OPENING KICK

► No. 6/4 Oklahoma looks to become the sixth FBS program to register 900 all-time wins (as recognized by the NCAA) when it hosts Texas Tech on Saturday at 11 a.m. CT. The contest will be televised nationally by FOX with **Gus Johnson**, **Joel Klatt** and **Jenny Taft** announcing.

► The Sooners and Red Raiders are both coming off bye weeks.

► OU has won six straight Big 12 openers and 10 of its last 11 (lost 24-19 to No. 15 Kansas State in Norman in 2012).

► Oklahoma owns a 20-6 record against Texas Tech (11-2 in Norman) and has won each of the last seven games in the series. OU is averaging 50.0 points, 599.1 yards and 307.7 rushing yards per contest during the streak.

► The Sooners have scored at least 38 points in each of their last nine games against the Red Raiders. It is the second-longest streak against an opponent in school history (OU scored at least 38 points in 11 straight games against Kingfisher College from 1908 through 1919).

► OU has won 34 of its last 36 games (.944) against Big 12 opponents dating back to the 2015 season. The losses were to Iowa State in 2017 (38-31 in Norman) and to Texas last year (48-45 in Dallas). Nineteen of those 34 victories have been by at least 15 points, and nine by at least 30 points.

► OU is the only program to win at least three straight Big 12 titles, and has done so twice (2006-08 and 2015-18). Its current streak of four straight outright league championships is the longest among Power Five programs since Alabama won five in a row from 1971 to '75 (Clemson is also riding a four-game outright streak [ACC]).

► The Sooners have won more Big 12 titles the last four seasons (four) than they have lost games against Big 12 opponents (35-3 record).

► Oklahoma is 33-3 (.917) in regular season Big 12 play the last four years, which coincides with **Lincoln Riley's** arrival at OU. Oklahoma State and West Virginia rank second during that period (23-14; .622), TCU fourth (22-14; .611) and Texas fifth (20-17; .541).

► OU has scored at least 34 points in 13 straight games and 24 of the last 25.

► At UCLA on Sept. 14, the Sooners racked up 434 first-half yards in taking a 34-7 halftime lead before winning 48-14. OU outgained the Bruins 611 yards to 311 and registered two takeaways (interceptions) without a turnover. **Jalen Hurts** completed 15 of 20 passes for 289 yards and three touchdowns while rushing 14 times for 150 yards and a score.

► Texas Tech is coming off a 28-14 loss at Arizona two weeks ago after leading 14-13 after three quarters. The Red Raiders, who forced three turnovers while committing two, were outgained 499 yards to 411. QB **Alan**



Jalen Hurts is the only FBS player since at least 1996 to register a passing efficiency rating of at least 245.0 (min. 18 attempts) three times in a season. It has taken him just three games to accomplish the feat.

A BALANCED APPROACH

Since the start of the 2018 season, Oklahoma has recorded eight games of at least 300 passing yards and at least 300 rushing yards. The next highest total nationally is three. Oklahoma State is the only other Big 12 program to do it once, and no other Power Five program has done it more than once.

Bowman completed 30 of 55 pass attempts for 307 yards and a TD, but Arizona outgained Tech by 210 yards on the ground (314-104).

KEY STORYLINES

► Saturday's game will feature an Oklahoma squad that ranks seventh nationally in passing offense (352.3 yards per game) and a Texas Tech team that ranks third nationally in passing defense (133.7 yards per game). OU leads the nation in passing efficiency rating (244.7; next highest is 213.6) while the Red Raiders rank 14th by allowing a 105.0 rating. Similarly, the Sooners have thrown 12 TD passes without an interception and are tied for the national lead with their 77.9 completion percentage, while Tech has surrendered two passing TDs (two interceptions) and has allowed just a 50.0-percent completion rate.

► OU quarterback **Jalen Hurts** is the only FBS player since at least 1996 to record three or more passing efficiency ratings of at least 245.0 (min. 18 attempts per game) in a season. He leads the nation with his 250.2 season rating (next highest is 225.6 by LSU's Joe Burrow) and owns the nation's sixth-, seventh- and ninth-best passing efficiency ratings this year (253.6 vs. South Dakota, 251.3 vs. Houston and 245.9 at UCLA). Hurts is also the only player in the country averaging more than 85 rushing yards (124.3) and at least 225 passing yards (293.3) per contest this season. He leads all quarterbacks in rushing yards per contest (next most among those who have played at least three games is 82.2 by Oklahoma State's Spencer Sanders).

► The 2019 Sooners are the only FBS team since at least the start of the 1996 campaign to average 7.5 yards or more per rush in each of its first three games of a season (min. 35 attempts per game). OU averaged 9.6 yards per carry vs. Houston, 7.9 vs. South Dakota and 7.5 at UCLA.

► In their history, the Sooners have rushed for 300-plus yards and passed for 300-plus in a game 14 times. Amazingly, eight of those occasions have come in the last 17 games (since the start of last season), and OU has accomplished the feat seven times in the last 10 contests (including each of the first three games this season). Only three other programs (UCF [three times] and Cincinnati and Louisiana [twice each]) have registered more than one such performance since the start of the 2018 season.

