OPENING KICK

► Meeting for the first time since 2015, No. 19/16 Oklahoma (2-0) plays its first road game of the season when it travels to face Tulsa (1-1) on Saturday at 2:30 p.m. CT at H.A. Chapman Stadium. The game will be televised by ESPN2 with **Dave Flemming**, **Brock Osweiler** and **Kayla Burton** announcing.

► Saturday's game will mark the 29th meeting between Oklahoma and Tulsa. The Sooners own a 20-7-1 series lead and are 7-3 against the Golden Hurricane in Tulsa.

► OU is 73-10 (.880) in September games since the start of the 1999 season, which was **Bob Stoops'** first as head coach.

► The 2023 season marks the 129th in OU football history. The Sooners lead the country with their 50 all-time conference championships, 27 11-plus-win seasons, 33 AP top-five finishes, seven Heisman Trophy winners (tied) and five No. 1 overall NFL Draft picks (tied), rank second with their 430 all-time weeks ranked in the top five of the AP poll, third with seven AP national championships and with their 101 weeks as the AP's No. 1 team, and fourth with their 56 bowl appearances and 414 NFL Draft picks.

► Saturday's contest will mark the 1,328th in OU history. The Sooners rank fifth in college football annals with their .725 all-time winning percentage (936-338-53 record). They trail Ohio State (.733), Alabama (.732), Michigan (.731), and Notre Dame (.730). Since the end of World War II (1946 season to present), OU leads all programs with 692 wins (34 more than Alabama, the program with the next most) and owns a .771 winning percentage.

► Tulsa, which is in its first year under the direction of former OU offensive coordinator and offensive line/tight ends/fullbacks coach **Kevin Wilson**, is 1-1. After a 42-7 season-opening home win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff, the Golden Hurricane lost 43-10 at No. 8 Washington on Saturday. TU gained 318 yards against the Huskies and gave up 563.

KEY STORYLINES

► Oklahoma owns a 20-7-1 all-time record against Tulsa and is 14-1 against the Golden Hurricane since 1943. The Sooners have won the last nine games in the series by an average score of 48-13. OU was ranked in each of those nine contests, with an

average AP ranking of No. 8. Tulsa's last win against OU came in 1996 in Norman (31-24) in a battle of unranked teams.

► The Sooners are 7-3 against TU in Tulsa. They have won the last four meetings at H.A. Chapman Stadium by an average score of 54-7 (52-7 in 2014, 62-21 in 2007, 37-0 in 2002 and 65-0 in 1987). The Golden Hurricane's wins in Tulsa came in 1933 (20-6), 1937 (19-7) and 1942 (23-0).

► First-year Tulsa head coach **Kevin Wilson** spent nine seasons (2002-10) on the Oklahoma staff under head coach **Bob Stoops**, helping the Sooners to a 98-24 (.803) record, a 59-13 (.819) Big 12 mark, six Big 12 championships and national championship game appearances in 2003, 2004 and 2008. The 2008 OU offense was one of the most potent in college football history, averaging a nation-leading 51.1 points per game and 547.9 yards per contest. The Sooners that season became the first FBS program to score at least 60 points in five straight games (62 vs. Nebraska, 66 at Texas A&M, 65 vs. Texas Tech, 61 at Oklahoma State and 62 vs. Missouri in the Big 12 Championship Game). Quarterback **Sam Bradford** won the Heisman Trophy that season (QB **Jason White** won it in 2003 when Wilson was on staff). Wilson served as OU's co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach from 2002-05 and as offensive coordinator and tight ends and fullbacks coach from 2006-10. He was Indiana's head coach from 2011-16 and spent the 2017-22 seasons as Ohio State's offensive coordinator and tight ends coach.

► After ranking 49th nationally last season in third-down conversion percentage (.405) and 87th in third-down conversion percentage defense (.409), OU is off to a stellar start in both categories in 2023. The Sooners have converted 18 of their 28 third downs through two games, good for the nation's third-best percentage (.643). And OU allowed Arkansas State and SMU to convert just six of their 27 combined third-down tries. The .222 opponent conversion figure has the Sooners ranked eighth in the country.

► OU added nine defensive scholarship transfers in the offseason and has been impressive on that side of the ball through two games. The Sooners rank sixth in scoring defense (5.5 ppg), 32nd in yards per play allowed (4.5) and 35th in total defense (287.5 ypg). Last year, OU ranked 98th in scoring defense (30.0 ppg), 82nd in yards per play allowed (5.8) and 121st in total defense (461.0 ypg).

► The Sooners have allowed just two scores (one touchdown) through two games. The TD came in the fourth quarter by SMU. The last time OU went at least seven quarters without allowing a touchdown to open a season was in 1999 when it beat Indiana State 49-0 and Baylor 41-10. Baylor's TD was in the fourth quarter.

► OU has yet to commit a turnover this season and has registered three takeaways on defense (one interception and two fumble recoveries). It also blocked a punt against SMU.

RECAPPING THE WIN OVER SMU

► **Tawee Walker** rushed for career-high 117 yards, **Dillon Gabriel** passed for four touchdowns and the OU defense held SMU to 4.6 yards per play in a 28-11 home win on Saturday. SMU's 11 points were its fewest since the 2017 season.

