## OPENING KICK

▶ Looking to win for the 38th time in 40 games against Big 12 opponents, No. 5/5 Oklahoma (6-0, 3-0) hosts West Virginia (3-3, 1-2) in the Sooners' annual Homecoming game on Saturday at 11 a.m. CT. The contest will be televised by FOX with **Gus Johnson**, **Joel Klatt** and **Jenny Taft** announcing.

▶ OU is the only program West Virginia has not defeated since joining the Big 12 prior to the 2012 season. The Sooners are 7-0 against the Mountaineers during that span and have scored at least 44 points in six of those contests (average score of 47-32 in the seven games), including each of the last five meetings (average score of 53-34). WVU was coached by current Houston head coach Dana Holgorsen in each of the seven games.

▶ Oklahoma is the nation's only team this year with at least 19 rushing touchdowns (19) and at least 19 passing TDs (20).

▶ In a stat that speaks to OU's success on both sides of the ball, the Sooners have run one fewer play than their opponents this season (390-391) but have outgained them by a staggering 1,688 yards (3,730-2,032). OU leads the nation in total offense (621.7 ypg) despite ranking 111th in plays per game (just 65.0).

▶ The Sooners have scored at least 34 points in 15 straight games (longest streak in school history) and in 27 of the last 28. The 15-game streak is tied for the second longest nationally since at least 1980 (Florida State also 16 from 2013-14 and Oregon 23 from 2011-12).

▶ Oklahoma has scored at least one touchdown in 23 of its 24 quarters. The Sooners scored a TD in each of their first 21 quarters, establishing a school record to start a season (the previous record was first 15 quarters in their 2000 national championship season). Going back to last year, OU has scored a TD in 26 of its last 27 quarters.

▶ The Sooners have won 19 of their last 20 games the week after playing Texas. The lone loss — to Kansas State in 2014 — was by one point (31-30).

▶ OU is 27-4-1 overall and 14-1-1 in home games as the No. 5 team in the AP poll. Against unranked opponents, the Sooners are 17-1 (10-1 at home) as the AP's No. 5 squad (lone loss was 31-24 to Oklahoma State in 1976).

## KEY STORYLINES

▶ Former Oklahoma quarterback **Austin Kendall** has started every game for West Virginia this season. Kendall, who was **Baker Mayfield's** backup in 2016, redshirted in 2017 and was **Kyler Murray's** backup last season, transferred to WVU in January and has completed 66.0% of his passes (126 of 191) for 1,247 yards (207.8 per game) and nine touchdowns while throwing seven interceptions. Kendall was injured on the Mountaineers'



Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week CeeDee Lamb made a career-high 10 catches for 171 yards and three TDs vs. No. 11 Texas. Lamb is tied for the national lead with 10 receiving TDs and ranks 11th with his 21.8 yards per catch and 12th with his 101.7 receiving yards per game. The consensus midseason All-American has at least one TD reception in eight straight games (seven over the last three).

opening series in Saturday's 38-14 home loss to Iowa State and did not return. He was replaced by **Jack Allison**, who was 18 for 24 through the air for 140 yards, a touchdown and an interception vs. the Cyclones. In his two years of action at OU, Kendall played in seven games and completed 28 of 39 passes (71.8%) for 265 yards and three TDs without a pick.

► OU quarterback **Jalen Hurts** recorded a passing efficiency rating of at least 245.0 in each of his first four games this season and is the only FBS player since at least 1996 to record more than two such outings (min. 18 attempts) in a season. He ranks second nationally with his 215.9 season pass efficiency rating and owns four of the nation's top 13 figures this year (253.6 vs. South Dakota, 251.3 vs. Houston, 249.0 vs. Texas Tech and 245.9 at UCLA). Hurts also leads all quarterbacks with his 105.0 rushing yards per contest (next most among those who have played at least five games is 73.5 by Georgia State's Dan Ellington).

► Oklahoma is averaging a nation-leading 621.7 offensive yards per game, which is 61 yards more than the next highest average (561.0 by LSU). Making that even more impressive is the fact the Sooners rank 111th out of 130 teams by averaging just 65.0 plays per game. OU averages 9.6 yards per play, which is 1.5 yards more than the team with the second-highest average (8.1 by Alabama). Last year, OU set the FBS single-season record by averaging 8.6 yards per play.

► The Sooners led the nation last year in both yards per pass attempt (11.3) and yards per rush (6.6). So far this season, they are doing it again. OU ranks first nationally (among teams attempting at least 10 passes per game) with its 12.0 yards per pass attempt and with its 7.7 yards per rush (next highest average is 6.9).

► Under the direction of first-year defensive coordinator **Alex Grinch**, OU has forced six turnovers, seven turnovers on downs and 34 punts through six games, while registering 49 tackles for loss and 22 sacks. It has also forced 21 three-and-outs (14 before halftime).

► After ranking 118th nationally last year in defensive third-down conversion percentage (46.4%), OU ranks ninth nationally this season (27.8%; 22 for 79). Offensively, the Sooners are 28 for 57 on the year for 49.1% (12th nationally). They are one of only three teams in the country to rank in the top 12 in both categories (Ohio State and Wake Forest are the others).