► The Sooners led the nation last year in both yards per pass attempt (11.3) and yards per rush (6.6). So far this season, they are doing it again. OU ranks first nationally with its 13.7 yards per pass attempt (next highest average is 11.5) and with its 8.3 yards per rush (next highest average is 7.5).

► Under the direction of first-year defensive coordinator **Alex Grinch**, OU has forced five turnovers, three turnovers on downs and 16 punts through three games, while registering 22 tackles for loss and nine sacks. After ranking 118th nationally last year in defensive third-down conversion percentage (46.4%), OU ranks seventh nationally this season (24.3%). Houston (5 for 13), South Dakota (1 for 11) and UCLA (3 for 13) combined to convert 9 of 37 (24%) third-down attempts. Conversely, the Sooners are 16 for 27 on the year offensively for 59% (tied for second nationally).

HOME IS WHERE THE "W" IS

► Oklahoma has won two more Big 12 championships over the last 20 years (12) than it has lost home games. OU is 115-10 (.920) at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium since the start of the 1999 season, with all 125 of those games sellouts (Saturday's game versus Texas Tech is also a sellout). It is the best home winning percentage among Power Five schools over the last 20 seasons (Ohio State is next at .889). OU has outscored its opponents by an average of 43-17 in those games. No school has won more than two Big 12 titles since the Sooners won their first in 2000.

RECAPPING THE WIN AT UCLA

► No. 5/4 Oklahoma raced to a 34-7 halftime lead behind a record-setting performance by QB **Jalen Hurts** and cruised to a 48-14 win at UCLA on Sept. 14 to improve to 3-0.

► The Sooners, who won their 21st consecutive true road game (tied for the second-longest streak nationally since World War II), outgained the Bruins 611 yards to 311 (9.5 per play to 4.9).

► Oklahoma outgained UCLA 434-116 in the first half (12.1 per play to 4.0). The Sooners gained at least 15 yards on 14 of their 36 plays and at least 30 yards on five plays. OU's 258 yards of first-quarter total offense were the second most in school history for an opening quarter (274 at Iowa State in 2014). Its 434 yards in the first half were its fifth most in program history in the opening half of a true road game.

► Hurts became the first player in OU history to pass for at least 200 yards (206) and rush for at least 100 (141) in the first half of a game. He finished 15 for 20 passing for 289 yards and three TDs and ran 14 times for 150 yards and a score. Ninety-nine of his rushing yards came on OU's opening drive, making him the first FBS player to accomplish the feat in 15 years.

► Receiver **Charleston Rambo** caught TD passes of 48 and 39 yards, and finished with game highs of six catches

YARDS-PER-PLAY LEADERS

Oklahoma led the nation with its 8.3 yards per play in 2017 (the previous single-season school record was 7.6 in 1971) and then set an FBS record with its 8.6 yards per play last season. OU now owns the No. 1 and No. 3 spots on the FBS all-time single-season list.

So far this season, the Sooners pace the country by averaging 10.5 yards per play. No other team averages more than 8.8:

and 116 receiving yards. Fellow receiver **CeeDee Lamb** caught a 39-yard TD pass and registered his first-career rushing score on a 1-yard play.

► OU's defense tallied two more takeaways on the night, upping its season total to five (all in the last two games). CB **Tre Brown** and LB **Ryan Jones** both picked up their first-career interception.

SCOUTING TEXAS TECH

► Texas Tech is in its first season under head coach **Matt Wells**. From Sallisaw, Okla., Wells spent the previous six years at his alma mater of Utah State where he compiled a 44-34 record and led the Aggies to five bowl appearances.

► The Red Raiders are 2-1 this season with wins over Montana State (45-10) and UTEP (38-3) that preceded a loss at Arizona (28-14) two weeks ago.

► Texas Tech averages 32.3 points and 508.7 total yards per game (167.3 rushing, 341.3 passing) while allowing 13.7 points and 306.3 total yards per contest (172.7 rushing, 133.7 passing). Tech is minus-1 in turnover margin and has converted 50% of its third downs while allowing opponents a 37% third-down conversion rate.

► **Armand Shyne** leads the Red Raiders in rushing with 238 yards (79.3 per game) and two touchdowns on 32 carries, and is followed by **Ta'Zhawn Henry's** 104 yards and one score on 23 rushes and **SaRodoric Thompson's** 94 yards and three TDs on 23 carries. **T.J. Vasher** sets the pace with 246 receiving yards (82.0 per game) and two TDs on 18 receptions. **McLane Mannix** has collected 137 yards and two TDs on 10 receptions, **Dalton Rigdon** has 164 yards and a touchdown on 14 catches and **Xavier White** had 138 yards and a score on nine grabs.

► The TTU defense has accounted for six sacks, 23 tackles for loss, two interceptions and one fumble recovery. Linebacker **Jordyn Brooks** paces the unit with 35 tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss, a fumble recovery and four QB hurries. Safety **Douglas Coleman** has two interceptions and a pass breakup to go along with 20 tackles.

