OPENING KICK

► No. 11/12 Oklahoma (3-0) and No. 22/25 Auburn (3-0) begin their SEC slates when they meet Saturday at 2:30 p.m. CT at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. The game, the first between the Sooners and Tigers in Norman, will be televised by ABC with **Sean McDonough**, **Greg McElroy** and **Molly McGrath** announcing.

► The 2025 season marks the 131st in OU football history. The Sooners lead the nation with their 50 all-time conference titles, 27 11-plus-win seasons (tied), 33 AP top-five finishes and five No. 1 overall NFL Draft picks (tied). They rank second with their seven Heisman Trophy winners (tied), third with seven AP national championships, their 101 weeks as the AP's No. 1 team and 431 total weeks in the AP Top 5, fourth with their 419 NFL Draft picks and fifth with their 58 bowl appearances.

► Auburn is one of five Oklahoma opponents playing in Norman for the first time this season. OU already beat Illinois State and Michigan in their Norman debuts in weeks 1 and 2, respectively. The Tigers will mark the Sooners' 99th all-time opponent at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. Ole Miss and LSU will take that number to 101 this season.

► SEC Network's traveling pregame show "SEC Nation" will make its Norman debut on Saturday, broadcasting from the South Oval on OU's campus. **Laura Rutledge** will host and be joined by **Paul Finebaum**, **Roman Harper**, **Jordan Rodgers** and **Tim Tebow** from 9-11 a.m. The "Marty & McGee" show will kick off programming live from 8-9 a.m.

► Saturday's contest will mark the 1,355th in OU history. The Sooners rank fifth nationally with their .723 all-time winning percentage (953-348-53 record), trailing Ohio State (.736), Alabama (.733), Michigan (.732) and Notre Dame (.731). Since the end of World War II (1946 season to present), OU leads all programs with 709 wins (29 more than Alabama, the program with the next most) and owns a .766 winning percentage.

► A nation-high-tying nine of OU's 2025 opponents, including all eight SEC foes, are ranked in this week's AP or coaches top-25 polls: No. 3/4 LSU, No. 8/7 Texas, No. 13/11 Ole Miss, No. 14/14 Alabama, No. 15/15 Tennessee, No. 21/20 Michigan, No. 22/25 Auburn, No. 23/22 Missouri and RV/24 South Carolina. The most AP-ranked teams the Sooners have faced in a regular season is six in 2016.



Senior TE Jaren Kanak, who converted from linebacker in spring, leads the nation's tight ends with 245 receiving yards (next most is 199). That represents 54% of the combined receiving yards by OU's tight ends all of 2024. He has games of 90, 69 and 86 yards and is averaging 17.5 yards per catch.

NUMBERS TO NOTE

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OU is one of only three teams with **four** players who average 50.0-plus receiving yards per game (**Jaren Kanak** [81.7], **Deion Burks** [75.0], **Keontez Lewis** [60.3] and **Isaiah Sategna III** [52.3]).

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The Sooners lead the SEC in **six** defensive categories, including total defense (181.0), passing defense (84.7), scoring defense (6.3) and third-down conversion pct. (17.1). See page 3 chart.

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Oklahoma has forced as many punts through three games (27) as it has allowed first downs (27). The last time OU permitted 27 or fewer first downs through its first three games was 1985 (16).

KEY STORYLINES

► OU head coach **Brent Venables** is 4-0 against Auburn in his coaching career, leading the Sooners to a 27-21 road win last year and posting a 3-0 mark as Clemson's defensive coordinator (26-19 in 2012 in Atlanta [his first game with CU], 19-13 in 2016 in Auburn and 14-6 in 2017 in Clemson). His OU and Clemson defensive units have held Auburn to an average of 14.8 points and 308.8 yards and have racked up 21 sacks and 45 tackles for loss in the four contests.

► Saturday's game marks the return of former OU quarterback

Jackson Arnold to Norman. Arnold, who has started each of Auburn's first three games this season, played in 17 contests over the previous two campaigns and made 10 starts (nine last season). He completed 63% of his passes for 1,984 yards and 16 TDs (six INTs) as a Sooner, and rushed for 560 yards and four TDs. He did not play in OU's win at Auburn last season.

► While Oklahoma's offense has been strong through three games (ranks 28th out of 134 teams in yards per game at 472.7), the Sooners' defense has been other-worldly. OU ranks second nationally in passing defense efficiency (84.7 rating), third in first downs allowed per game (9.0), and fourth in total defense (181.0 ypg), scoring defense (6.3 ppg) and third-down conversion defense (17.1%). It leads the SEC in each of those categories. OU also ranks 19th in tackles for loss per game (8.0) and 34th in rushing defense (96.3 ypg).

► Redshirt junior quarterback **John Mateer**, the nation's top transfer from last season according to ESPN, is off to a stellar start at OU. He ranks second nationally with his 368.3 yards of total offense per game.

