OPENING KICK

► No. 16/16 Oklahoma (1-0) plays its second straight home game to open the 2024 season when it hosts Houston (0-1) on Saturday at 6:45 p.m. CT at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium in Norman. The game will be televised by SEC Network with **Tom Hart**, **Jordan Rodgers** and **Cole Cubelic** announcing.

► Saturday's game is part of a two-game home-and-home series, with OU slated to play at Houston's TDECU Stadium on Sept. 16, 2028.

► The Sooners and Cougars were both members of the Big 12 Conference in 2023, but did not meet. Before OU joined the SEC on July 1, it spent 28 years in the Big 12 and won 14 league titles.

► The 2024 season marks the 130th in OU football history. The Sooners lead the nation with their 50 all-time conference championships, 27 11-plus-win seasons (tied), 33 AP top-five finishes and five No. 1 overall NFL Draft picks (tied). They rank second with their seven Heisman Trophy winners (tied), third with seven AP national championships, their 101 weeks as the AP's No. 1 team and 431 total weeks in the AP Top 5, and fourth with their 57 bowl appearances, 31 bowl wins (tied) and 417 NFL Draft picks.

► Saturday's contest will mark the 1,340th in OU history. The Sooners rank fifth in college football annals with their .725 all-time winning percentage (945-341-53 record). They trail Ohio State (.734), Michigan (.734), Alabama (.733) and Notre Dame (.730). Since the end of World War II (1946 season to present), OU leads all programs with 701 wins (31 more than Alabama, the program with the next most) and owns a .766 winning percentage.

► Going back to the start of the 1998 campaign, Oklahoma is 25-1 in its second game of the season. The lone loss during the stretch came in 2020 when unranked Kansas State beat No. 3 OU 38-35 in Norman.

► The Sooners are coming off a 51-3 season-opening home win over Temple in which they registered six takeaways and converted them into 34 points. It was the first Friday night home game in program history.

► Houston, which finished 4-8 overall and 2-7 in the Big 12 Conference last season, lost 27-7 at home to UNLV on Saturday. The Cougars were outgained 308 yards to 247.



Sophomore QB Jackson Arnold became just the third Sooner to ever pass for at least four TDs in a first career home start, completing 17 of 25 passes (68%) for 141 yards, four scores and no interceptions in a 51-3 home win over Temple on Friday, Aug. 30. The Sooners gave up just 197 yards on the night and racked up six takeaways.

KEY STORYLINES

► The Sooners have beaten Houston three times in their four meetings. OU's victories over the Cougars came in 1981 (40-14 in the Sun Bowl in El Paso, Texas), 2004 (63-13 in Norman; OU was ranked No. 2) and 2019 (49-31 in Norman in most recent matchup; OU was ranked No. 4). No. 15 Houston posted a 33-23 win over the No. 3 Sooners in the 2016 season opener at NRG Stadium in Houston.

► Saturday's game will mark the third time for Oklahoma to face Houston head coach **Willie Fritz** in four seasons. The Sooners hosted Tulane in 2017 and in the 2021 season opener when Fritz was the Green Wave's head coach. In 2017, OU cruised to a 56-14 win by outscoring Tulane 42-0 after the game was tied at 14 at the end of the first quarter. The 2021 contest, which was originally scheduled to be played in New Orleans but was moved to Norman due to Hurricane Ida, saw No. 2 OU survive 40-35. The Sooners led 37-14 at halftime.

► Eighty-two Sooners played in Friday's season opener against Temple and 33 of them are in their first year at Oklahoma. Eleven players (seven offensive and four defensive) made their first OU starts: OL **Geirean Hatchett**, **Branson Hickman**, **Febechi Nwaiwu** and **Michael Tarquin**, WR **Deion Burks** and **Brenen Thompson**, TE **Bauer Sharp**, DB **Dez Malone** and DL **Jayden Jackson**, **R Mason Thomas** and **Damon Williams**. Jackson is the only freshman.

► Of the 78 players on OU's week 1 depth chart, 24 (or 31%) are freshmen. That includes 17 true freshmen and seven redshirts.

► After ranking second nationally last season with 26 takeaways and with 111 points off takeaways (ranked first with 8.5 points per game), OU forced Temple into six turnovers and converted them into 34 points. The six takeaways led the nation in week one, as did the +6 turnover margin (only one other team had better than a +3 margin).

RECAPPING THE WIN OVER TEMPLE

► In the program's first-ever Friday night home game, Oklahoma excelled in all three phases of a 51-3 win over Temple. It was the fourth time in head coach **Brent Venables'** 27-game tenure the Sooners did not give up a touchdown.

► Offensively, sophomore quarterback **Jackson Arnold** completed 17 of 25 passes (68%) for 141 yards and four touchdowns with no interceptions. He became just the third Sooner to ever pass for at least four TDs in their first career home start, joining **Josh Heupel** in 1999 and **Spencer Rattler** in 2020.

► Three of Arnold's TDs went to redshirt junior **Deion Burks**. The receiver finished with six catches for 36 yards and became the first Sooner to catch three TD passes in a season opener and the first OU player to haul in three TDs in his school debut. The Purdue transfer's scoring grabs covered 14, 8 and 5 yards. Arnold also threw a 14-yard TD pass to Southeastern Louisiana tight end transfer **Bauer Sharp** on OU's opening drive.

