OPENING KICK

► Oklahoma (2-2, 1-2) goes for its seventh straight win over TCU (1-2, 1-2) when it travels to face the Horned Frogs on Saturday at 11 a.m. CT inside Amon G. Carter Stadium in Fort Worth. The game will be televised by ABC with **Joe Tessitore**, **Greg McElroy** and **Holly Rowe** announcing.

► The Sooners have won 24 of their last 26 true road games and are 13-2 in such contests under fourth-year head coach **Lincoln Riley**.

► Dating back to the start of the 2012 season, Oklahoma is 41-8 (.837) in regular season games away from home. OU has scored at least 30 points in 42 of those 49 contests.

► Oklahoma has won 20 of its last 21 games immediately following its regular season matchup vs. Texas. The lone loss during the stretch — to Kansas State in Norman in 2014 — was by one point (31-30).

► OU has scored at least 28 points in a school-record 56 consecutive games. The next longest streak nationally since at least 1980 is 31 by UCF (2017-19). The next longest active streak is 18 games by SMU.

► Oklahoma is 42-6 (.875) in regular season Big 12 play since the start of the 2015 season, which coincides with Riley's arrival at OU as offensive coordinator. Oklahoma State ranks second during that period (30-17; .638) while West Virginia ranks third (27-21; .563), TCU fourth (26-22; .542) and Texas fifth (25-23; .521).

► The Sooners have ranked in the top seven nationally in total offense each of Riley's five years calling plays and in the top three each of the last four seasons (7th in 2015 [530.2 ypg]; 2nd in 2016 [554.8]; 1st in 2017 [579.6]; 1st in 2018 [570.3]; and 3rd in 2019 [537.6]). Through four games this season, OU leads the Big 12 and ranks 10th in total offense (502.0).

► OU is in its third straight week of being unranked in the AP Top 25 after being ranked in every poll since Sept. 25, 2016. The Sooners had appeared in 64 straight AP polls prior to the Sept. 9 poll, which was the third longest streak nationally (Alabama has a streak of 203 consecutive appearances and Clemson has a streak of 92) and the sixth longest in program history.

► Since the start of the 1999 season (**Bob Stoops'** first as head coach), OU is 20-7 (.741) when not ranked in the AP poll.

► The Sooners beat TCU 41-17 in the 2017 Big 12 Championship game in Arlington, Texas. It was the first Big 12 title contest since 2010.

KEY STORYLINES

► Oklahoma is 8-1 against TCU since the Horned Frogs joined the Big 12 Conference prior to the 2012 season. The Sooners' lone loss was a 37-33 decision in 2014 in Fort Worth. Each of the first five meetings after TCU joined the



Junior running back T.J. Pledger earned Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week honors after rushing for career highs of 131 yards and two touchdowns in the Sooners' 53-45 win over Texas. Included were carries of 26 and 25 yards (OU's longest rush of the season entering the game was 23 yards).

RECENT GROUND DOMINANCE VS. TCU

Oklahoma has rushed for at least 200 yards in each of its last six games against TCU (all wins) and has averaged 283.3 in those contests. The Sooners posted rushing totals of 333 yards in 2015, 260 in 2016, 200 and 218 in 2017, 323 in 2018 and 366 last season. In contrast, OU has held TCU to an average of 119.2 rushing yards in those games (high of 161 in 2015).

league were decided by seven or fewer points, but OU has won the last four — all since **Lincoln Riley** became head coach — by an average of 18 points.

► The Sooners have statistically dominated each of their last six matchups against TCU, all wins. Over those six contests, Oklahoma has outgained the Horned Frogs 3,111 yards to 2,124 (+164.5 ypg) and owns a 150-97 advantage in first downs (56-23 over the last two years). It has gained over 500 yards in five of the six meetings and had 461 in the other. OU has been particularly dominant in the run game, outgaining TCU 1,700 yards to 715 (+164.2 ypg). It has registered at least 200 rushing yards in all six contests (TCU's high is 161) and has surpassed 300 yards on three occasions (366 last year, 323 in 2018 and 333 in 2015).

► Quarterback **Spencer Rattler** ranks first nationally among freshmen in total offense (313.3 ypg), passing offense (296.5 ypg) and passing touchdowns (13). He has thrown for at least two touchdowns in all four contests, at least three TDs in three games and for four TDs in the Missouri State and Kansas State outings.

► Oklahoma has won the time-of-possession battle in all four games this season and ranks second nationally with its 34:44 average (Charlotte is at 34:46). In Riley's first three seasons as head coach, OU had never ranked better than 23rd in the country in the statistic (31:50 in 2017). Since the Sooners began tracking time of possession in 1992, only one OU squad has recorded a figure above 33:00 minutes per game (33:11 in 2004).

► Each of TCU's three games and Oklahoma's last three have been one-possession outcomes. The Horned Frogs' three contests have been decided by an average of 4.0 points, while the Sooners' last three games have been decided by an average of 6.0 points (3.3 not including overtime).

► This year's Oklahoma squad is looking to become the fifth in program history to win a conference title with two league losses. The four occasions it happened were in 1976 (5-2 in Big Eight; shared with Colorado and Oklahoma State) and 2002, 2007 and 2010 (6-2 in Big 12; won Big 12 Championship games). No OU team has ever won a conference title after a 0-2 league start and no Sooners squad has ever won a conference championship with three league losses.