► Mateer has registered at least one rushing TD and at least one passing TD in each of his last nine games, good for the longest active streak nationally and tied for the fourth-longest streak since the start of the 2000 season (see chart on page 3).

► Arnold (64.0) and Mateer (53.7) rank second and third among SEC quarterbacks in rushing yards per game. Mateer ranks first in passing yards (314.7 ypg) while Arnold ranks 14th (167.0 ypg).

► The Sooners have allowed just one rushing touchdown this season (Michigan) and Auburn none.

► OU has yet to allow any points in the first or fourth quarters this season. It has allowed just three points in the second quarter and 16 in the third.

RECAPPING THE WIN AT TEMPLE

► In its first game in Pennsylvania since 1984, No. 13/16 Oklahoma racked up 515 yards of offense while limiting Temple to 104 — the fewest by an OU opponent since 2014 — in a 42-3 win at Lincoln Financial Field in Philadelphia. The Owls entered the game ranked 18th nationally by averaging 513.5 yards per contest and had scored 97 points over their first two outings.

► Temple's seven first downs (including one by penalty) were the fewest OU allowed since the 2015 season (at Kansas State). The Owls' 12 punts were the most by a Sooners opponent since 2015, and the most in a true road game since 2000. OU's defense registered eight three-and-outs.

► QB **John Mateer** completed 20 of 34 passes for 282 yards and a touchdown and rushed seven times for 63 yards and a TD (a 51-yarder). It was his third effort of at least 270 passing yards in three games.

► Freshman RB **Tory Blaylock** registered a career-high 100 rushing yards on 14 carries (7.1 average) and two touchdowns en route to SEC Freshman of the Week honors. He scored on runs of 6 and 18 yards in the second quarter for his first career multi-TD game.

► Redshirt junior WR **Isaiah Sategna III** logged career and game highs of seven receptions and 97 yards (13.9 average). The first-year Sooner, a transfer from Arkansas, was credited with 101 yards after the catch.

► Senior TE **Jaren Kanak** tallied four receptions for 86 yards and converted a two-point conversion attempt after OU's first touchdown with a pass to holder **Jacob Ulrich**. All four of his catches resulted in first downs, and three came on third-down plays.

► Redshirt senior DB **Kendel Dolby** started at cornerback in his first action since getting injured the the fourth game of last season (vs. Tennessee) and finished with a team-high-tying four tackles (one for loss). Sophomore DB **Reggie Powers III** and redshirt sophomore LB **Taylor Heim** set career highs with four stops each.

► Powers III, sophomore DB **Michael Boganowski** and redshirt freshman DL **Wyatt Gilmore** each notched their first career sack. It was Gilmore's second career game (also played last season vs. Temple).

► Junior LB **Sammy Omosigho** recorded three pass breakups. He had one career PBU entering the game.

► In his second career game, Central Oklahoma transfer punter **Grayson Miller** averaged 50.0 yards on four boots. He had a long of 58 yards and two punts were downed inside the 20-yard line.

OU-AUBURN SERIES HISTORY

► Oklahoma and Auburn have met three times, including twice in the Sugar Bowl, and OU has won each game.

► In the final game of the 1971 season, **Chuck Fairbanks'** No. 3 Sooners downed **Ralph Jordan's** No. 5 Tigers 40-22 in the Sugar Bowl in front of 84,031 fans at Tulane Stadium.

► In the last game of the 2016 season, **Bob Stoops'** No. 7 OU squad prevailed 35-19 over **Gus Malzahn's** 17th-ranked Auburn team. Sugar Bowl attendance at the Superdome was 54,077.

► Last season in Auburn, Ala., the Sooners posted a 21-18 win (recap in next note).

THE OU-AUBURN SERIES

Oklahoma has won its only three meetings against Auburn, with two of them Sugar Bowl contests.

LAST YEAR VS. AUBURN

► Trailing 21-10 with less than nine minutes left in the fourth quarter, No. 21/18 Oklahoma scored the final 17 points in a 27-21 win at Auburn on Sept. 28, 2024, for its first-ever SEC victory.

► The Sooners scored the go-ahead points when redshirt sophomore linebacker **Kip Lewis** returned an interception 63 yards for a touchdown with 4:06 remaining. Freshman quarterback **Michael Hawkins Jr.** converted the ensuing two-point conversion on an acrobatic dive to put OU ahead 24-21 and redshirt senior kicker **Zach Schmit** later booted a 39-yard field goal with 54 seconds to go for the game's final points.

► Lewis, who added five tackles, including one for a loss, was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week.

► Hawkins Jr. became just the seventh OU quarterback to start at least one game as a true freshman and became the first OU true freshman QB to win on the road in his first career start. Hawkins, who ran for a 48-yard score on the Sooners' first possession, completed 10 of 15 passes for 161 yards and rushed 14 times for 69 yards. He had no turnovers.

► Redshirt senior receiver **J.J. Hester** entered the contest without a reception since the 2022 season but caught three passes for game and career highs of 86 yards. His 60-yard nab in the fourth quarter set up a touchdown that cut Auburn's lead to 21-16 with 8:32 remaining.