► The Sooners, who never trailed, led 14-3 at halftime and 14-11 early in the fourth quarter before scoring the final 14 points of the game as Gabriel connected with receiver **Jalil Farooq** on a 21-yard touchdown with 9:01 remaining and with running back **Marcus Major** on a 27-yard score with 6:40 left.

► Gabriel's other touchdown throws went to Michigan transfer receiver **Andre Anthony** in the first quarter (his first TD as a Sooner gave OU a 7-0 lead) and Texas A&M transfer tight end **Blake Smith** in the second quarter (his first career TD put OU up 14-3). Anthony caught a career-high seven passes for 76 yards.

► The game marked the 10th in Gabriel's career in which he threw at least four touchdown passes (third at OU) and 17th career game with at least three TD passes (fifth at OU). He also surpassed 100 career TD passes (now has 101).

► The Sooners held SMU to 26 fewer points and 106 fewer yards than it averaged last season. OU's defense registered two takeaways (interception by **Justin Harrington** and a fumble forced by **Key Lawrence** and recovered by **Danny Stutsman**).

► Stutsman was the defensive star, finishing with 17 tackles (one shy of his career high), 2.5 tackles for loss, a sack, a QB hurry and the fumble recovery in OU territory. Named Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week on Sunday, he keyed a defensive effort that held the Mustangs to a combined 6-for-20 performance on third and fourth downs.

► The OU defense logged five tackles for loss, five QB hurries and five pass breakups (two PBU's by sophomore linebacker **Jaren Kanak**).

► Freshman defensive back **Peyton Bowen** finished with four tackles, a key fourth-down pass breakup and blocked a punt in SMU territory on its first possession that led to OU's first touchdown of the game. It was the Sooners' first blocked punt since 2020 against Texas (**David Ugwoegbu**).

OU'S ROAD SUCCESS

► Oklahoma has won 30 of its last 37 true road games, with the only losses during that stretch coming in 2019 at Kansas State (48-41), 2020 at Iowa State (37-30), 2021 at Baylor (27-14) and Oklahoma State (37-33), and last season at TCU (55-24), West Virginia (23-20) and Texas Tech (51-48 in overtime). Five of the seven losses were one-score outcomes.

► The 2019 defeat at K-State snapped OU's 22-game true road winning streak (it hadn't lost since Oct 4, 2014, at TCU), which was the second longest such streak nationally since at least the end of World War II. During the 22-game streak, OU outscored foes 1,076-626 (49-28 average) and outgained them by 3,621 yards (583-419 average).

► The Sooners have outgained their opponent in 29 of their last 37 true road games.

► OU has scored at least 30 points in 38 of its last 42 true road games (school-record 35-game streak was stopped in 2021 at Baylor). The next highest total by an FBS team over its last 42 true road contests is 31 (Ohio State and UCF).

NOTING THE NEWBIES

► After adding 47 new players to the program last season, Oklahoma welcomed 65 newcomers for 2023, **Brent Venables'** second season as head coach. Forty of those 65 newcomers are scholarship players. That means 52% of OU's 2023 roster is comprised of first-year Sooners. Ninety-nine of OU's 125 players (79%) are first- or second-year Sooners, with 64 of them on scholarship. Only 26 of 116 players on OU's 2021 end-of-year roster are on the 2023 roster.

► OU hit the transfer portal with frequency in the offseason, adding 21 players for 2023 who transferred from four-year schools. Among the 16 scholarship transfers, nine are on defense and seven on offense. The 21 total transfers played in 447 collective games at their previous schools and made 214 starts.

► Forty first-year Sooners saw the field against Arkansas State or SMU, or both. FIRST-TIME STARTERS

► Forty-five players have made their first appearance in an Oklahoma uniform this season, and 11 players (eight defensive, three offensive) have made their first OU starts this year (10 against Arkansas State and one against SMU). The first-time OU starters were redshirt senior DL **Jacob Lacey** (vs. SMU), redshirt senior OL **Walter Rouse**, junior WR **Andrel Anthony**, junior **RB Tawee Walker**, redshirt senior DE **Rondell Bothroyd**, redshirt senior DL **Da'Jon Terry**, redshirt senior DE **Trace Ford**, redshirt senior DB **Justin Harrington**, redshirt senior DB **Reggie Pearson** and sophomore LB **Jaren Kanak**.

SOONERS PICKED THIRD IN BIG 12

► For just the fourth time in the last 13 years, Oklahoma was not the preseason media choice to win the Big 12 Conference football title in 2023. OU, which has won six of the last eight Big 12 championships, was picked to finish third in the 2023 Big 12 Preseason Poll that was released on July 6. The 2023 season will mark the Sooners' last in the Big 12, as they are slated to join the Southeastern Conference in July 2024.

► OU, which has posted a 61-14 (.813) record against Big 12 opponents over the last eight years (includes a 4-0 record in Big 12 Championship games), received four first-place votes in the poll and 758 total points. Texas, which last won the conference title in 2009, was picked to win the league with 41 first-place votes and 886 total points, while Kansas State, last year's Big 12 champion, was picked to finish second with 14 first-place votes and 858 points. Texas Tech (four first-place votes, 729 points) and TCU (three first-place votes, 727 points) were picked to finish fourth and fifth.