► The Sooners averaged 6.1 yards per rush and were led by freshman **Taylor Tatum**, who racked up 69 yards on just five carries (13.8 average), including a game-long 35-yarder and an eight-yard TD. Redshirt junior **Sam Franklin** carried four times for 45 yards (11.2 average; long of 30) and junior **Jovantae Barnes** carried five times for 33 yards (6.6 average).

► On defense, OU held the Owls to 197 yards and 3.2 yards per play. Temple gained 128 yards on 12-of-25 passing and 69 yards on 36 rushes (1.9 average).

► The Sooners registered six takeaways on the night, their most since 2003. After recovering six fumbles all of last season, they recovered four against Temple (most nationally on the week), and added two INTs. Junior linebacker **Jaren Kanak** returned one of the recoveries (on an Owls punt return) 21 yards for a touchdown.

► The game was OU's first since 1987 to finish +6 in turnover margin. The Sooners converted all six takeaways into points (34 total).

► Sixth-year kicker **Tyler Keltner**, who transferred from Florida State, was 3 for 3 on field goals (50, 42 and 24 yards) and made all six PAT tries in his OU debut. He was named SEC Special Teams Player of the Week.

► OU finished with six sacks and nine tackles for loss. Redshirt freshman **Markus Strong** notched solo sacks on each of the game's last two plays.

LAST TIME VS. HOUSTON

► Making his Oklahoma debut, graduate transfer quarterback **Jalen Hurts** accounted for 508 yards of offense to Houston's 408 in a 49-31 home win over the Cougars on the night of Sunday, Sept. 1, 2019. He was named Big 12 Player and Newcomer of the Week and Maxwell Award Player of the Week.

► Hurts was 20 for 23 through the air for 332 yards and three touchdowns while running 16 times for a career-high 176 yards (11.0 average) and three more scores. His 508 yards of total offense were 112 more than the previous school record for a Sooner debut, held by **Baker Mayfield** (396 vs. Akron in 2015). The total offense figure represented the fifth-highest total by an OU player in any game and the second highest by a Sooner at home (Mayfield had 572 vs. Tulsa in 2015). No Sooner has posted a higher total since.

- ▶ Hurts became the first Sooner to ever throw for at least 300 yards and rush for at least 150 in a game. He also became the first player in Big 12 history to throw for at least 300 and rush for at least 150 while completing at least 80% of his passes.
- ▶ Hurts' 176 rushing yards were the second-most by an OU quarterback. Only **Thomas Lott** (195 vs. Kansas State in 1976) ran for more in a game.
- ▶ OU's 686 yards were its most ever in a season opener.
- ▶ The Sooners registered 13 first downs on 17 first-quarter plays and 20 first downs on 35 first-half plays.
- ▶ Junior linebacker **Kenneth Murray** led the Sooners with 13 tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss while recording a pass breakup and a quarterback hurry. Sophomore defensive lineman **Ronnie Perkins** registered seven tackles, 1.0 sack, 2.0 TFLs and a forced fumble.

HOME IS WHERE THE "W" IS

▶ Oklahoma is 141-13 (.916) at Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium since the start of the 1999 season, giving the Sooners more conference championships during the period (14) than home defeats. It is the best home winning percentage in the country over the last 25-plus seasons (Boise State [.904] and Ohio State [.895] are next). OU has outscored its opponents by an average of 43-18 in those games.

▶ The Sooners have posted 153 straight sellouts of originally scheduled home games, dating back to the start of the 1999 season (**Bob Stoops'** first as head coach). Only Nebraska (397) has a longer current streak.

HELLO, SEC

▶ Oklahoma and Texas officially joined the Southeastern Conference on July 1 after 28 years in the Big 12 Conference. OU won half of the Big 12's football championships (14 of 28) since the league began in 1996 (six of the last nine) and posted a 187-61 (.754) record against conference competition (includes an 11-1 record in Big 12 Championship games).

▶ Oklahoma's 14 Big 12 titles were 10 more than the program with the next most (Texas won four). From 2010 through 2023, OU won eight Big 12 titles and was followed by Baylor (three), Kansas State (two) and Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas (one each).

▶ The Sooners are no strangers to their new SEC foes as Oklahoma has a 161-112-13 (.586) record against the league's current member schools, including fellow new entrant Texas. Not including the Longhorns, OU owns a 110-49-8 (.683) all-time record against current SEC programs.

▶ Sept. 21, 2024, will mark Oklahoma's first conference game as an SEC member when it hosts Tennessee, which is coached by former Sooner All-America quarterback and Heisman Trophy runner-up **Josh Heupel**, who led OU to the 2000 national title. Other league home games will be against South Carolina (Oct. 19) and Alabama (Nov. 23). The first SEC edition of the Red River Rivalry against Texas in Dallas is scheduled for Oct. 12 at the Cotton Bowl.

ONE OF NATION'S TOUGHEST SCHEDULES

▶ Oklahoma's 2024 schedule is not for the faint of heart. The Sooners will face six opponents ranked in the top 15 of the preseason AP poll — tied with Florida for the most nationally — and eight total teams that made bowl games last year, including College Football Playoff participants Alabama and Texas. OU's opponents in the preseason AP top 15 are No. 3 Texas (in Dallas), No. 4 Alabama (home), No. 6 Ole Miss (road), No. 11 Missouri (road), No. 13 LSU (road) and No. 15 Tennessee (home). All six squads made bowl games last season, as did Auburn and Tulane (both are receiving votes in the AP poll).