► Junior running back **Jovantae Barnes** carried 18 times for 61 yards and scored on a 2-yard run.

► Senior safety **Billy Bowman Jr.** logged a game-high eight tackles, seven of them solo. Junior defensive lineman **R Mason Thomas** added four tackles, including sacks on back-to-back third- and fourth-down plays totaling 19 yards on Auburn's first possession after OU went up 24-21. The turnover on downs in Tigers territory led to the Sooners' final field goal.

► Junior safety **Robert Spears-Jennings** (9 yards) and redshirt sophomore linebacker **Kobie McKinzie** (6 yards) had one sack each.

► Schmit, who filled in for primary place kicker **Tyler Keltner** (appendicitis), made both of his field goal tries. He also connected on a 24-yarder late in the third quarter.

HOME IS WHERE THE "W" IS

► The Sooners are 147-15 (.907) at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium since the start of the 1999 season (**Bob Stoops'** first year as head coach), giving them just one more home loss than conference titles during the period. It is the second-best home winning percentage in the country over the last 26-plus seasons (Boise State [.909] is first and Ohio State [.897] third). OU has outscored its foes by an average of 43-18 in those games.

► Not including this week's game, OU has sold out 161 straight originally scheduled home contests dating back to the start of the 1999 season (**Bob Stoops'** first as head coach). Only Nebraska has a longer current streak.

► Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium celebrated its 100th season in 2024. The 100th anniversary of the first game played in the stadium will be on Oct. 17. On that day in 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new 16,000-seat west stands, a 7-0 victory over Drake.

► The first game played at the current stadium site, called Owen Field and named after former head coach and athletics director **Bennie Owen** (a charter member of the College Football Hall of Fame), took place in 1923, before stadium construction got underway.

► OU owns a sparkling 425-88-15 (.819) all-time record at the "Palace on the Prairie" and has faced 98 opponents there (remaining home foes Auburn, Ole Miss and LSU this season will take that number to 101).

YEAR TWO IN THE SEC

► Oklahoma and Texas officially joined the Southeastern Conference on July 1, 2024, after 28 years in the Big 12 Conference. OU won half (14) of the Big 12's football titles in its 28 years in the league and posted a 187-61 (.754) record against conference competition (includes an 11-1 record in Big 12 championship games).

► Oklahoma's 14 Big 12 titles were 10 more than the program with the next most (Texas won four). From 2010 through 2023, OU won eight Big 12 titles and was followed by Baylor (three), Kansas State (two) and Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas (one each).

► This week's AP poll features 11 SEC teams (including eight of the top 15): No. 3 LSU, No. 5 Georgia, No. 8 Texas, No. 10 Texas A&M, No. 11 Oklahoma, No. 13 Ole Miss, No. 14 Alabama, No. 15 Tennessee, No. 20 Vanderbilt, No. 22 Auburn and No. 23 Missouri. The AFCA coaches poll also includes No. 24 South Carolina.

MATEER'S SUPER START

► Redshirt junior quarterback **John Mateer**, who transferred from Washington State in January, has completed 71 of 105 pass attempts (68%) for 944 yards and five touchdowns through three games. He is also OU's second-leading rusher with 161 yards and has a team-high four TDs on the ground.

► Mateer ranks in the top 20 nationally in total offense (second; 368.3 ypg), passing yards per game (seventh; 314.7), completions per game (11th; 23.7), rushing TDs (14th; four) and points responsible for per game (17th; 18.0).

► Mateer's 944 passing yards are the third most by an OU quarterback through the first three games of a career (**Josh Heupel** had 1,202 in the first three contests of 1999 and **Baker Mayfield** had 1,062 yards in the first three outings of 2015).

MORE ON THE OFFENSE

► True freshman running back **Tory Blaylock** leads the team with 166 rushing yards on the season after registering 100 rushing yards and two touchdowns at Temple. It was Blaylock's first career 100-yard rushing game, and he became the first OU running back to register two touchdowns this season. His 25-yard run in the third quarter was the longest rushing play by a Sooners running back on the year.

► Senior tight end **Jaren Kanak** played linebacker his first three years (started nine games in 2023 and one last season) but converted to tight end in the spring. The former high school receiver and quarterback has caught 14 passes for 245 yards over OU's first three games. The 245 yards lead the nation's tight ends (next most is 199) and represent 54% of the receiving yards amassed by OU's tight ends all of last season (455).

► Redshirt senior receiver **Deion Burks**, who spent three years at Purdue and is in his second at Oklahoma, caught seven passes and one TD in each of the first two games in 2025 and leads the Sooners with 17 receptions. His 88 yards vs. Illinois State and 101 vs. Michigan represent his two highest totals at OU.

► Fellow redshirt senior receiver **Keontez Lewis** has 15 receptions for 181 yards on the young season and caught two TDs against Illinois State. His nine catches vs. the Redbirds were a career high (he finished with 119 receiving yards).