WE RUN IT, TOO

Since the start of the 2014 season, Oklahoma has produced a nation-leading 11 individual 1,000-yard rushing seasons. The next most is eight by four schools. Those 11 OU 1,000-yard rushing performances came from **Samaje Perine**, (2014-16), **Joe Mixon** (2016), **Rodney Anderson** (2017), **Kyler Murray** (2018), **Kennedy Brooks** (2018-19, 2021), **Jalen Hurts** (2019) and **Eric Gray** (2022).

YEAR TWO FOR VENABLES

► The 2023 season marks the second in the head coaching career of **Brent Venables**, who was hired by OU on Dec. 5, 2021, after spending the previous 10 years coordinating Clemson's defense. Venables returned to Norman, where he served as OU's linebackers coach from 1999-2011 (was co-defensive coordinator from 1999-2003 and associate head coach and defensive coordinator from 2004-2011). He has coached in eight national championship games between his time at OU and Clemson (four at each school), winning titles with the Sooners in 2000 and Tigers in 2016 and 2018. In 26 years as a full-time assistant coach, Venables' teams posted 26 winning seasons, won 13 conference titles, went to 30 bowl games (includes four College Football Playoff National Championship games) and won at least 10 games 21 times.

RETURNING ALL-BIG 12 HONOREES

► The Sooners return five players who earned 2022 All-Big 12 honors — two on offense and three on defense. Quarterback **Dillon Gabriel** was named Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year as a redshirt junior after passing for 3,168 yards and 25 touchdowns and rushing for 315 yards and six more scores. And center **Andrew Raym** was an honorable mention all-league selection as a junior after giving up just two sacks on 358 pass-blocking plays in his 10 games (all starts).

► Defensive end **Ethan Downs** earned second-team All-Big 12 accolades as a sophomore when he ranked fourth in the conference with 13.5 tackles for loss (he is the league's leading returner in TFLs). Linebacker **Danny Stutsman** and safety **Billy Bowman** were honorable mention All-Big 12 performers in 2022 as sophomores. Stutsman led the conference and ranked 18th nationally with his 9.6 tackles per game, while Bowman logged 60 tackles and ranked second on the team with three interceptions in 11 games (nine starts).

GABRIEL A TD MACHINE

► Redshirt senior quarterback **Dillon Gabriel**, who has started 39 of his 40 career games between UCF (2019-21) and OU (2022-23), including each of his last 39, ranks second nationally since the start of the 2019 with his 101 touchdown passes despite missing 11 games during the span due to injury (current Notre Dame and former Wake Forest QB Sam Hartman has passed for 104 TDs in two more games).

► Among current players, Gabriel also ranks second nationally since the start of 2019 with his 11,684 passing yards. Hartman is first (11,714 in 42 games) and Oregon's Bo Nix is third (11,490 in 49 games).

► If Gabriel continues to average 2.5 TD passes per contest like he did in his first 38 games entering this season, he would finish with 127 career TDs in a 13-game 2023 season, which he would accomplish in a 51-game career. That would rank seventh in FBS history. **Landry Jones** is the OU record-holder for career passing TDs with 123 in 52 games (**Baker Mayfield** passed for 131 career TDs, but 12 of those were as a Texas Tech Red Raider).

SOONERS REPLACE THREE STARTING OFFENSIVE LINEMEN

► Oklahoma lost three starting offensive linemen from 2022: first-round NFL Draft pick **Anton Harrison** (left tackle), third-round selection **Wanya Morris** (right tackle) and four-year starter **Chris Murray** (right guard). But the Sooners are not without talent and experience among their 2023 group. Redshirt senior guard **McKade Mettauer** has started 43 of his 44 career games, including all 13 for OU last season, and senior **Andrew Raym** has been the Sooners' starter at center the last two seasons (19 career starts). Redshirt junior **Tyler Guyton** made five starts at tackle in 2022 and redshirt sophomore guard **Savion Byrd** saw action in 10 games last season, including the Cheez-It Bowl vs. Florida State (first career start). Those four players started each of OU's first two games this season. The Sooners also welcomed back three other letterwinners in redshirt junior **Aaryn Parks** and sophomores **Jacob Sexton** and **Jake Taylor**.

► OU added three scholarship transfers on the offensive line this year in redshirt seniors **Walter Rouse** and **Caleb Shaffer**, who both arrived in January, and redshirt sophomore **Troy Everett**, who arrived in June. Rouse, who started OU's first two games this season at left tackle, played in 40 games at Stanford over the last four seasons and made 39 starts at left tackle. Shaffer played 40 games at Miami (Ohio) and started 35 at guard. Everett played in 13 games at Appalachian State over the past two seasons, including 10 last year (six starts at center). He was named a second-team freshman All-American last year by The Athletic.

BIG SHOES TO FILL AT RB AND WR

► Opportunities abound for OU at running back and wide receiver in 2023, as the Sooners lost their leading rusher and receiver from last season in **Eric Gray** and **Marvin Mims Jr.**, respectively. Gray was a second-team All-Big 12 pick who rushed for 1,366 yards (the ninth-most in OU single-season history) and 11 touchdowns last year. He led the Big 12 and ranked 14th nationally by averaging 6.4 yards per carry. Mims Jr. earned first-team All-Big 12 honors and racked up 1,083 receiving yards and six TDs. He averaged a Big 12-

high 20.1 yards per catch, which ranked sixth nationally.