ROAD WARRIORS

► Oklahoma has won 24 of its last 26 true road games, with the only losses during that stretch coming last year at Kansas State (48-41) and two games ago at Iowa State (37-30).

► Last year's defeat at K-State snapped OU's 22-game true road winning streak (the Sooners hadn't lost since Oct 4, 2014, at TCU), which was the second longest such streak nationally since at least the end of World War II.

► During the 22-game streak, OU outscored opponents 1,076-626 (49-28 average) and outgained them 12,829 yards to 9,208 (583-419 average).

► Oklahoma has outgained its opponent in 23 of its last 26 true road games.

► OU has scored at least 30 points in each of its last 31 true road games and at least 41 points in 21 of them.

► The Sooners are 7-1 all-time at TCU.

RECAPPING THE WIN OVER TEXAS

► Oklahoma held a 31-17 lead and limited Texas to 238 offensive yards over the game's first 55 1/2 minutes but needed four overtimes to win the highest-scoring Red River Showdown matchup in history, 53-45, on Oct. 10 in Dallas. Quarterback **Spencer Rattler** connected with receiver **Drake Stoops** on a 25-yard touchdown pass in the fourth overtime and then cornerback **Tre Brown** registered a game-ending interception in the end zone.

► The game was just the third involving at least one Big 12 team that went to four overtimes, and the first since 2011. It was the longest contest in OU history in terms of overtimes and duration (4:43).

► **Lincoln Riley** improved to 4-1 against Texas, joining **Bob Stoops** as the only OU head coaches to win at least four of their first five games versus the Longhorns (Stoops also started 4-1 from 1999-03).

► Junior running back **T.J. Pledger** registered career highs of 22 rushes, 131 rushing yards and two rushing TDs to earn Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week honors. He also caught two passes for 24 yards. Redshirt freshman **Marcus Major** ran 12 times for 43 yards and recorded his first career touchdown, a 7-yard rush in the second quarter.

► OU had four rushes of at least 20 yards in the game, including a season-long 26-yarder by Pledger. Entering the game, the Sooners had only two rushes of at least 20 yards on the season.

► Rattler became just the third OU freshman quarterback starter to beat Texas, joining **Justin Fuente** in 1996 and **Sam Bradford** in 2007. He completed 23 of 35 passes for 209 yards and three touchdowns (one interception) while rushing 14 times for 51 yards and a 1-yard score.

► Freshman **Marvin Mims** (30-yarder in first quarter) and sophomore **Austin Stogner** (11-yarder in first overtime) registered OU's other touchdown catches. Sophomore **Theo Wease** caught a team-high eight passes for 56 yards. He entered the game with seven receptions this season and 15 for his career. He also caught a two-point conversion pass in the last overtime for the game's final points.

► Texas entered the game allowing 0.7 sacks and 3.7 tackles for loss per game, but OU registered six and 10 on the day. Redshirt sophomore **Nik Bonitto** paced the team with 2.0 sacks.

► The Sooners recorded a season-high three takeaways on the day, their most since the second game of the 2019 season vs. South Dakota (also two interceptions and a fumble recovery). Sophomore defensive back **Woodi Washington** logged his first career interception with 5:02 left in the fourth quarter and redshirt junior defensive end **Isaiah Thomas** recovered a fumble on Texas' second play of the game.

► For the first time since Stoops' debut game as OU head coach (vs. Indiana State in 1999), the Sooners blocked a punt (**David Ugwoegbu** in second quarter) and a field goal (**Perrier Winfrey** in third overtime).

LAST YEAR VS. TCU

► No. 9/8/7 Oklahoma outgained TCU by 307 yards (511-204), had 30 first downs to the Horned Frogs' 11 and held a 39:31-20:29 advantage in time of possession, but after racing to a 21-0 second-quarter lead had to hang on for a 28-24 home win on Nov. 23, 2019, that was the 400th in Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium history. OU clinched a berth in the Big 12 Championship with the victory.

► After OU failed to convert on fourth down while holding a four-point lead late in the fourth quarter, sophomore **Brendan Radley-Hiles** intercepted a TCU pass at the OU 32-yard line on a fourth-and-6 play with 1:41 to go to help the Sooners escape with the win. It was OU's second game-sealing pick in as many weeks.

► TCU's 45 plays, 204 total yards, 65 passing yards, 4.53 yards per play, one third-down conversion (on nine tries) and 11 first downs all represented OU opponent season lows.

► Oklahoma ran 85 plays to TCU's 45. The Horned Frogs' 45 snaps were the fewest by an OU opponent since Colorado ran 44 plays in a 24-3 Sooners win in 2006.

► OU's 366 rushing yards were its most since it racked up 405 in 2015 against Texas Tech. Its 64 rushing attempts were its most since 2016 vs. West Virginia (also 64).

► **Jalen Hurts** threw for two touchdown passes and ran for 173 yards and two more scores, while **Kennedy Brooks** finished with 149 rushing yards. **Charleston Rambo** caught a career-high six passes for 77 yards and **CeeDee Lamb** (5 yards) and **Brayden Willis** (20 yards) reeled in OU's touchdown passes.