► Oklahoma is the only SEC team and one of just three squads nationally (Baylor and Syracuse are the others) with four players who each average at least 50.0 receiving yards per game (Kanak 81.7, Burks 75.0, Lewis 60.3 and **Isaiah Sategna III** 52.3).

► OU has scored on all 13 of its red-zone trips this season (10 touchdowns and three field goals).

► The Sooners threw for at least 270 yards twice in 2024 (284 vs. Maine and 275 vs. Navy in the Armed Forces Bowl), but have done it three times in three games this season (392 vs. Illinois State, 270 vs. Michigan and 287 at Temple).

► In the win over No. 15 Michigan, **Michael Fasusi** became the first OU freshman to start at left tackle in his first career game. He played 66 snaps and allowed just one QB pressure. He missed the season opener vs. Illinois State and last week's Temple contest.

► Redshirt senior offensive lineman **Febechi Nwaiwu** is the only OU offensive lineman to start all three games this season. He has started all three contests at right guard (also started all 13 games there last year).

MORE ON THE DEFENSE

► Through three games, Oklahoma has allowed just one total touchdown and 27 total first downs. The last time OU held its first three opponents to one total touchdown (or none) was the 1989 season, and it has been since 1985 that the Sooners have allowed 27 or fewer first downs over their first three games (16 that season).

► The defense has also allowed OU opponents' fewest total points through the first three games (19) since the 2004 season (14), the fewest total offensive yards (543) since 2007 (539), the fewest passing yards (254) since 2018 (222), the fewest passing touchdowns (zero) since 2017 (also zero) and the lowest opponent third-down conversion rate (17.1%) since 2007 (17.0%). It has also forced the most opponent punts (27) since the 2015 season (28).

► The Sooners have forced as many punts (27) through three games as they have allowed total first downs (27; includes five by penalty).

► The strength of the Sooners' defense very well could be its line, with three players returning who started a combined 33 games last season (senior **Damonic Williams** 12, senior **R Mason Thomas** 11 and freshman **Jayden Jackson** 10) and another who started three and saw extensive field time (senior **Gracen Halton**). That quartet totaled 118 tackles, 26 tackles for loss, 17 sacks and 16 QB hurries last season. Phil Steele ranked OU's defensive line as the best in the country this summer, and ESPN/SEC Network analyst Cole Cubelic said in May the Sooners have the league's best defensive line, "... and it ain't even close."

► Junior linebacker **Sammy Omosigho** paces the team with 14 tackles despite not starting a game this season. Omosigho is tied for the team lead with 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks, and paces the squad with three pass breakups.

► Against Illinois State, **Courtland Guillory** became only the second OU true freshman to start at cornerback in a season opener (the other was **P.J. Mbanasor** in 2015). Guillory has five tackles, a pass breakup and a QB hurry through three games.

► The Sooners have yet to force a turnover.

A LOOK AT SPECIAL TEAMS

► Oklahoma ranks fourth in the SEC and 20th nationally in net punting average (44.6). Redshirt sophomore **Jacob Ulrich** (first-team All-Conference USA last season at Kennesaw State) averaged 47.5 yards on two punts against Illinois State while redshirt junior **Grayson Miller** averaged 48.9 yards on his eight punts vs. Michigan and Temple. Both are first-year Sooners.

► Redshirt junior **Tate Sandell** has handled placekicking and kickoff duties the first three games. The first-year Sooner is 3 for 4 on field goal tries (including a 52-yarder at Temple) after making 19 of 23 last year at UTSA.

► Redshirt junior **Ben Anderson** is OU's long snapper for the third straight year. He earned third-team All-SEC honors last season and is a 2025 third-team preseason All-American by Phil Steele.

► Oklahoma's special teams units were drastically improved in 2024 under first-year coordinator **Doug Deakin**. After finishing No. 107 in the FEI (Freneau Efficiency Index) special teams ratings in 2023 the year before Deakin's arrival, the Sooners jumped to No. 34 last season.

BREAKING DOWN THE TRANSFERS

► The Sooners signed 22 transfers in the offseason, with the vast majority of those on offense. The breakdown is 14 offensive, four defensive and four special teams players.

► OU's transfer portal class was ranked No. 12 nationally by 247Sports.

► Perhaps OU's two biggest offseason player additions were on the offensive side of the ball in redshirt junior quarterback **John Mateer** and senior running back **Jaydn Ott**. Mateer, who starred at Washington State, was ranked by ESPN in May as the country's No. 1 transfer, while Ott was No. 17. A Manning Award finalist last year after passing for 3,139 yards and rushing for 826 in his first season as a starter, Mateer was the nation's only player with at least 20 touchdown passes (29) and at least 10 rushing TDs (15). His 44 TDs responsible for led the country in the regular season. Ott, who came from Cal, rushed for 2,597 yards (24 TDs) and caught 95 passes for 712 yards (six TDs) over the last three seasons (1,315 rushing yards/12 TDs in 2023).