► The Sooners returned three scholarship running backs who teamed for 851 yards and 10 touchdowns on 189 carries (4.5 ypc) in 2022. Sophomore **Jovantae Barnes** ran for 533 yards and five TDs, redshirt senior **Marcus Major** rushed for 227 yards and four scores, and redshirt freshman **Gavin Sawchuk** ran for 105 yards and one TD. Major, who has battled injuries during his career, entered the season with 525 career yards and seven TDs. In last year's Cheez-It Bowl vs. Florida State, Barnes (108 yards) and Sawchuk (100) became the first pair of OU freshmen with at least 100 rushing yards in the same game since 1985. The game marked Barnes' first career start and Sawchuk's second career game. Junior walk-on running back **Tawee Walker** played in 11 games last year and rushed for 62 yards. He started this year's opener against Arkansas State (44 yards and two TDs on eight carries) and led OU in rushing against SMU (career-high 117 yards on a career-high 21 carries).

► A pair of four-star freshmen joined the OU running backs room during the spring semester in **Kalib Hicks** and **Daylan Smothers**. Hicks rushed for more than 3,000 yards and 31 TDs during his high school career, while Smothers rushed for 1,581 yards and 28 TDs his junior year alone. Smothers was rated by ESPN as the nation's No. 12 running back in the 2023 class.

► OU returned six lettermen at receiver, led by sixth-year player **Drake Stoops** and junior **Jalil Farooq**. Stoops, who has played in 51 career games and made 20 starts, ranked second on the squad in 2022 with 39 catches while finishing with 393 receiving yards and three TDs. Farooq started 10 games last year and caught 37 passes for 466 yards and five TDs. Other returning lettermen are sophomore **Gavin Freeman** (three catches for 46 yards in 13 games in 2022), who was just placed on scholarship three weeks ago, redshirt junior **LV Bunkley-Shelton** (two catches for 24 yards in 12 games in 2022), sophomore **Jayden Gibson** (one catch for 12 yards in nine games last year) and senior **D.J. Graham**. Graham changed positions from cornerback in the middle of last season and looks to see the field offensively for the first time in his collegiate career.

► Redshirt freshman **Nic Anderson** and a trio of scholarship transfers figure to vie for significant field time this season. Anderson, who was the nation's No. 15 receiver by ESPN as a high school senior, saw action in three games last year. Junior **Andre Anthony**, a starter in each of OU's first two games, transferred from Michigan in January and sophomore **Brenen Thompson** transferred from Texas in June. Anthony caught 19 passes for 328 yards and three TDs in two years in Ann Arbor, while Thompson caught one pass for 32 yards for UT last season. Freshman **Jaquize Pettaway** was a consensus top-100 national player in the 2023 recruiting class (ranked No. 43 by ESPN). His nine receptions against Arkansas State in the season opener tied the OU single-game freshman record.

SECOND-TIME SOONER

► Redshirt senior tight end **Austin Stogner** played his first three seasons as a Sooner before transferring to South Carolina for the 2022 season. Now, after a rare transfer back to the school where he started, he's wrapping up his career in Norman and figures to see plenty of playing time.

► The 6-6, 258-pounder has started 22 career games (all since the start of the 2020 season) and has racked up 68 receptions for 867 yards and nine touchdowns. Eight of those TDs came over his three seasons as a Sooner.

► Stogner started 10 of his 12 games at South Carolina last year, registering 20 catches for 210 yards.

SURVEYING THE DEFENSE

► With 19 returning defensive letterwinners (26 total returning defensive players) and 32 total newcomers (nine transfers, 22 freshmen and one junior college transfer), the Sooners appear to have a deeper and more capable group of players on that side of the ball through two games in 2023.

► OU's 2022 defense tied for fourth nationally with its 104 tackles for loss (8.0 per game) and seventh with its 17 interceptions. Individually, linebacker **Danny Stutsman** led the Big 12 and ranked 14th in the country with his 125 total tackles. Defensive end **Ethan Downs** earned second-team All-Big 12 honors after ranking fourth in the league with 13.5 tackles for loss and tying for the team lead with 4.5 sacks. Both Stutsman and Downs are juniors, as is defensive back **Billy Bowman**, who like Stutsman was an honorable mention all-conference pick and who ranked second on the squad with three interceptions.

► The Sooners returned 17 defensive players who saw action in at least nine games last season. They also welcomed back eight of their top 14 tacklers, five of their top seven tackle-for-loss leaders (four of the top five) and four of their top five sack leaders.

► OU's returning players accounted for 52% of the team's total tackles last year, 61% of its tackles for loss (63.5 of 104), 68% of its sacks (19 of 28), 59% of its interceptions (10 of 17), 50% of its pass breakups (25 of 50), 63% of its QB hurries (31 of 49) and 100% of its forced fumbles (7 of 7) and fumble recoveries (5 of 5).