► TCU registered three takeaways on the night to OU's one. Included was a 98-yard interception return for a touchdown by **Vernon Scott** early in the fourth quarter that accounted for the game's final points.

YEAR TWO OF "SPEED D"

► Hired in January 2019, Oklahoma defensive coordinator and safeties coach **Alex Grinch**, who was a 2019 Broyles Award semifinalist, has presided over a significant turnaround on the defensive side of the ball.

► So far this season, Oklahoma ranks in the top 25 nationally in a bevy of categories. It is 11th in opponent third down conversion percentage (28.6), 12th in rushing defense (96.5 ypg), 17th in opponent pass completion percentage (56.8), 18th in sacks per game (3.0), 20th in total defense (342.5 ypg) and 24th in tackles for loss per game (7.0).

► The Sooners made huge strides in Grinch's first season last year, ranking 17th nationally in opponent third-down conversion percentage (32.2; in 2018 [before Grinch's arrival] they ranked 119th at 46.4), 17th in tackles for loss per game (7.4; in 2018 ranked 79th at 5.6), 32nd in rushing defense (134.1 ypg; in 2018 ranked 59th at 159.8), 34th in sacks per game (2.6; in 2018 ranked 49th at 2.1), 38th in total defense (356.4 ypg; in 2018 ranked 114th at 453.8), 58th in passing defense (222.4 ypg; in 2018 ranked 130th at 294.0) and 64th in scoring defense (27.3 ppg; in 2018 ranked 101st at 33.3).

► In 2019 Big 12 play, OU led the league in total defense (330.6 ypg) and passing defense (190.4 ypg), and ranked second in rushing defense (140.1 ypg), pass defense efficiency (125.7 rating) and third- and fourth-down conversion percentage (33.3 each).

► The Sooners allowed more than 6.0 yards per play just twice in their 14 games last season. In the 41 games from 2016-18, OU allowed at least 6.0 yards per play 20 times.

► Seven of OU's top 10 tacklers last season were freshmen or sophomores. Three then-sophomore defenders (**S Pat Fields**, **S Delarrin Turner-Yell** and LB **DaShaun White**) started every game, and two others (DE **Ronnie Perkins** and DB **Brendan Radley-Hiles**) each started 13.

► In 18 games under **Grinch**, the Sooners have allowed opponents to score on their opening drive of a game just three times (Oklahoma State and LSU touchdowns last season; Iowa State field goal this year). Fifteen of the opponent opening drives have lasted five plays or less and 11 have been three or less.

SNAKE IN THE GRASS

► Redshirt freshman **Spencer Rattler**, the consensus No. 1 quarterback in the 2019 recruiting class, threw for a state-record 11,083 yards (116 passing touchdowns) and ran for over 1,000 yards (14 TDs) in his career at Pinnacle High School in Phoenix, Ariz. The 2018 Elite 11 MVP was the No. 9 overall national recruit by 247Sports, No. 13 by Rivals and No. 29 by ESPN.

► Rattler appeared in three Oklahoma games last season, completing 7 of 11 passes for 81 yards and a touchdown without an interception. He also ran three times for 23 yards.

► Rattler is OU's fourth starting QB in four seasons. **Baker Mayfield** and **Kyler Murray** won the Heisman Trophy in 2017 and 2018, respectively, while **Jalen Hurts** was the 2019 Heisman runner-up.

► So far this season, Rattler is tied for fifth nationally in touchdown passes (13) and ranks sixth in completion percentage (71.3), sixth in passing efficiency rating (174.1), 12th in total offense (313.3 ypg), 14th in passing offense (296.5 ypg) and 15th in yards per pass attempt (9.2).

► Rattler has thrown for at least two touchdown passes in all four games this season, has thrown for at least three in three contests and for four in each of the Missouri State and Kansas State outings.

► In his starting debut in the season opener against Missouri State, Rattler completed 14 of 17 passes for 290 yards and four touchdowns (no interceptions) in only one half of work. He followed with 30-for-41 effort for 387 yards and four more TDs (three interceptions) against Kansas State, and a 25-for-36 performance for 300 yards and two TDs (one interception) at Iowa State. Versus Texas, he was 23 for 35 for 209 yards and three scores (one interception).

► In the first half of play, Rattler has completed 78.8% of his passes (52 of 66) for 746 yards and nine TDs.

► Rattler has 67 net rushing yards on the season and has scored a TD on the ground in each of the last two games.

YOUNG RUNNING BACKS ROOM

► Oklahoma, which has produced a Big 12-high six individual 1,000-yard-rushing seasons by running backs over the past five years (the next most in the league during that span is three) and has led the Big 12 in rushing offense in all three of **Lincoln Riley's** campaigns as head coach, is dividing its carries in 2020 among a largely inexperienced group.

► OU returned just 20.4% of its rushing yards and only 18.4% of its rushing touchdowns from last season.

► Senior **Rhamondre Stevenson** was OU's leading returning rusher entering the season but has yet to play in 2020. He ran 64 times for 515 yards and six TDs in his debut season last year, and his 8.0 yards per rush led the nation among players with at least 50 carries.