► The other offensive transfers consist of five wide receivers (redshirt senior **Keontez Lewis** [Southern Illinois], redshirt juniors **Javonnie Gibson** [Arkansas-Pine Bluff] and **Isaiah Sategna III** [Arkansas], junior **Jer' Michael Carter** [McNeese State] and sophomore **Josiah Martin** [Cal]), three offensive linemen (redshirt senior **Derek Simmons** [Western Carolina], redshirt junior **Jake Maikkula** [Stanford] and junior **Luke Baklenko** [Stanford]), three tight ends (redshirt senior **Will Huggins** [Pittsburg State] and redshirt juniors **Carson Kent** [Kennesaw State] and **John Locke Jr.** [Louisiana Tech]) and redshirt sophomore quarterback **Whitt Newbauer** (Mercer).

► On defense, two transfers are linemen (senior **Marvin Jones Jr.** [Florida State] and redshirt sophomore **Siolaa Lolohea** [Utah State]) and two are linebackers (redshirt senior **Kendal Daniels** [Oklahoma State] and redshirt sophomore **Reed DeQuasie** [Oklahoma State]).

► The special teams transfers feature two placekickers (redshirt junior **Tate Sandell** [UTSA], redshirt senior **Austin Welch** [Kennesaw State]) and one punter (redshirt sophomore **Jacob Ulrich** [Kennesaw State]) and one punter/placekicker (redshirt junior **Grayson Miller** [Central Oklahoma]).

FIVE PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

► Five Sooners — two each on offense and defense and one on special teams — earned 2025 preseason All-America recognition.

► Senior defensive lineman **R Mason Thomas** was a third-team preseason All-American by Athlon and Phil Steele after ranking fourth in the SEC and 17th nationally with his 9.0 sacks (0.8 per game) last year. He also led the Sooners with his 12.5 tackles for loss and 11 QB hurries.

► Senior running back **Jaydn Ott** was a third-team preseason All-American by Phil Steele and a fourth-teamer by Athlon. The Cal transfer arrived at OU in June after posting 2,597 rushing yards (25 TDs) and 712 receiving yards (six TDs) over the last three seasons.

► Redshirt junior **Ben Anderson** was a third-team preseason All-American by Phil Steele. OU's long snapper each of the last two seasons, he was a third-team All-SEC pick last year.

► Redshirt senior wide receiver **Deion Burks** picked up fourth-team preseason All-America honors from Athlon. Burks, who battled injuries in his first season at OU last year after transferring from Purdue, entered the year with 94 career catches for 1,049 yards and 10 touchdowns.

► Redshirt junior linebacker **Kip Lewis** also picked up fourth-team honors from Phil Steele. In 2024, Lewis started 12 of 13 games and logged 65 tackles and 4.0 tackles for loss, and returned interceptions for touchdowns in wins at Auburn and against No. 7 Alabama.

NEW ASSISTANT COACHES

► The 2025 OU coaching staff features a new play-caller on offense and two new coaches on the defensive side of the ball. In December, Oklahoma head coach **Brent Venables** hired **Ben Arbuckle** as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. Arbuckle, who served the 2023 and 2024 seasons in the same capacity at Washington State, presided over a 2024 Cougars offense that ranked 12th nationally in the regular season with its 36.8 points per game, sixth in passing TDs (30), eighth in yards per pass attempt (9.1), ninth in passing efficiency rating (165.2), 22nd in total offense (440.4 ypg) and 24th in passing offense (268.8 ypg) and rushing TDs (27). WSU rushed for over 100 yards in 11 games (its most since 2005) and 89 yards in the other regular season contest.

► Venables also brought in **Nate Dreiling** as inside linebackers coach and **Wes Goodwin** as assistant linebackers and outside linebackers coach. Dreiling served the 2024 season at Utah State as interim head coach and defensive coordinator. He has spent five years as a defensive coordinator at Utah State (2024), New Mexico State (2022-23) and Pittsburg State (2018-19). His Utah State defense last year ranked 36th nationally in interceptions (13).

► Goodwin was promoted to defensive coordinator at Clemson prior to the 2022 season after Venables was named head coach at Oklahoma. He spent a total of 13 seasons across two stints at Clemson and helped guide the Tigers to the 2024 ACC Championship and an appearance in the College Football Playoff. Clemson ranked in the top 20 nationally in takeaways, interceptions and fumbles recovered during the 2024 season, ranked eighth nationally in total defense and pass defense in 2023 and ranked among the top 25 nationally in scoring defense, rushing defense, yards allowed per rush, sacks and tackles for loss in his first season as defensive coordinator in 2022.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

► During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (709) than any other program (next most is 680 by Alabama).

► Oklahoma has finished in the top 5 of the AP poll a nation-leading 33 times (Ohio State is second with 31).

► OU leads all FBS programs with 50 all-time conference championships. The rest of the top five includes Nebraska (46), Michigan (45), Ohio State (39) and USC (37). The Sooners' 14 league titles since 2000 are the most among Power Five programs (Ohio State ranks second with 11).

