OPENING KICK

► No. 13/16 Oklahoma (2-0) plays its first road game of the season when it takes on Temple (2-0) on Saturday at 11 a.m. CT in Philadelphia, Pa.. The game, which will take place at Lincoln Financial Field (home of the Philadelphia Eagles), will be televised by ESPN2 with **Roy Philpott**, **Sam Acho** and **Marilyn Payne** announcing.

► The 2025 season marks the 131st in OU football history. The Sooners lead the nation with their 50 all-time conference titles, 27 11-plus-win seasons (tied), 33 AP top-five finishes and five No. 1 overall NFL Draft picks (tied). They rank second with their seven Heisman Trophy winners (tied), third with seven AP national championships, their 101 weeks as the AP's No. 1 team and 431 total weeks in the AP Top 5, fourth with their 419 NFL Draft picks and fifth with their 58 bowl appearances.

► Oklahoma has played six games in the state of Pennsylvania and owns a 3-2-1 record. One of the losses came against Temple in Philadelphia (1942), while the other five games were played at Pitt (1953, '57, '65, '71 and '84). OU's last game in the Keystone State was a 42-10 victory over Pitt in 1984. The Sooners were ranked No. 15 and the Panthers No. 17.

► Since the start of the 2000 season, Oklahoma owns a 60-17 (.779) record in true road games against teams unranked in the AP poll. That includes an 11-1 mark in non-conference outings (won the last eight). The lone non-conference road loss to an unranked team during the span came in 2005 at UCLA (No. 21 OU lost 41-24).

► Saturday's contest will mark the 1,354th in OU history. The Sooners rank fifth nationally with their .723 all-time winning percentage (952-348-53 record), trailing Ohio State (.736), Alabama (.733), Michigan (.732) and Notre Dame (.731). Since the end of World War II (1946 season to present), OU leads all programs with 708 wins (29 more than Alabama, the program with the next most) and owns a .762 winning percentage.

► A nation-high-tying nine of OU's 2025 opponents, including all eight SEC foes, are ranked in this week's AP Top 25: No. 3 LSU, No. 7 Texas, No. 11 South Carolina, No. 15 Tennessee, No. 17 Ole Miss, No. 19 Alabama, No. 23 Michigan, No. 24 Auburn and No. 25 Missouri. The most ranked teams the Sooners have faced in a regular season is six in 2016.



Redshirt senior WR Deion Burks registered his two top receiving-yardage games as a Sooner vs. Illinois State (88 yards) and Michigan (101). He scored a touchdown in each contest and ranks second in the SEC with his 7.0 receptions per game. Burks had three TD catches vs. Temple in 2024.

KEY STORYLINES

► Saturday will mark the fourth all-time meeting between Oklahoma and Temple, with OU holding a 2-1 series edge. The No. 16 Sooners posted a 51-3 season-opening win last year (recap on next page), while the other matchups took place in the 1940s. In the first meeting in Norman on Nov. 23, 1940, the Sooners prevailed 9-6 in head coach **Tom Stidham's** final season. On Nov. 21, 1942, in Philadelphia, head coach **Dewey Luster's** OU squad lost 14-7 at Temple Stadium. Both teams were unranked in each of the first two meetings.

► Temple is under the direction of first-year head coach **K.C. Keeler**, who spent the last 11 seasons at Sam Houston State and led the Bearkats to a 97-39 record (.713). He is in his 32nd season as a collegiate head coach (also spent nine years at Rowan and then 11 at Delaware) and has won two FCS national championships (2003 at Delaware [15-1 record] and 2020 at Sam Houston [10-0]).

► The Owls rank in the top 20 nationally in both total offense (18th; 513.5 ypg) and total defense (15th; 211.5 ypg). They posted a 42-10 season-opening win at UMass before beating Howard 55-7 at home on Saturday.

► The Sooners' 2024 defense was its best under head coach **Brent Venable**, as they ranked 19th nationally with their 318.2 yards allowed per game (their fewest since 2009). Through two games this season, OU ranks 19th by surrendering just 219.5 yards per contest (151 vs. Illinois State and 288 vs. Michigan). It also ranks sixth in passing defense (88.0 ypg), seventh in third-down defense (16.0% conversion rate) and 10th in scoring defense (8.0 ppg).

► Redshirt junior quarterback **John Mateer**, the nation's top transfer from last season according to ESPN, is off to a stellar start in a Sooners uniform, throwing for 331.0 yards per game (four passing TDs) and rushing for a team-high 49.0 yards per contest (three rushing TDs). He ranks second nationally and first in the SEC with his 380.0 yards of total offense per game.