► OU boasts one of the nation's best 1-2 receiver punches in junior **CeeDee Lamb** and redshirt sophomore **Charleston Rambo**. Lamb is tied the national lead in touchdown receptions (10) and ranks 11th in yards per catch (21.8) and 12th in receiving yards per game (101.7). Rambo ranks third in the nation with his 23.9 yards per grab and averages 67.7 yards per contest (has four TD catches). The duo has combined for nine catches of at least 45 yards this season (Lamb has receptions of 45, 48, 51, 65 and 71 yards while Rambo has grabs of 48 [two], 56 and 74 yards).

**HOME IS WHERE THE "W" IS**

► Oklahoma has won two more Big 12 championships over the last 20 years (12) than it has lost home games. OU is 116-10 (.921) at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium since the start of the 1999 season, with all 126 of those games sellouts. It is the best home winning percentage among Power Five schools over the last 20 seasons (Ohio State is next at .890). OU has outscored its opponents by an average of 43-17 in those games. No school has won more than two Big 12 titles since the Sooners won their first in 2000.

**RECAPPING THE WIN OVER TEXAS**

► **CeeDee Lamb** made a career-high 10 catches for 171 yards and a career-high-tying three touchdowns and No. 6/5 Oklahoma tied a school record with nine sacks in a 34-27 victory over No. 11/11 Texas in the Cotton Bowl on Saturday. It marked OU's eighth win over the Longhorns in the last 11 meetings and 14th in the last 21.

► The Sooners' defense also recorded 15 tackles for loss, their second most ever against Texas. Eight OU players registered a sack, 14 recorded at least half a tackle for loss and 23 players were credited with at least one tackle.

► OU outgained Texas 511-310 in total yards (7.7 yards per play to 4.2) and extended its streak of scoring at least 34 points to 16 games, tied for the second longest nationally since at least 1980.

► **Jalen Hurts** (Big 12 Co-Newcomer of the Week) carried the ball 17 times for 131 yards (the most rushing yards by an OU quarterback vs. Texas and a Cotton Bowl Stadium collegiate record by a QB) and a 3-yard fourth-quarter touchdown. He was 16 for 28 through the air for 235 yards, three TDs and an interception.

► Lamb's touchdowns covered 1 yard (fourth-down play in first quarter), 51 yards (third quarter; beat five defenders) and 27 yards (fourth quarter; broke two tackles). He made 10 of OU's 16 receptions on the day and moved into sole possession of third place on OU's career receiving TDs list with 28. He was named Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week and Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week.

**A BALANCED APPROACH**

Since the start of the 2018 season, Oklahoma has recorded eight games of at least 300 passing yards and at least 300 rushing yards. The next highest total nationally is three. Oklahoma State and TCU are the only other Big 12 programs to do it once, and no other Power Five program has done it more than once.

**YARDS-PER-PLAY LEADERS**

Oklahoma led the nation with its 8.3 yards per play in 2017 (the previous single-season school record was 7.6 in 1971) and then set an FBS record with its 8.6 yards per play last season. OU now owns the No. 1 and No. 3 spots on the FBS all-time single-season list.

So far this season, the Sooners pace the country by averaging 9.6 yards per play. No other team averages more than 8.1:

► **Kennedy Brooks** joined Hurts by surpassing the 100-yard rushing mark with 105 yards on 10 carries (10.5 average). It was his first 100-yard rushing game of the season (had five such performances last year).

► Safety **Delarrin Turner-Yell** recorded a career-high 10 tackles and a tackle for loss. Linebacker **Kenneth Murray** (Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week) had five solo tackles, a sack and two TFLs. Defensive lineman **Neville Gallimore** registered a team-high two sacks (four total tackles).

**LAST YEAR VS. THE MOUNTAINEERS**

► In the third-highest-scoring game in school history (115 points), No. 6/6/6 Oklahoma outlasted No. 13/12/12 West Virginia 59-56 last Nov. 23 to record its 20th consecutive true road win and secure a berth in its 10th Big 12 Championship Game. The Sooners finished with 668 total yards and averaged 10.3 yards per play in moving to 7-0 against WVU since it joined the Big 12 Conference. The win was OU's 17th straight in the month of November dating back to 2014.

► Quarterback **Kyler Murray** completed 20 of 27 passes for 364 yards and three touchdowns, and rushed nine times for an OU-career-high 114 yards (12.7 average) and a 55-yard score. Murray was named Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week for the fifth time of the year.

► **Marquise Brown** reeled in 11 passes for 243 yards, the second-highest yardage total in school history. He caught touchdown passes of 25 yards and 45 yards, and added non-scoring receptions of 26, 30 and 65 yards. Brown joined **Ryan Broyles** and **Dede Westbrook** as the only Sooners with multiple 200-yard career receiving games (two each).

► Running back **Kennedy Brooks** rushed 21 times for a career-high 182 yards (8.7 average), and scored on a 68-yard run in the second quarter to give OU a 28-21 lead. It marked his third straight game with at least 165 rushing yards, and fifth time of the season to break the century mark. Brooks was named Big 12 Newcomer of the Week for the third time.

