### OPENING KICK

► Two of college football's all-time powerhouse programs meet for just the second time when No. 18/24 Oklahoma (1-0) hosts No. 15/13 Michigan (1-0) on Saturday at 6:30 p.m. CT at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium in Norman. The game, the first in the regular season between the Sooners and Wolverines, will be televised by ABC with **Chris Fowler**, **Kirk Herbstreit** and **Holly Rowe** announcing.

► The 2025 season marks the 131st in OU football history. The Sooners lead the nation with their 50 all-time conference championships, 27 11-plus-win seasons (tied), 33 AP top-five finishes and five No. 1 overall NFL Draft picks (tied). They rank second with their seven Heisman Trophy winners (tied), third with seven AP national championships, their 101 weeks as the AP's No. 1 team and 431 total weeks in the AP Top 5, fourth with their 419 NFL Draft picks and fifth with their 58 bowl appearances.

► Oklahoma owns a 79-54-4 record against current Big Ten programs. More than half of those contests were against former conference rival Nebraska (OU is 47-38-3 against the Huskers). Saturday will mark the Sooners' first game against a Big Ten opponent since sweeping Nebraska in a home-and-home series in 2021 (23-16 in Norman) and 2022 (49-14 in Lincoln in **Brent Venables'** first year as head coach). OU is 12-7 against Big Ten members at the time of competition.

► Saturday's contest will mark the 1,353rd in OU history. The Sooners rank fifth in college football annals with their .723 all-time winning percentage (951-348-53 record), trailing Ohio State (.736), Michigan (.733), Alabama (.733) and Notre Dame (.731). Since the end of World War II (1946 season to present), OU leads all programs with 707 wins (29 more than Alabama, the program with the next most) and owns a .762 winning percentage. Michigan ranks seventh with 634 victories during the span.

► Oklahoma and Michigan are two of the five college football programs sponsored by Jordan Brand. The others are Florida, North Carolina and UCLA. Michigan was the first Jordan Brand football team (2016) while OU's relationship began in 2018. Saturday's game will mark the Sooners' second against another Jordan Brand team. They beat Florida 55-20 in the Cotton Bowl to cap the 2020 season.



**QB John Mateer completed 30 of 37 pass attempts in OU's 35-3 win over Illinois State on Saturday and set a school record for passing yards (392) in a Sooners debut. He threw for three TDs and ran for another. His 392 yards through the air led the SEC in week 1 and were second most nationally.**

Michigan is one of **five** OU foes this season that will be making their Norman debuts. The others are Illinois State, Auburn, Ole Miss and LSU. Only Kent State and Missouri have played at OU.

161

This marks the **161st** consecutive sellout of a regularly scheduled OU home contest (every game since the start of the 1999 season). It is the nation's second-longest streak (Nebraska).

2009

OU gave up just 318.2 yards per game last season, its lowest total-defense figure since **2009**. On Saturday vs. Illinois State, the Sooners allowed only 151 yards (34 passing).

**KEY STORYLINES**

► Saturday's game will mark the second meeting between Oklahoma and Michigan. The lone matchup occurred in the 1975 season, when OU downed the Wolverines 14-6 in the Orange Bowl to claim its fifth AP national championship. (A game recap is on page 3 of these notes).

► Michigan is coached by **Sherrone Moore**, who was an Oklahoma offensive lineman on the 2006 and '07 teams under head coach **Bob Stoops**. The Sooners combined for a 22-6 record those seasons and won Big 12 championships each year (defeated No. 19 Nebraska 21-7 in the 2006 league title game and No. 1 Missouri 38-17 in the '07 championship game). Moore played in five games at guard as a junior in 2006 and nine the following year as a senior (no starts either season). A transfer from Butler (Kan.) Community College, Moore was named to the All-Big 12 Academic First Team as a senior. He was teammates with current Oklahoma running backs coach **DeMarco Murray** (2014 NFL Offensive Player of the Year with Dallas) and current tight ends coach **Joe Jon Finley**. OU head coach **Brent Venables** was the Sooners' associate head coach, defensive coordinator and linebackers coach during Moore's two years in Norman.

► Saturday's game will mark just OU's eighth at home against a member of the Big Ten Conference at the time of competition. The Sooners are 4-3 in those contests. They beat Wisconsin (48-21 in 1969), Iowa (21-6 in 1979), Minnesota (63-0 in 1986) and Nebraska (23-16 in 2021), and lost to Northwestern (19-3 in 1960) and Ohio State (24-14 in 1983 and 45-24 in 2016).