▶ For just the seventh time in program history, OU will play seven home games in 2024. The Sooners are also the designated home team for the Allstate Red River Rivalry against Texas in Dallas on Oct. 12. The other six seasons in which Oklahoma played seven home games were: 1991, 2001, '03, '07, '18 and '21.

NEW (BUT FAMILIAR) COORDINATORS

▶ The 2024 OU coaching staff features new play-callers on both sides of the ball. Following the departure of former offensive coordinator Jeff Lebby who is now Mississippi State's head coach, Oklahoma head coach **Brent Venables** announced in December that **Seth Littrell** was promoted to offensive coordinator and tight ends coach **Joe Jon Finley** was elevated to co-offensive coordinator. Littrell, who was an offensive analyst for the Sooners in 2023 following a seven-year head coaching stint at North Texas, is OU's quarterbacks coach and serves as offensive play-caller. Finley, entering his fourth season on OU's staff, will continue to coach tight ends and is playing an increased role in offensive game-planning and oversight.

▶ In January, Venables announced the hiring of **Zac Alley** as co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach. Alley joined OU's program after spending the last two seasons as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Jacksonville State. He also served the 2021 season in the same capacity at ULM. The 31-year-old is extremely familiar with Venables, having worked under him for four years (2015-18) as a graduate assistant at Clemson when Venables was defensive coordinator and linebackers coach. In those four seasons, with Alley working primarily with the defensive tackles and linebackers, Clemson posted a 55-4 (.932) record (tied with Alabama for the nation's best during that span) and won four Atlantic Coast Conference titles and two national championships (2016 and 2018).

40 SCHOLARSHIP NEWCOMERS

► Of the Sooners' 127 players, 40 are scholarship newcomers. That includes 27 December high school signees and 13 transfers. Thirty-two of the 40 (20 freshmen and 12 transfers) enrolled at OU in January and participated in spring practices.

► Twenty-four of the 40 scholarship newcomers are offensive players and 16 are defensive players.

► The 13 scholarship transfers entered the season having combined to make 258 collegiate starts (182 starts among 10 players on offense and 76 starts among three players on defense).

RETURNING ALL-CONFERENCE HONOREES

► The Sooners return three players in 2024 who earned 2023 All-Big 12 honors, all three of them seniors on the defensive side of the ball. Defensive back **Billy Bowman Jr.** was a first-team All-Big 12 honoree after ranking third in the nation with six interceptions a season ago, with an NCAA-best and school-record three returned for touchdowns (238 INT return yards). Linebacker **Danny Stutsman**, also voted first-team All-Big 12 in 2023, led the Sooners in total tackles (104), solo tackles (51) and tackles for loss (16.0), and registered three sacks, an interception, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. Defensive end **Ethan Downs** earned second-team All-Big 12 accolades for the second straight year after he totaled 28 tackles, a team-high 4.5 sacks, 6.5 tackles for loss, one interception and six QB hurries.

► Bowman Jr. and Stutsman were 2024 preseason first-team All-SEC picks by league head coaches and media.

2023 REWIND

► Oklahoma finished 10-3 in 2023 and tied for second in the Big 12 with a 7-2 league mark. The Sooners made their school-record 25th consecutive bowl appearance (nation's second-longest current streak), facing No. 14 Arizona in the Alamo Bowl in San Antonio, Texas.

► OU's victory total gave it 42 all-time seasons of at least 10 wins, one behind national leader Alabama.

► The Sooners ranked No. 3 nationally in total offense (507.0 ypg) and No. 4 in scoring offense (41.7 ppg). They were the only team in the country to score at least 59 points in four games or more. OU also ranked No. 6 in passing offense (324.8 ypg) and pass efficiency rating (167.5), No. 7 in third-down conversion percentage (49.2) and No. 12 in fourth-down conversion percentage (68.4).

► Super senior **Drake Stoops** and redshirt freshman **Nic Anderson** were one of just five duos from the same team (the only one in the Big 12) to each register double-digit receiving touchdowns (each had 10).

► On the other side of the ball, OU led the country with their 1.5 interceptions per game (20 total pickoffs) and ranked No. 7 in tackles for loss per contest (7.5), No. 14 in opponent third-down conversion percentage (31.1) and No. 17 in pass efficiency defense rating (118.6). It ranked No. 46 in scoring defense (23.5 ppg), which was down considerably from 2022 when it ranked No. 98 (30.0 ppg).

► OU tied for the national lead with its 11 different players registering at least one interception.

► The Sooners finished No. 2 nationally with 26 takeaways, No. 4 with 2.0 takeaways per game and No. 23 with their +0.46 turnover margin per contest.

► In its 10 wins, OU outscored opponents 98-17 off turnovers. On the year, the Sooners' 111 points off takeaways ranked No. 2 nationally behind national champion Michigan, which had 122 in two more games.

REVAMPED QB ROOM

► Oklahoma's quarterbacks room looks drastically different than it did last year, with only one returning signal-caller on this year's roster and first-year offensive coordinator **Seth Littrell** serving as quarterbacks coach. The lone returning QB is sophomore **Jackson Arnold**, the 2022-23 Gatorade National Football Player of the Year, who has taken over for two-year starter and unanimous 2023 first-team All-Big 12 honoree Dillon Gabriel. A graduate transfer, Gabriel, who is now at Oregon, entered the year ranked fourth in FBS history in career touchdowns accounted for (152), seventh in career passing yards (14,865) and eighth in career passing TDs (125).