► OU's first two defensive touchdowns of the season proved huge. **Caleb Kelly**, who finished with a career-high 14 tackles, sacked QB **Will Grier**, forced a fumble on the play and returned it 10 yards to put the Sooners ahead 35-21 with 3:06 left in the first half. Fellow linebacker **Curtis Bolton** recovered a fumble forced by **Kenneth Mann** and returned it 48 yards for a 59-49 lead with 9:58 to go in the fourth quarter. It was Bolton's third touchdown of the year (two on blocked punts). The game marked OU's first since 2011 against Texas that it scored two defensive TDs.

► **Trey Sermon** (1-yard rush) and **Grant Calcatera** (2-yard reception) scored OU's other two touchdowns.

**DEFENSE ON THE RISE**

► Hired in January, coordinator and safeties coach **Alex Grinch** has overseen major improvement on the defensive side of the ball through six games this season.

► Oklahoma ranks ninth nationally in third-down conversion percentage (27.8; last year ranked 119th at 46.4), 11th in sacks per game (3.7; last year ranked 49th at 2.1), 15th in tackles for loss per game (8.2; last year ranked 57th at 5.6), 31st in scoring defense (20.3 ppg; last year ranked 101st at 33.3), 37th in passing defense (199.8 ypg; last year ranked 130th at 294.0), 41st in total defense (340.3 ypg; last year ranked 114th at 453.8) and 51st in rushing defense (140.5 ypg; last year ranked 59th at 159.8).

► In Big 12 play, the Sooners rank first in pass defense efficiency (122.9), second in passing defense (187.3 ypg), scoring defense (21.0 ppg) and sacks (4.3 per game), third in total defense (328.0 ypg) and fourth in rushing defense (140.7 ypg).

► OU is one of seven teams nationally that has not permitted a touchdown this season on the possession following a turnover. The Sooners have allowed two field goals following their six turnovers.

► Six Sooners rank in the top 15 in sacks per game in Big 12 play.

**300-300 RARE FOR EVERYONE BUT SOONERS**

► In their history, the Sooners have rushed for 300-plus yards and passed for 300-plus in a game 14 times. Amazingly, eight of those occasions have come in the last 20 games (since the start of last season), and OU has accomplished the feat seven times in the last 13 contests (including each of the first three games this season). Only three other programs (UCF [three times] and Cincinnati and Louisiana [twice each]) have registered more than one such performance since the start of the 2018 season.

**THE NORMAN 500**

Since Lincoln Riley arrived at OU ahead of the 2015 season, the Sooners have registered 500-plus yards of offense in an incredible 76.7% of their games (46 of 60). The program with the next highest percentage of 500-yard performances during the period is Texas Tech (57.1%; 32 of 56). Only seven programs have a rate of at least 45%:

**MODEL OF EFFICIENCY**

- ▶ The Sooners are averaging a staggering 0.75 points per offensive play this season. Going back to 1996, the highest end-of-season figure was 0.688 by OU last year (the previous high was 0.687 by Florida State in 2013).
- ▶ OU has averaged 4.26 points per offensive possession this season, putting points on the scoreboard on 67 percent of its drives and scoring touchdowns 57 percent of the time.
- ▶ Twenty-six of OU's 39 offensive TD drives (67%) have taken less than three minutes of game clock.

**BIG-PLAY SOONERS**

- ▶ Despite ranking 104th out of 130 FBS teams last season in offensive plays per game (just 66.3), Oklahoma led the country in plays of at least 20 yards (111) and at least 30 yards (59), and ranked second in plays of at least 40 yards (34; Clemson had 35 in one more game).
- ▶ So far this season, the Sooners have picked up where they left off in 2018. They lead all teams in number of plays per game of at least 10 yards, (23.2; next most is 21.2), 20 yards (10.0; next most is 7.7), 30 yards (5.2; next most is 4.7) and 40 yards (3.0), despite ranking 111th nationally by averaging just 65.0 plays per contest.

**RILEY'S FAST START**

- ▶ The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, **Lincoln Riley** was named Oklahoma's 22nd head man on June 7, 2017, and quickly set school records for wins by a first-year head coach (12) and victories in his first two seasons (24). No one at any school in the last 125 years (since Penn's George Woodruff in 1892-93) won more games in his first two seasons as a college head coach. In addition to his 24-4 record, Riley won two Big 12 titles, participated in two College Football Playoffs and produced seven first-team All-Americans, two Heisman Trophy winners and two No. 1 overall NFL Draft picks in his first two years as OU's head coach. He turned 36 on Sept. 5 and is the FBS's fifth-youngest head coach.

