.

The Sooners signed 23 players, 19 of them ranked as four- or five-star prospects by 247Sports, ESPN or Rivals. Four players were ranked as five-star prospects by at least one service in quarterback Spencer Rattler and receivers Trejan Bridges, Jadon Haselwood and Theo Wease. The class is comprised of 12 defensive players and 11 offensive players. Eight of them enrolled at OU in January and participated in spring practice (Bridges, Haselwood and Wease, tight end Austin Stogner, offensive lineman Finley Felix, defensive lineman LaRon Stokes, linebacker Jonathan Perkins and defensive back Jamal Morris).

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

- ▶ During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (650) than any other program (next most is 610 by Alabama).
- ▶ OU is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 35,842 points (in 1,275 games).
- ▶ No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 39. In addition, OU's 25 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.
- ▶ Since former head coach **Bob Stoops** arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads all Power Five conference programs in wins (215) and points scored (10,239).
- ▶ Only Alabama (118) and Ohio State (105) have been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll more weeks than Oklahoma (101). OU's 413 weeks in the AP's top five are most of any school (Alabama next with 399 and Ohio State third with 374). The AP Poll was introduced in 1936.
- ▶ Only Ohio State (624) has more all-time top-10 AP poll appearances than OU (589).
- ▶ Only Alabama (10) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

EXTRA POINTS

- ▶ Oklahoma is the only FBS program to rack up 16 seasons of double-digit wins since 2000. OU also leads all FBS programs with its 39 all-time 10-plus-win seasons, and with its 25 campaigns of at least 11 victories.
- ▶ OU is the only program to win at least three straight Big 12 titles, and has done so twice (2006-08 and 2015-18). Its current streak of four straight outright league championships is the longest among Power Five programs since Alabama won five in a row from 1971 to '75 (Clemson is also riding a four-game outright streak [ACC]).
- ▶ Since the start of his sophomore season at Alabama, OU quarterback **Jalen Hurts** has posted a 9.3-to-1 touchdown-to-interception ratio (28 TDs to three INTs).
- ▶ The Sooners have won more Big 12 titles the last four seasons (four) than they have lost games against Big 12 opponents (35-3 record).
- ▶ OU committed 13 turnovers each of the last two years. That's the second-lowest total in school history (11 in 2008).
- ▶ Oklahoma is 33-3 (.917) in regular season Big 12 play the last four years, which coincides with **Lincoln Riley's** arrival at OU. Oklahoma State ranks second during that period (.23-13; .639), TCU and West Virginia third (.22-14; .611) and Texas fifth (.19-17; .528).
- ▶ Redshirt junior receiver **Lee Morris** has 23 career catches and 10 have gone for touchdowns. The 43-percent touchdown rate ranks first in school history among players with at least 20 receptions. Eight of Morris's 21 receptions last year resulted in a score.
- ▶ OU has scored at least 50 points 22 times since the start of the 2015 season, most in the nation.
- ▶ Oklahoma has scored at least 30 points in 37 of its last 39 games (29 and 28 in the other two). It has won 36 of those 39 contests.
- ▶ OU ranked fourth nationally last year by converting 51.7 percent of its third-down plays and was 5 for 8 Sunday against Houston (62.5 percent). The Sooners ranked 11th last year by converting 66.8 percent (9 of 14) of its fourth-down plays (had no such attempts Sunday).
- ▶ The Sooners' 2019 starting offensive line logged a combined 156 career starts by season's end. This year's offensive line entered 2019 with a combined 12 career starts (all by center **Creed Humphrey** last season).
- ▶ When the Sooners play at UCLA next week, they will be looking to extend their true road winning streak to 21 games. That would tie as the second-longest such streak nationally in the post-World War II era. The Sooners won 25 consecutive true road games from 1953-58 under **Bud Wilkinson**, and Alabama won 21 in a row from 1970-75. OU's current 20-game streak is tied with Miami, Fla. (1984-88) and Ohio State (2012-16).

