### OPENING KICK

► No. 20/19 Oklahoma begins its 129th season of varsity football when it plays host to Arkansas State on Saturday at 11 a.m. CT at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium in Norman. The game will be televised by ESPN with **Roy Philpott, Roddy Jones** and **Taylor McGregor** announcing.

► Saturday's game will mark the first between Oklahoma and Arkansas State in football.

► The 2023 season marks the 129th in OU football history. The Sooners lead the country with their 50 all-time conference championships, 27 11-plus-win seasons, 33 AP top-five finishes, seven Heisman Trophy winners (tied) and five No. 1 overall NFL Draft picks (tied), rank second with their 430 all-time weeks ranked in the top five of the AP poll, third with seven AP national championships and with their 101 weeks as the AP's No. 1 team, and fourth with their 56 bowl appearances and 414 NFL Draft picks.

► Saturday's contest will mark the 1,326th in OU history. The Sooners rank fifth in college football annals with their .725 all-time winning percentage (934-338-53 record). They trail Ohio State (.733), Alabama (.732), Michigan (.731), and Notre Dame (.729). Since the end of World War II (1946 season to present), OU leads all programs with 690 wins (33 more than Alabama, the program with the next most) and owns a .766 winning percentage.

► Oklahoma is 99-23-6 all-time in season openers and has won its last six such contests and 12 of its last 13. The Sooners are 80-15-4 in their first game of a season at Owen Field, which hosted its first game in 1923. OU has won 17 straight openers at home (last such loss was a 17-10 defeat vs. TCU in 2005).

► This marks the 24th straight season the Sooners have been ranked in the preseason AP poll and, at No. 20, this is their lowest preseason position during that stretch. OU's lowest preseason ranking over the previous 23 years was No. 19 in 2000 (finished the season No. 1) and 2015 (finished No. 5). The Sooners have been ranked 10th or better in 20 of the last 23 preseason polls. OU has also ended seven of the last eight seasons ranked in the AP top 10.

► After winning its first three games and reaching No. 6 in the AP poll under first-year head coach **Brent Venables**, the

2022 Sooners finished 6-6 in the regular season and dropped a 35-32 Cheez-It Bowl contest to No. 13 Florida State, a game it led 25-18 in the fourth quarter. Four of OU's losses came by three points and another by seven. Its wins came by an average of 22.5 points.

► Arkansas State, which is in its third year under head coach **Butch Jones**, went 3-9 last season and finished seventh in the Sun Belt Conference West Division with a 1-7 record. Its wins came against Grambling State (58-3), ULM (45-28) and UMass (35-33), all at home. After nine straight winning seasons (75-41 record from 2011-19), the Red Wolves have posted three straight losing campaigns (9-26 during the span).

**KEY STORYLINES**

► The Sooners have faced current Arkansas State head coach **Butch Jones** three times while he was head coach at other schools, and won all three contests. **Bob Stoops** was OU's head coach in each meeting. In 2010, Jones' first year at Cincinnati, No. 8 Oklahoma posted a 31-29 road win over the Bearcats behind 370 passing yards and two touchdowns from **Landry Jones**. OU also notched respective 34-10 (home) and 31-24 (road; double overtime) victories in 2014 and '15 over Jones' Tennessee program. In the first OU-UT matchup, the No. 4 Sooners got 308 passing yards from **Trevor Knight** and 67 rushing yards on just nine carries from **Samaje Perine**. The next year in Knoxville, No. 19 OU trailed 17-3 midway through the fourth quarter before rallying to win one of the most memorable games in program history. All four of **Baker Mayfield's** touchdowns came in the fourth quarter and overtimes, and the defense allowed No. 23 UT just 254 total yards (3.3 per play). Over the three contests, the Sooners surrendered an average of 4.6 yards per play.

► After adding 47 new players to the program last season, Oklahoma welcomes 65 newcomers for 2023, **Brent Venable's** second season as head coach. Forty of those 65 newcomers are scholarship players. That means 52% of OU's 2023 roster is comprised of first-year Sooners. Ninety-nine of OU's 125 players (79%) are first- or second-year Sooners, with 64 of them on scholarship. Only 26 of 116 players on OU's 2021 end-of-year roster are on the 2023 roster (19 of those are currently on scholarship [eight on offense, 11 on defense]).

► Oklahoma returns 10 players (not including specialists) who started at least nine of the team's 13 games last season (five on each side of the ball). The five offensive players are quarterback **Dillon Gabriel** (12 starts), linemen **McKade Mettauer** (13 starts) and **Andrew Raym** (10 starts) and wide receivers **Jalil Farooq** and **Drake Stoops** (10 starts each). The defensive players are linemen **Ethan Downs** (13 starts) and **Reggie Grimes** (10 starts), linebacker **Danny Stutsman** (13 starts) and defensive backs **Billy Bowman** (nine starts) and **Woodi Washington** (13 starts). Defensive lineman **Isaiah Coe** started six contests. The Sooners also welcome back kicker **Zach Schmit**, who handled all field goal, PAT and kickoff duties last season, and Farooq, who served as OU's primary kickoff returner.