► Mateer has registered at least one passing TD and at least one rushing TD in each of his last eight games, the longest active streak nationally and tied for the fifth-longest streak since the start of the 2000 season.

► Oklahoma is the only team in the country that ranks in the top 15 in both passing offense and passing defense. The Sooners rank 14th nationally in passing offense (331.0 ypg) and sixth in passing defense (88.0 ypg). Last year, OU ranked 119th in passing offense (175.8 ypg) and 43rd in passing defense (203.2 ypg).

RECAPPING THE WIN OVER MICHIGAN

► No. 18/24 Oklahoma held No. 15/13 Michigan to 288 yards and 12 first downs in posting a 24-13 home win on Saturday. It was the second meeting between the storied programs (OU beat UM 14-6 in the 1976 Orange Bowl to win the 1975 national championship).

► The Sooners limited the Wolverines to nine completions on 24 attempts. The 37.5 completion percentage was the lowest by an OU opponent since the 2023 season.

► Oklahoma, which snapped Michigan's nine-game streak of holding opponents to 17 or fewer points, converted 10 of 18 third- and fourth-down plays (56%) while holding UM to a 3-for-15 performance (20%).

► Redshirt junior quarterback **John Mateer** accounted for 344 total yards and three touchdowns. He completed 21 of 34 passes for 270 yards and a touchdown while rushing 19 times for 74 yards and two TDs.

► With the Sooners leading 21-13 in the fourth quarter, Mateer led a 16-play, 78-yard drive that consumed 8:27 and resulted in a field goal with 1:44 left to seal the victory.

► Mateer's rushing touchdowns were a 2-yarder with 22 seconds left in the first half that gave OU a 14-0 lead and a 10-yarder with 10:12 remaining in the third quarter that put the Sooners up 21-7.

► Redshirt senior wide receiver **Deion Burks**, who hails from Inkster, Mich., had a game-high seven receptions for 101 yards, his most yards as a Sooner. He caught a nine-yard TD pass on the game's first drive.

► Senior tight end **Jaren Kanak**, a converted linebacker, was targeted six times and had five receptions for 69 yards.

► Redshirt junior linebacker **Owen Heinecke** saw his most action as a Sooner and registered a team- and career-high seven tackles (one for loss) and a pass breakup.

► Redshirt senior linebacker **Kendal Daniels** logged four tackles, including a game-high 2.5 TFLs.

► **Michael Fasusi** became the first OU freshman to start at left tackle in his first career game. He played 66 snaps and allowed just one quarterback pressure on 33 pass-blocking plays.

► Four other players made their first OU starts: senior running back **Jaydn Ott**, redshirt junior offensive lineman **Jake Maikkula**, redshirt offensive lineman **Derek Simmons** and redshirt sophomore defensive lineman **Taylor Wein**.

► Central Oklahoma transfer punter **Grayson Miller** made his FBS debut on Saturday, averaging 47.8 yards on four boots. He had a long of 59 yards and two punts were downed inside the 20-yard line.

LAST YEAR VS. TEMPLE

► In the program's first-ever Friday night home game, Oklahoma excelled in all three phases of a 51-3 win over Temple on Aug. 30, 2024. It was the fourth time in head coach **Brent Venables'** OU head coaching tenure the Sooners did not give up a touchdown.

► Offensively, sophomore quarterback **Jackson Arnold** completed 17 of 25 passes (68%) for 141 yards and four touchdowns with no interceptions. He became just the third Sooner to ever pass for at least four TDs in their first career home start, joining **Josh Heupel** in 1999 and **Spencer Rattler** in 2020.

► Three of Arnold's TDs went to redshirt junior **Deion Burks**. The wide receiver finished with six catches for 36 yards and became the first Sooner to catch three TD passes in a season opener and the first OU player to haul in three TDs in his school debut. The Purdue transfer's scoring grabs covered 14, 8 and 5 yards. Arnold's other TD pass was to another newcomer, Southeastern Louisiana tight end transfer **Bauer Sharp**. It was a 14-yard connection on OU's opening drive.

► The Sooners averaged 6.1 yards per rush and were led by freshman **Taylor Tatum**, who racked up 69 yards on just five carries (13.8 average), including a game-long 35-yarder and an eight-yard TD. Redshirt junior **Sam Franklin** carried four times for 45 yards (11.2 average; long of 30) and junior **Jovantae Barnes** carried five times for 33 yards (6.6 average).

► On defense, OU held the Owls to 197 yards and 3.2 yards per play. Temple gained 128 yards on 12-of-25 passing and 69 yards on 36 rushes (1.9 average).