► Oklahoma's 2024 defense was its best under head coach **Brent Venables**, now in his fourth year, and the Sooners returned six defenders this season who started at least eight games a year ago, including three on the line. OU, which ranked 19th nationally in total defense last year (its 318.2 yards allowed per game were its fewest since 2009), held Illinois State to 151 total yards and eight first downs Saturday.

► Perhaps OU's two biggest offseason player additions were on the offensive side of the ball in redshirt junior quarterback **John Mateer** and senior running back **Jaydn Ott**. Mateer, who starred at Washington State, was ranked by ESPN in May as the country's No. 1 transfer, while Ott was No. 17. A Manning Award finalist last year after passing for 3,139 yards and rushing for 826 in his first season as a starter, Mateer was the nation's only player with at least 20 touchdown passes (29) and at least 10 rushing TDs (15). His 44 TDs responsible for led the country in the regular season. Ott, who came from Cal, rushed for 2,597 yards (24 TDs) and caught 95 passes for 712 yards (six TDs) over the last three seasons (1,315 rushing yards/12 TDs in 2023).

► Of Oklahoma's 111 players, 45 (or 41%) are newcomers. That group is comprised of 23 freshmen and 22 transfers (seven seniors, 10 juniors and five sophomores).

► Of the 74 players on OU's week 1 depth chart, 19 (or 26%) were freshmen. That includes 11 true freshmen (five offense, five defense, one special teams) and eight redshirt freshmen (two offense, five defense, one special teams).

**RECAPPING THE WIN OVER ILLINOIS STATE**

► **John Mateer** turned in one of the best quarterback-debut performances in program history and the defense surrendered just 151 yards (its fewest in five years) as No. 18 Oklahoma posted a 35-3 win over Illinois State on Saturday. The Redbirds entered the contest ranked No. 6 in both FCS preseason polls.

► Mateer set an OU record for passing yards in a Sooner debut, completing 30 of 37 attempts (81%) for 392 yards and three touchdowns to break **Baker Mayfield's** previous standard of 388 yards (vs. Akron in 2015). He also rushed for 24 yards and a TD.

► Mateer's 392 yards led the SEC in week one (next most was 341) and were second most nationally. His 191.4 passing efficiency rating was OU's best since 2023 (min. 25 attempts).

► The Sooners limited the Redbirds to 34 passing yards and 1.7 yards per pass attempt (3.3 yards per completion). It was OU's fewest passing yards allowed since 2013.

► Also making his OU debut, redshirt senior wide receiver **Keontez Lewis** registered a career-high nine catches for 119 yards and a career-high-tying two touchdowns (29 and 20 yards).

► Mateer's other TD throw was a 27-yarder to redshirt senior **Deion Burks**. All four of Burks' OU TDs have come in season openers the last two years (three vs. Temple in 2024). He finished with seven catches for 88 yards, his most as a Sooner.

► Senior **Jaren Kanak**, who played linebacker the last three seasons (started nine games in 2023 and one last season) started at tight end Saturday and logged five receptions for 90 yards, including a 43-yarder. It was the most receiving yards in a game by an OU tight end since the 2022 season.

► Junior linebacker **Sammy Omosigbo** led OU with a career-high eight tackles, including his first career sack.

► Eight players (four offensive, four defensive) made their first OU starts Saturday: Mateer, Lewis, redshirt junior WR **Isaiah Sategna III** and redshirt freshman OL **Eddy Pierre-Louis** on offense, and redshirt senior LB **Kendal Daniels**, senior DL **Marvin Jones Jr.**, sophomore DB **Michael Boganowski** and freshman DB **Courtland Guillory** on defense.

► Guillory became only the second OU true freshman to start at cornerback in a season opener (the other was **P.J. Mbanasor** in 2015).

## ESPN COLLEGE GAMEDAY RETURNS

► "ESPN College GameDay" will air from Norman on Saturday morning, marking the 42nd time the show will have been on hand for a game involving Oklahoma. The Sooners are 27-14 (.659) in such games. Only Ohio State (67 times) and Alabama (60) have been featured more often than OU.

► This will mark College GameDay's 10th appearance at an OU home contest (Oklahoma is 6-3). The last was last season when Tennessee posted a 25-15 win on Sept. 21. OU's wins when hosting College GameDay came in 2000 (31-14 vs. No. 1 Nebraska), 2001 (38-37 vs. No. 11 Kansas State), 2003 (52-9 vs. No. 14 Oklahoma State), 2007 (41-31 vs. No. 11 Missouri) and 2008 (65-21 vs. No. 2 Texas Tech). The other two losses came in 1995 (38-17 to No. 4 Colorado) and 2012 (30-13 to No. 5 Notre Dame).

► Saturday will mark Michigan's 41st appearance on College GameDay (21-19 record).