► Junior **T.J. Pledger** carried 10 times for 65 yards and a score last season. He missed this year's opener against Missouri State before starting against Kansas State (41 yards on 13 carries), Iowa State (47 yards on 11 carries) and Texas (career highs of 131 yards, two TDs and 22 carries).

► Redshirt freshman **Marcus Major** ran 10 times for 28 yards in his three contests in 2019. He rushed 11 times for 31 yards against Missouri State this season and didn't carry the ball again until last game against Texas (43 yards and his first career TD on 12 rushes).

► Freshman **Seth McGowan** was a consensus four-star recruit who was rated as the nation's No. 13 running back by Rivals and No. 16 by 247Sports and ESPN after rushing for more than 3,700 yards and 45 touchdowns at Mesquite Poteet High School in Texas. He led OU in rushing in its first three games this season (61 and a TD vs. Missouri State, 73 and a TD vs. Kansas State and 47 at Iowa State [tied with Pledger]) before missing the Texas outing.

IMPRESSIVE FOOT NOTE

► During **Lincoln Riley's** three-plus-year head coaching career, Oklahoma ranks second nationally with its 85.5% success rate on field goal attempts (59 for 69). The Sooners trail only Florida, which has converted 91.9% of its tries (57 for 62) since the start of the 2017 season. TCU is the next best Big 12 school in the category during the span (80.3%; 57 of 71).

► During the same period, the Sooners rank third nationally in PAT conversion percentage among teams with at least 150 attempts, converting 264 of 265 tries (99.6%). Only Georgia (189 for 189) and Utah State (170 for 170) have higher success rates.

"AIR RAID" A MISNOMER

► Fans and media have often referred to Oklahoma's offense under **Lincoln Riley** as the "Air Raid." The label is not exactly accurate, however, as the Sooners have rushed more than they've thrown in each of the five years since Riley arrived in Norman, and that's counting plays in which the quarterback was sacked as pass plays (officially they are recorded as rushes). OU's rushing play percentage was 52.6 in 2015, 57.7 in 2016, 53.1 in 2017, 54.7 in 2018 and 57.3 last season. This season has been different so far, with the Sooners running 47.0 percent of the time.

HUMPHREY, BRKIC NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

► Redshirt junior center **Creed Humphrey** and redshirt sophomore kicker **Gabe Brkic** each landed multiple preseason All-America honors. Humphrey earned preseason first-team All-America honors from the Associated Press, Sporting News and the Walter Camp Foundation. The 2019 consensus second-team All-American and first-team All-Big 12 pick was the Big 12 Co-Offensive Lineman of the Year and a finalist for the Rimington Trophy for the nation's top center after not allowing a sack in his 864 plays. He has made 29 career starts and anchored the middle of OU's O-line unit that won the Joe Moore Award in 2018 and was a semifinalist last season.

RILEY AMONG LEGENDS

OU is the only program nationally that can boast four coaches who each registered at least 100 career wins (Bennie Owen, 122; Bud Wilkinson, 145; Barry Switzer, 157; Bob Stoops, 190). With 38 wins, current head coach Lincoln Riley is more than a third of the way to 100 victories after just 46 games.

► Brkic, the only placekicker nationally who made all of his field goal and extra point tries in 2019 (69 for 69 combined), was a 2020 preseason first-team All-American by Sporting News and a second-team selection by the AP. A 2019 Lou Groza Award semifinalist and a second-team All-Big 12 pick, Brkic went 17 for 17 on field goal attempts and 52 for 52 on PATs to earn freshman All-America honors from the FWAA and The Athletic, and first-team All-America honors from CBS Sports. His 103 kicking points were the most by an FBS player without a miss since at least 1996. He is 4 for 6 on field goals this year and 14 for 14 on PATs.

NO. 1 ON BOTH SIDES OF THE BALL

► The 2019 season marked the first in the 24-year history of the Big 12 the Sooners led the conference in both total offense (526.9 ypg; next most was 462.8) and total defense (330.6 ypg; next fewest was 357.6) in league play. The only other team to do it was co-national champion Nebraska in 1997.

RILEY'S FAST START

► The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, **Lincoln Riley** became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. At 24-4 and 36-6, he also holds the OU record for most wins by a head coach in his first two and first three seasons (**Barry Switzer** held the records of 21 and 32). No one in the last 125 years won more games in their first three seasons as a college head coach (Penn's George Woodruff was the last from 1892 to '94).

► Riley is one of just four FBS head coach since at least 1996 to win three conference titles in his first three years as a head coach. Marshall's Bob Pruett [1997-99], Miami's Larry Coker [2001-03] and Oregon's Chip Kelly [2009-11] also accomplished the feat.

OFFENSE HAS ROLLED UNDER RILEY

► Oklahoma owns the nation's most productive offense since the start of the 2015 season, which was **Lincoln Riley's** first year as OU's offensive coordinator. Riley still calls plays as head coach.

► Since the start of the 2015 campaign, OU ranks first nationally in scoring (44.5 ppg; next most is 41.4), total offense (551.9; next most is 512.6), yards per play (7.7; next most is 6.9), touchdowns from scrimmage (403), pass efficiency rating (187.8; next best is 170.6) and yards per pass attempt (10.6), second in completion percentage (69.4), third in passing offense (323.9) and 10th in rushing offense (228.0).