► Arnold played in seven games as a true freshman last season, completing 44 of 69 passes for 563 yards and four touchdowns, and rushing 31 times for 116 yards and a score. He started in the Alamo Bowl against No. 14 Arizona and threw for 361 yards and a pair of touchdowns. He also played the entire second half at BYU on Nov. 18, directing OU from a 17-17 halftime tie to a 31-24 win.

► **Casey Thompson**, who is believed to be first seventh-year offensive player in OU history, spent four years at Texas, before transferring for one year each to Nebraska and Florida Atlantic. A starter in 23 of his 35 career games, Thompson has completed 63.5% of his passes for 5,338 yards and 52 touchdowns, and has rushed

SOONERS TO WEAR THROWBACK ALTERNATE UNIFORM VS. HOUSTON

Oklahoma will wear a brand new alternate uniform for Saturday's game against Houston. Drawing inspiration from the uniforms of the dominant Bud Wilkinson era, the new 2024 alternate ensemble features crimson jerseys with white numerals, white tri-stripes on the shoulder sleeves and SEC and Jordan Brand patches. The uniform also includes crimson striping on the sides of the white pants and on the top of the logo-free white helmet. The helmet stripe is painted as opposed to a decal.

The alternate uniform is representative of the one worn by OU teams from 1946-56 and closely resembles the "Sooner Legacy" uniform OU donned Aug. 30, 2003, in a 37-3 season-opening home win over North Texas.

As part of the 100th-year celebration of Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, each 2024 home game will feature a different theme, with the Houston game spotlighting the hugely successful Wilkinson era.

Wilkinson coached the Sooners from 1947-63 and compiled a 145-29-4 (.826) record. The 1969 College Football Hall of Fame inductee led Oklahoma to 47 consecutive wins from the 1953 to 1957 seasons, still the longest streak in FBS history. Wilkinson, who compiled a 40-11 combined record against rivals Nebraska (14-3), Oklahoma State (17-0) and Texas (9-8), directed OU to its first three AP national championships in 1950, 1955 and 1956. The 1956 squad is often regarded as Wilkinson's finest, and possibly the best in program history. It went 10-0, posted six shutouts and outscored opponents 466-51.

Wilkinson is the only individual in NCAA annals to win three national titles as both a player (1934-1936 with Minnesota) and a head coach.

for 191 yards and 10 TDs. His father, Charles, was an OU quarterback from 1986-88 under head coach **Barry Switzer**, and his brother, Kendal, was a Sooners QB from 2011-13 under head coach **Bob Stoops**.

► Freshmen **Michael Hawkins Jr.** and **Brendan Zurbrugg** joined the program as mid-year enrollees in January. Hawkins Jr. was rated as a four-star prospect by ESPN, On3 and Rivals and as the No. 3 dual-threat QB recruit in the country by Rivals and No. 7 by ESPN. His father, Michael, played cornerback for Oklahoma under Stoops in 2002 before spending multiple years in the NFL. Zurbrugg was a consensus three-star prospect who was rated as the No. 18 dual-threat quarterback in 2023 class by ESPN and the No. 30 quarterback overall by On3.

► Redshirt-freshman **Steele Wasel**, from Choctaw, Okla., transferred from Akron. As a high school senior, the former all-state honoree passed for 3,325 yards and 38 TDs, and added 543 rushing yards and five scores.

MORE ON THE OFFENSE

RUNNING BACKS

► Running back **Gavin Sawchuk** led the Sooners with 744 rushing yards and 120 carries (team-high 6.2 yards per rush) as a redshirt freshman last season, and scored nine touchdowns. His biggest output came the second half of the season, as he totaled 617 rushing yards and six TDs on 86 carries (7.2 yards per rush) in the team's last five games. He surpassed 100 rushing yards in each of those five contests.

► **Jovantae Barnes** was OU's second-leading rusher as a freshman in 2022 (519 yards; 4.5 yards per carry; five TDs), but battled injury last season and was limited to just 37 carries and 140 yards (one TD). Now a junior, Barnes is looking to again make a significant impact. He was rated by Rivals as the nation's No. 3 running back in the 2022 high school class.

► OU has several other options in the backfield, including redshirt junior **Sam Franklin**, a mid-year transfer from Tennessee-Martin where he played in 24 games and made 13 starts over three seasons. Entering 2024, he had rushed for 2,129 yards and 20 TDs on 315 carries (6.8 yards per rush).

Redshirt freshman **Kalib Hicks** played in just two games last year and scored a TD on one of his three rushes. He was the No. 8 running back in the 2023 recruiting class by Rivals.

► The Sooners have high hopes for freshman **Taylor Tatum**, the consensus No. 1 national running back in the 2024 class. Tatum, who is also planning to play baseball at OU, ran for 1,463 yards as a senior in 2023 and finished his career with 53 rushing TDs.

WIDE RECEIVERS

► OU returned eight letterwinners at wide receiver, its most returning producers since the 2021 season.

► The Sooners welcomed back 65% of their receiving yards from last year, led by senior **Jalil Farooq** (45 catches, 694 yards, two TDs), redshirt sophomore **Nic Anderson** (38 catches, 798 yards, 10 TDs), senior **Andrel Anthony** (27 catches, 429 yards, one TD) and junior **Brenen Thompson** (seven catches, 241 yards, two TDs). Anthony's 429 yards led the team through six games before he sustained a season-ending injury against Texas, and Thompson played only six games while battling injuries. Junior **Jayden Gibson** (14 catches, 375 yards, five TDs) will miss the season with an injury sustained during preseason training camp.