## HOME IS WHERE THE "W" IS

► The Sooners are 146-15 (.907) at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium since the start of the 1999 season (**Bob Stoops'** first year as head coach), giving them just one more home loss than conference titles during the period. It is the second-best home winning percentage in the country over the last 26-plus seasons (Boise State [.908] is first and Ohio State [.896] third). OU has outscored its foes by an average of 43-18 in those games.

► Including this week's game, OU has sold out 161 straight originally scheduled home contests dating back to the start of the 1999 season (**Bob Stoops'** first as head coach). Only Nebraska has a longer current streak.

► Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium celebrated its 100th season in 2024. The 100th anniversary of the first game played in the stadium will be on Oct. 17. On that day in 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new 16,000-seat west stands, a 7-0 victory over Drake.

► The first game played at the current stadium site, called Owen Field and named after former head coach and athletics director **Bennie Owen** (a charter member of the College Football Hall of Fame), took place in 1923, before stadium construction got underway.

► OU owns a sparkling 424-88-15 (.819) all-time record at the "Palace on the Prairie" and has faced 97 opponents there (Michigan, Auburn, Ole Miss and LSU this season will take that number to 101).

## 1976 ORANGE BOWL RECAP: OU BEATS MICHIGAN TO WIN NATIONAL TITLE

► In the only Oklahoma-Michigan football meeting, **Barry Switzer's** 1975 Sooners posted a 14-6 Orange Bowl win over the Wolverines on Jan. 1, 1976, to claim their fifth of seven AP national championships. It was OU's first bowl game under Switzer, and second national title (the 1974 Sooners were prohibited by the NCAA from playing in a bowl game but still were crowned AP national champs).

► Under the direction of head coach **Bo Schembechler**, Michigan became the first Big Ten team to play in the Orange Bowl. It was also the Wolverines' first time facing a team that ran the "Wishbone" offense.

► No. 1-ranked Ohio State lost 23-10 to UCLA in the Rose Bowl earlier in the day, opening the door for No. 3 OU to claim a national title, as No. 2 Texas A&M had lost 20-0 to USC in the Liberty Bowl on Dec. 22.

► OU fumbled four times and lost three, but outgained Michigan 345-202 in total yards. The Sooners surrendered 169 rushing yards and just 33 passing yards. The Wolverines completed only two of 20 pass attempts and threw three interceptions. Their first completion came with under 40 seconds left in the game.

► The Sooners' touchdowns came on a 39-yard end-around by receiver **Billy Brooks** in the second quarter and a 10-yard keeper by quarterback **Steve Davis** on the first play of the fourth quarter. Michigan's only score came on a 2-yard rush by **Gordie Bell** after OU fumbled at its own 2, but the two-point conversion failed.

► Davis, playing in his final collegiate game, rushed 19 times for 55 yards and completed 3 of 5 passes for 63 yards. His record as OU's starting quarterback improved to 32-1-1, the same as Switzer's as OU head coach.

► The dominant Oklahoma defense was led by brothers **Dewey** and **Lee Roy Selmon**. The consensus first-team All-America defensive linemen combined for 23 tackles. Dewey Selmon's 13 tackles still stand as the most ever by an OU defensive lineman in a bowl game.

► The game was the sixth and last Orange Bowl played on artificial turf.

## YEAR TWO IN THE SEC

► Oklahoma and Texas officially joined the Southeastern Conference on July 1, 2024, after 28 years in the Big 12 Conference. OU won half (14) of the Big 12's football titles in its 28 years in the league and posted a 187-61 (.754) record against conference competition (includes an 11-1 record in Big 12 championship games).

► Oklahoma's 14 Big 12 titles were 10 more than the program with the next most (Texas won four). From 2010 through 2023, OU won eight Big 12 titles and was followed by Baylor (three), Kansas State (two) and Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas (one each).

## ONE OF NATION'S TOUGHEST SCHEDULES

► For the second straight season, Oklahoma's schedule is among the nation's most challenging. Heading into 2025, the Sooners' strength of schedule was ranked as the country's toughest in ESPN's FPI.

► OU is scheduled to play three of the top 10 teams in the AP preseason poll and seven of the top 25 squads: No. 1 Texas (in Dallas), No. 8 Alabama (away), No. 9 LSU (home), No. 13 South Carolina (away), No. 14 Michigan (home), No. 21 Ole Miss (home) and No. 24 Tennessee (away).

► Only four teams nationally (all in the SEC) will play seven games against teams in the 2025 preseason AP poll (also Florida, LSU and Mississippi State).