► Gabriel, who was the 2022 Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year, has started 37 of his 38 career games and his 95 passing touchdowns over the last four years rank as second most nationally despite him missing 11 games due to injury. He ranked second in the Big 12 in 2022 in passing yards per game (264.0), total offense (290.3 ypg), pass efficiency rating (154.4), yards per completion (13.8), yards per pass attempt (8.6) and passing TDs (25). He completed 230 of 367 passes (62.7%) for 3,168 yards and rushed for 317 yards and six TDs.

► OU hit the transfer portal with frequency in the offseason, adding 21 players for 2023 who transferred from four-year schools. Among the 16 scholarship transfers, nine are on defense and seven on offense. The 21 total transfers played in 447 collective games at their previous schools and made 214 starts.

**HOME IS WHERE THE "W" IS**

► Oklahoma is 134-13 (.912) at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium since the start of the 1999 season, giving the Sooners more Big 12 championships during the period (14) than home defeats. It is the best home winning percentage in the country over the last 24 seasons (Boise State [.907] and Ohio State [.892] are next). OU has outscored its opponents by an average of 43-18 in those games.

► The Sooners have posted 146 straight sellouts of originally scheduled home games dating back to the start of the 1999 season (**Bob Stoops'** first as head coach). Only Nebraska (FBS-record 389) has a longer current streak.

► OU has recorded 41 unbeaten seasons at home, including 15 in the last 24 years.

**OU RANKED IN PRESEASON TOP 20**

► Oklahoma is ranked No. 20 in the preseason Associated Press Top 25 Poll and No. 19 in the preseason USA Today Sports AFCA Coaches Poll.

► This marks the 24th straight year that OU has appeared in the preseason AP Top 25, which is the second-longest current string behind Ohio State (35) and the second-longest streak in program history (28 straight seasons from 1968-95). It also represents the 65th time that Oklahoma has appeared in the preseason AP

poll, second most behind Ohio State (70 times).

- ▶ OU's all-time average preseason AP rank is 6.8, best in the nation (Alabama is second at 7.1).
- ▶ This is just the third time in the last 23 years that OU is not ranked in the AP preseason top 10.
- ▶ OU finished the season in the AP's top 10 in seven of the last eight years.

**SOONERS PICKED THIRD IN BIG 12**

▶ For just the fourth time in the last 13 years, Oklahoma is not the preseason media choice to win the Big 12 Conference football title. OU, which has won six of the last eight Big 12 championships, was picked to finish third in the 2023 Big 12 Preseason Poll that was released on July 6. The 2023 season will mark the Sooners' last in the Big 12, as they are slated to join the Southeastern Conference in July 2024.

▶ OU, which has posted a 61-14 (.813) record against Big 12 opponents over the last eight years (includes a 4-0 record in Big 12 Championship games), received four first-place votes in the poll and 758 total points. Texas, which last won the conference title in 2009, was picked to win the league with 41 first-place votes and 886 total points, while Kansas State, last year's Big 12 champion, was picked to finish second with 14 first-place votes and 858 points. Texas Tech (four first-place votes, 729 points) and TCU (three first-place votes, 727 points) were picked to finish fourth and fifth.

**YEAR TWO FOR VENABLES**

▶ The 2023 season marks the second in the head coaching career of **Brent Venables**, who was hired by OU on Dec. 5, 2021, after spending the previous 10 years coordinating Clemson's defense. Venables returned to Norman, where he served as OU's linebackers coach from 1999-2011 (was co-defensive coordinator from 1999-2003 and associate head coach and defensive coordinator from 2004-2011). He has coached in eight national championship games between his time at OU and Clemson (four at each school), winning titles with the Sooners in 2000 and Tigers in 2016 and 2018. In 26 years as a full-time assistant coach, Venables' teams posted 26 winning seasons, won 13 conference titles, went to 30 bowl games (includes four College Football Playoff National Championship games) and won at least 10 games 21 times.

**LAST GO-ROUND IN BIG 12**

▶ With the Sooners set to join the Southeastern Conference on July 1, 2024, the 2023 football season will mark their last in the Big 12 Conference. OU has won more than half of the Big 12's football championships (14 of 27) since the league began in 1996, and has posted a 180-59 (.753) record against conference competition (includes an 11-1 record in Big 12 Championship games).

▶ Oklahoma's 14 Big 12 titles are 11 more than the programs with the next most (Baylor, Kansas State and Texas have three each). Going back to and including 2010, OU has won eight Big 12 titles and is followed by Baylor and Kansas State (three each) and Oklahoma State and TCU (one each).