► No program has more all-time 11-win seasons than Oklahoma's 27 (Alabama also has 27).

► Since the start of the 2000 season, OU ranks second with 18 seasons of at least 10 wins and ranks second with 264 victories.

► Since former head coach **Bob Stoops** arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads the country with its 13,191 points scored. Boise State (12,747) is second and Oregon (12,540) third.

► Oklahoma's 81 consensus All-Americans since 1950 lead the nation (Alabama and Ohio State rank second with 77 each). Since 2000, OU has produced 31 consensus All-Americans, tied with Ohio State behind only Alabama.

EXTRA POINTS

► The Sooners are 13-6 all-time as the No. 11-ranked team in the AP poll (5-1 at home). Oklahoma was last ranked 11th in 2014 when it defeated Texas 31-26 in Dallas and lost to No. 14 Kansas State 31-30 at home in back-to-back weeks. OU's last home win as the AP's 11th-ranked team was in 2013 vs. TCU (20-17).

► For the second straight season, Oklahoma's schedule is among the nation's most challenging. Heading into 2025, the Sooners' strength of schedule was ranked as the country's toughest in ESPN's FPI.

► Of Oklahoma's 111 players, 45 (or 41%) are newcomers. That group is comprised of 23 freshmen and 22 transfers (seven seniors, 10 juniors and five sophomores).

► Of the 73 players on this week's depth chart, 19 (or 26%) were freshmen. That includes 11 true freshmen (five offense, five defense, one special teams) and eight redshirt freshmen (two offense, five defense, one special teams).

► In their 19 wins since the start of the 2023 season, the Sooners have outscored opponents 175-35 off turnovers. In their 11 losses during the same span, they have been outscored 105-27 off turnovers.

► Since the start of the 2014 season, OU ranks fourth nationally (second in Power Four) with its 5.3 yards per rush and seventh (fourth in Power Four) with its 356 rushing TDs.

► Since offensive line coach **Bill Bedenbaugh** joined the OU staff in 2013, the Sooners rank first nationally in total offense (494.1 ypg), second in yards per pass attempt (9.1), third in pass efficiency rating (164.3) and scoring offense (39.4 ppg), fourth in yards per rush (5.3; tied) and sixth in completion percentage (65.9) and in yards per completion (13.8). It is the only program in the country to rank in the top 15 in passing offense (eighth at 279.9 ypg) and rushing offense (10th at 214.2 ypg) during that span.

► The Sooners have won their last 84 games when holding opponents to under 21 points. Their last loss under the circumstance came at Nebraska in 2009 (10-3).

GAYLORD FAMILY OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and A 62-foot-by-38-foot video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE TURNS 100 ON OCT. 17

► Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals, is hosting football games for the 101st year this season. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.

► In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.

► The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).

► In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.

► Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and 83,489 (2016). With 2019's widening of aisles and some seats, capacity dropped to its current 80,126 figure.

► In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

► The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.

► The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489. The addition of handrails and some seat and aisle widening in 2019 reduced capacity to 80,126.

► The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons also benefit from two new clubs.

► Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3,000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.

► All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space includes a spacious locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.

► The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.

► A significantly larger and more detailed video board replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

A former 13-year University of Oklahoma assistant coach who won a national championship with the Sooners and two more with Clemson University during an ultra-successful 10-year stint as defensive coordinator, Brent Venables was named OU's 23rd head football coach on Dec. 5, 2021, and has coached the Sooners to a 25-17 record in his three-plus seasons.

Venables' 2023 Sooners went 10-3 overall and finished in second place in the Big 12 (7-2). They ranked third nationally in total offense (507.0 ypg) and fourth in scoring offense (41.7 ppg) and led the country in defensive interceptions per game (1.5).

The 54-year-old Venables served as co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Oklahoma from 1999-2003 and as associate head coach, defensive coordinator and linebackers coach from 2004-11 under former head coach Bob Stoops. Venables has coached in eight national championship games between his time at OU and Clemson, winning titles with the Sooners in 2000 and Tigers in 2016 and 2018. In 26 years as a full-time assistant coach, Venables' teams produced 26 winning seasons, won 13 conference titles, went to 30 bowl games (includes four College Football Playoff National Championship games) and won at least 10 games 22 times.

After joining Clemson prior to the 2012 season, Venables constructed one of the nation's top defenses. From 2012-2021, the Tigers ranked first nationally in sacks (445; next most was 392) and opponent third-down conversion percentage (30.2), second in opponent pass efficiency rating (111.1) and takeaways (244; tied), third in scoring defense (17.8 ppg) and opponent completion percentage (53.3), fourth in total defense (311.4 ypg) and pass defense (190.5 ypg), fifth in interceptions (148) and sixth in rushing defense (120.9 ypg). They won league titles each year from 2015-20.

Since 2000, Venables has coached eight national award winners and 16 consensus All-Americans. In that time, 61 defensive players under his guidance have been selected in the NFL Draft (12 first-rounders), including 18 linebackers, two of whom were first-round picks.