► The Sooners registered six takeaways on the night, their most since 2003. After recovering six fumbles all of the 2023 season, they recovered four against Temple (most nationally on the week), and added two INTs. Junior linebacker **Jaren Kanak** returned one of the recoveries (on an Owls punt return) 21 yards for a TD.

► The game was OU's first since 1987 to finish +6 in turnover margin. The Sooners converted all six takeaways into points (34 total).

► Sixth-year kicker **Tyler Keltner**, who transferred from Florida State, was 3 for 3 on field goals (50, 42 and 24 yards) and made all six PAT tries in his OU debut. He was named SEC Special Teams Player of the Week.

► OU finished with six sacks and nine tackles for loss. Redshirt freshman **Markus Strong** notched solo sacks on each of the game's last two plays.

OU ROAD SHOW

► Oklahoma has won 34 of its last 46 true road games (.739) going back to 2014, with eight of the 12 losses one-score outcomes.

► OU's 2019 defeat at Kansas State snapped the Sooners' 22-game true road winning streak (it hadn't lost since Oct. 4, 2014, at TCU), which was the second longest such streak nationally since at least the end of World War II. During the 22-game streak, OU outscored foes 1,076-626 (49-28 average) and outgained them by 3,621 yards (583-419 average).

► The Sooners have outgained their opponent in 32 of their last 46 true road games.

► OU has scored at least 30 points in 41 of its last 51 true road games (school-record 35-game streak was stopped in 2021 at Baylor). The next highest team total over its last 51 true road contests is 36 (Ohio State).

YEAR TWO IN THE SEC

► Oklahoma and Texas officially joined the Southeastern Conference on July 1, 2024, after 28 years in the Big 12 Conference. OU won half (14) of the Big 12's football titles in its 28 years in the league and posted a 187-61 (.754) record against conference competition (includes an 11-1 record in Big 12 championship games).

► Oklahoma's 14 Big 12 titles were 10 more than the program with the next most (Texas won four). From 2010 through 2023, OU won eight Big 12 titles and was followed by Baylor (three), Kansas State (two) and Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas (one each).

► This week's AP Top 25 poll features 11 SEC teams: No. 3 LSU, No. 6 Georgia, No. 7 Texas, No. 11 South Carolina, No. 13 Oklahoma, No. 15 Tennessee, No. 16 Texas A&M, No. 17 Ole Miss, No. 19 Alabama, No. 24 Auburn and No. 25 Missouri.

NATION'S TOUGHEST SCHEDULE?

► For the second straight season, Oklahoma's schedule is among the nation's most challenging. Heading into 2025, the Sooners' strength of schedule was ranked as the country's toughest in ESPN's FPI.

► OU will play a nation-high-tying nine games this season against teams ranked in this week's AP poll: No. 3 LSU (home), No. 7 Texas (in Dallas), No. 11 South Carolina (away), No. 15 Tennessee (away), No. 17 Ole Miss (home), No. 19 Alabama (away), No. 23 Michigan (home), No. 24 Auburn (home) and No. 25 Missouri (home).

MATEER'S SUPER START

► Redshirt junior quarterback **John Mateer**, who transferred from Washington State in January, has completed 51 of 72 pass attempts (72%) for 662 yards and four touchdowns and two interceptions through two games. He is also OU's leading rusher with 98 yards and three TDs.

► Mateer ranks in the top 15 nationally in total offense (second; 380.0 ypg), passing yards per game (sixth; 331.0), points responsible for per game (seventh; 21.0), rushing TDs (10th; three) and completions per game (12th; 25.5).

► Mateer's 662 passing yards are the second most by an OU quarterback through the first two games of a career (**Josh Heupel** had 773 in the first two contests of the 1999 season).

MORE ON THE OFFENSE

► Senior tight end **Jaren Kanak** played linebacker his first three years (started nine games in 2023 and one last season) but converted to tight end in the spring. The former high school receiver and quarterback has caught 10 passes for 159 yards over the first two games. That's 36% of the receiving yards amassed by OU's tight ends all of last season (438).

► Redshirt senior receiver **Deion Burks**, who spent three years at Purdue and is in his second at OU, caught seven passes and one TD in each of the first two games in 2025. His 88 yards vs. Illinois State and 101 vs. Michigan represent his two highest totals at Oklahoma.

► Fellow redshirt senior receiver **Keontez Lewis** has 12 receptions for 155 yards on the young season and caught two TDs against Illinois State. His nine catches vs. the Redbirds were a career high (he finished with 119 receiving yards).

► Oklahoma is the only SEC team and one of just two squads nationally (Baylor is the other) with three players who each average at least 70.0 receiving yards per game (Burks 94.5, Kanak 79.5 and Lewis 77.5).