## NEW ASSISTANT COACHES

► The 2025 OU coaching staff features a new play-caller on offense and two new coaches on the defensive side of the ball. In December, Oklahoma head coach **Brent Venables** hired **Ben Arbuckle** as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. Arbuckle, who served the 2023 and 2024 seasons in the same capacity at Washington State, presided over a 2024 Cougars offense that ranked 12th nationally in the regular season with its 36.8 points per game, sixth in passing TDs (30), eighth in yards per pass attempt (9.1), ninth in passing efficiency rating (165.2), 22nd in total offense (440.4 ypg) and 24th in passing offense (268.8 ypg) and rushing TDs (27). WSU rushed for over 100 yards in 11 games (its most since 2005) and 89 yards in the other regular season contest.

► Venables also brought in **Nate Dreiling** as inside linebackers coach and **Wes Goodwin** as assistant linebackers and outside linebackers coach. Dreiling served the 2024 season at Utah State as interim head coach and defensive coordinator. He has spent five years as a defensive coordinator at Utah State (2024), New Mexico State (2022-23) and Pittsburg State (2018-19). His Utah State defense last year ranked 36th nationally in interceptions (13).

► Goodwin was promoted to defensive coordinator at Clemson prior to the 2022 season after Venables was named head coach at Oklahoma. He spent a total of 13 seasons across two stints at Clemson and helped guide the Tigers to the 2024 ACC Championship and an appearance in the College Football Playoff. Clemson ranked in the top 20 nationally in takeaways, interceptions and fumbles recovered during the 2024 season, ranked eighth nationally in total defense and pass defense in 2023 and ranked among the top 25 nationally in scoring defense, rushing defense, yards allowed per rush, sacks and tackles for loss in his first season as defensive coordinator in 2022.

## BREAKING DOWN THE TRANSFERS

► The Sooners signed 22 transfers in the offseason, with the vast majority of those on offense. The breakdown is 14 offensive, four defensive and four special teams players.

► OU's transfer portal class was ranked No. 12 nationally by 247Sports.

► The offensive transfers consist of five wide receivers (redshirt senior **Keontez Lewis** [Southern Illinois], redshirt juniors **Javonnie Gibson** [Arkansas-Pine Bluff] and **Isaiah Sategna III** [Arkansas], junior **Jer'Michael Carter** [McNeese State] and sophomore **Josiah Martin** [Cal]), three offensive linemen (redshirt senior **Derek Simmons** [Western Carolina], redshirt junior **Jake Maikkula** [Stanford] and junior **Luke Baklenko** [Stanford]), three tight ends (redshirt senior **Will Huggins** [Pittsburg State] and redshirt juniors **Carson Kent** [Kennesaw State] and **John Locke Jr.** [Louisiana Tech]), two quarterbacks (redshirt junior **John Mateer** [Washington State] and sophomore **Whitt Newbauer** [Mercer]) and a running back (senior **Jaydn Ott** [Cal]).

► On defense, two transfers are linemen (senior **Marvin Jones Jr.** [Florida State] and redshirt sophomore **Siolaa Lolohea** [Utah State]) and two are linebackers (redshirt senior **Kendal Daniels** [Oklahoma State] and redshirt sophomore **Reed DeQuasie** [Oklahoma State]).

► The special teams transfers feature two placekickers (redshirt junior **Tate Sandell** [UTSA; made both PATs Saturday], redshirt senior **Austin Welch** [Kennesaw State] and one punter (redshirt sophomore **Jacob Ulrich** [Kennesaw State]) and one punter/placekicker (redshirt junior **Grayson Miller** [Central Oklahoma]).

## FIVE PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

► Five Sooners — two each on offense and defense and one on special teams — earned 2025 preseason All-America recognition.

► Senior defensive lineman **R Mason Thomas** was a third-team preseason All-American by Athlon and Phil

Steele after ranking fourth in the SEC and 17th nationally with his 9.0 sacks (0.8 per game) last year. He also led the Sooners with his 12.5 tackles for loss and 11 QB hurries.

► Senior running back **Jaydn Ott** was a third-team preseason All-American by Phil Steele and a fourth-teamer by Athlon. The Cal transfer arrived at OU in June after posting 2,597 rushing yards (25 TDs) and 712 receiving yards (six TDs) over the last three seasons.

► Redshirt junior **Ben Anderson** was a third-team preseason All-American by Phil Steele. OU's long snapper each of the last two seasons, he was a third-team All-SEC pick last year.

► Redshirt senior wide receiver **Deion Burks** picked up fourth-team preseason All-America honors from Athlon. Burks, who battled injuries in his first season at OU last year after transferring from Purdue, entered the year with 94 career catches for 1,049 yards and 10 touchdowns.