► Texas Tech quarterback **Alan Bowman** leads the Big 12 with his 340.0 passing yards per game and ranks second nationally with his 33.7 completions per contest, but Wells announced last week that Bowman will miss several weeks due to a shoulder injury sustained at Arizona. Backup QBs **Jett Duffey** and **Jackson Tyner** have combined to complete one pass on four attempts this season. Last year against the Sooners, Duffey replaced an injured Bowman and completed 9 of 17 passes for 139 yards and two TDs while rushing 13 times for 47 yards and a score (recap below).

LAST YEAR VS. THE RED RAIDERS

► No. 7/7/7 Oklahoma fell behind 14-0 midway through the first quarter but outscored Texas Tech 51-32 the rest of the way in a 51-46 win in Lubbock last November. It was OU's nation-leading 19th consecutive true road victory.

► The Sooners outgained the Red Raiders by 210 yards (683-473) and averaged 8.6 yards per play to Tech's 6.7. OU held the Raiders to a 3-for-13 performance on third downs (23 percent).

► **Kyler Murray** became the first Sooner to ever pass for at least 300 yards and rush for at least 100 in a game, as he was 20 for 35 through the air for 360 yards and three TDs, and ran for 100 yards and a score on 11 carries (9.1 average).

► **Trey Sermon** ran for career highs of 206 yards and three touchdowns, averaging 7.9 yards per rush. Twenty-five of his 26 carries went for positive yards (seven went for at least 10 yards), while the other was for no gain. The 206 yards were the most by a Sooner in two seasons and the second most by a Big 12 player on the year. The sophomore rushed for 98 yards in the fourth quarter alone (on 10 carries), scoring on runs of 20 and 30 yards to help ice the victory.

► **Lee Morris** caught four passes for a career-high 101 yards and a pair of touchdowns (16 and 46 yards).

► Linebacker **Kenneth Murray** led the Sooners with 11 tackles, his sixth double-digit effort in seven games. He also finished with 1.5 tackles for loss. Safety **Robert Barnes** logged five tackles and returned an intercepted two-point conversion attempt 100 yards for two points as Tech was attempting to tie the game at 42 with 6:54 remaining.

MODEL OF EFFICIENCY

► The Sooners are averaging a staggering 0.82 points per offensive play this season. Going back to 1996, the highest end-of-season figure was 0.688 by OU last season (the previous high was 0.687 by Florida State in 2013).

► Oklahoma has averaged 4.57 points per offensive possession this season, putting points on the scoreboard on 69 percent of its drives and scoring touchdowns 63 percent of the time.

► Fourteen of OU's 22 offensive TD drives (64 percent) have taken less than three minutes of game clock.

BIG-PLAY SOONERS

► Despite ranking 104th out of 130 FBS teams last season in offensive plays per game (just 66.3), Oklahoma led the country in plays of at least 20 yards (111) and at least 30 yards (59), and ranked second in plays of at least 40 yards (34; Clemson had 35 in one more game).

► So far this season, the Sooners have picked up where they left off in 2018. They lead all teams in number of plays per game of at least 10 yards, (24.3), 20 yards (10.7; next most is 8.8), 30 yards (7.3; next most is 5.5) and 40 yards (3.7), despite running just 194 plays (64.7 per game; only 22 teams average fewer plays per game).

SOONERS CELEBRATING 125TH SEASON

► The 2019 Oklahoma football campaign marks the 125th in the program's illustrious history, and the Sooners are celebrating that colorful and accomplished past throughout the fall. The "125" logo will be featured on the backs of helmets and on Owen Field during the 2019 season, as well as on various fan merchandise and apparel. The OU Athletics Department is also planning a variety of content, collectibles and activities that honor the Sooners' storied past.

► In their first 124 years, the Sooners amassed an 896-325-53 (.724) record, good for the fifth-best winning percentage nationally during the period, and posted only 13 losing seasons.

RILEY'S FAST START

► The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, **Lincoln Riley** was named the Oklahoma's 22nd head man on June 7, 2017, and quickly set school records for wins by a first-year head coach (12) and victories in his first two seasons (24). No one at any school in the last 125 years (since Penn's George Woodruff in 1892-93) won more games in his first two seasons as a college head coach. In addition to his 24-4 record in his first two years, Riley won two Big 12 titles, participated in two College Football Playoffs and produced seven first-team All-Americans, two Heisman Trophy winners and two No. 1 overall NFL Draft picks in his two years as OU's head coach. He turned 36 on Sept. 5.

HURTS THRIVING IN OU STARTING ROLE

► After a competitive battle during August camp, head coach **Lincoln Riley** announced Aug. 19 that senior **Jalen Hurts** will be OU's starting quarterback to start the season, and that redshirt freshman **Tanner Mordecai** would be his backup, and freshman **Spencer Rattler** would be third on the depth chart.

► A graduate transfer from Alabama who arrived at OU in January, Hurts follows in the footsteps of OU Heisman Trophy winners **Baker Mayfield** (2017) and **Kyler Murray** (2018). Through three games, he has performed as one of the best players in the country.