► Purdue transfer **Deion Burks** (47 catches, 629 yards, seven TDs last season as a redshirt sophomore) was a preseason All-SEC Third Team pick by league media and will play an impactful role as a slot receiver.

TIGHT ENDS

► Oklahoma's tight ends group was extremely thin depth wise a year ago, but that's no longer the case. Even though OU's returners in that room combined for no college starts and only two receptions, the Sooners are excited about three new additions and two players returning from injury.

► Transfers **Bauer Sharp** (Southeastern Louisiana) and **Jake Roberts** (Baylor) are atop the depth chart. Sharp, who began his career as a quarterback, entered the year with 25 career games played at tight end and 10 starts (40 receptions for 366 yards and four TDs). Roberts, from Norman, spent his first three years at North Texas before playing the 2023 campaign in Waco. He has 66 career catches for 772 yards and four TDs (25 starts in 49 games). And freshman **Davon Mitchell** was one of the nation's top high school tight ends last year. The 6-3, 259-pounder, who graduated a year early, was a consensus four-star recruit. ESPN ranked him No. 68 among all players.

► **Kade McIntyre** battled injury and played in just two games last year as a true freshman (one catch for 26 yards) and redshirt sophomore **Kaden Helms**, who missed last season due to injury, caught one pass in his three games in 2022. Both are back for 2024.

OU'S 2023 RECRUITING CLASS RANKED AS HIGH AS NO. 7

Head coach **Brent Venables** and his staff signed OU's third straight top-10 recruiting class in 2024. The class of 27 scholarship players all signed during the December early period. The class ranked No. 7 nationally by Rivals, No. 8 in the 247Sports composite and ESPN rankings and No. 9 by On3.

Of the 27 signees, one was rated as a consensus five-star prospect and eight were ranked as consensus four-star prospects on a five-star scale by 247Sports, ESPN, On3 and Rivals. Sixteen were rated a four-star prospect by at least two of the outlets, while 11 received three-star designation from at least three of those services (seven garnered at least one four-star nod).

Fourteen members of the signing class were designated as offensive players and 13 as defensive players, and all were high schoolers. A record 20 of the Sooners' 27 signees enrolled at OU for the spring semester and participated in team activities.

The Sooners signed three players who were rated as the top recruit in their state or country in Oklahoma defensive end **Danny Okoye**, Kansas defensive back **Michael Boganowski** and England offensive lineman **Daniel Akinkunmi**. Seven prospects were rated among the top 10 nationally at their respective position by at least one recruiting service. 13 signees were rated among the top 15 at their position and 18 were rated among the top 25 at their position.

The state of Texas produced the most OU signees with seven, while Oklahoma produced six and Ohio two. The Sooners signed one player each from Alabama, Arizona, England, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Kansas, Louisiana, Minnesota, Mississippi, Nevada and North Carolina.

OFFENSIVE LINE

► For the second straight year, OU has replaced multiple starting offensive linemen who were selected in the NFL Draft, resulting in a 2024 returning group that totaled only eight combined starts and 37 games played in an OU uniform entering the season. Junior **Jacob Sexton** and redshirt junior **Troy Everett** each made four starts last year. Redshirt sophomore **Jake Taylor** is the only other returner with significant game experience.

► To fill in the openings left by four former starters who are now in the NFL (right tackle and first-round pick **Tyler Guyton**, left tackle and sixth-round pick **Walter Rouse** and free-agent signees **McKade Mettauer** [right guard] and **Andrew Raym** [center]), OU brought in five transfer offensive linemen, and all have at least two years of FBS experience.

► Four of the five transfers are entering their fifth or sixth collegiate seasons: redshirt super seniors **Spencer Brown** (24 starts in 32 games at Michigan State) and **Michael Tarquin** (18 starts in 45 games at Florida and USC) and redshirt seniors **Geirean Hatchett** (four starts in 21 games at Washington) and **Branson Hickman** (33 starts in 37 games at SMU), while redshirt junior **Febechi Nwaiwu** (19 starts in 26 games at North Texas) was a freshman All-American two years ago.

SIZING UP THE DEFENSE

► Oklahoma's defense made big strides in year two under **Brent Venables** in 2023, and many analysts expect the improvement will continue this season. That includes Phil Steele, who ranks OU's linebacker and defensive back units each as second best nationally and No. 1 in the SEC.

LINEBACKERS

► The Sooners' linebacking corps is led by preseason All-American **Danny Stutsman**, a senior who decided to forgo the NFL Draft and who has started all 25 of his games the last two seasons, and who entered 2024 with 267 tackles, 28.0 tackles for loss, 7.0 sacks, three interceptions, four forced fumbles and eight pass breakups in his career. He ranked second in the Big 12 and 15th nationally with 1.3 TFLs per game last year.

► Redshirt sophomore **Kip Lewis** got the nod at the other interior linebacker position in week one after starting the last five games of 2023 and ranking second on OU with 66 tackles on the season (added 3.5 TFLs).

► The rest of the linebackers room is full of other young players who have gained some experience the last year or two, including junior **Jaren Kanak** (seven starts, 62 tackles, 6.0 TFLs, 2.0 sacks and five QB hurries in 2023), junior **Dasan McCullough** (30 tackles 3.5 TFLs, three PBU's and three QB hurries last year), redshirt sophomore **Kobie McKinzie** (22 tackles, three PBU's in 2023) and sophomore **Lewis Carter** (seven tackles).