► Redshirt junior linebacker **Kip Lewis** also picked up fourth-team honors from Phil Steele. In 2024, Lewis started 12 of 13 games and logged 65 tackles and 4.0 tackles for loss, and returned interceptions for touchdowns in wins at Auburn and against No. 7 Alabama.

## REVAMPED QB ROOM

► OU's quarterbacks room looks quite a bit different than it did last year, with only one returning signal-caller on this year's roster and first-year offensive coordinator **Ben Arbuckle** serving as quarterbacks coach. The lone returning QB is sophomore **Michael Hawkins Jr.**, who played in seven games and made four starts as a true freshman last year. He completed 63.3% of his passes for 783 yards and three TDs against two interceptions, and rushed for 204 yards and a TD. Hawkins Jr. became the first OU true freshman quarterback to win on the road in his first career start when the Sooners rallied in the fourth quarter to beat Auburn 27-21 on Sept. 28. It was Oklahoma's first road game as a member of the SEC.

► Washington State transfer **John Mateer** was one of the country's top quarterbacks last year, when he completed 64.6% of his throws for 3,139 yards and 29 TDs against just seven interceptions, and rushed 178 times for 826 yards (4.6 per carry) and 15 scores. The rushes, rushing yards and rushing TDs all set WSU single-season records. A 2025 captain, Mateer will start for the Sooners.

► **Whitt Newbauer** is a sophomore who started in seven of his nine games at Mercer last year and earned All-Southern Conference Freshman Team honors. He completed 56.4% of his passes for 1,398 yards and 12 TDs vs. four interceptions. He also rushed for two TDs.

► Freshman **Jett Niu** was a consensus three-star prospect out of Lindon, Utah, and enrolled in January. He completed 195 of 341 passes for 2,857 yards and 29 TDs as a high school senior, and was ranked by On3 as the No. 6 recruit in Utah.

## MORE ON THE OFFENSE

► Oklahoma returned 21 letterwinners on offense and welcomed 24 newcomers on that side of the ball. The most returning experience is on the offensive line, with five 2025 Sooners starting at least six games last season and another starting four. The leaders of the unit are redshirt seniors **Troy Everett** (missed first six games last year but started final seven at center) and **Febechi Nwaiwu** (started all 13 games at right guard) and senior **Jacob Sexton** (started first eight games [four at left tackle, four at left guard] before missing the rest of the year to injury). Redshirt sophomores **Heath Ozaeta** (eight starts last year [seven at left guard]) and **Logan Howland** (six starts at left tackle) saw loads of action in 2024, especially the second half of the season. Redshirt junior **Jake Taylor** was limited to four games (all starts at right tackle) and redshirt freshman **Eddy Pierre-Louis** saw action in four games.

► OU signed three offensive line transfers who combined for 57 starts at their previous schools. Redshirt senior **Derek Simmons** (Western Carolina) has 27 career starts, redshirt junior **Jake Maikkula** (Stanford) has 16 and junior **Luke Baklenko** (Stanford) has 14.

► The Sooners also signed five freshman offensive linemen, including consensus five-star and top-10 overall national prospect **Michael Fasusi** and consensus four-star and top-70 national recruit **Ryan Fodje**, who are both expected to see meaningful playing time as rookies this season.

► Cal transfer **Jaydn Ott** headlines OU's deepest and most talented running backs group in years. As a sophomore in 2023, Ott rushed for 1,315 yards and 12 TDs before battling injuries last season. He has started 32 of his 34 career games. Senior **Jovantae Barnes** also fought injuries in 2024 but was still OU's leading rusher with 577 yards and five TDs. He started six of his nine games. Sophomores **Taylor Tatum** and **Xavier Robinson** both had their moments as rookies last year. Tatum, who was the No. 1 running back nationally in the 2024 class, started three of his 11 games and rushed for 278 yards (5.0 per carry) and three TDs. Robinson emerged late in the year and ran for 233 yards (4.8 per carry) and four TDs. Included were career highs of 107 yards and two TDs on 18 carries in a win over No. 7 Alabama. And freshman **Tory Blaylock** figures to see the field after drawing rave reviews from head coach **Brent Venables** during training camp.

► OU's wide receiver corps blends a mix of returners, transfers and freshmen. A Phil Steele preseason fourth-team All-American, **Deion Burks** headlines the returning group. The redshirt senior, who caught three TD passes in last year's season opener vs. Temple, missed seven 2024 games due to injury but caught 31 passes for 245 yards in his five contests. The 31 receptions were the most ever by a player in the first five games of an OU career. Four Sooners gained significant playing time as freshmen last season and are primed for bigger roles: **Ivan Carreon**, **Jacob Jordan**, **Zion Kearney** and **Zion Ragins**. Five transfers will bolster the unit, led by redshirt senior **Keontez Lewis** (Southern Illinois), redshirt junior **Isaiah Sategna III** (Arkansas) and junior **Jer' Michael Carter** (McNeese State). Redshirt junior **Javonnie Gibson** (Arkansas-Pine Bluff) impressed during spring ball before sustaining an injury. Freshman **Elijah Thomas** cracked the week-one depth chart.