► Hurts has completed 49 of 61 passes (80.3%) for 880 yards (293.3 per game) and nine touchdowns without an interception. He has also rushed 38 times for 373 yards (124.3 per game) and four TDs. Hurts leads the nation in passing efficiency rating (250.2), yards per completion (18.0) and yards per pass attempt (14.4), ranks second in completion percentage, total offense (417.7 yards per game) and yards per rush (9.8), and fifth in points responsible for per game (26.0).

► Hurts has already posted more passing efficiency ratings over 245.0 this season (three) than any FBS player has recorded in a season going back to at least 1996 (minimum 18 attempts per game). If the minimum is lowered to 15 attempts per contest, only one other player since at least 1996 has posted three efficiency ratings over 245.0 for a season: Mayfield in 2017.

► Behind Hurts, OU has rushed for more than 300 yards and passed for more than 300 yards in all three games.

Here's a look at some of Hurts' accomplishments in each of OU's first three contests:

► Against Houston in the season opener, Hurts accounted for six touchdowns and set the record for total offensive yards by a player in his Oklahoma debut as the Sooners won 49-31. He was 20 for 23 through the air for 332 yards and three touchdowns while running 16 times for a career-high 176 yards (11.0 average) and three more scores. His 508 yards of total offense smashed the school record for a Sooner debut, previously held by Mayfield (396 vs. Akron in 2015). Hurts also became the first Sooner to ever throw for at least 300 yards and rush for at least 150 in a game, and the only player in Big 12 history to throw for at least 300 and rush for at least 150 while completing at least 80 percent of his passes.

► In less than two-and-a-half quarters of work against South Dakota in week two, Hurts completed 14 of 18 passes for 259 yards and three touchdowns while rushing eight times for 47 yards in a 70-14 win.

► On Sept. 14 at UCLA, Hurts became the first player in OU history to pass for at least 200 yards (206) and rush for at least 100 (141) in the first half of a game. Ninety-nine of his rushing yards came on OU's opening drive, making him the first FBS player to accomplish the feat in 15 years. Hurts' 103 first-quarter rushing yards were the most by a Big 12 player in the opening period of a contest since Texas' Vince Young in 2005, and his 141 rushing yards in the first half stand as the most ever by an OU quarterback in the opening half of a game.

MORE ON HURTS

► Jalen Hurts started 14 games in each of Alabama's 2016 and 2017 seasons, and saw action in 13 contests in

RILEY'S RARE FEAT

Lincoln Riley is just one of five people to win at least 24 games in his first two seasons as a college head coach. The last time a head coach won more games than Riley in his first two seasons was 1892 and '93 (125 years ago).

2018. He played in three College Football Playoff National Championships and helped the Crimson Tide to the 2017 national title. UA went 41-3 in his three seasons there.

► Hurts led the Crimson Tide to a 26-2 record in his 28 starts over the 2016 and 2017 seasons. One of his appearances in 2018 came in the SEC Championship when he replaced injured starter Tua Tagovailoa and rallied UA to a 35-28 win after it trailed 28-21 when he entered the game in the fourth quarter. Hurts threw a 10-yard pass with 7:08 left to tie the game at 28 and ran for a 15-yard score with 1:04 remaining for the game's final points.

► From Channelview, Texas, Hurts owns the Alabama quarterback career record with 23 rushing touchdowns and ranks second in school history with 1,976 career rushing yards and 71 touchdowns responsible for. He amassed 7,602 yards of total offense and threw for 48 touchdowns, both good for third place in UA history.

► In his debut season of 2016, Hurts was named SEC Freshman of the Year, a freshman All-American by ESPN and *USA Today* and a finalist for the Manning Award. He completed 62.8 percent of his passes for 2,780 yards and 23 touchdowns against nine interceptions. He also ran for an Alabama quarterback-record 954 yards (5.0 per carry) and 13 TDs. In the second game of the season, Hurts became the first UA freshman quarterback to start a game under head coach Nick Saban, and he went on to start each of the next 27 contests. The Crimson Tide won its first 14 games in 2016 before falling to Clemson in the CFP National Championship, 35-31.

► Hurts' 2017 sophomore season saw him complete 154 of 255 pass attempts (60.4 percent) for 2,081 yards and 17 touchdowns versus just one interception. He rushed for 855 yards (5.6 per carry) and eight scores, and was named a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist. Hurts registered three games of at least 100 rushing yards and was named offensive MVP in Alabama's 24-6 win over Clemson in the CFP Semifinal at the Allstate Sugar Bowl.

► Last season, Hurts played in 13 games, completing 51 of his 70 passes (72.9 percent) for eight touchdowns with two interceptions, good for a 196.7 passing efficiency rating. He also ran for 167 yards (4.6 per carry) and two TDs.

NO LITTLE LAMB

► A preseason All-Big 12 selection and a preseason first-team All-American by The Athletic, junior wide receiver **CeeDee Lamb** is continuing his ascent on OU's charts this season. The Richmond, Texas, product has 120 catches for 2,194 yards and 21 touchdowns in his two-plus years as a Sooner. His 21 TDs are already tied as seventh most in school history and he needs five more to move into the top three. Through three games this season he has posted nine catches and 229 receiving yards. He ranks fourth nationally by averaging 25.4 yards per grab and has scored three TDs.