DEFENSIVE BACKS

► One of the nation's top defensive playmakers a year ago, **Billy Bowman Jr.** leads a defensive backfield group that is full of talent and experience. The senior started 29 of 35 career games his first three seasons and leads all current Sooners with nine interceptions (returned for 249 yards and three TDs). Only two players nationally totaled more interceptions than his nine over the last two seasons.

► Now a sophomore, former five-star high school prospect **Peyton Bowen**, who blocked two punts last season and flashed his ability on several occasions, started opposite Bowman in week one vs. Temple. Junior **Robert Spears-Jennings** played in 12 games last season (two starts) and will see plenty of action in 2024. A trio of freshmen, all former four-star recruits, made the week one depth chart in **Michael Boganowski**, **Jaydan Hardy** and **Reggie Powers III**, and all played vs. the Owls, with Hardy registering an interception.

► The Sooners are extremely deep at cornerback, with four upperclassmen, a sophomore and a freshman making the first depth chart. **Woodi Washington**, who has started 36 career games and has five interceptions and 19 PBU's, is back for his sixth year. He, junior **Kani Walker** (started vs. Temple and logged an INT) and freshman **Eli Bowen** (Peyton's brother), will also see the field at that position. The other cornerback spot features junior **Gentry Williams** (10 starts and three INTs last year), super senior and San Diego State transfer **Dez Malone** (23-game starter the last two seasons) and sophomore **Jacobe Johnson**, a gifted athlete who played in all 13 games last year and logged a pick.

DEFENSIVE LINE

► OU's defensive line may be its most talented and deepest in years. While several young players figure to play significant roles this season, OU boasts a wealth of accomplished veterans, led by ends **Ethan Downs** (two-time second-team All-Big 12 pick with 24.0 career TFLs and 10.5 sacks in his 40 games [26 starts]) and **Trace Ford** (46 career games and 16 starts) and tackle **Da'Jon Terry** (50 games and 13 starts), who have all played at least 39 games collegiately. Meanwhile, tackle **Gracen Halton** (1.5 sacks vs. Temple) and end **R Mason Thomas** (first career start vs. Temple) have two years under their belts. And end **Adepoju Adebawore** is a former five-star recruit who played in every game last season.

► A pair of experienced transfers in junior tackle **Damonic Williams** (27 starts at TCU; freshman All-American in 2022) and senior end **Caiden Woullard** (26 starts at Miami [Ohio]; 17 TFLs and 13.5 sacks the last two years) bolster the Sooners' front.

► Against Temple, freshman tackle **Jayden Jackson** became only the fourth OU true freshman to start on the defensive line in a season opener. His high school teammate — top-10 national recruit **David Stone** — will also see time there. Freshman end **Danny Okoye** has excellent pass-rushing ability and big-time potential.

QUICK LOOK AT SPECIAL TEAMS

► Florida State transfer **Tyler Keltner** won the primary placekicking job and went 3 for 3 on field goals and 6 for 6 on extra-point attempts against Temple in the opener. He spent his first four seasons at East Tennessee State, where he was 56 for 74 on field goals (76%) and 131 of 131 on PATs, and three times earned All-Southern Conference honors.

► Redshirt senior **Zach Schmit** served as OU's placekicker the last two seasons and has made 28 of his 40

career field goal attempts (70%) and all 124 of his PAT tries. His streak of 124 made extra-points is the fourth-longest in program history. Schmit handled kickoffs against Temple.

► Super seniors **Josh Plaster** and **Luke Elzinga** split punting responsibilities the first six games last season, with Plaster taking the field in longer situations and Elzinga serving as the team's short-field specialist. Elzinga took over full punting responsibilities in game seven vs. UCF and averaged 45.1 yards on his 27 kicks on the year (long of 58; 13 inside the 20-yard line; eight fair catches). Plaster is the team's primary holder, after serving in that capacity all of last season.

100TH YEAR OF GAYLORD FAMILY – OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM

► 2024 marks the 100th season of Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. OU owns a sparkling 419-86-15 (.820) all-time record at the "Palace on the Prairie" and has faced 94 opponents there (South Carolina and Maine this season will mark the 95th and 96th foes).

► The first game played at the current stadium site, called Owen Field and named after former head coach and athletics director **Bennie Owen** (a charter member of the College Football Hall of Fame), took place in 1923, before stadium construction got underway. On Oct. 17, 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new 16,000-seat west stands, a 7-0 victory over Drake in which **Roy "Goat" Lamb** scored the game's only touchdown on a 2-yard run in muddy conditions.

► Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of university personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of \$293,000 and dedicated on Nov. 7, 1925. Almost since its inception, the stadium has been a work in progress, with countless expansions and improvements taking place. Prior to the 2002 season, the stadium was renamed "Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium" after a generous donation helped complete one of those expansions. Capacity peaked at 83,489 from 2016-18, but dropped to its current figure of 80,126 in 2019 after seat and aisle widening.

DEWEY SELMON HEADED TO HALL

► Part of the famed and feared Selmon brothers defensive line trio for Oklahoma's vaunted defenses of the early and mid-1970s, **Dewey Selmon** was named to the 2024 College Football Hall of Fame Class in January and will be inducted Dec. 10 in Las Vegas.