► In 72 games since the start of the 2015 season, OU has registered at least 500 yards of total offense 51 times (next most is 42), including in 41 of the last 55 outings, topped the 600-yard mark on 25 occasions and gone over 700 yards seven times. Similarly, OU has scored at least 30 points in 64 of 72 games since Riley's arrival, at least 40 points 46 times, at least 50 points 26 times and at least 60 points eight times.

► The Sooners have registered at least 700 yards of offense 13 times in their history, and seven of those occasions have come since the start of the 2015 season: 854 at Texas Tech in 2016, 785 at Oklahoma State in 2017, 773 vs. Tulsa in 2015, 733 vs. South Dakota in 2019, 710 at Kansas in 2015, 702 vs. Kansas State in 2018 and 702 vs. Oklahoma State in 2018.

HEISMAN U

► Quarterbacks **Baker Mayfield** and **Kyler Murray** became Oklahoma's sixth and seventh Heisman Trophy winners in 2017 and '18, respectively, moving the Sooners into a tie with Notre Dame and Ohio State for the most Heisman winners. Other OU winners were QB **Sam Bradford** in 2008, QB **Jason White** in 2003, RB **Billy Sims** in 1978, RB **Steve Owens** in 1969 and RB **Billy Vessels** in 1952.

► Quarterback **Jalen Hurts** was the 2019 Heisman Trophy runner-up and became Oklahoma's 11th Heisman finalist, most of any school (finalists were first named in 1982). Miami (Fla.) ranks second with nine finalists, Alabama ranks third with eight and Florida ranks fourth with seven.

► Oklahoma boasts 10 Heisman finalists in the last 20 years (since 2000), which is four more than the program with the next most during that span (Alabama has six).

► OU is the first program to ever produce five Heisman finalists in a four-year period (Hurts, Murray in 2018 [won], Mayfield in 2017 [won] and Mayfield [finished third] and receiver **Dede Westbrook** [finished fourth] in 2016). With Mayfield's and Murray's wins, Oklahoma is the only program to produce different quarterback winners in consecutive seasons.

► OU is tied for the most Heisman runners-up, as well (six). OU's second-place Heisman finishers were **Kurt Burris** (1954), **Greg Pruitt** (1972), **Sims** (1979), **Josh Heupel** (2000), **Adrian Peterson** (2004) and Hurts (2019).

► Oklahoma has produced four Heisman Trophy winners in the last 17 years. Only three other programs have produced four winners ever.

► An Oklahoma quarterback has finished in the top four of Heisman voting in each of **Lincoln Riley's** five years with the Sooners (Mayfield fourth in 2015, third in 2016 and first in 2017; Murray first in 2018; Hurts second in 2019).

RILEY SECURES ANOTHER TOP-10 RECRUITING CLASS

OU's 23-member 2020 recruiting class ranked No. 10 nationally by ESPN, giving the Sooners a fourth consecutive top-10 group. Eighteen signees ranked at least a four-star prospect on a five-star scale by 247Sports, ESPN or Rivals, while the other five earned consensus three-star designation.

The class is comprised of 12 offensive players and 11 defensive players. Ten signees enrolled at OU for the spring semester: defensive linemen **Josh Ellison** and **Perrion Winfrey** (both junior college products), cornerback **D.J. Graham**, safety **Bryson Washington**, linebacker **Shane Whitter**, tight end/H-back **Mikey Henderson**, running back **Seth McGowan**, wide receiver **Marvin Mims** and offensive linemen **Noah Nelson** and **Andrew Raym**.

OU TRIO ON HALL OF FAME BALLOT

The National Football Foundation (NFF) and College Hall of Fame announced the 2021 ballot for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame in June and former Oklahoma standouts **Bob Stoops**, **Josh Heupel** and **Roy Williams** earned spots among the seven coaches and 78 players listed from the Football Bowl Subdivision. The announcement of the class will be made in early 2021 and the class will be officially inducted on Dec. 7, 2021, in New York City.

OU's leader in all-time wins, Stoops coached the Sooners to a 190-48 (.798) record from 1999-2016 and captured 10 Big 12 championships and the 2000 national title.

Heupel was the quarterback on OU's 2000 national championship team. He was a consensus All-American and Heisman Trophy runner-up that season.

Safety Roy Williams also starred on the 2000 squad. In 2001 he won the Nagurski Award (nation's best defensive player) and Thorpe Award (best defensive back), the same year he was a unanimous All-American.

FOUR NFL DRAFTEES; TWO IN FIRST ROUND

► Oklahoma had four players picked in the 2020 NFL Draft, and for the second straight year produced a pair of first-round selections. Wide receiver **CeeDee Lamb** (17th overall pick; Dallas) was the first Big 12 player selected, while linebacker **Kenneth Murray** (No. 23 overall pick; Los Angeles Chargers) was the first Big 12 defensive player chosen. The duo was joined in the draft by quarterback **Jalen Hurts** (second round; Philadelphia) and defensive lineman **Neville Gallimore** (third round; Dallas). Since 2000, 99 Sooners have been selected, which is 29 more than the next-closest Big 12 program during that span (Texas, 70) and 48 more than the second closest (TCU, 51).