► OU has scored on all seven of its red-zone trips this season (six touchdowns and one field goal).

► The Sooners threw for at least 270 yards twice in 2024 (284 vs. Maine and 275 vs. Navy in the Armed Forces Bowl), but have already done it twice this season (392 vs. Illinois State and 270 vs. Michigan).

► Redshirt senior offensive lineman **Febechi Nwaiwu** is the only OU offensive lineman to start both games this season. He started both contests at right guard.

MORE ON THE DEFENSE

► Oklahoma ranks No. 4 nationally (min. two games) in first downs allowed (20), No. 6 in passing defense (88.0 ypg), No. 7 in passing efficiency defense rating (76.8), No. 7 (first in the SEC) in third-down conversion percentage defense (16.0%; 4 for 25), No. 10 in scoring defense (8.0 ppg), No. 18 in total defense (219.5 ypg) and No. 23 in red zone defense (67%).

► The Sooners have limited opponents to just 176 passing yards through two games this season (34 against Illinois State and 142 tonight). It is the fewest passing yards OU has allowed through two games since 1998 (114 combined vs. North Texas and TCU).

► The strength of the Sooners' defense very well could be its line, with three players returning who started a combined 33 games last season (senior **Damonic Williams** 12, senior **R Mason Thomas** 11 and freshman **Jayden Jackson** 10) and another who started three and saw extensive field time (senior **Gracen Halton**). That quartet totaled 118 tackles, 26 tackles for loss, 17 sacks and 16 QB hurries last season. Phil Steele ranked OU's defensive line as the best in the country this summer, and ESPN/SEC Network analyst Cole Cubelic said in May the Sooners have the league's best defensive line, "... and it ain't even close."

► Linebackers **Owen Heinecke** and **Sammy Omosigho** pace the team with 11 tackles each despite neither of them starting a game. Omosigho has 2.5 tackles for loss (1.5 sacks) while Heinecke has 2.0.

► Against Illinois State, **Courtland Guillory** became only the second OU true freshman to start at cornerback in a season opener (the other was **P.J. Mbanasor** in 2015). Guillory has four tackles, a pass breakup and a QB hurry through two games.

► OU has not allowed any points in the first, second or fourth quarters this season. Opponents' 16 points (one touchdown and three field goals) have come in the third quarter.

► This is the fourth straight season (all under head coach **Brent Venables**) OU has allowed only one total touchdown in its first two games.

► The Sooners have yet to force a turnover.

A LOOK AT SPECIAL TEAMS

► Oklahoma leads the SEC and ranks 11th nationally in net punting average (46.0). Redshirt sophomore **Jacob Ulrich** (first-team All-Conference USA last season at Kennesaw State) averaged 47.5 yards on two punts against Illinois State while redshirt junior **Grayson Miller** averaged 47.8 yards on his four punts vs. Michigan. Both are first-year Sooners.

► Redshirt junior **Tate Sandell** has handled placekicking and kickoff duties the first two games. The first-year Sooner is 1 for 2 on field goal tries after making 19 of 23 last year at UTSA.

► Redshirt junior **Ben Anderson** is OU's long snapper for the third straight year. He earned third-team All-SEC honors last season and is a 2025 third-team preseason All-American by Phil Steele.

► Oklahoma's special teams units were drastically improved in 2024 under first-year coordinator **Doug Deakin**. After finishing No. 107 in the FEI (Fremeau Efficiency Index) special teams ratings in 2023 the year before Deakin's arrival, the Sooners jumped to No. 34 last season.

BREAKING DOWN THE TRANSFERS

► The Sooners signed 22 transfers in the offseason, with the vast majority of those on offense. The breakdown is 14 offensive, four defensive and four special teams players.

► OU's transfer portal class was ranked No. 12 nationally by 247Sports.

► Perhaps OU's two biggest offseason player additions were on the offensive side of the ball in redshirt junior quarterback

John Mateer and senior running back **Jaydn Ott**. Mateer, who starred at Washington State, was ranked by ESPN in May as the country's No. 1 transfer, while Ott was No. 17. A Manning Award finalist last year after passing for 3,139 yards and rushing for 826 in his first season as a starter, Mateer was the nation's only player with at least 20 touchdown passes (29) and at least 10 rushing TDs (15). His 44 TDs responsible for led the country in the regular season. Ott, who came from Cal, rushed for 2,597 yards (24 TDs) and caught 95 passes for 712 yards (six TDs) over the last three seasons (1,315 rushing yards/12 TDs in 2023).