► Selmon will become Oklahoma's 24th former player in the College Hall of Fame and fifth straight defender.

► A Eufaula, Okla., native, Selmon starred at both defensive tackle and nose guard for the Sooners. In his four years on campus, OU posted a 43-2-1 record (the .946 winning percentage was best in the country), won four straight Big Eight championships and captured national titles his junior and senior seasons of 1974 and '75. He earned first-team All-America honors in 1974 and was named a consensus All-American in 1975.

► Selmon finished his OU career with 325 tackles and 25 tackles for loss (for 109 yards). In a 16-13 win over Texas in 1974, he registered 22 tackles, which still stands as the single-game school record by a defensive lineman. He also holds the OU bowl record for tackles by a defensive lineman (13) in a 14-6 Orange Bowl win over Michigan that gave the Sooners the national title.

► With Selmon as a starter from 1973-75, OU went 32-1-1. Each of his Sooner squads finished in the top three of the AP rankings, winding up at No. 2 in 1972, No. 3 in 1973 and No. 1 in 1974 and '75.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (701) than any other program (next most is 670 by Alabama).

► Oklahoma has finished in the top 5 of the AP poll a nation-leading 33 times (Ohio State is second with 30).

► OU leads all FBS programs with 50 all-time conference championships. The rest of the top five includes Nebraska (46), Michigan (44), Ohio State (39) and USC (37). The Sooners' 14 league titles since 2000 are the most among Power Five programs (Ohio State ranks second with 11).

► No program has more all-time 11-win seasons than Oklahoma's 27 (Alabama also has 27). And since the start of the 2000 season, OU and Ohio State have produced a nation-leading 18 seasons of at least 10 wins.

► Since former head coach **Bob Stoops** arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads the country with its 12,829 points scored, which is 606 more than second-place Boise State (12,223) and 915 more than third-place Oregon (11,914).

► OU's 80 consensus All-Americans since 1950 lead the nation (Alabama ranks second with 77 and Ohio State third with 73). Since 2000, OU has produced 30 consensus All-Americans, second only to Alabama.

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowed in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and a 62-foot-by-38-foot video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE TURNS 100

► Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals, is hosting football games for the 100th year this season. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.

► In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.

► The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).

► In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.

► Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and 83,489 (2016). With 2019's widening of aisles and some seats, capacity dropped to 80,126.

► In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

► The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.

► The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489. The addition of handrails and some seat and aisle widening in 2019 reduced capacity to 80,126.

► The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons also benefit from two new clubs.

► Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.

► All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space includes a spacious locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.

► The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.

► A significantly larger and more more detailed video board replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

BRENT VENABLES

NAMED OU'S 23RD HEAD COACH DEC. 5, 2021 • FORMER K-STATE/OKLAHOMA/CLEMSON ASSISTANT THREE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS (ONE WITH OKLAHOMA, TWO WITH CLEMSON) EIGHT NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME APPEARANCES • COACHED IN 34 BOWL GAMES 13 CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS • THREE-TIME BROYLES AWARD FINALIST (2016 WINNER)

A former 13-year University of Oklahoma assistant coach who won a national championship with the Sooners and two more with Clemson University during an ultra-successful 10-year stint as defensive coordinator, Brent Venables was named OU's 23rd head football coach on Dec. 5, 2021, and has coached the Sooners to a 17-10 record in his two-plus seasons.

Venables' 2023 Sooners went 10-3 overall and finished in second place in the Big 12 (7-2). They ranked third nationally in total offense (507.0 ypg) and fourth in scoring offense (41.7 ppg) and led the country in defensive interceptions per game (1.5).

The 53-year-old Venables served as co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Oklahoma from 1999-2003 and as associate head coach, defensive coordinator and linebackers coach from 2004-11 under former head coach Bob Stoops. Venables has coached in eight national championship games between his time at OU and Clemson, winning titles with the Sooners in 2000 and Tigers in 2016 and 2018. In 26 years as a full-time assistant coach, Venables' teams produced 26 winning seasons, won 13 conference titles, went to 30 bowl games (includes four College Football Playoff National Championship games) and won at least 10 games 22 times.

After joining Clemson prior to the 2012 season, Venables constructed one of the nation's top defenses. From 2012-2021, the Tigers ranked first nationally in sacks (445; next most was 392) and opponent third-down conversion percentage (30.2), second in opponent pass efficiency rating (111.1) and takeaways (244; tied), third in scoring defense (17.8 ppg) and opponent completion percentage (53.3), fourth in total defense (311.4 ypg) and pass defense (190.5 ypg), fifth in interceptions (148) and sixth in rushing defense (120.9 ypg). They won league titles each year from 2015-20.

Since 2000, Venables has coached eight national award winners and 16 consensus All-Americans. In that time, 61 defensive players under his guidance have been selected in the NFL Draft (12 first-rounders), including 18 linebackers, two of whom were first-round picks.

As a defensive coordinator and linebackers coach, Venables produced winners of three Butkus Awards (OU's Rocky Calmus in 2001 and Teddy Lehman in 2003, and CU's Isaiah Simmons in 2019), two Nagurski Awards (OU's Roy Williams in 2001 and Derrick Strait in 2003), two Thorpe Awards (Williams in 2001 and Strait in 2003) and one Bednarik Award (Lehman in 2003). And in 2018, Clemson defensive tackle Christian Wilkins became the school's first winner of William V. Campbell Trophy, also known as the "Academic Heisman."