## MORE ON THE DEFENSE

► The strength of the Sooners' defense very well could be its line, with three players returning who started a combined 33 games last season (senior **Damonic Williams** 12, senior **R Mason Thomas** 11 and freshman **Jayden Jackson** 10) and another who started three and saw extensive field time (senior **Gracen Halton**). That quartet totaled 118 tackles, 26 tackles for loss, 17 sacks and 16 QB hurries last season. Phil Steele ranked OU's defensive line as the best in the country this summer, and ESPN/SEC Network analyst Cole Cubelic said in May the Sooners have the league's best defensive line, "... and it ain't even close."

► The Sooners' linebacker corps, which lost 2024 consensus first-team All-American **Danny Stutsman** to graduation, is led on the inside by redshirt juniors **Kip Lewis** and **Kobie McKinzie** and junior **Sammy Omosigbo**. Lewis started 12 of 13 games last season and registered 65 tackles, 4.0 TFLs and interception returns for touchdowns in wins at Auburn and vs. No. 7 Alabama. McKinzie made two starts a year ago and logged 30 tackles (3.0 for loss) and 1.5 sacks. Omosigbo played largely at the "Cheetah" position last season, logging 39 tackles (5.0 for loss). Redshirt junior and former walk-on **Owen Heinecke** also figures to see ample playing time, as does redshirt senior **Kendal Daniels**, who transferred from Oklahoma State, where he started 28 of his 39 career games and totaled 240 tackles (22.5 for loss), 7.5 sacks and five interceptions over the last three seasons.

► The defensive backfield lost second-team All-SEC safety and fourth-round NFL Draft pick **Billy Bowman Jr.** but still features five juniors or seniors who have been regulars on the field at least the last two seasons. The group is led by senior safety **Robert Spears-Jennings**, who started 11 of 13 games in 2024, ranked second on the team with 66 tackles (5.0 for loss) and forced four fumbles to rank eighth nationally. Junior and fellow safety **Peyton Bowen** has played in 27 career games (eight starts; five last season). Redshirt senior **Kendel Dolby** started three games each of the last three seasons. He sustained a season-ending injury in the third game of 2024 after starring at the "Cheetah" position. Redshirt junior **Gentry Williams** (11 starts) and junior **Jacobe Johnson** (two starts) are cornerbacks who have played in 23 and 26 career games, and sophomore **Eli Bowen** earned freshman All-America honors from ESPN and On3 last season after starting each of the last eight contests and recording 30 tackles, one interception and four pass breakups. Three sophomores also figure to play significant roles in cornerback **Devon Jordan** and safeties **Michael Boganowski** and **Reggie Powers III**.

## A LOOK AT SPECIAL TEAMS

► Oklahoma's special teams units were drastically improved in 2024 under first-year coordinator **Doug Deakin**. After finishing No. 107 in the FEI (Freneau Efficiency Index) special teams ratings in 2023 the year before Deakin's arrival, the Sooners jumped to No. 34 last season.

► Several of OU's 2024 specialists have finished their careers, including primary placekicker **Zach Schmit** and punter **Luke Elzinga**. The sole returning placekicker on the roster is **Liam Evans**, a redshirt freshman who made his lone PAT attempt last season. The Sooners signed a pair of transfer placekickers in redshirt senior **Austin Welch** (Kennesaw State; 14 for 18 on FGs last year) and redshirt junior **Tate Sandell** (UTSA; 19 of 23 on FGs last season), and a transfer punter in redshirt sophomore **Jacob Ulrich** (Kennesaw State; earned first-team All-Conference USA honors in 2024). They also signed a transfer punter/placekicker in redshirt junior **Grayson Miller** (Central Oklahoma), as well as freshman placekicker **Preston Tarpley**.

► Redshirt junior **Ben Anderson** will be OU's long snapper for the third straight year. He earned third-team All-SEC honors last season and is a 2025 third-team preseason All-American by Phil Steele.

## COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (706) than any other program (next most is 678 by Alabama).

► Oklahoma has finished in the top 5 of the AP poll a nation-leading 33 times (Ohio State is second with 31).

► OU leads all FBS programs with 50 all-time conference championships. The rest of the top five includes Nebraska (46), Michigan (45), Ohio State (39) and USC (37). The Sooners' 14 league titles since 2000 are the most among Power Five programs (Ohio State ranks second with 11).