► The other offensive transfers consist of five wide receivers (redshirt senior **Keontez Lewis** [Southern Illinois], redshirt juniors **Javonnie Gibson** [Arkansas-Pine Bluff] and **Isaiah Sategna III** [Arkansas], junior **Jer' Michael Carter** [McNeese State] and sophomore **Josiah Martin** [Cal]), three offensive linemen (redshirt senior **Derek Simmons** [Western Carolina], redshirt junior **Jake Maikkula** [Stanford] and junior **Luke Baklenko** [Stanford]), three tight ends (redshirt senior **Will Huggins** [Pittsburg State] and redshirt juniors **Carson Kent** [Kennesaw State] and **John Locke Jr.** [Louisiana Tech]) and redshirt sophomore quarterback **Whitt Newbauer** (Mercer).

► On defense, two transfers are linemen (senior **Marvin Jones Jr.** [Florida State] and redshirt sophomore **Siolaa Lolohea** [Utah State]) and two are linebackers (redshirt senior **Kendal Daniels** [Oklahoma State] and redshirt sophomore **Reed DeQuasie** [Oklahoma State]).

► The special teams transfers feature two placekickers (redshirt junior **Tate Sandell** [UTSA], redshirt senior **Austin Welch** [Kennesaw State]) and one punter (redshirt sophomore **Jacob Ulrich** [Kennesaw State]) and one punter/placekicker (redshirt junior **Grayson Miller** [Central Oklahoma]).

FIVE PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

► Five Sooners — two each on offense and defense and one on special teams — earned 2025 preseason All-America recognition.

► Senior defensive lineman **R Mason Thomas** was a third-team preseason All-American by Athlon and Phil Steele after ranking fourth in the SEC and 17th nationally with his 9.0 sacks (0.8 per game) last year. He also led the Sooners with his 12.5 tackles for loss and 11 QB hurries.

► Senior running back **Jaydn Ott** was a third-team preseason All-American by Phil Steele and a fourth-teamer by Athlon. The Cal transfer arrived at OU in June after posting 2,597 rushing yards (25 TDs) and 712 receiving yards (six TDs) over the last three seasons.

► Redshirt junior **Ben Anderson** was a third-team preseason All-American by Phil Steele. OU's long snapper each of the last two seasons, he was a third-team All-SEC pick last year.

► Redshirt senior wide receiver **Deion Burks** picked up fourth-team preseason All-America honors from Athlon. Burks, who battled injuries in his first season at OU last year after transferring from Purdue, entered the year with 94 career catches for 1,049 yards and 10 touchdowns.

► Redshirt junior linebacker **Kip Lewis** also picked up fourth-team honors from Phil Steele. In 2024, Lewis started 12 of 13 games and logged 65 tackles and 4.0 tackles for loss, and returned interceptions for touchdowns in wins at Auburn and against No. 7 Alabama.

NEW ASSISTANT COACHES

► The 2025 OU coaching staff features a new play-caller on offense and two new coaches on the defensive side of the ball. In December, Oklahoma head coach **Brent Venables** hired **Ben Arbuckle** as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. Arbuckle, who served the 2023 and 2024 seasons in the same capacity at Washington State, presided over a 2024 Cougars offense that ranked 12th nationally in the regular season

with its 36.8 points per game, sixth in passing TDs (30), eighth in yards per pass attempt (9.1), ninth in passing efficiency rating (165.2), 22nd in total offense (440.4 ypg) and 24th in passing offense (268.8 ypg) and rushing TDs (27). WSU rushed for over 100 yards in 11 games (its most since 2005) and 89 yards in the other regular season contest.

► Venables also brought in **Nate Dreiling** as inside linebackers coach and **Wes Goodwin** as assistant linebackers and outside linebackers coach. Dreiling served the 2024 season at Utah State as interim head coach and defensive coordinator. He has spent five years as a defensive coordinator at Utah State (2024), New Mexico State (2022-23) and Pittsburg State (2018-19). His Utah State defense last year ranked 36th nationally in interceptions (13).

► Goodwin was promoted to defensive coordinator at Clemson prior to the 2022 season after Venables was named head coach at Oklahoma. He spent a total of 13 seasons across two stints at Clemson and helped guide the Tigers to the 2024 ACC Championship and an appearance in the College Football Playoff. Clemson ranked in the top 20 nationally in takeaways, interceptions and fumbles recovered during the 2024 season, ranked eighth nationally in total defense and pass defense in 2023 and ranked among the top 25 nationally in scoring defense, rushing defense, yards allowed per rush, sacks and tackles for loss in his first season as defensive coordinator in 2022.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (708) than any other program (next most is 679 by Alabama).

► Oklahoma has finished in the top 5 of the AP poll a nation-leading 33 times (Ohio State is second with 31).