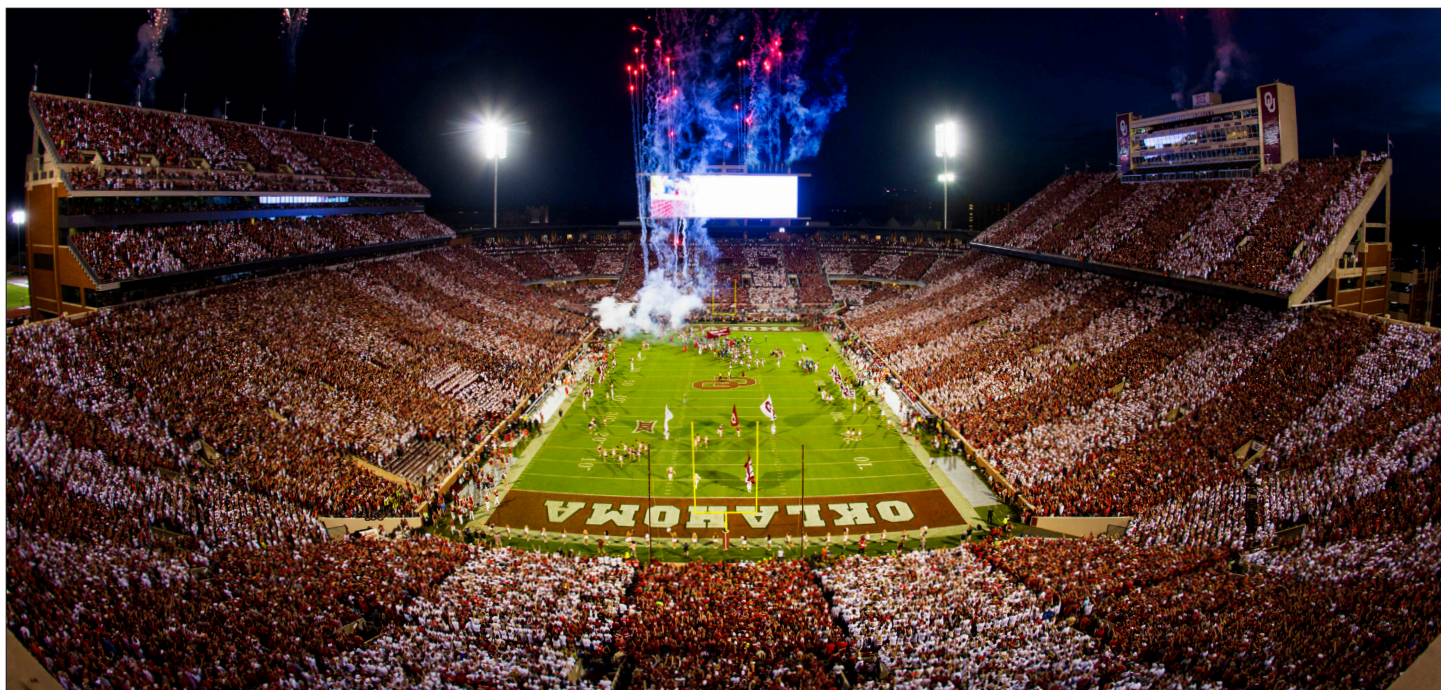

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and the second-largest collegiate video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- ▶ Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.
- ▶ In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- ▶ The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- ▶ In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- ▶ Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and 83,489 (2016). With this year's widening of aisles and some seats, capacity has dropped to 80,126.
- ▶ In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

- ▶ The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- ▶ The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.
- ▶ The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons also benefit from two new clubs.
- ▶ Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- ▶ All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- ▶ The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.
- ▶ A significantly larger and more more detailed video board has replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The new board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

LINCOLN RILEY

TWO SEASONS AS HEAD COACH • 24-4 RECORD (.857) • 2018 CO-BIG 12 COACH OF THE YEAR OWNS OU RECORDS FOR WINS IN A DEBUT SEASON (12) AND IN FIRST TWO SEASONS (24) DIRECTED SOONERS TO BIG 12 TITLES AND COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF BERTHS IN 2017 AND '18 WINNER OF 2015 BROYLES AWARD AS NATION'S TOP ASSISTANT COACH

After presiding over two of the most prolific offenses in OU history as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2015 and 2016, Lincoln Riley took over the program's head coaching reins on June 7, 2017, following the retirement of one of the most accomplished coaches of the last quarter century in Bob Stoops. OU's 22nd head coach, all Riley has done in his first two years at the helm is lead the Sooners to their 11th and 12th Big 12 titles and to a pair of College Football Playoff berths. He was also named the 2018 Co-Big 12 Coach of the Year.

The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, Riley became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. At 24-4, he also holds the OU record for most wins by a head coach in his first two seasons (Barry Switzer held the previous mark with 21 over the 1973 and '74 seasons). No one has won more games in his first two seasons as a college head coach since Penn's George Woodruff in 1892 and '93.

Originally from the 5,000-person West Texas town of Muleshoe, Riley, who continues to call Oklahoma's offensive plays as head coach, has made his name as perhaps the best up-and-coming star in college football by overseeing an explosive — and balanced — OU offense the last four seasons.

Since the start of the 2015 campaign, OU ranks first nationally in points per game (45.4; next most is 41.4), total offense (561.6; next most is 529.7), touchdowns from scrimmage (315; next most is 294), pass efficiency rating (190.2; next best is 161.3), completion percentage (69.4; tied) and yards per pass attempt (10.7), and is fourth in passing offense (328.3) and 10th in rushing offense (233.3). With that kind of offensive production, it's no surprise the Sooners have posted a 46-8 (.852) record since his arrival (33-3 in Big 12 play). OU's overall mark since 2015 is fourth best nationally, with only Alabama (56-4), Clemson (56-4) and Ohio State (49-6) having better records.