As a defensive coordinator and linebackers coach, Venables produced winners of three Butkus Awards (OU's Rocky Calmus in 2001 and Teddy Lehman in 2003, and CU's Isaiah Simmons in 2019), two Nagurski Awards (OU's Roy Williams in 2001 and Derrick Strait in 2003), two Thorpe Awards (Williams in 2001 and Strait in 2003) and one Bednarik Award (Lehman in 2003). And in 2018, Clemson defensive tackle Christian Wilkins became the school's first winner of William V. Campbell Trophy, also known as the "Academic Heisman."

Venables has received national accolades for his coaching and recruiting, including the Frank Broyles Award in 2016 as the nation's top assistant coach after being a finalist in 2015. He was FootballScoop's Defensive Coordinator of the Year in 2014 and Rivals.com's Recruiter of the Year in 2015.

Venables' defensive units were remarkably consistent during his 10 years with the Tigers. Each of his last eight Clemson defenses ranked in the top 15 nationally in yards allowed and seven of the last eight ranked in the top 20 in points allowed. Over his last eight years there, his units ranked first (in 2014), 10th, eighth, fourth, fifth, sixth, 15th and ninth (in 2021) in total defense. Additionally, his units ranked first or second in the ACC in total defense each of his last eight years (ranked first in six of those seasons).

Under Venables' tutelage in 2021, Clemson ranked second nationally in scoring defense (15.0 ppg) and red zone defense (62.1 conversion percentage), fourth in sacks (3.4 per game), eighth in rushing defense (98.8 ypg) and ninth in total defense (308.4 ypg).

Venables' 2020 Clemson defense tied for the national lead with 46 sacks, despite no player producing more than 4.5 sacks individually. His 2019 unit allowed fewer than 300 yards of total offense in each of its first 12 games, the first defense nationally since at least 1996 to accomplish that feat. Clemson held 16 straight opponents to 20 or fewer points across the 2018-19 seasons, the school's longest streak since the 1937-40 campaigns.

Clemson's 2018 squad led the nation in scoring defense (13.1 ppg) for the first time in school history and set a program record by recording 54 sacks.

Venables' Clemson defenses ranked among the top 10 nationally in sacks each year from 2014-21 and ranked in the top 10 in tackles for loss from 2013-20. The units led the nation in TFLs every year from 2013-16.

From 1999-2011, Venables helped OU to the 2000 national championship, three other national championship game appearances (2003, '04 and '08) and seven Big 12 titles. He was a finalist for the Broyles Award in 2006 when the Sooners led the Big 12 in total defense and scoring defense.

Oklahoma linebackers under Venables earned three Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year awards, five Big 12 Defensive Newcomer of the Year accolades and six first-team All-America honors. Ten of his OU linebackers — and 31 defensive players overall — were taken in the 2000-12 NFL Drafts.

While Venables was an Oklahoma assistant, the Sooners ranked among the top 16 nationally in total defense eight times (including each year from 2000-06) and among the top 20 in scoring defense eight times. OU led the Big 12 in scoring defense on four occasions (2000, '04, '06 and '11) and topped the conference in total defense three times (2003, '04, and '06).

Prior to joining Stoops' first staff at OU, Venables coached linebackers at Kansas State (1996-98), serving as defensive running game coordinator in 1998, and was a graduate assistant at K-State under Bill Snyder from 1993-95.

As a player at Kansas State (1991-92), Venables earned honorable mention All-Big Eight honors in 1992 after registering 124 tackles. He began his collegiate playing career at Garden City (Kan.) Community College (1989-90), where he earned All-America honors after recording 276 tackles and was inducted into the school's athletics hall of fame in April 2023.

A native of Salina, Kan., Venables received his bachelor's degree in political science from Kansas State in 1992. He and his wife Julie have four children: sons Jake and Tyler and daughters Laney and Addie.

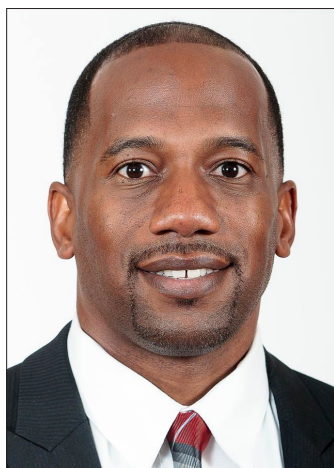

NORMAN — John Mateer set a record for passing yards in an Oklahoma debut and the defense allowed its fewest yards in five seasons as No. 18 OU opened the season with a 35-5 win over Illinois State at Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium.

Mateer completed 30 of 37 passes (81%) for 392 yards and three touchdowns, breaking the previous debut-passing-yardage record of 388 set by Baker Mayfield in 2015. Mateer was only the third quarterback to attempt at least 30 passes in his OU debut, and his completion rate was the highest among that group.