► Last year, Lamb, who has started 29 of his 31 career games, caught 65 passes for 1,158 yards, the sixth-highest yardage total in single-season school history. He caught at least one touchdown pass in seven consecutive games and finished with a team-high 11 TD grabs. If he repeats his 65-catch performance this year, he would move into sixth place on OU's all-time receptions list (would give him 176).

► Lamb was the only player in the country last year with multiple receptions of 80 yards. He registered an 86-yard catch against Baylor and an 82-yard grab vs. Kansas State, both for scores. He also caught an 82-yard TD pass as a freshman against Tulane.

► Also a 2019 preseason AP second-team All-American as an all-purpose player, Lamb ranked eighth nationally in 2018 with his 8.2 yards per punt return. He is averaging 8.2 yards on six returns this year.

MURRAY NAMED PRESEASON BIG 12 DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

► Junior linebacker **Kenneth Murray**, who ranked second in the Big 12 and 13th nationally last season with his 155 total tackles (most by a Sooner since **Curtis Lofton** had 157 in 2007), was named 2019 Preseason Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year by media who cover the league. He's off to a good start, registering a team-high 22 tackles to go along with 3.0 tackles for loss. He was named the Lott IMPACT Player of the Week after the season-opening win over Houston (13 tackles, 2.5 TFLs, 1 breakup and 1 QB hurry).

► Murray registered nine games of double-digit tackles last season as a second-team All-Big 12 performer, including three contests of at least 15 stops (28 vs. Army [most by an FBS player since at least 2000], 17 vs. Baylor and 15 vs. Alabama in CFP Semifinal at the Orange Bowl).

► Murray, who has started all 31 games since the start of 2017, has 23.0 career tackles for loss and 6.0 sacks. His fumble recovery against Oklahoma State last season with the game tied at 41 helped OU post a 48-47 win.

OFFENSE HAS ROLLED UNDER RILEY

► Oklahoma owns the nation's most productive offense since the start of the 2015 season, which was **Lincoln Riley's** first year as OU's offensive coordinator. Riley called plays as the program's offensive coordinator and continues to act as head coach.

► Since the start of the 2015 season, OU ranks first nationally in points per game (45.8; next most is 41.6), total

RILEY SECURES ANOTHER TOP-10 RECRUITING CLASS

Lincoln Riley's 2018 recruiting class — his first as head coach at OU — was a consensus top-10 one. His 2019 class was ranked even higher. The Sooners' "New Wave 19" class was rated No. 4 nationally by ESPN, No. 5 by Rivals and No. 6 by 247Sports.

The Sooners signed 23 players, 19 of them ranked as four- or five-star prospects by 247Sports, ESPN or Rivals. Four players were ranked as five-star prospects by at least one service in quarterback Spencer Rattler and receivers Trejan Bridges, Jadon Haselwood and Theo Wease. The class is comprised of 12 defensive players and 11 offensive players. Eight of them enrolled at OU in January and participated in spring practice (Bridges, Haselwood and Wease, tight end Austin Stogner, offensive lineman Finley Felix, defensive lineman LaRon Stokes, linebacker Jonathan Perkins and defensive back Jamal Morris).

offense (565.5; next most is 525.5), touchdowns from scrimmage (330; next most is 308), pass efficiency rating (191.9; next best is 164.3), completion percentage (69.6; tied) and yards per pass attempt (10.8), and is fourth in passing offense (329.5) and 10th in rushing offense (236.0).

► In 57 games since the start of the 2015 season, OU has registered at least 500 yards of total offense 43 times, including in 33 of the last 41 outings, topped the 600-yard mark on 23 occasions and gone over 700 yards seven times. Similarly, OU has scored at least 30 points in 51 of 57 games since Riley's arrival, at least 40 points 39 times, at least 50 points 23 times and at least 60 points eight times.

► The Sooners have registered at least 700 yards of offense 13 times in their history, and seven of those occasions have come since the start of the 2015 season: 854 at Texas Tech in 2016, 785 at Oklahoma State in 2017, 773 vs. Tulsa in 2015, 733 vs. South Dakota in 2019, 710 at Kansas in 2015, 702 vs. Kansas State in 2018 and 702 vs. Oklahoma State in 2018.

GOING FOR BIG 12 FIVE-PEAT

► If Oklahoma wins the 2019 Big 12 title, it will mark the program's fifth straight league crown. The last time the Sooners won at least five consecutive conference championships was 1972-80 under head coaches **Chuck Fairbanks** (1972) and **Barry Switzer**.

► OU is the only program to win three straight Big 12 titles, and it has done so twice (also from 2006-08). Baylor (2013-14) is the only other program to win two Big 12 championships in a row.

► The last Power Five program to win five straight outright league titles was Alabama (SEC) from 1971 through 1975.

BIG 12'S BELL COW

► Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed 12 league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each). All 12 of the Sooners' titles have come since the start of the 2000 campaign, with no other program during that span winning more than two. OU is 132-28 (.825) in regular season Big 12 play since the start of the 2000 season. That's 21 more wins than the program with the next most victories during that period (Texas; 111-50) and 43 more than the program with the third most (Oklahoma State; 89-72).