▶ Four new programs will make their Big 12 debuts in 2023, with BYU, Cincinnati, Houston and UCF joining the league. OU will host UCF on Oct. 21 and play at Cincinnati on Sept. 23 and at BYU on Nov. 18.

**RETURNING ALL-BIG 12 HONOREES**

▶ The Sooners return five players who earned 2022 All-Big 12 honors — two on offense and three on defense. Quarterback **Dillon Gabriel** was named Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year as a redshirt junior after passing for 3,168 yards and 25 touchdowns and rushing for 315 yards and six more scores. And center **Andrew Raym** was an honorable mention all-league selection as a junior after giving up just two sacks on 358 pass-blocking plays in his 10 games (all starts).

▶ Defensive end **Ethan Downs** earned second-team All-Big 12 accolades as a sophomore when he ranked fourth in the conference with 13.5 tackles for loss (he is the league's leading returner in TFLs). Linebacker **Danny Stutsman** and safety **Billy Bowman** were honorable mention All-Big 12 performers in 2022 as sophomores. Stutsman led the conference and ranked 18th nationally with his 9.6 tackles per game, while Bowman logged 60 tackles and ranked second on the team with three interceptions in 11 games (nine starts).

**GABRIEL A TD MACHINE**

▶ Redshirt senior quarterback **Dillon Gabriel**, who has started 37 of his 38 career games between UCF (2019-21) and OU (2022), including each of his last 37, ranks second nationally over the last four seasons with his 95 touchdown passes despite missing 11 games during the span due to injury (Houston's Clayton Tune passed for 96 TDs in four more games).

▶ If Gabriel continues to average 2.5 TD passes per contest like he has in his first 38 games, he would finish with 127 career TDs in a 13-game 2023 season, which he would accomplish in a 51-game career. For perspective, that would rank seventh in FBS history. **Landry Jones** is the OU record-holder for career passing TDs with 123 in 52 games (**Baker Mayfield** passed for 131 career TDs, but 12 of those were as a Texas Tech Red Raider).

**SOONERS REPLACING THREE STARTING OFFENSIVE LINEMEN**

► OU lost three starting offensive linemen from 2022: first-round NFL Draft pick **Anton Harrison** (left tackle), third-round selection **Wanya Morris** (right tackle) and four-year starter **Chris Murray** (right guard). But the Sooners are not without talent and experience among their 2023 group. Redshirt senior guard **McKade Mettauer** has started 41 of his 42 career games, including all 13 for OU last season, and senior **Andrew Raym** has been the Sooners' starter at center the last two seasons (17 starts). Redshirt junior **Tyler Guyton** made five starts at tackle in 2022 and redshirt sophomore guard **Savion Byrd** saw action in 10 games last season, including the Cheez-It Bowl vs. Florida State when he made his first career start. OU welcomes back three other letterwinners in redshirt junior **Aaryn Parks** and sophomores **Jacob Sexton** and **Jake Taylor**.

► The Sooners welcome three scholarship transfers on the offensive line this year in redshirt seniors **Walter Rouse** and **Caleb Shaffer**, who both arrived in January, and redshirt sophomore **Troy Everett**, who arrived in June. Rouse played in 40 games at Stanford over the last four seasons and made 39 starts at left tackle. Shaffer played 40 games at Miami (Ohio) and started 35 at guard. Everett played in 13 games at Appalachian State over the past two seasons, including 10 last year (six starts at center). He was named a second-team freshman All-American last year by The Athletic.

**BIG SHOES TO FILL AT RB AND WR**

► Opportunities abound for OU at running back and wide receiver in 2023, as the Sooners lost their leading rusher and receiver from last season in **Eric Gray** and **Marvin Mims Jr.**, respectively. Gray was a second-team All-Big 12 pick who rushed for 1,366 yards (the ninth-most in OU single-season history) and 11 touchdowns last year. He led the Big 12 and ranked 14th nationally by averaging 6.4 yards per carry. Mims Jr. earned first-team All-Big 12 honors and racked up 1,083 receiving yards and six TDs. He averaged a Big 12-high 20.1 yards per catch, which ranked sixth nationally. Mims was picked in the second round of the NFL Draft by Denver while Gray was a fifth-round selection by the New York Giants.

► The Sooners return three scholarship running backs who teamed for 851 yards and 10 touchdowns on 189 carries (4.5 yards per carry) in 2022. Sophomore **Jovantae Barnes** ran for 533 yards and five TDs, redshirt senior **Marcus Major** rushed for 227 yards and four scores, and redshirt freshman **Gavin Sawchuk** ran for 105 yards and one TD. Major, who has battled injuries during his career, has rushed for 525 yards and seven TDs in his career. In last year's Cheez-It Bowl vs. Florida State, Barnes (108 yards) and Sawchuk (100) became the first pair of OU freshmen with at least 100 rushing yards in the same game since 1985. The game marked Barnes' first career start and Sawchuk's second career game. Junior walk-on running back **Tawee Walker** is also squarely in the mix for playing time. He played in 11 games last year and rushed for 62 yards.