► No program has more all-time 11-win seasons than Oklahoma's 27 (Alabama also has 27).

► Since the start of the 2000 season, OU ranks second with 18 seasons of at least 10 wins and ranks second with 262 victories.

► Since former head coach **Bob Stoops** arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads the country with its 13,125 points scored. Boise State (12,696) is second and Oregon (12,437) third.

► OU's 81 consensus All-Americans since 1950 lead the nation (Alabama and Ohio State rank second with 77 each). Since 2000, OU has produced 31 consensus All-Americans, tied with Ohio State behind just Alabama.

# GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and A 62-foot-by-38-foot video board.

## OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE TURNS 100 ON OCT. 17

► Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals, is hosting football games for the 101st year this season. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.

► In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.

► The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).

► In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.

► Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and 83,489 (2016). With 2019's widening of aisles and some seats, capacity dropped to its current 80,126 figure.

► In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

## RECENT RENOVATION

► The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.

► The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489. The addition of handrails and some seat and aisle widening in 2019 reduced capacity to 80,126.

► The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons also benefit from two new clubs.

► Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.

► All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space includes a spacious locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.

► The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.

► A significantly larger and more more detailed video board replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

# BRENT VENABLES

**NAMED OU'S 23RD HEAD COACH DEC. 5, 2021 • FORMER K-STATE/OKLAHOMA/CLEMSON ASSISTANT  
THREE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS (ONE WITH OKLAHOMA, TWO WITH CLEMSON)

**A** former 13-year University of Oklahoma assistant coach who won a national championship with the Sooners and two more with Clemson University during an ultra-successful 10-year stint as defensive coordinator, Brent Venables was named OU's 23rd head football coach on Dec. 5, 2021, and has coached the Sooners to a 23-17 record in his three-plus seasons.

Venables' 2023 Sooners went 10-3 overall and finished in second place in the Big 12 (7-2). They ranked third nationally in total offense (507.0 ypg) and fourth in scoring offense (41.7 ppg) and led the country in defensive interceptions per game (1.5).

The 54-year-old Venables served as co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Oklahoma from 1999-2003 and as associate head coach, defensive coordinator and linebackers coach from 2004-11 under former head coach Bob Stoops. Venables has coached in eight national championship games between his time at OU and Clemson, winning titles with the Sooners in 2000 and Tigers in 2016 and 2018. In 26 years as a full-time assistant coach, Venables' teams produced 26 winning seasons, won 13 conference titles, went to 30 bowl games (includes four College Football Playoff National Championship games) and won at least 10 games 22 times.

After joining Clemson prior to the 2012 season, Venables constructed one of the nation's top defenses. From 2012-2021, the Tigers ranked first nationally in sacks (445; next most was 392) and opponent third-down conversion percentage (30.2), second in opponent pass efficiency rating (111.1) and takeaways (244; tied), third in scoring defense (17.8 ppg) and opponent completion percentage (53.3), fourth in total defense (311.4 ypg) and pass defense (190.5 ypg), fifth in interceptions (148) and sixth in rushing defense (120.9 ypg). They won league titles each year from 2015-20.

Since 2000, Venables has coached eight national award winners and 16 consensus All-Americans. In that time, 61 defensive players under his guidance have been selected in the NFL Draft (12 first-rounders), including 18 linebackers, two of whom were first-round picks.

As a defensive coordinator and linebackers coach, Venables produced winners of three Butkus Awards (OU's Rocky Calmus in 2001 and Teddy Lehman in 2003, and CU's Isaiah Simmons in 2019), two Nagurski Awards (OU's Roy Williams in 2001 and Derrick Strait in 2003), two Thorpe Awards (Williams in 2001 and Strait in 2003) and one Bednarik Award (Lehman in 2003). And in 2018, Clemson defensive tackle Christian Wilkins became the school's first winner of William V. Campbell Trophy, also known as the "Academic Heisman."

Venables has received national accolades for his coaching and recruiting, including the Frank Broyles Award in 2016 as the nation's top assistant coach after being a finalist in 2015. He was FootballScoop's Defensive Coordinator of the Year in 2014 and Rivals.com's Recruiter of the Year in 2015.

Venables' defensive units were remarkably consistent during his 10 years with the Tigers. Each of his last eight Clemson defenses ranked in the top 15 nationally in yards allowed and seven of the last eight ranked in the top 20 in points allowed. Over his last eight years there, his units ranked first (in 2014), 10th, eighth, fourth, fifth, sixth, 15th and ninth (in 2021) in total defense. Additionally, his units ranked first or second in the ACC in total defense each of his last eight years (ranked first in six of those seasons).