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (652) than any other program (next most is 613 by Alabama).

► OU is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 35,960 points (in 1,277 games).

► No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 39. In addition, OU's 25 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.

► Since former head coach **Bob Stoops** arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads all Power Five conference programs in wins (217) and points scored (10,357).

► Only Alabama (118) and Ohio State (105) have been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll more weeks than Oklahoma (101). OU's 415 weeks in the AP's top five are most of any school (Alabama next with 402 and Ohio State third with 375). The AP Poll was introduced in 1936.

► Only Ohio State (627) has more all-time top-10 AP poll appearances than OU (592).

► Only Alabama (10) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

EXTRA POINTS

► Oklahoma head coach **Lincoln Riley** turned 36 on Sept. 5. He is the fifth-youngest FBS head coach.

► The Sooners are 36-4 overall and 22-2 in home games as the No. 6 team in the AP poll. Against unranked opponents, OU is 27-1 (19-0 at home) as the AP's No. 6 squad.

► Riley is 20-1 against unranked opponents as OU's head coach (lost 38-31 to Iowa State on Oct. 7, 2017).

► OU has run one fewer play than its opponents this season (195-194), but has outgained its foes by 972 yards (2,030-1,058).

► Since the start of his sophomore season at Alabama, OU quarterback **Jalen Hurts** has posted an 11.3-to-1 touchdown-to-interception ratio (34 TDs to three INTs).

► The Sooners have been ranked in the AP's top 10 in 42 of the last 43 polls. The only time it wasn't during that stretch was following its 2017 loss to Iowa State (fell from third to 12th).

► OU has outscored opponents 38-0 in the first quarter this season and 83-17 in the first half.

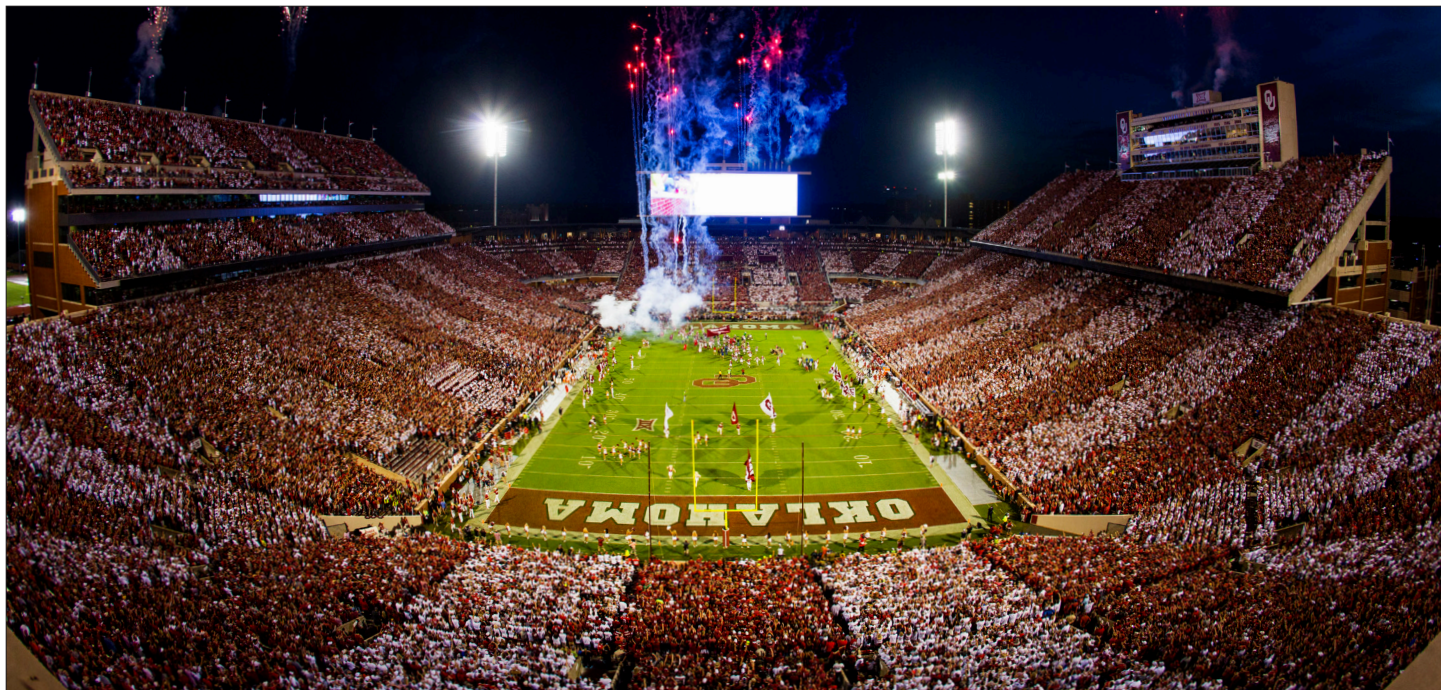

OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and the second-largest collegiate video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- ▶ Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.
- ▶ In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- ▶ The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- ▶ In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- ▶ Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and 83,489 (2016). With this year's widening of aisles and some seats, capacity has dropped to 80,126.
- ▶ In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