Venables has received national accolades for his coaching and recruiting, including the Frank Broyles Award in 2016 as the nation's top assistant coach after being a finalist in 2015. He was FootballScoop's Defensive Coordinator of the Year in 2014 and Rivals.com's Recruiter of the Year in 2015.

Venables' defensive units were remarkably consistent during his 10 years with the Tigers. Each of his last eight Clemson defenses ranked in the top 15 nationally in yards allowed and seven of the last eight ranked in the top 20 in points allowed. Over his last eight years there, his units ranked first (in 2014), 10th, eighth, fourth, fifth, sixth, 15th and ninth (in 2021) in total defense. Additionally, his units ranked first or second in the ACC in total defense each of his last eight years (ranked first in six of those seasons).

Under Venables' tutelage in 2021, Clemson ranked second nationally in scoring defense (15.0 ppg) and red zone defense (62.1 conversion percentage), fourth in sacks (3.4 per game), eighth in rushing defense (98.8 ypg) and ninth in total defense (308.4 ypg).

Venables' 2020 Clemson defense tied for the national lead with 46 sacks, despite no player producing more than 4.5 sacks individually. His 2019 unit allowed fewer than 300 yards of total offense in each of its first 12 games, the first defense nationally since at least 1996 to accomplish that feat. Clemson held 16 straight opponents to 20 or fewer points across the 2018-19 seasons, the school's longest streak since the 1937-40 campaigns.

Clemson's 2018 squad led the nation in scoring defense (13.1 ppg) for the first time in school history and set a program record by recording 54 sacks.

Venables' Clemson defenses ranked among the top 10 nationally in sacks each year from 2014-21 and ranked in the top 10 in tackles for loss from 2013-20. The units led the nation in TFLs every year from 2013-16.

From 1999-2011, Venables helped OU to the 2000 national championship, three other national championship game appearances (2003, '04 and '08) and seven Big 12 titles. He was a finalist for the Broyles Award in 2006 when the Sooners led the Big 12 in total defense and scoring defense.

Oklahoma linebackers under Venables earned three Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year awards, five Big 12 Defensive Newcomer of the Year accolades and six first-team All-America honors. Ten of his OU linebackers — and 31 defensive players overall — were taken in the 2000-12 NFL Drafts.

While Venables was an Oklahoma assistant, the Sooners ranked among the top 16 nationally in total defense eight times (including each year from 2000-06) and among the top 20 in scoring defense eight times. OU led the Big 12 in scoring defense on four occasions (2000, '04, '06 and '11) and topped the conference in total defense three times (2003, '04, and '06).

Prior to joining Stoops' first staff at OU, Venables coached linebackers at Kansas State (1996-98), serving as defensive running game coordinator in 1998, and was a graduate assistant at K-State under Bill Snyder from 1993-95.

As a player at Kansas State (1991-92), Venables earned honorable mention All-Big Eight honors in 1992 after registering 124 tackles. He began his collegiate playing career at Garden City (Kan.) Community College (1989-90), where he earned All-America honors after recording 276 tackles and was inducted into the school's athletics hall of fame in April 2023.

A native of Salina, Kan., Venables received his bachelor's degree in political science from Kansas State in 1992. He and his wife Julie have four children: sons Jake and Tyler and daughters Laney and Addie.

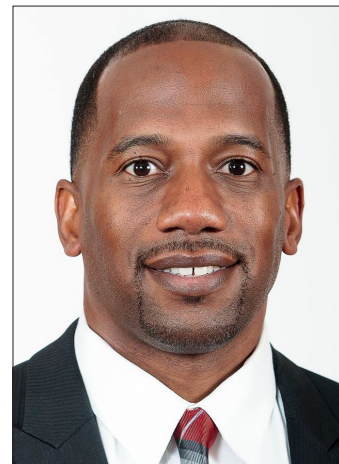

NORMAN — In the program's first-ever Friday night home game, Oklahoma excelled in all three phases of a 51-3 season-opening win over Temple.

Sophomore quarterback Jackson Arnold completed 17 of 25 passes (68%) for 141 yards and four touchdowns with no interceptions. He became just the third Sooner to ever pass for at least four TDs in their first career home start. Three of Arnold's TDs went to redshirt junior Deion Burks. The wide receiver finished with a game-high six catches for 36 yards and became the first Sooner to catch three TD passes in a season opener and the first OU player to haul in three TDs in his school debut. Arnold's other TD pass was a 14-yarder on OU's opening drive to tight end Bauer Sharp, another newcomer.

The Sooners averaged 6.1 yards per rush and were led by freshman Taylor Tatum, who racked up 69 yards on just five carries (13.8 average), including an eight-yard TD. Redshirt junior Sam Franklin carried four times for 45 yards (11.2 average) and junior Jovantae Barnes carried five times for 33 yards (6.6 average).

OU held the Owls to 197 yards (128 passing and 69 rushing) and 3.2 yards per play. The Sooners registered six takeaways on the night, their most since 2003. After recovering six fumbles all of last season, they recovered four against the Owls (most nationally on the week), and added two interceptions. Junior linebacker Jaren Kanak returned one of the recoveries (on a Temple punt return) 21 yards for a touchdown. OU also had six sacks.

Sixth-year kicker Tyler Keltner, who transferred from Florida State, was 3 for 3 on field goals (50, 42 and 24 yards) and made all six PAT tries in his OU debut. He was named SEC Special Teams Player of the Week.