DEFENSIVE SHOT IN THE ARM

► Oklahoma signed nine defensive scholarship transfers in the offseason, six of them defensive linemen. They are redshirt seniors **Rondell Bothroyd** (Wake Forest), **Trace Ford** (Oklahoma State), **Jacob Lacey**

OU'S 2023 RECRUITING CLASS RANKED AS HIGH AS NO. 4

Head coach Brent Venables and staff hauled in Oklahoma's second-straight top-10 recruiting class in 2023. The class featured 24 scholarship players — 23 during the December signing period and one more in February. The class ranked No. 4 nationally by 247Sports and ESPN, No. 6 by Rivals, and No. 7 by On3.

Of the 24 signees, three were ranked as consensus five-star prospects on a five-star scale by 247Sports, ESPN, On3 and Rivals, 12 were rated a four-star recruit by at least two of the outlets while nine others received three-star designation from at least one of those services.

All but one of the 24 signees were high schoolers (one came from the junior college ranks) and hail from 14 states: five from Texas, three each from Oklahoma and Florida, two each from Missouri and Washington, and one each from California, Colorado, Indiana, Nebraska, New Jersey, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania and Tennessee.

Ten members of the signing class are classified as offensive players and 14 as defensive players.

Thirteen of the Sooners' signees enrolled at OU for the spring semester and participated in team activities. They were quarterback Jackson Arnold, defensive linemen Adepoju Adebawore and Ashton Sanders, running backs Kalib Hicks and Daylan Smothers, offensive linemen Joshua Bates and Cayden Green, linebacker Phil Picciotti and defensive backs Peyton Bowen, Kendel Dolby, Erik McCarty, Makari Vickers and Jasiah Wagoner.

(Notre Dame), **Phil Paea** (Utah State), **Davon Sears** (Texas State) and **Da'Jon Terry** (Tennessee). The sextet combined for 185 games played, 58 starts, 62 tackles for loss and 33.5 sacks. Bothroyd started 31 of his 48 games at Wake Forest and logged 30.5 TFLs and 16.5 sacks. Ford battled through injuries to start 15 of his 32 games and register 11.5 TFLs and 8.5 sacks. Bothroyd has started both games this season, while Ford (Arkansas State), Lacey (SMU) and Terry (Arkansas State) have each started one.

► Linebackers **Dasan McCullough** (Indiana) and **Konnor Near** (Ferris State) earned recognition for their play in 2022, and safety **Reggie Pearson** (Texas Tech) brings a wealth of starting experience to the OU program. McCullough was named a freshman All-American as a true frosh last year from ESPN, The Athletic (second team) and College Football News (second team). Playing in all 12 games and making four starts, he registered 49 tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss, 4.0 sacks and three pass breakups. Near was a first-team All-Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Association pick at Ferris State, registering 66 tackles, 10.5 TFLs, and 3.0 sacks and helping the Bulldogs to their second straight Division II national title. FSU went 28-1 the last two seasons. Pearson, who has started both games this year, is in his sixth season of college football after spending his first three years at Wisconsin and the last two at Texas Tech. He started 20 of 23 games the last two years for the Red Raiders, racking up 109 tackles, three interceptions and seven pass breakups. He also started 13 of 14 games for Wisconsin in 2019 and logged 60 tackles, 3.5 TFLs, two forced fumbles and four PBUs.

A QUICK LOOK AT SPECIAL TEAMS

► Oklahoma returns placekicker **Zach Schmit**, but has new players at punter, long snapper and holder for the first time in years. To that end, the Sooners are relying on returning roster players and incoming transfers to fill the all-important roles in the kicking game. Schmit, who made all 57 PAT attempts and 13 of 19 field goal tries last season, has again won the job, beating out redshirt freshman **Gavin Marshall** and transfer **Redi Mustafaraj**. **Josh Plaster** and transfers **Luke Elzinga** (a three-time All-MAC performer at Central Michigan) have each punted this season, with Plaster taking the field on longer punt opportunities and Elzinga on shorter-yardage situations. Returning team members **Ben Anderson** (primary) and **Ethan Lane** (backup) are the team's long snappers.

► The Sooners lost a pair of key special teamers in first-team All-Big 12 punter **Michael Turk**, who set OU records for punting average in a game (59.7 yards on three punts in 2021 against TCU), season (51.2 yards in 2021) and a career (48.4). And **Kasey Kelleher** served as the team's long snapper on all punts and all but two place kicks over the past five seasons.

LAST GO-ROUND IN BIG 12

► With the Sooners set to join the Southeastern Conference on July 1, 2024, the 2023 football season will mark their last in the Big 12 Conference. OU has won more than half of the Big 12's football championships (14 of 27) since the league began in 1996, and has posted a 180-59 (.753) record against conference competition (includes an 11-1 record in Big 12 Championship games).

► Oklahoma's 14 Big 12 titles are 11 more than the programs with the next most (Baylor, Kansas State and Texas have three each). Going back to and including 2010, OU has won eight Big 12 titles and is followed by Baylor and Kansas State (three each) and Oklahoma State and TCU (one each).

► Four new programs will make their Big 12 debuts in 2023, with BYU, Cincinnati, Houston and UCF joining the league. OU will host UCF on Oct. 21 and play at Cincinnati on Sept. 23 and at BYU on Nov. 18.