Individual player honors and accomplishments have poured in under Riley, highlighted by quarterbacks Baker Mayfield and Kyler Murray becoming OU's sixth and seventh Heisman Trophy winners in 2017 and 2018. Mayfield also won the Maxwell, Davey O'Brien, Manning and Walter Camp Player of the Year Awards, was named AP Player of the Year and was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft. Murray also won the O'Brien and Manning Awards and was named AP Player of the Year. Receiver Dede Westbrook finished fourth in Heisman voting in 2016 and became OU's first winner of the Biletnikoff Award, while tight end Mark Andrews claimed the school's first Mackey Award in 2017. Seven Sooners have earned first-team All-America honors the last two years. Running back Joe Mixon set the OU single-season record with 2,331 all-purpose yards in 2016, while backfield mate Samaje Perine set the school career rushing record with 4,122 yards in only three seasons.

Oklahoma's newest head man joined the Sooners in January 2015 after he caught the eye of Stoops during a highly successful five-year stint as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Ruffin McNeill at East Carolina from 2010-14. With OU looking for a new play caller and wanting to get back to the up-tempo attack it helped make mainstream, Riley's numbers at ECU made him the perfect hire.

At East Carolina, Riley installed and directed a spread offensive scheme that made an immediate impact as the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual school offensive records in his five seasons with the program. His squads recorded the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four marks for total offense in a season.

He spent his final season with the Pirates serving in the role of assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach in 2014 as the team ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 ypg) and was fifth in total offense (533.0 ypg). With Riley calling the shots, the Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense.

Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down conversion percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone scoring efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

Among his notable pupils, Riley helped transform a pair of East Carolina wide receivers into the most productive pass catchers in FBS history. He guided walk-on Justin Hardy to 387 career catches, breaking the NCAA record previously held by OU's Ryan Broyles (349). Hardy's 4,541 career receiving yards rank third all-time in FBS annals as he flourished in Riley's offense, registering three 1,000-yard seasons at ECU that culminated with a 121-catch, 1,494-yard year as a senior in 2014. Riley also coached recent second-round NFL draft selection Zay Jones for the first two years of his career. Jones went on to break Hardy's record and is the NCAA's leader in career receptions (399) and receptions in a season (158 in 2016).

In addition to overseeing Mayfield's and Murray's record-setting careers, Riley also developed dynamic quarterbacks Dominique Davis and Shane Carden at ECU. Conference USA's 2010 Newcomer of the Year, Davis set ECU career marks for completions and TD passes despite playing just two seasons. Davis ranked second among FBS signal callers with 393 completions and 46 total touchdowns in 2010. He set an NCAA record with 36 straight completions in 2011.

Carden took over the job in 2012 and went on to break the majority of Davis' records, becoming the first 4,000-yard passer in program history and setting single-season standards for completion percentage (70.5 in 2013) and passing yards (4,736 in 2014). Carden earned Conference USA MVP honors in 2013 and was the American Conference's Offensive Player of the Year in 2014. He led all FBS passers with 392 completions in 2014.

Prior to East Carolina, Riley spent seven seasons on the staff at Texas Tech, where he was part of seven bowl teams and five bowl wins. During that span, Red Raiders quarterbacks won NCAA passing titles in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007. A walk-on quarterback at Tech during the spring and summer of 2003 who then became a student coach, Riley immersed himself in head coach Mike Leach's offense and worked his way into a full-time position as wide receivers coach in 2007. He served as inside receivers coach in 2008 and '09, and eventually called plays as interim offensive coordinator in the 2010 Alamo Bowl, where the Red Raiders racked up 579 yards in a 41-31 victory over Michigan State to cap the 2009 season.

Under Riley's guidance in 2007, wide receiver Michael Crabtree won the Biletnikoff Award after smashing Big 12 records and NCAA freshman standards with 134 receptions for 1,962 yards. Crabtree also accumulated 22 touchdown catches his first season. In fact, wide receiver Danny Amendola joined Crabtree that year as Texas Tech receivers who each amassed 100-catch, 1,000-yard efforts.

A 2006 Texas Tech graduate who earned a Bachelor of Science degree in exercise and sport sciences, Riley and his wife, Caitlin, have two daughters, Sloan and Stella.

NORMAN – Jalen Hurts accounted for six touchdowns and set the record for total offensive yards by a player in his Oklahoma debut as the Sooners beat Houston 49-31 to start the 2019 season. OU's 686 total yards were its most ever in a season opener.

A graduate transfer quarterback from Alabama, Hurts was 20 for 23 through the air for 332 yards and three touchdowns while running 16 times for a career-high 176 yards (11.0 average) and three more scores. His 508 yards of total offense smashed the school record for a Sooner debut, previously held by Baker Mayfield (396 vs. Akron in 2015).

Hurts became the first Sooner to ever throw for at least 300 yards and rush for at least 150 in a game, and the first player in Big 12 history to throw for at least 300 and rush for at least 150 while completing at least 80 percent of his passes.

OU ran for 354 yards and threw for 332 on the night.

The Sooner defense held a Houston offense that last year ranked seventh nationally in total yards per game (512.5) to 408 yards (5.9 per play). OU by comparison averaged 11.2 per play, third most in program history. Linebacker Kenneth Murray led the Sooners with 13 tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss while recording a pass breakup and a quarterback hurry.