**HURTS THRIVING IN OU STARTING ROLE**

- ▶ After a competitive battle during August camp, head coach **Lincoln Riley** announced Aug. 19 that senior **Jalen Hurts** would be OU's starting quarterback to start the season, and that redshirt freshman **Tanner Mordecai** would be his backup, and freshman **Spencer Rattler** would be third on the depth chart.
- ▶ A graduate transfer from Alabama who arrived at OU in January, Hurts follows in the footsteps of OU Heisman Trophy winners **Baker Mayfield** (2017) and **Kyler Murray** (2018). Through six games, he ranks atop or near the top of several statistical categories nationally.
- ▶ Hurts has completed 98 of 137 passes (71.5%) for 1,758 yards (293.0 per game) and 17 touchdowns with three interceptions. He has also rushed 74 times for a team-high 630 yards (105.0 per game) and eight TDs. Hurts leads the nation in yards per pass attempt (12.8; next highest is 11.6) and ranks second in total offense (398.0 yards per game), passing efficiency rating (215.9), yards per completion (17.9) and yards per rush (8.5), fourth in points responsible for per game (25.0) and ninth in completion percentage.
- ▶ Hurts is averaging 398.0 yards of total offense per game. That's more yards than 42% of the other FBS teams (54 of 129) and more yards than 34% of other Power Five teams (22 of 64).
- ▶ Hurts has already posted four passing efficiency ratings over 245.0 this season. Since at least 1996, the most efficiency ratings over 245.0 recorded by an FSB player in a season (minimum 18 attempts) had been two. If the minimum is lowered to 15 attempts per contest, only one other player since at least 1996 has posted three efficiency ratings over 245.0 in a season: Mayfield in 2017.
- ▶ Behind Hurts, OU has rushed for more than 300 yards and passed for more than 300 yards in three of six games.

Here's a look at some of Hurts' accomplishments in each of OU's first five contests (game 6 recap on page 2):

- ▶ Against Houston in the season opener, Hurts accounted for six touchdowns and set the record for total offensive yards by a player in his Oklahoma debut as the Sooners won 49-31. He was 20 for 23 through the air for 332 yards and three touchdowns while running 16 times for a career-high 176 yards (11.0 average) and three more scores. His 508 yards of total offense smashed the school record for a Sooner debut, previously held by Mayfield (396 vs. Akron in 2015). Hurts also became the first Sooner to ever throw for at least 300 yards and rush for at least 150 in a game, and the only player in Big 12 history to throw for at least 300 and rush for at least 150 while completing at least 80 percent of his passes.
- ▶ In less than two-and-a-half quarters of work against South Dakota in week two, Hurts completed 14 of 18 passes for 259 yards and three touchdowns while rushing eight times for 47 yards in a 70-14 win.
- ▶ On Sept. 14 at UCLA, Hurts became the first player in OU history to pass for at least 200 yards (206) and rush for at least 100 (141) in the first half of a game. Ninety-nine of his rushing yards came on OU's opening drive, making him the first FBS player to accomplish the feat in 15 years. Hurts' 103 first-quarter rushing yards were the most by a

**RILEY'S RARE FEAT**

Lincoln Riley is just one of five people to win at least 24 games in his first two seasons as a college head coach. The last time a head coach won more games than Riley in his first two seasons was 1892 and '93 (125 years ago).

With 30 wins, current head coach Lincoln Riley is more than a quarter of the way to 100 victories after just 34 games, and owns the best winning percentage of the quintet.

Big 12 player in the opening period of a contest since Texas' Vince Young in 2005, and his 141 rushing yards in the first half stand as the most ever by an OU quarterback in the opening 30 minutes of a game.

► Against Texas Tech on Sept. 18, Hurts completed 17 of 24 passes for a career-high 415 yards and three touchdowns and rushed nine times for 70 yards and a score in less than three quarters of work in a 55-16 win. He joined Patrick Mahomes (Texas Tech) and Trevone Boykin (TCU) as the only QBs in Big 12 history to throw for 415-plus yards, register three passing touchdowns, rush for at least 70 yards and score a rushing touchdown in a conference game.

► Hurts accounted for four touchdowns in a 45-20 Oct. 5 win at Kansas, completing 16 of 24 passes for 228 yards and two scores and running 10 times for 56 yards and two more TDs.

**MORE ON HURTS**

► **Jalen Hurts** started 14 games in each of Alabama's 2016 and 2017 seasons and saw action in 13 contests in 2018. He played in three College Football Playoff National Championships and helped the Crimson Tide to the 2017 national title. UA went 41-3 in his three seasons there.

► Hurts led the Crimson Tide to a 26-2 record in his 28 starts over the 2016 and 2017 seasons. One of his appearances in 2018 came in the SEC Championship when he replaced injured starter Tua Tagovailoa and rallied UA to a 35-28 win after it trailed 28-21 when he entered the game in the fourth quarter. Hurts threw a 10-yard pass with 7:08 left to tie the game at 28 and ran for a 15-yard score with 1:04 remaining for the game's final points.

► From Houston, Hurts left with the Alabama quarterback career record of 23 rushing touchdowns and ranked second in school history with 1,976 career rushing yards and 71 touchdowns responsible for. He amassed 7,602 yards of total offense and threw for 48 touchdowns, both good for third place in UA history.

► In his debut season of 2016, Hurts was named SEC Freshman of the Year, a freshman All-American by ESPN and *USA Today* and a finalist for the Manning Award. He completed 62.8 percent of his passes for 2,780 yards and 23 touchdowns against nine interceptions. He also ran for an Alabama quarterback-record 954 yards (5.0 per carry) and 13 TDs. In the second game of the season, Hurts became the first UA freshman QB to start a game under head coach Nick Saban and he went on to start each of the next 27 contests. The Crimson Tide won its first 14 games in 2016 before falling to Clemson in the CFP National Championship, 35-31.