FIVE 2023 NFL DRAFTEES

► Oklahoma had five players picked in the 2023 NFL Draft, all on the offensive side of the ball and one in each of the first three rounds. **Anton Harrison** became OU's first offensive lineman taken in the first round since 2013 when he was selected with the No. 27 overall pick by the Jacksonville Jaguars. He also became the 10th offensive lineman drafted in nine years under O-line coach Bill Bedenbaugh. Harrison was followed by wide receiver **Marvin Mims Jr.** in the second round (Denver Broncos), offensive lineman **Wanya Morris** in the third round (Kansas City Chiefs), running back **Eric Gray** in the fifth round (New York Giants) and tight end **Brayden Willis** in the seventh round (San Francisco 49ers). Since 2000, 116 Sooners have been selected, which is 36 more than the next-closest Big 12 program during that span (Texas, 80).

HEISMAN U

► Quarterbacks **Baker Mayfield** and **Kyler Murray** became Oklahoma's sixth and seventh Heisman Trophy winners in 2017 and '18, respectively, moving the Sooners into a tie with Notre Dame and Ohio State for the most Heisman winners (USC now has seven as well). Other OU winners were QB **Sam Bradford** in 2008, QB **Jason White** in 2003, RB **Billy Sims** in 1978, RB **Steve Owens** in 1969 and RB **Billy Vessels** in 1952.

► Quarterback **Jalen Hurts** was the 2019 Heisman Trophy runner-up and became Oklahoma's 11th Heisman finalist, tied with Alabama for most of any school (finalists were first named in 1982). Miami (Fla.) and Ohio State rank third with nine finalists and Florida ranks fifth with eight.

► OU boasts a nation-leading 10 Heisman finalists in the last 23 years (since 2000). Alabama ranks second

with nine, Ohio State ranks third with six and Stanford is fourth with five.

► Oklahoma is the only program to ever produce five Heisman finalists in a four-year period (Hurts in 2019 [runner-up], Murray in 2018 [won], Mayfield in 2017 [won] and Mayfield [finished third] and receiver **Dede Westbrook** [finished fourth] in 2016). With Mayfield's and Murray's wins, OU is the only program to produce different quarterback winners in consecutive seasons.

► OU is tied for the most Heisman runners-up, as well (six). OU's second-place Heisman finishers were **Kurt Burris** (1954), **Greg Pruitt** (1972), Sims (1979), **Josh Heupel** (2000), **Adrian Peterson** (2004) and Hurts (2019).

► Oklahoma has produced four Heisman Trophy winners in the last 20 years. Only four other programs have produced four winners ever (Notre Dame, Ohio State and USC seven and Alabama four).

► An OU quarterback finished in the top four of Heisman voting in five consecutive years (Mayfield fourth in 2015, third in 2016 and first in 2017; Murray first in 2018; Hurts second in 2019).

OU'S BIG 12 DOMINATION

► OU's 14 Big 12 titles are 11 more than the program with the next most. Baylor, Kansas State and Texas have each won three Big 12 championships and are followed by Nebraska (two) and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each). Colorado and Nebraska left the Big 12 after the 2010 season and Texas A&M departed after the 2011 campaign.

► Oklahoma's win over Iowa State in the 2020 Big 12 Championship resulted in the Sooners' sixth straight Big 12 title and 14th since 2000 (no other program has won more than two during the span). For perspective, the two Power Five programs with the next most conference titles this millennium are Ohio State (11 in Big Ten) and Oregon (eight in Pac-10/Pac-12).

► Since 2010, OU has won eight Big 12 titles and is followed by Baylor (three), Kansas State (two), Oklahoma State and TCU (one each).

► Since 2000, OU has won more Big 12 championships (14) than it has lost home games (13).

► Oklahoma is 57-14 (.803) in regular season Big 12 play since the start of the 2015 season. Oklahoma State ranks second during that period (.46-26; .639), TCU third (42-30; .583), Texas fourth (38-33; .535) and Kansas State fifth (37-35; .514).

► Oklahoma is the only program to win at least three straight Big 12 titles, and it has done so twice (2006-08 and 2015-20). Baylor (2013-14) is the only other program to win two Big 12 championships in a row.

► At 11-1, the Sooners are the only program with a winning record in Big 12 Championship games. Texas (3-3), Kansas State (2-2) and Baylor (1-1) have the next best marks.

► Every OU freshman class from 1999-2020 has won at least one Big 12 title and all but the 2011 and 2020-22 freshman classes have won at least two. The 2015, 2016 and 2017 freshman classes each won four Big 12 titles.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (692) than any other program (next most is 658 by Alabama).

► Oklahoma has finished in the top 5 of the AP poll a nation-leading 33 times (Ohio State is second with 30).

► OU leads all FBS programs with 50 all-time conference championships. The rest of the top five includes Nebraska (46), Michigan (44), Ohio State (39) and USC (37). The Sooners' 14 league titles since 2000 are the most among Power Five programs (Ohio State ranks second with 11).

► No program has more all-time 11-win seasons than Oklahoma's 27. And since the start of the 2000 season, OU and Ohio State have produced a nation-leading 18 campaigns of at least 10 wins.

► Since former head coach **Bob Stoops** arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads the country with its 12,337 points scored, which is 585 more than second-place Boise State (11,752) and 947 more than third-place Oregon (11,390).