► OU leads all FBS programs with 50 all-time conference championships. The rest of the top five includes Nebraska (46), Michigan (45), Ohio State (39) and USC (37). The Sooners' 14 league titles since 2000 are the most among Power Five programs (Ohio State ranks second with 11).

► No program has more all-time 11-win seasons than Oklahoma's 27 (Alabama also has 27).

► Since the start of the 2000 season, OU ranks second with 18 seasons of at least 10 wins and ranks second with 263 victories.

► Since former head coach **Bob Stoops** arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads the country with its 13,149 points scored. Boise State (12,747) is second and Oregon (12,506) third.

► Oklahoma's 81 consensus All-Americans since 1950 lead the nation (Alabama and Ohio State rank second with 77 each). Since 2000, OU has produced 31 consensus All-Americans, tied with Ohio State behind only Alabama.

EXTRA POINTS

► The Sooners are 8-4-1 all-time as the No. 13-ranked team in the AP poll (2-2 on the road). Oklahoma was last ranked 13th in 2023 when it defeated TCU 69-45 at home. OU's last road contest as the AP's 13th-ranked team was in 2012 at West Virginia (50-49 win behind **Landry Jones'** then-school-record 554 passing yards). Its last loss when ranked No. 13 was in 2011 (44-10 at Oklahoma State).

► Oklahoma running backs coach **DeMarco Murray** played the 2015 NFL season with the Philadelphia Eagles, who play their home games at Lincoln Financial Field, site of Saturday's game. Murray spent seven years in the NFL and was named the league's offensive player of the year in 2014 with the Dallas Cowboys.

► Saturday's game will mark OU's first in an NFL stadium in the regular season since the No. 3 Sooners lost to No. 15 Houston 33-23 in the 2016 opener at NRG Stadium, home of the Houston Texans.

► Of Oklahoma's 111 players, 45 (or 41%) are newcomers. That group is comprised of 23 freshmen and 22 transfers (seven seniors, 10 juniors and five sophomores).

► Of the 74 players on OU's weeks 1 and 2 depth chart, 19 (or 26%) were freshmen. That includes 11 true freshmen (five offense, five defense, one special teams) and eight redshirt freshmen (two offense, five defense, one special teams).

► In their 18 wins since the start of the 2023 season, the Sooners have outscored opponents 175-32 off turnovers. In their 11 losses during the same span, they have been outscored 105-27 off turnovers.

► Since the start of the 2014 season, OU ranks fourth nationally (second in Power Four) with its 5.3 yards per rush and seventh (fourth in Power Four) with its 352 rushing TDs.

► Since offensive line coach **Bill Bedenbaugh** joined the OU staff in 2013, the Sooners rank first nationally in total offense (493.9 ypg), second in yards per pass attempt (9.1), third in pass efficiency rating (164.6) and scoring offense (39.4 ppg), fourth in yards per rush (5.3; tied) and sixth in completion percentage (66.0) and in yards per completion (13.8). It is the only program in the country to rank in the top 15 in passing offense (eighth at 279.8 ypg) and rushing offense (12th at 214.1 ypg) during that span.

► The Sooners have won their last 83 games when holding opponents to under 21 points. Their last loss under the circumstance came at Nebraska in 2009 (10-3).

► Since the start of the 2012 season, OU is 93-7 when scoring at least 35 points and 80-4 when scoring at least 40.

► Oklahoma is tied for the national lead with five No. 1 overall NFL Draft picks. OU has produced three No. 1 overall picks in the last 16 years alone. No other school has produced more than one during that period.

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and A 62-foot-by-38-foot video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE TURNS 100 ON OCT. 17

► Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals, is hosting football games for the 101st year this season. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.

► In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.

► The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).

► In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.

► Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and 83,489 (2016). With 2019's widening of aisles and some seats, capacity dropped to its current 80,126 figure.

► In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

► The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.

► The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489. The addition of handrails and some seat and aisle widening in 2019 reduced capacity to 80,126.

► The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons also benefit from two new clubs.

► Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.

► All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space includes a spacious locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.

► The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.

► A significantly larger and more detailed video board replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

A former 13-year University of Oklahoma assistant coach who won a national championship with the Sooners and two more with Clemson University during an ultra-successful 10-year stint as defensive coordinator, Brent Venables was named OU's 23rd head football coach on Dec. 5, 2021, and has coached the Sooners to a 24-17 record in his three-plus seasons.

Venables' 2023 Sooners went 10-3 overall and finished in second place in the Big 12 (7-2). They ranked third nationally in total offense (507.0 ypg) and fourth in scoring offense (41.7 ppg) and led the country in defensive interceptions per game (1.5).