► Hurts' 2017 sophomore season saw him complete 154 of 255 passes (60.4 percent) for 2,081 yards and 17 TDs versus just one interception. He rushed for 855 yards (5.6 per carry) and eight scores and was named a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist. Hurts registered three games of at least 100 rushing yards and was named offensive MVP in Alabama's 24-6 win over Clemson in the CFP Semifinal at the Allstate Sugar Bowl.

► Last season, Hurts played in 13 games, completing 51 of his 70 passes (72.9 percent) for eight touchdowns with two interceptions, good for a 196.7 passing efficiency rating. He also ran for 167 yards (4.6 per carry) and two TDs.

**NO LITTLE LAMB**

► A preseason All-Big 12 selection and a preseason first-team All-American by The Athletic, junior wide receiver **CeeDee Lamb** is continuing his rapid ascent on OU's charts this season. The Richmond, Texas, product ranks 11th in school history in receptions (139), sixth in receiving yards (2,575) and third in receiving touchdowns (28) despite playing less than two-and-a-half seasons. He needs three more receiving TDs to tie **Mark Clayton** for second place at 31 while **Ryan Broyles** holds the school record with 45 (both Clayton and Broyles played four seasons).

► Through six games this year, Lamb has posted team highs of 28 catches, 610 receiving yards and a nation-leading 10 receiving TDs. He ranks 11th nationally in yards per reception (21.8) and 12th in receiving yards per game (101.7).

► Lamb has caught at least one touchdown pass in each of OU's last eight games and has seven over the last three outings. Amazingly, he also registered a seven-game TD streak last season from the second through eighth contests. He was named Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week and Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week after catching a career-high 10 passes for 171 yards and three TDs vs. Texas on Oct. 12.

► Lamb ranks No. 3 among active FBS players (and No. 1 among non-seniors) in career receiving TDs (28). The non-senior with the next-highest total is Alabama junior Jerry Jeudy (22). Lamb ranks sixth among active FBS players with 2,575 career receiving yards, and again is No. 1 among non-seniors.

► Last year, Lamb, who has started 32 of his 34 career games, caught 65 passes for 1,158 yards, the sixth-highest yardage total in single-season school history. He caught at least one touchdown pass in seven consecutive games and finished with a team-high 11 TD grabs. If he repeats his 65-catch performance this year, he would move into sixth place on OU's all-time receptions list (would give him 176).

► Lamb was the only player in the country last year with multiple receptions of 80 yards. He registered an 86-yard catch against Baylor and an 82-yard grab vs. K-State, both for scores. He also caught an 82-yard TD pass as a freshman against Tulane.

► Also a 2019 preseason AP second-team All-American as an all-purpose player, Lamb ranked eighth nationally in 2018 with his 8.2 yards per punt return. He ranks 32nd this season by averaging 9.2 yards on nine returns.

**MURRAY LIVING UP TO PRESEASON ACCOLADES**

► Junior linebacker **Kenneth Murray**, who ranked second in the Big 12 and 13th nationally last season with his 155 total tackles (most by a Sooner since **Curtis Lofton** had 157 in 2007), was named 2019 Preseason Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year by media who cover the league. He's off to a strong start this season, registering a team-high 42 tackles to go along with 6.0 tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks and two pass breakups. He was named the Lott IMPACT Player of the Week after the season-opening win over Houston (13 tackles, 2.5 TFLs, 1 breakup and 1 QB hurry).

► Murray registered nine games of double-digit tackles last season as a second-team All-Big 12 performer, including three contests of at least 15 stops (28 vs. Army [most by an FBS player since at least 2000]), 17 vs. Baylor and 15 vs. Alabama in CFP Semifinal at the Orange Bowl).

► Murray, who has started all 34 games since the start of 2017, has 26.0 career tackles for loss and 8.0 sacks. His fumble recovery against Oklahoma State last season with the game tied at 41 helped OU post a 48-47 win.

**OFFENSE HAS ROLLED UNDER RILEY**

► Oklahoma owns the nation's most productive offense since the start of the 2015 season, which was **Lincoln Riley's** first year as OU's offensive coordinator. Riley continues to call plays as head coach.

► Since the start of the 2015 season, OU ranks first nationally in points per game (45.8; next most is 41.5), total offense (565.6; next most is 522.5), touchdowns from scrimmage (347; next most is 316), pass efficiency rating (191.1; next best is 165.5) and yards per pass attempt (10.8), and is second in completion percentage (69.3), fourth in passing offense (329.0) and 10th in rushing offense (236.6).

► In 60 games since the start of the 2015 season, OU has registered at least 500 yards of total offense 46 times, including in 36 of the last 44 outings, topped the 600-yard mark on 24 occasions and gone over 700 yards seven times. Similarly, OU has scored at least 30 points in 54 of 60 games since Riley's arrival, at least 40 points 41 times, at least 50 points 24 times and at least 60 points eight times.

► The Sooners have registered at least 700 yards of offense 13 times in their history, and seven of those occasions have come since the start of the 2015 season: 854 at Texas Tech in 2016, 785 at Oklahoma State in 2017, 773 vs. Tulsa in 2015, 733 vs. South Dakota in 2019, 710 at Kansas in 2015, 702 vs. Kansas State in 2018 and 702 vs. Oklahoma State in 2018.