► A pair of four-star freshmen joined the OU running backs room during the spring semester in **Kalib Hicks** and **Daylan Smothers**. Hicks rushed for more than 3,000 yards and 31 TDs during his high school career, while Smothers rushed for 1,581 yards and 28 TDs his junior year alone. Smothers was rated as the nation's No. 12 running back in the 2023 class by ESPN.

► OU returns six lettermen at receiver, led by sixth-year player **Drake Stoops** and junior **Jalil Farooq**. Stoops, who has played in 49 career games and made 18 starts, ranked second on the squad in 2022 with 39 catches while finishing with 393 receiving yards and three TDs. Farooq started 10 games last year and caught 37 passes for 466 yards and five TDs. Other returning lettermen are sophomore **Gavin Freeman** (three catches for 46 yards in 13 games in 2022), who was just placed on scholarship on Friday, redshirt junior **LV Bunkley-Shelton** (two catches for 24 yards in 12 games), sophomore **Jayden Gibson** (one catch for 12 yards in nine games) and senior **D.J. Graham**. Graham changed positions from cornerback in the middle of last season and will be looking to see the field offensively for the first time in his collegiate career.

► Redshirt freshman **Nic Anderson** and a trio of scholarship transfers figure to vie for significant field time this season. Anderson, who was the nation's No. 15 receiver by ESPN as a high school senior, saw action in three games last year. Junior **Andre Anthony** transferred from Michigan in January and sophomore **Brenen Thompson** transferred from Texas in June. Anthony caught 19 passes for 328 yards and three TDs in two years in Ann Arbor, while Thompson caught one pass for 32 yards for UT last season. Freshman **Jaquaize Pettaway** was a consensus top-100 national player in the 2023 recruiting class (ranked No. 43 by ESPN).

**SECOND-TIME SOONER**

► Redshirt senior tight end **Austin Stogner** played his first three seasons as a Sooner before transferring to South Carolina for the 2022 season. Now, after a rare transfer back to the school where he started, he's wrapping up his career in Norman and figures to see plenty of playing time.

► The 6-6, 258-pounder has started 20 career games (all over the last three seasons) and has racked up 67 receptions for 864 yards and nine touchdowns. Eight of those TDs came over his three seasons as a Sooner.

► Stogner started 10 of his 12 games at South Carolina last year, registering 20 catches for 210 yards.

**PREVIEWING THE DEFENSE**

► Oklahoma's defensive unit was admittedly not as strong as hoped in 2022. But if there's one thing that's certain, it's that a defense on a **Brent Venables**-coached team won't stay down for long. OU's staff established a foundation last year and then revamped personnel in the offseason. With 19 returning defensive letterwinners (26 total returning defensive players) and 32 total newcomers (nine transfers, 22 freshmen and one junior college transfer), the Sooners expect to have a deeper and more capable group of players on that side of the ball in 2023.

► OU's 2022 defense tied for fourth nationally with its 104 tackles for loss (8.0 per game) and seventh with its 17 interceptions. Individually, linebacker **Danny Stutsman** led the Big 12 and ranked 14th in the country with his 125 total tackles. Defensive end **Ethan Downs** earned second-team All-Big 12 honors after ranking fourth in the league with 13.5 tackles for loss and tying for the team lead with 4.5 sacks. Both Stutsman and Downs are juniors, as is defensive back **Billy Bowman**, who like Stutsman was an honorable mention all-conference pick and who ranked second on the squad with three interceptions.

► The Sooners return 17 defensive players who saw action in at least nine games last season. They also welcome back eight of their top 14 tacklers, five of their top seven tackle-for-loss leaders (four of the top five) and four of their top five sack leaders.

► OU's returning players accounted for 52% of the team's total tackles last year, 61% of its tackles for loss (63.5 of 104), 68% of its sacks (19 of 28), 59% of its interceptions (10 of 17), 50% of its pass breakups (25 of 50), 63% of its QB hurries (31 of 49) and 100% of its forced fumbles (7 of 7) and fumble recoveries (5 of 5).

**DEFENSIVE SHOT IN THE ARM**

► Oklahoma signed nine defensive scholarship transfers in the offseason, six of them defensive linemen. They are redshirt seniors **Rondell Bothroyd** (Wake Forest), **Trace Ford** (Oklahoma State), **Jacob Lacey** (Notre Dame), **Phil Paea** (Utah State), **Davon Sears** (Texas State) and **Da'Jon Terry** (Tennessee). The sextet combined for 185 games played, 58 starts, 62 tackles for loss and 33.5 sacks. Bothroyd started 31 of his 48 games at Wake Forest and logged 30.5 TFLs and 16.5 sacks. Ford battled through injuries to start 15 of his 32 games and register 11.5 TFLs and 8.5 sacks.