The 54-year-old Venables served as co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Oklahoma from 1999-2003 and as associate head coach, defensive coordinator and linebackers coach from 2004-11 under former head coach Bob Stoops. Venables has coached in eight national championship games between his time at OU and Clemson, winning titles with the Sooners in 2000 and Tigers in 2016 and 2018. In 26 years as a full-time assistant coach, Venables' teams produced 26 winning seasons, won 13 conference titles, went to 30 bowl games (includes four College Football Playoff National Championship games) and won at least 10 games 22 times.

After joining Clemson prior to the 2012 season, Venables constructed one of the nation's top defenses. From 2012-2021, the Tigers ranked first nationally in sacks (445; next most was 392) and opponent third-down conversion percentage (30.2), second in opponent pass efficiency rating (111.1) and takeaways (244; tied), third in scoring defense (17.8 ppg) and opponent completion percentage (53.3), fourth in total defense (311.4 ypg) and pass defense (190.5 ypg), fifth in interceptions (148) and sixth in rushing defense (120.9 ypg). They won league titles each year from 2015-20.

Since 2000, Venables has coached eight national award winners and 16 consensus All-Americans. In that time, 61 defensive players under his guidance have been selected in the NFL Draft (12 first-rounders), including 18 linebackers, two of whom were first-round picks.

As a defensive coordinator and linebackers coach, Venables produced winners of three Butkus Awards (OU's Rocky Calmus in 2001 and Teddy Lehman in 2003, and CU's Isaiah Simmons in 2019), two Nagurski Awards (OU's Roy Williams in 2001 and Derrick Strait in 2003), two Thorpe Awards (Williams in 2001 and Strait in 2003) and one Bednarik Award (Lehman in 2003). And in 2018, Clemson defensive tackle Christian Wilkins became the school's first winner of William V. Campbell Trophy, also known as the "Academic Heisman."

Venables has received national accolades for his coaching and recruiting, including the Frank Broyles Award in 2016 as the nation's top assistant coach after being a finalist in 2015. He was FootballScoop's Defensive Coordinator of the Year in 2014 and Rivals.com's Recruiter of the Year in 2015.

Venables' defensive units were remarkably consistent during his 10 years with the Tigers. Each of his last eight Clemson defenses ranked in the top 15 nationally in yards allowed and seven of the last eight ranked in the top 20 in points allowed. Over his last eight years there, his units ranked first (in 2014), 10th, eighth, fourth, fifth, sixth, 15th and ninth (in 2021) in total defense. Additionally, his units ranked first or second in the ACC in total defense each of his last eight years (ranked first in six of those seasons).

Under Venables' tutelage in 2021, Clemson ranked second nationally in scoring defense (15.0 ppg) and red zone defense (62.1 conversion percentage), fourth in sacks (3.4 per game), eighth in rushing defense (98.8 ypg) and ninth in total defense (308.4 ypg).

Venables' 2020 Clemson defense tied for the national lead with 46 sacks, despite no player producing more than 4.5 sacks individually. His 2019 unit allowed fewer than 300 yards of total offense in each of its first 12 games, the first defense nationally since at least 1996 to accomplish that feat. Clemson held 16 straight opponents to 20 or fewer points across the 2018-19 seasons, the school's longest streak since the 1937-40 campaigns.

Clemson's 2018 squad led the nation in scoring defense (13.1 ppg) for the first time in school history and set a program record by recording 54 sacks.

Venables' Clemson defenses ranked among the top 10 nationally in sacks each year from 2014-21 and ranked in the top 10 in tackles for loss from 2013-20. The units led the nation in TFLs every year from 2013-16.

From 1999-2011, Venables helped OU to the 2000 national championship, three other national championship game appearances (2003, '04 and '08) and seven Big 12 titles. He was a finalist for the Broyles Award in 2006 when the Sooners led the Big 12 in total defense and scoring defense.

Oklahoma linebackers under Venables earned three Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year awards, five Big 12 Defensive Newcomer of the Year accolades and six first-team All-America honors. Ten of his OU linebackers — and 31 defensive players overall — were taken in the 2000-12 NFL Drafts.

While Venables was an Oklahoma assistant, the Sooners ranked among the top 16 nationally in total defense eight times (including each year from 2000-06) and among the top 20 in scoring defense eight times. OU led the Big 12 in scoring defense on four occasions (2000, '04, '06 and '11) and topped the conference in total defense three times (2003, '04, and '06).

Prior to joining Stoops' first staff at OU, Venables coached linebackers at Kansas State (1996-98), serving as defensive running game coordinator in 1998, and was a graduate assistant at K-State under Bill Snyder from 1993-95.