► Undrafted free agent cornerback **Parnell Motley**, who finished his OU career ranked fifth with 33 pass breakups, made the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' 53-man roster in September and is now with the San Francisco 49ers.

OKLAHOMA'S BIG 12 FIVE-PEAT

► OU's 2019 Big 12 championship marked the program's fifth straight league crown. The last time it won at least five consecutive conference titles was 1972-80 under head coaches **Chuck Fairbanks** (1972) and **Barry Switzer**.

► OU is the only program to win at least three straight Big 12 titles, and it has done so twice (also from 2006-08). Baylor (2013-14) is the only other program to win two Big 12 championships in a row.

► OU's and Clemson's current streaks of five straight outright league championships are the longest among Power Five programs since Alabama won five in a row from 1971 to '75. The last current Power Five program to win six straight outright conference titles is Oklahoma (12 in a row from 1948 to '59).

BIG 12'S BELL COW

► Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed 13 league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each). All 13 of the Sooners' titles have come since the start of the 2000 campaign, with no other program during that span winning more than two. OU is 141-31 (.820) in regular season Big 12 play since the start of the 2000 season. That's 25 more wins than the program with the next most victories during that period (Texas; 116-56) and 45 more than the program with the third most (Oklahoma State; 96-75).

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (666) than any other program (next most is 624 by Alabama).

► Oklahoma is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 36,549 points (in 1,292 games).

► OU leads all FBS programs with 49 all-time conference championships. The rest of the top five includes Nebraska (46), Michigan (42), Ohio State (38) and USC (37). The Sooners' 13 league titles since 2000 are the most among Power Five programs (Ohio State ranks second with 10).

► No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 40 (including a nation-leading 17 since 2000). In addition, OU's 26 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.

► Since former head coach **Bob Stoops** arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads all Power Five conference programs in wins (228) and points scored (10,946).

► Only Alabama (122) and Ohio State (105) have been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll more weeks than Oklahoma (101).

► The Sooners have made 421 all-time appearances in the AP poll's top five, more than any other program (Alabama is next with 418 and Ohio State third with 390). That means OU has been in the top five in 36 percent of all AP polls (1,174 total polls), which started in 1936. OU has made 26 AP top-5 appearances since the start of 2017.

► Only Ohio State (644) has more all-time top-10 AP poll appearances than OU (607).

► Only Alabama (10) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more all-time AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

EXTRA POINTS

► Over its two meetings against TCU the last two seasons, OU outgained the Horned Frogs by 568 yards (1,047-479) and posted a 56-23 advantage in first downs.

► The last time Oklahoma started a season 1-2 was 2016. That team was victorious in its final nine games to finish 10-2, won Big 12 and Sugar Bowl titles and earned a final No. 5 AP ranking. It was **Bob Stoops'** final year at the Sooners' helm.

► Sooners freshman **Marvin Mims** has a team-high four touchdown catches and registered three of those over the first two contests. He became the program's first player since redshirt freshman receiver **Ryan Broyles** in 2008 to register three TD receptions in his first two career games (Broyles is OU's career records holder for receptions, receiving yards and receiving TDs). Mims is the Texas high school record holder for receiving yards in a career (5,485) and in a season (2,629 on 117 receptions and 32 touchdowns last year). He has 15 catches for 196 yards this season and ranks second nationally with his 16.8 yards per punt return (101 yards on six returns).

► Oklahoma has absolutely dominated the first quarter this season, outscoring Missouri State (31-0), Kansas State (7-0), Iowa State (10-3) and Texas (10-0) by a combined 58-3 margin. The Sooners have limited the three opponents to 186 total yards on 53 plays (3.5 average) in the opening 15 minutes. OU holds a 96-37 first-half scoring advantage and has given up just 509 yards on 110 plays (4.6 average) in the opening half of play.

► Every Oklahoma freshman class since 1999 has won at least two Big 12 championships. Baylor's 2011, 2012 and 2013 freshman classes are the only other ones that have won two Big 12 titles (BU won league crowns in 2013 and '14).

► OU is the only program that has produced at least four NFL Draft picks each of the last 13 years.

OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and the second-largest collegiate video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.
- In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and 83,489 (2016). With this year's widening of aisles and some seats, capacity has dropped to 80,126.
- In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

- The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.
- The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons also benefit from two new clubs.
- Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.
- A significantly larger and more more detailed video board has replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The new board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

**FOURTH SEASON AS HEAD COACH • 38-8 RECORD (.826) • 2018 CO-BIG 12 COACH OF THE YEAR
OWNS OU RECORDS FOR WINS IN DEBUT SEASON (12), FIRST TWO (24) & THREE (36) SEASONS
DIRECTED SOONERS TO BIG 12 TITLES AND COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF BERTHS IN 2017, '18 & '19
WINNER OF 2015 BROYLES AWARD AS NATION'S TOP ASSISTANT COACH**

After presiding over two of the most prolific offenses in OU history as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2015 and 2016, Lincoln Riley took over the program's head coaching reins on June 7, 2017, following the retirement of one of the most accomplished coaches of the last quarter century in Bob Stoops. OU's 22nd head coach, all Riley has done in his first three years at the helm is lead the Sooners to their 11th, 12th and 13th Big 12 titles and to three College Football Playoff berths. He was also named the 2018 Co-Big 12 Coach of the Year.