► Linebackers **Dasan McCullough** (Indiana) and **Konnor Near** (Ferris State) earned recognition for their play in 2022, and safety **Reggie Pearson** (Texas Tech) brings a wealth of starting experience to the OU program. McCullough was named a freshman All-American as a true frosh last year from ESPN, The Athletic (second team) and College Football News (second team). Playing in all 12 games and making four starts, he registered 49 tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss, 4.0 sacks and three pass breakups. Near was a first-team All-Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Association pick at Ferris State, registering 66 tackles, 10.5 TFLs, and 3.0 sacks and helping the Bulldogs to their second straight Division II national title. FSU went 28-1 the last two seasons. Pearson is in his sixth season of college football after spending his first three years at Wisconsin and the last two at Texas Tech. He started 20 of 23 games the last two years for the Red Raiders, racking up 109 tackles, three interceptions and seven pass breakups. He also started 13 of 14 games for Wisconsin in 2019 and logged 60 tackles, 3.5 TFLs, two forced fumbles and four PBU's.

**A QUICK LOOK AT SPECIAL TEAMS**

► Oklahoma returns placekicker **Zach Schmit**, but will have new players at punter, long snapper and holder for the first time in years. To that end, the Sooners will rely on returning roster players and incoming transfers to fill the all-important roles in the kicking game. Schmit, who made all 57 PAT attempts and 13 of 19 field goal tries last season, looks to take a step forward, and has battled redshirt freshman **Gavin Marshall** and transfer **Redi Mustafaraj** during fall camp. **Josh Plaster** and transfers **Luke Elzinga** (a three-time All-MAC performer at Central Michigan) and **Ashton Logan** (played in three games at Colorado last year) have been battling for punting duties, while returning team members **Ethan Lane** and **Ben Anderson** are the team's long snappers.

► The Sooners lost a pair of key special teamers in first-team All-Big 12 punter **Michael Turk**, who set OU records for punting average in a game (59.7 yards on three punts in 2021 against TCU), season (51.2 yards in 2021) and a career (48.4). And **Kasey Kelleher** served as the team's long snapper on all punts and all but two place kicks over the past five seasons.

► In the return game, **Drake Stoops** and **LV Bunkley-Shelton** have handled punts in the past, but the Sooners must replace three-year return man **Marvin Mims Jr.** in the primary role. Mims' 16.0-yard punt-return average last year would have ranked second nationally if he met NCAA's minimum requirement of 1.2 punt returns per game for the category. **Jalil Farooq** and **Billy Bowman** returned the majority of kickoffs last season and figure to factor again this year.

### OU'S 2023 RECRUITING CLASS RANKED AS HIGH AS NO. 4

Head coach Brent Venables and staff hauled in Oklahoma's second-straight top-10 recruiting class in 2023. The class featured 24 scholarship players — 23 during the December signing period and one more in February. The class ranked No. 4 nationally by 247Sports and ESPN, No. 6 by Rivals, and No. 7 by On3.

Of the 24 signees, three were ranked as consensus five-star prospects on a five-star scale by 247Sports, ESPN, On3 and Rivals, 12 were rated a four-star recruit by at least two of the outlets while nine others received three-star designation from at least one of those services.

All but one of the 24 signees were high schoolers (one came from the junior college ranks) and hail from 14 states: five from Texas, three each from Oklahoma and Florida, two each from Missouri and Washington, and one each from California, Colorado, Indiana, Nebraska, New Jersey, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania and Tennessee.

Ten members of the signing class are classified as offensive players and 14 as defensive players.

Thirteen of the Sooners' signees enrolled at OU for the spring semester and participated in team activities. They were quarterback Jackson Arnold, defensive linemen Adepoju Adebawore and Ashton Sanders, running backs Kalib Hicks and Daylan Smothers, offensive linemen Joshua Bates and Cayden Green, linebacker Phil Picciotti and defensive backs Peyton Bowen, Kendel Dolby, Erik McCarty, Makari Vickers and Jasiah Wagoner.

### EMMETT JONES NEW RECEIVERS COACH

► OU's only full-time coaching addition since last season occurred in January when **Emmett Jones** was hired as passing game coordinator and wide receivers coach. Jones, who has strong ties to the Dallas area, spent the 2022 season at Texas Tech as wide receivers coach and passing game coordinator. From 2019-21, he served as wide receivers coach at Kansas and added the title of passing game coordinator his final two years there. He also served as KU's interim head coach in spring 2021. Jones was also at Texas Tech from 2015-18, serving the first of those seasons as director of player development and the last three as outside receivers coach. Prior to collegiate coaching, Jones was a Texas high school coach for 14 years, the last three as head coach at South Oak Cliff High School.