► OU's 80 consensus All-Americans since 1950 are the most nationally (Alabama ranks second with 75 and Ohio State third with 72). Since 2000, the Sooners have produced 30 consensus All-Americans, second only to Alabama.

► OU is the only program that has produced at least four NFL Draft picks each of the last 16 years.

EXTRA POINTS

► The Sooners are 17-2 all-time as the No. 19-ranked team in the AP poll (4-2 on the road). Oklahoma's last game played as the 19th-ranked team was in 2020 (63-9 victory over Kansas in Norman), and its last road contest was in 2015 (55-0 win at Kansas State). The two losses came in 1959 and 1991, both at Nebraska (25-21 in 1959 and 19-14 in 1991). The average margin of OU's 17 victories as the AP's 19th-ranked team is 31 points (average score of 41-10).

► OU had 15 scoring drives of 10-plus plays in 2022 but already has seven through two games this season. Related, the Sooners ranked 126th out of 130 teams last year in time of possession (26:23 per game). So far this season, they rank 32nd by averaging a 32:18 TOP figure.

► Since the start of the 2014 season, Oklahoma leads the nation with its 5.5 yards per rush and ranks fifth nationally (second in Power Five) with its 305 rushing TDs.

► OU has won 84 of its last 85 games when holding opponents to 23 or fewer points. The one exception was a 23-20 loss at West Virginia last season.

► Since the start of the 2012 season, OU is 85-7 when scoring at least 35 points and 74-4 when scoring at least 40. The Sooners are 183-0 all-time when scoring at least 50 points.

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and a 62-foot-by-38-foot video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals, is hosting football games for the 99th year this season. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.
- In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and 83,489 (2016). With last year's widening of aisles and some seats, capacity dropped to 80,126.
- In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

- The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489. The addition of handrails and some seat and aisle widening in 2019 reduced capacity to 80,126.
- The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons also benefit from two new clubs.
- Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.
- A significantly larger and more detailed video board has replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The new board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

BRENT VENABLES

NAMED OU'S 23RD HEAD COACH DEC. 5, 2021 • FORMER K-STATE/OKLAHOMA/CLEMSON ASSISTANT THREE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS (ONE WITH OKLAHOMA, TWO WITH CLEMSON) EIGHT NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME APPEARANCES • COACHED IN 33 BOWL GAMES 13 CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS • THREE-TIME BROYLES AWARD FINALIST (2016 WINNER)

A former 13-year University of Oklahoma assistant coach who won a national championship with the Sooners and two more with Clemson University during an ultra-successful 10-year stint as defensive coordinator, Brent Venables was named OU's 23rd head football coach Dec. 5, 2021.

The 52-year-old Venables served as co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Oklahoma from 1999-2003 and as associate head coach, defensive coordinator and linebackers coach from 2004-11 under former head coach Bob Stoops. Venables has coached in eight national championship games between his time at OU and Clemson, winning titles with the Sooners in 2000 and Tigers in 2016 and 2018. In 26 years as a full-time assistant coach, Venables' teams produced 26 winning seasons, won 13 conference titles, went to 30 bowl games (includes four College Football Playoff National Championship games) and won at least 10 games 22 times.

After joining Clemson prior to the 2012 season, Venables constructed one of the nation's top defenses. From 2012-2021, the Tigers ranked first nationally in sacks (445; next most was 392) and opponent third-down conversion percentage (30.2%), second in opponent pass efficiency rating (111.1) and takeaways (244; tied), third in scoring defense (17.8 ppg) and opponent completion percentage (53.3), fourth in total defense (311.4 ypg) and pass defense (190.5 ypg), fifth in interceptions (148) and sixth in rushing defense (120.9 ypg). They won conference titles each year from 2015-20.

Since 2000, Venables has coached eight national award winners and 16 consensus All-Americans. In that time, 57 defensive players under his guidance have been selected in the NFL Draft (12 first-rounders), including 15 linebackers, two of whom were first-round picks.

As a defensive coordinator and linebackers coach, Venables produced winners of three Butkus Awards (OU's Rocky Calmus in 2001 and Teddy Lehman in 2003, and CU's Isaih Simmons in 2019), two Nagurski Awards (OU's Roy Williams in 2001 and Derrick Strait in 2003), two Thorpe Awards (Williams in 2001 and Strait in 2003) and one Bednarik Award (Lehman in 2003). And in 2018, Clemson defensive tackle Christian Wilkins became the school's first winner of William V. Campbell Trophy, also known as the "Academic Heisman."

Venables has received national accolades for his coaching and recruiting. He received the Frank Broyles Award in 2016 as the nation's top assistant coach after being named a finalist in 2015. He was named FootballScoop's Defensive Coordinator of the Year in 2014 and Rivals.com's Recruiter of the Year in 2015.

Venables' defensive units were remarkably consistent during his 10 years with the Tigers. Each of his last eight Clemson defenses ranked in the top 15 nationally in yards allowed and seven of the last eight ranked in the top 20 in points allowed. Over his last eight years there, his units ranked first (in 2014), 10th, eighth, fourth, fifth, sixth, 15th and ninth (in 2021) in total defense. Additionally, his units ranked first or second in the ACC in total defense each of his last eight years (ranked first in six of those seasons).