Under Venables' tutelage in 2021, Clemson ranked second nationally in scoring defense (15.0 ppg) and red zone defense (62.1 conversion percentage), fourth in sacks (3.4 per game), eighth in rushing defense (98.8 ypg) and ninth in total defense (308.4 ypg).

Venables' 2020 Clemson defense tied for the national lead with 46 sacks, despite no player producing more than 4.5 sacks individually. His 2019 unit allowed fewer than 300 yards of total offense in each of its first 12 games, the first defense nationally since at least 1996 to accomplish that feat. Clemson held 16 straight opponents to 20 or fewer points across the 2018-19 seasons, the school's longest streak since the 1937-40 campaigns.

Clemson's 2018 squad led the nation in scoring defense (13.1 ppg) for the first time in school history and set a program record by recording 54 sacks.

Venables' Clemson defenses ranked among the top 10 nationally in sacks each year from 2014-21 and ranked in the top 10 in tackles for loss from 2013-20. The units led the nation in TFLs every year from 2013-16.

From 1999-2011, Venables helped OU to the 2000 national championship, three other national championship game appearances (2003, '04 and '08) and seven Big 12 titles. He was a finalist for the Broyles Award in 2006 when the Sooners led the Big 12 in total defense and scoring defense.

Oklahoma linebackers under Venables earned three Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year awards, five Big 12 Defensive Newcomer of the Year accolades and six first-team All-America honors. Ten of his OU linebackers — and 31 defensive players overall — were taken in the 2000-12 NFL Drafts.

While Venables was an Oklahoma assistant, the Sooners ranked among the top 16 nationally in total defense eight times (including each year from 2000-06) and among the top 20 in scoring defense eight times. OU led the Big 12 in scoring defense on four occasions (2000, '04, '06 and '11) and topped the conference in total defense three times (2003, '04, and '06).

Prior to joining Stoops' first staff at OU, Venables coached linebackers at Kansas State (1996-98), serving as defensive running game coordinator in 1998, and was a graduate assistant at K-State under Bill Snyder from 1993-95.

As a player at Kansas State (1991-92), Venables earned honorable mention All-Big Eight honors in 1992 after registering 124 tackles. He began his collegiate playing career at Garden City (Kan.) Community College (1989-90), where he earned All-America honors after recording 276 tackles and was inducted into the school's athletics hall of fame in April 2023.

A native of Salina, Kan., Venables received his bachelor's degree in political science from Kansas State in 1992. He and his wife Julie have four children: sons Jake and Tyler and daughters Laney and Addie.

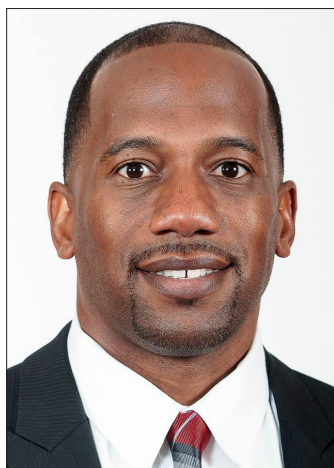

**NORMAN** — John Mateer set a record for passing yards in an Oklahoma debut and the defense allowed its fewest yards in five seasons as No. 18 OU opened the season with a 35-5 win over Illinois State at Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium.

Mateer completed 30 of 37 passes (81%) for 392 yards and three touchdowns, breaking the previous debut-passing-yardage record of 388 set by Baker Mayfield in 2015. Mateer was only the third quarterback to attempt at least 30 passes in his OU debut, and his completion rate was the highest among that group.

Mateer scored the first points of the season on a 7-yard rush near the end of the first quarter. He finished the game with 24 rushing yards on seven carries.

Two of his touchdown passes went to redshirt senior transfer wide receiver Keontez Lewis, who registered a game- and career-high nine catches for 119 yards and had TD receptions of 28 and 20 yards in the fourth quarter. His nine receptions tied the school record for a player in his OU debut.

Redshirt senior wide receiver Deion Burks caught seven passes for 88 yards and a 27-yard touchdown. All four of his touchdown receptions at OU have been in season openers, and he became only the second receiver in program history with four TD receptions in season-opening games (three last year vs. Temple).

Freshman running back Tory Blaylock rushed for a team-high 42 yards on eight carries and scored a touchdown on a 5-yard rush in the second quarter.

Senior tight end Jaren Kanak, who moved from linebacker in the offseason, had five catches for 90 yards, including a 48-yarder that was the longest play of the game. His 90 yards were the most by an OU tight end since the 2022 season.

Freshman defensive back Courtland Guillory became only the second OU true freshman to start at cornerback in a season opener and notched a tackle and a pass breakup.