### FIVE 2023 NFL DRAFTEES

► Oklahoma had five players picked in the 2023 NFL Draft, all on the offensive side of the ball and one in each of the first three rounds. **Anton Harrison** became OU's first offensive lineman taken in the first round since 2013 when he was selected with the No. 27 overall pick by the Jacksonville Jaguars. He also became the 10th offensive lineman drafted in nine years under O-line coach Bill Bedenbaugh. Harrison was followed by wide receiver **Marvin Mims Jr.** in the second round (Denver Broncos), offensive lineman **Wanya Morris** in the third round (Kansas City Chiefs), running back **Eric Gray** in the fifth round (New York Giants) and tight end **Brayden Willis** in the seventh round (San Francisco 49ers). Since 2000, 116 Sooners have been selected, which is 36 more than the next-closest Big 12 program during that span (Texas, 80).

### FORMER SOONERS ON STAFF

► Second-year OU head coach **Brent Venables** has placed an emphasis on making alumni feel welcome around the program, and has turned to several former Sooners to fill his staff.

► In addition to assistant coaches **Joe Jon Finley** (2004-07), **Brandon Hall** (1998-00), **Jeff Lebby** (2002-06) and **DeMarco Murray** (2007-10), several other former players hold staff positions as analysts, graduate assistants and as part of OU football's SOUL Mission program.

► Former linebackers **Lance Mitchell** (2002-04) and **Rufus Alexander** (2003-06) are defensive analysts while former fullback/running back **Seth Littrell** (1997-00) and former offensive linemen **Phil Loadholt** (2007-08) serve as offensive analysts. Former quarterback **Tanner Schafer** (2016-21) and offensive lineman **Clayton Woods** (2018-19) are offensive graduate assistants.

► Former running back and receiver **Josh Norman** (1998-01) and linebackers **Caleb Kelly** (2016-21) and **Curtis Lofton** (2005-07) work with SOUL Mission (Serving Our Uncommon Legacy). SOUL Mission is dedicated to helping OU football student-athletes develop in all aspects of their lives. Four SOUL Mission pillars target every facet of off-the-field enhancement of OU's football student-athletes: civic engagement, life skills, career development and former player development.

► Venables has also tabbed a quartet of trio of former Clemson players to serve on his staff: defensive ends coach **Miguel Chavis** (defensive tackle; 2007-10), senior defensive analyst **Xavier Brewer** (cornerback; 2008-12), defensive graduate assistant **Ryan Carter** (cornerback; 2013-17) and **James Skalski** (linebacker; 2016-21).

### HEISMAN U

► Quarterbacks **Baker Mayfield** and **Kyler Murray** became Oklahoma's sixth and seventh Heisman Trophy winners in 2017 and '18, respectively, moving the Sooners into a tie with Notre Dame and Ohio State for the most Heisman winners (USC now has seven as well). Other OU winners were QB **Sam Bradford** in 2008, QB **Jason White** in 2003, RB **Billy Sims** in 1978, RB **Steve Owens** in 1969 and RB **Billy Vessels** in 1952.

► Quarterback **Jalen Hurts** was the 2019 Heisman Trophy runner-up and became Oklahoma's 11th Heisman finalist, tied with Alabama for most of any school (finalists were first named in 1982). Miami (Fla.) and Ohio State rank third with nine finalists and Florida ranks fifth with eight.

► OU boasts a nation-leading 10 Heisman finalists in the last 23 years (since 2000). Alabama ranks second with nine, Ohio State ranks third with six and Stanford is fourth with five.

► Oklahoma is the only program to ever produce five Heisman finalists in a four-year period (Hurts in 2019 [runner-up], Murray in 2018 [won], Mayfield in 2017 [won] and Mayfield [finished third] and receiver **Dede Westbrook** [finished fourth] in 2016). With Mayfield's and Murray's wins, OU is the only program to produce different quarterback winners in consecutive seasons.

► OU is tied for the most Heisman runners-up, as well (six). OU's second-place Heisman finishers were **Kurt Burris** (1954), **Greg Pruitt** (1972), **Sims** (1979), **Josh Heupel** (2000), **Adrian Peterson** (2004) and Hurts (2019).

► Oklahoma has produced four Heisman Trophy winners in the last 20 years. Only four other programs have

produced four winners ever (Notre Dame, Ohio State and USC seven and Alabama four).

► An OU quarterback finished in the top four of Heisman voting in five consecutive years (Mayfield fourth in 2015, third in 2016 and first in 2017; Murray first in 2018; Hurts second in 2019).

**OU'S BIG 12 DOMINATION**

► OU's 14 Big 12 titles are 11 more than the program with the next most. Baylor, Kansas State and Texas have each won three Big 12 championships and are followed by Nebraska (two) and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each). Colorado and Nebraska left the Big 12 after the 2010 season and Texas A&M departed after the 2011 campaign.