The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, Riley became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. At 24-4 and 36-6, he also holds the OU record for most wins by a head coach in his first two and first three seasons (Barry Switzer held the records of 21 and 32). No one has won more games in their first three seasons as a college head coach since Penn's George Woodruff from 1892 to '94.

Originally from the 5,000-person West Texas town of Muleshoe, Riley, who continues to call Oklahoma's offensive plays as head coach, has made his name as perhaps the best up-and-coming star in college football by overseeing an explosive — and balanced — OU offense the last five seasons.

Since the start of the 2015 campaign, OU ranks first nationally in scoring (44.5 ppg; next most is 41.4), total offense (551.9; next most is 512.6), yards per play (7.8), touchdowns from scrimmage (403), pass efficiency rating (187.8; next best is 170.6) and yards per pass attempt (10.6), second in completion percentage (69.4), third in passing offense (323.9) and 10th in rushing offense (228.0). With that kind of offensive production, it's no surprise the Sooners have posted a 60-12 (.833) record since his arrival (41-7 in Big 12 play). OU's overall mark since 2015 is fourth best nationally, with only Clemson (74-5), Alabama (70-6) and Ohio State (61-7) owning better records.

Individual player honors and accomplishments have poured in under Riley, highlighted by quarterbacks Baker Mayfield and Kyler Murray becoming OU's sixth and seventh Heisman Trophy winners in 2017 and 2018. QB Jalen Hurts was the 2019 Heisman runner-up. Mayfield also won the Maxwell, Davey O'Brien, Manning and Walter Camp Player of the Year Awards, was named AP Player of the Year and was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft. Murray also won the O'Brien and Manning Awards, was named AP Player of the Year and was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2019 NFL Draft. Receiver Dede Westbrook finished fourth in Heisman voting in 2016 and became OU's first winner of the Biletnikoff Award, while tight end Mark Andrews claimed the school's first Mackey Award in 2017. Eight Sooners have earned first-team All-America honors the last three years. Running back Joe Mixon set the OU single-season record with 2,331 all-purpose yards in 2016, while backfield mate Samaje Perine set the school career rushing record with 4,122 yards in only three seasons.

Oklahoma's newest head man joined the Sooners in January 2015 after he caught the eye of Stoops during a highly successful five-year stint as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Ruffin McNeill at East Carolina from 2010-14. With OU looking for a new play caller and wanting to get back to the up-tempo attack it helped make mainstream, Riley's numbers at ECU made him the perfect hire.

At East Carolina, Riley installed and directed a spread offense scheme that made an immediate impact as the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual school offensive records in his five seasons with the program. His squads recorded the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four marks for total offense in a season.

He spent his final season with the Pirates serving in the role of assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach in 2014 as the team ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 ypg) and was fifth in total offense (533.0 ypg). With Riley calling the shots, the Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense.

Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down conversion percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone scoring efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

Among his notable pupils, Riley helped transform a pair of East Carolina wide receivers into the most productive pass catchers in FBS history. He guided walk-on Justin Hardy to 387 career catches, breaking the NCAA record previously held by OU's Ryan Broyles (349). Hardy's 4,541 career receiving yards rank third all-time in FBS annals as he flourished in Riley's offense, registering three 1,000-yard seasons at ECU that culminated with a 121-catch, 1,494-yard year as a senior in 2014. Riley also coached recent second-round NFL draft selection Zay Jones for the first two years of his career. Jones went on to break Hardy's record and is the NCAA's leader in career receptions (399) and receptions in a season (158 in 2016).

In addition to overseeing Mayfield's and Murray's record-setting careers, Riley also developed dynamic quarterbacks Dominique Davis and Shane Carden at ECU. Conference USA's 2010 Newcomer of the Year, Davis set ECU career marks for completions and TD passes despite playing just two seasons. Davis ranked second among FBS signal callers with 393 completions and 46 total touchdowns in 2010. He set an NCAA record with 36 straight completions in 2011.

Carden took over the job in 2012 and went on to break the majority of Davis' records, becoming the first 4,000-yard passer in program history and setting single-season standards for completion percentage (70.5 in 2013) and passing yards (4,736 in 2014). Carden earned Conference USA MVP honors in 2013 and was the American Conference's Offensive Player of the Year in 2014. He led all FBS passers with 392 completions in 2014.

Prior to East Carolina, Riley spent seven seasons on the staff at Texas Tech, where he was part of seven bowl teams and five bowl wins. During that span, Red Raiders quarterbacks won NCAA passing titles in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007. A walk-on quarterback at Tech during the spring and summer of 2003 who then became a student coach, Riley immersed himself in head coach Mike Leach's offense and worked his way into a full-time position as wide receivers coach in 2007. He served as inside receivers coach in 2008 and '09, and eventually called plays as interim offensive coordinator in the 2010 Alamo Bowl, where the Red Raiders racked up 579 yards in a 41-31 victory over Michigan State to cap the 2009 season.