As a player at Kansas State (1991-92), Venables earned honorable mention All-Big Eight honors in 1992 after registering 124 tackles. He began his collegiate playing career at Garden City (Kan.) Community College (1989-90), where he earned All-America honors after recording 276 tackles and was inducted into the school's athletics hall of fame in April 2023.

A native of Salina, Kan., Venables received his bachelor's degree in political science from Kansas State in 1992. He and his wife Julie have four children: sons Jake and Tyler and daughters Laney and Addie.

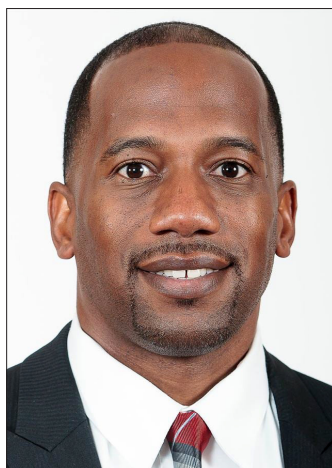

NORMAN — John Mateer set a record for passing yards in an Oklahoma debut and the defense allowed its fewest yards in five seasons as No. 18 OU opened the season with a 35-5 win over Illinois State at Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium.

Mateer completed 30 of 37 passes (81%) for 392 yards and three touchdowns, breaking the previous debut-passing-yardage record of 388 set by Baker Mayfield in 2015. Mateer was only the third quarterback to attempt at least 30 passes in his OU debut, and his completion rate was the highest among that group.

Mateer scored the first points of the season on a 7-yard rush near the end of the first quarter. He finished the game with 24 rushing yards on seven carries.

Two of his touchdown passes went to redshirt senior transfer wide receiver Keontez Lewis, who registered a game- and career-high nine catches for 119 yards and had TD receptions of 28 and 20 yards in the fourth quarter. His nine receptions tied the school record for a player in his OU debut.

Redshirt senior wide receiver Deion Burks caught seven passes for 88 yards and a 27-yard touchdown. All four of his touchdown receptions at OU have been in season openers, and he became only the second receiver in program history with four TD receptions in season-opening games (three last year vs. Temple).

Freshman running back Tory Blaylock rushed for a team-high 42 yards on eight carries and scored a touchdown on a 5-yard rush in the second quarter.

Senior tight end Jaren Kanak, who moved from linebacker in the offseason, had five catches for 90 yards, including a 48-yarder that was the longest play of the game. His 90 yards were the most by an OU tight end since the 2022 season.

Freshman defensive back Courtland Guillory became only the second OU true freshman to start at cornerback in a season opener and notched a tackle and a pass breakup. Junior linebacker Sammy Omosigbo registered a team-high eight tackles and recorded his first career sack, and redshirt junior linebacker Owen Heinecke made a career-high four tackles, including his first career tackle for loss.

NORMAN — John Mateer rushed for two touchdowns and threw another and Deion Burks caught seven passes for 101 yards and a score against his home-state team to lead No. 18/24 Oklahoma to a 24-13 win over No. 15/13 Michigan at Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. It was just the second meeting between the storied programs (OU beat UM 14-6 in the 1976 Orange Bowl to claim the 1975 national title).

Mateer completed 21 of 34 passes for 270 yards and rushed for 74 more on 19 carries. The redshirt junior signal-caller tossed a 9-yard touchdown pass to Burks on the game's opening possession, then scored on a 2-yard run with 22 seconds left in the half. He added a 10-yard rushing score in the third quarter to extend the lead to 21-7. Burks, a redshirt senior from Inkster, Mich., had his first 100-yard receiving game at OU.

The Sooners limited the Wolverines to 288 yards of total offense, including just 142 passing. Michigan's only touchdown came on a 75-yard rush by Justice Haynes on the first scrimmage play of the second half. OU held UM quarterback Bryce Underwood to 9-of-24 passing (37.5%) and the Wolverines offense to 3 of 14 on third downs.

With Oklahoma leading 21-13 in the fourth quarter, Mateer led a 16-play, 78-yard drive that consumed 8:27 and resulted in a 21-yard field goal by Tate Sandell to push the lead to 11 points with 1:44 remaining.

Senior tight end Jaren Kanak notched five receptions for the second straight game and ended with 69 receiving yards.

Redshirt junior linebacker Owen Heinecke led the Sooners with seven tackles (one for loss) and added a pass breakup. Redshirt senior linebacker Kendal Daniels finished with four tackles, 2.5 of which went for lost yardage. Redshirt sophomore defensive lineman Taylor Wein made his first career start and tallied three tackles, while Michael Fasusi became the first freshman in program history to start at left tackle in his first career game.