**GOING FOR BIG 12 FIVE-PEAT**

► If Oklahoma wins the 2019 Big 12 title, it will mark the program's fifth straight league crown. The last time the Sooners won at least five consecutive conference championships was 1972-80 under head coaches **Chuck Fairbanks** (1972) and **Barry Switzer**.

► OU is the only program to win three straight Big 12 titles, and it has done so twice (also from 2006-08). Baylor (2013-14) is the only other program to win two Big 12 championships in a row.

► OU's current streak of four straight outright league championships is the longest among Power Five programs since Alabama won five in a row from 1971 to '75 (Clemson is also riding a four-game outright streak [ACC]).

**BIG 12'S BELL COW**

► Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed 12 league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each). All 12 of the Sooners' titles have come since the start of the 2000 campaign, with no other program during that span winning more than two. OU is 135-28 (.828) in regular season Big 12 play since the start of the 2000 season. That's 23 more wins than the program with the next most victories during that period (Texas; 112-51) and 45 more than the program with the third most (Oklahoma State; 90-73).

**EXTRA POINTS**

► Oklahoma has won 37 of its last 39 games (.949) against Big 12 opponents dating back to the 2015 season. The losses were to Iowa State in 2017 (38-31 in Norman) and to Texas last year (48-45 in Dallas). Twenty-one of those 37 victories have been by at least 15 points, and 10 by at least 30 points.

► The Sooners have made 416 all-time appearances in the AP poll's top five, more than any other program (Alabama is next with 405 and Ohio State third with 378). That means OU has been in the top five in 36 percent of all AP polls (1,160 total polls), which started in 1936. OU has made 21 AP top-5 appearances since the start of 2017.

► OU has been ranked in the AP's top 10 in 45 of the last 46 polls. The only time it wasn't during that stretch was following its 2017 loss to Iowa State (fell from third to 12th).

► Six of OU's top eight tacklers this season and eight of its top 11 are freshmen or sophomores. Four sophomore defenders (S **Pat Fields**, DL **Ronnie Perkins**, S **Delarrin Turner-Yell** and LB **DaShaun White**) have started every game. One redshirt freshman (DL **Jalen Redmond**) and one true freshman (OLB **David Ugwoegbu**) have started one.

► Seventeen true freshmen and 12 redshirt freshmen have played for Oklahoma this season.

► For the first time in the same season since 2006, Oklahoma held four consecutive opponents this year to 20 points or less (14 by South Dakota and UCLA, 16 by Texas Tech and 20 by Kansas). OU has allowed only seven first-quarter points this year (average of 1.2) and has permitted just 37 first-half points (average of 6.2).

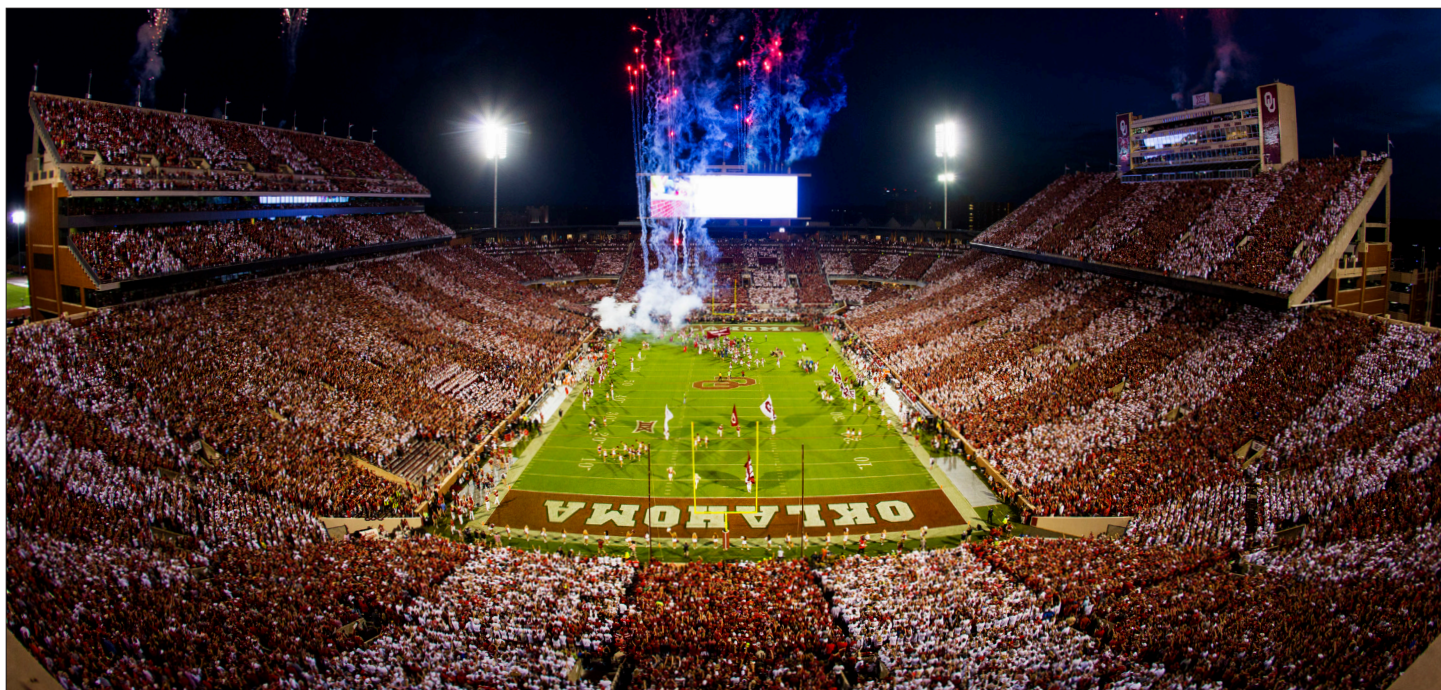
► Since the start of his sophomore season at Alabama, **Jalen Hurts** has posted a 7-to-1 touchdown-to-interception ratio (42 TDs to 6 INTs).