- ▶ The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- ▶ The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.
- ▶ The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons also benefit from two new clubs.
- ▶ Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- ▶ All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- ▶ The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.
- ▶ A significantly larger and more more detailed video board has replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The new board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

LINCOLN RILEY

THIRD SEASON AS HEAD COACH • 27-4 RECORD (.871) • 2018 CO-BIG 12 COACH OF THE YEAR OWNS OU RECORDS FOR WINS IN A DEBUT SEASON (12) AND IN FIRST TWO SEASONS (24) DIRECTED SOONERS TO BIG 12 TITLES AND COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF BERTHS IN 2017 AND '18 WINNER OF 2015 BROYLES AWARD AS NATION'S TOP ASSISTANT COACH

After presiding over two of the most prolific offenses in OU history as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2015 and 2016, Lincoln Riley took over the program's head coaching reins on June 7, 2017, following the retirement of one of the most accomplished coaches of the last quarter century in Bob Stoops. OU's 22nd head coach, all Riley has done in his first two years at the helm is lead the Sooners to their 11th and 12th Big 12 titles and to a pair of College Football Playoff berths. He was also named the 2018 Co-Big 12 Coach of the Year.

The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, Riley became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. At 24-4, he also holds the OU record for most wins by a head coach in his first two seasons (Barry Switzer held the previous mark with 21 over the 1973 and '74 seasons). No one has won more games in his first two seasons as a college head coach since Penn's George Woodruff in 1892 and '93.

Originally from the 5,000-person West Texas town of Muleshoe, Riley, who continues to call Oklahoma's offensive plays as head coach, has made his name as perhaps the best up-and-coming star in college football by overseeing an explosive — and balanced — OU offense the last four seasons.

Since the start of the 2015 campaign, OU ranks first nationally in points per game (45.8; next most is 41.6), total offense (565.5; next most is 525.5), touchdowns from scrimmage (330; next most is 308), pass efficiency rating (191.9; next best is 164.3), completion percentage (69.6; tied) and yards per pass attempt (10.8), and is fourth in passing offense (329.5) and 10th in rushing offense (236.0). With that kind of offensive production, it's no surprise the Sooners have posted a 49-8 (.860) record since his arrival (33-3 in Big 12 play). OU's overall mark since 2015 is fourth best nationally, with only Alabama (59-4), Clemson (59-4) and Ohio State (52-6) having better records.

Individual player honors and accomplishments have poured in under Riley, highlighted by quarterbacks Baker Mayfield and Kyler Murray becoming OU's sixth and seventh Heisman Trophy winners in 2017 and 2018. Mayfield also won the Maxwell, Davey O'Brien, Manning and Walter Camp Player of the Year Awards, was named AP Player of the Year and was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft. Murray also won the O'Brien and Manning Awards and was named AP Player of the Year. Receiver Dede Westbrook finished fourth in Heisman voting in 2016 and became OU's first winner of the Biletnikoff Award, while tight end Mark Andrews claimed the school's first Mackey Award in 2017. Seven Sooners have earned first-team All-America honors the last two years. Running back Joe Mixon set the OU single-season record with 2,331 all-purpose yards in 2016, while backfield mate Samaje Perine set the school career rushing record with 4,122 yards in only three seasons.

Oklahoma's newest head man joined the Sooners in January 2015 after he caught the eye of Stoops during a highly successful five-year stint as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Ruffin McNeill at East Carolina from 2010-14. With OU looking for a new play caller and wanting to get back to the up-tempo attack it helped make mainstream, Riley's numbers at ECU made him the perfect hire.

At East Carolina, Riley installed and directed a spread offensive scheme that made an immediate impact as the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual school offensive records in his five seasons with the program. His squads recorded the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four marks for total offense in a season.

He spent his final season with the Pirates serving in the role of assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach in 2014 as the team ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 ypg) and was fifth in total offense (533.0 ypg). With Riley calling the shots, the Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense.

Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down conversion percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone scoring efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

Among his notable pupils, Riley helped transform a pair of East Carolina wide receivers into the most productive pass catchers in FBS history. He guided walk-on Justin Hardy to 387 career catches, breaking the NCAA record previously held by OU's Ryan Broyles (349). Hardy's 4,541 career receiving yards rank third all-time in FBS annals as he flourished in Riley's offense, registering three 1,000-yard seasons at ECU that culminated with a 121-catch, 1,494-yard year as a senior in 2014. Riley also coached recent second-round NFL draft selection Zay Jones for the first two years of his career. Jones went on to break Hardy's record and is the NCAA's leader in career receptions (399) and receptions in a season (158 in 2016).

In addition to overseeing Mayfield's and Murray's record-setting careers, Riley also developed dynamic quarterbacks Dominique Davis and Shane Carden at ECU. Conference USA's 2010 Newcomer of the Year, Davis set ECU career marks for completions and TD passes despite playing just two seasons. Davis ranked second among FBS signal callers with 393 completions and 46 total touchdowns in 2010. He set an NCAA record with 36 straight completions in 2011.