Under Riley's guidance in 2007, wide receiver Michael Crabtree won the Biletnikoff Award after smashing Big 12 records and NCAA freshman standards with 134 receptions for 1,962 yards. Crabtree also accumulated 22 touchdown catches his first season. In fact, wide receiver Danny Amendola joined Crabtree that year as Texas Tech receivers who each amassed 100-catch, 1,000-yard efforts.

A 2006 Texas Tech graduate who earned a Bachelor of Science degree in exercise and sport sciences, Riley and his wife, Caitlin, have two daughters, Sloan and Stella.

NORMAN — Oklahoma outgained FCS foe Missouri State by 473 yards (608-135) and posted its first shutout since 2015 in a 48-0 season-opening win.

Redshirt freshman quarterback Spencer Rattler was stellar in his first career start, completing 14 of 17 passes for 290 yards and four touchdowns without an interception in just one half of work. He helped stake the Sooners to a 31-0 first-quarter lead and to a 41-0 halftime advantage, and was named Big 12 Rookie of the Week.

Rattler's 303.3 passing efficiency rating set OU and Big 12 freshman records, and he set school frosh standards for yards per completion (23.7) and yards per pass attempt (17.1). He became the second OU freshman QB in his starting debut (Sam Bradford) with two TD passes of at least 50 yards (58 to freshman Marvin Mims and 53 to redshirt junior Charleston Rambo). Mims finished with 80 receiving yards and 68 punt return yards, good for 148 all-purpose yards, second most by an OU freshman in a career debut. Fellow true freshman Seth McGowan paced the Sooners with 61 rushing yards on 11 carries and tallied a 1-yard TD run and a 37-yard TD reception.

Oklahoma started the game with seven straight three-and-outs on defense and seven straight scores on offense. It held MSU to seven first downs and forced nine punts. Junior safety Delarrin Turner-Yell registered his first career interception in the third quarter and returned it 42 yards.

Redshirt senior kicker Stephen Johnson, who played in place of preseason All-American Gabe Brkic, was named Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week after making both of his field goal attempts (42 and 22 yards) and all five of his PAT tries.

NORMAN — Oklahoma outgained Kansas State by 117 yards (517-400), had 28 first downs to the Wildcats' 10 and held KSU to a 2-for-11 performance on third downs, but was outscored 17-0 in the fourth quarter in a 38-35 home loss.

The Sooners held leads of 28-7 and 35-14, but four turnovers and a fourth quarter that included a blocked punt, two more punts and an interception spelled doom for OU. K-State became the first program since 2013 and '14 to post wins in consecutive seasons over the Sooners.

Quarterback Spencer Rattler completed 30 of 41 passes on the day for a career-high 387 yards and four touchdowns against three interceptions. He became only the fourth OU quarterback to throw at least eight TD passes in his first two career starts, joining Josh Heupel in 1999 (eight), Sam Bradford in 2007 (eight) and Landry Jones in 2009 (nine).

Rattler threw touchdown passes to freshman Marvin Mims (11 and 9 yards), redshirt sophomore Drake Stoops (32 yards; first of his career) and Jeremiah Hall (21 yards) to give OU a 28-7 with 6:35 to go in the third quarter. The Sooners pushed their lead to 35-14 when freshman Seth McGowan registered a 5-yard TD run with 2:46 to go in the third. But the Wildcats scored the game's final 24 points, knocking the score with 8:17 left and taking the lead on a 50-yard field goal with 4:32 remaining.

AMES, Iowa — Oklahoma dropped consecutive regular season games for the first time since 1999 and lost at Iowa State for the first time since 1960 with a 37-30 defeat.

OU led 17-6 before falling behind 23-20 in the third quarter. It tied the score at 23 on a career-long 51-yard field goal by Gabe Brkic, and took a 30-23 lead on a Spencer Rattler pass to Jeremiah Hall with 8:17 remaining, which came four plays after an OU strip sack. But ISU scored the final 14 points on runs of 2 and 8 yards by Brock Purdy and Breece Hall.

Rattler completed 25 of 36 passes for 300 yards and two touchdowns (one interception), both of which went to Jeremiah Hall for scores of 4 and 3 yards. He also registered a rushing touchdown on a leaping 5-yard play in the first quarter.

Brkic converted 3 of 4 field goal tries on the night, his first attempts of the season.

DALLAS — In the longest game in school history and the highest-scoring Red River Showdown ever, Oklahoma downed No. 22 Texas 53-45 in four overtimes at the Cotton Bowl. Spencer Rattler connected with Drake Stoops on a 25-yard touchdown pass in the fourth overtime and Tre Brown intercepted a Sam Ehlinger pass in the end zone to seal the victory.

T.J. Pledger rushed for a career-high 131 yards and two touchdowns, Theo Wease caught a career-high eight passes for 52 yards, Marvin Mims had 52 receiving yards and a first-quarter TD and Austin Stogner finished with 56 receiving yards and an overtime TD catch.

A Woodi Washington interception with 5:02 remaining in the fourth quarter and with OU up 31-17 looked like the clincher for the Sooners, but Texas mounted touchdown drives of 50 and 84 yards to force extra time. Rattler finished with three TD passes and ran for a score.