► Oklahoma's win over Iowa State in the 2020 Big 12 Championship resulted in the Sooners' sixth straight Big 12 title and 14th since 2000 (no other program has won more than two during the span). For perspective, the two Power Five programs with the next most conference titles this millennium are Ohio State (11 in Big Ten) and Oregon (eight in Pac-10/Pac-12).

► Since 2010, OU has won eight Big 12 titles and is followed by Baylor (three), Kansas State (two), Oklahoma State and TCU (one each).

► Since 2000, OU has won more Big 12 championships (14) than it has lost home games (13).

► Oklahoma is 57-14 (.803) in regular season Big 12 play since the start of the 2015 season. Oklahoma State ranks second during that period (.46-26; .639), TCU third (42-30; .583), Texas fourth (38-33; .535) and Kansas State fifth (37-35; .514).

► Oklahoma is the only program to win at least three straight Big 12 titles, and it has done so twice (2006-08 and 2015-20). Baylor (2013-14) is the only other program to win two Big 12 championships in a row.

► At 11-1, the Sooners are the only program with a winning record in Big 12 Championship games. Texas (3-3), Kansas State (2-2) and Baylor (1-1) have the next best marks.

► Every OU freshman class from 1999-2020 has won at least one Big 12 title and all but the 2011 and 2020-22 freshman classes have won at least two. The 2015, 2016 and 2017 freshman classes each won four Big 12 titles.

**COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST**

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (690) than any other program (next most is 657 by Alabama).

► Oklahoma has finished in the top 5 of the AP poll a nation-leading 33 times (Ohio State is second with 30).

► OU leads all FBS programs with 50 all-time conference championships. The rest of the top five includes Nebraska (46), Michigan (44), Ohio State (39) and USC (37). The Sooners' 14 league titles since 2000 are the most among Power Five programs (Ohio State ranks second with 11).

► No program has more all-time 11-win seasons than Oklahoma's 27. And since the start of the 2000 season, OU and Ohio State have produced a nation-leading 18 campaigns of at least 10 wins.

► Since former head coach **Bob Stoops** arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads the country with its 12,236 points scored, which is 519 more than second-place Boise State (11,717) and 965 more than third-place Oregon (11,271).

► OU's 80 consensus All-Americans since 1950 are the most nationally (Alabama ranks second with 75 and Ohio State third with 72). Since 2000, the Sooners have produced 30 consensus All-Americans, second only to Alabama.

► OU is the only program that has produced at least four NFL Draft picks each of the last 16 years.

**EXTRA POINTS**

► The Sooners are 12-3-1 all-time as the No. 20-ranked team in the AP poll (7-0 at home). OU's last game played as the 20th-ranked team was in 2016 (45-40 victory over Texas in Dallas). Oklahoma last lost as the AP's 20th-ranked team in 2009 (10-3 at Nebraska).

► Since offensive line coach **Bill Bedenbaugh** joined the OU staff in 2013, the Sooners rank first nationally in total offense (509.4 ypg), second in pass efficiency rating (168.0), yards per rush (5.5), scoring offense (40.8 ppg) and passing yards per attempt (9.4), fifth in yards per completion (14.2) and sixth in completion percentage (66.4). They are the only program in the country to rank in the top 10 in rushing offense (10th at 224.6 ypg) and passing offense (eighth at 284.9 ypg) over that span.

# GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and a 62-foot-by-38-foot video board.

## OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- ▶ Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals, is hosting football games for the 99th year this season. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.
- ▶ In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- ▶ The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- ▶ In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- ▶ Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and 83,489 (2016). With last year's widening of aisles and some seats, capacity dropped to 80,126.
- ▶ In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

## RECENT RENOVATION

- ▶ The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- ▶ The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489. The addition of handrails and some seat and aisle widening in 2019 reduced capacity to 80,126.
- ▶ The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons also benefit from two new clubs.
- ▶ Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- ▶ All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- ▶ The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.
- ▶ A significantly larger and more detailed video board has replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The new board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

# BRENT VENABLES

**NAMED OU'S 23RD HEAD COACH DEC. 5, 2021 • FORMER K-STATE/OKLAHOMA/CLEMSON ASSISTANT THREE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS (ONE WITH OKLAHOMA, TWO WITH CLEMSON) EIGHT NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME APPEARANCES • COACHED IN 33 BOWL GAMES 13 CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS • THREE-TIME BROYLES AWARD FINALIST (2016 WINNER)**

**A** former 13-year University of Oklahoma assistant coach who won a national championship with the Sooners and two more with Clemson University during an ultra-successful 10-year stint as defensive coordinator, Brent Venables was named OU's 23rd head football coach Dec. 5, 2021.

The 52-year-old Venables served as co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Oklahoma from 1999-2003 and as associate head coach, defensive coordinator and linebackers coach from 2004-11 under former head coach Bob Stoops. Venables has coached in eight national championship games between his time at OU and Clemson, winning titles with the Sooners in 2000 and Tigers in 2016 and 2018. In 26 years as a full-time assistant coach, Venables' teams produced 26 winning seasons, won 13 conference titles, went to 30 bowl games (includes four College Football Playoff National Championship games) and won at least 10 games 22 times.