Carden took over the job in 2012 and went on to break the majority of Davis' records, becoming the first 4,000-yard passer in program history and setting single-season standards for completion percentage (70.5 in 2013) and passing yards (4,736 in 2014). Carden earned Conference USA MVP honors in 2013 and was the American Conference's Offensive Player of the Year in 2014. He led all FBS passers with 392 completions in 2014.

Prior to East Carolina, Riley spent seven seasons on the staff at Texas Tech, where he was part of seven bowl teams and five bowl wins. During that span, Red Raiders quarterbacks won NCAA passing titles in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007. A walk-on quarterback at Tech during the spring and summer of 2003 who then became a student coach, Riley immersed himself in head coach Mike Leach's offense and worked his way into a full-time position as wide receivers coach in 2007. He served as inside receivers coach in 2008 and '09, and eventually called plays as interim offensive coordinator in the 2010 Alamo Bowl, where the Red Raiders racked up 579 yards in a 41-31 victory over Michigan State to cap the 2009 season.

Under Riley's guidance in 2007, wide receiver Michael Crabtree won the Biletnikoff Award after smashing Big 12 records and NCAA freshman standards with 134 receptions for 1,962 yards. Crabtree also accumulated 22 touchdown catches his first season. In fact, wide receiver Danny Amendola joined Crabtree that year as Texas Tech receivers who each amassed 100-catch, 1,000-yard efforts.

A 2006 Texas Tech graduate who earned a Bachelor of Science degree in exercise and sport sciences, Riley and his wife, Caitlin, have two daughters, Sloan and Stella.

NORMAN – Jalen Hurts accounted for six touchdowns and set the record for total offensive yards by a player in his Oklahoma debut as the Sooners beat Houston 49-31 to start the 2019 season. OU's 686 total yards were its most ever in a season opener.

A graduate transfer quarterback from Alabama, Hurts was 20 for 23 through the air for 332 yards and three touchdowns while running 16 times for a career-high 176 yards (11.0 average) and three more scores. His 508 yards of total offense smashed the school record for a Sooner debut, previously held by Baker Mayfield (396 vs. Akron in 2015).

Hurts became the first Sooner to ever throw for at least 300 yards and rush for at least 150 in a game, and the first player in Big 12 history to throw for at least 300 and rush for at least 150 while completing at least 80 percent of his passes.

OU ran for 354 yards and threw for 332 on the night.

The Sooner defense held a Houston offense that last year ranked seventh nationally in total yards per game (512.5) to 408 yards (5.9 per play). OU by comparison averaged 11.2 per play, third most in program history. Linebacker Kenneth Murray led the Sooners with 13 tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss while recording a pass breakup and a quarterback hurry.

NORMAN – Oklahoma outgained South Dakota 733 yards to 339 and recorded its first three takeaways of the season in a 70-14 win over South Dakota. OU's 70 points were its most since a 79-10 home win over North Texas to open the 2007 campaign, and a school-record 10 Sooners scored touchdowns on the night.

Jalen Hurts completed 14 of 18 passes for 259 yards and three touchdowns while rushing eight times for 47 yards before leaving the game with 11:03 left in the third quarter.

Redshirt freshman Tanner Mordecai replaced Hurts on OU's second possession of the third quarter with the Sooners leading 42-0 and promptly engineered a four-play, 68-yard touchdown drive in which he connected with freshman receiver Jadon Haselwood on a 14-yard score. It was the first career touchdown for both players. Mordecai finished 6 for 8 for 114 yards and two TDs. Freshman QB Spencer Rattler made his collegiate debut and threw for 50 yards and a TD on 4-for-4 passing and ran for 15 yards on two carries.

Sophomore defensive back Brendan Radley-Hiles recovered a second-quarter fumble and returned a third-quarter interception 30 yards for his first career TD. Freshman cornerback Jaden Davis added an interception with 11:12 left in the fourth quarter.

PASADENA, Calif. — No. 5/4 Oklahoma raced to a 34-7 halftime lead behind a record performance by QB Jalen Hurts and cruised to a 48-14 win at UCLA to improve to 3-0.

The Sooners, who won their 21 consecutive true road games (tied for the second-longest streak nationally since the end of World War II), outgained the Bruins 611 yards to 311 (9.5 per play to 4.9).

Hurts became the first player in OU history to pass for at least 200 yards (206) and rush for at least 100 yards (141) in the first half of a game. He finished 15 for 20 through the air for 289 yards and three touchdowns and ran 14 times for 150 yards and a score. Ninety-nine of his rushing yards came on OU's opening drive, marking the first time an FBS player accomplished the feat in 15 years.

Charleston Rambo caught touchdown passes of 48 and 39 yards, and finished with 116 receiving yards. CeeDee Lamb caught a 39-yard TD pass and registered his first-career rushing score on a 1-yard play.

OU recorded another 300-yard passing game (302) and 300-yard rushing game (309), its 14th such effort in school history and, amazingly, seventh in the last 10 games (all three outings this year).

The Sooners' defense tallied two more takeaways on the night, upping its season total to five. Cornerback Tre Brown and linebacker Ryan Jones both picked up their first-career interception.