Mateer scored the first points of the season on a 7-yard rush near the end of the first quarter. He finished the game with 24 rushing yards on seven carries.

Two of his touchdown passes went to redshirt senior transfer wide receiver Keontez Lewis, who registered a game- and career-high nine catches for 119 yards and had TD receptions of 28 and 20 yards in the fourth quarter. His nine receptions tied the school record for a player in his OU debut.

Redshirt senior wide receiver Deion Burks caught seven passes for 88 yards and a 27-yard touchdown. All four of his touchdown receptions at OU have been in season openers, and he became only the second receiver in program history with four TD receptions in season-opening games (three last year vs. Temple).

Freshman running back Tory Blaylock rushed for a team-high 42 yards on eight carries and scored a touchdown on a 5-yard rush in the second quarter.

Senior tight end Jaren Kanak, who moved from linebacker in the offseason, had five catches for 90 yards, including a 48-yarder that was the longest play of the game. His 90 yards were the most by an OU tight end since the 2022 season.

Freshman defensive back Courtland Guillory became only the second OU true freshman to start at cornerback in a season opener and notched a tackle and a pass breakup. Junior linebacker Sammy Omosigbo registered a team-high eight tackles and recorded his first career sack, and redshirt junior linebacker Owen Heinecke made a career-high four tackles, including his first career tackle for loss.

NORMAN — John Mateer rushed for two touchdowns and threw another and Deion Burks caught seven passes for 101 yards and a score against his home-state team to lead No. 18/24 Oklahoma to a 24-13 win over No. 15/13 Michigan at Gaylord Family — Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. It was just the second meeting between the storied programs (OU beat UM 14-6 in the 1976 Orange Bowl to claim the 1975 national title).

Mateer completed 21 of 34 passes for 270 yards and rushed for 74 more on 19 carries. The redshirt junior signal-caller tossed a 9-yard touchdown pass to Burks on the game's opening possession, then scored on a 2-yard run with 22 seconds left in the half. He added a 10-yard rushing score in the third quarter to extend the lead to 21-7. Burks, a redshirt senior from Inkster, Mich., had his first 100-yard receiving game at OU.

The Sooners limited the Wolverines to 288 yards of total offense, including just 142 passing. Michigan's only touchdown came on a 75-yard rush by Justice Haynes on the first scrimmage play of the second half. OU held UM quarterback Bryce Underwood to 9-of-24 passing (37.5%) and the Wolverines offense to 3 of 14 on third downs.

With Oklahoma leading 21-13 in the fourth quarter, Mateer led a 16-play, 78-yard drive that consumed 8:27 and resulted in a 21-yard field goal by Tate Sandell to push the lead to 11 points with 1:44 remaining.

Senior tight end Jaren Kanak notched five receptions for the second straight game and ended with 69 receiving yards.

Redshirt junior linebacker Owen Heinecke led the Sooners with seven tackles (one for loss) and added a pass breakup. Redshirt senior linebacker Kendal Daniels finished with four tackles, 2.5 of which went for lost yardage. Redshirt sophomore defensive lineman Taylor Wein made his first career start and tallied three tackles, while Michael Fasusi became the first freshman in program history to start at left tackle in his first career game.

PHILADELPHIA — Quarterback John Mateer accounted for 345 total yards and two touchdowns and freshman running back Tory Blaylock rushed for 100 yards and two TDs to lead No. 13/16 Oklahoma to a 42-3 win over Temple at Lincoln Financial Field, home of the Philadelphia Eagles.

Mateer completed 20 of 34 passes for 282 yards and a touchdown and rushed for 63 yards and another score, extending his streak of at least one passing touchdown and one rushing touchdown to a nation-leading nine games. The redshirt junior tossed a 6-yard TD pass to running back Xavier Robinson in the third quarter, and on the following possession scored on a 51-yard rush.

Blaylock averaged 7.1 yards on his 14 carries and scored on runs of 6 and 18 yards in the second quarter. Redshirt junior wide receiver Isaiah Sategna III hauled in seven receptions for 97 yards and senior tight end Jaren Kanak made four catches for 86 yards. Senior running back Jovantae Barnes scored on a 3-yard rush on OU's opening possession. Redshirt junior Tate Sandell was 2 for 2 on field goals, making kicks from 52 and 29 yards.

The OU defense was stellar all day. The Sooners allowed just 104 total yards (fewest permitted since 2014) and seven first downs (fewest allowed since 2015), and forced the Owls to punt 12 times (the most by an opponent since 2015 and most in a road game since 2000). The defense also recorded season highs of four sacks and 11 tackles for loss, and limited Temple to a 19% third-down conversion rate.

Redshirt senior defensive back Kendel Dolby, playing in his first game in nearly a year after recovering from injury, logged a team-high-tying four tackles (one for loss). Sophomore Reggie Powers III and redshirt sophomore Taylor Heim also had four stops apiece and Powers notched his first career sack, as did sophomore defensive back Michael Boganowski and redshirt freshman defensive lineman Wyatt Gilmore.