After joining Clemson prior to the 2012 season, Venables constructed one of the nation's top defenses. From 2012-2021, the Tigers ranked first nationally in sacks (445; next most was 392) and opponent third-down conversion percentage (30.2%), second in opponent pass efficiency rating (111.1) and takeaways (244; tied), third in scoring defense (17.8 ppg) and opponent completion percentage (53.3), fourth in total defense (311.4 ypg) and pass defense (190.5 ypg), fifth in interceptions (148) and sixth in rushing defense (120.9 ypg). They won conference titles each year from 2015-20.

Since 2000, Venables has coached eight national award winners and 16 consensus All-Americans. In that time, 57 defensive players under his guidance have been selected in the NFL Draft (12 first-rounders), including 15 linebackers, two of whom were first-round picks.

As a defensive coordinator and linebackers coach, Venables produced winners of three Butkus Awards (OU's Rocky Calmus in 2001 and Teddy Lehman in 2003, and CU's Isaih Simmons in 2019), two Nagurski Awards (OU's Roy Williams in 2001 and Derrick Strait in 2003), two Thorpe Awards (Williams in 2001 and Strait in 2003) and one Bednarik Award (Lehman in 2003). And in 2018, Clemson defensive tackle Christian Wilkins became the school's first winner of William V. Campbell Trophy, also known as the "Academic Heisman."

Venables has received national accolades for his coaching and recruiting. He received the Frank Broyles Award in 2016 as the nation's top assistant coach after being named a finalist in 2015. He was named FootballScoop's Defensive Coordinator of the Year in 2014 and Rivals.com's Recruiter of the Year in 2015.

Venables' defensive units were remarkably consistent during his 10 years with the Tigers. Each of his last eight Clemson defenses ranked in the top 15 nationally in yards allowed and seven of the last eight ranked in the top 20 in points allowed. Over his last eight years there, his units ranked first (in 2014), 10th, eighth, fourth, fifth, sixth, 15th and ninth (in 2021) in total defense. Additionally, his units ranked first or second in the ACC in total defense each of his last eight years (ranked first in six of those seasons).

Under Venables' tutelage in 2021, Clemson ranked second nationally in scoring defense (15.0 ppg) and red zone defense (62.1 conversion percentage), fourth in sacks (3.4 per game), eighth in rushing defense (98.8 ypg) and ninth in total defense (308.4 ypg).

Venables' 2020 Clemson defense tied for the national lead with 46 sacks, despite no player producing more

than 4.5 sacks individually. His 2019 unit allowed fewer than 300 yards of total offense in each of its first 12 games of the season, the first defense nationally since at least 1996 to accomplish that feat. Clemson held 16 straight opponents to 20 or fewer points across the 2018-19 seasons, the best streak at the school since the 1937-40 seasons.

Clemson's 2018 squad led the nation in scoring defense (13.1 ppg) for the first time in school history and set a program record by recording 54 sacks.

Venables' Clemson defenses ranked among the top 10 nationally in sacks each year from 2014-21 and ranked in the top 10 in tackles for loss from 2013-20. The units led the nation in TFLs every year from 2013-16.

From 1999-2011, Venables helped OU to the 2000 national championship, three other national championship game appearances (2003, '04 and '08) and seven Big 12 titles. He was a finalist for the Broyles Award in 2006 when the Sooners led the Big 12 in total defense and scoring defense.

Oklahoma linebackers under Venables earned three Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year awards, five Big 12 Defensive Newcomer of the Year accolades and six first-team All-America honors. Ten of his OU linebackers — and 31 defensive players overall — were taken in the 2000-12 NFL Drafts.

While Venables was an Oklahoma assistant, the Sooners ranked among the top 16 nationally in total defense eight times (including each year from 2000-06) and among the top 20 in scoring defense eight times. OU led the Big 12 in scoring defense on four occasions (2000, '04, '06 and '11) and topped the conference in total defense three times (2003, '04, and '06).

Prior to joining Stoops' first staff at OU, Venables coached linebackers at Kansas State (1996-98), serving as defensive running game coordinator in 1998, and was a graduate assistant at K-State under Bill Snyder from 1993-95.

As a player at Kansas State (1991-92), Venables earned honorable mention All-Big Eight honors in 1992 after registering 124 tackles. He began his collegiate playing career at Garden City (Kan.) Community College (1989-90), where he earned All-America honors after recording 276 tackles and was inducted into the school's athletics hall of fame in April 2023.

A native of Salina, Kan., Venables received his bachelor's degree in political science from Kansas State in 1992. He and his wife Julie have four children: sons Jake and Tyler and daughters Laney and Addie.