► Oklahoma has outscored its opponents 69-7 in the first quarter this season and 148-37 in the first half.

# GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and the second-largest collegiate video board.

## OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- ▶ Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.
- ▶ In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- ▶ The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- ▶ In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- ▶ Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and 83,489 (2016). With this year's widening of aisles and some seats, capacity has dropped to 80,126.
- ▶ In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

## RECENT RENOVATION

- ▶ The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- ▶ The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.
- ▶ The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons also benefit from two new clubs.
- ▶ Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- ▶ All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- ▶ The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.
- ▶ A significantly larger and more more detailed video board has replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The new board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

# LINCOLN RILEY

**THIRD SEASON AS HEAD COACH • 30-4 RECORD (.882) • 2018 CO-BIG 12 COACH OF THE YEAR OWNS OU RECORDS FOR WINS IN A DEBUT SEASON (12) AND IN FIRST TWO SEASONS (24) DIRECTED SOONERS TO BIG 12 TITLES AND COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF BERTHS IN 2017 AND '18 WINNER OF 2015 BROYLES AWARD AS NATION'S TOP ASSISTANT COACH**

**A**fter presiding over two of the most prolific offenses in OU history as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2015 and 2016, Lincoln Riley took over the program's head coaching reins on June 7, 2017, following the retirement of one of the most accomplished coaches of the last quarter century in Bob Stoops. OU's 22nd head coach, all Riley has done in his first two years at the helm is lead the Sooners to their 11th and 12th Big 12 titles and to a pair of College Football Playoff berths. He was also named the 2018 Co-Big 12 Coach of the Year.

The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, Riley became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. At 24-4, he also holds the OU record for most wins by a head coach in his first two seasons (Barry Switzer held the previous mark with 21 over the 1973 and '74 seasons). No one has won more games in his first two seasons as a college head coach since Penn's George Woodruff in 1892 and '93.

Originally from the 5,000-person West Texas town of Muleshoe, Riley, who continues to call Oklahoma's offensive plays as head coach, has made his name as perhaps the best up-and-coming star in college football by overseeing an explosive — and balanced — OU offense the last four seasons.

Since the start of the 2015 campaign, OU ranks first nationally in points per game (45.8; next most is 41.5), total offense (565.6; next most is 522.5), touchdowns from scrimmage (347; next most is 316), pass efficiency rating (191.1; next best is 165.5) and yards per pass attempt (10.8), and is second in completion percentage (69.3), fourth in passing offense (329.0) and 10th in rushing offense (236.6). With that kind of offensive production, it's no surprise the Sooners have posted a 52-8 (.867) record since his arrival (35-3 in Big 12 play). OU's overall mark since 2015 is fourth best nationally, with only Alabama (61-4), Clemson (61-4) and Ohio State (55-6) having better records.

Individual player honors and accomplishments have poured in under Riley, highlighted by quarterbacks Baker Mayfield and Kyler Murray becoming OU's sixth and seventh Heisman Trophy winners in 2017 and 2018. Mayfield also won the Maxwell, Davey O'Brien, Manning and Walter Camp Player of the Year Awards, was named AP Player of the Year and was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft. Murray also won the O'Brien and Manning Awards and was named AP Player of the Year. Receiver Dede Westbrook finished fourth in Heisman voting in 2016 and became OU's first winner of the Biletnikoff Award, while tight end Mark Andrews claimed the school's first Mackey Award in 2017. Seven Sooners have earned first-team All-America honors the last two years. Running back Joe Mixon set the OU single-season record with 2,331 all-purpose yards in 2016, while backfield mate Samaje Perine set the school career rushing record with 4,122 yards in only three seasons.

Oklahoma's newest head man joined the Sooners in January 2015 after he caught the eye of Stoops during a highly successful five-year stint as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Ruffin McNeill at East Carolina from 2010-14. With OU looking for a new play caller and wanting to get back to the up-tempo attack it helped make mainstream, Riley's numbers at ECU made him the perfect hire.

At East Carolina, Riley installed and directed a spread offensive scheme that made an immediate impact as the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual school offensive records in his five seasons with the program. His squads recorded the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four marks for total offense in a season.

He spent his final season with the Pirates serving in the role of assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach in 2014 as the team ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 ypg) and was fifth in total offense (533.0 ypg). With Riley calling the shots, the Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense.

Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down conversion percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone scoring efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

Among his notable pupils, Riley helped transform a pair of East Carolina wide receivers into the most productive pass catchers in FBS history. He guided walk-on Justin Hardy to 387 career catches, breaking the NCAA record previously held by OU's Ryan Broyles (349). Hardy's 4,541 career receiving yards rank third all-time in FBS annals as he flourished in Riley's offense, registering three 1,000-yard seasons at ECU that culminated with a 121-catch, 1,494-yard year as a senior in 2014. Riley also coached recent second-round NFL draft selection Zay Jones for the first two years of his career. Jones went on to break Hardy's record and is the NCAA's leader in career receptions (399) and receptions in a season (158 in 2016).

In addition to overseeing Mayfield's and Murray's record-setting careers, Riley also developed dynamic quarterbacks Dominique Davis and Shane Carden at ECU. Conference USA's 2010 Newcomer of the Year, Davis set ECU career marks for completions and TD passes despite playing just two seasons. Davis ranked second among FBS signal callers with 393 completions and 46 total touchdowns in 2010. He set an NCAA record with 36 straight completions in 2011.

Carden took over the job in 2012 and went on to break the majority of Davis' records, becoming the first 4,000-yard passer in program history and setting single-season standards for completion percentage (70.5 in 2013) and passing yards (4,736 in 2014). Carden earned Conference USA MVP honors in 2013 and was the American Conference's Offensive Player of the Year in 2014. He led all FBS passers with 392 completions in 2014.

Prior to East Carolina, Riley spent seven seasons on the staff at Texas Tech, where he was part of seven bowl teams and five bowl wins. During that span, Red Raiders quarterbacks won NCAA passing titles in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007. A walk-on quarterback at Tech during the spring and summer of 2003 who then became a student coach, Riley immersed himself in head coach Mike Leach's offense and worked his way into a full-time position as wide receivers coach in 2007. He served as inside receivers coach in 2008 and '09, and eventually called plays as interim offensive coordinator in the 2010 Alamo Bowl, where the Red Raiders racked up 579 yards in a 41-31 victory over Michigan State to cap the 2009 season.

Under Riley's guidance in 2007, wide receiver Michael Crabtree won the Biletnikoff Award after smashing Big 12 records and NCAA freshman standards with 134 receptions for 1,962 yards. Crabtree also accumulated 22 touchdown catches his first season. In fact, wide receiver Danny Amendola joined Crabtree that year as Texas Tech receivers who each amassed 100-catch, 1,000-yard efforts.

A 2006 Texas Tech graduate who earned a Bachelor of Science degree in exercise and sport sciences, Riley and his wife, Caitlin, have two daughters, Sloan and Stella.

**NORMAN** — After falling behind (7-0) for the first time all season, No. 6/4 Oklahoma rebounded with 42 consecutive points in a 45-20 win at Kansas. The victory was OU's 22nd straight in a true road game, good for the second-longest streak nationally in the post-World War II era (behind OU's 25-game streak from 1953-58).

Quarterback Jalen Hurts led the Sooners' offensive attack, completing 16 of 24 passes for 228 yards and two touchdowns while rushing 10 times for 56 yards and two scores.

Highlighted by a 61-yard fourth-quarter touchdown run, Rhamondre Stevenson paced the Sooners with 109 yards on only five rushes (21.8 average). Trey Sermon added 71 rushing yards and a score on 11 carries, and caught two passes for 20 yards and a TD.

Thirteen Sooners caught at least one pass (none with more than two), with CeeDee Lamb notching the other touchdown grab (a 10-yarder with 0:31 left in the second quarter). It marked Lamb's seventh straight game with a TD reception.

The OU defense registered three sacks and seven tackles for loss. Safety Delarrin Turner-Yell led the group with seven tackles, all solo, while adding a TFL.

**DALLAS** — CeeDee Lamb made a career-high 10 catches for 171 yards and a career-high-tying three touchdowns and No. 6/5 Oklahoma tied a school record with nine sacks in a 34-27 victory over No. 11/11 Texas in the Cotton Bowl. It marked OU's eighth win over the Longhorns in the last 11 meetings and 14th in the last 21.

The Sooners' defense also recorded 15 tackles for loss, their second most ever against Texas. Eight OU players registered a sack, 14 recorded at least half a tackle for loss and 23 players were credited with at least one tackle.

OU outgained Texas 511-310 in total yards (7.7 yards per play to 4.2) and extended its streak of scoring at least 34 points to 16 games, tied for the second longest nationally since at least 1980.

Jalen Hurts carried the ball 17 times for 131 yards (the most ever rushing yards by an OU quarterback vs. Texas and a Cotton Bowl Stadium collegiate record by a QB) and a 3-yard fourth-quarter touchdown. He was 16 for 28 through the air for 235 yards, three TDs and an interception.

Lamb's touchdowns covered 1 yard (fourth-down play in first quarter), 51 yards (third quarter) and 27 yards (fourth quarter). He made 10 of OU's 16 receptions on the day and moved into sole possession of third place on OU's career receiving TDs list with 28.

Kennedy Brooks joined Hurts by surpassing the 100-yard rushing mark with 105 yards on 10 carries (10.5 average).

Safety Delarrin Turner-Yell recorded 10 tackles, good for game and career highs, and a tackle for loss. Linebacker Kenneth Murray made five solo tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack while defensive lineman Neville Gallimore registered a team-high two sacks.