Under Venables' tutelage in 2021, Clemson ranked second nationally in scoring defense (15.0 ppg) and red zone defense (62.1 conversion percentage), fourth in sacks (3.4 per game), eighth in rushing defense (98.8 ypg) and ninth in total defense (308.4 ypg).

Venables' 2020 Clemson defense tied for the national lead with 46 sacks, despite no player producing more

than 4.5 sacks individually. His 2019 unit allowed fewer than 300 yards of total offense in each of its first 12 games of the season, the first defense nationally since at least 1996 to accomplish that feat. Clemson held 16 straight opponents to 20 or fewer points across the 2018-19 seasons, the best streak at the school since the 1937-40 seasons.

Clemson's 2018 squad led the nation in scoring defense (13.1 ppg) for the first time in school history and set a program record by recording 54 sacks.

Venables' Clemson defenses ranked among the top 10 nationally in sacks each year from 2014-21 and ranked in the top 10 in tackles for loss from 2013-20. The units led the nation in TFLs every year from 2013-16.

From 1999-2011, Venables helped OU to the 2000 national championship, three other national championship game appearances (2003, '04 and '08) and seven Big 12 titles. He was a finalist for the Broyles Award in 2006 when the Sooners led the Big 12 in total defense and scoring defense.

Oklahoma linebackers under Venables earned three Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year awards, five Big 12 Defensive Newcomer of the Year accolades and six first-team All-America honors. Ten of his OU linebackers — and 31 defensive players overall — were taken in the 2000-12 NFL Drafts.

While Venables was an Oklahoma assistant, the Sooners ranked among the top 16 nationally in total defense eight times (including each year from 2000-06) and among the top 20 in scoring defense eight times. OU led the Big 12 in scoring defense on four occasions (2000, '04, '06 and '11) and topped the conference in total defense three times (2003, '04, and '06).

Prior to joining Stoops' first staff at OU, Venables coached linebackers at Kansas State (1996-98), serving as defensive running game coordinator in 1998, and was a graduate assistant at K-State under Bill Snyder from 1993-95.

As a player at Kansas State (1991-92), Venables earned honorable mention All-Big Eight honors in 1992 after registering 124 tackles. He began his collegiate playing career at Garden City (Kan.) Community College (1989-90), where he earned All-America honors after recording 276 tackles and was inducted into the school's athletics hall of fame in April 2023.

A native of Salina, Kan., Venables received his bachelor's degree in political science from Kansas State in 1992. He and his wife Julie have four children: sons Jake and Tyler and daughters Laney and Addie.

NORMAN — Including an 82-yard punt return, Oklahoma scored on each of its first 11 possessions (10 touchdowns) in a 73-0 season-opening home win over Arkansas State. It was OU's largest victory margin in a season opener in 106 years.

OU's .909 completion percentage (30 of 33) set a school record (min. 15 attempts). Redshirt senior Dillon Gabriel was 19 for 22 for 308 yards and two touchdowns in one half of action while freshman Jackson Arnold, who celebrated his 19th birthday, was 11 for 11 for 114 yards and one TD in his collegiate debut. Gabriel and Arnold also each ran for a TD.

Sophomore Gavin Freeman's punt return touchdown was OU's first since 2016 and the second longest in an OU season opener. He became just the fourth Sooner to score a TD on his first career punt return and added his first career receiving score on a seven-yard play in the first quarter.

Junior running back Tawee Walker made his first career start and logged his first career rushing touchdowns, scoring from 1 yard in both the second and third quarters. He ran for 44 yards on eight carries. Other Sooners who scored their first career TDs were sophomore receiver Jayden Gibson (21-yard catch) and freshman running back Kalib Hicks (6-yard rush).

Freshman receiver Jaquaze Pettaway caught nine passes in his debut, most in the Big 12 and tied for fifth most nationally on the week. He finished with 56 yards.

NORMAN — No. 18/17 Oklahoma did not allow a touchdown until the fourth quarter and quarterback Dillon Gabriel passed for four touchdowns in a 28-11 home win over SMU.

The OU defense was stingy for the second straight week, extending its touchdownless streak to seven quarters. The Sooners registered two takeaways — a fumble forced by defensive back Key Lawrence and recovered by linebacker Danny Stutsman, and an interception by defensive back Justin Harrington.

Stutsman led OU with 17 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and a sack, while linebacker Kip Lewis notched nine stops.

Gabriel completed 19 of 27 pass attempts for 176 yards touchdown passes to receiver Andre Anthony (29 yards), tight end Blake Smith (2 yards), receiver Jalil Farooq (21 yards) and running back Marcus Major (27 yards). He surpassed 100 career touchdown passes and notched his 10th career contest with at least four TD throws.

Running back Tawee Walker rushed for a career-high 117 yards on 21 carries while Major carried eight times for 39 yards and caught two passes totaling 23 yards. Anthony led the Sooners with 76 yards on a career-high seven receptions.

Oklahoma scored on its second possession of the game when Gabriel found Anthony wide open down the middle of the field. OU extended its lead to 14-3 with a 13-play, 94-yard drive that culminated with Gabriel's two-yard toss to Smith.

After SMU cut the margin to 14-11 with a touchdown and two-point conversion with 12:09 to play, the Sooners scored on back-to-back possessions to pull away. Harrington's interception at the OU 20-yard line secured the victory.
